Abortion Clinic Bombings

Q. Although the recent bombing scare here in Washington was unrelated, there have been a series of recent abortion clinic bombings -- one in Tulsa and one in Atlanta. Does the Administration believe this is an orchestrated effort and are you doing anything to provide additional security at these facilities?

I am not going to comment upon the individual facts in an on-going investigation. But let me state clearly what I have said on a few occasions over the last couple of weeks. Acts of violence against people who are trying to exercise their constitutional rights are acts of terror. They are illegal. They are wrong. And we will investigate them and catch those who are committing them -- and we will insure that they are punished.

In May 1994, I proudly signed into law the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act (FACE), and my Administration has moved aggressively to enforce this law and combat this form of violence.

2.1.8 Research and Data Collection

The Administration supports strengthening the reliability and capability of data collection and research on migration issues. However, we do not support reinstatement of the program of annual registration and reregistration of all legal immigrants in the United States as called for by this resolution.

Also, I am trying to determine whether NSC is submitting the refugee responses themselves or whether they plan to incorporate their responses into the DPC document. I have not heard back yet.

The Constitution and federal statutory law permit a greater degree of religious expression in the federal workplace than many Americans may now understand. The government may not discriminate in the workplace against private religious expression during the workday. Subject only to the special restraints imposed by the Establishment Clause, religious expression, including proselytizing, is protected by the First Amendment in the federal workplace in the same way, and to the same extent, as other constitutionally valued speech. Like all private employee speech, it must be permitted except where it has an impact on the actual operation of government. At the same time, federal employers, supervisors and employees also may not use the workplace to coerce the consciences of other employees, or to convey official endorsement or disparagement of religion. Although application of the law might be complicated in some specific factual contexts and will require careful consideration in particular cases, certain principles are clear, and permit the promulgation of guidelines to apply to religious expression in the federal workplace. To understand why this is so requires a full understanding of general principles of anti-discrimination law as it applies to the federal workplace.

Federal law prohibits employment discrimination on the basis of race, sex, national origin and religion. That statute, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, affects religious (and non-religious) employees' rights in the government workplace in two ways. First, it bans discrimination on the basis of religion in employment. Second, it requires employers to accommodate employee religious practices. These two obligations—which are sometimes not easy to reconcile—are binding on the federal government acting as an employer. Among other topics, these guidelines address the intersection of these two obligations.

The federal government as an employer may not promote or refuse to promote, hire or refuse to hire, or otherwise favor or disfavor an employee or potential employee because of his or her religion. Thus, a federal agency may not refuse to hire Buddhists, or deliberately deny promotions to Christians, or impose stricter discipline on Jews than others. Likewise, federal agencies may not prefer Buddhists in hiring, give advantages to Christians in promotions, or impose lesser discipline on Jews. Atheists, too, may enjoy no advantage nor suffer any disadvantage because of their beliefs with respect to employment opportunities.

Title VII, however, is not limited to banning discrimination against employees because of their religion or lack of it. It also ensures the right of employees to be reasonably accommodated in their religious practices—which will include the right to speak about religion—except where accommodation would cause the employer more than undue minimal hardship. The most common example of the sort of accommodation required is the adjustment of work schedules to accommodate employee religious practices such as Sabbath or religious holiday observances.⁽¹⁾ These same provisions cover a wide range of religious practices, including dress. They also protect the employee's right to refuse to assist in carrying out programs irreconcilable with the individual's faith, unless the government would suffer more than minimal hardship in accommodating the employee.

1. Federal law permits federal employees to bank time to cover time lost for religious observance, 5 U.S.C. 5550a.

Many religions impose upon adherents the duty to spread the faith at every opportunity, a belief which encompasses the workplace. This duty is a protected religious activity which, when it takes the form of speech, cannot be suppressed except where the government can prove that the speech actually interferes with the efficient operation of the agency, intrudes upon the legitimate rights of other employees, or creates the appearance of an official endorsement of religion.⁽¹⁾ Because an employer has a legal duty to prevent the creation of a religiously hostile work environment—just as it may not permit the existence of a sexually hostile environment—employees may not proselytize in a way that creates such an environment (for example, where a proselytizer refuses a request to stop when requested to do so), and the employer must insist that those creating that hostile environment desist. The duty to comply with the law is a sufficient hardship to excuse a refusal to accommodate excessive and harassing proselytization. But not all proselytizing is harassing or creates a hostile environment.

2. "A claim of undue hardship cannot be supported by merely conceivable or hypothetical hardships; instead, it must be supported by proof of 'actual imposition on coworkers or disruption of the work routine'." *EEOC v. Townley Mfg. & Eng'g Co.*, 859 F.2d 610, 615 (9th Cir. 1988).

Re: White House/HHS Response to the NGA Position On Child Care

Note: HHS has not taken a formal position against any of the NGA resolutions because they represent the opinions of only one organization. However, HHS has comments on each of the following NGA resolutions.

22.2, Adequate Funding

We agree that both discretionary and mandatory funds should be funded at full authorization levels and that funding for the Social Service Block Grant should be maintained.

22.2.1, Seamless Child Care

We agree that states should have flexibility to run a seamless child care system.

22.2.2, Increased State Flexibility to Set Payment Rates

We recognize that states want maximum flexibility in setting payment rates. HHS is in the process of developing regulations on these and other issues and will take these recommendations into consideration.

22.2.3, Improved Program Administration

We recognize that states want maximum flexibility in defining administrative costs. HHS is in the process of developing regulations on these and other issues and will take these recommendations into consideration.

22.2.4, State Standards

(There is much controversy over this issue. HHS agrees with the law as passed and **would not** like to see the NGA suggested modifications enacted.)

The statute allows states to set child care standards for all types of providers. However, the new law does require states to ensure that standards are set in three key areas for all providers funded with CCDBG money: minimum health and safety training appropriate to the provider's setting; the prevention and control of infectious diseases (including immunizations) and building and premises safety. HHS supports the law as passed. This provision continues to allow states to set the actual standards, while at the same time ensuring that some level of standards are required for all providers in these key areas which are critical to protecting the health and safety for children in care.

2.3.1 Strongly agree with Governors' statement of support for persons fleeing persecution and with the importance of providing culturally appropriate services to meet the needs of those resettled in the United States. Also agree with judgement that resettlement is a long-term process which demands a close partnership between states, the private sector, and the federal government.

2.3.2 The Clinton Administration believes that a strong federal-state partnership is critical to the success of the refugee resettlement program and that the burden placed on states must be taken into account. Accordingly this Administration has maintained prior levels of cash and medical assistance to refugees and expanded our domestic program assistance. At the same time, our refugee admissions numbers must reflect the humanitarian needs of people who are being persecuted.

[On SSI and Food Stamps for Refugees; Need OMB position on budget.]

On privatization: The Clinton Administration is a strong believer in partnership between government and private sector. Options on privatization will be considered within the context of the 1997 Reauthorization of the Refugee Act and we will welcome the views of the NGA and others interested in this issue.

2.3.3 The Administration generally agrees with the principles proposed by the Governors for the the Reauthorization of the Refugee Act. In particular, the Administration supports the goal of helping refugees achieving rapid economic self-sufficiency.

The Administration strongly supports the Governors' recommendation that Cuban-Haitian entrants be treated as "refugees" as provided under the Fascell-Stone amendment. The Administration opposed the provision in the welfare bill that put an end to that parity.

The Administration will review the question of extending the period of eligibility for refugee services to twelve months. This should be considered within the context of the 1997 Reauthorization of the Refugee Act and we will welcome the Governors' input in that endeavor.

2.3.4 The Administration agrees that consultation between states, voluntary agencies and the federal government can and should be improved. The Administration will seriously consider proposals that enhance such coordination while maintaining the necessary flexibility to deal with urgent humanitarian crises.

2.3.5 The Administration supports the proposal to provide special impact aid to states and local governments under the circumstances described by the Governors.

- 1) Amendment 14.2: 30% Cap On Rental Payments -- Governors are opposed to Administration efforts to increase the requirement that 30% of income be paid as rent. They claim this is counter to welfare to work principles. We have propose an increase to the 30% requirement (Brook Rule), but so have the Republicans. We have proposed to increase the figure for budgetary purposes.
- 2) Amendment 14.3: Existing Programs -- Governors want to maintain permancy of Low-Income Housing Tax Credit and Mortgage Revenue Bond Program. The Administration concurs with the NGA position and would underscore that the President fought to make both of these incentives part of the permanent tax code back in 1993. He signed them into law as permanent features of the Code as part of OBRA '93.
- 3) 14.4: Federal Housing Efforts -- Generally concur with NGA position.
- 4) 14.5: Section 8 Project-Based Assistance -- The Administration has called for going to a "mark to market" system which should make the Section 8 program more efficient. The Governors are very concerned and want us to preserve the existing system. This however is not financially feasible. We of course are open to working with them in insuring the best possible transition.

SUBJECT *Add On To The Micro Credit Awards Event*

On Thursday, January 30, 1997 you are scheduled to take part in the micro credit ceremony in the East Room. The First Lady and Secretary Rubin, with you, will present the first annual Presidential Awards in Excellence for *domestic* micro credit programs. You will be honoring seven successful micro-entrepreneurs. A reception will follow.

In addition, you will be able to make two related announcements -- a new public-private partnership to pursue highly aggressive welfare to work efforts, and a commitment to increase CDFI funding. The announcements will emphasize new private sector involvement and funding for welfare to work efforts, including microenterprise. The public-private partnership will give you the opportunity to highlight another corporation -- Chase Bank -- stepping up to meet your welfare to work challenge to corporate America.

1. *Announce the Chase Manhattan Bank/Rockefeller Foundation/HUD Welfare-to-Work \$9.0 Million Dollar Partnership.*

Chase Manhattan Bank and the Rockefeller Foundation have teamed with HUD in a three-way partnership to plan and fund long-term private sector welfare-to-work demonstrations designed to raise employment rates by as much as 20-30 percent in small urban neighborhoods. Chase and Rockefeller have committed a total of \$7.5 million to the project along with an initial \$1.5 million commitment from HUD. The Rockefeller Foundation expects to raise an additional \$7.5 million from corporations, foundations, and government agencies.

Organizations in 15 *urban* communities throughout the country will be selected to participate in these demonstrations. *Systematic research* will monitor activities and community outcomes to determine whether dramatic increases in employment can be achieved.

Funding will go in part to community organizations committed to undertaking intensive training and private sector job placement efforts with four common elements: work incentives; state-of-the-art job placement and retention services; expanded access to capital for neighborhood residents and business owners; and a creation of a community culture that supports work. Funding will also go to Public Housing Authorities in 5-6 cities to train and place public housing residents in jobs while simultaneously modifying welfare and housing policies to encourage work.

Peter Goldmark, President of the Rockefeller Foundation, the Vice Chair of Chase Bank, and a high level representative from HUD will be present.

2. Reiterate commitment to increase the Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI) Fund budget.

Your new budget includes a \$1 billion increase over five years for the CDFI Fund, which coordinates the Administration's numerous microenterprise programs. The exact dollar amount for our FY '98 budget has not yet become public.

Campaign Finance Reform Principles and Parameters

The President has outlined five principles that form the foundation of acceptable campaign finance reform legislation: *1) it must be bipartisan; 2) it must be comprehensive; 3) it must reduce the amount of money that is raised and spent on federal elections; 4) it must help level the playing field between challengers and incumbents; and 5) it cannot favor one party over the other.* With these principles for guidance, acceptable campaign finance reform must also meet the following parameters:

- 1) **Foreign money in federal elections must be banned.**
- 2) **Incentives for voluntarily limiting campaign spending must allow candidates to adequately communicate with voters.**
 - 30 minutes of free television time
 - Reduced rate broadcast time for radio and television
 - Reduced postal rates for campaign mailings
- 3) **“Soft” money in federal elections must be banned.**
 - Federal, state and local parties cannot raise or spend contributions for federal elections that are either unlimited, undisclosed or both.
- 4) **Campaign spending must be brought under control.**
 - Voluntary spending limits in exchange for free television time, reduced broadcast rates and reduced postal rates for campaign communications
- 5) **Broader citizen participation must be encouraged.**
 - Ban on “soft” money
 - Qualification thresholds for incentive package designed to encourage small contributions
- 6) **The influence of lobbyist contributions must be curtailed.**
 - If a lobbyist makes a contribution to a candidate, the lobbyist is restricted for one year from lobbying the candidate or the candidate’s staff
- 7) **Campaign spending must be fully disclosed.**
 - Full and immediate disclosure of independent expenditures

- Require reporting for contributions of \$50 or more
 - Require electronic filing of campaign contribution and spending reports
- 8) **The Federal Election Commission's enforcement capabilities must be strengthened.**
- Injunctive authority for the FEC
 - Increase penalties for knowing and wilful violations of the campaign finance laws
 - Random audit authority for the FEC
 - FEC ability to expedite proceedings for violations that occur within 60 days of an election
- 9) **Unlimited and undisclosed special interest campaign spending must be banned.**
- Expand the definition of independent expenditures to include all communication designed to influence campaigns
- 10) **Unlimited, coordinated party and special interest campaign spending must be banned.**
- Expand the definition of coordination to bring party and interest group spending that is truly coordinated with the candidate under applicable limits.
- 11) **The influence of special interest PACs must be limited.**
- Ban or reduce PAC contributions
