

Here is a near-final run-down of the FMLA radio address, to be taped live in the Oval Office tomorrow:

Message of Event

As discussed, there are three main points:

1. To describe the accomplishments of the Family Leave law on the fourth anniversary of its signing (the exact anniversary is 2/5);
2. To announce a new 800 number and public education campaign to increase awareness of FMLA;
3. To reaffirm the President's campaign commitment to expand Family Leave to parent-teacher conferences and children's routine medical appointments.

It was decided not to include mention of our flextime proposal, or to discuss when we will resubmit the FMLA expansion bill (originally submitted on the last day of the 104th Congress), since we do not yet know if these two proposals would be combined in one bill.

Terry Edmonds is preparing the President's remarks.

Event and Picture

A briefing will be held in the President's dining room, from 9:45 to 10:00. The event will take place at 10:06 in the Oval, followed by the usual receiving line.

Josh King is arranging the picture; the goal is to incorporate both a sign with the new 800 number, and some real people who have been affected by FMLA.

P6(b)(6) We are also bringing in Clifton "Stan" Sorrell, CEO of the Calvert Group, a \$5.2 billion, 175-employee investment company in Bethesda, which has been implementing FMLA and already offers the leave policies we are proposing under our FMLA expansion. Mr. Sorrell was at the FMLA signing in 1993 (his company has been recognized as one of Working Mother's best 100 companies four years in a row, and was also one of Bush's Thousand Points of Light). Sorrell will be bringing two of his employees who have used Family Leave.

The current plan is for the President to read the radio address from his desk, with Mr. and Mrs. Sens standing behind the desk on one side, and Mr. Sorrell and his employees on the other side. Josh is preparing a small sign-tent which would be placed on the desk to be at the center of the picture, which might say something like "Learn More About Family Leave: 1-800-959-FMLA." (Josh will have additional options ready.)

Press and Materials

Most likely, only still photographers would be allowed in this event. NEC has drafted an overall one-pager (attached), Labor is finishing one-pagers on their public education campaign and on the Sens family and Sorrell's company, and the Press Office could also distribute copies of Labor's new Family Leave PSA's (attached).

Eli Segal has committed to organize the corporate welfare to work effort. From a policy standpoint, we are ready to make the announcement for the SOTU. We would announce the following: Three CEOs (to be named) have agreed to lead an effort to mobilize the business community around your challenge to put 1 million welfare recipients to work by the year 2000.

We are in the process of choosing the two or three CEOs who would head the effort. Right now, those being considered are: United Airlines, UPS, Burger King, and Rachel's Bus Company in Chicago. Monsanto and Sprint would likely be Vice Chairs. Cheri Carter in public liaison is working to finalize this piece.

Once you reiterate the welfare to work challenge and announce which CEOs will lead the effort, Eli will continue his work outside the White House to organize the effort.

Corporations involved in the challenge would directly hire welfare recipients; those without available jobs will encourage and motivate different businesses to hire; others might fund specific programs, offer leadership, call on contacts, or recruit other corporations and their employees to the effort.

Faith Community Challenge

We are working with Flo McAfee and Linda Lader to organize this effort. We are waiting for the religious community to come to us with a proposal. As you know, you have a Congressional prayer breakfast scheduled for next week. This will be one of several topics the faith community will discuss. Flo McAfee believes the faith community will approach us with a proposal in a couple of weeks at which point we will begin work with them.

Subject: NGA Talkers on Benefits to Immigrants

We have developed some talking points comparing the NGA proposal relating to benefits to immigrants with the Administration's proposal. The NGA has made significant proposals in this area, though different from our proposal in a number of ways. The talking points below could be incorporated into other talking points being developed for anyone meeting with NGA or working on their proposal.

Talkers:

NGA DRAFT PROPOSAL ON BENEFITS TO LEGAL IMMIGRANTS

The NGA and the President share a common concern regarding the impact the welfare bill's benefit ban will have on low income legal immigrants, especially the disabled and refugees. The main difference between the proposals is that the President targets cash and medical assistance to current and future disabled legal immigrants while the NGA would provide cash, some medical and food assistance only to legal immigrants currently in the country. In addition, although they approach the problem differently, both proposals address the special needs of refugees.

By banning legal immigrants from participating in the SSI, Medicaid, Food Stamps and other major assistance programs, the welfare bill inherently shifts the cost of supporting disadvantaged legal immigrants to the States. The NGA and the President's proposals each would address this concern, albeit in different ways. Preliminary estimates indicates that the proposals have a similar budgetary impact and would provide a significant restoration of benefits.

The NGA would continue to provide SSI and Food Stamps to all elderly and disabled immigrants currently in the country. However, no assistance would be available for future low income immigrants who suffer a disability or develop an unexpected illness. The President's proposal provides greater long term support for disabled immigrants, including children, and ensures their access to health care. The proposal would

continue SSI and Medicaid eligibility for disabled immigrants, including the disabled elderly, for all current and future immigrants.

Governors should be urged to voice their concerns with the Congress about the impact of the benefit ban on legal immigrants and refugees in the States. Some on the Hill are considering a block grant to provide assistance to those States with large immigrant populations losing benefits under the welfare law. While we are pleased that the Congress is starting to consider fixes in this area, States and immigrants would be better served by a reinstatement of federal cash, food and medical assistance than they would by a small capped block grant.

There is a bit of a tug of war going on regarding who will lead the process for the next few months on coming up with the detail on American Heritage Rivers.

Food Stamp Waivers

You had asked about an item in a recent Cabinet weekly report that described USDA's approval of a Hawaii request to waive the food stamp work requirement. The report noted that USDA has approved waivers in 14 states to date. You asked whether this means that we don't need to change the law in this area since single individuals in waiver states can go on getting food stamps.

Waivers are granted only to areas with unemployment rates over 10% or with "insufficient jobs", usually as defined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although these waivers do offer significant relief from the law, they would help only about 30% of this population even if states take full advantage of the waiver option. None of the waivers granted to date are state-wide. For example, West Virginia's request for a state-wide waiver was turned down. Rhode Island was able to exempt 90% of its food stamp population. Illinois's waiver only exempts portions of the city of Chicago.

Women's Health Update: Staff from the Department of Health and Human Services will likely make final recommendations for mammography screening for women age 40 to 50 at the end of February. The Department will likely recommend that not all women age 40 to 50 receive mammography screenings, but that those who have a medical basis for such be covered by insurance. This recommendation will be viewed as a positive step by women's advocates. DPC staff are working with Ann Lewis and others about outreach and education.

Update on Coverage of Mastectomy: The Department of Health and Human Services will clarify that the Medicare program will cover mastectomies when medically necessary. Therefore, if, following a mastectomy, a doctor and patient believe it is necessary to stay in the hospital 48 hours or more, the stay will be paid for by Medicare. An announcement of this policy and your support of similar legislation for private health plans may be made in the State of the Union Address.

These initiatives coupled with provisions to improve health care quality and increase funding for NIH will create a strong package of women's health initiatives.

Elena: Here is my best guess as to the meeting Bruce mentioned to you, but I could be wrong. As a parent, I know how important it is to take responsibility for our children when they need us most -- when they are sick, when they need to go to the doctor, or when there is a parent-teacher conference at school. Fortunately, Hillary and I have never had to risk our jobs to be there for our daughter. We have never had to make the choice between being good parents and good workers. Today, I want to talk with you about what we have done, and what more we must do, to give that same assurance to every American family.

One of the things that I most wanted to do when I became President was to help parents succeed both at home and at work. That is why I was so proud to make the Family and Medical Leave Act the first bill I signed as President, exactly four years ago this Wednesday.

Family and Medical Leave allows people in companies with 50 or more employees to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave -- to care for a newborn or newly-adopted child, or to be with a family member who is sick, without fear of losing their job.

Today, over half of all American workers share this important benefit. People like Christie Sens, a first grade teacher from Fairfax, Virginia who is here with me today. Christie was among the first Americans to make use of the new Family Leave law in 1993, when she and her husband were expecting their first child. Christie thought she would be forced to choose between the six weeks her school allowed for new mothers, or taking a whole year off without pay. Because of our new law, she was able to spend 12 full weeks at home -- recovering from her pregnancy, and spending precious time with her new daughter. Christie used the benefit again in 1995 for the birth of her second child.

Family leave is not only family friendly -- it is employer friendly as well. Also with me today is Stan Sorrell, President and CEO of the Calvert Group, an investment firm in Bethesda, Maryland, and two of his employees who have used Family Leave. The Calvert Group started a Family and Medical Leave program three years before it became the law of the land. Like more than 90 percent of participating companies, they found that Family Leave is good for business, adding little or nothing to their costs. After all, in the four years since I signed the Family Leave law, American business created 11.2 million new jobs -- more than any four-year term in our history.

We must make it even easier for parents to take responsibility, and live up to their obligations to their children and their employers. Today, I call on Congress to expand the Family Leave Law, to give parents an additional 24 hours of time off each year -- to take a child or an elderly relative to a regular doctor's appointment, or to attend parent-teacher conferences at school. In doing so, we will **make our families stronger and our workers more productive -- building the kind of country and economy we all want for our children.**

We must also address the fact that too many workers are not taking advantage of the Family Leave law, because they are not even aware of it. That is why I am pleased to announce that the Department of Labor is launching a multi-media public education campaign, to spread the word about Family Leave; to make sure employers and employees have the facts; and to make sure everyone knows how to make this law work for them. It's not enough to help people have the tools to succeed; we must make sure they know what those tools are. The centerpiece of this campaign is a new 800 number that any American can call to learn about Family and Medical Leave: 1-800-959-FMLA. You can also get information through our Labor Department's website: WWW.DOL.GOV.

By expanding Family Leave to cover children's doctor's visits and parent-teacher conferences -- by helping more Americans learn about Family Leave, and the ways they can succeed both at home and at work -- we will create more opportunity, take more responsibility for our children and families, and build a stronger community for us all. That is how we must prepare America for the 21st Century, and help everyone have the tools to make the most of their lives.

Family and Medical Leave embodies one of our country's most basic goals: building stronger families as we enter a new century, full of new promise. Ralph Waldo Emerson once said, "It is one of the most beautiful compensations of this life that no man can sincerely try to help another without helping himself." Family and Medical Leave is helping millions of American families -- and in so doing, it is helping us all. Now is the time to expand it, and make it available to even more of our citizens.

I talked to Kent Markus at Justice and here are his comments:

1. He wanted to know if we mention "civil rights" anywhere in the speech. The AG thinks it is an area that at the minimum just needs to be mentioned so that no one can accuse us of not mentioning it.

2. He wanted to know where we got the 100,000 criminal aliens goal -- I assumed Steve was looking into that and has been working w/ INS. He did note as an aside that saying "We should" is not as strong as just "Our goal is..."

3. He recommends that we mentioned youth alcohol abuse somewhere -- it could fit at the end of "My balanced budget includes the largest anti-drug effort ever: to stop drugs at their source, punish those who push them, and steer young people away from drugs and alcohol."

4. On the Youth Violence Bill paragraph, here are some points I talked through with him:

Change Brady/juvenile sentence to: "Extends the Brady law check to prevent violent juveniles from ever buying a handgun." The current sentence says "extends the Brady Bill so a minor" But technically Brady does not disqualify an individual from buying a handgun -- the 1968 Gun Act does that; Brady is a check of that disqualification. Not an earth-crushing distinction, but the rewrite is not bad rhetorically and more correct.

Change Safety lock sentence: "requires gun safety locks to help prevent theft and tragic accidents." This takes out "trigger" which is awkward (and actually incorrect because the lock is not on the trigger). "Help" gives us some wiggle room in case someone claims these locks will have no impact. "Theft and tragic accidents" sounds better than "unauthorized use."

Provide resources sentence: wants us to add in this sentence "provides resources to communities so they can deal with truancy, school violence, and can keep schools...." AG wanted us to emphasize that the resources are going to the "community" and we have a grant program in the bill -- separate from the Afterschool program -- for anti-truancy, school violence programs, curfews, etc.

**PRESIDENT WILLIAM J. CLINTON
RADIO ADDRESS ON FAMILY LEAVE
Saturday, February 1, 1997**

Good morning. As a parent, I know how important it is to take responsibility for our children when they need us most -- when they are sick, when they need to go to the doctor, or when there is a parent-teacher conference at school. Fortunately, Hillary and I have never had to risk our jobs to be there for our daughter. We have never had to make the choice between being good parents and good workers. Today, I want to talk with you about what we have done, and what more we must do, to give that same assurance to every American family.

One of the things that I most wanted to do when I became President was to help parents succeed both at home and at work. That is why I was so proud to make the Family and Medical Leave Act the first bill I signed as President, exactly four years ago this Wednesday.

Family and Medical Leave allows people in companies with 50 or more employees to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave -- to care for a newborn or newly-adopted child, or to be with a family member who is seriously ill, without fear of losing their job.

Today, over half of all American workers share this important benefit. People like Christie Sens, a first grade teacher from Fairfax, Virginia who is here with me today. Christie was among the first Americans to make use of the new Family Leave law in 1993, when she and her husband were expecting their first child. Christie thought she would be forced to choose between the six weeks her school allowed for new mothers, or taking a whole year off without pay. Because of our new law, she was able to spend 12 full weeks at home -- recovering from her pregnancy, and spending precious time with her new daughter. Christie used the benefit again in 1995 for the birth of her second child.

Family leave is not only family friendly -- it is employer friendly as well. Also with me today is Stan Sorrell, President and CEO of the Calvert Group, an investment firm in Bethesda, Maryland, and two of his employees who have used Family Leave. The Calvert Group started a Family and Medical Leave program three years before it became the law of the land. Like almost 90 percent of businesses covered by the law, they found that Family Leave is easy to administer, and costs them little or nothing. So we know it is working for both families and businesses. After all, in these past four years, American business created 11.2 million new jobs -- more than any four-year term in our history.

We must make it even easier for parents to take responsibility, and live up to their obligations to their children and their employers. Today, I call on Congress to expand the Family Leave Law, to give parents an additional 24 hours of unpaid leave each year -- to take a child or an elderly relative to a regular doctor's appointment, or to attend parent-teacher conferences at school. In doing so, we will make our families stronger and our workers

more productive -- building the kind of country and economy we all want for our children.

We must also address the fact that too many workers still do not know about the Family Leave law. That is why I am pleased to announce that we are launching a multi-media public education campaign, to spread the word about Family Leave; to make sure employers and employees have the facts; and to make sure everyone knows how to make this law work for them. It's not enough to help people have the tools to succeed; we must make sure they know what those tools are. The centerpiece of this campaign is a new 800 number that any American can call to learn about Family and Medical Leave: 1-800-959-FMLA. You can also get information through our Labor Department's website on the Internet: WWW.DOL.GOV.

By expanding Family Leave to cover children's doctor's visits and parent-teacher conferences -- by helping more Americans learn about the opportunity of Family Leave -- we will enable millions more Americans to meet their responsibilities, both at home and at work. That is how we must prepare our people for a new century, full of new promise and possibility.

As parents, teachers, and business people; as members of the workforce and members of our communities -- we all share a stake in the strength of our families. Our society can never be stronger than the children we raise, or the families in which we raise them. That is why Family Leave is more than a single issue or accomplishment. It is at the heart of our approach to preparing America for the 21st Century, by ensuring that we can all meet our obligations, and make the most of the gifts that God gave us.

Besides raising educational standards, we must prepare all our children to learn. Over the next four years, my Administration will advance a comprehensive program on the health, social well-being, and cognitive development of children. We need to improve the health and nutrition of our children; to keep our children away from drugs, tobacco, and other substances and activities hazardous to their well-being; and to better understand the developmental aspects of learning. Research in these areas will play a critical role, just as it did in the development of the successful Head Start program. My balanced budget expands Head Start by one million children by 2002.

I am pleased to announce we will convene a White House Conference on Early Learning and the Brain this spring, to apply the newest scientific insights toward understanding how young children learn. It is never too early to learn, and we can never do too much to help them. I am also establishing a Children's Research Task Force that will link federal agencies, policy makers, and the scientific community to identify the most important needs and opportunities in child and family research.
