SSA would like to give an AP reporter the story that we are including work incentives for people with disabilities on Wednesday, the day before the budget is released. The theory is that, while these are small, they are important to the disability community and are at least a start toward "making work pay" for people with disabilities, and they are likely to be swallowed up if they are announced on Thursday, between the general budget story and the 2 other stories of interest to the disability community (SSI children and Medicaid per capita cap).

Nancy-Ann Min, Chris Jennings, and Bill White of public liaison all advocate drawing some kind of notice or doing some kind of event with these proposals, particularly given the disability groups' negative reaction on Medicaid and SSI. I think it's a wise idea, as long as there are no other budget release strategies it would screw up.

What do you think? Obviously we can roll it out of here if we prefer, but I am assuming you don't think this merits much White House attention.

Welfare Reform -- Q&A's after NGA Meeting
2/3/97

Question: *Didn't the President suffer a major defeat in his quest to fix the welfare law, with the action by the NGA to drop its opposition to legal immigrant cuts?*

Answer: The NGA is not dropping its concerns, just restating them in gentler language.

As the new welfare law is being implemented, the Governors are gaining a new appreciation of some parts of the bill that the President has had a problem with from the beginning -- those parts that are not related to putting people to work. This is particularly true of those Governors in states with large numbers of legal immigrants. They are now looking more carefully at their state budgets and the fact that many legal immigrants who are disabled, many in nursing homes, will lose their SSI and Medicaid over the summer. In addition to noting that these provisions are unfair, they can see the potential costs to their own state budgets if they make the decision to ameliorate those cuts.

Because of pressure from the Congressional leadership, it appears that the NGA will now adopt a policy that is somewhat watered down from earlier drafts. While we would wish for stronger language, the key fact is that the Governors are now on record expressing concerns about the fairness of these provisions.

Question: *But don't you think that those Governors who care about this issue hurt their case by flip-flopping, and ultimately caving in to the Republican leadership in Congress?*

The National Governors' Association has a long history of bipartisanship that causes them to move very cautiously on many issues. The President understands that group very well, having headed it up when he was Governor of Arkansas. In that context, we believe their new policy on benefits for legal immigrants is very encouraging.

Question: *The President says he is ready to work with Congress to fix the immigrant and food stamp parts of the welfare law, but the Republican leadership says the bill is fine as it is. Even Mr. Gephardt just said the bill shouldn't be changed until we have had a chance to see how it works. Doesn't this mean your proposals will be dead on arrival?*

Answer: We have seen movement from the Governors, on both sides of the aisle, on this issue, even though their final resolution was weakened under pressure from the Congressional leadership. So we are encouraged that people are beginning to see the harm that these provisions could do to hard-working people who came to this country and, through, no fault of their own, became disabled and could no longer

support their families.

I know that the President is encouraged also as he starts his second term that we are seeing some real changes in our relationship with the Congress. It appears that we have gotten past some of the unproductive ways of doing business we have had over the past two years, and that we are learning how to work with one another in a far more constructive fashion.

Clearly the Administration and Congress often have different priorities, and our disagreements will not be swept away. Nor should they be, since a healthy debate is part of what the American people are paying us for. But we are looking forward to working with the Congress in a continuing process of give and take, and explaining why our proposals merit their support.

Question: *How much money does the President's budget contain for welfare reform?*

Answer: As you know, the President sends his budget to Congress on Thursday, so we will have more to say on that at that time. There are two sets of numbers for welfare reform in the budget: money for the Welfare to Work Initiative and money to improve areas of the welfare law -- in particular, on legal immigrants and food stamps -- that the President has objected to from the beginning.

Question: *What do the Administration propose to do in its welfare to work initiative?*

Answer: The Welfare to Work Initiative is still being designed, but it would help move hard-to-place welfare recipients off of the welfare rolls and into work. The initiative would likely have two parts: 1) a performance-based welfare-to-work jobs challenge to help states and cities create job opportunities for the hardest to employ recipients, and 2) an enhanced and targeted Work Opportunity Tax Credit to provide the private sector with powerful and new financial incentives to hire the hard to place welfare recipients.

Question: *How is the Administration going to move people from welfare to work when there are no jobs?*

Answer: I believe jobs are available and that the welfare rolls will continue to decline. Minimum wage jobs have always been open, but the package of welfare benefits previously available offered more to recipients than a minimum wage job. Now, with increases in the Earned Income Tax Credit, child care subsidies, and other provisions that makes work pay, welfare recipients can afford to take those available minimum wage jobs. Once working, former welfare recipients will gain the employment experience necessary to move up the ladder of work.

But, we will need more jobs -- and jobs that pay more than the minimum wage if

we are ensure the success of the new welfare law. The combination of private sector commitments, such as those made by the CEOs with whom I recently met, economic development, tax credits, additional welfare-to-work funds, and a focus on jobs in the growing technology industry will create the new, higher paying jobs we need.

Question: *The welfare law gives you the choice of how many disabled children will be cut off of the SSI program. Have you made this decision yet?*

Answer: The Social Security Administration is now working to implement the new law fairly and effectively. Writing this new standard is an important task since it must be consistent with the Congress's intent to tighten eligibility for this program, and also ensure that severely disabled children retain their benefits, including Medicaid. SSA expects to finish their work shortly.

TALKING POINTS ON THE STATE OF THE UNION ADDRESS
Monday, February 3, 1997

A concrete action plan. In his Inaugural address, President Clinton presented his larger vision of preparing America for the 21st Century. In the State of the Union and budget, the President will present his clear, concrete and consistent action plan to implement that vision.

At a time of peace and prosperity, our great enemy is inaction. The President will emphasize the unique opportunity America faces to build on the strong economic foundation we have established, and also the importance of taking action now to share the 21st Century.

Balancing the budget to keep the economy strong and investing in critical priorities. The President will demonstrate that he has moved the country beyond the false choices of the past -- that we can finish the work of balancing the budget, to lower interest rates and keep the economy growing, while still investing in those things that help the American people thrive and our economy grow.

Working together with all sectors of society. The President will stress the responsibility shared by all sectors of society (states, localities, businesses, communities and families) to work together to meet our challenges. In his address, he will issue a call to action that must be answered by all Americans, and he will highlight those who are already stepping up to the challenge of preparing America for the 21st Century.

Key points to emphasize: education, leadership in the world and unity. The President's address will place a special focus on these three areas -- giving our children a world-class education for the 21st Century, remaining the world's indispensable nation, and forming a stronger, more perfect union here at home.

STATE OF THE UNION ADDRESS -- THEMATIC OUTLINE
Monday, February 3, 1997

1. Finishing the unfinished business of our country. The President will open with a strong statement of his determination to finish the job of balancing the budget, reforming welfare and reforming campaign finance laws, to lay the foundation for preparing America for the 21st Century.

2. Strengthening education as the number-one priority. The President will emphasize that nothing is more important to preparing America for the 21st Century than giving our children a world-class education. That is why the President is proposing the largest education budget in history, providing record investments from pre-school to high school to college, and he is focussing on the responsibility all families and communities share to renew our schools at all levels. His address will place a special focus on the need to set the highest standards for students, teachers and schools.

3. Harnessing the powerful forces of knowledge, science, and technology. In the first State of the Union to be carried live over the Internet, the President will discuss his plans to spread the benefits of technology and research to all Americans, from our schools to our hospitals to our homes.

4. Building stronger families to help parents pass on their values to their children, and stronger communities to prepare America for the 21st Century. The President will talk about the need to strengthen America's families by expanding Family Leave, and continuing to expand access to health care step-by-step; and the need to strengthen our communities by revitalizing urban communities, protecting our environment, pressing the fight against crime and drugs, expanding national service and celebrating culture and the arts.

5. Keeping American leadership strong. The President will place a special focus on keeping America strong, by maintaining our role as the world's indispensable nation. This includes building an undivided, democratic Europe; building an Asian-Pacific community; prospering in the global economy; remaining a force for peace throughout the world; moving strongly against new threats to our security, and maintaining the tools to meet these challenges.

6. Remaining strong as One America. Following through on his Inaugural address, the President will issue a strong call for unity -- emphasizing that our diversity is a great strength as we move into the 21st Century.

DRAFT -- NOT ADMINISTRATION POLICY
February 3, 1997 - 6:45 PM

OBJECTIVE

Objective of American Heritage Rivers Initiative. To protect and restore America's great rivers to enhance our citizens' enjoyment of their historic, cultural, recreational, economic and environmental value and the health of our communities.

CHARGE TO CABINET

President Clinton is charging his Cabinet to work with communities to design an initiative that will support community efforts on behalf of their rivers. The Cabinet will report the results of this effort with recommendations to the President within 90 days for his approval.

CORE ELEMENTS

- **Matching Community Involvement with Federal Support.** The American Heritage Rivers effort is a partnership between the federal government and the people who enjoy the many values of a river. The partnerships will be created from the community up, through local, state, tribal, and federal governments rather than from the top down.
- **Giving Communities the Tools They Need.** President Clinton is directing federal agencies to provide better tools to all communities to enhance America's rivers and create greater opportunities for the people who live along them.
- **"American Heritage Rivers."** In addition, President Clinton will offer special recognition to outstanding stretches of America's rivers by selecting them to be "American Heritage Rivers." Communities will nominate sites to be considered for this status. Federal agencies will refocus resources to provide particular assistance to these areas.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

- **A Call to Action.** The President is calling on communities around the country to bring private companies, non-profit organizations, and state, local, and tribal resources together to restore, protect, and revitalize rivers that run through their communities. President Clinton is directing his Cabinet to reach out to those people to encourage and expand on successful efforts.
- **Using Partnerships to Chart Each Community's Unique Course.** The American Heritage Rivers initiative will center around partnerships between communities and state, local, tribal, and federal governments. Each river and every community is different, and

requires different solutions. The federal government will support community efforts to chart a course that makes the most sense based on the area's economic, social, historical, and environmental conditions, drawing on local expertise already devoted to river and community enhancement.

TOOLS FOR ALL RIVER COMMUNITIES

The Cabinet will prepare recommendations for improving federal help to all river communities, including but not limited to American Heritage Rivers. Examples of activities that the federal government can undertake include the following:

- **Access to Federal Programs and National Expertise.** Communities need help penetrating the maze of federal programs available to assist them. Agencies will make it easier to access available federal resources to support community restoration, protection and revitalization efforts, and will create a clearinghouse for this information. This effort will also make national expertise available to communities and actively promote successful ideas about how our heritage can be preserved.
- **Comprehensive Information for Communities.** For the first time communities will have access to all the data available to the federal government about the health of their rivers and the challenges to continued protection. Agencies will make this information easily accessible using the Internet and other methods.
- **A Talent Bank Across Communities.** Many communities are already engaged in work to preserve their river and revitalize their communities. Federal agencies will create a "talent bank" of experienced local people who are willing to share knowledge and techniques about community river restoration efforts.

SELECTION OF "AMERICAN HERITAGE RIVERS"

- **American Heritage Rivers.** In addition to the better help provided to all communities, the President will select outstanding river sites as American Heritage Rivers. In the first year up to ten such sites will be selected to demonstrate successful models of community action. Lessons learned from these sites will be shared across the country.
- **Enhanced Government Tools.** President Clinton is directing his Cabinet to refocus programs, grants, and technical assistance to provide special support to American Heritage Rivers. Each community supporting an American Heritage River will be given resources to catalyze their community's work on behalf of a restored, revitalized river.
- **Better Decisions.** President Clinton is directing the federal agencies to adopt a "good neighbor" policy in making decisions, taking into consideration the effects upon American Heritage Rivers of actions by federal agencies.
- **Community Representative.** Federal agencies will provide a community representative

to help implement the community's vision and provide a contact for federal resources in each American Heritage River community.

- **Nominations.** Communities will be able to nominate outstanding stretches of river for consideration as an American Heritage River. Nominations will include information on the importance of the stretch of river to the nation's culture and history; to past and future economic development; and to public health and environmental quality. In addition, the Administration will ask for a community plan for revitalization, broad support for the plan and a commitment of non-federal resources.

FULFILLING THE PRESIDENT'S CHARGE

- **Directive to Cabinet.** The President is directing the Cabinet (including agencies responsible for natural resource management, economic development, environmental protection, and historic preservation) to develop the American Heritage Rivers effort by reaching out to those with experience in revitalizing their communities and rivers -- civic leaders, businesses, government at all levels, historians, non-governmental organizations. Within 90 days the Cabinet will report to the President the design of a program that will carry out the objectives of this initiative.
- **American Heritage River Selections.** As part of the design of the overall program, the Cabinet will recommend specific basic program procedures, including the process for nominating and selecting sites for American Heritage River recognition, and the considerations that will affect the selection. The President will select up to 10 American Heritage Rivers for recognition within one year from the announcement of the final program.
- **Budget Impact.** This effort is not to rely on net increases in federal spending or regulations, but rather newly-targeted budget resources and more effective regulation.

HEARINGS:

Monday, February 3:

Today, Secretary Rubin testified before the House Judiciary Committee on the Balanced Budget Amendment. At the hearing, Democrat Robert Wise (WV) announced his effort to exempt the Social Security trust fund and create a capital budget. Republican Christopher Cox (CA) announced his proposal for a 2/3 majority vote in both chambers to raise taxes.

Tuesday, February 4:

The House Judiciary Committee will mark up term limits.

Wednesday, February 5:

The House Transportation Infrastructure Committee plans to hold a markup of H.R. 4, the Truth in Budgeting Act, at 4:00pm. The bill would remove four transportation trust funds off budget. In a letter to Congress last year, Director Rivlin stated that the Administration strongly opposed the bill.

Also on Wednesday, the House Budget Committee will hold a hearing on the proposed Balanced Budget Amendment.

CONGRESS TODAY (2/3):

Senate was in Pro Forma session and the House was in recess.

HEARINGS:

Monday, February 3:

Today, Secretary Rubin testified before the House Judiciary Committee on the Balanced Budget Amendment. At the hearing, Democrat Robert Wise (WV) announced his effort to exempt the Social Security trust fund and create a capital budget. Republican Christopher Cox (CA) announced his proposal for a 2/3 majority vote in both chambers to raise taxes.

Tuesday, February 4:

The House Judiciary Committee will mark up term limits.

Wednesday, February 5:

The House Transportation Infrastructure Committee plans to hold a markup of H.R. 4, the Truth in Budgeting Act, at 4:00pm. The bill would remove four transportation trust funds off budget. In a letter to Congress last year, Director Rivlin stated that the Administration strongly opposed the bill.

Also on Wednesday, the House Budget Committee will hold a hearing on the proposed Balanced Budget Amendment.

**HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PRESIDENT'S WELFARE TO WORK INITIATIVE
AND PROPOSAL TO CHANGE FOOD STAMPS
AND BENEFITS FOR LEGAL IMMIGRANTS**

Cost of the Proposals Welfare to Work Initiatives: Approximately \$3.3 billion over 5 years

Changes to Food Stamps and Benefits for Legal Immigrants:
\$17.9 billion over 5 years

**Welfare to Work
Initiatives**

The Welfare to Work proposal is a comprehensive approach to helping States and cities create new jobs and prepare individuals for them, as well as providing employers with incentives to create new job opportunities for long term welfare recipients.

*Incentives for States
and Cities*

Creates the Welfare to Work Jobs Challenge. The Jobs Challenge is designed to help States and cities move a million of the hardest to employ welfare recipients into lasting jobs by the year 2000.

The proposal provides \$3 billion in mandatory funding for job placement and job creation. States and cities can use these funds to provide subsidies and other incentives to encourage private business to hire welfare recipients. States will also have the option to encourage the growth of intermediaries as job readiness and job placement agents and may use voucher like arrangements, to empower individuals with the tools and choices to help them get jobs and keep them.

Establishes Access to Jobs and Training. An important element of moving people from welfare to work is providing access to mobility. The FY98 budget provides \$100 million for a new Access to Jobs and Training Initiative within the Department of Transportation. This new activity will offer Federal Transit Administration grants to states and local entities for new or modified transportation services that target low income individuals, including current welfare recipients.

Establishes Bridges to Work. This comprehensive initiative also expands the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Bridges to Work demonstration Project, which links low-income people in central cities to job opportunities in surrounding suburban communities. In addition, HUD will award new portable rental assistance to localities that link their housing assistance with their efforts to move welfare recipients to work.

Access to Credit

Increases the Community Development Financial Institutions Fund. Finally, the Administration proposes to increase the Community Development Financial Institutions Fund to \$1 billion over the next five years thereby expanding the availability of credit, investment capital, financial services, and other development services in distressed urban and rural communities.

Incentives for Employers

Enhances the Work Opportunity Tax Credit. The Administration would provide further incentives to create new job opportunities for long-term welfare recipients by converting the current Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) into a much enhanced credit that focus on those who need the most help -- long term welfare recipients. The new credit would let employers claim a 50% credit on the first \$10,000 a year of wages, for up to two years, for workers they hire who were once long term welfare recipients.

Expands the Work Opportunity Tax Credit. In addition, the existing WOTC would be expanded to include able bodied childless adults aged 18-50 who are subject to a rigorous work requirement under the Administration's food stamp legislative proposal.

Restoring Fairness to the Federal Safety Net Programs

Several provisions in last year's Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunities Act have nothing to do with the goals of welfare reform -- moving people from welfare to work. Rather, they were misguided cuts in Federal Support to vulnerable populations, including the elderly and people with disabilities.

Food Stamps

Creates and Funds a Real Food Stamp Work Requirement. Instead of the harsh and unreasonable time limit in the welfare bill, which limits food stamp to able bodied childless adults between the ages of 18 and 50 to 3 months in 36, the President proposes a real work requirement for this group. Food Stamps would be limited to 6 months in 12 for those who refuse a work opportunity, a policy that would encourage work while giving those out of work the transitory help they need to get back on their feet. New funding and a wage supplementation option are expected to expand the number of work slots available to this group by 380,000 over five years.

Helps Families with High Housing Costs. Cuts to families with high housing costs would be ameliorated by increasing and eventually lifting the cap on the excess shelter deduction. This would restore the link between such families and the total cost of their housing.

Provides Benefits Which Recognize the Cost of Living. Low income families and individuals face increasing living costs each year. The Administration's proposal would reestablish the relationship between benefits and a rising cost of living, including the value of a

household's car.

Equity for Immigrants *Protects Immigrants Who Become Disabled.* Over 250,000 legal immigrants who experienced an accident or illness which resulted in disability after entering the U.S. would continue to receive SSI and Medicaid benefits. The welfare bill's bar on cash and medical assistance was short-sighted and particularly harsh towards those immigrants who can no longer support themselves because of disabilities.

Provides Targeted Assistance to Immigrant Children. The Administration's budget would continue to provide essential cash and medical assistance for low income legal immigrant children -- especially the disabled.

Creates an Exemption for Refugees More Sensitive to their Needs. The welfare bill exempted refugees and asylees from the benefit restrictions for their first five years in the country. The budget would lengthen the exemption for refugees and asylees from 5 to 7 years to provide a more appropriate amount of time for refugees and asylees to become citizens.

Delays the Ban for Immigrants Receiving Food Stamps. The Administration proposes to delay the ban on Food Stamps for legal immigrants until the end of FY1997 in order to give legal immigrant families, elderly and disabled more time to naturalize.

Protections for Children *Provides Adequate Funding for States During Recessions.* The proposal would provide sufficient funding for States who face regional or nationwide economic downturns which the current Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant does not include.

Continues Medical Care for Low-Income Disabled Children. The President would allow disabled children who lose their SSI eligibility due to changes in the definition of childhood disability to retain their Medicaid health coverage.

Perhaps it makes sense for Bruce to open the discussion and say that while we have the Communications folks in the room, we should talk about the TV special, allowing them to leave if they'd like while we discuss other issues.

Re: the WH Conference, there obviously aren't a lot of specifics to divulge to Reiner and company, apart from what the President will have said in his State of the Union address, but we can convey that we will certainly be in touch to consult.

On another front, we should probably all sit down at some point to discuss the Conference. FYI, Mrs. Clinton has indicated an interest in having the Conference last for more than two hours, so as to be more credible (although the President clearly would not need to be there for that long) and anchoring the Conference in the many practical things that parents can do to apply the recent research to their youngest children. Jeanine and I plan to compress the many recommendations of themes and participants that we have received, and hope to have a proposal to you by COB Friday.
