GAMBLING IMPACT STUDY COMMISSION

February 6, 1997

BACKGROUND

Fueled by concerns about the growing gambling industry, the 104th Congress passed the Gambling Impact Study Commission Act. The Act establishes a Gambling Impact Study Commission ("Commission") to study the impact of gambling on states, localities and Native American tribes. The Commission must submit a report to the President in August 1998 containing recommendations for legislation and administrative actions based on their findings.

ISSUE

The selection of members to the Commission has come under recent scrutiny. William Safire and a 2-2-97 Washington Post editorial complain that nearly all the nominees have close ties to the gaming industry which will impact their final recommendations. They further suggest that the selection of appointees is directly linked to financial contributions made by gaming interests.

SELECTION OF MEMBERS TO THE COMMISSION

The selection of the 9 members of the Commission is as follows: 3 members appointed by the President, 3 members appointed by the Senate (2 Republican appointments, 1 Democrat), and 3 members appointed by the House of Representatives (2 Republican appointments, 1 Democrat). This formula gives Democrats 5 appointments and the Republicans 4 appointments.

The list of named appointees is as follows:

House Speaker Gingrich:

1. J. Terrence Lanni, Chairman and CEO of MGM Grand Inc.
2. Kay Coles James, Dean of the Robertson School of Government at Regent University

Senate Majority Leader Trent Lott:

1. Dr. Paul Moore, radiologist from Mississippi
2. Dr. James Dobson, Focus on the Family

Senate Minority Leader Tom Daschle:

Leo McCarthy, former Lt. Governor of California

Minority Leader Gephardt and the President have not yet named their appointees. The list of possible appointees leaked to the press is as follows:

House Minority Leader Dick Gephardt:

John Sweeney of AFL-CIO, or John Wilhelm of the Culinary Union

President Clinton:

1. Bill Bible, Nevada Gaming Control Board
2. Minnesota Native American
3. A "split the difference think tanker"

Office of Presidential Personnel sent a decision memo to the President with their suggested list of appointees the week of January 20. Presidential Personnel will not specifically name the individuals they submitted nor will they say if the President has approved their list. They expect to make an announcement later this week.

COMMENT

If the Commission is comprised of the above-listed appointments (including those not yet named), there is evidence that 5 appointments would be pro-gaming, 2 would be anti-gaming (both Republican nominees), with 2 unknowns remaining. It is likely that at least one of the unknowns will side with the pro-gaming wing of the Commission. This will be unsatisfactory to those who argued for the need to establish the Commission.

Assuming Bill Bible is not viewed as an anti-gaming regulator but as a member with pro-gaming industry interests (a likely scenario), the current list of Presidential appointments is tilted to the pro-gaming side 2-1 and may ultimately end up 3-0. It should also be noted neither of the Congressional Democratic appointments is likely to side with the anti-gaming interests.

RECOMMENDATION

In order for the Commission to have credibility, it would probably require at least one or more appointments that is viewed as anti-gaming (e.g., appointee from religious community, or possibly sports industry). If the list of Presidential appointments is revisited, it must be done quickly since the appointments are already due to Congress.

REMOVING BARRIERS TO WORK FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

The President's budget includes important steps to make it possible for more people with disabilities to work. A large and growing number of people with disabilities can work, and want to work. With the ADA, changes in societal attitudes, and advances in technology, it is clearer than ever that being disabled does not mean that you can't contribute to our nation's economy. However, people with disabilities face a variety of complex barriers to work.

Therefore, the President's budget addresses this critical problem with the following three initiatives designed to assist people with disabilities who are eligible for Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI):

- **New State Option on Medicaid:** The budget proposes to help people with disabilities work without losing their health care coverage. Today, people on Supplemental Security Income (SSI) who go to work lose Medicaid if their earnings exceed caps that vary by state. Yet, it is often especially difficult for people with disabilities to get private insurance, especially coverage for any preexisting conditions. As a result, many people who are eligible for SSI "manage" their income to ensure that they keep Medicaid -- by stopping work when they hit the caps, or even turning down promotions. The President's proposal would create a new state option that would allow SSI beneficiaries with disabilities who earn more than these caps to keep Medicaid by contributing to the cost of their coverage as their income rises.
- **Medicare:** The President's budget authorizes a four-year demonstration to encourage Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries to return to work. Under the demonstration, certain SSDI beneficiaries who have exhausted their coverage [under a trial work period and an extended period of eligibility] would be eligible for up to four additional years of premium-free Part A coverage.
- **Pay for Results for Rehabilitation Services:** The Administration is proposing a new strategy to encourage more SSDI beneficiaries and SSI recipients to return to work. **Currently, the Social Security Administration (SSA) refers some SSDI and SSI beneficiaries to State Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) agencies. Under this pilot proposal, SSDI and SSI beneficiaries could choose their own public or private VR providers. Providers who successfully assist beneficiaries in leaving the rolls and returning to work would be paid a percentage of the disability benefits saved. These payments would continue only as long as the person remained off the rolls, up to a maximum of five years. Because providers would be rewarded for results rather than for their costs, this should encourage more providers to have a continuing interest in their clients' long term success, which in turn may lead to more beneficiaries returning to work.**

This plan creates new ways to help people find work and achieve their goals. The Administration looks forward to working with the Hill to enact these proposals. Since there are members of Congress from both sides of the aisle who are also working to solve this problem, we

are hopeful that we will have a constructive dialogue that will lead to the enactment of legislation.

You should both have a copy of OMB/Ken's attempt to explain why we aren't backtracking with the size of our fix package. The document is not too clear at present, but I'm not sure it's possible to make this one clear. I'm not even sure the argument works, other than just giving us the benefit of asserting that our critics are wrong.

I think the major problem is that our \$37 billion proposal never reflected the \$6 billion in goodies (child care, TANF) added late in the process, while the final bill at \$52 billion did. So in a sense the real gulf between us was more like \$21 billion, rather than the \$13-15 billion that is in people's heads.

The best I can do at the moment is something like:

"The difference between us and the Congress on food stamp/immigrants is and has always been \$21 billion. Our current proposal would restore \$18 billion of that amount. There were other baseline changes that cloud the comparison, but we have not changed our position.

You don't need this from me this morning but, for what it's worth: I found the explanation for why our fix package hasn't grown confusing. I know it is inherently very confusing, but I couldn't follow it very well, even though I had read the document.

I don't follow why the fact that CBO originally low-balled the cost of exempting legal immigrants from the SSI ban is so important. It just sounds like we discovered that our desires are more expensive than we thought. It doesn't seem to address the argument that we are now seeking to save less money from this law than we once were.

I have a feeling there are better ways to frame it -- either arguing that our new policy is actually to save MORE on food stamps/immigrants than our old policy; or else maybe argue that the difference between us and them at enactment was really more like \$20 billion than \$13-15 billion, because we always loved the \$6 billion in TANF money added at the end. I will talk to your staff to see if I am barking up the wrong tree.
