I. PURPOSE

To announce that seven DC college presidents have responded to your America Reads challenge by committing to partner with District public schools and place thousands of college student reading tutors in the DC schools over the next five years. You will also announce that AmeriCorps participants will coordinate and recruit additional tutors in targeted District schools. General Becton will announce that DC is taking the first steps towards meeting your America Reads Challenge.

II. BACKGROUND

The Clinton Administration has secured commitments from seven DC college presidents to place at least 680 new college reading tutors in the DC schools next year alone, and thousands over the next five years. This is in addition to the hundreds of college students who are already tutoring in the District schools. Most of the new tutors are federal college work study students. The colleges will use the increased federal work study funding and take advantage of your having waived the local match for work study students who tutor.

Last fall, you proposed that colleges dedicate half of their additional work study slots -- 100,000 slots -- to tutoring in reading or other community service. In December, you announced that 21 college presidents had responded to your challenge to dedicate work study slots for tutoring in reading and formed a steering committee to recruit additional colleges. This is an excellent example of how you are using the presidency to mobilize Americans without waiting for Congress to enact legislation. Father O'Donovan, President of Georgetown, and Dr. Robert Corrigan, President of San Francisco State University, are both members of this steering committee and both will be at the Garrison School tomorrow.

While the total number of additional college students pledged to tutor is lower than we had originally thought, it is still a substantial initial commitment. You challenged colleges nationally to provide 10 percent or 100,000 of the 1 million reading tutors called for under America Reads. The 680 new tutors pledged in the District are over 10 percent of the 5,400 tutors General Becton believes he needs to reach his goal of tutoring all the first graders in the 18 public schools he has targeted for tutoring.

General Becton will announce that DC will be taking the first step toward meeting your America Reads challenge by creating "DC Reads," a public-private partnership to use these college tutors and mobilize additional volunteer reading tutors to improve reading skills in the 18 elementary schools with the greatest academic need. AmeriCorps will put two AmeriCorps participants at each of the 18 schools to coordinate and recruit tutors, and General Becton will hire reading specialists to train the tutors at each of the schools. The non-profit, Communities In Schools, formerly called Cities in Schools, will help coordinate resources at each of these schools and recruit private sector partners. The private sector partners will include Nations Bank, First Union Bank, Bovermo Properties, and the Washington Post, although they have not finalized their commitments.

The three initial components of DC Reads are:

1. Book Buddies: Beginning later this year, AmeriCorps members, along with Communities in Schools, will recruit and coordinate volunteers or "book buddies" to tutor first grade students twice a week in each of the targeted 18 elementary schools. All tutors will be trained and assisted by reading specialists hired by General Becton;
2. Saturday Academy: DC Public Schools will establish Saturday Reading Academies for 3rd and 6th graders at the 18 targeted schools; and
3. Family Resource Centers: District and AmeriCorps will work with public and private partners to establish Family Resource Centers in the targeted schools to help parents support their children's reading.

You are making this announcement at Garrison Elementary School because it is the pilot school for DC Reads and is one of the 18 targeted schools. Three AmeriCorps participants recruited reading tutors who began tutoring there this week. Education Department employees and Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) members and Foster Grandparent members tutor at Garrison as well. Communities in Schools is also a partner at Garrison.

For example, the statute requires that even a simple decision to investigate a matter must be formally approved by the Commission. There is also no wiggle room under the statute on foreign contributions. Justice does have the ability to proceed independently in the case of criminal (not civil) violations but I am not sure what we want to do with that.

Although we obviously do not want to interfere with our current efforts on behalf of McCain-Feingold, we may want to consider, at some point, the advisability of offering legislation that addresses only FEC reform issues. This should including streamlining enforcement, requiring more frequent candidate disclosure filings, and breaking the partisan 3-3 logjam that is endemic to FEC decisionmaking.

On February 25, the National Council Advisory Board is scheduled to make its final recommendations on its appropriate schedule of mammography screening for women between the ages of 40 and 49. The Board is likely to be more sensitive to the concerns raised by proponents of annual screening than they were previously. (Specifically, they may weigh the evidence on the advantage of early screening more favorably than previously and be stronger about the need to evaluate this on a year by year, case by case basis by physician and patient). However, it is unlikely that they will recommend that women have annual screenings.

It is our strong belief that we should defer to the recommendations made by the scientists in this regard and avoid any impression that we are pressuring the Department or the Board to modify their recommendations. Having said this, we should make certain that the communication of their recommendation is handled sensitively and in a way that ensures that women understand that they should consult with their physician as to the advisability of having annual screenings. Moreover, we think we should seriously consider taking the public position that all insurers, whether they be public (Medicare, Medicaid, etc.) or private, should pay for screenings that physicians and patients determine as medically necessary.

Children's Health Executive Order: White House staff (DPC, NEC, CEQ, and OSTP) are continuing work to refine the Children's Health Executive Order. The order is designed to ensure that children are considered when the federal government takes action. The executive order, as currently drafted, contains three key parts: 1) a requirement that every agency give priority to identifying risks that may disproportionately affect children; 2) a requirement that agencies specifically evaluate the effects of their regulations on children, if the regulation may disproportionately affect children; and, 3) an interagency working group to coordinate a federal research agenda for children. The executive order will help to fill an important gap in our current approach to regulations by emphasizing that children are not just small adults and have unique needs related to federal policy making. We have convened several discussions with individual agencies and plan to call together deputies or principals for any further discussion in the near future.

ISTEA: White House staff have been hammering out final issues on the Administration's ISTEA bill. Specifically DPC, OSTP and CEQ are working to craft a joint position between EPA and DOT on environmental provisions in the bill. We have made excellent progress in resolving brownfields and clean air issues; the remaining question is whether the bill contains enough provisions that will increase energy efficiency and reduce greenhouse gases. Our goal is to finalize a bill in time for Secretary Slater's testimony on February 26.

Here's my quick insert for the Medicare issue we just talked about -- CJ:

On Monday, the Treasury Department will release its monthly report on the status of the Medicare Trust Fund. It will show a seemingly significant \$9 billion drop in reserves. This finding is not unexpected and the current status of the Trust Fund is still almost exactly in line with projections from the June, 1996 Trustees report. As such, this report does not change the status of the actuary's projected exhaustion date of 2001. However, when a bad monthly report is released, some House Republicans (like Archer and Thomas) use it as ammunition against us, suggesting that we continue to ignore the Medicare "crisis." Our response, as usual, is that this finding is not out-of-line with the projections of last year's Trustees report, that fluctuations are normal and expected, and that the Trust Fund still has more than \$125 billion left in reserves. We then go onto point out that we still need to take prompt action to strengthen the Trust Fund, as we have advocated in three successive balanced budget proposals.

DOJ -- The Department of Justice wants to file a brief in the next few days arguing that New York State should be permitted to cut off Medicaid-funded prenatal care for illegal aliens, in a case dating back to the late 1980's. The Bush Administration argued in court that illegal aliens were not entitled to Medicaid coverage for prenatal care. In 1991 a district court enjoined HHS and the state from cutting off benefits because congressional intent was unclear. However, the new welfare law appears to make it very clear that illegal aliens are not entitled to Medicaid-funded prenatal care, and DOJ would like to file a motion dismissing the complaint against the government. It appears that this would be the first action by the Clinton Administration on this issue.

In January the President directed the Secretary of DOT to work with consumer and industry groups to develop ways to increase seat belt use and to report back to him in 45 days (March 10). Increasing belt use in the U.S. by 15 percentage points -- from 68% to 83%-- would save over 2000 lives annually and would reduce airbag injuries. DOT's report is likely to urge the President to: set an ambitious national goal for seat belt use (XX % by the year 2000); challenge the states to pass "primary" seat belt laws (laws that allow cops to pull over and ticket passengers solely for not wearing seat belts); provide \$9 million in financial incentives to states to improve and enforce belt laws (consistent with our budget and draft ISTEA proposals); and challenge business groups to fund passenger safety education. DOT is working to get private sector commitments to fund education efforts before the report's release. DOT expects to be ready for any event as soon as March 13 or 14.

I apologize for not getting back to you last week on action ideas. I was staff contact for events on Friday, Weds., and Friday for HRC and/or the POTUS. I'm not sure what form people gave you ideas, so I will just briefly list some and I can put them into your format if someone circulates it to me.

DC: Bruce said DPC ought to get more active on education and crime in DC. Regarding education, Becton has not been as aggressive as Mayor Daley in Chicago and does not seem to have surrounded himself with the kind of people Daley has and he needs to. Melanne and I have discussed the idea of helping Becton create a small high-level advisory committee for him made up of the real stars in the field. This approach would enable us to do more while addressing the Dept.'s concerns about getting too involved in local education reform. I was planning to discuss the idea with Mike C, OMB, and the Dept. unless you recommend otherwise.

Regarding DC events, the FLOTUS has now done events on microenterprise, challenging law firms to partner with schools, and on colleges partnering with schools and pledging reading tutors. I worked with Ann Lewis, Steve Silverman, and Carol Thompson-Cole on the memo to the President on coordinating DC events, but did not yet hear whether Thursday night's meeting with the President on DC responded to that memo. The memo both described a process for coordinating events, and listed some of the ideas I have been kicking around for a while, such as White House involvement in DC net days, a big cleanup effort on Earth Day, and highlighting agency efforts, including NASA's involvement in the schools and GSA's donation of computers.

DC School Construction Event: Next Thursday 2/27 we expect the privatization of Connie Lee to be completed, making it possible for us to do a high profile event with Rubin and one of the White House principals announcing that we are making millions of dollars available for school construction and repair in DC -- more than would be available for DC under our national school construction proposal. Treasury will be submitting an event proposal to the White House.

DC Economic Development: The POTUS is scheduled to announce the specifics of his DC economic development proposal on Friday March 7.

DC summer jobs: We could help ensure there are jobs available for DC teens this summer in at least two ways: by convening DC employers and challenging them to do more and by continuing and expanding the federal agencies' summer jobs and internship programs. Last summer the federal government hired hundreds of DC youth. The Treasury Dept. has powerful letters from students who interned there over the summer. One DC public school student said the internship was her first experience in the work world, taught her how to use a computer, and allowed her to visit the White House for the first time -- after having lived in DC for 18 years!

Pediatric Drug Labeling: Elizabeth Drye, Patsy, OVP, and I have held some meetings with FDA and outside groups on the lack of pediatric safety and dosing information on many drugs with pediatric applications. FDA has made it relatively easy for drug companies to provide this data, but still most do not do it, leaving it up to doctors to decide whether to prescribe the drug for children and in what doses. This issue has become very hot now for two reasons: it is now clear that the actions Kessler took to encourage companies to submit this data have not worked, and many doctors are afraid to prescribe the highly effective anti-HIV protease inhibitors to children without better information because the drugs are so toxic. Further Administration action on this issue could generate industry opposition, but would likely earn broad public support and attention. There seem to be several views within the Administration on how best to proceed on this issue, and I believe it is ripe for DPC to step in and develop a consensus. Elizabeth and I would be happy to brief you on this issue.

Child Care: I do not have a specific initiative in mind, but as you and Bruce have stated before, we need to take some actions on child care, perhaps on quality/safety. I would think we need to ask HHS, DOL and others to give us some proposals. Were you planning on doing this as part of our 0-3 working group?

0-3: List of possible actions being developed.

Education: I won't attempt this without seeing what Mike has already given you. As I mentioned before, we could do a great POTUS or FLOTUS event on the release of a new Education Dept. manual on how to establish a community school, similar to the manual on school uniforms. It is very well done and ready to go. Rahm had initially scheduled a POTUS event to release the manual, but it fell through and I don't believe it has been rescheduled.

Family Medical Leave: Rahm and Gene have a list of reports on the FMLA that DOL is preparing an which could be the subject of future events. I can get a copy of the latest to you if you are interested and do not already have it. While recent discussions have focused on linkage with flex-time, I think there are some additional expansion proposals that the Administration might entertain and would be much less controversial than lowering the firm-size threshold to 25 employees -- such as making time I know Gene will be assigning someone from the NEC to be working on family and work issues, but am unclear how active you expect DPC to be.
