Tobacco -- At today's kick butts planning meeting (2:00) I suggest we advocate that the President speak out about recent aggressive tobacco advertising practices. The President could call on companies to act with moral courage and restraint. Companies are not yet using the Internet to advertise directly at US sites, but they are using it in subtle new ways that might recruit youth smokers. Further, companies have recently used bold new advertising tactics that reach youth in other media. For example, RJ Reynolds has moved attractive Joe Camel imagery right onto cigarette packs and is marketing a "collector pack" series. Virginia slims is also currently sponsoring a concert tour and CD for young new women artists as part of its "It's a woman's thing" campaign (ugh). Administration staff and outside groups agree it's a good time for some strong words from POTUS.

Food Safety -- USDA/FDA/CDC are holding a 2 1/2 day meeting M-W next week to work with groups on the President's food safety initiative. They've asked me to speak Monday a.m. for 15 minutes outlining the initiative. We expect about 200-300 people from industry trade associations, science associations, and consumer advocacy groups. As you know, I met with the senior people from most of the key groups in White House meetings in early March. Is it o.k. for me to speak? Do you want to review my remarks? Could be trade press there.

1. Smart Guns.

Perfect timing on your request. NIJ is about 2-4 weeks away from announcing that they have chosen a prototype smart gun that they will start testing in the field. They are providing a \$500,000 grant to consortium of companies such as Colt Manufacture to demonstrate the gun.

The gun will have a "Active Radio Frequency Tag" that will permit the gun to be only fired within a 3 feet (or less) range from a wrist band that the police officer will wear. The gun will also have a "lasar-aiming element" so that when the officer points his gun at a bad guy, a red dot will appear on his target. Supposedly, this serves as an effective warning to the culprit that he could potentially be blown away so he better calm down. This stuff is so cool.

I told Boyd to wait this time before he leaks all of this to the paper.

2. Police Youth Academies.

I talked to Justice Department -- BJA has funded the NYPD youth academy program for two years at about \$50,000 per year. This is a summer program that Bratton started and that Safir has continued.

COPS told me that they have never considered this and that -- because of FY 97 appropriations language -- they are prohibited from using funds for non-hiring grants.

However, they admitted to me that they received reprogramming approval from Congress to fund \$75 million in backlogged applications for their "Problem-solving Partnerships" program. This is the program that we tried to Brattonize and they were resisting. In fact, I recall Bratton

having a grant application for this program to fund a Comstat initiative for about 20+ New England towns (I have much more that I have learned on Comstat in the last day that I want to share w/ you at some point --- this is great stuff that we could probably be doing more on).

I have a call into Brann to push him on the youth academies.

Through recent discussions with HUD and OMB, two housing issues related to welfare reform have surfaced that we need to discuss and resolve. Right now, we have scheduled a meeting on Wednesday, April 2 from 3:00 -4:30 in room 211 to begin discussing the following issues.

First is the question of who should qualify for an income exclusion when determining rent amounts. Previously, the small population enrolled in the JOBS program who moved into work qualified for such exclusions. However, now essentially all of those on TANF who go through training and into work will qualify. Further, those who go from TANF directly into work without moving through training DO NOT qualify. Should all welfare recipients who receive housing subsidies and move from welfare to work receive an income exclusion? If not, how do we choose which populations are eligible? What are the ramifications on HUD's budget?

Second, the Feds pay 100% of admin and capitol costs for public housing and serve over 1.4 million households, about 60% of whom are on AFDC. Several states in their TANF plans are creating a two-tiered welfare system--those who receive housing subsidies will receive less in TANF benefits, those who do not receive housing subsidies will receive a larger TANF check. This has tremendous budgetary implications for HUD and particularly concerns OMB.

Joining us for this meeting will be Olivia Golden and other staff from HHS and Michael Stegman and Paul Leonard from HUD. Please let me know via e-mail whether or not you'll be attending. Thanks.

This issue may not be totally ripe, but here it is (and it's long and confusing, I know):

Preserving Medicaid Coverage for Legal Immigrants Losing SSI -- We have been exploring how to preserve Medicaid coverage for legal immigrants who lose SSI. The welfare law requires SSI cut-offs for most legal immigrants in July and August. For Medicaid, the welfare law allows states to decide whether to continue coverage for legal immigrants. It is heartening to note that, to date, no states have opted to drop legal immigrants from Medicaid.

Nevertheless, a problem remains because SSI automatically entitles you to Medicaid in most states. A person losing SSI may qualify for Medicaid through another route -- as a pregnant woman, very poor with children, medically needy -- or may not, depending on the individual and the features of that state's Medicaid program. Texas and Florida are particularly hard pressed on this issue: Texas has no medically needy program, while Florida's is very "bare bones." Either state could remedy the problem by getting the state legislature to add a new Medicaid state option, but they are reluctant to do so because it would be difficult to pass such a measure or to limit it to legal immigrants.

We have come to an agreement on a partial solution: HHS will issue a change in its definition of a medically needy program that will preserve Medicaid for 31,000 people in seven states. In addition, HHS will issue a regulation to delay for one year the date when people lose coverage, so that HHS has time to ensure that its interpretation of the law is correct. This would preserve coverage for 160,000 people for one year. (You should know that advocacy groups are arguing for a complete solution, but HHS is convinced that this is not legally permissible.)

The cost of both items is \$1.4 billion over five years. Virtually all of this cost is already in our budget, as part of our legislative proposal to preserve SSI and Medicaid for disabled legal immigrants. We plan to announce this in mid-April. OMB argues that our announcement should be low-profile because they fear we will face criticism on budget and policy grounds. Finally, you should know that this announcement could dilute some of the momentum for our legal immigrant "fix" package, because we will have solved (for one year) one of the most sensational situations -- people being evicted from nursing homes.

We've had a chance to review the one page HHS privatization paper on principles and USDA's two drafts of a letter to Texas. We understand that HHS also has drafted a letter, but we haven't seen that yet. Also, USDA is planning on revising their letter for a second time.

Two things jump out at us.

First, the HHS paper and the USDA letter leave us with the impression that the agencies are willing to allow the up front "initial application processing" to be privatized through the interview. The final decision would be made by a State employee. This is based on the Medicaid model which only allows the initial application work to be contracted out. That represents a significant amount of the Medicaid work since there is not as much on-going certification in Medicaid as in Food Stamps or AFDC/TANF. The USDA letter mirrors the HHS paper and therefore only applies to the up-front work, leaving out a significant amount of the work which is typically performed by an eligibility worker through frequent on-going contact with the household. It was rather clever on their part, but I think the State might not react well. I don't think they were trying to put anything past us; instead, this oversight indicates that there is still some miscommunication regarding what functions should be priva

tized. For instance, in the meeting held earlier this week, B. Vladek was talking about privatizing much the same Elena has talked about it, i.e. through and including the interview. K. Thurm was using a vocabulary which indicated a position much more akin to USDA's which says that the interview has too much discretionary decision making to be privatized. The paper is a slightly different take from both of those views because it would only privatize up-front application work rather than the ongoing work over the months and years to determine if the individual maintains their eligibility. (Perhaps the HHS letter is different, but I'm assuming that it follows the paper.)

Barry, in his role as Ken this week, believes that the players should sit down one more time to go over exactly what we all mean by "initial processing", "decision making" and "certification" before HHS makes a call to the State and certainly before any paper or letters are shared with the State. We should be very clear on what we all mean so that we give consistent responses to the State -- because they will ask questions.

Second, both the HHS paper and the USDA letter are rather technical. They don't address the broadbased principles which Raines and Koskinen feel should apply to any privatization initiative: improved program performance, improved financial integrity and improved cost effectiveness. A whole range of issue are captured under these umbrella terms such as quality control, recipient access to benefits, the role of current state employees, etc. We know that we owe you language, but its not clear that the letters as written are appropriate for this kind of discussion. That's a problem easily solved, but again we probably need to sit down and make sure we are all on the same page with regards to process. Also, as Barry mentioned in his e-mail both letters should be reviewed by Labor and OPM.

I don't think Ken will be back until mid-week. We'd prefer to wait for him, but we and Barry can meet before than if time dictates that this process move more quickly.

Here are 2 items. If you want to hold the second item until we are further along in the process, and have had a chance to discuss in more detail with you and Bruce, that will be ok with me.

We are preparing for a major endorsement of your national testing initiative on Wednesday April 2. At a roundtable discussion, Delaine Eastin, California Superintendent of Schools, will announce that California will participate in the national testing initiative. Together with the commitments already received from Maryland, Michigan and North Carolina, this means that states serving approximately 20% of the nation's students will participate in this initiative. In addition, John Dorr, managing partner of the venture capital firm Kleiner, Perkins, Caulfield and Byers, will announce that more than 100 high-tech CEO's are endorsing your testing initiative and will urge every governor and state education official to have their state participate.

DPC and Education Department staff (Mike Cohen and Mike Smith) will begin consulting with governors, key Members of Congress and staff, and others, to determine how best to establish an advisory process for the testing initiative that will provide public credibility and political support for the testing initiative, without delaying the very tight deadline for developing the tests.

SUBJECT: BRADY LAW STRATEGY IN RESPONSE
TO SUPREME COURT DECISION

The Supreme Court will decide on the constitutionality of the Brady Law within the next few months, and most experts believe that the Court will hold that the Federal Government cannot require state and local law enforcement officials to conduct criminal background checks. We wanted you to know the strategy we will propose in the event the Court rules this way.

Three elements of the law would most likely still be standing --- 1) Brady's 5-day waiting period; 2) Requirement that gun dealers obtain a statement from purchasers concerning the proposed handgun sale; and 3) Transfer by gun dealers of the statement to state or local law enforcement officers. In addition, the decision would apply only to 24 Brady states, and not to the Brady alternative states (states where state legislatures have established an alternative system that meets federal standards).

In the event of an adverse Court decision, law enforcement officials would be able to continue to conduct criminal record checks of handgun purchasers on a voluntary basis. And most law enforcement officials believe that the vast majority of local chief law enforcement officers would continue to perform background checks.

We have been working with the Justice and Treasury Departments to develop a multi-pronged strategy to respond to such a decision. The strategy would stress that the majority of the Brady Law is still intact, but criminals should have no safe haven. This landmark public safety measure is too important to have judicially-created exceptions. The law should be clear -- no background check, no gun sale.

The steps we recommend to implement the strategy are:

- 1) The afternoon of the day the opinion comes down, you would make a statement at the White House with the Bradys condemning the decision and directing the Attorney General and the Secretary of Treasury to review the decision and present you with options to respond within the week.

At an event later in the same week, you would stand with the Attorney General, Secretary Rubin, law enforcement chiefs and sheriffs, Members of Congress, and the Bradys to announce the following:

- 2) Legislation. Sending legislation to the Hill that will respond to this Supreme Court decision and challenge Congress to move on it quickly (in addition, Treasury is reviewing any actions you could take by Executive Order in conjunction with the legislative fix);
- 3) Law Enforcement Pledge. Release a pledge signed by chiefs and sheriffs throughout the nation that they will continue to enforce the Brady Law -- many of whom would be in attendance at the event.
- 4) Reno/Rubin Letter. Release Letter from Reno and Rubin to every police chief and sheriff in the country urging them to continue their public safety duty to conduct background checks on handgun purchasers. The letter would be sent electronically by Treasury to all state and local law enforcement organizations, and also sent to state attorneys general.
- 5) ATF Letter. ATF Director Magaw would send notification to Federal Firearms Licensees explaining the Court decision and noting that their obligations remain unaffected.

Legislation:

The Justice and Treasury Departments are considering legislative options to pursue in response to an adverse Court decision. Understandably, they have only developed general approaches, since a more definitive recommendation is dependent upon an analysis of the Court's opinion.

Here are at least some preliminary options that we are considering.

Condition Funding. Condition federal law enforcement funding to states and localities on the passage of state legislation requiring background checks before the purchase of a handgun. As would any funding condition, this option causes some consternation in the law enforcement community.

Regulate FFLs. Another option we are reviewing to require background checks is through the federal government's authority to regulate Federal Firearms Licenses dealers (FFL). Under this approach, an FFL would not be permitted to sell a handgun unless the chief law enforcement official has certified that s/he will conduct a background check. Without this certification, the FFL would be prohibited from selling handguns -- at all.

Most chief law enforcement officers are going to conduct background checks, those who refuse will have to explain why they don't to their gun owners -- because there will be no handgun sales in their area. It sticks to a simple overall message -- no background check, no gun sale. Handgun Control supports this approach.
