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Federal Judge William Osteen has indicated he will not issue a decision on FDA's tobacco rule before April 14, but we expect him to issue his decision that day or shortly thereafter. Three general outcomes are possible: 1) the court upholds the rule; 2) the court rules that FDA has jurisdiction, but that portions or all of the rule are invalid (still a major victory); or 3) the court rules against FDA jurisdiction and the rule. We have worked with HHS, DoJ and other WH offices to prepare statements for each of these scenarios so you and others will be able to respond quickly to the decision. The Justice Department will review the decision immediately. If the court decision is made available in the morning and is not completely favorable, we expect to be prepared to announce later that same day the Administration's intent to appeal. We are also working with the departments to prepare new policies you could announce within days or weeks after the decision to ensure further progress on tobacco as the FDA rule moves through the appeals process.

**President Clinton's Petition To The Federal Election Commission To**  
**Ban 'Soft Money'**  
April \_\_, 1997

Today, the President petitioned the Federal Election Commission (FEC) to revisit its rules on 'soft money' and act to ban the use of soft money in federal elections, as proposed in bipartisan campaign finance reform legislation now before Congress. The petition proposes to end the current soft money system by requiring that candidates for federal office and national parties only be permitted to raise and spend 'hard money' -- funds subject to the restrictions, contribution limits, and reporting requirements of the 1974 Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA). This ban would apply to all political party committees, as anticipated by the bipartisan campaign finance reform legislation.

**'Soft money' and federal elections**

Soft money plays an increasingly large role in funding political parties and campaigns. So-called hard money contributions are those that are given to candidates or parties subject to the limits and disclosure of federal law. Soft money, on the other hand, goes to national or state political parties, and can be raised in large amounts and from sources that could not give under federal election law (directly from corporations and unions).

The role of soft money has grown dramatically in the past several elections. In 1996, the Democratic Party raised \$123 million, and the Republican Party raised \$138 million in soft money -- more than triple the total of four years before.

Soft money is today lawful under a series of regulations put forward by the Federal Election Commission (FEC). The FEC first issued advisory opinions on this in 1978. It did not take further action during the 1980's, as the role of soft money grew. In 1990, ordered to take some action on soft money by a federal court, the FEC promulgated regulations that govern how parties can allocate funds between federal and non-federal activities. (The court deferred to the agency as to how to address the issue, but noted that the agency could go as far as to ban the use of soft money for mixed federal- and state-political activity.)

In addition, the 1979 statutory amendments to the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) authorized allocation of national and state hard money for joint activities.

**President Clinton's support for a soft money ban**

President Clinton has consistently called for legislation that would ban the use of soft money in federal elections. He called for this legislation during the 1992 campaign, and

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supported the campaign finance reform legislation that was vetoed that year by President Bush (which would have banned soft money). The campaign finance reform plan he proposed in May 1993 included a soft money ban; this proposal was passed by both chambers but was killed by a Senate filibuster in 1994.

The bipartisan campaign finance reform legislation introduced by Senators McCain and Feingold and Representatives Shays and Meehan would prohibit the use of soft money in federal elections.

In January, 1993, the Democratic National Committee voluntarily announced that it would restrict contributions it can currently accept under the law. It would not accept soft money contributions in excess of \$100,000 per year, and it would not accept contributions from individuals who are not citizens or from domestic subsidiaries of foreign corporations.

### **Contents of the request to the FEC**

The President will call on Congress to enact the bipartisan legislation to reform campaign financing and ban soft money. In the meantime, he is formally requesting the FEC to act now, under existing law, to write new regulations banning the use of soft money to influence federal elections, as envisioned in the legislation. Specifically, the President is requesting that the Commission consider new rulemaking to accomplish the following:

- Prohibit national political parties (and their congressional campaign committees or agents) from soliciting or receiving any funds not subject to the limitations or prohibitions of FECA. (This would preclude, for example, contributions directly from corporate or union treasuries, or contributions from individuals in excess of the amount an individual can give to a national parties federal account.)
- Prohibit any federal officeholder or candidate (and their agents) from soliciting or receiving any funds not subject to the limitations or prohibitions of FECA.
- Provide that any amount of funds expended by a political party during a federal election year for any activity that influences a federal election (including any voter registration or get-out-the-vote drive, generic advertising, or any communication that refers to a federal candidate) must be paid for from funds subject to FECA. (This would end the allocation system, currently authorized by the FEC, under which hard and soft money are mixed for campaign activities that affect both state and federal elections.)

Not sure what we're planning to do with this, but Anne Lewis (NEC) and I are working to get it ready to go by mid April. As you know, our legislative proposal extends the FMLA to cover an additional 24 hours for school activities, well-child check-ups, and care of an elderly relative won't. You should know that a memo from the President asking agencies to implement this policy administratively won't give federal employees any completely new benefits -- under existing law, supervisors can give employees leave without pay for these activities at the supervisors' discretion. Still, supervisors often say no, and OPM, Anne and I think that a memo from the President to the agencies stating they should implement this policy will make it much more likely that supervisors will approve leave requests. We recommend sending the memo, but not over-selling it. Not sure how newsworthy it is. (The legislation gives employees and entitlement to leave for these activities if they give 7 days notice; we can't give them that legal entitlement w/out legislation).



**National Week of Service**

Today the President is designating a new national week of service (April 13-19). The President is asking AmeriCorps alumni and returned Peace Corps volunteers to engage young people in service across the country. AmeriCorps and the Peace Corps will organize activities in more than 15 states and in hundreds of communities, with 3,000 to 4,000 youth newly engaged in service during the week. These efforts will build on the existing National Volunteer Week and National Youth Service Day (April 15), which are a public-private partnership between the Corporation for National Service, the entire national service network, and community volunteers, including the Points of Light Foundation, Youth Service America, the US Chamber of Commerce, the US Conference of Mayors, Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America, and many others. During the week, as many as 2 million young people will participate in 3,000 events across the country.

**Maryland and High School Service**

The Maryland high school and middle school students at the White House today (see attached list) are actively engaged in service. Their community service and service learning activities include tutoring, mentoring, assisting in food and clothing drives, and many other activities. Maryland is the only state in the nation with a state-wide service learning graduation requirement, but many school districts and private schools throughout the nation include service learning as an element of effective education. Maryland Lt. Governor Kathleen Kennedy Townsend spearheaded the idea in Maryland and founded the organization that oversees this requirement throughout the state.

**The National Service Scholars Program**

Today the President announced the launching of his National Service Scholars program -- an opportunity for schools and communities to recognize young people for outstanding volunteer service while helping them continue their education with a \$1,000 scholarship. The Corporation for National Service is offering a matching \$500 scholarship for one high school junior or senior selected by each principal. Already a host of civic volunteer organizations -- including the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Moose International, Lions Clubs, and the U.S. Jaycees among others -- have accepted the President's challenge to work with their local chapters to provide matching funds for these scholarships. These organizations will work with high schools to identify one student in each high school doing outstanding community service. Applications went out to high school principals two weeks ago. For 1997, at least \$3 million in matching funds is available, and the President's budget includes funds to make this program nation-wide next year.

**Benefits of Service Learning Programs**

A new study by Brandeis University and Abt Associates for the Corporation for National Service shows that well-designed, fully-implemented service learning programs improve learning, strengthen civic attitudes, and promote service activities. Students who participate in these school programs actually get better grades in math, science, and social studies. They also become better citizens -- more aware of the needs in their community and more personally and socially responsible. This report is the first national study to show significant gains in academic

achievement by high school and middle school students as a result of service learning programs. The study evaluated 1,000 students in programs in 17 sites across the country during the 1995-96 school year. Service-learning combines meaningful service activities with formal educational curriculum and structured time for students to reflect on their service experiences.

**Commitment to Summit by Education Associations**

Today the President is announcing that the National Association of Secondary School Principals, representing more than 40,000 school administrators, has responded to the Summit's call to action by pledging to introduce service learning to more than 2 million students, bringing the service ethic and opportunity to young people through the National Association of Student Councils, the National Honor Society/National Junior Honor Society; and the new American Technology Honor Society. In addition, the Council of Chief State School Officers has already made a commitment to the Summit that they will increase the number of states that use and support service learning to 25 states by the year 2000.

**Presidents' Summit for America's Future**

The Summit, which will be held in Philadelphia on April 27-29, was first announced at the White House this January. The President and former President Bush are honorary co-chairs of the Summit, with Gen. Colin Powell the General Chairman and Henry Cisneros and Lynda Robb the vice-chairs. The Summit is an opportunity for all Americans to answer a call to action through citizen service. The goal is to provide all children and youth with the five fundamental resources they need: an ongoing relationship with a caring adult, safe places and structured activities, a healthy start, a marketable skill through effective education, and an opportunity for young people to give back through community service. Delegations from 140 communities and 50 states will develop plans to help make this a reality.

SUBJECT: DPC Weekly Report

**1. Welfare Caseload Dropped 20% in First Term:** We haven't released them yet, but the final caseload reductions are in for the first term. Welfare caseloads dropped a record 2.8 million from January 1993 to January 1997 -- a 20% decline. There were 860,000 fewer families on welfare at the end of your first term than when you took office. Caseloads dropped in 47 states (Hawaii, Alaska, California, and D.C. are the exceptions). The greatest declines were in Wisconsin (49%), Oregon (43%), West Virginia (43%), Indiana (42%), and Oklahoma (40%); a total of 18 states had caseload declines of 30% or more. To put this in perspective, the caseload *decreased* as much in the last four years as it *increased* in the first 25 years of the AFDC program. (The welfare rolls did not reach 3 million until 1960.)

We can release these numbers in conjunction with Thursday's Cabinet meeting, when agencies and the White House will present their plans to hire people off welfare. We will follow up shortly with a Council of Economic Advisers white paper that attributes 42% of the caseload decline to economic growth, 32% to our welfare waivers, and 26% to other unexplained factors (e.g., increased child support collections, expansion of the EITC, heightened awareness of pending welfare reforms, and any unknown variables).

**2. Welfare-to-Work Foundation:** Eli Segal is ready to incorporate and announce his foundation, which will be headed by United Airlines CEO Gerald Greenwald. The CEOs of UPS, Burger King, Sprint, Monsanto, and probably Marriott will also be founding board members. Eli hopes to line up 15-25 other companies for a White House announcement in late April. His long-term goal is to sign up at least 2,500 businesses, and to help establish a national network of intermediaries like America Works to provide the job-readiness, job placement, and support many recipients need and most employers don't know how to provide. He plans to launch challenges in several major cities, and would like to kick off that effort with a major Presidential event with a few hundred businesses in Milwaukee in May or June.

**3. AIDS Developments:** Your idea to pick Sandy Thurman as AIDS Director is going over well in the community, and should be well-received at Monday's announcement. I have

met with her several times, and think she's terrific. Your Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS will meet in Washington this week and make two major recommendations: 1) that you should call for increased investment in research to enable the development of an AIDS vaccine by a date certain (probably within a decade); and 2) that Secretary Shalala should certify that needle exchange programs reduce the spread of HIV and do not increase drug use. The first recommendation is good news, and may help us overcome NIH's steadfast resistance to letting us earmark more resources for vaccine research or specify a target date. On needle exchange, we'll have to proceed more carefully.

**4. Seat Belts and NEXTEA:** The Transportation Department has completed a report on measures to increase seat belt use toward a new national goal of 85% by the year 2000, but we need your sign-off on a key proposal. In most states, seat belt laws are enforced only when a driver is stopped for some other reason. But 11 states and D.C. have adopted primary seat belt laws, which allow for ticketing solely for failure to use a seat belt. Belt use in these states is 15% higher than in states with secondary enforcement laws. NHTSA estimates that enactment of primary belt laws by the remaining 39 states would save 1,800 lives a year.

The NEXTEA bill you announced March 12 includes financial incentives (grants) for states to adopt primary belt laws. Secretary Slater would like to send Congress a new safety title for NEXTEA to strengthen states' incentive by adding a "soft sanction": States that do not pass primary laws or achieve 85% belt use by October 2002 would have to transfer 1.5% of their federal highway funds into their highway safety programs.

The NGA opposes this proposal, as do the National Motorists Association, individual liberties groups, and some conservative and western members of Congress. A broad coalition of automakers, insurance companies, safety advocates, and law enforcement will support it. DOT believes the proposal has a good chance of congressional approval, in the wake of increased public outcry over airbags and attention to the importance of seat belts. Gene and I both recommend that you support Secretary Slater's proposal.

**5. Tobacco:** Federal Judge William Osteen in North Carolina has indicated he will not issue a decision on FDA's tobacco rule before April 14, but we expect him to issue his decision that day or shortly thereafter. Three general outcomes are possible: 1) the court upholds the rule; 2) the court rules that FDA has jurisdiction, but that portions or all of the rule are invalid; or 3) the court rules against FDA jurisdiction and the rule. We have worked with HHS, Justice, and other White House offices to prepare statements for each of these scenarios so you and others will be able to respond quickly to the decision. The Justice Department will review the decision immediately. If the decision is not completely favorable, we expect to be prepared to announce later that same day the Administration's intent to appeal. We are also working with the departments to prepare new policies you could announce within days or weeks after the decision to ensure further progress on tobacco as the FDA rule moves through the appeals process.

**6. California Testing Feud:** A few days after Delaine Eastin and 240 business leaders endorsed our testing initiative, the head of the California Board of Education (a Wilson appointee) wrote Secretary Riley contending that the state legislature would have to pass a new

law before the Board could consider proceeding with our tests. Eastin strongly disagrees, and has fired back publicly at the Board, pointing out that California already administers the NAEP test on a sample basis and that the Board has long sought a national means of assessment to compare California's performance with other states. It's too early to tell whether this is a short-term political feud or will heat up into a long-term problem.

**7. COPS Program:** The Justice Department has informed us that large-city demand for additional COPS grants is seriously lagging this year. Joe Brann wants our sign-off on administrative changes that will help avoid unspent COPS funding.

The Crime Bill requires half the grants to go to jurisdictions with populations of 150,000 or more. Currently, the program requires a 25% local match, three-year grants, and a cap of \$75,000 per officer over the life of the grant. Because large cities have much higher costs per officer, the cap forces them to pay a match of up to 40%. To generate further demand in large cities, Brann wants to use his discretionary authority to eliminate the cap, extend the grant period to 4 years, extend current grants for 1 year if they agree to add new officers (so that existing grants do not have less favorable terms), and require these cities to deploy the new officers to targeted "hot spot" crime areas. These changes could mean that it will take another year to reach 100,000 officers (2001 instead of 2000), but we don't have much choice if we're going to stimulate the necessary demand for large city applications.

**8. Voting Rights and Education Reform:** This week, the Justice Department decided not to invoke the Voting Rights Act to block New York's school reorganization and reform efforts. The Department had caused a panic in New York City last month by threatening to delay reorganization on the grounds that it might disenfranchise school board voters, even though only 5% of people currently vote in those elections and the city's school boards have been notoriously unresponsive to public outcry for reform. This week's decision is a good precedent if the issue comes up in other states.

Excerpt from Remarks by the President during Women's Economic Leadership Forum, April 4, 1997:

In addition to that, we have tried to improve, as Betsy said, the operation of the federal child care programs and how they interface with those at the local level. And in the welfare reform bill, one of the best things about it was we put up \$4 billion more for child care. But let me say, I still believe in some ways that's the most underfunded employee support program in the United States. And I urge you to take a look at that -- about the delivery system and how it works. (Applause.)

One of the things that I think should be done intensely in every state -- and I'm going around to state legislators, along with the Vice President and the First Lady, to talk to them about education reform and welfare reform -- and one of the things that I think every state should do is to target the establishment of child care centers and the training of child care workers for moving people from welfare to work and then giving people on welfare who do become certified child care workers either free or discounted service for their own children in the child care centers where their parents work.

If you look at it, we have a window here of significant opportunity, because the states got a block grant under the welfare reform bill, targeted to how much they were getting when the welfare rolls were at their highest. The welfare rolls have now dropped by about 2.5 million, the biggest drop in history. So they have some extra money here until the next economic recession comes along.

And I believe that one of the most significant things that can be done -- and I urge all of you to ask your states to

consider doing this and to lobby at the state level to do this -- is to focus very sharply on the opportunity this welfare reform bill plus this extra cash the states gives up to set up for the first time a genuinely comprehensive well trained, well staffed, properly funded child care network in the country in a way that will move people from welfare to work and make child care available to lower wage working people who have never been on welfare in their lives, but can't afford decent child care for their kids. It's a terrific opportunity and we should be doing it. (Applause.)
