Today at the White House, the President and First Lady host “The White House Conference on Early Childhood Development and Learning: What New Research on the Brain Tells Us About Our Youngest Children.”

- The President said in his State of the Union address, “learning begins in the first days of life...scientists are now discovering how young children develop emotionally and intellectually from their very first days, and how important it is for parents to begin immediately talking, singing, even reading to their infants.”
- Today’s Conference brings together esteemed scientists, doctors, sociologists, parents and other experts to examine how we can use this new research in practical ways -- to be better parents and care-givers, and to raise stronger families.

The Drugs and Addictions Working Group at Harvard delivered a half-day briefing for Gen. McCaffrey and some of his staff just before he took office last year. He seems to have found it useful.

I would like to offer a similar briefing to Rahm Emmanuel and anyone else you and he think might be interested. The topics could be shaped to fit the interests of those attending, but we would plan to cover the underlying logic of drug policy, the values and limits of the main instruments (enforcement, treatment, and prevention), an overview of the budget and the issues around shifting it, and a few hot current topics (coerced abstinence, violence-minimizing enforcement, medical marijuana, drug treatment in the managed-care environment).

Thank you for your letter of March 14 on concerning legislation to create national uniform standards for some certain types of securities litigation. The new regime put in place by the Private Securities Litigation Reform Act is still unfolding in its infancy, and one of the issues that will need to be considered as we gain experience with the Act is how its provisions affect the roles of state and federal courts in private securities fraud litigation.

The Securities and Exchange Commission has just released a report I asked them to prepare for me and for Congress that I requested, assessing the impact effects of last year's legislation -- particularly the impact of its "safe harbor" provisions. , including not only issues relating to litigation, but also the impact of the "safe harbor" for forward looking statements on information available to investors. Other studies also have been done. We will be reviewing the SEC study and other reports and data to assess the need for further legislation. We look forward to working with you on this important issue.

As you may recall, I submitted a memo to Sylvia on two Native American issue proposals. When I followed up with Angus King of her staff, he told me that the memo was forwarded to Lynn Cutler, the new person at Intergovernmental handling Native American issues. I took this to mean that Sylvia neither approved nor disapproved the recommendations.

The quarterly DPC Working Group meeting on Native Americans is next Wednesday. There is a lot of interest on behalf of the DPC working group staff and Babbitt to issue the kind of memo we recommended to Sylvia to get updates from agencies on their government-to-government consultation plans. It would be ideal if we could tell them something next Wednesday about this issue.

I've tried to do some legwork on this to see if this is possible. Here's where things stand:

I have spoken with Lynn Cutler about the memo and she is very interested in having some WH action in this area. She thinks that Marcia Hale may be interested in issuing or being on it. Since it is the DPC Native American Working Group, I think Bruce should be on the memo alone or with Marcia (assuming he would want to be). Lynn will be meeting with Sylvia to see if the CoS wants to be on this kind of memo, or if not, if they have any problems with it.

I discussed the issue with Cabinet Affairs (Kris Balderston), who said he did not see any problem with issuing this kind of memo to agencies. His reaction was more of surprise that little has been done in the way of follow up in this area.

I ran a draft memo by WH Counsel's office to make sure this kind of memo doesn't present any legal problems. Robert Weiner made a technical suggestion but said it looked fine.

I am attaching a copy of the draft memo for your review. I worked with the Department of Justice's Office of Tribal Justice on the draft. I am also attaching the memo to Sylvia we worked on, in case you wanted to look at it.

I'm sure your brain must feel like it is in the early childhood development stage after all the work you've been doing, but any feedback you could give me on this would be great. Thanks!

(See April 29, 1994 Executive Memorandum on Government-to-Government Relations with Native American Tribal Governments, enclosed.) We write to request the assistance of your Department or Agency in ensuring that the President's directive is appropriately implemented.

The April 29, 1994 Executive Memorandum is based on the unique historical and legal relationship with Native American tribal governments as set forth in the Constitution of the United States, treaties, statutes, executive actions, and court decisions. When executive actions will impact government or treaty rights of Indian tribes or tribal trust property, the Executive Memorandum requires the responsible Department or Agency to consult with tribal governments concerning the impact of the federal action to the greatest extent practicable and permitted by law.

Government-to-Government consultations should be conducted with knowledge of, and sensitivity for, tribal governmental and treaty rights. In addition, Executive Departments and Agencies are required to take steps to remove procedural impediments to working directly and effectively with Indian tribes.

Several Executive Departments and Agencies have implemented the President's directive by adopting their own policies on Government-to-Government relations with Native American Tribal Governments. In addition, some Departments and Agencies have designated staff as liaisons with Native American Tribal governments to facilitate the implementation of the President's directive to ensure that Tribal governments can access their organizations.

To assist us in ensuring that the President's directive is appropriately implemented, please send us the following:

- a) your Department or Agency policy on Government-to-Government Relations with native American Tribal governments if you have such a policy;
- b) the name, position, address and telephone number of Department or Agency staff designated as liaisons with tribal governments; and
- c) a two or three-page synopsis of your Department or Agency approach and activities in implementing the President's April 29, 1994 Executive Memorandum.

You requested comment on two proposals submitted by representatives of American Indian tribes: an Executive Order on Government-to-Government relations with tribes and a Presidential meeting with tribal leaders.

PROPOSED EXECUTIVE ORDER ON GOVERNMENT-TO-GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

President Clinton signed a Presidential Memorandum on Government-to-Government relations with tribes on April 29, 1994. This historic Memorandum acknowledged the special relationship the United States has with American Indian tribes and directed the heads of Executive Departments and Agencies to consult with Federally-recognized Tribal nations on a Government-to-Government basis in formulating policies and programs affecting tribes.

In letters to the President, two tribes now have requested the issuance of an Executive Order on Indian sovereignty and the Government-to-Government relationship. This order would be quite similar in substance to the current Memorandum. It is likely that the tribes want an Executive Order because they believe it will produce greater agency responsiveness than has the Presidential Memorandum.

Federal agencies vary in their compliance with the Memorandum. The Interior Department and the EPA have been particularly responsive in developing and carrying out policies pursuant to the Memorandum. Other agencies have been much slower to develop and implement policies on this front.

An Executive Order is probably not the appropriate response to this problem at this juncture. Issuing an Executive Order similar to the Presidential Memorandum may suggest a failure of the Federal government to act on the President's initial request. This suggestion would be unfair (some agencies have responded well), and could undermine successes achieved by this Administration on Government-to-Government relations. At any rate, issuing essentially the same directive in another form is unlikely to change agencies' behavior.

Instead, we should consider prodding agencies on their compliance with the initial Memorandum. For example, a memorandum to Federal agencies issued by the Chief of Staff or other appropriate White House official-- or, if more high-profile action is desired, even the President himself-- could ask for the status of their policies pursuant to the 1994 Presidential Memorandum. Such a memo could well spur as yet unresponsive agencies to take positive action. In the event such a memorandum fails to produce results, we should then consider what

further steps are necessary to further promote Government-to-Government relations and tribal sovereignty (e.g., Executive Order or other Executive action).

MEETING WITH TRIBAL LEADERS

In April 1994, the President met with over 300 tribal leaders in a large ceremonial event on the White House lawn. The Cabinet was present at the meeting, and the event lasted several hours. During the meeting, the President released his Memorandum on Government-to-Government relations and a Memorandum on the use of eagle feathers for religious purposes.

Leaders of approximately 11 tribes now have asked to have another meeting with the President. Many other tribes would agree that it is time for another Presidential meeting.

We believe that the President should hold another meeting with tribal leaders. This meeting would be an important gesture of goodwill to tribes. It also would allow the President to have direct contact with a constituency that does not often receive such high-level attention.

Such a meeting, however, should include a much wider group of tribal leaders than the 11 who have made the pending request. It would also require significant planning and sufficient lead time-- at least three months for preparation.

Alternatively, the President could speak at a large inter-tribal conference, such as the National Conference of American Indians (NCAI), which meets a few times a year. Secretary Babbitt speaks at one NCAI conference annually, and the Vice President spoke to NCAI in November 1995. A NCAI conference is scheduled for November 1997 in Santa Fe.

A speaking role at an NCAI conference would be easier to coordinate than a Presidential meeting with tribal leaders at the White House. But such an event would not carry quite the same symbolic significance. In addition, the Navajo Nation usually does not attend the NCAI Conference, and the absence of this very large tribe could count as a serious problem.

Either event will place the President at some risk of criticism. The tribes may well complain of a lack of responsiveness to Native American issues at the Department of Interior. The scheduling of either event should take into account the timing of significant Administration decisions affecting tribes that are expected in the near future-- for example, on Indian gaming, and the BIA/Interior budget.

“CREATING A NEW SPIRIT OF SERVICE AND CITIZENSHIP”

Two hundred and ten years ago, at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia, Benjamin Franklin noticed a design painted on the back of the chair from which General Washington had presided -- a sun hanging low on the horizon. Throughout the difficult months of the Convention, Franklin could not decide whether it was rising or a setting sun. But as the Convention came to a close, and as the delegates signed America's Constitution, Franklin concluded that the sun was most definitely rising.

Once again, at the dawn of the 21st Century, America finds itself looking toward the future with hope and possibility. And once again, here in Philadelphia, we have chance to reaffirm the basic bargain that has kept us strong since the framers' day: opportunity for all, responsibility from all, and a united American community, where everyone has a role to play. Citizen service is a critical way to fulfill those ideals. To me, it is the very essence of citizenship itself, for it enables all of us -- parents, religious and civic groups, business and labor, teachers and schools -- to solve our problems together, as one community.

This weekend at Independence Hall, we have a tremendous opportunity to rekindle that sense of citizenship, all across America. Former President George Bush and I will convene the Presidents' Summit For America's Future -- a three-day gathering that will focus the nation on the importance of citizen service, and in particular the steps we must take to strengthen America's children. We will be joined by every living former President or his representative. In the months and years to follow, our goal is to mobilize millions of Americans to help America's children through service: giving them mentors and positive role models, ensuring that they have a safe and healthy start, giving them the tools to succeed through education, and engaging them in community service as well.

I am especially pleased that the entire effort is being chaired by General Colin Powell, who knows how to mobilize Americans when our national interests are at stake. Together with the Summit's Vice Chairs, former HUD Secretary Henry Cisneros and Lynda Robb, General Powell has already led an impressive effort to recruit businesses and non-profit groups, religious and civic leaders, and citizens from all 50 states and from 140 cities and towns for this weekend's gathering. My hope is that we will leave Philadelphia with a new sense of duty as Americans, and a new determination to carry the ethic of service into our daily lives.

Citizen service comes in many forms. Some volunteer on weekends, and some devote full years of their lives to service. Private organizations play a strong role -- such as the Philadelphia Inquirer, which is donating a dime from every street sale of this issue to the massive clean-up of Germantown Avenue which the First Lady, Vice President and Mrs. Gore and I will join this morning. We must honor and encourage all forms of service and voluntarism, and we must applaud the many private and non-profit organizations that have already stepped forward with commitments to serve, helping to fulfill President Bush's vision of a Thousand Points of

Light.

It is especially important that we engage America's young people in service -- so that they take leading roles in shaping their own futures, and gain the sense of citizenship that will build a better country for decades to come. That is why I am so proud of AmeriCorps, the national service program I launched four years ago, now run by Pennsylvania's former Senator, Harris Wofford. Since its creation, AmeriCorps has enabled 50,000 young people to earn money for college while serving their communities.

The success of AmeriCorps shows that service can help meet our most pressing public needs, from renewing our cities to protecting our environment, from immunizing children to helping them learn to read. Even more important, AmeriCorps reaffirms America's basic bargain: creating more opportunity by helping young people pay for college, asking more responsibility through citizen service, and building a stronger community for us all. Our evidence shows that their service leads to more service: a typical AmeriCorps member trains or recruits a dozen or more volunteers.

In preparation for the Summit, I have taken a number of actions in recent weeks to encourage more young people to serve. I designated the week of April 13-19 as National Service Week in America, with over one million young people participating in 3,000 projects across our nation, and thousands of AmeriCorps alumni and returned Peace Corps volunteers participating as well -- reaching out to youth in their communities and teaching a new generation about the power of service. I challenged every state to make service a part of the curriculum in high school and middle school -- giving students credit for service, putting service on their transcripts, or even requiring it, as Maryland has done under the leadership of Lieutenant Governor Kathleen Kennedy Townsend. I launched a new National Service Scholars program, inviting high schools to select students who have performed outstanding service, making them eligible for \$1,000 college scholarships.

These efforts are just the beginning of what we will see at this weekend's Summit, and what we can achieve through AmeriCorps, President Bush's Thousand Points of Light Foundation, and the campaign that General Powell will lead to follow-up on the Summit, "America's Promise -- The Alliance For Youth. Together, we must foster a spirit of service that lasts a lifetime, not merely a week or a weekend. The era of big government may be over, but the era of big national challenges is not. Service is a way to meet today's challenges through our oldest values: more opportunity, more responsibility, and a stronger community for all.

This weekend, the city that gave birth to our democracy can play a major role in renewing our democracy. For I believe that today's peace and prosperity are much like the sun that was painted on General Washington's chair -- a sign of promise and possibility, but only if we are ready to embrace it. For the sake of our children -- for the sake of our own future -- let the sun rise over Independence Hall this weekend, and let this be the dawn of a new age of service and citizenship for America.

Today, the House swore in its newest member, Democrat Representative Ciro Rodrigues of Texas, 28th District. Congressman Rodrigues fills the seat of the late Representative Frank Tejada.

Hearings:

Administrator Sally Katzen testified today before House Commerce Joint Subcommittees on Health & Environment and Oversight & Investigation regarding the EPA's rules concerning particulate matter and ozone.

Deputy Director John Koskinen will testify on Friday, April 18, before the House Government Reform Committee regarding debt collection.

CONGRESS TODAY (4/17):

SENATE

The Senate passed (53-44) S. 495, as amended, a bill to establish domestic laws and enforcement tools to prosecute activities involving chemical weapons. The bill would also require that the President sanction countries that engage in chemical weapons activities, and would provide the death penalty for violations of the law that lead to the loss of life.

[SAP on the Chemical Weapons Convention sent, 4/17: □&For the reasons expressed by the President in the attached statement, the Administration strongly urges the Senate to expeditiously grant its advice and consent to the ratification of the Chemical Weapons Convention; SAP on S. 495 sent, 4/17: Strongly oppose]

Debate on the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) will begin on April 23rd.

HOUSE

By a vote of 227-190, 3 present, the House agreed to Rep. Solomon's motion to strike from the record Representative John Lewis's remarks regarding Speaker Gingrich paying his \$300,000 ethics violations fines. The House then tabled a motion to object by a vote of 223 -199.

The House considered H.R. 400, the 21st Century Patent Improvement Act, but did not come to resolution. While under consideration, the House rejected (178-227) the Rohrbacher substitute amendment, which would have changed the term of a patent to the longer of either 20 years from the filing of the application or 17 years from the grant of the patent. The House hopes to complete consideration of the bill on Wednesday, April 23rd.

At last, we have some modest progress on this. You may recall that a TV producer from the Summit had the bright idea of asking a bunch of young poets and playwrights to draft the declaration of commitment that all the Presidents will be asked to sign at the Summit. But happily their product was off-base enough that it will probably just be delivered as a letter to the Presidents from the young people.

Therefore, the TV producer has taken a shot at it (below), as has Bush's person. Our current plan, since time is short, is to have a conference call tomorrow with Communications and Harris to agree among ourselves on a draft; and then have Harris forward that to the Summit as his own draft. The Summit people will give it to Powell, Bush, Ray Chambers, us, etc. for comments on Monday. Presumably then we will have a negotiating session.

Bruce and Jonathan, let me know if you want to be in on the conference call tomorrow. I don't know the time yet. Or if you had time to play with this Monday morning and email it to me, that would be great.

Here are the 2 versions:

TV producer: "In accordance with the principles set forth in America's Promise [this is the name of Powell's 501c3, so there's probably a legal issue here], namely that all young Americans be afforded A Healthy Start, Safe Places, A Relationship With a Caring Adult, An Opportunity for Community Service and the Tools to Develop a Marketable Skill, we the undersigned citizens of the United States of America do hereby affirm our commitment to achieving these goals."

Bush guy: "I promise to do my best to help every young person in America achieve [the 5 goals of the Summit, listed above -- caring adult, healthy start, etc.]."

We need to inject more strongly the concept of citizen service, both as a way to get things done and to strengthen communities and democracy. There is no way to drop the 5 goals for children. (In fact, Ray Chambers will probably push for the text to include Powell's goal of reaching 2 million children by the year 2000.)

***Enhancing Protection of Children's Health
April 16, 1997***

Vice President Gore today announced an executive order to reduce environmental health and safety risks to children. For the first time, federal agencies will be required to assign high priority to addressing these risks, to coordinate their research priorities on children's health, and to ensure that their standards take into account special risks to children. The executive order, which President Clinton signed today, includes the following actions:

- ***Strengthen Policies to Protect Children.*** The executive order requires all agencies to make the protection of children a high priority in implementing their statutory responsibilities and fulfilling their overall missions.
- ***Improve Research and other Initiatives to Protect Children.*** The proposed executive order would create an interagency task force to establish a coordinated research agenda, to identify research and other initiatives the Administration will take to advance the protection of children's environmental health and safety, and to enlist public input for these efforts.
- ***Ensure that New Safeguards Consider Special Risks to Children.*** The executive order would, for the first time, require agencies to analyze and explain the effects of their rules on children. When a major regulation addresses special risks to children, agencies would have to 1) consider disproportionate impacts on children; and 2) explain why their proposed action is preferable to other alternatives. The primary goal of this provision is to link policy decisions to the emerging science regarding children's environmental health and safety. This provision ensures accountability to the public and helps agencies identify their research needs.

BACKGROUND

There is a growing body of evidence, highlighted by a 1993 study by the National Academy of Sciences (NAS) on the exposure of children to pesticides, demonstrating that children are at disproportionate risk from environmental health, and safety risks. The report also concludes that federal regulatory standards often fail to consider these risks fully.

These disproportionate risks stem from several fundamental differences between children and adults, in terms of physiology and activity. Children are still developing, and thus are neurologically and immunologically more susceptible to certain risks. Children eat, drink and breathe more for their weight, exposing them to greater amounts of contamination and pollution for their weight. Children are less able to protect themselves by use of judgment and skill (e.g. navigating traffic, reading and following warnings). Concurrent with their recognition of these factors, scientists have

documented an alarming increase in the incidence of conditions in children that may be linked to environmental health and safety risks. These include childhood cancer, leukemia, and asthma, as well as childhood deaths and injuries from accidents.

President Clinton has taken bold action to respond to the challenge posed by this new science. President Clinton's initiatives resulted in explicit protection for children in the Food Quality Protection Act and Safe Drinking Water Act; development of new standards for passive restraints in cars that are more protective of children; and administrative action to protect children from tobacco, lead, and other hazards. Each of these initiatives responds to major threats to children that are of major concerns to American families.

These successes highlight the need for an overall, coordinated approach to children's issues that highlights their priority, coordinates federal research, and ensures that federal standards consistently account for disproportionate risks to children. Today's executive order, developed through extensive consultation with affected agencies, would fill this gap with provisions to address each of these areas.
