1. They are limited to official teacher shortage areas and have various certification constraints imposed by school districts. ## SUMMARY OF NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE REPORT ON CRIME PREVENTION

April 24, 1997

### **Background**

The 1996 Department of Justice (DOJ) appropriations bill required a comprehensive study of the effectiveness of DOJ grants to local communities for law enforcement and crime prevention efforts. Special emphasis was to be given to factors relating to juvenile violence.

The study released last week was completed by criminologists from the University of Maryland. Researchers studied existing evaluations of over \$3 billion of DOJ spending, including: COPS funding, prison construction, drug courts, Byrne grants, and juvenile justice formula grants.

The report organizes crime prevention efforts by section into the institutional settings where crime prevention efforts can take place: families, schools, labor markets, and the legal institution settings of policing and criminal justice.

### **Report Conclusions**

- Key overall finding: the most effective crime prevention funding is directed to urban, low-income, high crime neighborhoods where youth violence is highly concentrated.

**Police.** The report found that the effectiveness of additional police in preventing crime depends on how well they are focused on tasks and problems. Formula and block grants for policing were found to be less effective than discretionary grants since they are generally allocated on the basis of population instead of on the basis of serious crime.

\_ *What works:* policing crime "hot spots" through directed patrols in high crime areas; targeting serious repeat offenders through proactive arrests; and selective arrest in domestic violence cases.

\_ *What's promising:* community policing with focus on problem-oriented policing and improving police legitimacy, and adding extra police to cities.

\_ *What doesn't work:* neighborhood watch programs and arresting juveniles for minor offenses.

**How DOJ Programs Reflect Report's Results:** The COPS office is providing funding for 100,000 police officers--more than 57,000 have been funded to date. The Office of Justice Programs is building prisons to incarcerate serious, violent offenders.

**Communities.** Most crime happens in a small minority of communities; yet crime prevention programs are not restricted to these neighborhoods. The study found that crime prevention programs are likely to work in communities that need them the least, while communities with the greatest crime problems are the hardest to reach.

*\_ What Works:* Mentoring programs showed a strong impact on drug use. Recreation programs had a strong effect on both crime and drug use.

*\_ What Doesn't Work:* community mobilization and gun buy-back programs.

*How DOJ Programs Reflect Report's Results:* The Weed and Seed program targets violence prevention funding in specific, high-crime neighborhoods. Funding from the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Program is also directed toward high-crime communities.

***Families.*** Family risk factors have a major effect on crime. The earlier the risk factors can be addressed in life, the greater the impact. Programs for infants and young children may be the most cost-effective in the long-run, even if they are the most expensive in the short term. However, family violence by adults was found to be more difficult to address.

*\_ What works:* home visitation by nurses and social workers for infants in troubled families and family therapy by clinical staff for delinquent youth.

*\_ What's promising:* battered women's shelters and temporary restraining orders.

*\_ What doesn't work:* mandatory arrest in misdemeanor domestic violence cases where offender is unemployed and home visitation by police as a follow up to domestic violence incidents.

*How DOJ Programs Reflect Report's Results:* The Office of Juvenile Justice Prevention (OJJDP) and Weed and Seed are including home visitation components in their program plans for this year. VAWGO and STOP grants may be used to enhance prosecution of domestic violence cases, including increasing the number of temporary restraining orders.

***Criminal Justice.*** The study found that there is little evidence that increased incarceration has reduced crime. However, variations in how the criminal justice system treats admitted offenders can make a significant difference.

*\_ What works:* focused and structured rehabilitation programs, prison-based drug treatment, and incarceration of high-volume repeat offenders.

*\_ What's promising:* drug courts, day fines, and juvenile aftercare.

*\_ What doesn't work:* "scared straight" programs and old-style military boot camps.

*How DOJ Programs Reflect Report's Results:* DOJ is funding a residential substance abuse treatment program for state prisoners. The Drug Courts program was doubled from \$15 million to \$30 million.

**Labor Markets.** There is a long history of attempting to prevent crime by putting young people into the labor market for legitimate work. Programs aimed at linking labor markets more closely to high crime neighborhoods and individuals could have substantial crime prevention benefits.

\_ *What works:* short-term vocational training for older male ex-offenders who are no longer involved in the criminal justice system.

\_ *What's promising:* job corps, prison-based vocational education for adults, and Enterprise Zone programs.

\_ *What doesn't work:* summer jobs and subsidized jobs for youth.

**Schools.** Schools have significant potential as a setting to prevent crime. However, the report found numerous school-based programs to be ineffective including the DARE program. It should be noted that the Department of Education is currently working with DARE to improve their curriculum in light of recent criticisms of the program-- and the report acknowledges that their conclusion is based on the unrevised curriculum.

\_ *What works:* programs aimed at establishing behavioral norms, such as school rules, and programs that focus on developing social competency skills (e.g., self-control, stress management).

\_ *What doesn't work:* peer-group counseling, recreation and community service activities without a strong prevention component.

**How DOJ Programs Reflect Report's Results:** Justice is funding a national study of school-based prevention programs to document the extent to which students can be engaged in school activities that reduce opportunities for crime.

### **Report Recommendations**

The report concludes that researchers were unable to determine how a majority of federal funding affects crime due to a dearth of program evaluation. To remedy this, the report's primary recommendation is to set aside 10% of all crime prevention funding to conduct program evaluations.

Your Anti-Gang and Youth Violence Legislation contains a similar approach. The legislation calls for 10% of juvenile justice grant funding to be reserved for research on program effectiveness.

## MORGAN STATE COMMENCEMENT

New scientific discoveries and technological developments promise all kinds of benefits to our society: longer and healthier lives; cures for what were once considered incurable diseases; universal access to university libraries; up to the second information. The potential to improve people's everyday lives is enormous. But at the same time, new science and technology raises a host of ethical and moral questions that we are only just learning to ask, let alone come to grips with and answer.

Leading America into a national discussion of these issues -- asking the questions, answering some of them, and laying down the moral markers that must guide us as we look for more answers -- is a task ripe for the Presidential bully pulpit.

There are two major categories of science and technology that raise distinct, although often related, types of new questions: biology and medicine on the one hand, which raises religious questions, questions about the nature of humanity, as well as privacy issues; and information technology on the other hand, which raises all kinds of privacy questions, as well as many civil liberty related issues.

The President's speech could focus on both areas, but a thoughtful discussion would be better advanced with a primary focus on one set of issues.

There are a good number of policy options in the pipeline that could be used to provide substance to the speech:

**Genetic Screening:** The President could propose major legislation to prohibit insurers from using genetic screening information as a basis for denying coverage. It's worth noting that in the early 70s some African-Americans were denied health care coverage by insurers and jobs by employers because they were identified as sickle cell anemia carriers.

**Cloning Report:** NBAC's report is due a week later (May25); their final meeting is scheduled for the day before (May 17). Presumably, if we pushed a little, the President could announce their findings and comment on them. At this point, we expect their recommendations to be essentially in line with the President's position.

**Diabetes:** It is possible, but unlikely, that a major diabetes announcement could be ready.

**Tuskegee:** The President is currently scheduled to discuss the Tuskegee experiments the week before the commencement. Given the subject and the venue, he should certainly reiterate his strong feelings against the kind of human testing that went on in Tuskegee.

**Information Technology:** If the President were to discuss information technology issues, he could announce creation of an ELSI (Ethical, Legal, and Social Implications) grant program housed at NSF, similar to the existing one housed at NIH, to explore looming information technology questions and develop answers.

Narcotics Money Laundering-- The rapid increase in electronic commerce and immigrants' use of international transfer services to send money home has caused the U.S. market for money transmission services to grow steadily over the last ten years. Despite licensing procedures, the money transmitter industry has proven vulnerable to abuse by organized money launderers. To address this problem, the Treasury Department has the authority to require financial institutions within a geographic area to comply with special reporting or record keeping obligations-- called Geographic Targeting Orders (GTO). A GTO issued on August 7, 1996-- which Treasury recently renewed--required 22 licensed money transmitters in the New York metropolitan area to report information about the senders and recipients of all cash transmissions to Columbia of \$750 or more. Prior to the GTO, remitters were only required to report transactions of more than \$10,000 under Federal law. The GTO has caused a dramatic reduction in the flow of narcotics proceeds in New York, thereby denying drug trafficking cartels access to their profits. Several of the targeted money remitters have stopped sending funds to Columbia altogether.

The Treasury Department is ready to release proposed rules which would expand the successful Geographic Targeting Order (GTO) nationally, apply it to transactions to all nations, and make it permanent. The proposed rules would also require money remitters to report suspicious activity.

# **GEOGRAPHIC TARGETING ORDER**

## **Possible Announcement**

The President could announce a nationwide crack down on narcotics money laundering through the money transmitter industry by expanding the successful Geographic Targeting Order (GTO) nationally and making it permanent.

The GTO in effect since August 1996 has caused a dramatic reduction in the flow of narcotics proceeds in New York by requiring licensed money transmitters to report all cash-purchased transmissions to Columbia in excess of \$750-- denying drug trafficking cartels access to their profits.

## **Background**

Rapidly increasing electronic commerce and immigrants' use of international transfer services to send money home to family has caused the U.S. market for money transmission services to grow steadily over the last ten years. Despite licensing procedures, the money transmitter industry has proven vulnerable to abuse by organized money launderers.

The Bank Secrecy Act (BSA) allows the Treasury Department to require financial institutions in a geographic area to comply with special reporting or record keeping obligations-- called Geographic Targeting Orders (GTO). Currently, GTOs are temporary and can only be authorized for 60-day periods.

## **The Current GTO**

The GTO issued on August 7, 1996 required 22 licensed money transmitters in the New York metropolitan area and their approximately 3,500 agents to report information about the senders and recipients of all cash transmissions to Columbia of \$750 or more. Before the GTO, only transactions more than \$10,000 had to be reported under Federal law. The August 1996 GTO expired on April 3, 1997. Ray Kelly signed the renewal of the GTO last week.

## **Results of the GTO**

The GTO caused an immediate 30% reduction in the flow of narcotics proceeds to Columbia through New York City money transmitters. Several of the targeted money remitters have stopped sending funds to Columbia altogether.

There has also been a dramatic increase in the Customs Commission's interdiction and seizure activities. Over \$50 million in cash has been seized at the since the GTO went into effect-- a four-fold increase over the previous years' totals.

## **Next Steps**

We could have Rubin send a letter to the President, which responds to his request to make the GTO permanent and apply it nationwide. Rubin's letter would announce his intention to issue proposed rules to require money remitters to obtain identifying information on wire transfers in excess of \$750, and to report suspicious transactions.

SUBJECT: COLLEGE AND WELFARE WORK REQUIREMENTS

You asked about reports that welfare recipients enrolled in college are dropping out or being asked to drop out in order to go to work and help states meet the welfare law's work requirements.

As you know, the welfare law marks a change in thinking on how to move people from welfare to work. Rather than depending on education and training programs to give people skills that will then translate into jobs, the welfare law relies on research showing that, in most cases, the surest route to work is to start with a job of some sort. Entry level jobs may then translate into higher level jobs as skills are acquired in the workplace.

Of course, there are bound to be individuals for whom education is the surest route to a job with a future. And the welfare law in no way precludes this, nor requires states to tell clients to drop out of school -- although some jurisdictions, such as New York City, have done so. (New York City has moved aggressively to require welfare recipients to participate in community work experience jobs such as cleaning parks. This was done not as a result of the Federal welfare law, but at the initiative of Mayor Giuliani. As a result, the number of students on welfare enrolled at the City University of New York has reportedly fallen from 29,000 to 18,000.)

The following are some of the ways in which states can accommodate welfare clients who wish to stay in school:

- **States may choose to exclude some college students from the work requirements.**  
To avoid penalties, states must ensure that 25% of the welfare population works at least 20 hours a week in 1997. This increases over time so that, by 2002, 50% of the welfare population must work at least 30 hours per week. The dramatic drop in the welfare caseloads is making the work participation rates far easier to meet than expected, since states get "credit" toward their work participation rates for the caseload declines. Therefore, in the early years of TANF, most states should be in a position to allow currently enrolled students to finish their programs.
- **States could encourage recipients to attend vocational post-secondary training,** which can be counted for up to 12 months in the state's participation rate. Overall, no

more than 20 percent of individuals can be counted as working by participating in vocational training or secondary school, and in many states much of that 20% will be made up of teenage parents finishing high school.

- **States could put college students in separate state programs to which the work rates do not apply.** Under the law states could use savings from welfare reform (from dropping caseloads or the fact that they need maintain only 75% of historic state spending to get the TANF block grant) to set up separate state programs in which they could support welfare recipients in college. Currently, work rates do not apply to either 1) programs funded by completely separate state dollars or 2) programs funded by “maintenance of effort” dollars which states spend in order to get the TANF block grant. We have argued that the work rates should apply to the latter, which is integrally related to the federal program, lest states structure their programs to significantly undermine the work rates. This change would require legislation. However, even if work rates applied to the “maintenance of effort” programs, states could use the savings from welfare reform to fund separate state programs for college students.
- **College students could work 20 or 30 hours a week and still attend school.** Many Americans do this: Department of Education statistics show that in 1993, 38% of undergraduates worked at least 35 hours a week, while 16% worked between 21 and 34 hours a week. Colleges could make it easier for welfare recipients to combine work and college by providing work study opportunities that meet the work requirements. Although most colleges limit work study to 10 to 15 hours a week, there is no limit in federal law -- they can provide as many hours as needed to meet the student’s financial need. Up to five percent of work study funds may be used in community service activities such as tutoring, so it would be possible for a student to fulfill her work requirement and remain in college by tutoring in the America Reads program. A student could also work 15 hours a week in an on-campus work study job and 15 hours a week in a private-sector, off-campus job subsidized by her welfare check.

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# PRESIDENT CLINTON'S AMERICA READS CHALLENGE ACT OF 1997

April 26, 1997

**TODAY, AS HE PREPARES TO LEAVE FOR PHILADELPHIA, PRESIDENT CLINTON WILL ANNOUNCE THAT HE IS SENDING LEGISLATION TO CONGRESS THAT EMBODIES THE SPIRIT OF THE PRESIDENTS' SUMMIT FOR AMERICA'S FUTURE -- THE AMERICA READS CHALLENGE ACT.** The America Reads Challenge Act will help mobilize AmeriCorps members, skilled reading specialists, and an army of trained volunteer reading tutors to ensure that every student can read independently and well by the end of 3rd grade. The Act sets forth the first comprehensive, nationwide effort to create after-school, summer, and weekend tutoring in reading. The America Reads Challenge Act is a five-year, \$2.75 billion commitment to local communities and organizations, as well as national and regional efforts. It includes:

**America's Reading Corps.** The Act would fund 25,000 reading specialists and tutor coordinators, including 11,000 AmeriCorps members, to mobilize one million volunteer reading tutors.

- Coordinating with the in-school reading program, tutors will provide individualized after-school, weekend, and summer reading tutoring for approximately three million children in grades K-3 who need the extra help.
- AmeriCorps members and others will work to recruit these tutors, and reading specialists will provide their training and supervision.

**Parents as First Teachers Challenge Grants.** The legislation also recognizes that, as their children's first teachers, parents can give their children the firm foundation they need to do well in school. These Challenge Grants would provide more than \$300 million over five years to foster effective programs to provide assistance for interested parents to help their children become successful readers by the end of 3rd grade.

- **Head Start and Title I/Even Start.** These grants will build on other commitments to early learning in the President's balanced budget plan. This includes an expansion of the Head Start program reaching one million 3- and 4-year olds and additional investments in Title I/Even Start to strengthen reading instruction during the regular school day as well as family literacy efforts.

**THE PRESIDENT'S LEGISLATION ADDRESSES CHILDREN'S READING NEEDS.** Research shows that children who cannot read well and independently by the end of third grade are less likely to succeed in school and more likely to drop out. While American students today generally read as well as ever, 40% of our fourth graders scored below the basic level on the 1994 National Assessment of Educational Progress. According to studies, however, well-designed tutoring programs result in student gains in reading.

**PRESIDENT CLINTON IS ISSUING THE AMERICA READS CHALLENGE TO ALL AMERICANS -- AND THEY ARE RESPONDING.** The America Reads Challenge asks every American to help in this effort, building on the work being done by classroom teachers, librarians, tutors, and reading specialists.

- **Encouraging Involvement.** The America Reads Challenge is pursuing several essential strategies to help our children learn to read: creating more learning opportunities to supplement classroom reading instruction; encouraging parent involvement to help children develop readiness skills for reading beginning at birth, as well as involvement throughout the school years; and bringing best teaching practices into classrooms.
- **Federal Work Study Expansion.** President Clinton has asked college presidents to allocate half of all their new work-study slots to college students who become America Reads tutors. The goal is to give 100,000 federal work study students the opportunity to help children learn to read better. So far, 166 colleges have pledged thousands of students to tutor in elementary schools.
- **Service Summit Commitments.** As part of the President's Service Summit in Philadelphia, major non-profits and corporations have committed to recruit tens of thousands of new tutors specifically for the America Reads effort, with tens of thousands of additional commitments to literacy activities.

*Four Tutoring Organizations Highlighted by President Clinton  
in the America Reads Radio Address*

*READING ONE-TO-ONE*, Richardson, Texas

Reading One-to-One offers a one-on-one tutoring program to at-risk students in elementary schools, many of whom are limited-English proficient. The tutors -- college students and community volunteers -- are trained in the tutoring curriculum and supervised by on-site tutor coordinators, including AmeriCorps members. The program stresses consistency: each student works with no more than two tutors three to four times a week during the school year.

Reading One-to-One began at The University of Texas at Dallas in 1991 as a local tutoring effort. Since that time, more than 5,000 children in more than 50 schools in Dallas, Richardson, and Brownsville, TX, and Salt Lake City and Magna, UT, have been tutored using the Reading One-to-One program model. A statistical analysis shows that 70 forty-minute sessions produce an average net gain (attributable to program intervention alone) of approximately 0.5 grade equivalents. Additionally, survey results of teachers and parents showed that 88% of the teachers and 95% of the parents thought reading skills had indeed increased.

*HIPPYCorps INITIATIVE AT STANLEY ISAACS NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER, NY, NY*

Stanley Isaacs Neighborhood Center is one of ten HIPPY sites that participate in the HIPPYCorps Initiative in New York, where 65 AmeriCorps members provide services to approximately 700 families. HIPPY is a home-based program for parents of children 4- and 5-years old that provides parents with a two-year curriculum, lesson plans, and materials to help them teach school readiness skills to their children. According to evidence from a five-year study of the program, teachers rated children who had been in HIPPY as better adapted to the classroom and more likely to do well in school than children who had not been in the program.

There are 103 local HIPPY programs operating in 26 states and the District of Columbia, serving over 13,000 families. The core HIPPY Program consists of home visits every other week in which a paraprofessional role plays the coming week's curriculum with the parent, who then engages in the activities with their children on a daily basis. Parents tell stories to their children, teach them to recognize shapes and colors, follow directions, solve logical problems other school readiness skills. Alternate weeks, home visits are supplemented by group meetings. Parents meet together for discussions of lesson topics and parenting issues.

old daughter, Kelly, so that they could spend quality time together -- just as Kelly was beginning to read. *Judy Almodovar* became an AmeriCorps member and a paraprofessional with HIPPIY 18 months ago, after initially signing up as a parent. She and her son Michael also participate in the program. *Maria De La Rosa* is the HIPPIY Coordinator for the Stanley Isaacs Neighborhood Center.

*HANDS ON ATLANTA*, Atlanta, Georgia

Hands On Atlanta's AmeriCorps members serve as recruiters, coordinators and project supervisors currently assisting 15 K-12 public schools in the Atlanta area. AmeriCorps members recruit and train high school volunteers as tutors for younger students in afterschool programs. They also mobilize community volunteers -- 5,000 of them by the end of this school year -- to serve schools in a variety of ways, including after-school programs that incorporate academic enrichment.

In 1996, 720 Hands on Atlanta volunteers participated each week in Saturday tutorial programs contributing over 30,000 hours of enrichment to Atlanta school children. In addition, AmeriCorps members organized a total 90,000 hours of daily tutorial assistance provided to over 2,790 children. In the first three years of AmeriCorps involvement, the schools have seen an 11 percent increase in performance on national standardized tests in math and reading, and an average 25 percent decrease in incidents of discipline.

#### **START MAKING A READER TODAY (SMART) AMERICORPS\*VISTA PROGRAM**

The goal of SMART is to ensure that all Oregon children leave elementary school reading at or above their grade level. AmeriCorps\*VISTA members have recruited 3,900 local volunteers to work with children through one-to-one tutoring assistance in 78 schools across the state. More than 309,000 hours of service have been donated, and money has been raised to purchase over 150,000 books which have been given to the children in the program. Private sector support comes from over 350 companies including Nike, Intel Corporation, Smith Barney and Wal-Mart. SMART has been recognized as an outstanding literacy partnership program by the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services and by the National Alliance of Business.

SMART programs are mainly in schools where the student population is from low-income households. During the Summer months, this SMART serves more than 1,500 children statewide. AmeriCorps\*VISTA members drive "Story Vans" to parks and recreation centers to read aloud to children. To reach the most underserved populations in the state, the project coordinates with the Oregon free lunch summer program for children, engaging in literacy tutoring for children at sites where the lunches are being served.

## Evidence That Tutoring Works

### Research has found that well-designed tutoring programs result in student gains in reading

- A major British study of tutoring -- conducted by Topping and Whitley -- examined the progress of more than 2,300 elementary and junior high students who were tutored for an average of 8.6 weeks by a mixture of parent volunteers, peers, and older students. Learners improved at 4.4 times the normal rate for the tutoring period in comprehension and 3.3 times the normal rate in work recognition. For months after the end of tutoring, the average student was still improving at twice the normal rate in both comprehension and work recognition. [Topping, K., & Whitley, M. (1990). *Participant evaluation of parent-tutored and peer-tutored projects in reaching*. *Educational Research*, 32(1), 14-32.]
- An analysis -- conducted by Cohen, Kulik and Kulik -- of approximately 60 published studies found positive effects of specific tutoring programs on targeted students. The analysis relied on measurable results, and did not take into account anecdotal reports [Cohen, P.A., Kulik, J.A., & Kulik, C.L.C. (1982). *Educational outcomes of tutoring: A meta-analysis of findings*. *American Educational Research Journal*, 19, 237-248.]
- An after school tutoring program in which low-achieving second and third graders were tutored one hour, twice each week, by university students, retirees, and suburban mothers also generated strong improvements in the tutees' reading skills. Two reading specialists selected the children for tutoring, recruited and trained the tutors, and monitored the tutoring sessions. In each of two years, the tutored group outperformed a closely matched comparison group on word recognition, passage reading accuracy, and spelling. Fifty percent of the tutored children made a full year's gain reading while only 20% of the comparison group children did. [Morris, D., Shaw, B., & Perney, J. (1990, November). *Helping low readers in Grades 2 and 3: An after-school volunteer tutoring program*. *Elementary School Journal*, 91, 133-150.]

### Characteristics of successful tutoring programs have also been identified through research

- According to a synthesis of research on tutoring involving college students and younger children, successful programs are structure to provide sufficient time for consistent, regular contact; systematic screening of prospective tutors; thorough training and monitoring; and close communication and cooperation between the sponsoring agency and participating schools. [Policy Studies Associates (1990). *A review of programs involving college students as tutors or mentors in grades K-12*. Prepared for the U.S. Department of Education, Planning and Evaluation Service]
- A recent study of tutoring for 30 first grade children at risk in reading -- conducted by Juel -- reported that successful tutor-tutee relationships were characterized by strong reinforcement of progress; a high number of reading and writing experiences in which the student moved from being fully supported to working independently; and explicit demonstration of appropriate reading and writing processes. [Juel, C. (1996). *What makes*

## SUMMIT COMMITMENTS TO SUPPORT READING AND LITERACY EFFORTS

Responding to President Clinton's call to help every American child read independently and well by the end of third grade, organizations and corporations from across the country have stepped forward to commit tens of thousands of caring volunteers in conjunction with the Philadelphia Summit. While the hard work of identifying, training, and connecting these volunteers to schools lies ahead, these commitments demonstrate the strong nationwide interest in promoting reading and working with local schools to support our young people.

### **OVER 200,000 COMMITMENTS SPECIFICALLY CONNECTED TO AMERICA READS.**

Several organizations, representing commitments to recruit over 200,000 reading tutors, have expressly linked their commitments with the President's America Reads Challenge:

These commitments are cumulative over three years, except for Houston Reads, which commits to reach a level of 20,000 participating tutors by the year 2000. In addition, Scholastic Books will donate one million books to the America Reads effort.

**ADDITIONAL COMMITMENTS FOR MANY THOUSAND AMERICANS TO BE INVOLVED IN LITERACY EFFORTS.** Several additional organizations, including some with a long history in promoting literacy, have made reading-related summit commitments as well. These organizations include the National Center for Family Literacy, the Reading Recovery Council of America, Time Warner "Time to Read," City Cares of America, Hewlett Packard, USWest, and Reading is Fundamental.

### **STUDENT VOLUNTEER AND WORK STUDY COMMITMENTS TO AMERICA READS.**

Through the leadership of the President of San Francisco State University, 21 university presidents have each not only committed work-study funds to reading tutors as a part of the America Reads effort, but have also committed to recruit five other university presidents, as well. Overall, 166 college and university presidents have committed thousands of work study and non-work study students as tutors for America Reads.

**FEDERAL AGENCY ADOPT-A-SCHOOL COMMITMENT.** Federal agencies are making over 40 commitments to the Presidents' Summit for America's Future. One of these is that federal agencies will increase their commitment to adopt or establish partnerships with schools in their communities. The number of agency-school partnerships will increase from approximately 1,500 to 2,000 by the year 2000. Working through partnerships established by their agencies with schools across the country, Federal employees work closely with schools in a variety of ways --volunteering as mentors and tutors, purchasing needed equipment for schools, and holding career days.
