Update on Juvenile Justice Bill

H.R. 3, the Juvenile Crime Act of 1997 is scheduled for House floor consideration on Wednesday evening and Thursday morning. The version of H.R. 3 currently scheduled for consideration is a narrowly-crafted measure that would amend federal procedures for prosecuting juveniles and provide incentive grants to states, counties and localities for juvenile detention facilities, juvenile prosecutors and juvenile courts. The measure does not include any funding for the prevention of juvenile crime, nor does it include any Administration-proposed firearms measures such as a requirement that child safety locks be sold with every firearm and a provision that establishes a gun purchase disability for juveniles who have committed serious drug or violent offenses. Consequently, the Administration is likely to oppose House passage of H.R. 3 unless it is amended significantly.

The Administration has been negotiating with the House Republican leadership in an attempt to insert several key provisions, including authorizing significant amounts of funding for juvenile crime prevention programs, into a Manager's Amendment that will be offered when the bill is considered on the floor. If the negotiations are successfully concluded, every major component of the Administration's original proposal - prevention, intervention and tough enforcement - would be well-represented in the bill. Chances for a satisfactory settlement, however, as is often the case with crime legislation, are uncertain at best. It is expected that negotiations will conclude, one way or the other, later today.

Administrator Sally Katzen will testify tomorrow before the Senate Committee on Rules and Administration, in support of Government Printing Office Reform.

CONGRESS TODAY (5/7):

SENATE

The Senate continued consideration of S. 672, the Bosnia/Disaster Assistance Supplemental.

[SAP sent, 5/7: Based on the Senate Committee bill, which included the automatic continuing resolution, the President had indicated that he would veto it because it includes strongly objectionable extraneous provisions.]

Late Wednesday evening, Senator Byrd offered an amendment to strike the McCain-Hutchison automatic continuing resolution provision from the bill. The Senate did not vote on the amendment. Senator McCain then amended his provision, by unanimous consent, to increase the FY1998 funding level to 100% of the FY 1997 enacted level (up from 98%). Senator Byrd did not object to McCain's motion, and, in exchange, Senator McCain did not move table the Byrd amendment. Thus, debate on Byrd's amendment to strike the now 100% automatic continuing resolution provision from the bill will continue on Thursday.

Also today, the Senate also took the following action

- o Invoked cloture on the bill by a vote of 100 to 0.
- o Adopted (89-11) Amato (R-NY) amendment to remove Social Service Block Grant funds from the bill, intended to assist legal immigrants when certain benefits expire in August and to insert an extension of the SSI benefits through September 30, 1997. As expected, the JOBS rescission offsets the cost.
- o Tabled (51-29) Bumpers (D-AR) amendment to remove a provision that would prohibit Interior from implementing policy guidelines on RS 2477 related to rights-of-way for States building highways on public land.
- o Adopted (UC) Hollings amendment to prohibit the use of any funds made available in any Appropriations Act for FY97 made available by the Commerce Dept to make irreversible plans for the use of sampling in taking the 2000 decennial census.
- o Adopted (UC) Byrd amendment, offered by Stevens, to expand eligibility for rail freight assistance not only to the Northern Plain States, but to any state affected by flooding.
- o Adopted (UC) Feingold/Hutchison, which prohibited use of funds in the Act for supporting troops in Bosnia after June 30, 1998. It should be noted, however, that there are no funds in the Act that were intended to be used after June 30, 1998.

HOUSE

Suspended the Rules and passed (399-16) H.Res. 93 - Regarding the BLS and adjustments to the CPI. The House considered the bill in Tuesday's session under suspension of the rule, and ordered but postponed the vote.

Continued, but did not complete, consideration of H.R. 2 - Housing Opportunity and Responsibility Act of 1997 (Open Rule). While under consideration, the House rejected (172-252) a Frank amendment to strike the provision that gives public housing tenants a choice to pay a flat rate for rent.

[SAP sent, 4/30: Administration supports many of the bill's objectives, but opposes the bill unless it is amended]

Considered, but did not complete action on, H.R. 478 - Flood Prevention Act (Open Rule). While under consideration, the House adopted the rule by

a vote of 415-8. The House also adopted (227-196) a Boehlert substitute amendment for a waiver of the Endangered Species Act for consultation regulations for all counties that are declared federal disaster areas in 1997. The waiver would apply to repairs or replacement of flood control facilities in those counties.

[SAP sent, 5/2: Interior Secretary would recommend veto]

Adopted (252-159) the Rule on H.R. 3 - Juvenile Crime Control Act of 1997. At press time, the House is holding one hour of general debate on the bill.

[SAP sent, 5/7: Administration opposes]

CONGRESS TOMORROW (5/8)

The Senate will convene at 9:15 am for morning business until 10:00 am. The Senate will then resume consideration of S. 672, the Bosnia/Disaster Assistance Supplemental. Senator Warner will then offer an amendment to modify the allocation of highway outlays to conform to existing resources, rather than what is in the bill. A vote on the motion to table his amendment is likely to occur at 10:30 am. The Senate will then proceed to consideration of the Byrd amendment to strike the McCain provision regarding the automatic continuing resolution (which McCain changed by UC Wednesday night to provide 100% of the FY97 enacted level). The Senate still intends to complete consideration of the bill by 6:00 pm.

Q&As on Welfare Meeting with Texas Delegation
5/7/97

If no decision has been made regarding a meeting between Chief of Staff and Texas delegation:

Question: Did you get a letter from Senators Gramm and Hutchison and Representatives Arney, Delay, Archer, Stenholm, Hall, and Johnson asking for a meeting next week with the President's Chief of Staff? Do you plan to agree to the request?

Answer: We have received the letter, but no meeting has been scheduled yet.

If the Chief of Staff has agreed to meet with the members of the Texas delegation:

Question: Did you get a letter from Senators Gramm and Hutchison and Representatives Arney, Delay, Archer, Stenholm, Hall, and Johnson asking for a meeting next week with the President's Chief of Staff? Do you plan to agree to the request?

Answer: We did get the letter. We do plan to meet with these members of Congress to discuss the response we have given to the state of Texas. We do not intend to re-open the issue of the Texas request at this meeting, but instead to discuss with members of Congress the position we will have already discussed with state officials.

Last week, HHS and USDA officials met with the Texas Health and Human Services Commissioner. They told him that the state could release an RFO subject to written guidelines that will be provided by the agencies. By the time the Chief of Staff meets with members of Congress, the agencies will have conveyed these guidelines, which will make clear what federal statutes and regulations allow -- and what they prohibit -- with respect to privatization.

[In general, Texas will not be allowed to privatize eligibility determination or information gathering functions. The state, however, will be able to contract with a private party to do outreach and to revamp computer and other automation systems.]

We have never stated publicly the bracketed information, but this was the line taken by the agencies in this meeting with Commissioner McKinney. This distinction does not apply to Temporary Assistance to Needy Families, i.e., cash welfare, which the new welfare law explicitly allows to be privatized.

Texas Lawmakers Seek Welfare Reform Meeting With Bowles. Several members of Texas' congressional delegation are seeking to meet next week with White House Chief of Staff Erskine Bowles and discuss Texas' welfare reform plan. Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison, whose office is circulating a letter requesting the meeting, has also filed an amendment to the supplemental appropriations bill that would allow Texas to go ahead with its welfare plan.

In crafting its welfare reform proposal, a spokesperson for Gov. George W. Bush said the state submitted to the Department of Health and Human Services an RFO -- or Request For Offers -- which would allow private-sector companies to bid for the job of engineering Texas' welfare reform. However, the Clinton Administration met last week with state officials and reportedly denied the RFO.

According to an HHS official: "We met with them, and they want to hire a contractor who will develop a full plan. However, one of the ambitious goals" of the Texas plan involves "re-engineering their eligibility program by taking the three different Federal programs [welfare, Medicaid and food stamps]...and rolling it into one set of eligibility." Added the official: "We told them that in the statute, under determination of eligibility, it says anybody who has discretion to screen in or screen out someone has to be a public-sector employee. So that could not involve private-sector contractors." The official continued: "That's what the law says. It's one way of saying this is a fundamental function of government. And there is a reason the law was written that way. The notion is about protecting the rights of beneficiaries, because those who are not part of the public system might have other interests beyond their intended role here."

Bush's spokesperson said Texas wants "to consolidate the eligibility interviews for all of the programs. We are trying to tap the technological expertise of the private sector. Our state agencies want to team up with private sector companies. We're trying to create a one-stop shop, so that someone who needs help comes in and is interviewed, and we can determine what kind of help that person needs." The Administration official said: "We see their goal is better services, sort of 'one-stop shopping' for benefits, and cost effectiveness. But, although Congress gave the

states:..unlimited flexibility in how they design their welfare program, they didn't change the laws affecting Medicaid and food stamps. Those two programs' certification of eligibility has to be done by public-sector employees."

Bush's spokesperson said the state has turned to its Federal delegation. "Despite the words of the Clinton Administration that they want to help states get welfare waivers, their actions make it clear they do not," the spokesperson said, adding: "Texas is tired of the double-talk and the runaround, and we are going to proceed with other means."

A Hutchison aide said several members of the delegation are signing a letter, seeking a meeting with Bowles "next Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday." The aide said Hutchison is also sponsoring an amendment to allow the bidding process to go forward. If the amendment is not considered during debate on the supplemental bill, the aide said Hutchison "will continue to look for the appropriate legislative opportunity to get Texas the approval."

Meanwhile, an aide to Texas GOP Rep. Bill Archer, chair of the Ways and Means Committee, said Archer "supports" Hutchison's measure, "but he doesn't want to have states coming up [to Capitol Hill] asking for special waivers that have to be written into legislative language. As you know, Texas wants to create a state-wide system of offices, run by a private contractor, where residents would apply for Medicaid, Food Stamps, welfare, and other public assistance.

On Friday, HHS and USDA officials met with the Texas Health and Human Services Commissioner. They told him that the state could release an Request for Offers seeking private contractors to operate welfare offices subject to written guidelines that will be provided by the agencies later this week. These guidelines will make clear what federal statutes and regulations allow -- and what they prohibit -- with respect to privatization. In general, Texas will not be allowed to privatize eligibility determination or information gathering functions. The state, however, will be able to contract with a private party to do outreach and to revamp computer and other automation systems.

Yesterday, Senator Hutchison filed an amendment to the supplemental appropriations bill which would allow Texas to create a state-wide, privately-run benefit eligibility system. We have sent a Statement of Administration policy to the Congress saying we strongly oppose this amendment, that we are working with Texas to resolve these issues, and Congressional action is inappropriate at this time. Meanwhile, some members of the Texas delegation, including Representatives Stenholm, Armey, DeLay, and Archer and Senators Gramm and Hutchison, have sent Erskine a letter requesting a meeting on the subject next week.

Q&As on Welfare Meeting with Texas Delegation
5/7/97

[These Q&As assume the Chief of Staff agrees to meet with the members of the Texas delegation.]

Question: Did you get a letter from Sen. Gramm, Rep. Archer and other members of the Texas delegation asking for a meeting next week with the President's Chief of Staff? Do you plan to agree to the request?

Answer: We did get the letter. We do plan to meet with these members of Congress to discuss the response we have given to the state of Texas. We do not intend to re-open the issue of the Texas request at this meeting, but instead to discuss with members of Congress the position we will have already discussed with state officials.

Last week, HHS and USDA officials met with the Texas Health and Human Services Commissioner. They told him that the state could release an RFO subject to written guidelines that will be provided by the agencies. By the time the Chief of Staff meets with members of Congress, the agencies will have conveyed these guidelines, which will make clear what federal statutes and regulations allow -- and what they prohibit -- with respect to privatization.

[In general, Texas will not be allowed to privatize eligibility determination or information gathering functions. The state, however, will be able to contract with a private party to do outreach and to revamp computer and other automation systems.]

We have never stated publicly the bracketed information, but this was the line taken by the agencies in this meeting with Commissioner McKinney. This distinction does not apply to Temporary Assistance to Needy Families, i.e., cash welfare, which the new welfare law explicitly allows to be privatized.

Several of us just got a fairly baffling memo from Judy Heumann/Howard Moses of the Education Dept. about a "Section 508" issue. It is a bit of a mess, so I will do my limited best to summarize what is going on.

Section 508 is part of a 20-year-old law (the Rehab Act). It requires that federal computer purchases be accessible. A group of federal appointees with disabilities, led by Howard Moses of Education, has been arguing for months that the Administration (OMB) has not done nearly enough to make sure that agencies are living up to this.

Now there is a bill from Rep. Eshoo that may get added to a larger workforce bill. It would mandate that OMB has some role in all this -- I think to certify that agencies were complying. The Education Dept's memo proposes that we support the bill, and it cc's all the most prominent disability advocates in the administration, including those at the National Council on Disability, who are not entirely internal to the Administration.

It seems very odd to me that we would support a bill that requires us to enforce an existing law. I have told Education this, but they will push hard that it is the only way to get OMB to take any action. It seems like we ought to be able to satisfy them without supporting a change in the law.

Subject: Leahy-altered version of volunteer bill

I got a call earlier today from Ben Freeland in Leg Affairs asking whether the Leahy changes in the volunteer bill -- which then went on to pass by 99-1 -- "satisfied the Administration's concerns." As I understand it, Ben is writing this for something to go to a Senate caucus this weekend, so it's important we get the right answer. Unfortunately (for all of you) I will be out of the office and unreachable until late in the day tomorrow. Ben needs an answer before then. Someone needs to call him on 66650.

I've left copies of the bill on your desks. Essentially, all Leahy was able to do -- under, I gather, pressure from the majority to claim Democrats were hypocrites because they wouldn't support volunteerism -- was limit the bill to volunteers only, eliminating the limitations on liability of nonprofits and government entities.

In my opinion, the resulting bill would, standing alone, be acceptable in the context of the push for volunteerism, although there still is the broader issue whether anyone has demonstrated a need to preempt. Admittedly, someone volunteering with the Klan who negligently hits someone else while riding a bicycle to get the food for a Klan picnic would probably get the benefit of the bill (since I assume the picnic wouldn't be a hate crime) but I assume we could live with that eventuality.

The real problem, of course, is that this bill does not stand alone, out of the context of broad tort reform. THEREFORE, the fact that the bill still contains: (i) one-way preemption; (ii) a total bar of joint and several liability for non-economic damages; and (iii) a punitives standard that might be tougher than we want, in addition to the overly broad definition of non-profit organization, does raise some concern. The Porter bill pending in the House with bi-partisan support is not really a preemption bill at all, but an incentive. Even looked at as a preemption, it has NONE of the problems of the revised Coverdale bill.

I therefore think our message to the Democratic Senators should be: we think Senator Leahy's initial speech was right on point but understand why you went along with this, and it's certainly better than the original Coverdale bill. However, the basic question of "why preemption?" hasn't been answered, and moreover there are still some real problems with the bill, in the context of the Republicans' broader push for tort reform, namely one-way preemption, the total bar on joint and several liability for non-economic damages and [? an excessively high punitives standard?]. Moreover, the extremely broad definition of nonprofit organization remains troubling. We think the right thing to do is for every Democrat, and the Administration, to get behind the Porter bill, and to work hard to get that bill, which has none of these problems, through the House and, eventually, the bill that is adopted by the conference committee. Failing that, we think it essential that at least the joint and several liability provision be removed.

As you know, Texas wants to create a state-wide system of offices, run by a private contractor, where residents would apply for Medicaid, Food Stamps, welfare, and other public assistance.

On Friday, HHS and USDA officials met with the Texas Health and Human Services Commissioner. They told him that the state could release an Request for Offers seeking private contractors to operate welfare offices subject to written guidelines that will be provided by the agencies later this week. These guidelines will make clear what federal statutes and regulations allow -- and what they prohibit -- with respect to privatization. In general, Texas will not be allowed to privatize eligibility determination or information gathering functions. The state, however, will be able to contract with a private party to do outreach and to revamp computer and other automation systems.

Yesterday, Senator Hutchison filed an amendment to the supplemental appropriations bill which would allow Texas to create a state-wide, privately-run benefit eligibility system. We have sent a Statement of Administration policy to the Congress saying we strongly oppose this amendment, that we are working with Texas to resolve these issues, and Congressional action is inappropriate at this time. Meanwhile, some members of the Texas delegation, including Rep. Stenholm, Chairman Archer, and Senator Gramm, have sent Erskine a letter requesting a meeting on the subject next week.

fyi-- Diana may have updated you on this, but the product of the Lott-sponsored bipartisan negotiating process for the IDEA reauthorization will be marked up at the full committee level tomorrow morning in both the House and the Senate. Assuming the mark-ups go smoothly, in the afternoon, Secretary Riley will have a press conference (tentatively 3 pm) to praise the legislation, with probable attendees including Sens Lott, Jeffords, Coats, and Harkin, and Reps Goodling, Riggs, Castle, L. Graham, Clay, Martinez, and Miller. Sen. Kennedy might also participate--see below. Floor action on the bill is expected next week, on Tuesday in the House and on Thursday in the Senate. If all goes without a hitch, we could be looking at the potential for a bill signing as early as May 22 or 23.

The main question mark for tomorrow is Kennedy; late in the process he began pushing to give DOJ authority to investigate IDEA matters without having them referred from Education, as a means of toughening enforcement. There has been lots of back and forth between Kennedy and Lott's staff; as of late today it wasn't clear whether Kennedy would pursue this tomorrow, and if he does (and fails) what it would mean for his support for the bill overall, which is getting praise as very balanced from both education and disability advocacy groups. Meanwhile, Kennedy has irritated the Republicans, notably Riggs, for raising the DOJ issue so late. Riggs has made noises about pushing harder on an issue of his own (having to do with services to students in adult prisons) that had already been raised and addressed in the negotiating process, but ED thinks at this point he probably won't.

On one of the biggest sticking point from the last Congress, cessation of services/discipline, my understanding is that the agreement that has been worked out would overrule the 4th Circuit decision and explicitly require states to provide services to special ed students who had been suspended or expelled from school.
