I. Incarceration of juveniles with adults in the federal system

Under the Administration's proposed legislation, the "Anti-Gang and Youth Violence Act of 1997", juveniles prosecuted as juveniles could not be housed with adults until they reach age 18, regardless of the offense. Moreover, no juvenile under age 16 who has been charged or convicted as an adult, can be housed with an adult under the proposed bill. Juveniles prosecuted as adults can be housed with adults after they reach the age of 16, at the discretion of the Bureau of Prisons.

As juveniles have become increasingly violent, however, housing such dangerous juveniles with other juveniles can endanger younger, and sometimes more vulnerable, delinquents. The Administration believes it is more appropriate to give federal prison authorities the ability to be flexible depending upon the needs of the individual defendant.

II. Prosecution of more juveniles as adults

The current process for determining whether a juvenile will be prosecuted as an adult or as a juvenile is often highly unpredictable. The Administration's bill does not add any new offenses for which a juvenile can be charged in federal court.

However, the Administration bill does expand the circumstances where a juvenile can be charged as an adult by giving federal prosecutors the discretion to transfer juvenile offenders to adult criminal court. It should be noted that except for the most serious juvenile offenders, age 16 and older, juveniles charged as adults may petition the court to be tried as juveniles rather than adults.

III. More mandatory minimum sentences for juveniles

The Administration's legislation increases mandatory minimum sentences from one year to three years for three narrowly targeted crimes: selling drugs to minors; using minors to distribute drugs; and trafficking drugs in or near a school or other protected location. The Administration believes that the proposed increases are necessary to punish persons who endanger children by selling illegal drugs to them, or employ or otherwise use them in their drug trade, and to deter others from engaging in such reprehensible and dangerous conduct.

The mandatory minimum sentences could apply to juveniles who are prosecuted as adults. However, it should be noted that "safety valves" on mandatory sentences may be applied to 13-15 year olds in certain circumstances.

IV. Availability of public records

President Clinton has had a longstanding commitment to fight for the rights of victims of crime. The Administration's bill contains important protections for the rights of victims, including the victims of crimes committed by juvenile offenders. The bill clarifies current law by extending to victims of juvenile offenders the right to information about the juvenile proceeding that they might need or be entitled to under state or federal law. For example, victims would be able find out about the status of the proceedings, or the release status of the offender. Fingerprints and photographs of adjudicated delinquents found to have committed the equivalent of an adult felony offense or a federal gun offense would be sent to the FBI and made available in the same manner applicable to adult defendants.

The Administration believes these changes represent a fair balance between maintaining important protections for juveniles and expanding the information available to their victims.

PRESIDENT PUSHES FREE TRADE AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION WITH LEADERS OF CENTRAL AMERICAN NATIONS

Today, the President holds a summit meeting with Central American leaders to address the common issues of growing economies, good education, safe streets, clean air and clean water.

- The President will sign an Open Skies Agreement that will increase the competitiveness and access of U.S. businesses in Central America.

Earlier in the week, President Clinton visited Mexico, where he signed two historic agreements to battle drug trafficking and protect our common border:

- "An Alliance Against Drugs," which commits both nations to cooperative efforts to crack down on corruption, money laundering, arms trafficking and distribution of illegal narcotics;
- "A Vision of the Border 2010," which will help combat illegal alien trafficking and underscore the human rights of all citizens regardless of immigration status.

The President's visit shows how far America's relationship with Central America has come. A decade ago, we focused on fighting insurgency. Today, we are cooperating to fight poverty, promote prosperity, strengthen democracy and protect the environment -- making the Americas a foundation of U.S. security and prosperity in the 21st Century.

YESTERDAY: FCC APPROVAL OF "E-RATE" A MAJOR VICTORY FOR EFFORT TO CONNECT AMERICA'S CLASSROOMS TO THE INTERNET

- In a unanimous vote, the FCC approved the President and Vice President's proposal for discount education rates for schools and libraries that want to get connected to the Information Superhighway -- to help meet the goal of connecting every classroom and school library to the Internet by the year 2000.
- This new "E-Rate" will make more than \$2 billion in discounts available annually to schools and libraries. For most schools and libraries, the cost of both telephone and Internet access will be cut in half. For our poorest schools, access will be almost free.
- Vice President Gore said: "This decision will help to ensure that all of our children -- whether rich or poor, from inner cities or isolated rural communities -- have the same access to the same vast world of knowledge."

Elena: Remember when you said we should go get a cup of coffee some time? (That was probably 18 months ago). Well, the bill has come due. Instead of a cup of coffee, or reminiscing about those precise and analytical questions you drafted for Justice Ginsburg, you have to read this e-mail about one of your favorite issues concerning the constitutionality of the Amtrak Board of Directors...

After languishing for months we are now in a big hurry to move the Amtrak reauthorization bill to the Hill by the beginning/middle of next week if we can. The sole remaining issue that needs to be ironed prior to transmittal is OLC's concerns about the constitutionality of the appointment of Board members.

We are meeting on Monday at 2 p.m. to try and resolve the issue. Our goal for this meeting to hopefully end up somewhere near to where we were at the end of the last go around -- that is, no proposal to modify the Board of Directors.

DoT has drafted a response to the OLC comments (let me know if you want a copy). This draft discusses the problems of relying on the Lebron decision and the heavy political and financial price which would be paid by supporting OLC's views (it makes it easier to argue that Amtrak's liabilities should be Federal liabilities in event of a bankruptcy). Neil Kinkopf from OLC and perhaps his boss will be coming to this meeting Monday and Bill Marshall from WH Counsel, along with other folks from DoT. We suspect that this issue will again require WH Counsel to weigh in and dissuade OLC from its current views. Any thoughts you could share

with us, or Bill on the background of this subject would be helpful. Also, any opinions you have on the best way to proceed (especially opinions which reaffirm your previous wise conclusion on this issue) would be appreciated.

TALKING POINTS ON 1997 COMMENCEMENT ADDRESSES

The President will deliver three commencement addresses, with a central theme of preparing America for the 21st Century. Each address will focus on a separate subject vital to the American people in the 21st Century, but also return to a broader message: the need to take advantage of the forces of change, so that they work for us, not against us.

- **Morgan State -- Sunday, May 18 -- Science and Technology.** Will reflect on the new wonders of science and technology and the Information Age -- but also the ethical dilemmas they pose and the need to harness them so that they work for us, not against us (e.g. computers vs. freedom of speech, cloning vs. natural selection).
- **West Point -- Saturday, May 31 -- Foreign Policy Vision/NATO Enlargement.** Will be one of the major foreign policy addresses of second term -- presenting the President's vision of the demands of American leadership in the 21st Century, making a strong case for NATO enlargement.

[Note: two days earlier in the Hague, the President will deliver a major address to the people of Europe on the future of American-European relations. West Point will be the President's major address to the American people on the same subject.]

- **UC San Diego -- Saturday, June 14 -- Race and Reconciliation.** Will focus on the need to remain strong as One America -- harnessing the increasing diversity of our nation as our greatest strength.

DRAFT -- IDEA REAUTHORIZATION

Wednesday the House Education and the Workforce Committee and the Senate Labor and Human Resources committee approved nearly identical bills reauthorizing the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The legislation embodies much of the Administration's original reauthorization proposal, which was designed to place a stronger emphasis on teaching and learning and improving educational results for disabled children. For example, the bill requires that Individualized Education Plans (IEP's) be focused on enabling the child to participate in the general curriculum, and reaffirms that disabled students must be included in state and district assessments, with appropriate accommodations where necessary.

The legislation also reflects reasonable compromises on many of the stickiest issues left over from the last Congress, protecting the rights of disabled students and their families while also expanding the authority of teachers and principles to protect the safety of all children in the classroom. In particular, the legislation would make it easier to remove a student from the classroom for bringing a weapon or drugs to school but would overturn the 4th Circuit's decision permitting cessation of services, and require that disabled students continue to receive services even if they have been suspended or expelled. The legislation would also make changes in the IDEA funding formula, using census and poverty counts in order to reduce incentives to wrongly identify children as having a disability (although formula changes would only take effect at substantially increased appropriations levels).

This week's committee action was the culmination of an intensive bipartisan negotiating process, convened by Majority Leader Lott's staff, involving key House and Senate Democrats and Republicans, Administration officials, and education and disability groups, which methodically addressed outstanding issues left over from the last Congress.

There are still some issues that could threaten final passage -- particularly related to the provision of services to imprisoned youth identified as disabled (a concern in California) -- and the schedule for floor action is not yet finalized in either house. At present, the legislation is expected to be approved by the House on Tuesday, and could be given final approval by the Senate as early as Wednesday. There is a very good chance the bill will be ready for signature by the end of month.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

Today, the House of Representatives is missing an important opportunity to fight and prevent the scourge of juvenile crime. I oppose passage of H.R. 3, the Juvenile Crime Control Act, because it fails to provide a comprehensive plan to crack down on youth and gang violence.

As I began my second term as President, I made juvenile crime and gangs my top law enforcement priority over the next four years. I called on every police officer, prosecutor, and citizen in America to work together to keep our young people safe and to keep young criminals off our streets.

America's Anti-Gang and Youth Violence Strategy must declare war on gangs; target funding for additional local prosecutors to pursue, prosecute, and punish gang members; extend the Brady Law so violent teen criminals will never have the right to purchase a gun; require federal dealers to sell a child safety lock with every gun, to protect our kids from using guns to hurt each other or themselves; and target resources to keep schools open late, on weekends, and in the summer, to keep young people off the street and out of trouble.

H.R. 3 fails to provide any of these necessary measures to give law enforcement, prosecutors, and parents the tools they need to combat gangs and youth violence in their communities.

Four years ago, we made a commitment to take our streets back from crime and violence. We had a comprehensive plan of 100,000 new community police officers on the street, tough new penalties on the books, and steps to keep guns out of the hands of criminals with the assault weapons ban and the Brady Bill.

Our plan is working. Last year, violent crime came down for the fifth year in a row. And for the first time in seven years, the rate of young people arrested for violent crime and murder has gone down. But we cannot waste this opportunity to bring down violent juvenile crime even further. I will continue to work with Congress to ensure passage of legislation that will give our children the safest and most secure future possible.

RADIO ADDRESS ON JUVENILE JUSTICE LEGISLATION
Saturday, May 10, 1997

This morning, I want to talk about the responsibility we share to protect our children from the scourge of violent crime -- especially crime that is committed by other young people.

Because of our hard work over the past four and a half years, we know that America's children face a brighter future. Economic growth is the highest it has been in a decade -- and unemployment is at its lowest level in 30 years. Last Friday, we reached an historic agreement to finish the job of balancing the budget -- to keep our economy thriving, while opening the doors to education wider than ever, and providing health care for five million uninsured children. Together, we are proving that we can meet our toughest challenges, and prepare our people for the promise of a new century.

But our children cannot live out their dreams if they are living in fear of gangs and guns. That is why I have worked so hard to reverse the tide of crime. We passed a tough crime bill that is putting 100,000 police on our streets. We passed the Brady Bill, which has stopped over 186,000 felons, fugitives, and stalkers from buying handguns. We banned deadly assault weapons. We passed the biggest anti-drug budget ever. We're making our schools safe, drug-free, and gun-free.

Our strategy is working. Serious crime has dropped five years in a row. But at the same time, crime among young people is on the rise. Experts predict that unless we act now, the number of people arrested for violent crimes will double by the year 2010. That means we must launch a full-scale assault on juvenile crime. We need smart prevention to stop juvenile crime before it starts. And young people must know that if they commit a violent crime, they will face tough punishment, and build a criminal record that could follow them throughout their lives.

This February, I sent legislation to Congress that would declare war on gangs, with new prosecutors and tougher penalties. It would extend the Brady Bill so that someone who commits a violent crime as a juvenile can never buy a gun. It would require child safety locks to be sold with guns -- to keep children from hurting each other or themselves. It would help keep schools open after hours, on weekends, and in the summer, keeping children off the streets and out of trouble. This tough, balanced approach has shown dramatic results at the local level; in Boston, where many of these efforts are in place, youth murders have dropped 80% in five years, and not one child has been killed with a gun in over a year and a half.

Unfortunately, this Thursday, the House of Representatives passed a juvenile justice bill that falls far short of that promise. The House bill is weak on guns, weak on gangs, and weak on probation -- and it walks away from the prevention programs that can remake children's lives.

The House bill does not guarantee the new anti-gang prosecutors we desperately need to pursue, prosecute, and punish violent juveniles. It does not guarantee efforts such as Operation

Night Light, where police and probation officers make nightly visits to the homes of young probationers, to make sure they live up to the strict rules of their probation.

The House bill does not fund anti-crime initiatives to keep our schools open later and on weekends, so young people can stay under the watchful eye of parents, educators, religious and community leaders -- instead of on streetcorners, where the most common influences are bad influences. We know violent crime peaks right after the school day ends. We've got to engage our children during that time, to steer them out of harm's way.

Most troubling of all, the House bill rejects my call to cut-off young people's access to guns. The need for child safety locks is obvious. If we can have them on bottles of aspirin, we should certainly have them on guns. According to a new survey, 185 children died in 1994 because of accidental shootings. For many more juveniles, stolen or borrowed guns become instruments of deliberate violence and destruction. Firing a gun should not be as easy for a child as squeezing the trigger. Extending the Brady Bill is just as important. If you commit a violent crime as a juvenile, you should forfeit your right to buy a gun forever.

The House-passed juvenile justice bill is unacceptable. To me, a juvenile justice bill that does not limit children's access to guns is a bill that walks away from the problem. Not a single hunter would lose their guns because of child safety locks; not a single law-abiding adult would be denied a gun if we extend the Brady Bill to those who committed violent juvenile crimes. But countless young lives would be saved when stolen guns become useless guns, and when lawless juveniles become gunless adults. If Congress really wants to get tough on juvenile crime, then it's time to get tough on guns, and take them out of the hands of violent juveniles.

To keep crime going down, Congress must pass a tough, balanced juvenile justice bill. That's the only way we can reach the day when we are no longer numb to acts of violence by and against our children -- when their appearance on the evening news is both shocking and rare. And it is the only way our children can learn and play without risk of harm -- so they can make the most of their future, and of the world they will inherit.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

Today, the House of Representatives is missing an important opportunity to fight and prevent the scourge of juvenile crime. I oppose passage of H.R. 3, the Juvenile Crime Control Act, because it fails to provide a comprehensive plan to crack down on youth and gang violence.

As I began my second term as President, I made juvenile crime and gangs my top law enforcement priority over the next four years. I called on every police officer, prosecutor, and citizen in America to work together to keep our young people safe and young criminals off our streets.

My Anti-Gang and Youth Violence Strategy declares war on gangs, with a requirement that dealers sell child safety locks with firearms, to protect our kids from using guns to hurt each other or hurt themselves; targeted funding for additional local prosecutors to pursue, prosecute and punish gang members; a Brady Law extension so violent teen criminals will never have the right to purchase a gun; and targeted resources to keep schools open late, on weekends, and in the summer, so young people have something to say yes to.

H.R. 3 fails to provide any of these necessary measures to give law enforcement, prosecutors, and families the tools they need to combat gangs and youth violence in their communities.

Four years ago, we made a commitment to take our streets back from crime and violence. We had a comprehensive plan of 100,000 new community police officers on the street, tough new penalties on the books and keeping guns out of the hands of criminals with the assault weapons ban and the Brady Bill.

Our plan is working. Last year, violent crime came down for the fifth year in a row. And for the first time in seven years, the rate of young people arrested for violent crime and murder has gone down. But we cannot waste this opportunity to bring down violent juvenile crime even further. I will continue to work with Congress to ensure passage of legislation that will give our children the safest and most secure future as possible.

Administrator Sally Katzen testified today before the Senate Committee on Rules and Administration, in support of Government Printing Office (GPO) reform.

CONGRESS TODAY (5/8):

SENATE

Passed (78-22) S. 672, the Bosnia/Disaster Assistance Supplemental.

[SAP sent, 5/7: □Based on the Senate Committee bill, which included the automatic continuing resolution, the President had indicated that he would veto it because it includes strongly objectionable extraneous provisions.□8]

While under consideration, the Senate took the following action:

- o Tabled (55-45) the Byrd amendment to strike the McCain provision regarding the automatic continuing resolution which provides 100% of the FY97 enacted level for FY98.
[Raines letter with Presidential veto threat sent 5/8, Thursday morning]
- o Tabled (54-46) a Warner (R-VA) amendment to modify the allocation of highway outlays to conform to existing resources.
- o Reid (D-NV) withdrew his amendment regarding the Endangered Species Act (ESA).
- o Adopted (voice vote) Kempthorne compromise ESA amendment to allow critical repairs to levees to go forward and placed unspecified limitations on what a community has to do to preserve endangered species when performing maintenance on levees.
- o Tabled (62-38) Gramm (R-TX) amendment to pay for the non-defense disaster spending in the bill through an across-the-board reduction of 1.9 percent in FY 1997.
- o A Hutchison/Gramm amendment to provide Texas greater flexibility in administering federally-funded public health and human services programs was ruled not in order.
- o Adopted (voice vote) a Stevens (for Daschle, Dorgan, Conrad, and others) amendment to increase CDBG funding from \$100 million to \$500 million and reduce FEMA from \$3.5 billion to \$3.1 billion.

TEXT:

Here is a (lengthy) inventory of current ideas on how to follow up on the Summit. It isn't as digested as it should be, but I figure it is better to lay it out to get us thinking. FYI, Steve Silverman needs to give Sylvia/Erskine a reaction to Eli's ideas; he says he will share any memo with me before forwarding it to her. I am assuming we will work up our own list and share it when we're ready. Let me know when/if you want to sit down on this, or email me your reaction.

A basic question is how much to strike out on our own with events that reinforce our message vs. work with the Summit/501c3 structure. Inevitably we have to decide how involved to be with Powell. We could bow out and wish him well (particularly given the legal constraints on our involvement with the 501c3). But it probably makes sense to strike a balance and stay involved, since our dealings with him in the Summit went fairly well, and the President is so identified with the Summit.

Steve Silverman and I had lunch yesterday with Col. Bill Smullen (Powell's guy), Stuart Shapiro, Ken Allen (Points of Light), and Gomperts. All of them will stay involved, but the focus now shifts to Rick Little. They invited us to a meeting with Rick next week, and Steve and I think we should go -- although we have to figure out what we want out of it. Rick is now setting targets for the 5 resources and figuring out how to track whether they achieve their goal of 2 million.

The ideal outcome, of course, would be for Powell to reinforce our service/AmeriCorps message in some way. That is why events playing up our new 50,000 slots are best. Eli suggests helping Powell see that reauthorization of AmeriCorps is critical, but I'm not sure how we pull that one off. The best hope for this would probably be a variation on Gomperts' idea -- dedicating the 50,000 new slots as some kind of army to do Powell's work.

AmeriCorps/Service ideas

We will do our letter to nonprofits/religious groups pushing the 50,000 AmeriCorps expansion. In addition, the President's note that we ("and Colin") should reach out to religious groups and publicize Campolo's efforts raises the idea that we could launch Campolo's program. This would be especially nice if it has an AmeriCorps component.

I need to learn more from Campolo about the status of his program. The President writes about Campolo's program as if it already has young people signed up, but I don't think it does yet. His coalition has 6 religious organizations, but I don't know how broadly representative of the faith community they are. I'll work with Flo McAfee on this. If Campolo wants AmeriCorps scholarships, the Corporation will first have to

put it through their competitive grant process.

Other possibilities:

If the budget agreement really gets us the new America Reads AmeriCorps people, we could try to highlight our success there in some way. We could highlight Teach for America, now that we know it's ours. The President expressed interest in an invitation to CityYear's annual conference in Rhode Island in June. CityYear members are all AmeriCorps. We could see if they wanted to do any scholarship-only awards. I hear they are goofy, but he likes them. You mentioned the partnering service-learning initiative that got that NY Times story. Rifkin's next step is a retreat in June to hammer out how they get to their announced goals (700 coaches, 10,000 schools) in terms of organization. Maybe there is an event after that retreat. The Corporation is launching this "Leader Schools" program -- another announcement at Penn State last year. These are awards to recognize schools with exemplary service learning programs, with Ted Sizer figuring out how to identify them. Susan Stroud wants to make them resources for other schools. I need to figure out event opportunities here. On high school service scholars, we could revive our combination awards/Elks/Moose idea. The Corp. says they have made progress, but I don't know the particulars yet. We keep saying there is an opportunity to do something with seniors; we have to figure out what this might be.

Summit-related Ideas

Most of Eli's ideas piggy-back more directly onto the Summit. I like his idea of asking the non-profit to report to us quarterly. It's a way of staying connected without taking direct responsibility for its work (which we don't have anyway). They may not welcome such a mandate, but if we ask for it I assume they have to do it. (I'll check with counsel here.)

Some of his other ideas seem too Summit-oriented to me, and not so related to service -- bringing in CEO's to report on progress since the Summit, or convening a conference on one or more of the 5 goals. On the other hand, the President said in a note on the weekly that we should "consider doing a more extensive followup, e.g., tied to juvenile justice initiative, try to get other cities to follow Boston, etc." (Leanne tells me this refers to Boston's work on juveniles that he learned about at the kick-off to our juvenile bill -- active churches, a comprehensive network of providers to provide services to juveniles.) This sounds to me like a focus on two summit goals (mentoring and a safe place), so maybe we could do something with Powell here.

Related to that, Ray Chambers has become convinced that the way to deliver the 5 resources is through the schools. He is pushing Rifkin's Partnering Initiative to play a role in this, but Rifkin is not anxious to. Chambers is also pushing the idea of community coaches in each school, with some sort of brainstorming meeting at the Corporation next week. We could use this to reinforce our Communities in Schools proposal in the budget, and afterschool programs generally.

I doubt Powell would agree to add welfare to work as a 6th goal, as Eli suggests.

Finally, I have to work with the federal agencies to make sure they actually follow through on their commitments.
