Welfare Reform and the Bipartisan Balanced Budget Agreement

The Administration is pleased that the bipartisan budget agreement reflects a number of the President's highest priorities on welfare. It includes the President's proposal for a \$3 billion welfare to work fund (which is a centerpiece of the President's second-term agenda), restoring benefits to legal immigrants, and creating new work opportunities for individuals subject to the food stamp work requirement.

However, we are very concerned that, as the legislation carrying out the budget agreement takes shape in committee, it must not violate the spirit or letter of that bipartisan agreement. Further, this legislation should not become a vehicle for other provisions that do not have bipartisan support. (GET OMB OK on this statement??)

The House Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal does deviate in significant ways from that bipartisan agreement, and so the Administration strongly opposes it in its current form.

Welfare to Work

- First, it is important to note that, on the critical issue of welfare to work, the Administration is pleased that the Ways and Means Subcommittee \$3 billion proposal meets many of the Administration's priorities. These include targeting funds to areas and individuals with high needs, directing funds to cities and local governments, awarding some funds competitively, and allowing communities to create successful job placement and creation programs. We are very disappointed at the proposal lacks adequate worker protections and non-displacement provisions, and urge the subcommittee to add stronger language to better protect against worker displacement.

Legal Immigrants

- The Ways and Means Subcommittee's proposed amendment to the welfare law clearly violates the negotiated, bipartisan budget agreement policy to restore a minimal safety net for disabled *legal* immigrants. The Subcommittee's proposal would restore SSI and Medicaid benefits only to immigrants (both the disabled and non-disabled elderly) *already receiving* benefits prior to August 23, 1996; by contrast, the bipartisan budget agreement policy restores SSI and Medicaid benefits to *any* immigrant *in the country* as of that date who is or becomes disabled. The budget agreement targets assistance to the most vulnerable individuals.
- The Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal ignores vulnerable immigrants who become disabled after August 22, 1996. By the year 2000, the Subcommittee proposal would protect 75,000 fewer immigrants than the budget agreement.
- The Administration also strongly opposes the Subcommittee's initial proposal not to restore benefits for SSI beneficiaries whose sponsors have income over 150% of the poverty level. However, it appears that it has decided to drop this proposal. This proposal would cut off 100,000 severely disabled immigrants who would receive benefits under the budget agreement, and would be unfair to families of limited means.

Minimum Wage

- The Administration strongly opposes the Ways and Means Subcommittee's provision on the minimum wage. The Subcommittee proposes that welfare recipients engaged in workfare not be considered employees for the purposes of the Fair Labor Standards Act. It would permit states to count child care, Medicaid, and housing benefits in their calculation of the minimum wage, and to meet the work requirements by counting hours engaged in job search, education, and training beyond those currently allowed by the welfare law.
- This Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal would undermine the fundamental goals of welfare reform. The Administration believes strongly that everyone who can work must work -- and that those who work should earn the minimum wage, whether they are coming off of welfare or not. The House Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal does not meet this test.
- The Administration stands ready to work with Congress and states to discuss alternative proposals that do not undermine the minimum wage or weaken the law's work requirements.

GGingrich disappointed by Clinton silence on drugs

WASHINGTON (AP) House Speaker Newt Gingrich said Wednesday he was disappointed that President Clinton didn't appeal to young people to stay away from drugs during an appearance on cable television this week.

Gingrich, R-Ga., who talks often about his desire for a drug-free society, said Clinton's ``casual disregard'' in the hour-long documentary Tuesday night on the VH1 music channel was ``an opportunity wasted.''

He said teen drug use has more than doubled since 1992.

``Silence sends a message,'' Gingrich wrote Wednesday in a letter to Clinton. ``And your silence on teen drug use ... sent a powerful, unintended message to young people that drug use isn't that big a deal.''

The program, ``Bill Clinton: Rock `n' Roll President,'' featured the 50-year-old Clinton musing about his life and the music in it.

White House spokesman Mike McCurry said Gingrich ``well knows the president's commitments on discouraging drug use among young people'' and that the speaker's letter may have been written by an ``overeager staffer.''

He also said VH1 is geared to an audience that is older than most viewers of MTV, another music-based cable television channel.

``When the president was most recently on MTV, he had a lot to say about drugs and drug use,'' McCurry said. ``He has been talking frequently and often about the importance of discouraging drug use among younger people.''

Last month, Clinton rebuked the fashion industry for advertisements that feature models who appear to be strung out on heroin.

But Gingrich recalled Clinton's 1992 campaign appearance on MTV, when he joked about smoking marijuana in college, and suggested that was reason enough to make an anti-drug appeal in this latest cable appearance.

``You did not say a single word about the tragic consequences of drug use, or the terrible toll drugs have taken on music stars, from the overdoses of the 1960s to the current heroin fad in the entertainment industry,'' he said. ``Your casual disregard for the issue was an opportunity wasted.''

Shaw argues that SSI has become a retirement program for foreigners. Therefore, another advantage of the "disabled after entry" policy is that it is not nice to people who immigrated knowing that they would likely become a public charge -- i.e., the old, and those who arrived disabled. It is nice to people who came expecting to work and contribute. So it reinforces points we want to make on immigration policy.

This advantage is in addition to other arguments -- our policy is more generous than Shaw's in the long run; and it's fairer to sponsors, since they couldn't have anticipated disabled after entry. Not sure if argument works that non-disabled aged don't need it as much as disabled, since it's hard to expect old people to work -- though we can safely say "most vulnerable", I think.

WEDNESDAY: PRESIDENT SIGNS INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES EDUCATION ACT

Yesterday at the White House, President Clinton signed the bipartisan IDEA bill, reaffirming America's commitment to provide all our children with the world's best education:

- Since its enactment in 1975, IDEA has given children with disabilities the right to sit in the same classrooms and learn the same skills as their fellow Americans -- helping to ensure that all our children have access to the best education. Today, three times as many disabled young people are enrolled in colleges and universities, and twice as many Americans with disabilities in their twenties are in the workplace.
- The expanded IDEA will ensure that children with disabilities can be in the classroom and be included in school activities like work experience, science clubs and field outings; it will ensure that children with disabilities learn the same things with the same curricula and the same assessments as all other children, and it will help teachers get the full range of skills they need to teach children with disabilities.
- President Clinton said: "To the American people, we are saying that we do not intend to rest until we have conquered the ignorance and prejudice against disabilities that disables us all...In America, we recognize that what really counts is the spirit and the soul and the heart, and we honor it with this legislation."

THURSDAY: VICE PRESIDENT ANNOUNCES NEW CRIME AND DRUG PREVENTION MEASURES TO PROTECT PUBLIC HOUSING RESIDENTS

Executive Order No. _____ of June __, 1997

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and laws of the United States of America, including the Federal Advisory Committee Act, as amended (5 U.S.C. App.), and in order to establish a President's Advisory Board on Race, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1: Establishment. (a) There is established the President's Advisory Board on Race. The Advisory Board shall comprise [7] members to be appointed by the President. Members shall be chosen from the private sector and shall each have substantial experience and expertise in the areas to be considered by the Advisory Board. Members shall be representative of the diverse perspectives in the areas to be considered by the Advisory Board.

(b) The President shall designate a Chairperson [and a Vice-Chairperson] from among the members of the Advisory Board.

[c] [The President shall appoint an Executive Director of the President's Initiative on Race who shall assist the Advisory Board to carry out its functions.]

Sec. 2. Functions (a) The Advisory Board shall advise the President on various issues involving race and racial reconciliation, including:

(1) Promoting a constructive national dialogue to confront and work through controversial issues that surround race;

(2) Bridging racial divides by recruiting leaders in communities throughout the nation who will develop and implement innovative approaches to calming racial tensions;

(3) Finding, developing and implementing solutions in areas in which the issue of race has a substantial impact, such as education, economic opportunity, housing, health care, crime and the administration of justice;

(4) Increasing the nation's understanding of the myriad perceptions of race which exist, the recent history of race relations and the future of race relations.

Sec. 3. Administration. (a) To the extent permitted by law and subject to the availability of appropriations, the Department of Justice shall provide the financial and administrative support for the Advisory Board.

(b) The heads of executive agencies shall, to the extent permitted by law, provide to the Advisory Board such information as it may require for the purpose of carrying out its functions.

[c] The Chair or Vice-Chair may, from time to time, invite experts to submit information to the Advisory Board and may form subcommittees or working groups within the Committee to review specific issues.

(d) Members of the Advisory Board shall serve without compensation but shall be allowed travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, as authorized by law for persons serving intermittently in the Government service (5 U.S.C. 5701-5707).

Sec. 4. General. (a) Notwithstanding any other Executive Order, the functions of the President under the Federal Advisory Committee Act, as amended, except that of reporting to the Congress, that are applicable to the Advisory Board shall be performed by the Executive Director of the President's Initiative on Race in accordance with guidelines that have been issued by the Administrator of General Services.

(b) The Advisory Board shall terminate on [September 30, 1998] unless extended by the President prior to such date.

In his State of the Union address, the President said "We must act to meet a new goal: 2 million more people off the welfare rolls by the year 2000." 'People off the rolls' includes adults and their children; it includes adults who go to work as well as adults who leave welfare for other reasons (i.e., they get married or start getting child support and no longer need welfare).

The President has also set a goal of one million adults in work by the year 2000. His \$3 billion welfare to work proposal, announced during the campaign and included in the budget agreement, is designed to move these million welfare recipients into jobs. In the year 2000, approximately one million adults must be working in order to meet the welfare law's participation rates. If a million welfare recipients are working in the year 2000, it is possible that the welfare rolls will have declined by more than 2 million people, but the goal in the State of the Union was set at a round 2 million people off the rolls.

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Talking Points on Tobacco Settlement Talks

- o The Administration is closely monitoring the settlement talks among the tobacco industry, state attorneys general, public health groups, and private lawyers. Any agreement would have to be passed by the Congress and signed by the President.
- o We will carefully review any settlement that emerges from the discussions, and we will seek the advice of the public health community. As the President has said, in reviewing any settlement proposal, our focus will stay squarely on protecting kids and the public health.

Q: Would you support a settlement that caps punitive damages? That seems to be the key stumbling block.

A: I'm not going to speculate on any particular aspects of a potential settlement. The Administration proposed the toughest measures ever to protect children from tobacco, and we are fighting in the courts to see that those restrictions take effect. Our focus in reviewing any settlement will stay on protecting kids and the public health. The President has made it clear he is not going to agree to anything with respect to tobacco that jeopardizes the public health.

Q: Senator Lott and others are urging quick closure to the talks. They say that the window of opportunity is closing. Is the Administration trying to help close the deal?

A: No. Because any settlement will have a profound and lasting impact on the public health, the Administration will have to consider a settlement in a careful and thorough manner. There will be no rush to judgment and no precipitous action. We are not going to take a position on a proposal until the Administration and the public health community have fully reviewed it.

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Talking Points on Cloning

Background

On Saturday, June 7, at a local public meeting, the National Bioethics Advisory Commission (NBAC) is expected to complete its review of cloning issues. In its draft final report, NBAC concludes that it is morally unacceptable for anyone to attempt to create a child using the technology that created Dolly the sheep. NBAC bases this conclusion on safety concerns, finding that the technology is "likely to involve substantial risk to the potential child." NBAC also concludes, however, that other forms of "human cloning" -- such as the cloning of DNA sequences, cell lines, and tissues (which do not involve the creation of entire human beings) -- are scientifically important and not ethically problematic. NBAC chose not to address the creation of embryos; its draft report neither sanctions nor condemns the cloning of embryos.

NBAC's draft final report calls for carefully-worded national legislation prohibiting anyone from "attempting to create a child through somatic cell nuclear transfer techniques." The Commission recommends a sunset provision and further review of the issues by an oversight body prior to the sunset date. The Commission will vote on this recommendation at its public meeting Saturday, and the President is scheduled to announce legislation implementing NBAC's proposal in a White House ceremony Monday, June 9th.

TALKING POINTS

- o On Saturday, the National Bioethics Advisory Commission is scheduled to conclude its review of the ethical and scientific issues raised by possible human cloning. The President expects to receive NBAC's final report soon. We look forward to receiving and reviewing the Commission's recommendations.

Q. The Washington Post reported Wednesday that NBAC will recommend a legislative ban on creating a child through cloning but that the Committee won't prohibit the creation of embryos using this technology. Where does the President stand? Does he think we should allow cloned embryos?

A. The President is very concerned about using this new technology to clone human beings. He is deeply troubled by the prospect that it might someday be possible to create a child from one's own genetic material. That is why he asked NBAC to review the issue.

The question of creating embryos for research -- as opposed to creating a child -- is a separate question that raises distinct scientific and ethical issues. The President has already acted in this area. In 1994 he directed the National Institutes of Health not to fund the creation of human embryos for research purposes. Congress has also placed restrictions on the use of federal funds for embryo research.

As you know, NBAC has not issued its final report, and the President has not yet reviewed their recommendations. We will have more to say about it after he has reviewed it.

WELFARE REFORM AND THE BIPARTISAN BUDGET AGREEMENT

- The Administration strongly opposes the House Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal, which violates the bipartisan budget agreement, treats disabled legal immigrants unfairly, and prevents working welfare recipients from getting a minimum wage.
- The Administration is pleased that the Ways and Means Subcommittee \$3 billion welfare-to-work proposal meets many of the Administration's priorities. These include: targeting funds to areas and individuals with high needs, directing funds to cities and local governments, awarding some funds competitively, and allowing communities to create successful job placement and creation programs.
- But the provisions of the Subcommittee proposal addressing legal immigrants and the minimum wage are clearly unacceptable.

Legal Immigrants

- The Ways and Means Subcommittee's proposed amendment to the welfare law clearly violates the negotiated, bipartisan budget agreement policy to restore a minimal safety net for disabled legal immigrants. The Subcommittee's proposal would restore SSI and Medicaid benefits only to immigrants *already receiving* benefits prior to August 23, 1996; by contrast, the bipartisan budget agreement policy restores SSI and Medicaid benefits to *any* immigrant *in the country* as of that date who is or becomes disabled.
- The Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal would protect 75,000 fewer immigrants than the budget agreement by the year 2002. And in leaving unprotected any person who becomes disabled after August 22, 1996, it fails to target assistance to the most vulnerable individuals.

Minimum Wage

- The Administration also strongly opposes the Ways and Means Subcommittee's provision on the minimum wage, which undermines the fundamental goals of welfare reform.
- The Administration believes strongly that everyone who can work must work -- and that those who work should earn the minimum wage, whether they are coming off of welfare or not.
- The House Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal does not meet this test. It effectively creates a subminimum wage for workfare participants. And it weakens the welfare law's work requirements.

LEGAL IMMIGRANTS AND THE BIPARTISAN BUDGET AGREEMENT

The Ways and Means Subcommittee's proposed amendment to the welfare law clearly violates the negotiated, bipartisan budget agreement policy to restore a minimal safety net for disabled *legal* immigrants. The Subcommittee's proposal would restore SSI and Medicaid benefits only to immigrants (both the disabled and non-disabled elderly) *already receiving* benefits prior to August 23, 1996; by contrast, the bipartisan budget agreement policy restores SSI and Medicaid benefits to *any* immigrant *in the country* as of that date who is or becomes disabled. The budget agreement targets assistance to the most vulnerable individuals.

- **THE WAYS AND MEANS SUBCOMMITTEE PROPOSAL IGNORES VULNERABLE IMMIGRANTS WHO BECOME DISABLED AFTER AUGUST 22, 1996:** This proposal abandons many legal immigrants who were in the U.S. when the welfare law was signed but become severely disabled after that date. In contrast, the bipartisan budget agreement protects these immigrants.
- **BY THE YEAR 2002, THE WAYS AND MEANS SUBCOMMITTEE PROPOSAL WOULD PROTECT 75,000 FEWER IMMIGRANTS THAN THE BUDGET AGREEMENT.** This number grows to 125,000 by the year 2007.

Example: A legal immigrant family entered the country 3 years ago. Both the father and mother have worked full-time since then, and have an annual income of about \$25,000, but neither job provides health insurance for themselves or the family. Their 5 year-old son becomes severely disabled in a car accident next year. Under the budget agreement, he would be eligible for SSI and Medicaid; under the Ways and Means Subcommittee's proposal he would be denied SSI -- and potentially denied Medicaid.

Question: Doesn't the Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal treat the elderly better than the Administration's proposal, while the Administration's policy favors the disabled? Isn't this really a wash?

Answer: The parties to the budget agreement already made the decision about where to target limited resources. The agreement explicitly states the policy of restoring SSI and Medicaid eligibility to immigrants who are or become disabled and who are in the U.S. as of August 22, 1996. This is one of the specific policies agreed to by the President and the Congressional leadership. Furthermore, the Leadership Council of Aging Organizations and the Consortium of Citizens with Disabilities state that they will not support "any reductions in benefits to immigrants with disabilities in order to provide them to other groups of immigrants."

The Administration believes that the budget agreement appropriately targets the most vulnerable individuals. It provides for all immigrants in the country when the welfare law was signed who have suffered -- or may suffer in the future -- a disabling accident or illness. At the same time, the agreement will result in restoring benefits to a full 80% of the caseload as of August 22, 1996 -- all of those now classified as disabled plus approximately two-thirds of the elderly caseload who can be reclassified as disabled.

WELFARE TO WORK

We are pleased that the Ways and Means subcommittee has included in its mark a \$3 billion welfare-to-work proposal that meets many of the Administration's priorities:

- It directs funds where they're needed most: to help long term recipients in cities and other communities with large numbers of poor people;
- It awards some funds on a competitive basis, assuring the best use of scarce resources;
- It provides communities with appropriate flexibility to use the funds to create successful job placement and creation programs.

We are pleased that Congressman Shaw was willing to work in a bipartisan basis to incorporate many of the Administration's priorities.

We are, however, deeply disappointed at the subcommittee draft's lack of adequate worker protections and non-displacement provisions, and urge the subcommittee to add language that will better protect against worker displacement.

The President proposed a \$3 billion welfare to work program last fall and fought to have it included in the bipartisan balanced budget agreement. A centerpiece of the President's second-term agenda, the proposal will help move one million adults from welfare to work by the year 2000.

MINIMUM WAGE AND WORKFARE

Background: The Labor Department has concluded that the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) applies to welfare recipients in workfare or other subsidized employment programs in the same way as that law applies to all other employees. This means that most welfare recipients in these programs will receive at least the minimum wage.

The House Ways and Means Subcommittee on Human Resources proposes to amend the welfare law so that welfare recipients engaged in workfare would not be employees for the purposes of the Fair Labor Standards Act or any other federal law. Although requiring the minimum wage for hours worked, the proposal would permit states to count child care, Medicaid, and housing benefits in their calculation of the minimum wage. It would also allow states to count additional hours of job search, education, and training toward the welfare law's work requirements.

The Administration strongly opposes the Ways and Means Subcommittee's provision on the minimum wage and welfare work requirements.

- This Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal would undermine the fundamental goals of welfare reform. The Administration believes strongly that everyone who can work must work -- and that those who work should earn the minimum wage, whether they are coming off of welfare or not.
- The House Ways and Means Subcommittee proposal does not meet this test. It effectively creates a subminimum wage for workfare participants. And it weakens the welfare law's work requirements.
- This Subcommittee proposal also was not addressed in the budget agreement between the White House and Congress and should therefore not be included in the reconciliation bill.

MINORITY COLLEGE ADMISSIONS AND ENROLLMENT

Background

While the rate of minority enrollment continues to increase overall, the rate of growth has been slowing in recent years. Sharp declines in minority admissions and enrollment in both California and Texas demonstrate the stark impact of rolling back affirmative action in those states and jeopardize efforts to increase college-going among minorities.

- **Minority enrollment still increasing overall, but rate of growth is slowing --** While overall enrollment of students of color in colleges and universities rose by 2.9 percent between 1994 and 1995 (the latest year for which data is available), this is down from gains of 4.6 percent between 1993 and 1994 and 7.1 percent between 1992 and 1993. American Council of Education (ACE), *Minorities in Higher Education 1996-97*.
- **Sharp declines have occurred in minority admissions in California and Texas--** The University of California and the University of Texas at Austin have recently reported substantial declines in African-American and Hispanic applicants and acceptances. In both states the sharp declines in minority admissions are attributed to roll-backs of affirmative action--in California, by the UC Board of Regents, and in Texas by the 5th Circuit's Hopwood decision. American Council of Education (ACE), *Minorities in Higher Education 1996-97*.
- **California --** The number of black students admitted to UCLA law school dropped by 80% in one year and is now the lowest since the early 1970s. Boalt Hall Law School at UC Berkeley admitted just 14 black students out of a class of 792, down from 75 in 1996. *Washington Post*, 5/19/97, p. A1
- **Texas --** At the University of Texas, nearly 400 fewer blacks and Hispanics have been offered undergraduate admission, a 20% drop in one year. Just 14 blacks have been offered admission at the UT law school, down from 65; in May, the sole African American who had accepted an admission offer withdrew. [Note: Developments in Texas have caused such a furor that Gov. Bush has signed a law mandating that the top 10% of graduates of all Texas high schools be admitted to all of the state's public colleges and universities]. *Washington Post*, 5/19/97, p. A1; *Dallas Morning News*, 5/23/97, p. 33A; *USA Today*, 6/2/97.

Questions and Answers

Question: Are you concerned about reports of declining enrollments of minority students in postsecondary education?

Answer: These trends are disturbing and completely unacceptable. Educational opportunity is the touchstone of the American dream, and figures like these raise a serious concern that the doors of college education are being closed to minority students. In addition, diversity in education helps prepare all our students to be productive citizens in the 21st century, so these developments should concern

every American.

Question: What is your administration doing to address this problem?

Answer: We are working on several fronts to address this issue:

- We will continue to intervene in litigation in support of appropriate affirmative action programs. The Department of Education is looking for a good opportunity to challenge the Hopwood decision, and the Department of Justice has filed a brief challenging California's Proposition 209.
- The Office for Civil Rights at the Department of Education is conducting a review of the Texas higher education system to ensure that Texas has eliminated all remnants of its former de jure segregated system.
- And, more broadly, the Administration is pressing higher education officials to maintain and expand diversity, and offering assistance to them to do so. For example, we have called on colleges and universities burdened by new legal restrictions to develop new and creative approaches to achieving diversity, such as aggressively recruiting in secondary schools with high percentages of minority students and forming educational partnerships with such schools.
