With respect to General McCaffrey's request to have a Rose Garden signing for this bill, I thought I'd sum-up where we are so that we could all be on the same page before the 3pm Chief of Staff meeting. Here goes:

1. McCaffrey would like to see an event before Congress goes out and by early next week at the latest. He/his staff feels its a great opportunity for a bipartisan drug event focused on community coalitions (the bill passed overwhelmingly in the House and Senate).

2. Peter thinks its a positive, "feel good" event, and that we're making strides with House appropriators on making sure that the bill will get funded. If we get fairly solid assurances on funding -- and there are no Senate objections -- he thinks we should look to do an event early next week.

3. Tracey was checking with Daschle's folks on what they thought, but she had concerns that Senate Dems thought we would be letting the R's off the hook pretty easy (\$10 million in grant authorizations for community coalitions next year) by doing a bipartisan drug event when we can't get them to support our larger drug/prevention efforts.

4. I spoke to Chris Putala in Biden's office who thought that if Hatch and Grassley are interested in a bill signing, we should first try and get some "bipartisan" assurances from them on including prevention/after schools in the Juvie bill. The way it looks now, only Specter is likely to vote with us, so we need at least one more vote.

FINAL ANALYSIS: While this is generally a positive event for us to do,

we should think twice about giving the R's any credit without some measure of support on appropriating funds -- or if we know they're not going to be with us on the Juvie prevention amendment the following week. In we do the event without these assurances, we should use the speech to hold the R's accountable on our drug/prevention related priorities (i.e., juvie prevention, safe and drug-free schools, media campaign, ONDCP reauthorization, etc.)

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL  
THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE  
ALL FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

SUBJECT: Registration Of Sex Offenders Adjudicated in Federal or  
Military Courts

A recent Justice Department report found that on any given day, 60%, or over 140,000 of the 234,000 convicted sex offenders under the care of corrections officials, are living in the community on either probation or parole. We have taken steps to guard our communities against repeat offenses by these sex offenders by enacting the "Jacob Wetterling Act," "Megan's Law" and the "Pam Lychner Act." Among other things, these important pieces of legislation require States to make public relevant information about released child molesters and sexually violent offenders.

We have also worked to ensure that the information gathered in all 50 States is available on a nationwide basis. Last June, I directed the Justice Department to develop a national sexual predator and child molester registration system-- which for the first time would link together the sex offender registration systems being developed in all 50 states. The FBI recently announced that its interim national sex offender registry had become operational. Once complete, this system will allow arresting officers and others to immediately identify an individual as a convicted sex offender and indicate where that person is registered.

Much still needs to be done to make this system an effective tool in combating and preventing sex crimes. The new national registry will only be as good as the quality of the information on sex offenders that it contains. We must forge a close partnership between the FBI, other federal agencies, and state law enforcement agencies in ensuring that accurate and up-to-date information on the whereabouts of sex offenders is timely loaded into the system and available to those who need it.

Some states have already risen to this challenge and are loading their sex offender information into the national system. Other states are moving rapidly toward that objective. But, for the system to work, all states must work together. We have called upon every state to load its information on sex offenders into the national registration system as soon as possible.

At the same time, it is important that sex offenders adjudicated in federal or military courts are registered, including those released from federal or military prisons, or placed on probation. The potential danger to the public from a released child molester or sexually violent offender whose whereabouts are unknown to the authorities is the same, regardless of whether the offender was

convicted in a state, federal, or military court.

I am accordingly directing the Attorney General and the Secretary of Defense to maximize the use of current administrative options to ensure that: (1) federal and military authorities notify the appropriate state authorities concerning the release to their areas of sex offenders adjudicated in federal or military courts; (2) sex offenders adjudicated in federal or military courts are required to register in the states where they reside; and (3) complete and current information on released sex offenders adjudicated in federal or military courts will be included in the registries of the states where they reside and in the national sex offender registry. I am also asking the Attorney General and the Secretary of Defense to report, within 60 days, on any legislative changes that would be needed to realize these objectives fully and to allow the national sex offender registry to completely realize its important potential. Finally, I encourage federal and state cooperation with Indian tribes toward the inclusion of sex offenders who have been adjudicated through tribal justice systems.

While we're thinking about scheduling events for the summer, we should think about what to submit on service. We have discussed whether to seek a Presidential event highlighting our proposal to reauthorize AmeriCorps. The proposed bill isn't cleared through OMB yet, but should be soon. At the same time, the Corporation has a few time-sensitive announcements that we need to decide on. We should probably decide whether we want to package some or all of these ideas that are floating around and submit them as one idea to scheduling. For those we don't want to pursue that are time sensitive, it may be appropriate to let the Corporation announce them with a statement from us.

In addition to the idea of a reauthorization event, we have these:

1. The Corporation is now up to about 1,300-1,600 applications from high schools/seniors who are eligible for and can receive \$1,000 high school service scholarships. They can award these any time, but want to know whether we want to announce them. It seems bad to let this announcement drift much further, in that these are scholarships for the fall. We could tell the individual schools/students, and then have an event later, I guess.

If we decide the Corporation should just announce this, we could have the President do a letter to principals and/or superintendents praising the success of the kickoff year, and expressing the hope that next year they'll all apply for the scholarships. (Actually, we have match this year for about 6,000 scholarships; I suspect applications are topping off well short of that.)

2. We also talked about highlighting the Corporation's new "scholarship only" awards that we announced at the Phila. summit. The Corporation is getting close to having a new round of these awards to announce. This could be part of a reauthorization event if the timing is right.

**Susan Gendrich-Cameron** - Principal of Carson Lane Academy in Murfreesboro, TN. Susan is the head of a school that combines family centered decision making and the creative use of learning technology.

***SUGGESTED QUESTION: Susan, how did parents influence the creation of this wonderful school?***

**Yvonne Chan** - Co-founder and Principal of Vaughn Next Century Learning Center in Los Angeles, CA. Yvonne, with other neighborhood families, has transformed a failing elementary school into a strong charter school that is the core of a new community.

***SUGGESTED QUESTION: Hillary visited this wonderful school when she was in Los Angeles a few months ago. She was struck by the change you have created in the families, the school and the community, and the pride that the children are taking in their success. How did you accomplish that?***

**Roberta Altman** - Director of the partnership between Mid-Town West, a New York City public school, and Bank Street College. She is also teaches graduate classes in education.

**Warlene Gary** - Leader of the Center for the Revitalization of Urban Education. Warlene is representing NEA President Bob Chase. She has taught disabled and disadvantaged children in D.C., and has worked at the NEA to implement nationwide parental involvement initiatives.

Bruce -- as you suggested, I had a long talk with Richard Schwartz who used to run NYC's workfare program and who is now a consultant for other local governments and some companies. Here are his views about what's important to make welfare reform work in the real world:

He thinks 20 hours of real work is enough -- that's what they did in New York (20 hpw for single parent families and 26 for two parent families). The remaining hours could be filled in w/job search and training. He says the value of workfare is it teaches people the "soft skills" like showing up every day on time and that companies like to hire people with an attendance track record. 20 hours a week is enough to accomplish this.

He thinks its fair to count Medicaid, child care, housing if necessary, although he doesn't oppose dropping them from the latest proposal.

He says lots of local governments want to contract out workfare to non-profits, have them operate and supervise workfare programs (Newark, which he's now advising, is doing this). He thinks non-profits operating workfare programs should operate under the same rules as government agencies. More important, he says, is to ensure that any exemptions are only for 'workfare' defined as a program having people do work which would otherwise not get done.

He thinks strong anti-displacement language is needed, but he worries about opening up the possibility of lawsuits that could tie up welfare reform programs in the courts (he didn't have another enforcement mechanism to propose). He's more worried, by the way, about the possibilities of displacement and wage depression through the use of private sector wage subsidies than through workfare -- which is an argument for applying whatever new anti-displacement rules get through Congress to all of TANF, where more of this is likely to happen.

He strongly dislikes the idea of time-limiting workfare -- i.e., saying someone can be put in workfare for only 9 months. He thinks that workfare should be used to give someone a track record of recent job experience, and that kicking them off of workfare will make employers less likely to want to hire them.

**Clinton Administration: Protecting Children from Sex Offenders  
Registration of Federal and Military Sex Offenders Initiative  
June 24, 1997**

**Announcement**

- Today, President Clinton directed the Attorney General, the Secretary of Defense, and all federal law enforcement agencies to ensure that federal and military sex offenders are registered, both in the state in which they live and in the national sex offender registry. Today's directive is an important step that builds upon the Clinton Administration's record of protecting our children from sex offenders.

**Background**

A recent Justice Department report found that on any given day, about 60% of the 234,000 convicted sex offenders under the care of corrections officials are living in communities, either on probation or parole. Over the last few years, the Clinton Administration has made protecting our children from sex offenders a national priority.

- The 1994 Clinton Crime Act required sex offenders to register in the state in which they live; increased penalties for sexual abuse offenses and certain offenses against youthful victims; and broadened pretrial detention for serious sex offenses cases.
- In May 1996, President Clinton signed Megan's Law to ensure that communities are notified when sex offenders are in their midst. In June 1996, President Clinton directed the Attorney General to establish a national sexual predator and child molester registration system. This computerized system will help link together the sex offender and notifications systems being developed in all 50 states.
- The national sex offender registry became operational in February-- allowing law enforcement agencies to search the FBI's criminal history record database to determine whether an individual is a registered sex offender, and if so, where he or she is registered. Close partnerships must be formed between the FBI and other law enforcement agencies to ensure that accurate and up-to-date information on the whereabouts of sex offenders is loaded into the system and available to those who need it.

**Today's Measure**

- The directive instructs the Attorney General and Secretary of Defense to ensure that:
  - 1) federal and military authorities provide appropriate state authorities with information concerning the release of sex offenders from their facilities;
  - 2) federal and military sex offenders are required to register in the states where they reside; and
  - 3) complete and current information on released federal and military sex offenders will be included in appropriate state registries and the national registry.
- In addition, President Clinton has asked the Attorney General and the Secretary of Defense to report back to him within 60 days on any legislative changes that might be needed to fully implement the directive.

The Vice President is planning to make four announcements:

Findings from a parent survey sponsored by the Department of Education, the Family Involvement Partnership for Education, and GTE. Key findings:

88% of parents of parents think schools treat them as important partners in helping children learn, and 86% say teachers generally listen to what they have to say.

However, close to 80% of parents believe they and their teachers should learn more about how parents can be more effectively involved in their children's education.

Parents give higher marks to elementary schools than middle schools on several measures of parental involvement. For example, 62% of elementary school parents said schools do a very job explaining to parents what students should know and be able to do in each subject, versus 45% in middle school.

Establishment of a new partnership to train teachers on parental involvement, with a kickoff teleconference on effective use of technology set for this fall.

Founders include members of the Department of Education-sponsored Family Involvement Partnership for Education and four leading schools of education: Vanderbilt University, University of Minnesota, Bank Street College (NY), and Columbia Teachers College.

In addition to the fall conference, the partnership expects to produce and disseminate a guidebook on effective practices, sponsor new research, and organize follow-up meetings and activities to allow teachers to share ideas.

Creation of a privately financed school reform fund that would provide grants to support good school leadership and innovation among three different categories of public schools: start-up, speed-up, and turnaround schools.

The fund is being established as a 501(c)(3) based in Silicon Valley, headed by John Doerr and overseen by a board of private sector and education leaders.

The VP will have no formal role in the fund, although it stems from his challenge and vision of school improvement.

The VP has agreed to be the honorary co-chair of a kickoff conference to be held in the next several months.

Announcement (and demonstration) of a new technology tool -- an "electronic dashboard" -- that parents could access via computer to get important information about their child's school (school standards, events, homework assignments, etc.) and their child's performance (homework completion, attendance, etc.). The dashboard will also help parents communicate with other parents, as well as with teachers.

Student privacy will be scrupulously protected using cutting edge technology, as well as passwords for parents.

Developers of this new technology include Netscape and Marimba. Marimba's CEO is expected to assist with the demo.

An early version of the dashboard will be used to gather input on what's useful, with a more complete version made widely available later.

The VP will note that there are additional technology tools in existence to help parents, students and teachers work together.

### II. BACKGROUND

This is the third family conference you have attended, and the sixth family conference the Vice President has held. The conference is entitled "Family Re-Union 6: Families and Learning," and it will focus on family involvement in education. The Child and Family Policy Center at the Vanderbilt University for Public Policy Studies and the Children, Youth and Family Consortium at the University of Minnesota are co-sponsors of the event. The conference will be broadcast live via satellite throughout the country.

In your address, you will be announcing that the Department of Education will be releasing a publication entitled, **A Compact for Learning: An Action Handbook for School-Family Community Partnerships.** School compacts are required for schools that participate in the Title I program to ensure strong parental involvement, but can be a powerful tool for all schools that seek to raise student achievement. The handbook provides step-by-step strategies, examples, and checklists on how to create an effective school compact, how to use a school compact, and how to strengthen and improve a school compact over time, based on results. The published version of the handbook will be available in late summer, and copies may be reserved by calling the Department of Education and will also be available on the Department's World Wide Web site.

You and the Vice President will be leading a discussion designed to show the stages in developing family involvement in learning. The first three panelists will give vivid examples of local programs, the second three will discuss ways of expanding these strategies on a large scale, the following two panelists will describe strategies for

Following this panel, the audience will be shown a moving documentary produced by the Boston University Film school with Children of differeing ages discussing their families involvement or lack of involvement in their shchools.

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## **DRAFT STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT**

I am disappointed in today's Supreme Court's decision which rules part of the Brady Law unconstitutional. The Brady Law has kept 250,000 felons, fugitives, and mentally unstable persons from purchasing handguns. And I will do everything in my power to make sure that we continue to keep handguns out of the hands of criminals.

Today's ruling should not mean an end to Brady background checks. Twenty-seven states -- nine more than when the Brady Law first passed -- now conduct background checks as a matter of state law and will continue to do so.

We expect that the majority of law enforcement agencies in the remaining states will continue to conduct background checks-- not because they are required by federal law-- but because that is good law enforcement policy. I have directed Attorney General Reno and Treasury Secretary Rubin to contact police departments across the country today, to make sure they know that Brady background checks can continue to be done on a voluntary basis.

But we should not stop there. [I have also asked the Attorney General and Secretary Rubin to immediately convene a meeting with the nation's law enforcement leaders to review and develop recommendations to ensure that background checks will continue to be conducted.] Our goal is clear: no background check, no handgun.

We recently received encouraging news from the Justice Department that last year we saw the largest drop in violent crime in more than three and a half decades. Murders dropped a stunning 11 percent in 1996. Our strategy of more police, tougher punishments, and fewer guns in the hands of criminals is making a difference. But we cannot let up. The safety of our communities and of all Americans is better assured when Brady background checks are conducted.
