SUBJECT: PROCESS FOR RESOLVING HISPANIC CAUCUS  
CONCERNS ON NATIONAL TESTING INITIATIVE

It is critical that we have a final Administration position on the concerns raised by the Hispanic Caucus by the beginning of September, when Congress returns. Earlier would be preferable, though difficult. Below are my recommendations for how to proceed:

**1. Education Department produces options memo**

I have asked Secretary Riley to develop an options memo which can form the basis of a decision memo to the President.

- preliminary draft by August 8
- feedback from DPC, OPL, Leg affairs by August 11
- final by August 13

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I think we should plan on two internal meetings, including DPC, NEC, OPL, Leg. Affairs, Political Affairs, Intergovernmental, Communications, etc.

August 18: review and discussion of ED options, and assignments for external consultations

August 22: review feedback from outside groups, determine views of key offices, and agree on basic themes for decision memo

**3. Consultations during week of 18th**

- Hispanic Caucus
- Hispanic groups
- urban districts
- other supporters (e.g., business groups, AFT, NEA, )
- states that have signed up or are likely to
- key governors (e.g., Romer)

**4. DPC Decision Memo to POTUS**

By August 25, we should send a decision memo to POTUS that presents all options for which there is significant support, and which lays out pro's and con's, including education impact, likely impact on overall testing initiative, likely impact on race initiative, and other political considerations.

Friday evening we discussed getting some polling data that could help with the Hispanic testing issue and the Goodling battle. Here are my suggestions:

1. Would you like to know how well your child is doing in reading in English at the 4th grade and math at the 8th grade compared with national standards of excellence?
2. Would you like to know how well your local school is doing in reading in English at the 4th grade and math at the 8th grade compared with national standards of excellence?
3. Should the U.S. Congress prohibit your local school or state from having the opportunity to give a 4th grade national reading test and an 8th grade national math test, in order to tell if students are meeting national standards of excellence?
4. For students who have immigrated to the U.S. within the last (3 years? 2 years?), should they have the opportunity to show how well they can read in their native language, such as Spanish, as well as in English, since they haven't had the chance to learn English well?

I don't know if Penn usually does or can provide breakdowns by subgroups, but it would be great to see breakdowns by urban/suburban/rural; parents of school-age kids (and maybe grandparents); Hispanic, African-American, White; and something like fundamentalist Christians.

It will be especially helpful to see how Hispanics react to the last questions, and if white Americans care much one way or the other. It will also be helpful to see how fundamentalist Christians respond to the first three--it would be helpful if we can pass around some data that shows that even that group thinks the schools should have a right to use the test.

You sent me a copy of the note Jim Hunt sent gave to the President at the NGA meeting in which he asked the President to hold a WH reception for the Board, including the 600 Board teachers who will be invited to this. The Board will meet Oct 23-25, in DC.

I think we should do this. This will give the national board a big boost, and will be an honor for the board certified teachers. It's recognition they deserve.

The President indicated he is inclined to do it--that's always an important clue. This will be Hunt's final meeting as chair of the Board; it will mean a lot to Hunt to get this to happen. (Both Hunt's staff and the National Board staff have been lobbying me on this for a while. )

The President is a big fan of the board, and a big fan of Jim Hunt. Riley will also support this request--he is also a fan of Hunt and the Board, and the three of them have a mutual admiration society based on their early leadership of education reform in the early 80's. Hunt is also working Erskine on this.

I have a copy of an letter the board sent to POTUS for this meeting--just got it the other day. I'll put it together with what you sent me and send to Christa for a scheduling request.

Two other important things: (1) I don't think we have an obvious policy announcement to go with this event, so I don't think we should sell this as a message event. We can try to work on something from the pool of ideas we have been working on, but I don't have anything specific in mind. (2) Part of Hunt's motivation is to use the event in some fashion to encourage the business community to contribute to the Board. I don't know if he is going to ask the President to make a pitch to the business leaders who would be invited, but I think we need to find out exactly what Hunt and the Board have in mind, and exactly what is and is not permissible, before we get too far down the road.

Subject: Cardin Amendment

Below is my cut at the substance of what we agreed to at yesterday's Ed Strategy meeting as a possible substitute for the Cardin amendment. Please let me know if this strikes you as a sensible approach and whether it accurately captures what we discussed. It would be particularly helpful to get your feedback on the bracketed portions, which I don't think we really addressed yesterday, and which differ from Cardin's approach. I will separately circulate this to Mike Smith and others at Education for their reactions.

If folks agree that this is basically on the mark, I also need guidance on next steps. I think drafters would need to put this more in the form of legislative specs. Education would need to be involved, especially because this is designed to parallel key aspects of Title I and take into account *Agostini v. Felton*. On the other hand, because it is tax

legislation, presumably Treasury needs to be involved at some point, as well. I can imagine ED taking a first cut, and then passing over to Treasury, but what do others think? And once that is settled, who should take the lead in shopping this with Cardin?

ROUGH DRAFT -- July 8, 1997

An Amendment to Allow a Tax Credit for Costs and Fees Paid for  
Supplementary Educational Services for Children  
[possible substitute for Cardin]

Credit would be for up to [\$150 or 50% of the costs incurred, whichever is less--Cardin amount] per year per child ages 6-18, enrolled as a full time elementary or secondary school student

Credit would be for costs and fees paid

Services provided must be supplementary to the basic educational program, and can include extra help/tutoring in core academic subjects, including reading and math [that the student is studying in school] [as well as enrichment in arts, music etc.]; the credit is not available for regular tuition costs

Allowable services may not include college entrance test preparation

[Allowable services may not include sectarian instruction]

Services must be provided outside the regular school day, which can include before- or after-school, during summers, or on weekends

Services must be provided through a local school district, consistent with Title I

Consistent with Title I and the Supreme Court's ruling in Agostini vs. Felton, services may be provided at a public school or at another site (including private religious schools)

Consistent with Title I, services may be provided directly by the local school district, or under contract to the local school district

Note: Some districts currently provide after-school or summer services for free; others have elected to charge for them. In localities where the services are provided for free, there is no need for the tax credit because after-school services are already available. In localities where services are only available for a fee, the legislation would aid families that want extra services for their children. In communities where after-school tutoring is primarily provided in venues such as Boys and Girls Clubs, the school district could agree to contract with such organizations to provide the services. Where no services are currently offered, the tax credit may encourage districts to begin offering such services.

Because the services would be provided under the auspices of the local school district, there would be no need for any sort of certification process as envisioned in the Cardin legislation. Services could be provided through private organizations under contract to school districts

to the same extent they can presently be provided under Title I.

The following memorandum discusses the latest developments concerning your Community Empowerment Agenda:

**1. Economic Development That Works**

- **Unemployment Has Started to Decline in Cities** --Unemployment, from 1993 to 1996, dropped more in central cities than in their surrounding suburbs --and each of the ten largest American cities has a lower unemployment rate today than in 1993. [Bureau of Labor Statistics, Local Area Unemployment Statistics, as cited in the State of the Cities Overview, 6/23/97]
- **After Years on the Rise, the Poverty Rate Has Decreased Slightly** --Nationwide the poverty rate in cities rose 50 percent from 14.2 percent in 1970 to 21.5 percent in 1993. From 1993 to 1995, there was a slight decline to 20.6 percent. [Census data cited in the State of the Cities Overview, 6/23/97]

**2. Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI) Fund**

- **Second Round Awards** -- The CDFI Fund is in the process of reviewing its second round of applications. The Fund is expected to make over \$30 million in awards before October 1.
- **CDFI Fund Budget Increase** -- The House has voted to fully fund the CDFI program at \$125 million for FY98. However, the Senate has not provided any money for the CDFI Fund. The House-Senate Conference is tentatively scheduled for September.
- **CDFI Fund's First Round** --The Community Development Banks and Financial Institutions Fund's (CDFI) first round of awards totaled \$37.2 million in investments in 32 CDFIs, including community development banks, loan funds, credit unions, venture capital funds, and microenterprise loan funds. In the next two to three years the CDFI Fund's investments are expected to leverage three to four times the investments in total capital raised for these institutions. Over the

long term, the Fund's investments are expected to leverage 10 to 20 times more activity by the CDFIs.

### **3. Empowerment Zones**

- **New Empowerment Zones and Enterprise Communities:** The reconciliation bill includes a second round of Empowerment Zones -- 15 urban and 5 rural EZs. The new EZs will benefit from a different blend of tax credits from the first-round EZs. They will be eligible for the Brownfields tax incentive, special expensing of business assets, and qualification for private-activity bonds. The legislation also includes funding for two new EZs with the existing Empowerment Zone tax incentives. The cost of the tax incentives is \$717 million. We will be working closely with the NEC, HUD, USDA, Treasury, and others on setting up the selection process.

### **3. Brownfields Initiative**

- **Brownfields Tax Incentive --** The reconciliation bill includes your proposed tax incentive for Brownfields. This incentive reduces costs by permitting clean-up costs to be deducted immediately for tax purposes. This will, in turn, encourage redevelopment of these areas. **The tax incentive will be available for three years. The Treasury Department estimates that this \$500 million tax incentive would allow \$1.5 billion in expensing, leverage more than \$6 billion for private sector cleanups nationwide, and allow redevelopment of 14,000 brownfields.**

I was just planning to write you on this. Yes, there is a new deadline -- the meeting the President will have in early September (the 10th or 12th) with outside disability groups. This is the meeting that grew out of the agreement to meet with ADAPT on their unrelated issue of increasing home/community-based services in Medicaid and decreasing reliance on nursing homes. But Public Liaison wants to broaden it to all the groups and issues.

Here's where we are: under the EO, DOL would chair a task force with all the agencies as members on how to improve employment of people with disabilities. But DOL increasingly has cold feet about the specificity of tasks that the disabled appointees want in the EO. DOL wants the EO to be a blank slate on policy so that the task force can start from scratch in figuring out what to do, while the appointees want specific charges that reflect or at least allude to policies they already believe are the right ones (example -- tax credit). Another problem (presumably fixable) is that other agencies will object to the EO as written, saying they don't want DOL to determine their policies.

I think we need a meeting this week with Seth Harris and maybe Kitty Higgins of DOL, John Lancaster of the Presidents' Committee (he may want other disabled appointees to come), and us. The purpose would be to see whether there is a structure that would work. I would really like it if you could come. I can't decide where I am on the threshold question -- whether it's worse to give up on this and make the appointees angry, or push to shoehorn this into existence and risk creating a task force that is destined to fail. Do you want to have such a meeting?

### **Possible Questions & Answers**

A. First, I urge Congress to fully fund FDA's tobacco appropriation -- those funds will be used to reduce youth access. As to the tobacco tax offset provision, it was an industry action of extraordinary bad faith that we will keep it in mind as we consider the settlement proposal.

Welfare -- Proposed High Performance Bonus: You asked last week whether we like the formula HHS has proposed to distribute the welfare law, \$1 billion performance bonus fund. The short answer is that we do. The proposal, which HHS developed after consultations with the NGA and APWA, would reward states based on whether welfare recipients are getting jobs, how long they keep those jobs, and whether their earnings increase from year to year. The proposal also takes account of success in reducing teen births. States have raised two concerns about the proposal. First, a few state welfare officials -- led by Wisconsin -- have insisted that a simple formula based on caseload reduction is preferable, because it gives

welfare caseworkers a clear goal that they can work towards. But a formula of this kind would not look at what happens to people after they leave welfare, thus making no distinction between states that prepare people for self-sufficiency and states that simply remove them from the rolls. In addition, a number of states have complained about HHS's proposal to use unemployment insurance records, instead of welfare agency records, to measure performance in employment, job retention, and earnings progression. HHS is convinced, however, that the unemployment insurance data, which employers themselves provide, will be more objective and more accurate.

Friday I attended (for Mike C.) a Mack McLarty-run meeting on the U.S. agenda proposals for the Santiago Summit of the Americas. In discussing the education proposals, attendees made it clear that they see education as the single most prominent item from the U.S. standpoint. In particular, it was suggested that the U.S. should pursue a major ramping up of U.S.-Latin America educational exchanges--not just a little (the draft agenda says 25%) but perhaps a lot; it was suggested that this could be something major for the President comparable to Fulbright scholarships. It was further suggested that the focus of exchanges should shift from the postsecondary level to something that would better reflect the President's concern with K-12 education -- maybe an exchange of elementary and secondary teachers. McLarty indicated strong support for doing something big on educational exchanges generally and said he thought he had some ideas on where resources could come from, but did not elaborate on \$ or the specifics.

Other items discussed as possibilities (either for adding explicitly to the agenda or for more "spontaneous" agreements) included policies on promoting freedom of the Internet, a hemispheric alliance on drugs, and a gun-running initiative (I have alerted Jose to the latter two items).

State and NSC will be working with the agencies and others in the EOP to continue fleshing these possibilities out.

Gingrich: More Welfare

Reform On GOP Agenda

In interviews given Saturday while Gingrich was  
attending an American Legion parade in his suburban  
Atlanta district, the speaker also said he favors  
equalizing penalties for people caught selling crack  
and powder cocaine -- but not by reducing crack  
penalties as the Clinton administration has proposed.

Rather, he indicated he might support increasing the  
penalties for powder cocaine offenders.

"I favor equalizing them, but I'm not sure I'm not for  
equalizing them up," Gingrich said. "A person who  
commits the same relative threat to society -- the  
same number of doses -- should face the same  
consequences."

Critics say current  
sentencing laws are  
unfair to those who  
handle crack, which  
is cheaper than  
powder and more  
likely to be used by  
members of racial  
minorities.

Attorney General Janet Reno and President Clinton's drug-policy adviser, Barry McCaffrey, have proposed reducing the sentencing disparity for the two forms of cocaine to a 10-1 ratio.

Their plan would impose mandatory five-year penalties for selling 25 grams of crack or 10 times as much powdered cocaine, 250 grams. Current law requires five-year sentences for the sale of 5 grams of crack or 500 grams of cocaine, a 100-1 ratio.

Exemption for those in welfare-to-work programs

Gingrich said that when Republicans return in the fall, they will take up a proposal to exempt individuals in welfare-to-work programs from the \$5.15-an-hour minimum wage.

That exemption is a major priority of Republican and even some Democratic governors. But GOP negotiators dropped the idea from the recent budget bill because of opposition from Clinton, promoting complaints from GOP governors.

"There will be a very big push on welfare reform," Gingrich said. "We did not fight it out on the budget agreement, but we are going to really ask all the governors in the country to work with us to pass a welfare-reform implementation act which we think the president has to sign."

"The bureaucrats and the unions are trying to destroy welfare reform. We cannot allow that to happen."

'We are moving in the right direction'

Also, Gingrich said he would prefer that President Clinton not use the line-item veto on any provisions of the balanced-budget agreement. He said the Clinton team did not raise that prospect during negotiations, so "I think it would be helpful for them not to exercise it."

"But I am not going to get into a fight about it. This is his right. We gave it to him deliberately."

Just two weeks after a small group of restless Republicans tried to topple him, Gingrich said House Republicans are now unified.

"For our team, there are sometimes frustrations, but we are moving in the right direction and that is good."

Asked to assess the political lessons of the past month, he said, "If you are patient and you work hard, you win."
