Elena -- I sent OMB the memo about 10:45. I just left word at OMB asking where the memo is in their process and telling them we'd like to make a change given Bruce's conversation with the Senator. Given Bruce's note below, I'd recommend the following lead paragraph:

Changed graph:

Despite our many efforts we have been unable to persuade Senator Murray to embrace our approach on welfare reform and domestic violence. We recommend against supporting any legislative proposal in the Labor-HHS conference such as hers that is at odds with our regulation. We believe the issue would be better addressed through regulation; Secretary Shalala strongly agrees.

The memo used to begin:

We recommend opposing any legislative proposals on welfare reform and domestic violence waivers in the Labor-HHS conference -- including but not limited to Senator Murray's -- because we believe the issue will be better addressed by HHS's forthcoming regulations. Secretary Shalala strongly concurs with our recommendation.

I think that's good. We might need to change the lead graph to suggest that we have been unable to persuade Sen Murray to embrace our approach to DV. We recommend against supporting any legislative proposal such as hers that is at odds with our regulation, and we would be better off if we can deal with this through regulation rather than a legislative fix.

Let me know what Mary says. I don't think we'll ever persuade Murray (or the R's) to come around to our approach, but if we did, getting congressional approval for the approach in our regulation would not be such a bad thing, even if it complicates our lives a bit.

Dear Governor _____:

I write to you again to seek your assistance and cooperation on one of our most important responsibilities -- protecting our children from violent, sexual predators. Nothing is more threatening to our families and communities than criminals who move from neighborhood to neighborhood looking for children to prey on. That is why we must do everything we can to track these offenders and keep them away from our children.

With your support we have already enacted critical legislation -- such as the Jacob Wetterling Act, the Pam Lychner Act and Megan's Law -- to help our communities guard against repeat sex offenders. These laws now serve as the foundation for many state sex offender registration systems and for notifying communities of released sex offenders. Congress is now considering -- and I strongly support -- additional legislation to help states implement these registration systems and to make sure that sex offenders convicted in federal or military courts are covered by these laws.

Equally important, my administration has worked hard to defend the constitutionality of state sex offender registration systems and community notification laws. And I am pleased to report that three federal courts of appeal have now upheld sex offender statutes in New Jersey, New York, Connecticut and Washington against constitutional challenges. My Administration will continue to fight to uphold these laws in the courts, including -- if necessary -- the United States Supreme Court.

Last year, I directed the Attorney General to create a national sexual offender registry to join together the efforts being made in all fifty states to track sex offenders. Our national registry will only be effective if every state participates and shares its data on sex offenders with other states. Although our interim registry became operational this spring, only 11 states are currently participating. With an incomplete registry, the law is unable to follow dangerous sex predators wherever they go -- state by state, neighborhood by neighborhood. I urge you to move expeditiously to participate in our national registry for the safety of the public and our children.

I can not emphasize enough how important your continued support and personal involvement is to the success of these initiatives. Through our combined efforts, we can be confident that we will have taken decisive steps to help families across the country protect their children.

RE Options regarding "Sporterized" Assault Weapons Directive

Attached is draft directive on the importation of a new class of modified, or "sporterized", assault weapons. As you know, the 1994 Crime Bill bans 19 specific assault weapons, their duplicates and certain other semiautomatic weapons with various military-style features. The 1968 Gun Control Act prohibits the importation of firearms that are not "generally recognized as particularly suitable or readily adaptable to sporting purposes." Despite these restrictions, some otherwise prohibited weapons have been redesigned in order to circumvent the ban and meet the sporting purposes test criteria for importation.

Generally, the directive to the Treasury Department we are proposing mirrors your action in 1993 to ban the importation of assault pistols and the action taken by President Bush in 1989 to ban the importation of assault rifles. Specifically, the directive would: (1) require Treasury to reexamine, and if necessary, modify the criteria used to keep non-sporting weapons out of the country; and (2) temporarily suspend the approval of any pending and future applications for permits to import sporterized assault weapons. Although only a limited number of these firearms has come into the country since passage of the assault weapons ban (approximately 14,000 in 1994, 12,000 in 1995, 30,000 in 1996, and nearly 20,000 to date this year -- as opposed to nearly 160,000 in 1993), applications are now pending to import as many as 1.1 million of these firearms.

As you know, we have not yet resolved whether the Administration should take the additional step of temporarily suspending permits that already have been granted. While ATF originally estimated that 300,000 sporterized assault weapons could be legally imported under roughly 50 existing permits, they now put the figure at about 600,000. The difference is due largely to an erroneous action taken last week by ATF staff to approve 3 permits for an additional 175,000 sporterized firearms -- despite Treasury's internal instructions to not act on pending applications until the scope of this directive was determined.

We have worked with Treasury, Justice and White House Counsel to develop the strongest possible case for suspending existing permits. For instance, over the weekend, ATF re-reviewed gun tracing data -- a key factor in upholding the Bush Administration's 1989 suspension of all permits (Gun South, Inc. v. Brady) -- to determine the number of sporterized assault weapons being recovered at crime scenes. And while ATF discovered that there was a 145% increase in the number of sporterized weapons traced since 1994, this is due mostly to the Administration's more than doubling of the number of crime guns traced.

Despite our efforts, Justice litigators continue to have serious doubts that we have a sufficient factual basis for temporarily suspending existing permits. They point out that, in upholding the Bush Administration's 1989 action, the court relied on a combination of specific facts, including: (1) the dramatic proliferation of assault rifles in criminal activity; (2) a 57% increase in the number of assault rifles recovered at crime scenes; (3) several highly publicized shootings involving assault rifles, such as the Stockton, CA murders; and (4) data indicating the smuggling of assault weapons for use in foreign crimes. Arguably, these circumstances do not exist today. Overall sales and imports of assault-type rifles are down significantly from previous levels, and current gun tracing data is skewed by the overall increase in the number of weapons traced. Only the large number of approved and pending permits are comparable to the circumstances in 1989.

Although Justice litigators believe that this is a high risk case, they have clearly stated that they will defend it. However, they -- and we -- remain concerned that a loss on the temporary suspension of existing permits could undermine our ability to defend any future action taken by Treasury to modify the test for non-sporting weapons. For instance, an unfriendly court could decide to rule more broadly on the Administration's authority to interpret the sporting purposes test under the 1968 Gun Act.

You must decide among the following options to finalize the scope of the directive:

Option 1: Suspend action only on pending and future permits (about 1.1 million firearms and growing). The 50 existing permits to import 600,000 firearms could be exercised during the review period, but -- if the sporting purposes test is ultimately changed -- permits for firearms that no longer meet the sporting purposes test would be revoked. Treasury and Justice lawyers believe this option is entirely defensible. Senator Feinstein and other Members of Congress would complain that this action is not sufficiently bold.

Option 2: In addition to suspending action on pending and future permits, temporarily suspend all existing permits (roughly 50 permits for 600,000 firearms) while the sporting purposes criteria is reviewed. After this review, if the sporting purposes test is changed, permits for firearms that no longer meet the test would be revoked. Justice litigators believe that this option presents a substantial litigation risk and could undermine our ability to defend future action by Treasury to modify the sporting purposes test. Additionally, key Treasury staff would spend much of the review period in court -- and not necessarily working on re-examining the sporting purposes test.

Option 3: Immediately suspend action on the importation of pending and future permits, and require Treasury to closely monitor the levels of importation and criminal use of sporterized firearms during the review period. Existing permits could be suspended if there is a significant change in either of these categories, and if Treasury and Justice establish that there is a sufficient factual basis to do so. Although this solution may not be acceptable to Senator Feinstein, it is likely to lessen criticism from others -- and reduce our litigation risk.

Option 4: In addition to suspending pending and future permits, also suspend the 3 permits for 175,000 firearms erroneously issued last week. These 3 permits were mistakenly granted prior to finalizing our interagency process on the directive -- during which time Treasury had informally placed a moratorium on issuing permits. Treasury and Justice lawyers believe there is at least some basis to defend this action. As with Option #1, Senator Feinstein and other gun control advocates may not find this action to be sufficient.

Ann Grady/Senator Murray has some revised statutory language -- I think as a result of our conference call -- which she faxed to Mary Bourdette and may be offering in the Labor-HHS conference tonight. It is an attempt to come closer to us, but it doesn't quite do the trick. Here's how it seems to work:

- 1) States can grant as many domestic violence waivers as they want (current law);
- 2) Individuals with waivers are not counted in the work participation or time limit calculation (same as Murray's prior proposal);
- 3) If a state would have failed the participation rate or time limits but for step #2, then the Secretary may review the waivers granted by the state and may "revoke any waivers" that the "Secretary finds were not granted in good faith." Presumably this "revocation" puts those individuals back in the calculation.

Problems I see:

a) The Secretary doesn't have the authority to revoke the waivers granted to individuals...and thus they wouldn't be put back in the calculation...so the mechanism doesn't quite work here.

b) The burden of proof has shifted somewhat: here, the Secretary finds "bad faith waivers" in order to increase the participation rate, rather than lowering the participation rate for waivers granted appropriately.

c) Waivers don't have to include services, or be temporary, or be granted based on an individual assessment, i.e., to people who really need them.

SUBJECT: Domestic Violence Waivers

Despite our many efforts we have been unable to persuade Senator Murray to embrace our approach on welfare reform and domestic violence. We recommend against supporting her proposal in the Labor-HHS conference given that it is at odds with our policy. We believe the issue would be better addressed through regulation; Secretary Shalala strongly agrees. This memo provides talking points describing our position and provides a brief comparison of the domestic violence amendment offered by Senator Murray and the HHS regulations currently under review.

Talking Points

- We share Senator Murray's goal of allowing states to grant temporary waivers from welfare reform rules to victims of domestic violence while ensuring that these women receive the services they need to become self-sufficient.
- We disagree with Senator Murray about how best to achieve these goals. We believe Senator Murray's proposal would allow states to largely escape the new welfare law's work rules and time limits while failing to provide victims of domestic violence with the services they need to get on the road to self-sufficiency.
- We support a policy that will encourage states to provide temporary waivers to victims of domestic violence and require that they provide services to these women while maintaining the welfare law's strong work focus.

Background

Senator Murray has long advocated a proposal that would exclude victims of domestic violence from the welfare work requirements and time limits. The Senate adopted her amendment as part of the Senate Labor-HHS bill, which is now in conference. Senator Murray's proposal has passed the Senate several times, but has always been dropped in conference. Our Statement of Administration Policy on the Labor-HHS bill does not mention her amendment. Senator Murray has long been aware that both the DPC and HHS have serious reservations about her approach to this issue.

Currently, states can exempt victims of domestic violence from work requirements and time limits, so long as they put 30 percent of their overall caseload to work and enforce the time limit for 80 percent of their caseload. Senator Murray's approach would change the law by allowing states to grant exemptions to these women wholly independently of the overall work and

time requirements. This approach would significantly weaken the welfare law's emphasis on work: for example, if 15 percent of the caseload were granted domestic violence waivers, then only 15 percent of the total caseload would have to work. At the same time, Senator Murray's proposal would do nothing to ensure that victims of domestic violence actually get the intensive assistance they need to become self sufficient; indeed, the proposal might well lead states to wholly ignore these women.

DPC, OMB, and HHS believe there is a better way to meet our and Senator Murray's joint goals, although Senator Murray strongly disagrees. We have been working on regulations clarifying that HHS will not subject states to penalties if they fail to meet the work rates because they have exempted victims of domestic violence, so long as their exemptions are temporary and the state also provides services to help these women become self-sufficient. In particular, the proposed regulation will:

- Ensure that domestic violence waivers (1) are based on an individualized assessment, (2) have limited duration and (3) are accompanied by an appropriate services plan designed to provide safety and lead to work. These provisions would help ensure that victims of domestic violence get the assistance they need and that states grant waivers only for individuals who need them.
- Excuse states from a penalty for failing to meet its work participation rate if the state meets the rate for the part of its TANF population that has not been granted domestic violence waivers.

(Within the Administration there is still some dispute between us and HHS over excusing states that grant domestic violence waivers from the 5-year time limit as well as from work requirements. We are currently discussing middle ground positions and hope to work through this dispute at the staff level.)

Both OMB and DPC believe that the proposed rule we are working on with HHS will result in a fair policy which balances our goals of protecting victims of domestic violence and ensuring the strong work focus of welfare reform. We believe it is critical that real services be provided to victims of domestic violence and that states not be penalized for providing these specialized services, but also that states not be given loopholes to escape work requirements or time limits.

Despite our efforts to address Senator Murray's concerns, we do not expect that she will be satisfied with any proposal that falls short of her amendment. However, based on HHS consultation with outside groups during the regulation development process, we do believe that many women's advocates will understand how much our proposal does to help victims of domestic violence.

I've heard that Hatch announced that he and Kennedy would be putting in a tobacco bill before Congress adjourns at today's Judiciary Cmte hearing on anti-trust portions of tobacco legislation. It appears staff were taken by surprise. Hatch sketched out some details including the use of an industry licensing fee as opposed to a tobacco tax to raise the money. He asked the witnesses to provide ideas on anti-trust before the end of the week so that he could incorporate their ideas.

Kennedy's staff were among those surprised by Hatch's announcement.

Kennedy's staff still maintain that there is only a 50/50 chance they will introduce a bill before Congress adjourns.

**AMERICA READS: HELPING ENSURE THAT EVERY CHILD
CAN READ WELL AND INDEPENDENTLY**

"Every child in America -- every single child in America needs to be able to read well, and needs to be able to read independently by at least the end of the 3rd grade, so that all this other learning can occur."

President Clinton, September 8, 1997

Today, the President returned to the Lighthouse Elementary School in Jupiter, Florida to meet with students, parents, teachers and community education supporters to discuss the importance of a solid foundation in reading and to highlight his America Reads initiative. He called on all Americans -- schools, libraries, religious institutions, universities, students, the media, community and national groups, business leaders and senior citizens -- to help ensure that every American child can read well and independently by the end of 3rd grade. Lighthouse Elementary school's reading and parent involvement programs are examples of the actions that schools and communities can undertake to help all children learn to read well.

PRESIDENT UNDERSCORES HIS COMMITMENT TO THE AMERICA READS CHALLENGE. While American students today generally read as well as ever, 40% of our fourth graders scored below the basic level on the 1994 National Assessment of Educational Progress. According to studies, however, well-designed tutoring programs result in student gains in reading. The America Reads Challenge sets forth the first comprehensive, nationwide effort to create after-school, summer, and weekend tutoring in reading. The legislation proposed by President Clinton links parents, teachers, AmeriCorps members, trained reading professionals, and volunteer tutors to school, library and community literacy efforts.

The Challenge is pursuing several essential strategies to help our children learn to read: creating more learning opportunities to supplement classroom reading instruction; encouraging parent involvement to help children develop readiness skills for reading beginning at birth, as well as involvement throughout the school years; and bringing best teaching practices into classrooms. The proposal is a five-year, \$2.75 billion commitment to local communities and organizations, as well as national and regional efforts. It includes:

- **America's Reading Corps.** The proposal would fund 25,000 reading specialists and coordinators, including 11,000 AmeriCorps members, to mobilize 1 million volunteer reading tutors.
- **Federal Work Study Expansion.** President Clinton has asked college presidents to allocate work-study slots to college students to become America Reads tutors. So far, *almost 800 colleges have pledged students to tutor in elementary schools.*
- **Other Initiatives that are Helping Our Children Learn.** America Reads incorporates early childhood development through the expansion of Head Start and Even Start; bringing the best teaching practices to classrooms; supporting research and evaluation on reading; and building partnerships with the private sector.

PRESIDENT CLINTON APPLAUDS LIGHTHOUSE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL'S EFFORTS TO MOTIVATE YOUNG READERS. The Lighthouse Elementary School participates in Florida's Sunshine State Young Readers program, which is a statewide reading motivation program that encourages students to read high quality literature and participate in a statewide vote for their favorite book. The President acknowledged the accomplishments of the students who read and completed book reports on all 15 books on the Sunshine State reading list. In 1996, over 1,000 Florida public schools participated and over 75,000 students read enough books to qualify for voting in the statewide balloting for their favorite book of the year. Motivational reading programs, like the Sunshine State readers, are important in helping to reach the President's goal that every child in America learn to read well and independently by the end of the third grade.

PRESIDENT CLINTON HIGHLIGHTS THE IMPORTANCE OF PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT. The President commended the Lighthouse Elementary parent volunteers who contribute 1,000 volunteer hours per month to assist teachers in the classroom, help prepare documents, and provide assistance in the library. Research continues to show that parental involvement is a crucial factor in children's learning -- students score better in reading, achieve higher grades and have fewer discipline problems when their parents participate in school activities. Parents and other concerned individuals in local communities are valuable reading partners and tutors and for young students learning to read and can engage in exercises to ensure that each child has the proper foundation for good reading skills.
