MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF THE TREASURY

Subject: Importation of Uzi and Galil Firearms

The historic Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 banned 19 specific assault weapons, duplicates of those 19 firearms and certain other semiautomatic weapons possessing various military style features. The Administration and Congress worked to ban these deadly firearms because -- as the weapon of choice for gangs and drug dealers -- they were being recovered at numerous crime scenes and resulting in criminals being better armed than some of the nation's law enforcement officers. Last year, in part as a result of the ban on assault weapons, fewer police officers were slain in the line of duty than in any year since 1960, and fewer law enforcement officer was killed by assault weapons.

In addition to the prohibitions contained in the 1994 ban on assault weapons, the 1968 Gun Control Act further restricts the importation of firearms unless they are determined to be particularly suitable for or readily adaptable for sporting purposes. To enforce this law, the Treasury Department has developed a factoring system to determine whether handguns meet this sporting purposes test and are thus importable. The Department also determined that semiautomatic assault type rifles do not meet the sporting purposes test and are not importable.

I am now informed that 2 of the 19 assault weapons that were specifically banned from importation in 1989, the Galil and the Uzi, have been redesigned in order to circumvent the ban. The Galil and Uzi, which are manufactured by Israeli Military Industries, were banned because -- in their military configurations -- they were found to have no legitimate sporting purpose. It is now appropriate to determine whether the redesigned weapons would have legitimate sporting purposes in this country and are suitable for continued importation under the provisions of the Gun Control Act of 1968.

My Administration has aggressively enforced all applicable laws to keep non-sporting firearms and other munitions posing a threat to public safety from entering the country. Therefore, I direct you to:

- 1) Take the necessary steps to reexamine and determine whether the sporting purposes test should be modified with respect to the importation of the Galil, Uzi and any other firearms that have been similarly adapted or re-engineered since the 1989 ban on the importation of semiautomatic assault rifles or the 1994 ban on semiautomatic assault weapons;
- 2) Effective immediately, suspend action on pending and future applications to import these weapons until this review is complete.

Nothing herein shall be construed to require actions contrary to applicable provisions of law.

1) Timing: Do we want to hold the DOL reg until the TANF reg is done? To meet the statutory deadline, DOL has to send the reg to the federal register tomorrow (I think we at a minimum should postpone until Monday, to give us a chance to check the changes). Bruce -- you expressed interest in holding it until the TANF reg was ready, which I would say from our meeting with HHS today, will realistically about two weeks. Do you want me to hold the DOL reg?

I imagine Herman will be quite unhappy, but I agree with you that releasing both regs at once will be more newsworthy.

2) Individuals Served by the Program: As you know, we argued throughout the budget negotiations that we needed \$3 billion for welfare to work in order to ensure that the hardest to employ people in high poverty/high unemployment areas would be served. At the same time we argued that PICs should have the maximum possible flexibility in deciding how to spend the funds to get these individuals into jobs.

The statute says that 70 percent of funds must be spent on individuals with certain characteristics. They must have been on welfare for 30 months or be within 12 months of losing eligibility and they must have two of the following three characteristics:

- 1) not completed high school and has low reading and math skills
- 2) requires substance abuse for treatment
- 3) have a poor work history

DOL wants to leave these definitions to the states and PICs. HHS adamantly disagrees, saying that the vast majority of welfare recipients could meet a loose definition of these terms.

Our idea (Parker-Matlack-Rice) would be to define "low skills in reading and mathematics" as at or below the 8th grade level and give states and PICs the following options re: "poor work history":

- Option #1: has worked for less than 3 of the last 12 months
- Option #2: has worked for less than 6 of the last 24 months;
- Option #3: if neither of the first two were satisfactory, the PIC or state could propose another definition to DOL;

Dear Mr. Chairman:

The Administration strongly objects to the inclusion of any provision in the FY 1998 Commerce, Justice and State Appropriations Conference Report to allow for the importation of surplus military weapons. We have repeatedly opposed such provisions, and the President's senior advisers would recommend that he veto the bill if it includes language that would large quantities of surplus military weapons to be imported.

The Administration finds it unacceptable that -- in the same appropriations bill that funds the nation's law enforcement priorities, such as putting more police on our streets -- the Committee is considering language that could flood our streets with millions of military surplus weapons. These weapons, especially M-1 carbines, M-1 Garrands and M-1911 .45 caliber pistols, were designed for military purposes and provided to foreign governments as a form of military aid over the past several decades. Moreover, thousands of these firearms have already been used in crimes -- including to take the lives of police officers. Opening the door to more of these weapons would only serve to further undermine public safety.

We urge the Committee to reject this provision.

Immigration -- Central Americans/Haitians: This week, House and Senate Republicans continued to negotiate over the legislative package intended to remedy certain problems the 1996 immigration law created for Central Americans. Two key issues remain uncertain. First, the Senate-- Chairman Abraham in particular-- opposes the House proposal to eliminate the unskilled worker category (10,000 visas annually) as a tradeoff for giving certain Central Americans permanent legal status. The Senate is considering a counter proposal to reduce the annual numbers of unskilled worker visas and diversity visas by 5,000 each. (The diversity category is 50,000 visas annually, which are designated for individuals from underrepresented countries. This category is primarily used by nationals from Africa and Europe.)

Second, different caucuses are now seeking expand the final legislation to afford relief to immigrants who otherwise would not have been covered by existing proposals. The CBC is pushing to get amnesty for Haitians who were paroled into the U.S. by the Bush Administration following the coup d'etat against President Aristide in 1991. Our preference would be to afford relief to the Haitians similar to what our legislative proposal would give to the majority of Central Americans. In addition, Senator Abraham has proposed including relief for asylum-seekers from Eastern European countries who fled communist governments before the end of 1990.

We need your call on whether to cave on one of the TANF reg issues. (Elena, it's "6b.") Bruce, you had earlier expressed not much interest in it, but we have a somewhat crisper understanding of it than we once did, so I want to make sure we have our marching orders.

HHS's draft rightly requires states to include both TANF and state-only programs in its caseload reduction credit calculation. However, we have been pushing them to drop language that invites states to exclude from the CRC calculation some or all families in a state-only program "based on the nature of benefits provided."

What HHS is trying to do here is to encourage states to set up programs that support the working poor through state EITC's, or child care or transportation subsidies WITHOUT making them subject to time limits. HHS is worried that states will be discouraged from doing so because any new people added will give them a smaller caseload reduction credit.

I have not been that sympathetic, because states have two pretty good alternatives. They can either classify these as TANF benefits, especially since these folks are actually working, which makes people subject to time limits. Or they can do this in a state-only program free from time limits, and accept a smaller caseload reduction credit. On the other hand, this is a complex issue to elevate. What do you think?

The Deputies meeting on Superfund was not particularly eventful. The Republicans are prepared to make a final offer on the Senate, and the Democrats are readying a response. FYI, we have made remarkably little progress on this issue, and it may end up getting elevated. Just to remind you, this is the issue where HHS wants to count fingerprinting, drug testing, and whole grant sanctions as eligibility decreases, and give states that initiate use of these tools a smaller caseload reduction credit.

HHS has several arguments.

First, the law says that eligibility decreases must be factored out of the credit, and they say fingerprinting was explicitly identified as a condition of eligibility in AFDC. Therefore, they argue that it's hard to say it's not an eligibility change for this purpose. We are working on this question.

Second, they concede that some of the 10-20% caseload reduction that results from fingerprinting does reflect rooting out fraud, but they argue that much of it is simply an extra administrative hurdle that causes many people to fall by the wayside. Also, Emil Parker argues against us on this, making the argument that many poor people are generally frightened of fingerprinting and other police-like actions.

Finally, they argue (as we do on other issues) that we are just talking about the caseload reduction credit here. States are still free to fingerprint, and they will benefit in other ways if they do -- with money saved, and with a smaller base of people to whom the work participation rates are applied.

We are assuming we should continue to carry the standard into battle on this one.

Reynolds pleased with Jacksonville verdict

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Oct 31 (Reuters) - R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co officials
said Friday they were pleased that a jury had
cleared the firm in a product liability suit. The suit was filed by a
Florida grandmother who suffered from lung cancer.

Ted Grossman, Reynolds' attorney in the case filed by Jean Karbiwnyk, 59,
told reporters the outcome was ``particularly
satisfying because it came after the admission of documents that I think
most courts would not have allowed.''

Grossman was referring to records taken from a law firm working for Brown
& Williamson Tobacco Corp. The documents
had helped Karbiwnyk's attorney, Norwood ``Woody'' Wilner, secure a

victory against that company last year in a product liability suit filed by former smoker Grady Carter.

That \$750,000 jury award is being appealed.

Wilner told reporters he had not yet decided whether he would appeal. The jury of two men and four women deliberated for about seven hours over three days before delivering the verdicts Friday morning.

In the unanimous verdicts, the panel cleared Reynolds of negligence and found that the company's Winston and Salem Lights cigarettes were not unreasonably dangerous and defective and not the legal cause of loss, injury or damage to Karbiwnyk.

Wilner noted that his third product liability lawsuit against a cigarette maker would not be his last.

``If R.J. Reynolds thinks this is the end of it, they have another thing coming,'' he said. Wilner said he has hundreds of cigarette lawsuits either filed or waiting to be filed in Florida. ``We knew this was going to be a long and bloody contest and we're ready to go on from here,'' he said.

Karbiwnyk said she was disappointed. ``I was hoping for a different verdict. I'm disappointed, but life goes on,'' she told reporters.

R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co is a unit of RJR Nabisco Holdings Corp (RN). Brown & Williamson Tobacco Corp is a unit of B.A.T Industries Plc (BATS.L) (BTI).

Much of Wilner's case hinged on decades-old records found in Reynolds' archives demonstrating the risks of tobacco.

Dan Donahue, Reynolds' vice president for research, said the company effectively turned the tables on that evidence. ``The world should be alarmed if in fact there was not evidence in the records of the tobacco companies of the existence of risk in the 50s, when that information was being developed. That would be evidence that the industry didn't care,'' he said.

Dear X:

Earlier this year, I transmitted to Congress legislation designed to promote fair and equitable treatment for individuals with pending immigration cases, including those who fled persecution and civil war in Central America and received protection in the United States. My legislation also aimed to assist the fledgling democracies of Central America which cannot easily absorb their nationals at this time. I urge the Congress provide similar treatment to Haitians as it considers final legislation on this matter.

In recent weeks, Members of Congress and representatives of the Haitian community have highlighted the compelling plight of thousands of Haitians in the United States. Their experiences parallel those of Central Americans in many ways. The Bush Administration brought most of these Haitians to the United States in 1991-92 after they were found to have a credible fear of persecution in Haiti. Many of these Haitians have made vital contributions to their communities and established deep roots in the United States. Providing them with an opportunity to gain permanent status in the U.S. is not only equitable, it is also critical to helping Haiti establish a strong and lasting democracy -- a goal which the United States continues to devote extensive energy and resources.

Given these similarities, I strongly believe that Haitians deserve relief equivalent to that under consideration for Central Americans. I hope that you will move quickly to address the special circumstances of Haitians and enact this important legislation before the Congress adjourns for the year.

Congressional Movement on Tobacco

Senator Hatch announced Wednesday that he wants to introduce a "discussion bill" enforcing a national tobacco settlement before Congress adjourns for the year. Hatch said the bill would be modeled on -- but not identical to -- the deal negotiated between the tobacco industry and the state attorneys general. Hatch said his goal was to craft a bill that could have bipartisan support.

Senator Kennedy may also offer a bill before Congress adjourns next month. Senator Lautenberg and James Hansen (R-UT) introduced a tobacco bill Wednesday that would cost \$494 billion. The proposal gives cigarette makers no relief from lawsuits, which was presumably their reason for entering into the June 20th settlement. A bill introduced last week by House members Chris Cox (R-CA), Scott McInnis (R-CO) and Paul McHale (D-PA) would limit fees paid to attorneys involved in the June 20th settlement to \$150 per hour plus expenses.

Welfare Regulations Almost Complete -- Within the next few weeks, we expect to complete and publish welfare regulations for both the \$3 billion welfare to work program that was part of the Balanced Budget Act and for the entire Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program established by last year's welfare law. We are considering releasing them both on November 17th, the day you are scheduled to inaugurate Cessna's new welfare to work facility in Wichita.

While the regulations for the \$3 billion program are fairly straightforward (the important issues were well defined in the statute), the TANF regulations are more complicated because they involve the fundamental issues of federal versus state roles in the new welfare system. We are focusing our efforts on ensuring that we hold states accountable for outcomes, particularly putting welfare recipients to work, while maintaining state flexibility in designing and implementing welfare reform efforts.

We are attempting to resolve three major issues with HHS. First, we are working to ensure that states may not use their flexibility to circumvent the work participation rates. Because states can use their state share of funding (their maintenance of effort) to establish separate programs that are not subject to work requirements or time limits, we are concerned that they may segregate their hardest-to-employ cases in state programs in order to meet the work rates in TANF. We also want to ensure that states don't reclassify families with parents living in the home as "child only" in order to avoid work rates and time limits (the law rightfully exempts child only families to avoid imposing requirements on grandparents and other non-parent caregivers). Second, we are trying to structure a penalty system that is firm, fair, and credible and will actually impose penalties when states -- after being given an opportunity to come into compliance -- fail to meet key requirements. Third, we are concerned that states with waivers will have an easier time meeting the work participation rates and may be able to exempt most people from time limits. (The waivers established tougher rules than those in AFDC, but in many cases ones less stringent than in the new law). Therefore, we are seeking to encourage such states to drop their waivers in favor of the law's tougher standards by limiting their ability to get high performance bonuses, caseload reduction credits, and breaks on penalties.

Welfare: Senator Murray's Domestic Violence Amendment: As you may know, Senator Murray has long advocated a proposal that would exclude victims of domestic violence from the welfare work requirements and time limits. This week, the conferees voted not to include her amendment in the Labor-HHS bill. We have always had serious reservations about her approach because we believe it would allow states to largely escape the new welfare law's work rules and time limits while failing to provide victims of domestic violence with the services they need to get on the road to self-sufficiency.

Currently, states can exempt victims of domestic violence from work requirements and time limits, so long as they put 30 percent of their overall caseload to work and enforce the time

limit for 80 percent of their caseload. Senator Murray's approach would change the law by allowing states to grant exemptions to these women wholly independently of the overall work and time requirements. This approach would significantly weaken the welfare law's emphasis on work: for example, if 15 percent of the caseload were granted domestic violence waivers, then only 15 percent of the total caseload would have to work. At the same time, Senator Murray's proposal would do nothing to ensure that victims of domestic violence actually get the intensive assistance they need to become self sufficient; indeed, the proposal might well lead states to wholly ignore these women.

We believe we have developed a better approach. Our draft regulations will clarify that HHS will not subject states to penalties if they fail to meet the work rates because they have exempted victims of domestic violence, so long as their exemptions are temporary and the state also provides services to help these women become self-sufficient. We are still discussing with HHS the issue of excusing states granting domestic violence waivers from the 5-year time limit as well as from work penalties and hope at the staff level to develop a middle ground approach.

Welfare Indicators Report: HHS has prepared the first annual report on Indicators of Welfare Dependence, required by a 1994 law authored by Senator Moynihan, and plans to send it to the Hill next week. The report reflects the advice of a bipartisan advisory board created by the act, which includes state welfare directors (Gary Stangler, Gerald Miller, Eloise Anderson), researchers (Judy Gueron, Marvin Kusters, Kristin Moore) and advocates (Bob Greenstein, Wade Horn). The law required HHS and the advisory board to develop a definition of welfare dependence and to track, through an annual report, changes in the incidence of dependence. This report defines a family as "dependent on welfare" if more than 50 percent of its total yearly income comes from TANF, food stamps, or SSI and this income is not associated with work (i.e., no one in the family is working in a subsidized or unsubsidized job at the same time). This first annual report shows that 4.8 percent of Americans were dependent on welfare in 1993 (the most recent year for which the data were available).

Welfare: Justice Dept. Issuing Guidance to Programs that Must Verify Immigration Status – Next week, the Department of Justice will release guidance to help programs understand the welfare law's requirements for verification of immigration status. Under the law, legal immigrants are barred from receiving certain benefits, while illegal immigrants are barred from a broader list of programs. This guidance will help programs that receive federal funds understand the law and implement it in a fair and non-discriminatory fashion. Shortly thereafter, we expect that HHS will announce which of its programs are included on the broader list of programs not available to illegal immigrants
