Here is an update on HHS's tobacco and food safety budgets. I am concerned that these programs are in trouble and in need of your help to receive adequate funding in the President's FY99 budget.

Tobacco

For FY99, OMB is recommending a \$30 million increase (\$21M for CDC for state programs and \$9M for FDA). HHS is currently requesting on appeal to OMB an increase of \$120M over the FY98 level (\$74M for CDC and \$46M for FDA). FDA's increase will enable it to contract with all states to effectively enforce its tobacco rule. As you know, effective enforcement is essential to making access restrictions work. CDC will put \$49M toward state programs, \$20M toward counter advertising, and \$5M toward surveillance and research. At this funding level, CDC will provide each state with \$1 million on average, which is less than the \$1.2 million average the 16 ASSIST states currently receive. Studies indicate states need about \$10 million each to replicate the reductions in youth smoking that California and Massachusetts have achieved. I believe HHS initially requested an increase of \$136 million over FY98 for tobacco. For FY98, FDA received \$34 million for tobacco, which is an increase of \$29.1 million over FY97. CDC received \$28.4 million, which is an increase of \$7 million over FY97, however the President had requested a \$15 million increase. NIH received \$25 million for the ASSIST program the same as in FY97 (beginning in FY99 ASSIST will move to CDC -- the CDC budget request reflects the move).

Food Safety

For FY99, OMB is recommending a \$30 million increase for HHS (\$5M for CDC and \$25M for FDA). HHS is currently seeking \$44 million on appeal (\$5M

for CDC and \$39M for FDA (\$22M for imports and \$17M for domestic)). I am trying to determine whether the HHS appeal is on top of the OMB \$30 million or instead of it. HHS initially requested a \$109 million increase (\$21M for CDC and \$88M for FDA (\$27M for imports and \$61M for domestic)). At OMB's currently recommended level of funding the Administration will not be able to achieve many of goals we have already promised in the President's Food Safety Initiative. \$5 million would not enable CDC to put in place the early warning system the President promised last January, and \$25 million for FDA, depending on how it is divided between imports and domestic, either is just short of what FDA needs to implement the produce initiative the President announced in October with no new money for the programs the VP announced in May, or well short of what is needed for imports and also well short of what is needed domestically.

HHS is officially responding to OMB's child support proposal as part of a larger budget passback document but here's a summary of their views via John Monahan (see below):

If the most viable option is saving \$300 million by imposing fees on non-custodial parents, it seems to me we could do that without converting the system to a block grant and forcing us to endure months of grief and possibly creating unintended consequences.

Where are things in the budget talks on this issue?

From Monahan:

In short, it is difficult to list all the objections to the OMB proposal. Among them are the fact (1) that raising such a radical change in the program

through a last-minute budget decision would be a severe blow to the bi-partisan process that has served child support well over the last few years,

(2) the numerous unintended consequences of changing so many funding flows (many of which offset within states among various agencies, (3) the blockgranting this program would seem to run contrary to our collective efforts to impose on states a variety of national programmatic requirements over the past few years.

Perhaps most importantly, blockgranting CSE will

send the wrong signal to state agencies about trying to provide child support

services to all children in need of them. Despite OMB's suggestion of including our incentives proposal in the mix, the most powerful fiscal incentive, by far, for states will be to make cost-effective recoveries for

TANF children. Thus, hard-to-serve TANF cases and non-TANF (which include many working poor families, as you know) will get less attention in a world

of a fixed federal payment, and state financial incentives focused on cost-effective TANF recoveries.

- **A Glimmer of Hope.** The 1997 Monitoring the Future (MTF) study shows that for most drugs and for most grades – and for the first time since 1991 – the increasing trends in teen drug use seem to be leveling off and, in some cases, even decreasing. Specifically, this year's MTF found:
  - **Drug use stabilizing.** With one exception, there was no recorded statistically significant increase in 30-day drug use among 8th, 10th and 12th graders;
  - **8th grade drug use declining.** For 8th graders, declines were recorded in past year use of any illicit drug, stimulants, tranquilizers, and daily use of marijuana.
  - **Attitudes changing.** There were important changes in attitudes regarding drug use. For instance, 8th graders were more likely to disapprove of occasional marijuana and cocaine use.
- **Progress On Drug-Related Crime.** Earlier this year, the Justice Department released studies showing that methamphetamine use declined between 7% and 52% in 8 key cities, and that the crack use was down substantially – by at least 10% – in 10 major cities. Drug-related murders also dropped to their lowest point in a decade.
- **Much More Still Needs to be Done.** Unfortunately, despite these signs of progress, drug use remains unacceptably high. Too many kids are still using drugs, and too many kids still do not understand the risks associated with them. Motivating kids to reject the use of illegal drugs must be our number one priority.
- **Time to Redouble Our Efforts.** MTF is the second national survey this year to show that we have an opportunity to begin reversing recent increases in adolescent drug use. That is why now, as teen drug use begins to level off and younger students show their disapproval, is the time to reach out to our kids.
- **The President's Nation Anti-Drug Youth Media Campaign.** Starting January 5th, the Administration will launch an unprecedented \$195 million paid media campaign that uses the full force of the media –from prime time television to the Internet to sports marketing – to educate kids and parents about the dangers of drugs. The campaign will begin with ads in 12 pilot – Atlanta, Baltimore, Boise, Denver, Hartford, Houston, Milwaukee, Portland, San Diego, Sioux City, Tucson, and Washington, D.C. – and spread throughout the country before the end of next year.

Subject: HHS Tobacco and Food Safety Budgets

Here is an update on HHS's tobacco and food safety budgets. I am concerned that these programs are in trouble and in need of your help to receive adequate funding in the President's FY99 budget.

Tobacco

For FY99, OMB is recommending a \$30 million increase (\$21M for CDC for state programs and \$9M for FDA). HHS is currently requesting on appeal to OMB an increase of \$120M over the FY98 level (\$74M for CDC and \$46M for FDA). FDA's increase will enable it to contract with all states to effectively enforce its tobacco rule. As you know, effective enforcement is essential to making access restrictions work. CDC will put \$49M toward state programs, \$20M toward counter advertising, and \$5M toward surveillance and research. At this funding level, CDC will provide each state with \$1 million on average, which is less than the \$1.2 million average the 16 ASSIST states currently receive. Studies indicate states need about \$10 million each to replicate the reductions in youth smoking that California and Massachusetts have achieved. I believe HHS initially requested an increase of \$136 million over FY98 for tobacco. For FY98, FDA received \$34 million for tobacco, which is an increase of \$29.1 million over FY97. CDC received \$28.4 million, which is an increase of \$7 million over FY97, however the President had requested a \$15 million increase. NIH received \$25 million for the ASSIST program the same as in FY97 (beginning in FY99 ASSIST will move to CDC -- the CDC budget request reflects the move).

Food Safety

For FY99, OMB is recommending a \$30 million increase for HHS (\$5M for CDC and \$25M for FDA). HHS is currently seeking \$44 million on appeal (\$5M for CDC and \$39M for FDA (\$22M for imports and \$17M for domestic)). I am

trying to determine whether the HHS appeal is on top of the OMB \$30 million or instead of it. HHS initially requested a \$109 million increase (\$21M for CDC and \$88M for FDA (\$27M for imports and \$61M for domestic)). At OMB's currently recommended level of funding the Administration will not be able to achieve many of goals we have already promised in the President's Food Safety Initiative. \$5 million would not enable CDC to put in place the early warning system the President promised last January, and \$25 million for FDA, depending on how it is divided between imports and domestic, either is just short of what FDA needs to implement the produce initiative the President announced in October with no new money for the programs the VP announced in May, or well short of what is needed for imports and also well short of what is needed domestically.

Conservatives Desert Connerly Over Gay Rights

SACRAMENTO--It has been four weeks since Ward Connerly won big on a new playing field and the boos have not stopped.

The hoots are coming from many of the same conservatives who earlier cheered his drive to end racial preferences in public hiring, contracting and university admissions--what commonly is called affirmative action.

The mood of those same admirers turned ugly when Connerly took up the cause of gay rights, pushing the UC regents into providing health benefits for same-sex partners of university employees.

To win, Connerly had to roll his old friend and political ally, Gov. Pete Wilson, who argued that treating gay couples the same as married heterosexuals will "spotlight the University of California as a role model for undermining marriage and destabilizing families."

Connerly countered that he certainly respects marriage, having been happily married himself for 35 years, "but there are values that transcend marriage: the values of equality . . . individual liberty . . . letting people pursue happiness on their own terms."

Since then, Wilson reportedly has been grumpy toward his onetime protege and some of the governor's aides have snubbed him. "I don't give a damn," Connerly told me.

Still, he acknowledged, "This was the toughest decision that I've had to make as a regent. Despite all the crap that I've endured on the race issue, it doesn't begin to compare to this issue. The gut reaction people have is strong, and you can't reason with them."

\* \* \*

In the same way that Connerly being black afforded him special credibility on the race issue, his being a Republican conservative made him especially worth listening to on gay rights. It was one of those "Nixon goes to China" moves. But he has paid a steep price.

Many blacks accused Connerly of being an "Uncle Tom." Now, many conservatives are accusing him of being disloyal to the governor and--to sum it up gently--siding with depravity and the devil.

On Connerly's old wooden desk in his Sacramento land consulting office--occupying a downtown Victorian--there is a stack of negative letters. Some simply are hate mail.

One Connerly reply in particular is the type of thing most of us occasionally are tempted to write, but never quite muster the nerve:

"Initially, I was inclined to treat your letter as just another communication from an ignorant, bigoted, intolerant individual and ignore it. However, I finally concluded that while you may fit some of that description, it would be wrong of me to characterize you as ignorant. You are an 'attorney at law.' This suggests some exposure to legal matters and the education process."

Connerly's blunt response continued, in part:

"It always astounds me that those with bigoted tendencies such as yours invoke the Scriptures to support their bigotry. I am part of an interracial marriage. When my wife and I married, there were those who said that such unions were immoral, unnatural, contrary to the Bible and would lead to the deterioration of civilization. In short, the ignorance and nonsense about the societal effects of interracial marriage 35 years ago is just as absurd today with reference to sexual orientation. . . ."

"Many years ago, I was forced to confront my prejudices because of a gay employee who was 'normal' by every societal standard except for his sexual

orientation. Choosing to be gay was no more of a choice for [him] than choosing to be male or cocoa brown was for me. Didn't the same God who made me make my former gay employee? As a Christian, who am I to say, then, that God goofed?"

Another Connerly response: "To suggest that I have been disloyal [to Wilson] is an insult. Over the past eight years I have supported the governor as much as anyone. I have contributed a handsome amount to his [campaigns]."

But now, Connerly told me, some conservative donors to his fledging American Civil Rights Institute "are going ape."

"I knew it going in," he said, "I had no choice. I couldn't have looked that staff member in the eye. Couldn't look myself in the eye. I'll just ride it out."  
\* \* \*

Assemblywoman Carole Migden (D-San Francisco), a lesbian, got Connerly up to speed on gay issues before the UC regents' vote. "He's dogged, he's ceaseless, he's articulate," she said.

"I'm not really sure why he took up this cause, frankly, and I'm not concerned. I'm appreciative and grateful."

Migden called my attention to all this because she had a point: "Don't write anybody off. In politics, there are always twists and turns and different chapters and episodes."

And opportunities for rare alliances and accomplishments--especially by committed people whose game isn't always playing to the cheers of the political crowd.

RE: Rollout of Self-assessment Guidance on Affirmative Action for Institutions of Higher Education.

This week we met with ED and DOJ to review the status of the self-assessment guidance on affirmative action for institutions of higher education. We reached rough agreement on most substantive issues and ED and DOJ are making additions/modifications to make the document more user-friendly and to better convey Administration support for properly conducted affirmative action programs. We expect to have a document ready to go into final by the second week in January. At this point we are working to develop an appropriate roll-out strategy and would appreciate your input.

We believe that the goals of the roll-out strategy should be: 1) make sure that appropriate postsecondary institutions get this information quickly and are able to put it to work, thus speeding and strengthening campus efforts to ensure that affirmative action programs comply with the law; 2) ensure that the civil rights community is aware of the Administration's continued support for properly conducted affirmative action programs in education; 3) demonstrate a substantive step forward that supports the President's Race Initiative; 4) time the release in relation to announcement of the new mentoring initiative and other action steps so it is perceived as part of broader administration efforts to ensure diversity in higher education, and 5) avoid unnecessarily fanning dispute over affirmative action.

We think the following approach should meet these goals. Bracketed elements could be added in depending on how aggressive we want to be in promoting the guidance and building these actions up for the press as a part of the race initiative, although none of the steps outlined are especially high profile. From the perspective of getting the document into the hands of higher education institutions and assisting them to proceed with needed internal reviews quickly and with the least possible controversy, the low-key course is probably best; we know that ACE, the umbrella group for higher ed institutions which is very supportive of this effort, would prefer such a strategy. However, demonstrating action with respect to the Race Initiative might dictate a more visible approach.

- Week of Jan. 12 -- hold briefing at WH to walk through document with small number of key leaders in the civil rights and education community (such as Wade Henderson with the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights, Tom Henderson with the Lawyers' Committee on Civil Rights, and Stan Ikenberry with ACE). [Share document with leaders who are asked to close hold and provide comments within a week].
- Week of Jan. 19 -- hold briefing at ED to walk through document with larger number of

leaders in civil rights and education community.

- Late Jan. -- appropriately address comments from civil rights and education community.
- [Late Jan. -- Department of Education is working on reports on the value of diversity in higher education and successful approaches to fostering diversity. These reports, if well-done, could be released in build-up to announcement of mentoring initiative and to lay the groundwork for release of self-assessment guidance].
- Jan. 27 to Feb. 3 -- President announces new mentoring initiative in or around the time of the State of the Union Address, and proposed funding for the program will be included in the FY 99 budget submission. In rolling out the mentoring initiative, officials should stress that one important benefit is that it would help open up the pipeline to higher education for more disadvantaged minority students and help foster campus diversity.
- [Feb. 7 -- Provide self-assessment guidance to friendly paper emphasizing how it is part of broader Administration efforts to foster diversity in higher education].
- Feb. 8 -- ED shares guidance publicly at already-scheduled ACE Conference.
- [Feb. 9 -- Secretary Riley sends guidance to higher education institutions and announces the Department will be holding a series of regional forums to assist institutions to review their affirmative action programs. Cover letter could also discuss importance of diversity in higher education and encourage institutions to get involved in mentoring initiative.]
- Early March -- ED holds first regional meeting on affirmative action self-assessment at Penn (already scheduled).

Nothing has really happened this week while we focused on the budget--except for our "breakthrough" on the Women's Leadership Academy earlier today.

I suspect you will want to massage this a good bit; I found it difficult to find precisely the right words to explain our strategy.

Single Sex School in New York City: After meeting with DPC and WHC staff, Secretary Riley has agreed to approach Chancellor Rudy Crew in an effort to explore ways they might work together to support the continuing operation of the Women's Leadership Academy in NYC, in the context of civil rights and Constitutional requirements. Riley has placed a call to Crew and expects to speak with him by the beginning of the new year. **Welfare Reform -- Welfare to Work Competitive Grants:** In early January, the Department of Labor will release a notice seeking welfare to work competitive grant applications. A total of \$711 million of the \$3 billion welfare to work funds will be awarded in five rounds of competition, two in FY '98 and three in FY '99. Projects will be funded for up to three years. Both public and private entities may apply, including state and local governments and community and faith-based organizations. We worked with DOL to ensure the notice seeks projects designed to place welfare recipients into jobs quickly and provide the support services and skills training for them to succeed in the work force. Like efforts supported by welfare to work formula funds, these projects must serve long-term welfare recipients with multiple barriers to employment. DOL intends to award about 70 percent of funds to projects in cities with high concentrations of poverty and 30 percent to rural areas. The first round of applications will be due in March.

**Crime -- COPS:** On December 11, the Justice Department announced grants for \$47 million to fund an additional 800 police officers under the Clinton COPS Initiative. The grants went to law enforcement agencies in 32 states, and included a grant to New York City to fund 300 additional officers. The announcement brings the total to 66,000 additional officers funded under the Clinton COPS Program.

**Crime -- 3-1-1 Community Policing Number:** On Wednesday, Dallas launched a new citywide 3-1-1 non-emergency response system. Dallas residents will be able to call 3-1-1 and request any city service 24-hours a day, seven days a week. The Dallas announcement is less than a month after San Jose', California kicked off its own 3-1-1 initiative. On October 1, Baltimore celebrated its one-year anniversary as the nation's first 3-1-1 project. The 3-1-1 initiative in Baltimore has helped reduce the volume of calls to 9-1-1 by 25 percent; has cut the average response time to emergency calls by two-thirds; and has been credited as one of the reasons for lower crime rates in the city.

**Crime -- Brady Handgun Checks:** As reported earlier, Ohio has signed an agreement with the Justice and Treasury Departments to conduct background checks for all handgun sales. Arkansas remains the only state that is not currently conducting background checks. Despite an opinion issued by Arkansas Attorney General Winston Bryant that Arkansas has the necessary authority, the Governor continues to refuse background checks. As a result, Attorney General Bryant has asked the Treasury and Justice Departments to make him the designated chief law enforcement officer authorized to conduct background checks statewide. The proposal is currently under consideration by the both Departments.

**Tobacco -- Proposed Smoking Cessation Program as Part of the Tobacco Settlement:** You inquired about a recent study in the *Journal of the American Medical Association* regarding the implementation of a smoking cessation guideline. The study found that full implementation of the HHS guideline to screen all patients for tobacco use and provide cessation assistance to all willing patients would cost \$6.3 billion in the first year and would achieve approximately 1.7 million new quitters over and above a baseline quit rate. Riley has placed a call to Crew and expects to speak with him by the beginning of the new year.
