Everyone, including Bill, felt more info was required on the effects of the different approaches.

Rachel Levinson from OSTP will circulate a draft options memo on the scientific approaches and their implications for research, and right to life issues.

The basic issue centers on: how do you define what type of research is banned? The WH version bans all entities from using "somatic cell nuclear transfer with the intent of introducing the product of that transfer into a woman's womb or in any other way creating a human being." That would seem to not ban experimentation with cloned embryos and would have right to life implications. The Biotech industry language: "it shall be unlawful for any person to use federal funds to create a human child identical in terms of DNA to an existing or previously existing individual using somatic cell nuclear transfer technology." Doesn't effect private sector, doesn't deal with experimentation and right to life. The reproductive society says "It shall be unlawful for any person to create a human child using somatic cell nuclear transfer." (applies to all, protects research specifically in separate section).

There is also a preemption issue.

Welfare Reform Announcements

1. Announce that we've met the goal -- two years ahead of schedule -- to move two million more Americans off of welfare by the year 2000 (goal set by President in last year's State of the Union).
2. Announce that welfare caseload have fallen below 10 million for the first time since 1970 and release state by state numbers.
3. Announce President's new plan to provide 50,000 vouchers to families who need new housing in order to move from welfare to work.
4. Announce a nationwide competition to reward state efforts to reduce out of wedlock births -- distributing \$100 million a year to five states with the largest reduction.
5. Announce a nationwide welfare to work competition, distributing \$1 billion in high performance bonuses to states that do the best job of placing people into jobs and helping them succeed in the work place.
6. Announce a new 1-800 number for employers to get help with the Earned Income Tax Credit, so to help companies retain employees and give them a raise in every pay check.
7. Announce the first state and local welfare to work grants, created in the Balanced Budget Act to fund welfare to work efforts in high poverty areas (GA, IL, KS, LA, MI, NE, NV, SC).
8. Announce that 3,000 companies have pledged to hire welfare recipients, and challenge the Welfare to Work Partnership to grow to 10,000 in the next year.
9. Call for new penalties for states that have not put in place systems to collect child support from deadbeat parents.

LAWMAKER BACKS STATE'S BID FOR LOWER CHILD SUPPORT PENALTY

Under intense pressure from California state and county officials, the principal author of the 1996 welfare reform law is ready to propose changes to the landmark measure that could shield California from a devastating \$ 4-billion penalty in 1998.

Less than 18 months after the welfare law was enacted, Rep. Clay Shaw (R-Fla.) says Congress must scale back the automatic penalties that it would impose on states that fail to build centralized computer systems to track parents who owe child support.

Shaw is set to propose a new penalty formula that could reduce the sanction California faces this year from a projected \$ 4 billion to about \$ 12 million. Shaw also hopes to relax the law's requirement that states build strictly integrated, centralized systems.

Shaw's proposal would ease California's path to compliance by allowing the state to establish a loosely linked network of dissimilar county child support enforcement systems.

Shaw, chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee's subcommittee on human resources, acknowledged that his draft plan is designed specifically to bail California out of its failure to meet the welfare law's requirements for a single, statewide computer system for child support enforcement.

The state has missed the first deadline to create such a system, and its efforts to build one have been stymied by massive technical and political problems.

"It's not entirely fair to those who really busted their backs to get the job done and tried to comply," said Shaw, who intends to air his proposals this month. "However, California's problems are more immense than many other states and there will be some penalty involved. But it won't take so much money out that it will be tremendously regressive."

Shaw's proposal, which has sparked controversy, comes as California's child support enforcement effort languishes in disarray. California collects support for less than 14% of the families that apply for it, and 3 million children receive nothing from the absent parent.

Many experts fault California's system of county-administered child support enforcement, whose parts are not linked by a single computer system. As a result, a Sacramento mother hoping to get child support from a father living in San Diego might have to deal with two distinct systems that do not easily communicate with each other and that may have vastly different rules and regulations.

The welfare reform law set out to fix that problem, mandating that each state have a "seamless" system that would track an absent parent's moves from county to county and make it easy to track whether that parent has kept up with child support payments:

Although California has spent \$ 100 million to build a computer system that would satisfy the requirements of the welfare law, Gov. Pete Wilson in

November
abandoned the project and canceled a \$ 103-million contract with computer
giant
Lockheed-Martin IMS. Wilson's action came after his administration
concluded
that it would cost more to correct problems with the Lockheed system than
to
launch a new effort.

But with that new effort not yet underway, the state is nearly certain
to
remain out of compliance with the welfare law for several years. And under
the
terms of the law now on the books, that infraction could cost California
its
entire welfare block grant for each year that its system fails to meet the
federal standard.

Under Shaw's plan, the secretary of the Department of Health and Human
Services still would have to sanction California for each year it fails to
institute an integrated system to track noncustodial parents. But the
secretary
would have the latitude to adopt a less punitive formula, dunning the
state for
4% of its federal child support enforcement block grant--or about \$ 12
million--in the first year of noncompliance.

The amount of the less punitive sanction would increase over consecutive
years from 8%--or \$ 24 million in California's case--of the block grant in
the
second year, to a ceiling of 20%--\$ 60 million in California--in the fifth
year
of noncompliance.

If a state initially fails to meet the requirements but comes into
compliance
later within the same year, Shaw's plan would allow the secretary to
return 75%
of the penalty to that state.

Shaw's proposal comes in response to feverish lobbying by California
state
officials as well as pressure from California lawmakers of both parties.
Even
district attorneys from throughout the state, who administer the separate
county
child support enforcement programs, have besieged Shaw with ideas to
improve the
law.

"I've spent more time on the California problem than on any other," he
said.

The congressman's position represents a compromise. Many California
officials
have pressed for even more forgiveness for the state; children's advocates
and
the Clinton administration have sought slightly stiffer penalty
provisions. The
administration and children's advocates also have resisted any bid to ease

the requirement for states to build centralized systems that can track the whereabouts and employment status of parents who owe child support.

In Sacramento on Tuesday, the director of the state's Social Services Department said the proposed penalties would represent an improvement over the current law. But she blamed federal officials for giving the state incomplete and sometimes inconsistent guidance in overseeing the program, and suggested that any penalty levied against the state would be unfair.

"If my choice is between \$ 10 million and \$ 4 billion, I will go with the \$ 10 million, but I would really rather not have that much," said Eloise Anderson. "What are they spanking our hand for? We tried to do exactly what they told us to do and it didn't work. . . . I'm pretty upset about it because we really tried hard."

Putting 100,000 More Police on the Streets January 15, 1998

Announcement

Today the President announced that he's met -- two years ahead of schedule -- the goal he set in last year's State of the Union to move two million more Americans off of welfare by the year 2000. The President released new figures showing that the number of Americans on welfare has fallen by 30 percent since he took office and is below 10 million people for the first time since 1970. There are now 4.3 million fewer people on welfare than when the President took office and began to grant waivers to 43 states to reform welfare and 2.4 million fewer than when he made welfare reform the law of the land. (The welfare rolls fell from 14.1 million in January 1993 to 12.2 in August 1996 to 9.8 million in September 1997, the new numbers released today.)

**PRESIDENT CLINTON:
ENSURING HEALTH SECURITY FOR ALL AMERICANS**

January 14, 1998

"To give American families the security they need to thrive, we need national consumer rights that say to every American: You have a right to know that you are receiving the best care, not the cheapest care; you have the right to choose the right doctor for the right type of care; the right to medical services in an emergency, wherever and whenever the need arises; the right to know your medical records are confidential and only used for legitimate purposes; and you have the right to express your concerns about the quality of care you receive, and to take action when that care is inadequate."

Today, President Clinton and Vice President Gore, along with Democratic Leaders Senator Daschle and Representative Gephardt, came together to call for legislation proposing national health care consumer protections for all Americans.

PATIENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS. The nation's health care system is undergoing significant change. Many Americans worry that these changes may reduce their health care options and lower the standards of care. A Patients' Bill of Rights will give Americans much needed protections -- such as a sense of security that they will have timely access to emergency services; that they will have access to the specialists they need; and that there is a rigorous process in place when they have health care grievances.

HEALTH CARE FOR THE 21ST CENTURY. The Health Care Bill of Rights is an important part of President Clinton's plan to ensure the health care security of all Americans while containing health care costs for working families and businesses. This initiative builds on the success of President Clinton's other health care achievements, including:

- **Protected Medicare -- protected, modernized and extended the Medicare trust fund for at least a decade while offering new options for patient choice and preventive care;**
- **Enacted Single Largest Investment in Health Care for Children since 1965 -- the \$24 billion Children's Health Care Initiative will provide health care coverage for five million children;**
- **Passed Meaningful Health Insurance Reform -- signed the Kassebaum/Kennedy Health Care Bill which limits exclusions for pre-existing conditions, makes coverage portable and helps individuals who lose their jobs remain covered;**
- **Raised Immunization Rates to All Time High -- 90% of toddlers in 1996 received the most critical doses of each of the routinely recommended vaccines --surpassing the President's 1993 goal.**

A FISCALLY RESPONSIBLE SOLUTION. President Clinton is promoting fiscally responsible policies that strengthen our families and expand opportunity for all Americans. Since coming to office, the President has worked to cut the deficit more than 90 , to its lowest level in more than two decades. Putting 100,000 More Police on the Streets January 15, 1998

Announcement

- Today, President Clinton announced that the Justice Department will: 1) provide New York City with a \$120 million grant to fund 1,600 additional police officers; and 2) provide another 620 law enforcement agencies with \$118 million in grants to fund an additional 1,700 police officers. President Clinton's COPS Initiative has now helped fund more than 70,000 police officers in communities across the country.

Making Our Streets Safe

- **100,000 More Police.** In 1992, President Clinton pledged to help cities hire 100,000 more police officers and to expand community policing. He proposed and fought for a nearly \$9 billion COPS Initiative as part of the 1994 Crime Act. With today's announcement, the COPS Initiative will have helped to fund over 70,000 additional police officers in more than 10,000 cities. Funding for the President's goal of 100,000 officers remains a protected priority in the 1997 Balanced Budget Agreement.
- **Lowest Crime Rates in 25 years.** Crime rates have dropped for five years in a row, to their lowest levels in 25 years. Since 1993, violent crime has dropped 16% -- and the murder rate has plummeted by more than 20%. In city after city, community policing is playing a key role in driving down the crime rates.
- **New York City: A National Model.** Nowhere has the President's COPS Initiative made a bigger difference than in New York City. To date, COPS has provided New York City with \$400 million to hire and redeploy over 5,800 police officers, and crime rates have dropped dramatically. In the past four years, crime has declined by an estimated 44%, and murder has dropped by 61%.

A Record of Success in Fighting Crime

- **Tough, Smart Anti-Crime Strategy.** President Clinton has worked closely with police, prosecutors, and community leaders to give communities the tools they need to cut crime. He worked to keep guns out of the hands of criminals by banning 19 deadly assault weapons, and preventing more than 300,000 fugitives and felons from purchasing guns through Brady background checks. He fought for tougher penalties for violent and sex offenders, and more prisons to incarcerate them. And he has pushed to keep schools open late, so that kids can be supervised during the high-crime hours after class.

COPS Program Announcement January 15, 1998

Q. What are you announcing today?

A. Today, the President announced that the Justice Department will: 1) provide New York City with a \$120 million grant to fund 1,600 additional police officers; and 2) provide another 620 law enforcement agencies with \$118 million in grants to fund an additional 1,700 police officers. The grants will be provided through the Justice Department COPS Office. **With today's announcement, the President's COPS Initiative will have helped to fund over 70,000 additional police officers in more than 10,000 cities across the country.**

Q. If New York City has been so successful in reducing its crime, why are you funding so many new officers for their city?

A. Even though New York City's crime rates continue to decline, Mayor Guiliani and Commissioner Safir are clearly dedicated to doing more to bring crime down even further and to improve quality of life for their residents. And we are glad that our COPS Program has been -- and will continue to be -- one of the tools they are using reach this remarkable success in dramatically reducing crime.

But crime isn't coming down just in New York City. It is declining across the country-- in large cities and small towns as well. We are committed to helping all cities further improve public safety, which is why we are continuing to add officers. Today's announcement also includes funding for more than 1,700 officers for another 620 law enforcement agencies.

Q. To date, how much money has the COPS Office given to New York City and for what purposes?

A. Including today's announcement, the New York City Police Department has been awarded \$400 million in COPS grants to hire and/or redeploy just over 5,800 police officers. This also includes about \$1.3 million in non-hiring grants to target domestic violence and street-level drug dealing, and to promote New York's successful community policing model ("Compstat") among other police departments.

Q. Do you think the COPS Program has had any impact on reducing crime?

A. Absolutely. Police chiefs and sheriffs throughout the country will tell you that community policing has been a crucial element in reducing crime. And while it's clear that there are several factors at work -- such as changing demographics and an expanding economy -- community policing has been at the center of most local anti-crime efforts.

Q. How do you know that the federal funding will be spent for new officers and not to supplant local funding for current officers?

A. By statute, funding for hiring additional officers through the COPS Program cannot be used to supplant local funding for existing officers. New York City is aware of this requirement, and has assured us that it will comply with it.

Q. Some recent articles have raised the problem that some police departments will have difficulty paying for COPS-funded officers after their federal grants expire. Are the police departments required to keep these officers?

A. Yes. Upon receiving their federal grants, police departments signed agreements with the Justice Department to make a good faith effort to retain additional officers when their federal funding expires. The Justice Department believes that the vast majority of police departments will keep their commitments and retain these officers. Some cities could experience changes which may affect their ability to retain their officers; in those instances, the Justice Department's COPS Office has committed to work with any agency that asks for assistance. In addition, we have a new program for fiscally distressed smaller communities (with populations under 50,000) to help them transition at the end of their grants.
