Dear Mr. Chairman:

The Administration strongly objects to the inclusion of any provision in the FY 1998 Supplemental Appropriations Conference Report to allow for the importation of any modified semiautomatic assault rifles that accept large capacity military magazines. The Secretary of the Treasury, consistent with his authority under the Gun Control Act of 1968, recently concluded that these firearms do not meet the sporting purposes test and are generally not importable. Thus, the President would veto any supplemental appropriations bill that includes language undermining this decision.

The proposed language would potentially allow for as many as 600,000 modified Uzis, AK 47s and other assault-type rifles to be imported into the country. While we know that an estimated 3,000 of these firearms have already reached our shores, we have almost no way of verifying the precise number of firearms "in transit." Moreover, we know from our experience in implementing a similar amendment in 1994 that an such an exemption will be nearly impossible to implement and could allow hundreds of thousands of modified assault weapons to circumvent the Secretary's decision.

I strongly urge the Committee to reject this provision.

**Q&As on Tobacco -- Al Hunt Interview**

April 28, 1998

**Q: Do you really think you'll get a tobacco bill this year?**

**A:** I believe we have an historic opportunity to pass bipartisan legislation this year which both contains the elements necessary to reduce teen smoking. And I'm going to do everything I can to put politics aside and pass legislation that will achieve that objective. Senator McCain's legislation, which passed the Commerce Committee by a 19-1 vote, is a strong step in the right direction on the road to passing comprehensive tobacco legislation. **It shows real momentum in both parties to pass effective, comprehensive tobacco legislation this year.**

**Q: Isn't the McCain bill a big government, big tax proposal?**

**A:** No. What this bill does is to attack the problem of youth smoking comprehensively, as all experts say we need to do, by combining strong provisions on price, penalties, advertising and access, and FDA jurisdiction. Although we have some differences with Senator McCain, he also recognizes the need to move forward on all these fronts to reduce youth smoking. That's not about big government. It's about sensible, bipartisan steps to dramatically reduce youth smoking.

**Q: But won't the McCain bill create 17 new federal bureaucracies?**

**A:** No -- this isn't about big government. What the bill does is to ensure that the federal government has the authority to regulate tobacco products in order to reduce youth smoking, as well as the ability to target tobacco revenues to strong public health and research efforts. The so-called "bureaucracies" that the industry is now complaining about are nothing more than what's necessary to protect the public health in this way -- to ensure that cigarettes are not sold to minors, to promote effective education, and to encourage smoking cessation. The proof that this is an industry con job is clear: almost all these provisions were in the June 1997 proposed settlement put forward by 41 state attorneys general, which the industry agreed to. The industry is criticizing these provisions now only because the political tide has turned against it, and certain other aspects of the legislation have gotten stronger.

**Q: Are you worried about the bill creating a black market?**

**A:** We think we can minimize black market activity through a system similar to the one that's been in place for alcoholic beverages for over sixty years by: 1) creating a "closed" distribution system for tobacco products so that only licensed entities can sell or buy products; 2) clearly branding packages for export, to prevent them from being diverted; and 3) establishing and enforcing penalties and other actions for violators. Senator McCain's bill largely addresses these issues, and we are working with him on technical changes.

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Hex-Dump Conversion

**Q: Wouldn't this big government scheme extend the reach of the federal government to every mom-and-pop grocery store or 7-11?**

**A:** No. We are comfortable with a system that places primary responsibility for licensing retailers on state governments, as the McCain bill does. The important thing is to work with Congress to devise a scheme that will facilitate the effort to prevent smuggling, while not burdening retailers. The Administration will work with Congress, and the retailers themselves, on this issue.

**Q: Won't the McCain bill bankrupt the companies? Lots of Wall Street analysts say it will.**

**A:** We don't want to put the tobacco companies out of business. We just want to put them out of the business of selling cigarettes to kids. A central feature of comprehensive tobacco legislation is to ensure that most of the payments made by the tobacco companies are passed on to price, in order to reduce youth smoking. As a result, there will be at most a modest impact on the profitability of the tobacco companies. This is also an industry with significant cash flow and net assets that will allow it to easily absorb this modest profit decline. The operating earnings of RJR, Philip Morris, and Loews last year were *\$18 billion*. Even RJR, the most highly leveraged firm in this industry, had a \$1.5 billion operating profit for its domestic tobacco business, and has over \$4 billion in net assets from its Nabisco stock holdings. The only real risk of bankruptcy comes from losing a rash of lawsuits in court.

**Needle Exchange Q&As**  
**April 29, 1998**

**Q: What is your position on the Solomon Amendment to prohibit any Federal funding for needle exchange programs?**

**A:** The Administration strongly opposes this legislation because it is unnecessary and unwarranted. We believe that this legislation serves only to further politicize this issue. As such, we believe that Congress should focus on those issues that immediately impact the health and well being of the nation: youth smoking, quality shortcomings, and Americans ages 55 to 65 that have been failed by the insurance market.

**Q: If you believe that needle exchange is an issue that should be decided at the local level why does the Secretary need any authority to authorize Federal funding?**

**A:** It has been the longstanding position of Congress to give the Secretary of Health and Human Services the authority for to determine the scientific and public health merits for a wide range of public health activities. We believe is unwarranted and unnecessary to take away the Secretary's authority and that this legislation is being pursued for purely political -- not policy -- reasons.

**Q: If the science concludes that needle exchange programs reduce the transmission of HIV and do not increase drug use, why aren't you releasing federal funds for needle exchange programs?**

**A:** We have always said that communities should make their own decisions on this issue, based on their own circumstances and using the best available scientific information. Releasing federal funding for needle exchange would have inappropriately shifted the focus away from communities -- where these decisions should be made -- to the national level. That could have severely undermined or threatened local programs that are currently in place, and hindered additional communities from deciding to put these programs into place. At the same time, such federal action could send an inappropriate message about the acceptability of drug use -- a message that is not sent when an individual community decides, on the basis of its unique circumstances, that a particular, carefully designed needle exchange program advances public health interests. For these reasons, the Administration concluded that it should simply give the scientific guidance that is necessary for communities to make their own decisions, rather than federalize the needle exchange issue.

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**Background:**

Congress gave the Secretary of Health and Human Services the responsibility to make two determinations: whether the scientific research findings conclude that needle exchange programs reduce HIV transmission and whether they increase drug use. In 1997, the Secretary made a determination that needle exchange programs do reduce the transmission of HIV. Last week, the Secretary held a meeting with her senior scientific advisors, including Nobel Laureate and head of the National Institutes of Health, Dr. Harold Varmus. These scientists agreed that the science-based standards have been met with regard to drug use as well.

**Q: Wasn't the decision not to federally fund needle exchange programs based on political considerations?**

**A:** The decision was based on a belief that communities should decide for themselves whether to adopt needle exchange programs, based on their own local circumstances and the best scientific evidence possible. We did fear that federalizing needle exchange would imperil such local decision making, by igniting a congressional battle on the subject. To that extent, the Administration's decision took into account political realities. But first and foremost, the decision resulted from a commitment to real, locally-based decision making on this subject.

"McCaffrey Vows No Free Needles"

Gen. Barry McCaffrey, the White House drug policy director, asserted Tuesday that the government will never fund needle-exchange programs, and he disagreed with studies showing that the programs reduce the spread of HIV and curb drug use. He said that he had convinced President Clinton that studies supporting needle-exchanges were incomplete and that more research on the matter is required. The administration recently announced that it supports the scientific evidence that needle-exchange programs help reduce the spread of HIV and do not encourage drug use, but said it will not allow federal money to be used by the programs. Washington, D.C. Delegate Eleanor Holmes Norton, chairman of the Congressional Black Caucus, and Rep. Maxine Waters (D-Calif.) last week called for the resignation of McCaffrey. McCaffrey replied that he would be responsive to the concerns of some caucus members, but that he would "try to defend it [his decision] and make sure [he is] sensitive to the threats of the black community." McCaffrey contends that the government should first focus on drug policy and treatment. He claims that while the programs may reduce the HIV incidence, there are associated problems with the exchanges to be dealt with, including increased crime in the program areas.

1. **Endorse Hyde/Hatch Legislative Alternative.** After the Justice Department's legal interpretation is released, we could endorse the expected introduction of legislation authorizing the DEA to pursue criminal investigations of physicians prescribing medications for assisted suicides.

**Pros**

- Appears consistent with our stated public position of opposition to assisted suicide.
- Avoids inevitable conflict with the Republican Congress and "right-wing" side of party.

**Cons**

- Raises important and potentially extremely problematic precedent for the establishment of a major Federal regulatory role over medical practice, a responsibility that has historically been the province of the states.
- According to physicians' groups and even the Catholic Health Association, a Federal law in this area will increase the well documented problem of undermedicating terminally ill patients as physicians become even more afraid of prescribing pain control medications that could make them vulnerable to prosecution by the Federal Government.

2. **Oppose Hatch/Hyde legislation outright.** Concurrent with the expected introduction of the Hatch/Hyde bill, communicate to the Hill that, while you find assisted suicide to be an abhorrent practice (as illustrated by your enactment of the Anti-Assisted Suicide Act of 1997), you cannot support legislation that diverts limited law enforcement resources from the DEA for this purpose. Moreover, you would underscore that you believe it would be ill-advised to pass a new, precedent-laden Federal bill that was extremely intrusive to state oversight over the regulation over the patient/doctor relationship.

**Pros**

- Sends a clear signal of opposition, a position that is consistent with that advocated by both HHS and Justice.
- Does not further confuse or frighten doctors, who are already seriously undermedicating terminally ill patients because of their fear of being prosecuted or at least publicly criticized for hastening death inappropriately.

- Could avoid a time-consuming and likely unproductive negotiating process with the Hill over Federal legislation that is extremely difficult to envision resulting in a rationale, desirable policy outcome.

**Cons**

- Appears inconsistent with historic position in opposition to assisted suicide.
- Risks major confrontation with the Republicans and virtually all representatives of the "religious right."

3. **Oppose DEA (likely Hatch/Hyde) approach, but suggest openness to alternatives.** Welcome the intent of the Republican DEA bill, but raise the same concerns outlined in option 2. Advise Republicans that we believe that there may be other ways to implement the intent of their legislation in a more workable fashion. In this context, we could suggest alternative enforcement agencies (such as FDA) and enforcement mechanisms, (such as reducing Federal support for Medicaid for states that are engaged in this Euthanasia process). By definition, this process would be designed to seriously attempt to find some common ground with the Republicans and the Governors to sincerely developing a workable legislative alternative to DEA enforcement.

**Pros**

- Seems consistent with your historic "assisted suicide" position.
- Shows we are seriously concerned about this issue; so much so that we are willing to help develop legislation that addresses the "rationing" fears that many conservative Americans have.
- Would take an enforcement approach that does not tap into limited DEA resources or rely on DEA enforcement agents (who might not be sensitized to this most sensitive of issues).

**Cons**

- May excessively raise expectations that a legislative solution can be achieved when, in fact, it may be virtually impossible to reach consensus.
- Relying on a financial enforcement mechanism like reduction of Federal Medicaid matching (or something like highway) dollars would be strongly opposed by the states as micro-management and as an inappropriate Federal intrusion of states rights and responsibilities.

4. **"Kick the Can" Strategy.** The last option is to take the same "openness to addressing issue" public position on the bill that was outlined in option 3, but participate in a process that is explicitly designed to conclude in non-action. Such an approach would presume a drawn-out process that allows the time for the medical groups, states, and others to communicate to all sides that Federal approaches in this area don't work and are ill-advised. At the very least, the opponents would raise serious enough objections to conclude that we do not have time to draft thoughtful Federal legislation this year.

#### Pros

- Would allow the process and the affected parties be the most influential participants to achieving closure on this controversial issue – not us.
- Would allow us to reiterate our strong position against assisted suicide in a way that does not result in legislation that creates as many or more undesirable precedences and problems than it solves.
- Would allow the time for all the issues on this controversial issue to be aired; might even help educate physicians and the public at large about the very real and serious under-medication for terminally ill problem.

#### Cons

- Could make us look indecisive and weak.
- Could be viewed with skepticism on the Hill and make us vulnerable to charge that we are trying to have it both ways.

FYI: I wanted you to know about charter school developments in California and suggest that the President could -- if plans are still for the President to respond to an Unz question anyway -- perhaps also call on Governor Wilson to sign a charter school bill coming to his desk that day.

I describe the charter situation below and can find out more if: 1) there still are plans for the President to take questions on Unz/ education at all Friday, and 2) you think it could make sense for the President to comment on charter schools too.

Votes are expected tomorrow in both houses of the California legislature tomorrow approving a major expansion of the state's charter school law. After weeks of negotiations among Silicon Valley high-tech executives, the California Teachers' Association (CTA), and state legislators, a legislative conference committee has agreed on a legislative compromise/alternative to a charter school ballot initiative backed by the executives and opposed by the CTA. If the conference agreement is approved by both houses tomorrow (as expected), the legislation would need to be signed into law by Governor Wilson by Friday in order to keep the initiative off of the ballot.

Wilson is likely to sign and under pressure to sign because the bill is supported by Silicon Valley, the CTA, charter advocates, etc. But those in the negotiations say it is conceivable he'd veto it because 1) he'd rather see Silicon Valley and the CTA in a fight about this, and 2) he's worried that taking a controversial charter school initiative off of the ballot would enable more CTA resources to be spent opposing his own education ballot initiative.

Do you think this is worth exploring further?
