Today, the Senate took a significant step toward completion of the IRS Reform legislation by agreeing by unanimous consent to restrict amendments to the IRS Reform Legislation to relevant amendments -- with the exception of amendments to be offered Wednesday morning by Senator Roth, and by Sen. Kerrey, to pay for the outyear costs of the legislation. ([Relevance] is a somewhat broader standard than germaneness but nevertheless places significant limits on what amendments may be offered to this tax bill.)

The Roth [payfor] amendment consists of an expansion of [Roth IRAs]. Converting [conventional IRAs] to [Roth IRAs] requires depositors to pay tax on the money in their accounts; the expanded availability of Roth IRAs would therefore be estimated to bring in additional revenues.

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Q: What is the INS doing to provide relief to the thousands who, because of Section 377 of the INA, are in danger of being deported?

A: The INS is aware of the issues surrounding those who were members of the CSS, LULAC and Zambrano classes who are now ineligible for immigration benefits (such as work authorization and stays of removal). Current immigration law may provide some avenue for relief for CSS class members. Those who have been in the country for more than 10 years may be eligible for cancellation of removal under IIRIRA. I spoke with Bob Bach from INS last week. He said that the draft legislation was not finished and that they had some questions about our strategy for moving forward. According to Bob, INS still wants to include pay equity for inspectors (equivalent to law enforcement officers) in the legislation. The last time we discussed this, OMB made clear that this was not do-able at this time (it would be very expensive and was not anticipated in FY99). According to Peter, we must get draft legislation introduced -- a vehicle to nail down Reyes and others and to keep the discussion moving with our proposal as a frame.

Last week, Abraham made a speech in which he stated his intention to hold oversight hearings (starting after the Memorial day recess) to determine the best way to reform the agency and that he would consider the Administration's proposal and other alternatives. He also stated that he does not think that the issue of INS reform will be resolved this Congress. This is a good sign, b/c it signals to the appropriators (Rogers) that Abraham sees this as his (not their) issue. However, INS has indicated that they may want to move forward with reform without blessing from the Congress. Peter's instinct, given Abraham's statement, is for INS not to move forward without Congress's o.k. He would, however, want to know if INS has any different intelligence on this. Peter has calls into their leg. person (Alan Erenbaum).

I have a call into Bob to make clear our strategy and to ask that we set something up with us and OMB later in the week to resolve any lingering issues that they may have with the legislation and our overall legislative strategy.

Q: There are so many promising new developments in cancer. Shouldn't your Administration do more to help advance the progress against this disease?

A: I am very encouraged about the promising new breakthroughs in cancer research. I am proud of what this Administration is doing to advance this progress through three proposals that represent some of the highest priorities of the cancer community.

- Historic Investment in Cancer Research. My balanced budget includes an unprecedented multi-year investment in cancer research, with a 65 percent increase in the NCI budget over the next five years.
- Cancer Clinical Trials. My budget also includes a new demonstration to cover the patient care costs for Medicare beneficiaries who participate in certain clinical trials. The recent promising cancer therapies all have to go through clinical trials. Scientists have said that expanding access to these trials will increase their participation rates, which is critical to ensuring that these promising new therapies go from the experimental phase to the market where they can potentially help millions of Americans.
- Genetic Discrimination. Finally, I have asked Congress to pass legislation that prevents employers and health insurers from discriminating on the basis of genetic information. **Studies show that a leading reason women do not get new genetic testing for susceptibility to breast cancer is because they worry about this kind of discrimination.**

I urge Congress to pass all of these proposals into law this year.

Q: Should insurance companies be required to cover Viagra?

A: If the drug is medically necessary, it should be covered. Most policies today cover prescription drugs that have been determined by physicians to be medically necessary.

Some health plans are now suggesting that this drug is being prescribed and dispensed for conditions that may not meet a traditional definition of medical necessity; in response, they are contemplating new coverage rules. We will follow this closely to determine if medically necessary medications are covered. But as a general matter, I believe there should be very careful deliberation before the government takes any action to require coverage for a particular prescription drug.

Q: But isn't it inconsistent to cover Viagra, in light of the fact that many policies do not

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now cover birth control pills?

- A:** The decision to require coverage for any particular drug should be carefully considered. The question is whether the denial of coverage creates problems of real access to medically necessary prescription drugs. Before we proceed in this area we should make sure that the need justifies governmental intervention.

SUBJECT: USDA's Proposed Organic Rule

In 1990, Congress passed the Organic Food Production Act which required the Department of Agriculture (USDA) to establish a national standard defining the use of the term "organic" for use on food products. The legislation was strongly supported by the organic industry which sought to involve the federal government in creating a unified organic standard, rather than the myriad of private and state-endorsed definitions. In December 1997, USDA published a proposed regulation to establish a national organic standard. Since that time, the proposed rule has been the subject of extensive criticism.

The primary complaint concerning the proposed rule has been that it does not explicitly prohibit the use of genetically modified organisms, irradiation, and biosolids (sludge) in food that could be labeled "organic." In the preamble to its proposal, USDA had requested comments as to whether foods using any of these techniques could be considered as organic. In response, USDA says it has received almost 200,000 comments regarding the proposed rule, the most ever received for a USDA rulemaking. The rule has also been the subject of unfavorable editorials in many newspapers including the New York Times, the Washington Post, the Chicago Tribune, and the Los Angeles Times. (Sample "Organic Hash From the USDA Kitchen"). Finally, 47 members of the House and 30 Senators have signed letters to Secretary Glickman expressing concern about the proposed rule.

Current Status

Secretary Glickman plans to issue a press release this Friday, May 7th, (attached), indicating that USDA will repropose the rule and "make fundamental changes in the new proposed rule on organic standards." Specifically, the statement would indicate that biotechnology, irradiation, and biosolids are "being taken off the table and will not be included in our new proposal." Articles in the last week in USA TODAY, and the Washington Post have indicated that USDA is preparing such a statement.

Representatives of OMB and NEC have been concerned about USDA's plan to issue a statement taking these techniques "off the table." These agencies argue that consumers will likely view a product labeled as organic as safe, despite the fact that there is not evidence to demonstrate that organic food is any safer than non-organic food, or that genetically modified,

irradiated, or food grown using sludge is unsafe. OMB points out that organic material might be even worse in terms of some microbiological hazards, and supposedly organic foods have been and may in the future be linked to illnesses such as occurred in the Odwalla juice outbreak. OMB notes the danger of contradiction in Administration policy in areas such as biosolids (sludge) in which the Administration is on record supporting the safety of the product. OMB suggested that USDA consider modifying the organic label to include a provision stating something along the lines of "organic food may be no more or less safe than non-organic food" or that USDA continue its comment review process and not prematurely prohibit using the term organic for food using any of the three disputed techniques.

USDA felt strongly that the label should not be modified and that a statement announcing a reproposal needs to be made promptly. USDA states that the organic label is not intended to signify the overall safety of the food, only the methods by which the food was produced, and that it will not advertise the label as having anything to do with safety. USDA notes that the disputed techniques are clearly not in keeping with the public's expectation of what constitutes organic. The Food and Drug Administration has expressed support for USDA's position.

Recommendation

We recognize the need for USDA to clarify its position on organics, and recommend that Secretary Glickman issue a statement indicating that biotechnology, irradiation, and sludge will not be part of the revised proposal. We suggest USDA not include the phrase "taken off the table," however, which may imply they could never be considered. In addition, after discussions with OMB, OSTP, NEC, FDA and USDA we have agreed upon two additional measures that could ameliorate some concerns over safety. These include (1) having USDA and FDA conduct a survey on consumer attitudes towards organic food to determine whether consumers purchase organic products on the basis of unproven safety claims, and (2) having USDA insert in the preamble of its new rule language indicating that the National Organic Standard Board should report regularly to the Secretary on possible uses of new technologies and whether they might meet an organic standard.

Here is the best we could do give the data that are available. It's a little softer than I would have preferred; there isn't a single validated data sources as much as a series of calls to NGA and similar organizations that try to track key education policy trends. Let me know what you think. We should at least be able to work up some speech language for this.

Leadership to End Social Promotions. At the 1996 National Education Summit between governors and business leaders, President Clinton challenged state and local officials to end the practice of social promotion--the practice of advancing students to the next grade level regardless of whether they have met academic standards. This practice hurts the students who are promoted by failing to provide them with the help they need to develop a solid foundation in the basics, and prevents parents and the public at large from holding schools accountable for results. The President reiterated his challenge in his 1998 State of the Union address. Today, the Action Plan adopted by Mayors responds to that challenge, and calls for an end to social promotions. Currently, 10 states have policies prohibiting the advancement of students who have not met specified requirements and 5 additional states have legislation pending to eliminate social promotions. A growing number of school districts, including Boston, Cincinnati, Chicago, Long Beach, Rochester, NY, Washington DC, New York City and Philadelphia also have such policies in place or under consideration.

I understand that there has been no decision about this week's radio address topic, but that child care remains a contender.

If child care prevails (as we hope it does), here is what we envision: the message would be Mother's Day, with the President stressing that today mothers are more pressed than ever, working outside the home in greater numbers than ever, and struggling to balance their responsibilities to their jobs and their families. He would talk about the need for Congressional action on child care, harken to the Casey Foundation's report which came out this week stressing the urgency of child care needs, and make two announcements aimed at giving mothers greater peace of mind about child care: (1) the release of Department of Justice guidelines for screening child care workers and other caregivers -- designed to reduce the incidence of abuse by care providers; and (2) the release of two HHS items: a report documenting model consumer education efforts and underscoring the critical importance of getting good information to parents on child care, and a check list for parents of questions to ask and things to look for in finding high quality child care.

SUBJECT: LEGISLATIVE REPORT

ISTEA: Conferees met for 15 minutes this afternoon. Shuster complained that the meetings on the House side which need to be happening in order to resolve the funding levels have not yet occurred; he expressed concern that the conference won't be able to complete action by Memorial Day. The conferees then adopted a minor package of staff recommendations. The conference will not meet again until next week. Also today, House Ways & Means Chairman Archer announced he would vote against the ISTEA conference report (and declined to serve as a conferee) when Speaker Gingrich appointed Ways & Means conferees who are committed to extending the ethanol subsidy through 2006. Archer wants to let the subsidy expire in 2000.

The House Science Committee held a hearing today to review the status of NASA's Space Station program, and, in particular, the Administration's response to: 1) A NASA commissioned independent report ("Chabrow report") that claims the Station program is underfunded by \$130 million -\$250 million/yr, and 2) the continuing funding shortfall in Russia that is delaying the delivery of the Service Module, a critical component for the early assembly of Station. Witnesses included Duncan Moore (OSTP), Dan Goldin (NASA), and Jay Chabrow (chairman of the independent cost assessment task group).

During questioning, Sensenbrenner was critical of OMB's statement for the record that additional cost growth for Station should be offset within NASA's budget. He was particularly bothered that human space flight was the area cited first for reduction, as he strongly supports this area. He asked Dr. Moore to identify specific offsets. Moore said the Administration would respond by June 15th, a deadline set in the recent supplemental, as to whether any additional funding is required for Station for FY 1999 and, if so, where the offsets will be.
