Dear Democratic Colleague:

In response to President Clinton's call to improve child care by making it safer and more affordable for America's working families, House Democrats will introduce our Democratic Child Care Proposal on Tuesday, June 9th. As part of the President's balanced budget, the Democratic proposal will introduce significant new investments in child care to help working families pay for child care, build a good supply of after-school programs, and improve the safety and quality of care and promote early learning.

We are writing to urge you to join us as original cosponsors of the Democratic Child Care bill to be introduced next week. This proposal doubles the number of children receiving child care assistance; increases tax credits for three million working families to help them pay for child care; establishes a stay-at-home credit for children under the age of four; provides after-school care for up to one million children per year; improves child care safety and quality; and enhances early childhood development.

**Q'S AND A'S REGARDING CALIFORNIA'S
"UNZ INITIATIVE" (PROPOSITION 227)**

Q: What is the Administration's reaction to the passage of Proposition 227 in California?

A. The most important message coming from voters in California is that we have to make sure that students, particularly those who are immigrants or children of immigrants, learn English as quickly as possible. The President agrees with that message, though he disagrees with the particular approach in Proposition 227.

President Clinton and Secretary Riley opposed the Unz Initiative in California because it is the wrong way to accomplish this goal. They believe that the Unz Initiative will result in fewer Limited English Proficient students learning English, lower academic achievement in other subjects, and greater frustration for students and parents. Its one-year time limit and one-size-fits all approach will harm kids rather than help them, and will limit the ability of local communities and schools to tailor approaches that meet the needs of their children.

Instead the President supports local programs that set a goal of helping students learn English within 3 years, are held accountable for meeting that goal, are given the flexibility to enable educators and parents to fashion programs that work best for their students, and make sure that the teachers have the knowledge and skills to get the job done. Next year, when Congress reauthorizes all elementary and secondary education programs, he will propose legislation to translate these principals into law. And the President will continue to press the Congress to support his request to double funding for training teachers in English-as-a-second language and bilingual education programs.

Q. How do you explain that the majority(or a large percentage) of Latinos in California voted for Prop 227 in spite of the President's opposition?

A. We recognize that many Latino parents were dissatisfied with the educational opportunities available to their children. Many felt that it was taking too long for their children to master English. That is why we have called for strengthening bilingual programs by increasing funding for bilingual teachers and by establishing a three year goal for all children to move into all English classes. We believe this approach is preferable to Proposition 227.

Q. Will the President support legislation currently in Congress (the Riggs bill) to overhaul the federal bilingual education program?

A. The President believes that efforts to strengthen the federal bilingual education program should be based on the principles he and Secretary Riley have already articulated: (1) a

goal for students to learn English within 3 years; (2) accountability for results; (3) local flexibility for determining how best to achieve results; and (4) investments in providing qualified teachers. The President plans to send legislation to Congress fully consistent with these principles next year, when Congress takes up all federal elementary and secondary education programs. The Riggs bill now before the House Education and Workforce Committee is not consistent with these principles, and so the Administration is opposed to that bill.

Q: Will you join those who are planning to bring legal action to stop the implementation of Proposition 227?

A. We are not at this time joining in legal challenges to Proposition 227. The Departments of Justice and Education will carefully monitor the educational programs that are put in place under the proposition to ensure that they comply with the civil rights laws. Whether they do so will depend upon how they are implemented and whether children with limited English proficiency are provided a realistic opportunity to succeed academically.

Q: What steps will you take with regard to school districts who are now subject to compliance agreements with the Department of Education that may be inconsistent with Prop. 227?

A. The Department has entered into approximately 55 compliance agreements with school districts in California in order to ensure that they provide adequate educational opportunities for children who have limited proficiency in English. These agreements, which were entered into voluntarily by the school districts, provide for a variety of educational approaches. Many provide for bilingual education, some do not. The Department is prepared to consider requests by these school districts for changes to these agreements and to provide technical assistance to all districts regarding what policies are permissible under federal law.

Q: What will be the effect of Proposition 227 on applications for federal grants to support bilingual education programs?

A. Many districts in California receive competitive grants under the Department of Education's Bilingual Education Program. That program supports, not only bilingual education projects, but also other instructional approaches for limited English proficient children. Districts that must revise their instructional approaches to comply with Proposition 227 may also need approval from the Department of Education to alter their plans for spending federal funds. The Department of Education is prepared to review any such proposed revisions, as well as revisions to pending grants proposals, to determine, on a case-by-case basis, whether they can be approved consistent with current program requirements.

Here is a a menu of compromises:

1. Use LEAF but end the program in 15 years. (Senator Ford caught Dallas and I in the hallway and confidentially suggested he could go with this.) We need to see if we can get any committed votes with this, we are reaching out to Senate moderate R's.
2. Do the buy out in 7 years for quota holders who don't grow, but less money for other leasees etc. but who are getting permits. Dallas Smith and Keith have written this one up and I will red dot it over to you.
- 3 and 4. Either a state run program or a privatized program. Ford is drafting/has drafted this language. A state by state compact may have constitutional problems, a federalized program helps those who want to vote to end the governmental tobacco program, it may appear to be a double standard to some farm state Ds.
4. Reduce the size of the Ford package (no Pell grants etc.), give money to farm states in emergencies like the Dakotas, reduce the time of the buy out. Reducing the buy out helps with the Helms types, reducing the size of the Ford package helps with non-tobacco types. But it probably doesn't actually change votes and it costs money.

We are pretty close to actually winning LEAF, and very close to being confident about striking Lugar. Ford is talking to Daschle today about getting to go first, they are worried word of this plan will leak to Lott.

H.J.Res. 78 -Joint Resolution Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of the United States Restoring Religious Freedom
(Istook (R) Oklahoma and 153 cosponsors)

The Administration strongly opposes House passage of H.J.Res. 78. The Nation currently has a constitutional amendment that protects religious liberty. It is the First Amendment. Public school students are free to voluntarily pray privately and individually at school. Students already have a right to say grace at lunchtime. They have the right to meet in religious groups on school grounds and use school facilities like any other school club. They have the right to read the Bible, or any religious text during study hall or other free class time. Similarly, people who wish to engage in religious expression on public property have the same rights as people who wish to engage in comparable nonreligious expression. For over 200 years, the First Amendment has protected our rights to be as religious as we choose. Congress should not tamper with this most precious liberty. The First Amendment should not be rewritten.

This Statement of Administration Policy was developed by the Legislative Reference Division (Schroeder) in consultation with the Departments of Justice (Taylor) and Education (Riddle), WHLA (Jacoby), WH Counsel (Marshall), DPC (Fernandes), TCJS (Boden) and HRD (Mustain).

OMB/LA clearance:

The House Judiciary Committee reported H.J.Res. 78 with an amendment in the nature of a substitute on May 19, 1998.

Administration Position to Date

The Administration has not previously taken a position on H.J.Res. 78.

On May 30, 1998, the President stated in his weekly radio address that amending the Constitution is the wrong way to protect religious freedom. The address further stated that "[f]or more than 200 years, the First Amendment has protected our religious freedom and allowed many faiths to flourish in our homes, in our workplaces and in our schools. Clearly

understood and sensibly applied, it works. It does not need to be rewritten."

Background

According to the House Judiciary Committee's report on H.J.Res. 78, the legislation was introduced in response to concerns that "the Supreme Court and lower courts have misinterpreted the Constitution by issuing rulings that severely restrict religious expression when other forms of free speech are not so restricted, and which result in discrimination against a religious viewpoint in public affairs."

Summary of H.J.Res. 78

H.J.Res. 78 would amend the Constitution to explicitly provide for an individual's religious rights to worship on public property, including schools, and prohibit the Government from requiring any person to: (1) join religious activities; (2) initiate or designate school prayers; (3) discriminate against religion; or (4) deny equal access to a benefit on account of religion.

Pay-As-You-Go Scoring

According to BASD (Balis), H.J.Res. 78 does not affect direct spending or receipts and, therefore, is not subject to the pay-as-you-go requirement of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act. CBO concurs.

Bear in mind, he's talking to 1500 young people.

I have said before that each of us must do our part to ensure that our progress continues -- and that's what I want to talk about today: the citizen service movement each of you is an important part of.

But before I speak about service, I want to talk to you about another issue you may have heard about that affects young people most of all: the battle in Washington over the tobacco bill. Smoking kills more people every year than AIDS, alcohol, car accidents, murders, suicides, drugs and fires combined. Studies show that 90% of all smokers lit their first cigarettes before they turned 18. The big tobacco companies know this, and for years they've spent hundreds of millions of dollars on ads to reach children as young as 12. Their strategy has worked: 3,000 young people start smoking every day ... and 1,000 will die early as a result.

This week, the Congress has the opportunity to pass a bill that will protect young people from tobacco and stop children from lighting their first cigarettes. Now, a great many people support this bill, from parents, to public health officials, to members of both parties in the Congress. But the big tobacco companies are doing everything they can to keep it from passing.

The Congress faces a critical choice. And today, I want to say that if Congress fails to pass this bill, it will be a victory for the tobacco companies and a defeat for all of you -- our nation's young people. If Congress fails to act, it will be because it has put narrow interests above the national interest. And that vote will be very hard to explain to the American people.

I re-did the chart as we discussed last night. It's still not perfect, and there are too many unanswered questions -- but this gives us a worse case scenario of costs. To get in the 2 to 3 billion a year ball park, I added all of the increases in year 1 and carried them forward (\$2.124 billion a year, plus a one-time technology add-on of \$89 million). Also, I can't understand how you include the Drug-Free Borders bill and propose doubling Customs drug budget without completely overlapping or duplicating the costs.

Finally, I should note that while the Drug-Free Borders bill passed the House w about 350 votes and Treasury wanted to be supportive, there are some hard to swallow labor provisions in the bill (i.e., it allows the Customs Commission to sidestep collective bargaining, if necessary, to ensure that drug interdiction is not compromised).

Ag Research: House Republican leadership may meet tomorrow to decide the fate of the Ag Research Conference Report. They may direct the House Appropriations Committee to put a 5-year crop insurance fix in their Agriculture Appropriations bill, offset by food stamp administrative savings.

Budget Resolution: Amendments to the Kasich budget resolution had to be filed at House Rules Committee by today at 5pm. House Rules Committee will meet late Wednesday afternoon to consider a rule for Floor consideration. Rules Committee staff expected the following amendments to be under consideration: (1) Democratic plan; (2) Blue Dog plan; (3) Moderate Republican plan, possibly close to Senate-passed; (4) CATS plan; (5) Sensenbrenner (science) amendment; and (6) an amendment to increase defense spending. There is only a very slim possibility of Floor action this week; Floor action is likely to be delayed as Kasich tries to get the votes he needs for passage.

REMARKS FOR CITY YEAR CONVENTION
CLEVELAND, OHIO
June 3, 1998

Hello, City Year, and thank you for inviting me to be a part of this Convention of Idealism. I want to thank Leslie Frye for your introduction and for reading your letter, and I also thank the 600 other City Year Members who wrote me with your own stories of service. I hope you won't mind that instead of writing back, I decided to thank you in person! I also want to thank City Year members Stephen Spaloss and Marilyn Concepcion -- it's good to see both of you again. I still have that sweat shirt you gave me, Stephen! [Other Acknowledgments: Sen. Harris Wofford, Eli Segal, Alan Khazei & Michael Brown, founders, City Year; Casey Hunt, City Year member.]

We are living in a very exciting time, when our country and our Congress face many challenges to strengthen our nation for the 21st Century. I believe that citizen service is one of the most important ways we can meet many of those challenges. But before I speak about service, I want to talk to you about an issue before the Congress right now that affects young people most of all: the tobacco bill.

Smoking kills more people every year than AIDS, alcohol, car accidents, murders, suicides, drugs and fires combined -- and 90% of all smokers started smoking before they turned 18. The big tobacco companies know this, and for years they've spent hundreds of millions of dollars on ads to get you to smoke. Their strategy has worked: 3,000 young people start smoking every day ... and 1,000 will die early as a result.

This week, the Senate has the opportunity to pass a strong tobacco bill that will help us keep young people from lighting their first cigarettes. This bill is supported by people in both parties, by public health officials, by parents and by young people themselves.

There are some in the Congress who would do anything to stall, stop, or kill this bill -- but we can't let that happen. We will never have a better chance to save one million lives. So I urge the Senate to put the national interest above narrow interests, and do nothing else until it passes this bill.

And now, I want to talk about another way that we can strengthen our nation for the 21st Century, by helping all Americans to do as you have done: rise to the call of citizen service.

When I first ran for President, I said that I wanted to build an America where service is a way of life ... where each of us reaches our fullness as human beings by being of service to our fellow Americans. And people like you were my inspiration. In 1991, I visited City Year in Boston, and I saw idealism in action. I vowed to build a national service program that gives more Americans the chance to serve, and more young people the opportunity to go to college.

Six years later, we have come a long way to realizing that vision. One of my proudest moments as President came when I signed into law the bill that created AmeriCorps. Since then, AmeriCorps has helped nearly 90,000 young people to serve their communities -- and helped nearly 50,000 young people with college costs. And this year, more than 40,000 AmeriCorps positions are being filled all around the country. And every young person who joins AmeriCorps typically recruits 12 more volunteers.

Because of AmeriCorps, the Senior Corps, which gives older Americans the chance to serve, and Learn and Serve America, which helps tap millions of students' potential for service, more communities are able to rebuild after floods and tornadoes ... more elderly Americans have the home services they need ... more children are being vaccinated against disease ... more young people have mentors to help them stay out of gangs and in school ... and more students are learning to read.

In fact, our America Reads program, which relies on all of our national service programs for tutors, is helping thousands of children to learn to read. Last year, I was pleased that many of our nation's college and university presidents came forward and committed work study students to serve as reading tutors. I am pleased to announce that as of today, 1,000 colleges and universities around the country have joined our efforts.

AmeriCorps works because it puts idealistic and enthusiastic young people like you where the problems are. It doesn't dictate from Washington where AmeriCorps members should serve and what they should do. It lets states and local communities identify their own needs, and design their own programs. And it enables service organizations like Boys and Girls Club of America, Habitat For Humanity, and hundreds of other non-profit and faith-based programs to select and use AmeriCorps members to continue and enlarge the good work they are already doing.

Here in Cleveland, more than 200 citizens of all ages and backgrounds are serving in 14 AmeriCorps programs -- including AmeriCorps members serving with City Year Cleveland -- doing everything from tutoring children to building homes, from organizing neighborhood watch groups to cleaning streams.

AmeriCorps is bringing volunteers to communities in need -- and it is bringing people together. While we have made great strides in the last

50 years, too often in America, people of different racial, ethnic, and economic backgrounds live, work, and go to school in different communities. I launched the Race Initiative to help bridge those gaps. And I believe that service -- working together toward common goals -- can unite us as few other things can.

City Year and AmeriCorps are living proof of that. Beyond the thousands of kids you have tutored, the thousands of rooms you have painted, the thousands of trees you have planted ... beyond the elderly people you have cared for, the people with AIDS you have comforted, the young people you have given encouragement and hope to, beyond all this, your year of service has taught you and reminded us that we really are in this together; we really can be one America.

In community after community, people are coming together through citizen service to meet our most vital needs. Now we in government must come together to create more opportunities for Americans to serve. Today, I call on the Congress to extend national service into the next millennium by reauthorizing AmeriCorps, the Corporation for National Service, and our other service programs.

There is no better evidence of how national service can unite people and political parties than the Presidents Service Summit, which I was pleased to convene last year with Presidents Ford, Carter, and Bush, as well as Nancy Reagan and General Colin Powell. I think everyone who was with us in Philadelphia felt a renewed sense of excitement about citizen service, and how we can mobilize the nation's huge community service network and volunteers to give our nation's youth the five key resources they need to succeed: a caring adult, a safe space, a healthy start, an effective education, and a chance to give back.

Since the Summit, our administration has worked to make this goal a reality through programs like the new Child Health Insurance Program, our child care initiative, and the High Hopes Mentoring program. At the same time, America's Promise, under the leadership of General Colin Powell, has been encouraging corporations, non-profits, and other organizations to meet and increase the commitments they made at the Summit.

But there is more that we can do. Today, I am pleased to announce that the Corporation for National Service will create up to 1,000 new AmeriCorps positions, targeted to pursue the goals of the Presidents Summit. These new positions will add firepower to state and local efforts to ensure that all young people have the resources they need to reach their highest potential.

In all these ways, we are helping to bring about a new sense of idealism, a renewed spirit of citizenship, and a new season of service in America. I know I don't have to tell you that AmeriCorps members make a pledge when they are sworn in. I wish all Americans could take this pledge and make service a part of their lives. I'd like to ask all of you here to take that pledge again with me today:

I will get things done for America, to make our people safer, smarter, and healthier. I will bring Americans together to strengthen our communities. Faced with apathy, I will take action. Faced with conflict, I will seek common ground. Faced with adversity, I will persevere. I will carry this commitment with me, this year and beyond. I am an AmeriCorps member ... and I am going to get things done.

I've heard that City Year members like to tell the story of the

little girl who tried to save a some starfish washed up on the beach, knowing that she couldn't save them all, but still trying to make a difference for a few. That reminds me of something that Robert Kennedy once said: "Few [of us] will have the greatness to bend history itself; but each of us can work to change a small portion of events, and in the total all those acts will be written the history of this generation.

Like the young people of my generation, the young people of your generation are idealistic and full of ideas; you are passionate and compassionate; above all, you are committed to action. And I truly believe that together, through citizen service, you will do more than write the history of your generation. Together, you are already writing the history of our nation in the 21st Century. I admire you and thank each of you for everything you are doing.

Dear Mr. Chairman,

I am writing to express my strong opposition to H.R. 3892. It is essential that we help limited English proficient students become proficient as rapidly as possible so that they are provided a realistic opportunity to succeed academically. As I have said before, I believe that efforts to do this by strengthening the federal bilingual education program should be based on the following principles: (1) a goal for students to learn English within 3 years; (2) accountability for results; (3) local flexibility for determining how best to achieve results; and (4) investments in providing qualified teachers. The President plans to send legislation to Congress fully consistent with these principles next year, when Congress takes up all federal elementary and secondary education programs as a part of the reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965. Because H.R. 3892 is not consistent with these principles, I am strongly opposed to the bill.

In addition, while I have a variety of concerns with the specific provisions of H.R. 3892, the most serious of which include the following:

Educational Issues

The bill is not administratively or programmatically sound. The bill would require States to withdraw funding from local programs and activities under the Act if students in those programs or activities are not mastering English within two years and would also limit any student's participation in programs or activities under the Act to three years. These provisions are vague and seemingly inconsistent, would set artificial and arbitrary deadlines that would prevent classroom teachers and local administrators from doing what is best for each child, are contrary to research on the time needed for children with limited English proficiency to achieve the mastery of English needed to be academically successful, and could require the termination of funding under the Act for many school districts.

Also, the bill would replace the current competitive bilingual education program with a formula-based, State block grant. This block grant approach is problematic because funds would not be targeted, as is now the case, on the school districts with the greatest need for funds and the highest quality programs, reliable data for an equitable allocation formula do not currently exist, and there are no provisions (such as maintenance of effort or supplanting provisions) to prevent States and school districts from simply reducing their financial support for these students because of the availability of Federal funds.

The bill would also eliminate professional development programs from the Act. By eliminating programs that focus on the preparation of teachers, the bill could exacerbate the current shortage of qualified bilingual and English-as-a-second language teachers nationwide.

Civil Rights Issues

H.R. 3892 appears to be based on the misconception that the Department's Office for Civil Rights (OCR) requires that school districts must use the bilingual education technique as the only means to comply with title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964's requirement that alternative language services to teach English be provided to limited English proficient students. Furthermore, while the bill suffers from inexact terminology, and refers to "consent decrees", it apparently seeks to void all existing compliance agreements between OCR, on the one hand, and States and school districts, on the other, if those agreements require those States and school districts to develop, implement, provide, or maintain any form of bilingual education. Similarly, the bill appears to require OCR to publish in the Federal Register all enforcement guidelines and compliance standards that relate to the provision of English language instruction to students with limited English proficiency and to prohibit OCR from entering into any new compliance agreements based on those guidelines or standards until those guidelines and standards, themselves, are approved by a subsequent statute.

Plainly, the purpose of these provisions is to stop OCR's enforcement of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as it applies to the education of language minority children, through the use of voluntary compliance agreements. This is very troubling because the use of compliance agreements is one of OCR's most important (and, by far, the most commonly used) enforcement tools regarding the provision of appropriate educational programs for such children. Title VI, itself, requires OCR to attempt to resolve all compliance problems under it, including those relating to the education of language minority children, through voluntary means before

employing other, more adversarial, means, such as funding terminations--preceded by administrative litigation--and referral to the Department of Justice for court litigation. Thus, these provisions of the bill are fundamentally inconsistent with the statutory enforcement philosophy of Title VI. The bill would also significantly diminish OCR's flexibility in resolving certain Title VI violations, and States and school districts that voluntarily choose to meet their civil rights obligations to students with limited English proficiency would also be denied the ability to demonstrate their compliance through an agreement with OCR. As a consequence, if H.R. 3892 were enacted, OCR enforcement of Title VI as it applies to the education of language minority children would necessarily have to rely far more on litigation than it currently does, and States and school districts would necessarily endure far more costly and time-consuming litigation, not only with the Department of Education and the Department of Justice, but with private parties, because States and school districts would no longer be able to rely on voluntary agreements with OCR as evidence of their compliance with Title VI.

For these reasons, I urge you to postpone making changes in the Bilingual Education Act until the reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act next year, when the Congress and the Administration can work together on constructive improvements to this legislation based on evaluations of the current program.

The Office of Management and Budget advises that there is no objection to the submission of this report from the standpoint of the Administration's program.
