As we in the federal government begin to write in plain language, we will not merely be cutting words and phrases, we will be re-examining the original purpose of our rules and regulations. In this sense -- reviewing and rewriting government communications is reinventing government itself. That was our promise when President Clinton and I took office in 1993, and that is a promise we are fulfilling as we make plain language the rule, rather than the exception, in the federal government."

Today, at a White House event, Vice President Al Gore presents the first Plain Language Award, which was created as part of a presidential initiative that requires all federal agencies to convert their regulations into plain language. Today's award recipient is Marthe ("Marta") Kent, Director of Regulatory Analysis at the Occupational Safety Hazard Agency (OSHA).

MAKING FEDERAL DOCUMENTS EASIER TO UNDERSTAND. On June 1, 1998, President Clinton signed an Executive Memorandum directing all federal government agencies to: (1) write any new document that tells the public how to get a benefit or comply with a requirement in plain language by October 1, 1998; (2) write all new government regulations in plain language by January 1, 1999; and, (3) revise all existing letters and notices into plain language by 2002.

RECOGNIZING ACHIEVEMENT BY FEDERAL AGENCIES. The Administration is committed to making the federal government more responsive to the citizens it serves. At today's ceremony, the Vice President recognizes the efforts of OSHA in drafting a new regulation on "dip tanking", a potentially hazardous metal coating or varnish stripping procedure.

"PLAIN LANGUAGE" HELPS ALL AMERICANS INTERACT BETTER WITH GOVERNMENT. In addition to the work done by OSHA, other agencies have made substantial progress in rewriting their regulations into plain language, including:

- **The Small Business Administration**, which has redrafted its loan applications. These new forms assisted victims of recent storms in California get their applications processed quickly;
- **The Veterans Benefit Administration**, ("VBA") which has simplified the language used in its forms. These new forms caused one customer to remark, upon receiving a letter from the VBA, "this is how the government should write to its customers. I feel like I'm talking to a real person."

REINVENTING GOVERNMENT EFFORTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE. Today's announcement is another example of the Administration's commitment to a better, more efficient federal government. When they took office, the President and Vice President made a commitment to streamlining government and making it work better for all Americans. In March, 1993, the National Partnership for Reinventing Government ("NPR") was formed to address this matter. In the five years since its creation, the NPR has succeeded in:

- **Reducing the size of the federal government** by over 300,000 employees, giving us the smallest federal government since the early 1960s, and, as a percentage of the work force, since before the New Deal.
- **Abolishing over 200 outdated federal government programs.**
- **Eliminating more than 16,000 pages of red tape,** and saving the American people over \$137 billion.

A CONTINUED COMMITMENT TO BETTER GOVERNMENT. The Administration will continue its efforts to make government work better. These changes are more than just cosmetic, the NPR has made the federal government less expensive, less expansive and more efficient. Under the leadership of the President and Vice President, the nature of our national bureaucracy has moved away from complacency and entitlement and toward initiative and innovation.

Poll Suggests Recent Republican Onslaught Against Gays Could Alienate Swing
Voters, According to HRC

WASHINGTON -- Anti-gay comments made by Majority Leader Trent Lott earlier
this month do not reflect the majority opinion in this country says a new
poll released today by the Human Rights Campaign.

"Senator Lott might be scoring points with religious political
activists on the right, but his views don't reflect those of a majority of
American voters who believe in fairness and equality," said David M. Smith,
communications director and senior strategist for the Human Rights
Campaign.

The survey conducted by Lake Snell Perry asked 931 registered
voters: Trent Lott, the Republican Majority Leader, recently made a
statement that said homosexuality is a sin and compared it to alcoholism
and kleptomania. Others say that homosexuality is inherent and not a
choice, and that all Americans should be treated equally and fairly by
lawmakers. Which of these statements comes closer to your own opinion: 24%
said homosexuality is a sin and a disease; 55% said that homosexuality is
inherent and that all Americans should be treated fairly; 14% said neither
or both; 4% said don't know; and 3% refused to answer.

These numbers cut across partisan lines with 62% of democrats, 57%
of independents and 41% of republicans saying that homosexuality is
inherent and gay Americans should be treated equally. 18% of democrats, 21%
of independents, and 35% of republicans saying that homosexuality is a sin.

"Strong majorities of democrat and independent voters and a
plurality of republican voters do not share Lott's views," said Smith, who
oversees polling for HRC. "This poll suggests that there could be a price
to pay with key middle ground voters who object to the Republican
Congressional leadership's stepped up campaign year attacks on gay people,"
cautioned HRC political director Winnie Stachelberg.

The Sanitary Quarantine Administration of the People's Republic of China

The entry of the following objects into China is banned: 1) Animal and plant pathogens (including bacterial and venomous vaccines), pests and other injurious organisms; 2) animals and plants, their products and other quarantine objects from countries and regions infested by infectious diseases; 3) animal carcasses; and 4) soil. Whenever these objects are found at a port of entry, the animal and plant quarantine organ shall reject or destroy them. If any of these objects have to be imported for research or other purposes, applications should be submitted beforehand and approval has to be granted by the state quarantine department. However, daily reports along with bullets are allowed in AND expected by 3:00 pm.

**THE PRESIDENT ANNOUNCES JOINT INSTITUTE FOR FOOD SAFETY
RESEARCH AND LABELING OF FRESH JUICES**
July 4, 1998

In his weekly radio address, the President will announce the publication of a final rule to increase the safety of fruit and vegetable juices. The new regulation, which will take effect in time for this year's apple cider season, would help control illnesses that may come from fresh, unpasteurized juices by requiring labels to alert those most at risk of food-borne illness such as children and the elderly. The rule will require that all packaged fresh juice be labeled with a warning advising consumers of the potential risks of juice that has not been processed to eliminate harmful bacteria. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) estimates that there are up to 48,000 cases of juice-related illness each year. In addition, the President will announce a plan to begin developing a Joint Institute for Food Safety Research that will strategically plan food safety research activities consistent with the President's Food Safety Initiative. Finally, the President will call on Congress to fully fund his Food Safety Initiative, pass vital food safety legislation, and confirm Dr. Jane E. Henney as the new FDA commissioner.

Providing Warning Labels for Consumers. The President will announce a final rule that will require warning labels on juice products that have not been processed to reduce microbial risk. These labels would state that the product has not been treated to eliminate microbes; that the product may contain pathogens known to cause serious illness; and that the risk is greatest for children, the elderly, and people with weakened immune systems. These labels would be required for all packages of untreated, fresh juices but not for juice sold for on-site consumption such as in restaurants. This rule will be effective for this year's apple cider season.

Food Safety Research Institute. The President will direct the Secretaries of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to develop within 90 days a plan for creating a Joint Institute for Food Safety Research that will: (1) strategically plan food safety research activities consistent with the President's Food Safety Initiative; and (2) efficiently coordinate all Federal food safety research, including with the private sector and academia. The goal of this Joint Institute for Food Safety Research will be to develop the means to identify and characterize foodborne hazards more rapidly and accurately, and to develop effective interventions that can be used as appropriate to prevent food contamination at each step from farm to table.

Fund Food Safety Initiative and Pass Food Safety Legislation. The President also will call on Congress to fully fund his \$101 million food safety initiative which provides for a number of initiatives including funding research on the detection of pathogens, enhancing FDA's inspection capabilities, and expanding consumer education initiatives. The President will call on Congress to pass two vital pieces of food safety legislation that will improve the safety of this Nation's food supply. The first piece of legislation will ensure that the FDA halts imports of fruits, vegetables, and other food products from any foreign country with food safety systems that do not provide the same level of protection required for U.S. products. This legislation gives FDA authority that is comparable to USDA's existing authority to prevent the importation of unsafe meat and poultry. The second piece of legislation will give USDA the authority to issue

mandatory recalls and impose civil penalties for unsafe meat and poultry.

Confirm New FDA Commissioner. The President also called on Congress to confirm Dr. Jane E. Henney as the new Commissioner of the FDA. The FDA needs the strong leadership of Dr. Henney to help lead the way to improving food safety and to assure the safety and efficacy of pharmaceutical and biological therapeutics, medical devices, blood products, generic drugs, food additives and cosmetics.

Clinton Administration Accomplishments In Improving Food Safety

The President's announcement builds on a strong record of food safety initiatives, ensuring that Americans eat the safest possible food. The Administration has put into place improved safety standards for meat, poultry, and seafood products, and has begun the process of developing enhanced standards for fruit and vegetable juices. The Administration also has expanded research, education, and surveillance activities throughout the food safety system.

*February, 1998. Administration announces its proposed food safety budget, which requests an approximate \$101 million increase for food safety initiatives.

*May, 1997. Administration announces comprehensive new initiative to improve the safety of nation's food supply --"Food Safety from Farm to Table" -- detailing a \$43 million food safety program, including measures to improve surveillance, outbreak response, education, and research.

*January, 1997. President announces new Early-Warning System to gather critical scientific data to help stop foodborne disease outbreaks quickly and to improve prevention systems further.

**THE PRESIDENT ANNOUNCES FOOD SAFETY
RESEARCH INSTITUTE**
July 1, 1998

In his weekly radio address, the President will announce a plan to develop a Joint Institute for Food Safety Research that will strategically plan food safety research activities consistent with the President's Food Safety Initiative.

Joint Institute for Food Safety Research. The President will direct the Secretaries of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Health and Human Services (HHS) to develop within 90 days a plan for creating a Joint Institute for Food Safety Research that will: (1) strategically plan food safety research activities consistent with the President's Food Safety Initiative; and (2) efficiently coordinate all Federal food safety research, including with the private sector and academia. Two of the principal goals of this Joint Institute for Food Safety Research will be to develop the means to identify and characterize foodborne hazards more rapidly and accurately, and to develop effective interventions that can be used as appropriate to prevent food contamination at each step from farm to table.

Food safety research is critically needed to develop the means to identify and characterize foodborne hazards more rapidly and accurately, to provide information and tools for regulatory programs and enforcement, and to develop effective interventions that can be used as appropriate to prevent food contamination at each step from farm to table. New pathogens appear or grow more resistant, and we need the best science available to better improve food safety.

Currently, there are at least 12 agencies that conduct food safety research. Under the President's food safety initiative, the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy has established an interagency food safety research council to help coordinate Federal research priorities and planning. While this interagency process is improving our coordination, a Joint Institute for Food Safety Research will provide an even stronger and better focused research strategy for food safety.

In addition to improving coordination among the Federal agencies, the Institute will serve as a focal point for coordinating research with states, the private sector, and academia, including public-private research partnerships, as appropriate. The specific structure and operations of the Institute will be outlined in the agencies' report back to the President, and will be based on extensive consultations with all stakeholders.

Good morning. I have just returned from my trip to China, a great and ancient nation that is undergoing historic change. I saw evidence of that change in the faces of people free for the first time to work in jobs of their own choosing ... in the new private businesses that are helping China's economy to grow ... and in the first free elections of local leaders in Chinese villages. I was able to speak directly, not only to the Chinese government, but to the Chinese people, about the importance of freedom and what it means to us in America.

Seeing once again the power of these ideals makes me even prouder to be home in time for Independence Day, when we celebrate the freedom our founders fought for more than 220 years ago.

The Fourth of July is also a time for families and friends to come together, at backyard barbecues and public parks all across America. Today, I want to talk to you about what I am doing to make sure that the food and drinks we serve to our families this Independence Day and every day are safe.

America's food supply is the most bountiful -- and the safest -- in the world. For nearly six years, I have worked hard made food safety a top priority. I signed into law legislation to keep harmful pesticides off our fruits and vegetables. We put in place strong protections to ensure that seafood is safe, and we are modernizing our meat and poultry safety system. Last year, we launched a nationwide early warning system to catch outbreaks of food-borne illness sooner, and prevent them from happening in the first place.

But as much as we have done, we know we must do more to keep our families safe and strong. We know that older people and children are especially vulnerable to contaminated food. That lesson was driven home tragically last year, when apple juice contaminated with a deadly strain of E. coli bacteria caused the death of a 16-month-old child in Washington State, and led to the hospitalization of more than a dozen children.

Today, we are taking two important steps to ensure that our food supply is as safe as we can make it, especially for our children. First, I am pleased to announce a new rule that requires warning labels on all packaged juice that has not been pasteurized or processed to kill harmful bacteria. These warnings will help families make better decisions about the juice they buy -- and they will help us to prevent thousands of Americans from becoming ill every year.

Second, I am directing the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Agriculture to report back to me within 90 days with a plan to create a new national institute for food safety. This institute will bring together the talents of the most esteemed scientists in the government, universities, and business to develop cutting edge food safety techniques.

I am doing what I can to protect our families from contaminated food. But Congress must do its part to ensure the safety of America's food supply. First and most important, it must fully fund my \$101 Million food safety initiative, which among other things will pay for 225 new FDA inspectors and employees, to keep unsafe food away from our borders, out of our stores, and off of our dining room tables. It must give the FDA greater authority to halt imports of fruits, vegetables, and other food products that are produced under safety conditions that do not match our own strict standards. It must give the USDA new authority to impose tough fines on food producers who violate those standards -- and to issue mandatory recalls of unsafe meat and poultry before it reaches our tables. And it should confirm a respected, experienced scientist, Dr. Jane Henney, to lead our food safety efforts as commissioner of the FDA.

Food can never be made entirely safe, and every parent has a responsibility to handle food carefully. But we must do everything we can to protect the food Americans eat and to keep our families strong. We're working to give families a little more peace of mind. That's one way to keep our nation strong as we move into the 21st Century.

**THE PRESIDENT CALLS FOR FULL FUNDING FOR FOOD
SAFETY INITIATIVE AND PASSAGE
OF VITAL FOOD SAFETY LEGISLATION**

July 4, 1998

In his weekly radio address, the President will call for full funding of the food safety initiative in his FY99 budget and for passage of two vital pieces of legislation to improve the safety of this nation's food supply into the 21st Century.

Food Safety Initiative. The President's FY99 budget includes a request for \$101 million to improve the safety of the nation's food supply. These resources will support a variety of measures including: hiring additional FDA inspectors to examine the safety of our nation's fruits and vegetables, both domestic and imported; developing new ways for federal inspectors to detect food-borne illnesses in meat and poultry and determine the source of contamination; improving educational outreach on proper food handling; and expanding our early warning system to help detect and respond to outbreaks of foodborne illnesses.

Congress has so far failed to provide the resources this important initiative requires. **The House-passed Agriculture Appropriations bill has provided only \$16.8 million of the \$95.6 million requested increase for USDA and FDA. The Senate Agriculture Appropriations Committee-passed bill has provided even less resources, only \$2.6 million of the \$95.6 million requested increase, with no additional funding for FDA and \$2.6 million for USDA.**

The President will call on Congress to meet his budget request for these measures critical to the safety of food consumed by America's families.

Enhanced FDA Oversight for Imported Foods. The President will call on Congress to pass food safety legislation, introduced by Senators Milkulski and Kennedy and Reps. Eshoo and Pallone, that gives the FDA greater authority over imported foods. This legislation will ensure that the FDA halts imports of fruits, vegetables, and other food products from any foreign country with food safety systems that do not provide the same level of protection as is required for U.S. products. The legislation also enables the FDA to halt imports from a country or facility that refuses to allow FDA inspections. This legislation gives FDA authority that is comparable to USDA's existing authority to prevent the importation of unsafe meat and poultry.

Mandatory Recall and Civil Penalties for Unsafe Meat and Poultry. The President also will call on Congress to pass the Food Safety Enforcement Enhancement Act, sponsored by Senators Harkin, Daschle, Johnson, and Leahy, which gives USDA the ability to assess civil fines and to order mandatory recalls of unsafe meat and poultry products. Currently, the USDA can respond to food safety violations only by bringing criminal actions or withdrawing inspections; all recalls are done on a voluntary basis and no civil penalties are available. This new legislation will give USDA additional enforcement tools to prevent consumers from ingesting and becoming ill from dangerous meat and poultry.

And it will leverage the resources of the private sector for research projects that will help keep America's food supply the safest in the world.

These are the steps we are taking today to give American families the security they deserve. But Congress must do its part as well. My food safety initiative makes an unprecedented \$101 Million commitment to provide the resources our agencies need to ensure that the food we eat is safe. This is not a Republican or Democratic issue -- it is a matter of our families' health and safety. And I call on the Congress to fully fund this initiative.

I have also proposed two key pieces of legislation to keep our food supply safe and our families healthy. The first would give the FDA greater authority to stop unsafe food at our borders, by requiring it to halt imports of fruits, vegetables, and other food products that are produced under safety conditions that do not match our own strict standards. The second would give the USDA new authority to impose tough fines on food producers who violate those standards -- and to issue mandatory recalls of unsafe meat and poultry before it reaches our tables.

Q. What do racial incidents like the recent occurrence in Jasper say about the success of the Initiative and the state of race in this country?

A. *This first answer is being drafted by the PIR, but they would like our answer to the follow-up.*

Q. What role should the federal government play in addressing these kinds of incidents?

A. The federal government must continue to play a leadership role in stamping out race-based hate and race-based crimes, through strict enforcement of our criminal and civil rights laws (including laws against hate crimes). In addition, all Americans -- not just government officials -- need to continue to speak out against hate, prejudice and senseless violence.

Q. Aren't opportunities in this country limited more by class than by race? Thus, shouldn't class-based policies be our focus?

A. America is moving closer to fulfilling its fundamental promise of equality and the opportunity for advancement for all. I have worked to restore the American dream by expanding the economy, investing in education for all children and making all of our communities safer. However, I recognize that while many of the challenges that we face are linked to issues of class, wealth and income, many others are rooted in racial and ethnic prejudices, both old and new. That is why we must focus both on creating better opportunities for all Americans in education, employment and economic opportunity and on developing and strengthening policies that are targeted to eliminating racial discrimination and racial disparities, such as increased enforcement of our civil rights laws and my initiative to eliminate racial and ethnic health disparities.

Q. How do we get past our racial problems, when the Federal government relies so heavily on the use of racial classifications?

A. Though our progress in bridging the racial divide in this country has been significant over the past 30 years, we don't yet live Dr. King's dream of all Americans being judged by the content of their character, rather than the color of their skin. As long as racial and/or ethnic categories have currency in our democracy -- where we still see strong evidence of race-based housing and employment discrimination and large racial and ethnic disparities in health and college enrollment statistics -- the federal government must be able to both identify where race does play a role and target its efforts to close those gaps.

- Q. The issue of school choice has a racial impact -- more white students are able to afford and attend private schools while more students of color are stuck in low-performing public schools, especially in urban areas. Why not support full school choice (i.e., public, private, and parochial) to allow minority children to move into better schools?**
- A. The best way to ensure that all children have access to a quality education in America is to focus on strengthening the public schools -- where 90% of our children are educated -- and expanding choice within the public education system, such as through charter schools. Vouchers would diminish the country's commitment to public education by siphoning critical dollars from neighborhood public schools that are already short on resources in order to send a few selected students to private schools. They would distract attention from the hard work of reform needed to change failing schools into good schools and good schools into outstanding schools.

Public schools face a host of challenges, but the answer is to put competition, change, excellence, and accountability back into the public school system, not to take limited funds away from it. No child in America -- black or white; rich or poor -- deserves a second class education.

The purpose of the memorandum is to get your guidance on a possible voluntary agreement with the broadcasters on free TV time for candidates. Over the last couple of weeks, we have been in discussions with Norm Ornstein of the American Enterprise Institute (AEI) regarding a voluntary agreement with the broadcasters on free TV time. It has become clear, from our discussions, that what is now achievable is considerably less than when the idea for the President's Commission on the Responsibilities of Broadcasters in the Digital Age (Moonves-Ornstein Commission) was first proposed. The broadcasters have become increasingly entrenched. They no longer view action on free TV time by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) as a real possibility and they are confident that there is a strong anti-free TV time faction in Congress that will prevent any legislative solutions. Finally, they do not feel any public pressure for free TV time.

Our leverage, at this point, lies within the Moonves-Ornstein Commission itself. Ornstein still has a majority of members that he can call upon to support a final report. Ornstein has told the broadcasters that he is prepared to push through a majority report that would include a scathing critique of the broadcasters unless they can reach a compromise. He continues to work towards a consensus proposal, the core of which would be the creation of a new, voluntary "Code of Conduct". Included in the "Code" would be a requirement that broadcasters provide 5 minutes of free air time each night from every broadcaster over the last thirty days of an election. The broadcasters would decide the format and which candidates have access to the air time. However, we have convinced Ornstein that it is important to insure that as many candidates have access to the time and that the time be used for candidate-centered discourse. The five minutes do not have to be aired en bloc, but would have to be broadcast between 5:00 pm and 11:30 pm.

There are three ways to enforce this agreement. First, get the National Association of broadcasters to recognize that stations must meet the "Code" and reprimand those that don't. Second, would be to require disclosure from all broadcasters on how they are meeting their "Code" obligations. Third, the FCC could consider how broadcasters are

fulfilling their "Code" obligations when reviewing requests for license renewals. This last piece would require a rulemaking by the FCC.

It has become evident that the other elements of Ornstein's consensus proposal, and our ideas of free TV time, are not going anywhere. For example, the broadcasters have shown no interest in our idea of providing a minute of free time for every two minutes purchased, even if it were exchanged, as Ornstein has suggested, for a repeal of the "lowest unit rate" requirement. It is also unlikely that broadcasters would agree to implement this agreement before the 1998 election, because they fear Republican retribution.

Without much leverage and, in my view, with few prospects for an improved environment on the broadcasting front anytime soon, I would recommend that we work through Ornstein in trying to secure an agreement on the 30 days piece sometime after the election. In light of the failure of Congress to once again act on campaign finance reform, such an agreement will appear to be a more significant accomplishment than it is in reality. However, there is an argument for holding off on an agreement until we, and the FCC are in a stronger political position.

Please advise.

In addition, Ornstein wants the Gore Commission to recommend to Congress that it repeal the "lowest unit rate" and put in its place a new law which would provide any candidate who buys 2 minutes of air time with an additional minute of air time.

Finally, there is a proposal to create an additional digital, PBS-like channel which would provide air time for public interest broadcasting including candidate info shows, etc.

There are three problems with this proposal. First, the 5 minutes per night of air time will not have any significant impact on reducing the cost of campaign advertising. A candidate will be lucky to get one or two minutes in the final month of free air time. Second, removing the lowest unit rate requirement requires congressional approval. Finally, it is unlikely a large majority of Americans would watch campaign commercials on a PBS-like station.

We are working with Congressional and public interest groups to place pressure on the Gore Commission and to try to change the focus of the debate to one which talks about how television can help reduce the high cost of campaigning. I will keep you posted.

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
