MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE

SUBJECT: JOINT INSTITUTE FOR FOOD SAFETY RESEARCH

Americans enjoy the most bountiful and safe food supply in the world. My Administration has made substantial improvements in food safety, from modernizing meat, seafood, and poultry inspections to creating a high-tech early warning system to detect and control outbreaks of foodborne illness.

Our success has been built on two guiding principles: (1) engaging all concerned parties, including consumers, farmers, industry, and academia, in an open and honest dialogue about improving food safety; and (2) grounding our efforts in the best science available. We have made good progress, but more can be done to prevent the many foodborne illnesses that still occur in our country.

As we look to the future of food safety, increasingly science and technology are playing a central role. An expanded food safety research agenda is essential to continued improvements in the safety of America's food. We need new tools to more quickly detect dangerous pathogens, like E. coli O157:H7 and campylobacter, and we need better interventions that reduce the risk of contamination during food production.

Food safety research is a critical piece of my Fiscal Year 1999 food safety initiative. Unfortunately, Congress has not yet fully funded the initiative. We will continue to work with Congress to invest more resources in this effort so vitally important to America's families and to the public health. In order to help improve the safety of our Nation's food supply, I also have proposed two critical pieces of legislation to bring our food safety system into the 21st century. First, my Administration has proposed legislation that would give the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) greater authority over imported foods. This legislation will ensure that the FDA halts imports of fruits, vegetables, and other food products that do not meet U.S. food safety requirements or that do not provide the same level of protection as is required for U.S. products. This legislation gives FDA authority that is similar to the authority that the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) already has to prevent the importation of unsafe meat and poultry. In addition, we have proposed legislation that would give USDA the authority to impose civil penalties for violations of meat and poultry regulations and the authority to issue mandatory recalls to remove unsafe meat and poultry from the marketplace. I urge Congress to pass both these bills in order to protect our Nation's families and to improve the safety of our Nation's food supply.

In this time of limited budgets, however, we also need to make every effort to maximize our resources, including coordinating our research efforts across the Federal government and in the private sector. Our interagency food safety research working group is a strong start, but it is one that we must build on.

Today, I hereby direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services and the Secretary of Agriculture to report back to me within 90 days on the creation of a Joint Institute for Food Safety Research that will: (1) develop a strategic plan for conducting food safety research activities consistent with the President's Food Safety Initiative; and (2) efficiently coordinate all Federal food safety research, including with the private sector and academia. This Institute should serve as the focal point for coordinating food safety research, under the leadership of the Secretaries of HHS and USDA, across the Federal government and should work to leverage resources with the private sector, including the use of public-private partnerships, or other appropriate mechanisms. This plan should build upon my Interagency Food Safety Initiative and should make provisions for cooperation and consultation with consumers, producers, industry, and academia as well as other Federal and state research and public health agencies.

You should call upon the Environmental Protection Agency, the National Partnership for Reinventing Government, and the Office of Science and Technology Policy, and other agencies as appropriate to provide you with assistance in achieving this goal. These steps, taken together and in coordination with our pending legislation, will ensure to the fullest extent possible the safety of food for all of America's families. I appreciate your commitment to improving food safety, and I look forward to your continuing leadership in developing this Joint Institute for Food Safety Research.

Families USA Report on Low-Income Medicare Beneficiaries. Early next week, Families USA will be releasing a new report that shows that over 3 million low-income Medicare beneficiaries are eligible but not enrolled in the Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB) program.

The QMB program pays Medicare copayments and deductibles for beneficiaries below 100 percent of poverty and pays premiums for all Medicare beneficiaries below 135 percent of poverty (you expanded this protection in last year's Balanced Budget Act from 120 and 135 percent of poverty). However, many beneficiaries are not aware of these premium protections, and others have difficulty filling out long applications or getting to offices to apply in person. In response, we are prepared for the Administration to announce a multi-faceted effort by SSA and HCFA to enroll eligible beneficiaries in this program, including: (1) encouraging simple mail-in applications; (2) posting information about this program in SSA offices; (3) educating eligible beneficiaries by including information in the pamphlets going to all 38 million Medicare beneficiaries this fall, and in the annual cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) notices received by 32 million Social Security beneficiaries age 65 and older; and (4) creating a new task force to find other ways to enroll eligible beneficiaries. We anticipate that this report will get a good deal of coverage because it is focused on the elderly and because it is being released by a group supportive of the Administration's agenda. We are working closely with Families USA to coordinate the rollout of this initiative.

Congressional Budget Office's Cost Estimates of Patients' Bill of Rights. Late next week the Congressional Budget Office is expected to release estimates on the Dingell-Ganske-Kennedy patients' bill of rights legislation. We anticipate that the premiums will be projected to increase by about 4 percent for the average employee, which amounts to about \$7 a month (a cost that will be split between employers and employees). We are working on a positive roll-out strategy for this estimate to buttress our claim that the benefits of any such legislation are more than worth the modest costs. Opponents of this legislation will try and use this information to say that the patients' bill of rights will increase health care costs and the number of uninsured. Assuming we are successful at portraying these costs as moderate and reasonable or at least achieve a draw, the primary outstanding issue on the patients' bill of legislation is the issue of enforcement. We will be sending you a memo on options as to how best to position the Administration on this issue.

HIPAA Enforcement Event. Next Tuesday, you are scheduled to participate in an event to take action against insurers who are circumventing the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). Earlier this year, we received a number of troubling reports that insurers were giving financial incentives to agents to avoid or delay enrolling Americans with pre-existing conditions, who were eligible for coverage under HIPAA. Although the number of reports has declined since you directed HCFA to send guidance to insurers in March that this is inconsistent with the intent of the law, some still believe this is still a problem. To help ensure compliance, you will be issuing an Executive Memorandum directing the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) to take all appropriate action -- up to and including termination of a participating health plan from the Federal Employees Health Benefit Program (FEHBP) -- if the agency determines that a plan is engaging in insurance practices that are inconsistent with the letter and spirit of HIPAA. FEHBP, which contracts with 350 carriers and has 9 million enrollees, will also require health plans to certify that they are abiding by the HIPAA law before

they can participate in the program. You will also be directing the Health Care Financing Administration to report any abuses they learn of to OPM and the National Association of Insurance Commissioners has agreed to work collaboratively OPM by reporting any violations to the agency. This action is intended to send a strong message that we are serious about giving this law real meaning for the millions of vulnerable Americans it protects.

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**PRESIDENT CLINTON ISSUES EXECUTIVE MEMORANDUM DIRECTING STRONG
ACTIONS AGAINST PLANS THAT VIOLATE KASSEBAUM-KENNEDY PROTECTIONS**
July 7, 1998

Today, on the one year anniversary of the implementation of the Kassebaum-Kennedy legislation, the President issued an Executive Memorandum directing the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) to take all actions necessary, up to and including termination, against health insurers now participating in the Federal Employees Health Benefit Plan (FEHBP) that violate the protections afforded by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA).

The President also announced that the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) and the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) will forward any reports of violation immediately to OPM, allowing the agency to quickly stop these abuses. These new directives underscore the President's strong commitment to ensuring health plans abide by the HIPAA law and build on actions the President took earlier this year.

There Have Been Reports That Some Health Insurers Are Circumventing HIPAA Protections. Some insurers are reportedly giving insurance agents incentives to avoid enrolling qualified Americans with pre-existing conditions, who are guaranteed access to coverage under HIPAA. Agents also have been given incentives to delay processing applications submitted by HIPAA-eligible individuals or small groups in order ensure that applicants have a sufficient break in coverage to lose eligibility for HIPAA protections. Such actions are inconsistent with the letter and the spirit of the 1996 law. Today, the President took strong action against insurers who violate the HIPAA protections. Specifically, he:

- **Directed OPM to Ensure Health Plans Are In Compliance With HIPAA to Participate in FEHBP.** In order to be eligible to participate in the FEHBP, insurance carriers subject to HIPAA will have to certify in writing to OPM that they are providing access to health insurance consistent with the HIPAA protections.
- **Directed OPM to Take Action, Up To and Including Termination, of Health Plans That Delay or Deny Coverage to Americans Eligible Under HIPAA.** To ensure compliance with HIPAA, the President directed the OPM to take all appropriate action -- up to and including termination of a participating health plans from FEHBP. This action will help ensure that the 350 participating carriers in the FEHB program, who serve 9 million enrollees, are providing access to health insurance to Americans eligible under the important 1996 law.
- **Directed HCFA to Report Any Abuses to OPM.** The President also directed HCFA to report to OPM immediately any actions taken by an insurer or insurer representative that in any way precludes or inhibits access to the insurance protections provided under HIPAA. The President noted that any such referral would, of course, not in any way alter the need for or responsibility to utilize any and all enforcement tools at HCFA's disposal.

- **Announced Collaboration With the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) to Help Stop Abuses.** The NAIC has also committed to help identify and report to OPM any insurers they uncover who are denying or delaying providing individuals the HIPAA protections.
- **Requested HHS and Labor Departments report back within six months on the successes and shortcomings of HIPAA.** This report would include specific legislative or regulatory recommendations that would be necessary to further strengthen this law.

These Actions Build on the President's Commitment to Assuring That HIPAA Provides Millions of Americans Access to Health Insurance.

- **Directed HHS to Issue Strong Warnings Regarding Unacceptable Insurance Practices.** Earlier this year, when the President first learned of efforts to circumvent the HIPAA law, he asked the Department of Health and Human Services to take appropriate actions to stop health plans and their agents to cease and desist all such harmful and likely unlawful practices. HCFA responded by immediately releasing a strong guidance bulletin on March 18th to virtually every insurer in the nation. This bulletin advised insurers that delaying or denying health care coverage to Americans eligible for insurance under HIPAA was unlawful and inappropriate and underscored the Federal Government's commitment to ensure compliance. Since this time, there have been fewer reports of abuse. However, there continue to be reports that some insurers are still violating this law.
- **Fought Hard for Kassebaum-Kennedy Insurance Reforms in 1996.** The HIPAA law helps individuals keep health insurance when they change jobs, guaranteed renewability of coverage, and guaranteed access to health insurance for small businesses. This act includes several other high priority Clinton Administration health initiatives, including:
 - **Eliminating the discriminatory tax treatment of the self-employed.** Increased the tax deduction from 30 percent to 80 percent for the approximately 10 million Americans who are self-employed. The President also signed into law a provision to phase it in to 100 percent in the Balanced Budget Act of 1997.
 - **Strengthening efforts to combat health care fraud, waste, and abuse.** The Kassebaum-Kennedy law created a new stable source of funding to fight fraud and abuse that is coordinated by the HHS Office of the Inspector General and the Department of Justice. In the first year alone, this effort saved Medicare \$1 billion.
 - **Providing consumer protections and tax incentives for private long-term care insurance.** Making long-term care more affordable by guaranteeing that employer sponsored long-term care insurance will receive the same tax treatment as health insurance and implemented new consumer protections to assure that any tax favored product meets basic consumer and quality standards.

Utah Opens a New Front in the War Against Teen
Smoking

SALT LAKE CITY -- He was a kid who lived in a group home - very structured, very strict. So one night he slipped out. When he climbed back in the window at 3 a.m., they were waiting for him. He told the judge that he just wanted to get out for a smoke with his buddies.

"With some kids, smoking is like a right of passage," says Chris Decker, the guardian who worked with the boy in juvenile court. "It's something they can control, and gives them a feeling of freedom."

Normally, in a court system flushed with cases of drug dealing and violent crime, such offenders would get a \$25 fine or a short stint in a stop-smoking program. But under a pioneering new court to open this fall in Utah, teen smokers will get more attention - and harsher penalties.

Utah's Tobacco Court is the first of its kind in the nation. Coming at a time when President Clinton has put teen smoking high on the nation's agenda, it is an experiment in how best to reform young violators. And it could hold valuable lessons for other states seeking to cut rising youth-smoking rates.

The creation of Joseph Anderson, a judge in Utah's Third District, the court has been on the drawing board for the past 2-1/2 years. Judge Anderson found that he was one of a few juvenile judges trying to deal with smoking infractions, which most saw as insignificant compared with other juvenile problems.

"They said there are just too many of them.... 'We don't have the resources,' " says Anderson, whose Third District handles half of the state's 10,000 smoking violations each year. "Both in terms of health problems and legal problems, we needed to do something."

Indeed, proponents of the new court point out that, according to the US surgeon general, cocaine use is 30 times more likely among smokers than nonsmokers. Others say smoking is also a strong indicator of deep-seated problems.

"You tend to see kids smoking who don't have much else in their lives," says Mr. Decker.

For the Utah courts, other addictions and problems have been higher priority. Only reluctantly did the Utah Supreme Court let Anderson experiment with his program for a year. The state court gave him \$10,000 to start, and he eked out \$20,000 more from other contributors including the state attorney general and the state health department. That's enough to get the program up and running.

Tobacco Court will work out of small claims court with volunteer, pro-tem judges. They will have the authority to levy fines as much as \$250, require community service, and send youths to smoking-education programs. If the teens thumb their noses at the law, they can have their driving privileges suspended.

"Our emphasis is to push them toward education," says Anderson. Tobacco Court will use a program called STTOP - Stop Teen Tobacco - one of a few substance-abuse programs that concentrates exclusively on smoking. The program reinforces good behavior through activities and is heavily reliant on parental participation, says coordinator Raymond Christy.

That was a problem for Anderson when he sentenced the boy from the group home. The courts had already terminated the boy's family's parental rights. Instead, Anderson sent the boy to the program with a worker from the home.

"Smoking isn't a simple problem," says Decker. "When you look at the different reasons kids smoke - their home life, emotional needs, and other situations ... it's hard to know which incentives and consequences you use."

Now, Tobacco Court has a year to prove that it can mete out the right incentives and consequences.

This Statement of Administration Policy provides the Administration's views on S. 2168, the Departments of Veterans Affairs

and Housing and Urban Development, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Bill, FY 1999, as reported by the Senate Appropriations Committee. Your consideration of the Administration's views would be appreciated.

The Administration appreciates efforts by the Committee to accommodate the President's priorities within the 302(b) allocation. However, the allocation is simply insufficient to make the necessary investments in programs funded by this bill. As a result, a variety of critical programs are underfunded, as discussed below.

The only way to achieve the appropriate investment level is to offset discretionary spending by using savings in other areas. The President's FY 1999 Budget proposes levels of discretionary spending for FY 1999 that conform to the Bipartisan Budget Agreement by making savings in mandatory and other programs available to help finance this spending. In the recently enacted Transportation Equity Act, Congress -- on a broad, bipartisan basis -- took similar action in approving funding for surface transportation programs paid for with mandatory offsets. The Committee has used part of one such offset in its version of the bill, and we encourage the Congress to take advantage of such additional offsets.

Below is a discussion of our specific concerns with the Committee-reported bill. We look forward to working with you to resolve these concerns as the bill moves forward.

Department of Housing and Urban Development

The Administration is deeply concerned about the funding levels provided for key programs within the Department of Housing and Urban Development, particularly for welfare-to-work vouchers and other programs such as the Community Empowerment Fund that would expand job opportunities.

The Administration is very disappointed by the Committee's decision to fund only 7,000 incremental vouchers through a \$40 million "Self-Sufficiency" housing vouchers pilot program that earmarks funds for seven specified cities. In light of recent studies that show historically high unmet housing need among very low-income Americans, however, the Administration believes it is critical for the Congress to fund the entire 50,000 welfare-to-work housing vouchers provided for in the President's request. Moreover, these welfare-to-work vouchers should be made available in a way that ensures vouchers are distributed to places with both the greatest need and the most effective program design. Full funding for welfare-to-work housing vouchers will support implementation of welfare reform by assisting those welfare recipients who need housing assistance to get or keep a job.

The Administration encourages the Congress to fund fully the President's request for \$400 million for a Community Empowerment Fund to generate jobs in distressed communities. The Committee provides only \$85 million as a set-aside within the existing CDBG program, with over 75 percent earmarked for specific projects.

The Administration appreciates the Committee's decision to fund a number of programs at the levels requested and to renew all expiring Section 8 contracts. Likewise, we appreciate the Committee's decision to increase funding for Homeless Assistance Grants above FY 1998 levels. We would strongly oppose, however, a rigid set-aside for permanent housing, which would reduce the ability of each local entity to adopt the most effective response to the homeless challenge unique to that area. Further, the Administration is disappointed by the absence of funding for

Regional Opportunity Counseling, a voluntary effort to expand the housing and employment opportunities available to low-income families. We urge the Senate to provide additional resources for the Fair Housing Initiatives Program in order to reduce housing discrimination that remains all too common. The Administration encourages the Senate to fund fully a number of other areas -- Brownfields, Regional Connections, Office of Lead Hazard Control, and the Partnership for Advancing Technologies in Housing (PATH) Initiative.

The Administration appreciates the Committee's decision to raise the limit on FHA single-family loans. The Administration urges the Congress to provide even greater homeownership opportunities by increasing FHA's loan limit to the GSE "conforming" limit. In addition, the Administration urges the Congress to adopt the Administration's proposal to reform HUD's single-family property disposition program, which would produce substantial savings by improving the efficiency of FHA's property disposition processes.

Finally, the Administration is concerned about the Committee's decision not to fund \$304 million in FHA administrative expenses. Appropriated funds are FHA's only source for contracting for vital management services for its insurance funds.

Environmental Protection Agency

The Administration has several major concerns with the Committee's mark for the Environmental Protection Agency. In particular, the Administration strongly objects to the action of the Committee to reallocate approximately \$600 million of funds that were already agreed to last year to accelerate Superfund cleanups. This reduction would delay cleanups at sites nationwide and needlessly jeopardize public health. The Administration urges the Senate to restore Superfund to the levels agreed to last year for FY 1999 and to delete restrictive language preventing use of brownfields funding for revolving loan funds.

While the Administration appreciates the increases provided for the Clean Water Action Plan, we urge the Senate to provide the President's full request to prevent pollution run-off and protect public health. In addition, the Administration strongly urges the Congress to restore the \$50 million request to help improve water quality in Boston Harbor and prevent beach closings.

The Administration strongly opposes the Committee's \$91 million reduction in EPA funding for the Climate Change Technology Initiative. This high-priority program should be fully funded to cut energy usage, save consumers money, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. We will work with the Congress to restore requested funding as the bill moves forward. The Administration is also concerned about the report language relating to this initiative, which is so broad that it could be interpreted to preclude or terminate many on-going activities that are already authorized by existing laws and treaties. In addition, the Administration objects to the report language requiring a detailed Government Performance and Results Act (GPRA) plan relating to Climate Change activities. Such a plan is premature and appears to require us to set goals for implementing the Kyoto Protocol before it has been ratified by the Senate.

The Administration is also concerned with the large number of unrequested, earmarked projects in the Committee mark for EPA, particularly when the Committee has reduced several other high-priority Administration initiatives, including right-to-know programs, Montreal

Protocol, GLOBE, and Mexican border wastewater treatment funding.

Council on Environmental Quality

The Administration appreciates the modest increase over the FY 1998 level provided for the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ). However, we strongly believe that in order to allow CEQ to carry out its environmental mission and reinvention efforts, the full requested level should be provided, and language prohibiting use of detailees should be deleted.

Corporation for National and Community Service

The Administration is deeply concerned that freezing funding for the Corporation for National and Community Service at the FY 1998 level, \$74 million below the President's request, will not allow the Corporation to finance nearly 5,000 AmeriCorps tutors targeted to recruit, organize, and manage more than 60,000 volunteers as part of America Reads, the Administration's effort to raise student literacy through the use of tutors to supplement the school day activities.

Community Development Financial Institutions Fund

The Administration strongly opposes the Committee's decision to reduce the request for the Community Development Financial Institutions Fund by \$70 million. This cut would severely reduce the Fund's ability to leverage investments, loans, and financial services in the country's most distressed communities.

Neighborhood Reinvestment Corporation

The Administration is disappointed by the Committee's decision not to fund the full request for the Neighborhood Reinvestment Corporation (NRC). The NRC has a proven successful record of leveraging private sector resources to promote homeownership and helping to strengthen America's communities. The Administration urges the Senate to fully fund the President's request of \$90 million, which includes a \$25 million homeownership initiative that seeks to create 10,000 new homeowners through FY 2000.

National Aeronautics and Space Administration

The Administration is pleased that the Committee has fully funded the President's request for NASA. We hope that it is possible to reach an accommodation on overall funding in the bill that can satisfy both the Administration's unfunded priorities in other agencies and the Committee's interest in providing increased funding for NASA. As indicated above, the Administration looks forward to working with Congress to identify mandatory and other program savings so that increases in spending, such as the additional spending for NASA, is possible.

We are concerned by the increased number of appropriation accounts for Space Station and other activities. The redirection of key resources to implement this change could threaten NASA's Year 2000 conversion effort and pose an audit risk. The Administration is prepared to work with the Congress to control development costs of the International Space Station better, while also providing the flexibility necessary to deal with unanticipated requirements. The Administration is also concerned about the very large number of unrequested, site-specific earmarks, which would have the effect of circumventing the competitive, peer review

process.

Federal Emergency Management Agency

The Administration appreciates the level of funding provided by the Committee for the Federal Emergency Management Agency. However, we believe that the \$25 million reduction to the President's request for pre-disaster mitigation grants is shortsighted. These grants would help reduce the costs of future disasters by leveraging local and private-sector support for enhanced mitigation efforts at the State and community level. We urge the Senate to fund fully the President's request for this important initiative. In addition, we urge the Senate to approve the President's recent request for funding to help States and communities prepare for potential terrorist incidents involving chemical and/or biological weapons.

National Science Foundation

Given the budget constraints facing the Committee, the Administration appreciates the effort to provide a \$215 million increase over the FY 1998 level for the National Science Foundation (NSF). However, the Administration is concerned that the elimination of funding for the proposed Polar Cap Observatory (PCO) would hamper scientists' further understanding of the Earth's upper atmosphere as well as the study of conditions in the space environment that can influence the performance and reliability of satellites, communications, navigation, and electric power distribution systems. The Administration is firmly committed to NSF's basic research function, which not only promotes scientific advancement but also contributes to economic development. We strongly urge the Senate to provide the full increase requested for NSF. The Administration is also concerned about the number and specificity of earmarks related to NSF, which come dangerously close to infringing on the merit-based review and decision-making process.

Administrative Provision

Finally, the Administration supports the Committee's goal of ensuring a safe and environmentally sound ship scrapping policy. The specific requirements in the bill, however, raise implementation issues such as EPA's certification of the enforcement of other countries' laws. The Administration believes that a starting point to develop a more workable approach to achieve these protection aims would be to build on the recommendations of the Interagency Ship Scrapping Review Panel. The Administration is committed to working with Congress to resolve these concerns and to finding mutually acceptable solutions that achieve these important objectives.

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**PRESIDENT CLINTON ISSUES EXECUTIVE MEMORANDUM DIRECTING STRONG
ACTIONS AGAINST PLANS THAT VIOLATE KASSEBAUM-KENNEDY PROTECTIONS**
July 7, 1998

Today, on the one year anniversary of the implementation of the Kassebaum-Kennedy legislation, the President issued an Executive Memorandum directing the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) to take all actions necessary, up to and including termination, against health insurers now participating in the Federal Employees Health Benefit Plan (FEHBP) that violate the protections afforded by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA).

The President also announced that the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) and the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) will forward any reports of violation immediately to OPM, allowing the agency to quickly stop these abuses. These new directives underscore the President's strong commitment to ensuring health plans abide by the HIPAA law and build on actions the President took earlier this year.

There Have Been Reports That Some Health Insurers Are Circumventing HIPAA Protections. Some insurers are reportedly giving insurance agents incentives to avoid enrolling qualified Americans with pre-existing conditions, who are guaranteed access to coverage under HIPAA. Agents also have been given incentives to delay processing applications submitted by HIPAA-eligible individuals or small groups in order ensure that applicants have a sufficient break in coverage to lose eligibility for HIPAA protections. Such actions are inconsistent with the letter and the spirit of the 1996 law. Today, the President took strong action against insurers who violate the HIPAA protections. Specifically, he:

- **Directed OPM to Ensure Health Plans Are In Compliance With HIPAA to Participate in FEHBP.** In order to be eligible to participate in the FEHBP, insurance carriers subject to HIPAA will have to certify in writing to OPM that they are providing access to health insurance consistent with the HIPAA protections.
- **Directed OPM to Take Action, Up To and Including Termination, of Health Plans That Delay or Deny Coverage to Americans Eligible Under HIPAA.** To ensure compliance with HIPAA, the President directed the OPM to take all appropriate action -- up to and including termination of a participating health plans from FEHBP. This action will help ensure that the 350 participating carriers in the FEHB program, who serve 9 million enrollees, are providing access to health insurance to Americans eligible under the important 1996 law.
- **Directed HCFA to Report Any Abuses to OPM.** The President also directed HCFA to report to OPM immediately any actions taken by an insurer or insurer representative that in any way precludes or inhibits access to the insurance protections provided under HIPAA. The President noted that any such referral would, of course, not in any way alter the need for or responsibility to utilize any and all enforcement tools at HCFA's disposal.

- **Announced Collaboration With the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) to Help Stop Abuses.** The NAIC has also committed to help identify and report to OPM any insurers they uncover who are denying or delaying providing individuals the HIPAA protections.
- **Requested HHS and Labor Departments report back within six months on the successes and shortcomings of HIPAA.** This report would include specific legislative or regulatory recommendations that would be necessary to further strengthen this law.

These Actions Build on the President's Commitment to Assuring That HIPAA Provides Millions of Americans Access to Health Insurance.

- **Directed HHS to Issue Strong Warnings Regarding Unacceptable Insurance Practices.** Earlier this year, when the President first learned of efforts to circumvent the HIPAA law, he asked the Department of Health and Human Services to take appropriate actions to stop health plans and their agents to cease and desist all such harmful and likely unlawful practices. HCFA responded by immediately releasing a strong guidance bulletin on March 18th to virtually every insurer in the nation. This bulletin advised insurers that delaying or denying health care coverage to Americans eligible for insurance under HIPAA was unlawful and inappropriate and underscored the Federal Government's commitment to ensure compliance. Since this time, there have been fewer reports of abuse. However, there continue to be reports that some insurers are still violating this law.
- **Fought Hard for Kassebaum-Kennedy Insurance Reforms in 1996.** The HIPAA law helps individuals keep health insurance when they change jobs, guaranteed renewability of coverage, and guaranteed access to health insurance for small businesses. This act includes several other high priority Clinton Administration health initiatives, including:
 - **Eliminating the discriminatory tax treatment of the self-employed.** Increased the tax deduction from 30 percent to 80 percent for the approximately 10 million Americans who are self-employed. The President also signed into law a provision to phase it in to 100 percent in the Balanced Budget Act of 1997.
 - **Strengthening efforts to combat health care fraud, waste, and abuse.** The Kassebaum-Kennedy law created a new stable source of funding to fight fraud and abuse that is coordinated by the HHS Office of the Inspector General and the Department of Justice. In the first year alone, this effort saved Medicare \$1 billion.
 - **Providing consumer protections and tax incentives for private long-term care insurance.** Making long-term care more affordable by guaranteeing that employer sponsored long-term care insurance will receive the same tax treatment as health insurance and implemented new consumer protections to assure that any tax favored product meets basic consumer and quality standards.

Retailers Back Teenage Id Card

Shopkeepers are backing a national identity card for teenagers in a drive to stamp out under-age purchase of alcohol, cigarettes, scratch cards, fireworks, videos and solvents.

The Citizen Card, which would bear a photograph and a hologram, would be a voluntary scheme available to youngsters aged 12 and above.

It will start at age 12 because that is the first threshold when a child needs to prove they are old enough to see 12-certificate films and videos.

Other important ages are: 14 when a teenager can enter a pub with by an adult and have a soft drink; 15 when further films and videos can be seen; 16 when tobacco and scratch cards can be bought, some fruit machines used, and youngsters can drink beer, cider and (in Scotland only) wine with a meal in a pub; 18 when alcohol and fireworks can be bought and young people can enter betting shops, bingo halls and some nightclubs, and 21, the minimum age for many nightclubs.

Youngsters would have to pay ?5 to buy the card, but, if successful, it could end up being used by up to seven million people.

The card would protect retailers by allowing them to demand sight of the card, making it easier for them to stay within the law by only selling to children who are old enough.

The scheme is, reportedly, being considered by 16 trade associations, the National Lottery and Railtrack. It also has the support of the Tobacco Manufacturers Association and the National Federation of Retail Newsagents.

John Carlisle, public affairs director of the Tobacco Manufacturers Association, said: "We are certainly one of the card's supporters.

"It is absolutely essential with the ever growing problem of under age abuse of substances, which includes tobacco, alcohol and glue, and has our full support.

"If the Government support us that would be the icing on the cake. I'm confident that the Government will support us," he said.

Today, President Clinton announced a new outreach campaign to help millions of low-income senior citizens and people with disabilities receive assistance in paying Medicare premiums. The President has requested that the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the Social Security Administration (SSA) launch a multi-faceted effort to enroll eligible Medicare beneficiaries in the Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB) program and related programs that pay for Medicare premiums and, for eligible recipients, copayments and deductibles.

THE NEED TO INFORM MEDICARE BENEFICIARIES OF THEIR OPTIONS. A study by Families USA reports that over 3 million low-income Medicare beneficiaries are not enrolled in either the Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB) program or related programs that pay Medicare premiums and, for eligible recipients, copayments and deductibles. These assistance programs were expanded in last year's Balanced Budget Act. However, many eligible beneficiaries are not aware of these cost-sharing protections and others have difficulty accessing this critically needed assistance.

A PRESIDENTIAL PLAN TO EDUCATE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS. The President is calling on the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the Social Security Administration (SSA) to launch a multi-faceted effort to enroll eligible Medicare beneficiaries in QMB and related programs. HHS and SSA will make unprecedented efforts to ensure that beneficiaries know about these programs, including:

- **Sending Written Information To All 38 Million Medicare Beneficiaries** about this vital program;
- **Informing Every New Medicare Beneficiary** about this program in the initial enrollment package they receive;
- **Including Information Describing This Program And An Eligibility Screening Worksheet** on the new Medicare Web Site, www.Medicare.gov;
- **Sending Program Information To More Than 36 Million Individuals** receiving Social Security benefits in the annual cost-of-living adjustment notices distributed in the fall.
- **Distributing 450,000 Pamphlets** and placing posters in SSA's 1,300 field offices;
- **Targeting Eligible Beneficiaries** through direct mailings. SSA will identify, and the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) will send out, a letter to those most likely to be eligible for this program.

WORKING WITH STATES AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR TO DEVELOP ENROLLMENT STRATEGIES. This initiative will bring together federal and state agencies and the private sector to enroll eligible recipients. These efforts include:

- **Encouraging The Use Of A Simplified Application Process.** The HCFA will send a letter to State Medicaid agencies that includes a model, simplified application as well as examples of successful outreach and enrollment programs. HCFA will encourage states to adopt simple, user-friendly procedures such as a mail-in application.
- **Creating A Federal-State-Consumer Advocate Task Force** to develop new strategies to enroll eligible beneficiaries. HHS, SSA, the National Governor's Association and advocates of the elderly and people with disabilities will collaborate to identify and implement strategies to educate beneficiaries about this program and make enrollment easier.
- **Providing The State Insurance Counseling And Assistance Programs (ICAs) With Material** to assist beneficiaries in enrolling in the premium assistance program.

BUILDING ON A COMMITMENT TO THOSE IN NEED. Today's announcement builds on President Clinton's ongoing commitment to identifying and enrolling vulnerable, low income Americans in this important program. Already, HCFA is providing training material on identifying and assisting potential beneficiaries to health care providers, advocates, and States. SSA has included information on programs in SSA pamphlets and handouts and conducted training for staff who interact with beneficiaries. These efforts, along with today's initiatives, are helping to ensure that those in need are given the protections and coverage they deserve.
