Per your request, here's a quick and dirty on the Rs' drug bills that were included in the final omnibus approps bill:

1. ONDCP Reauthorization. Reauthorizes ONDCP for 5 years and generally mirrors Administration's proposal. Some differences: includes non-binding targets to reduce overall drug use, availability, purity and crime by between 50 and 80%; establishes President's Drug Policy Council (DPC not specifically included, but can be added by President); and creates a Parents Advisory Council on Drug Abuse that reports to ONDCP.

2. Drug Demand Reduction Act. Authorizes Drug-Free Media Campaign at current funding levels (\$195 million) through 2002, and establishes 2-year, \$50 million program for prison and jail-based drug treatment. On a lesser note; provides for state education officers to establish a standard of quality for drug and other prevention programs; seeks to promote the development and approval of anti-addiction medications; establishes commission to improve the efforts of health professionals in reducing substance abuse; and calls for a report on how to streamline federal drug treatment and prevention programs.

3. Western Hemisphere Drug Elimination Act. Authorizes about \$2.5 billion in funds for a multitude of interdiction and international counterdrug programs, including -- increased radar coverage, Coast Guard equipment and resources, crop eradication programs, and alternative crop development support and research.

4. Miscellaneous Bills. Three small bills were also attached, including: (1) a Sense of the Congress resolution condemning the legalization of marijuana for medicinal purposes; (2) increased penalties for methamphetamine trafficking (equalizes w/current crack penalties by dropping triggers for 5 and 10-year mandatory minimums from 10 and 100 grams...to 5 and 50 grams); and (3) authorizes 2-year, \$20 million demonstration program for SBA to help small business adopt drug-free workplace policies.

5. Drug Supplemental Appropriations. Finally, the omnibus includes \$650 million in emergency drug appropriations -- most of which funds components of the Western Hemisphere Drug Elimination Act (Coast Guard, DEA intelligence, international programs, crop support research). Some exceptions include our requests for X-ray machines for Customs, improved

border barriers, a "point of entry" integrity initiative, \$1.2 million for ONDCP staff and \$2 million for a Drug Court Institute.

The Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (IRCA) established a scheme under which certain aliens unlawfully present in the United States could apply for permanent residence. An applicant must have resided continuously in the United States in an unlawful status since at least January 1, 1982; must have been physically present in the United States continuously since November 6, 1986 (IRCA's enactment date); and must have been otherwise admissible as an immigrant. In order to be eligible for this benefit, the applicant must have applied during the 12-month period beginning on May 5, 1987.

On May 1, 1987, INS promulgated several regulations related to eligibility that were later found by the courts to be inconsistent with the statute. Two of the regulations dealt with an alien's travel outside the U.S. during the application period. Another indicated that receipt of any form of public benefit (even for citizen children) would cause the alien to be ineligible for legalization.

Because of these regulations, many individuals who were likely eligible for legalization were turned away from INS offices and otherwise discouraged from applying. The CSS and LULAC class action lawsuits challenged the INS travel regulations in federal court. The Zambrano class action challenged the benefit regulation.

The district court in all three cases held that the travel and benefit regulations violated the statute, ordered the INS to extend the application period to November 30, 1988 for class members who were deterred from applying for legalization because of knowledge of INS's unlawful regulation(s), and issued an injunction requiring the INS to withhold deportation and provide work authorization to these class members pending resolution of their claims. The DOJ appealed all three orders to the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, arguing that the federal courts had no authority to extend the deadline for any discreet group of aliens. The 9th Circuit affirmed the district courts' orders to extend the deadline in all three cases.¹

DOJ appealed these rulings to the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court rejected the DOJ's position that the lower federal courts did not have jurisdiction to change the application deadline for a discreet group, but held that the district courts had erred by not determining whether the claims of class members were "ripe." The Court explained that a plaintiff's claim challenging the INS's legalization procedure was only "ripe" once that plaintiff took the necessary affirmative steps in the application process prior to INS's application of the erroneous regulation to him. Thus, if an alien was "front-desked" -- i.e., presented a completed application to the INS and had his application rejected prior to its being filed (based on a determination by someone at the "front desk" that one of the regulations made the alien ineligible) -- his claim was ripe for adjudication. In addition, in a footnote, the Court indicated that a plaintiff could also have a ripe claim if the front-desking policy was a "substantial cause" of the alien's failure to apply for legalization. The Court remanded these cases to the district courts and ordered the courts to conduct ripeness analyses regarding the various discreet groups.

On remand, the district courts all held that an applicant who was told by the INS that they were ineligible because of the application of one of the erroneous regulations had a ripe claim and was

thus entitled to an adjudication and a continuation of the benefits that class members had been enjoying (stays of deportation and work authorization). The DOJ appealed these rulings to the 9th Circuit in early 1996, arguing that the district courts had misinterpreted the Supreme Court's remand.

During the pendency of this appeal, Congress enacted Section 377 of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA), which retroactively stripped the federal courts of jurisdiction over any claim under the legalization program, unless the applicant filed a completed application (including an application fee) with the INS within the original statutory window.² After IIRIRA was enacted, the DOJ moved to have the CSS, Newman, and Zambrano suits dismissed. On January 16, 1998, the 9th Circuit ordered the district court to dismiss all of the plaintiffs' claims in CSS for lack of jurisdiction. The district court had a hearing, dismissed the case, and invited the plaintiffs to file a new cause of action. On May 8, 1998, because of the 9th Circuit's interpretation of Section 377 in the CSS case, the district court dismissed the claims in the Zambrano case.

The CSS and Newman classes total approximately 300,000 people. These classes were open to new members as late as 1996. The Zambrano class was closed at the end of the 5-month extension period ordered by the district courts (November 30, 1988). This class includes approximately 9,000 people.

Since the dismissal of these suits, DOJ has determined that class members are no longer entitled to work authorization, stays of removal, or any immigration benefit on the basis of class membership. According to INS, approximately 80,000 class member received work authorization and stays of removal during the pendency of these cases. All of these people (many of whom have lived and worked in the U.S. for more than 10 years) will lose their authorization to work in the coming months. In addition, because class members were not subject to deportation during the pendency of the litigation, most did not apply for suspension of deportation under the old rules (you must have a final order of deportation prior to being eligible to apply for suspension). Now, the rules have changed. The standard for "cancellation of removal" (the new terminology) is much stricter and presents a significant bar.

1) A bonus formula which only rewards unsubsidized employment (i.e. excludes even subsidies paid with TANF funds) may disproportionately affect those areas and populations the WTW funds were intended to serve, i.e. concentrated poverty and hardest to serve. While we don't yet have hard data on how much subsidized employment is occurring with TANF funds, it may be used more where it's harder for someone to get an unsubsidized job. Also, it may take longer for people to move from subsidized to unsubsidized jobs where the economy is worse or the individuals have more barriers. Given the one-shot, short-term time frame for the WTW bonus, we'd penalize these places by only counting unsubsidized placements.

2) Just a reminder that it was never our intention to reward fully subsidized jobs, i.e. workfare. The TANF bonus only rewards jobs that are less than 100% subsidized, and it's always been our intent to do the same here. In other words, the employer is paying someone \$6.00 hour, but gets a subsidy that partially offsets these costs (typically a cash out of the person's welfare check). I'm pretty sure OMB knows this at a staff level, but just wanted to make you had this info if it should come up with Jack.

Scientists Update Foodborne Pathogen Recommendations

New Report Discusses Food Safety

Scientists offer 18 recommendations as a platform to focus and stimulate efforts toward food safety improvements. The Council for Agricultural Science and Technology (CAST), an international consortium of 36 scientific and professional societies, released a report Foodborne Pathogens: Review of Recommendations in which a CAST task force of 18 scientists updated the 15 recommendations contained in the 1994 CAST report Foodborne Pathogens: Risks and Consequences. The task force members represent a variety of organizations and backgrounds including consumers, producers, the food processing industry, governmental agencies, academicians, private consultants, epidemiologists, microbiologists, economists, and attorneys.

Information Is Critical Food Safety Problem

Information continues to be the critical food safety problem. Pathogens cannot be seen with the naked eye, so the public cannot readily detect the safety of meals, foods, or ingredients purchased anywhere along the food continuum. The ability to link human illness with foodborne pathogens also is difficult. Thus, the majority of foodborne illness cases are unreported.

The complexity of food safety from farm to table requires many types of scientific expertise to design sensible public and private interventions.

The original report Foodborne Pathogens: Risks and Consequences published by the Council for Agricultural Science and Technology (CAST) in 1994 was well-received and widely quoted. With encouragement of producer organizations, governmental employees, scientists, and public interest groups, the CAST Board of Directors authorized an update of the

recommendations from the original report.

What Do the Experts Recommend?

The CAST task force members strove to provide recommendations that are specific and practical with the goal that efforts involved in moving toward implementation of these recommendations would ensure real improvements in the safety of foods. Briefly stated, the 18 recommendations are as follows.

Goal Setting

1. Base food-safety policy on risk assessment and include risk management and risk communication strategies.
2. Base food safety regulations on risk assessment and risk management.
3. Set federal food safety goals and priorities.

Research Needs

4. Expand food-safety information database by more complete reporting of the incidence of foodborne disease by pathogen, by food, and by contributory factors.
5. Conduct continued, rigorous epidemiologic studies to assist in establishing the cause of illness and effect of foodborne occurrence of a particular pathogen or toxin.
6. Improve and regularly update foodborne disease estimates.
7. Support research on mechanisms of chronic illnesses associated with foodborne pathogens.
8. Use dose-response modeling in the risk assessment process.
9. Conduct research to identify likely domestic and imported food and pathogen/toxin associations.
10. Encourage and support vigorous fundamental and applied research efforts related to foodborne pathogens.
11. Develop rapid, accurate detection methods for foodborne pathogens and toxins.

Production Control

12. Require producers, aquaculturalists, and seafood harvesters to adopt effective preharvest intervention strategies in the interest of enhancing public health.
13. Apply foodborne pathogen control practices from food source to consumption.
14. Harmonize international food safety standards.

Education

15. Educate the general public and food handlers relative to safe food preparation and handling.
16. Identify high-risk populations and provide food safety education.
17. Provide risk information relative to food choices to persons with enhanced disease susceptibility.
18. Use and evaluate food labeling to communicate safe food preparation and storage practices to food preparers.

Gene is likely to talk to Bruce and Jack Lew about several pending issues related to the Census Poverty Measures. I've sent over by red dot copies of the latest draft memo to principals (dated 8/25) that Gene just reviewed with NEC staff, a 10/22 summary from OMB of more alternative measures they'd like Census to include, and a draft outline of Census' report (though this appears to have changed a bit). Here's where things stand:

Back in late July, the major unresolved issue was whether Census should produce some unbenchmarked measures along with benchmarked measures. At our last meeting on this (7/20, which I think Elena attended), we also discussed whether staff were comfortable with what we thought was Census' plan to highlight only 3-4 measures and consensus was this should go to principals too. Though there was talk of doing a principal's meeting on these issues (hence draft memo), it got overtaken by events. NEC staff were waiting to discuss the issues, and the memo, with Gene and that finally happened this weekend. Gene doesn't think there's a need for a big meeting on this -- instead he plans to talk to Bruce and Jack "sooner rather than later".

Benchmarking

Census was, and still is, inclined to only publish benchmarked measures (so any alternative poverty rates would equal the official 1997 rate in aggregate, though rates for difference groups might change). Bruce, this was your preference anyway, but the memo lays out lots of pros and cons. It's my understanding is Gene hasn't taken a firm position on this but is generally sympathetic to keeping our options open.

Number of measures

As the draft memo and the OMB summary indicate, Census is planning to highlight 3-4 "combination" measures. An earlier chapter of their proposed report will deal with a broader range of issues (such as geographic variation and housing), but Census would then pick several combinations of these variables to highlight. OMB feels very strongly that Census should publish every permutation and combination, otherwise it will appear that decisions have already been made about which direction the Administration is heading. NEC also believes Census should highlight more measures (though maybe around 8 rather than 12). Earlier, we had thought Census would provide more info on the broader set of alternatives

before highlighting the 3-4. It now appears that they will only provide minimal information about the broader set.

It's my understanding that the product Census plans to publish in March is a report, not a notice in the federal register for comment. However the research and academic community is eagerly awaiting this report and U. of WI has already scheduled a big conference on it for April. The report is not an official indication of how the government intends to change the poverty measure; rather it is more like a response to the NAS/NRC recommendation with a range of alternatives. Nevertheless, there's considerable concern from NEC and OMB about avoiding any perception of political influence and a feeling that if Census only highlights a narrow range of options, it will appear that either there was influence, decisions had already been made about some issues, or it might be harder to go back and pick up other options later.

If there is a decision to suggest to Census that they highlight more measures, both OMB and NEC would argue that some of these should not be benchmarked.

I don't have a substantive problem with having more measures highlighted -- this could diffuse the reaction to any one alternative measure, and make it more technical/less political. However, from a process standpoint, telling Census to publish more measures may risk some of the same concern about meddling. If we do nothing, Census will likely highlight 3-4 benchmarked measures. I'd be glad to discuss if that would be helpful.

Subject: FYI -- WIC rule codifying law on treatment of pregnant women for program eligibility

FNS is about to clear a rule that, among other technical provisions, codifies language the President signed into law in 1994, and that almost

all state agencies have since implemented under an FNS policy memorandum. The provision at issue would make an otherwise income ineligible household with a pregnant woman eligible for WIC benefits if the household would be eligible if household size were increased by one. In passing this law Congress considered evidence that some of the greatest returns in the WIC program are for pregnant women. We are bringing this to your attention out of concern that a rule allowing pregnant mothers to be counted as two individuals could be construed by some as a statement on status of a fetus with respect to broader discussions on abortion policy. Because the rule codifies language signed into law in 1994 and on which FNS has already issued guidance, it reflects no change in policy or in formally stated Administration position.

Another mysterious coincidence occurred when VERNON JORDAN, a member of RJR Nabisco's Board of Directors and President Clinton's supposed friend, agreed to help MONICA LEWINSKY find a job in New York. According to Newsweek, Jordan got her an interview at BURSON-MARSTELLER, a public relations firm that happens to have Philip Morris as a long-standing client and is currently managing the grass roots movement in California to overturn the smoking ban in bars.
