Josh, Rich, Lisa K, and I met with Waxman's staff this afternoon and they have a new twist on recoupment. They want to produce that spends about half the money on tobacco control and the other half either on debt relief or on a menu of health and other programs. They believe they can get bipartisan support and can rally the groups around this effort.

Instead of letting the states keep the funds so long as they spend it for certain specified purposes, they propose that, at least for funds to be used for tobacco control, the funds be spent at the federal level. Specifically, they would propose to fund the \$2.6 billion a year in tobacco-related spending in the Hansen-Meehan bill which included:

- (1) \$500 million on a national education campaign (including counteradvertising)
- (2) \$300 million on FDA
- (3) \$600 million on grants to communities and schools
- (4) \$1 billion on research
- (5) \$200 million on cessation

They argued strenuously that spending at the federal level is the best way to ensure these funds are spent effectively and why -- if nothing else for positioning reasons -- wouldn't they want to start there?

They are less sure what they want to do with the other half of the funds. Phil Schiliro, Waxman's chief of staff, argued that putting the rest towards debt service would be the cleanest message that would attract the most Republicans. Phil Barnett, Waxman's committee counsel, argued that a less specified menu had advantages.

We should discuss.

I wanted to give you an update on conversations that Mike Cohen and I have been having with Gray Davis' office. Davis raised his interest in getting a class size waiver in a conversation with the VP a couple of weeks ago, and I offered to arrange a conference call with the right people at the Department to explore this.

Mike Cohen and I had conference calls with Davis' office at the end of last week to discuss what turns out to be Davis' very strong interest in getting a waiver to allow California school districts to use federal class size funding to reduce class size in high school in order to help prepare high school students for the graduation exam Davis is proposing. Davis is arguing that California has already reduced class size in the early grades to 20, and there simply isn't space or an adequate supply of well-qualified teachers to go down to 18. Moreover, Davis has proposed this high school graduation exit test, and is looking for additional resources to help prepare 9th and 10th graders to well on this test. Mike Cohen and Mike Smith are both fairly open to the argument, though they both -- at a minimum -- want to be sure any CA waiver request and approval is crafted in ways to avoid opening the door to less well-founded waiver requests from other states. There also may be other issues that could complicate this further.

Because the waiver request has to come from the SEA, we are working with Davis' office and Delaine Easton's office to help them develop a request for this waiver, and they are hoping to submit the request later this week. Davis' people are pushing hard for Riley and Davis to appear together Monday so that Riley can make a positive statement about the waiver request.

Cohen made clear to them that Riley was unlikely to send positive signals about a waiver request until it had been fully reviewed by the Department -- and that was unlikely to take place by Monday. Assuming that a waiver is not requested and granted by Monday, Davis' office have indicated they will likely push for 2 things:

- 1) They would like for Davis to be able to come out of the NGA mtg Monday, and tell the California media something he has been able to get -- or at least fight for -- on behalf of improving education in California. His staff would prefer that Riley come out with him to confirm this.

What do you think of the following idea? I realize this would need to be worked out in context of our overall discussions with the Governors. Davis could say that he supports the President's agenda to strengthen accountability in public schools (ending social promotion, etc.), but that Davis had pressed the Administration to provide states with flexibility in how this is carried out. Riley could

say that he has heard the Governors message, and that the Administration will develop legislation with these concerns in mind.

2) They would like the waiver request to be granted by late March, at the latest. Davis' education legislation will likely be approved by the end of March, and they want to be able to reference the approved waiver in their final legislation. Cohen told them this was a more reasonable time frame than next week.

POWELL v. RIDGE --- TALKING POINTS

--The Government's brief in this case takes the position that the complaint filed by the City of Philadelphia and other plaintiffs states a claim under Title VI regulations that should be considered by the courts, and not dismissed on its face.

--The Department of Education's Title VI regulations prohibit recipients of federal funds, including states, from using criteria or methods of administration that have the effect of subjecting individuals to discrimination based on race.

--The City's complaint alleges that the state has administered its formula for state aid to elementary and secondary education in a manner that has resulted in discrimination based on race, both through factors in the state formula itself and considering the state system for funding education, taken as a whole. The complaint also asserts that the state was able to foresee that changes in its formula would decrease aid to school districts serving predominantly minority students. It thus raises an issue of intentional discrimination, as well as issues of disparate impact based on race.

--The Department believes these issues warrant consideration by the trial court. The plaintiffs should have an opportunity to develop their theories and the facts and the defendants should have an opportunity to challenge them and to justify any disparities that are established, consistent with well-established civil rights principles found in Title VI and its implementing regulations.

POWELL v. RIDGE --- TALKING POINTS

--The Government's brief in this case takes the position that the complaint filed by the City of Philadelphia and other plaintiffs states a claim under Title VI regulations that should be considered by the courts, and not dismissed on its face.

--The Department of Education's Title VI regulations prohibit recipients of federal funds, including states, from using criteria or methods of administration that have the effect of subjecting individuals to discrimination based on race.

--The City's complaint alleges that the state has administered its formula for state aid to elementary and secondary education in a manner that has resulted in discrimination based on race, both through factors in the state formula itself and considering the state system for funding education, taken as a whole. The complaint also asserts that the state was able to foresee that changes in its formula would decrease aid to school districts serving predominantly minority students. It thus raises an issue of intentional discrimination, as well as issues of disparate impact based on race.

--The Department believes these issues warrant consideration by the trial court. The plaintiffs should have an opportunity to develop their theories and the facts and the defendants should have an opportunity to challenge them and to justify any disparities that are established, consistent with well-established civil rights principles found in Title VI and its implementing regulations.

*Q: USA Today, AP, and the Washington Post are reporting that the Secretary of Education is calling for a uniform licensing system for teachers. Is the Administration proposing a new national teaching license or teaching test?*

A: No. This week, Secretary Riley gave his annual State of American Education Address this week which he uses to assess the state of education and to raise ideas and spark long-term discussions among academics, educators and others. In his speech, Secretary Riley raised some ideas about how states and communities could change the way they license and certify teachers, and said he wanted to spark and shape a dialogue about these issues in the coming months. The Administration is not making a legislative or budget proposal along these lines. (Riley's idea is that states could give new teachers an initial license for three years after passing an exam of knowledge and performance, give a professional license based on clear standards assessed by an administrator and other teachers, and giving experienced teachers an advanced license after receiving certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards.)

These ideas build on and reflect much of the work that AFT has done over the years -- including AFT's support for the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, AFT's support for tests for new teachers, and AFT's support for supporting high-quality teaching.

Secretary Riley did not call for any type of national teaching license, he did not call for national standards or tests for teachers, he is not calling for states to adopt any single idea or proposal. Moreover, he didn't suggest that states consider changes to teacher tenure, nor did he suggest testing for licensed teachers. Riley's office consulted with Sandy Feldman and Bob Chase last week about the concepts outlined in the speech to be sure that we are comparing notes and generally moving in the same direction.

*Q: Will the Administration include this in its proposal to reauthorize the Elementary and Secondary Education Act? When the Administration is proposing other requirements for states to end social promotion, intervene in failing schools, etc., how do you oppose efforts to require these ideas as well?*

A: As you know, in his State of the Union Address, the President proposed steps to end social promotion, fix failing schools, and other steps to strengthen accountability in our schools. These ideas are based on considerable experience at the state and local level and reflect broad consensus across the

nation -- and strong support from the AFT. The preliminary ideas on teacher licensure and certification outlined by Secretary Riley reflect neither such extensive experience at the state and local, nor such consensus. Neither Secretary Riley nor anyone at the White House believe these ideas should be the basis of any legislative proposals. Riley simply is making a first attempt to jumpstart an important dialogue on these issues among academics, educators, states, and communities across the nation as they work on these issues over the next few years.

*Q. Will the President support an Ed-Flex bill when it comes to the Senate floor later this month?*

A. The President has supported the Ed-Flex concept (i.e. giving eligible states the ability to waive certain federal laws and regulations in exchange for greater accountability), but wants to be sure that it is done right. He would strongly prefer to see Congress consider this bill as part of the overall reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, rather than as a freestanding bill. This would ensure that Ed-Flex is designed to fit the federal education programs of the next five years, rather than the last five years. If Congress does take up Ed-Flex prior to ESEA reauthorization, the President will insist that it is consistent with his approach to ESEA and that it include tough accountability measures to ensure a high-quality education for all children -- especially those in greatest need. It is essential that an Ed-Flex provision strike the right balance between flexibility and accountability for results. We understand the concerns raised by AFT and others in the education community and we will work with you and our friends in Congress to address these concerns in the coming weeks.

In addition, the President will use any congressional consideration of this bill as an opportunity to press for other, more important efforts to improve education.

**We must not let debate over a relatively minor measure to reduce regulatory burdens distract us from the more important effort of improving the education of our students through such crucial initiatives as reducing class size and modernizing schools.**

**Davis-Bacon and School Construction**  
**January 20, 1999**

Q: Would Davis-Bacon apply to the Administration's new school construction proposal?

A: First of all, I want to reiterate the Administration is a strong supporter of the application of Davis-Bacon when Federal Government outlays are involved.

- Whether Davis-Bacon should apply to this tax cut proposal is an issue that has come up in the past and we have been asked to take another look at it and we are doing that.

**Background:**

The Administration position has been Davis-Bacon would not apply to our school construction proposal because it is on the tax side of the budget (where Davis-Bacon historically has not been applied) and not on the spending side (where Davis-Bacon does apply). Other similar tax subsidies, such as tax exempt bonds and the Low Income Housing Tax Credit, have not historically been subject to Davis-Bacon

The AFL, especially the Building Trades, have been aggressively advocating adding Davis-Bacon to our proposal. The President has told them that we will take another look and an inter-agency group is doing that. We are also consulting with our allies on the Hill as well. A Davis-Bacon provision was not included in the Daschle or Lautenberg bills which were introduced on SOTU day.

I want to talk this morning about meeting the greatest challenge of the new century: the aging of America. As the Baby Boom becomes the Senior Boom, long-term care will become a growing need. So it is more important than ever that we help families provide that essential kind of care for their loved ones. In my balanced budget, I have proposed and paid for a long-term care tax credit of \$1,000 to help families do exactly that. . .

Providing long-term care at home is, more and more often, a common choice, but it is rarely an easy one. . . We have taken steps to ease the burdens on these families in a number of ways: by strengthening Medicare, by extending the trust fund, by promoting prevention and cracking down on fraud and abuse. But the aging of America in the 21st Century will demand more of us. The long-term care tax cut I proposed last month would help to meet the needs of individual families, empowering them to do what is best, showing them how very much we value the work they do. . . Caregiving is a vital and sacred compact among generations -- and one we should recognize and reward as a nation.

A long-term care tax cut is exactly the kind of tax cut we should be making. As you know, we are engaged in a great national debate right now about how to use the budget surplus. Now, we can all agree that America should have tax cuts. But there are two very different ways we can go about it. First, there is the old way -- failed and full of risk -- that some Republicans are trying to resurrect. They are saying: splurge today, save tomorrow. That's not the approach that Vice President Gore and I have proposed. Our approach says invest today, save for tomorrow. Our kind of tax cut is one that doesn't destroy our fiscal discipline, but preserves it. Our kind of tax cut is not indiscriminate, but is, instead, targeted to meet people's real needs for the future. Above all, our kind of tax cut allows us to meet our responsibility to future generations -- and to invest the lion's share of the surplus in saving Social Security and Medicare first.

Even some Republican moderates are coming to see the wisdom in this approach, in targeted tax cuts. I look forward to working with them to make the right choices for future generations -- to make sure we don't squander our historic opportunity to save Social Security and Medicare, and pay down the debt. As I said in my State of the Union Address one month ago, we can make good on that opportunity -- while providing tax relief like USA Accounts, and while making targeted tax cuts in areas from urban investment to clean energy technology, and from child care to long-term care. That is the way we should use our surplus: We should invest it. Invest it in America's future.

As you know the Iowa AG sent us a memo arguing that the state settlements were based on three types of claims -- Medicaid, consumer fraud, and miscellaneous (including civil penalties, antitrust, and nuisance) -- and argued funds should be allocated among these categories and the federal government can only claim a share of the first category.

DOJ makes the following points:

Under a legislative resolution of claims, one could devise whatever Medicaid/non-Medicaid allocation one chose to.

Under an administrative recoupment, there are statutory constraints:

(1) The statute requires reimbursement of Medicaid claims first. It would be inconsistent with DOJ's usual litigation posture and bad precedent to allow allocation of claims as Miller proposes, if the overall settlement amount is less than the Medicaid claims. Here's how it usually works: say someone on Medicaid gets injured on the job, and Medicaid pays \$50,000 for his health costs. The person settles with the employer for \$25,000. In this case, the federal government always argues that all the \$25,000 should go to reimburse Medicaid and rebuffs arguments that a share of funds were awarded due to, say, pain and suffering, and should therefore remain with the individual.

(2) However, DOJ thinks it is acceptable to discount claims for litigation risk, e.g., the risk that one would lose in court. In our example, this would mean that the federal government would argue that all \$25,000 should reimburse Medicaid. However, if the lawyers thought there was, say, a 10 percent risk of losing the case, the lawyers could settle for \$22,500 out of the \$25,000.

Thus, they believe a good faith effort to apportion based on litigation risks would be allowable, if we wanted to go there, but again this applies only to administrative recoupment.

**PRESIDENT CLINTON HIGHLIGHTS PROPOSALS TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO  
QUALITY HEALTH CARE AT NEW HAMPSHIRE ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION  
February 18, 1999**

**Today, President Clinton and Governor Jeanne Shaheen met with a panel of New Hampshire residents who underscored the wide range of health care challenges currently facing the nation. The President emphasized the importance of his proposal to provide targeted tax credits, such as the proposed credit to defray the costs of long term care services, rather than indiscriminately spending the surplus on across the board tax cuts. The President also praised Governor Jeanne Shaheen's efforts to address many of these health care challenges facing New Hampshire.**

**The President highlighted several of the initiatives in his FY2000 budget to improve access to and quality health care, including:**

- **Addressing growing long-term care needs. The President's budget includes a historic new initiative to support elderly and disabled Americans with long-term care needs or the millions of family members who care for them. This initiative invests over \$6 billion over 5 years in long term care, including a \$1,000 tax credit to compensate for the cost of long-term care services; a new \$625 million National Family Caregiver Program that helps states provide direct services and support for those caring for elderly family members with long-term care needs; a new proposal to enable States to expand home-and community-based care to the same income levels as for nursing homes under Medicaid; and a national campaign to educate Medicare beneficiaries about long-term care options. The President also praised New Hampshire's efforts to expand community based care services for Medicaid enrollees and to provide critical information to the elderly and chronically ill adults about their long-term care options.**
- **Improve economic opportunities for Americans with disabilities. More than 70 percent of Americans with disabilities are unemployed, often because they face significant barriers, such as the fact that they may lose health care. The President has proposed a series of bold new initiatives to enable people with disabilities to return to work. This \$3.2 billion (over 5 years) initiative includes full funding for the Jeffords-Kennedy-Roth-Moynihan Work Incentives Improvement Act which provides options for workers with disabilities to buy into Medicaid and Medicare; a \$1,000 tax credit to help offset the cost of services and support people with disabilities need to work; and a new regulation that increases the amount that people with disabilities can earn and still maintain critical Social Security benefits. New Hampshire also provides community based services to individuals with disabilities through Medicaid. In recognition the state's innovation in this area, the Vice President recently announced that the state would a new grant through the Social Security Administration to help remove barriers to employment for people with disabilities.**

- **Helping small businesses provide health care coverage for their employees. The President's budget includes a \$44 million investment in targeted tax credits designed to encourage small businesses to participate in voluntary purchasing coalitions, which provide more choices to small businesses and their employees and make health care more accessible. This initiative provides: a new 10 percent tax credit for small businesses who decide to offer coverage by joining coalitions; encouraging private foundations to support coalitions by allowing their contributions towards these organizations to be tax exempt; and offering technical assistance to small business coalitions from the Administrators of the Federal Employees Health Benefit Plan. Governor Shaheen has proposed legislation that creates voluntary small business purchasing alliance to reduce costs and increase options for small businesses offering health insurance to their employees. She believes that the key to making her proposal work is outside financing sources and as such strongly supports the Administration's proposal.**
- **Implementing the Children's Health Insurance Program, the largest investment in children's health in a generation. The Administration is committed to implementing the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) and has developed a national outreach campaign to sign up every child eligible for Medicaid or CHIP coverage. New Hampshire, under Governor Shaheen's leadership is one of forty-six other states who have already implemented the CHIP program, Healthy Kids, to provide health insurance to thousands of uninsured New Hampshire children.**
- **Protect Patients through a Strong, Enforceable Patients Bill of Rights. Once again, the President called upon Congress to pass a strong federally enforceable patients' bill of rights: with a range of patient protections including: guaranteed access to needed specialists; access to emergency room services when and where the need arises, access to a meaningful independent and external appeals process for consumers to resolve differences with their health plans, and the right to be compensated when a health plan's decision causes a patient to be harmed or die. The President is already doing everything he can to implement these protections by extending them to the 85 million Americans covered by Federal health plans. Governor Shaheen has also proposed managed care reforms through the HMO Accountability Act that includes new critical patient protections.**
