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S. 3: The Omnibus Crime Control Act of 1997

Transfer of Alien Prisoners: Requires renegotiation of treaties so consent of alien to be transferred back to country of origin is not necessary. Requires withholding of foreign aid and visas for countries that refuse to accept their nationals or sufficiently incarcerate them.

Exclusionary Rule Reform: Evidence obtained by “objectively reasonable” search or seizure shall not be excluded under the fourth amendment in federal court cases.

Violent Crime, Drugs and Terrorism

- Criminal Penalties and Procedures: Provides special protection for Olympic Games. Mandatory minimum penalties for crimes committed with explosives. Criminal forfeiture for chemical weapons violations.
- International Terrorism: Revision to State Department Rewards Program for informants on international terrorism and drug trafficking cases.
- Commission and Studies: Establishment of National Commission on Terrorism.

Community Protections

- Law Enforcement Assistance: Exemption for current and former police from state laws prohibiting carrying concealed firearms.
- Citizens’ Assistance: Authorizes states to enter into compacts to enable individuals to carry concealed weapons. Permits federal grant \$ to be used for firearms training and education to the public.

Criminal Procedure Improvements

- Equal Protection for Victims: Amends federal rules of criminal procedure and evidence on trial procedures to assist prosecutors and victims.
- Firearms: Mandatory minimum sentences for criminals possessing firearms. Mandatory death penalty for repeat violators of international drug trafficking laws.
- Federal Death Penalty: Adds aggravating factors in determination of death penalty sentence. Establishes death penalty in District of Columbia.

Increased Penalties for Trafficking and Manufacture of Methamphetamine and Precursors

Violence Against Women and Children: Makes religious organizations eligible for VAWA grants. Establishes death penalty for fatal interstate domestic violence cases. Provides for HIV testing of defendants in sexual assault cases.

Violent Crime and Terrorism: Expands coverage of antiterrorism statutes and increases penalties.

Prison Reform:

- Prison Litigation Reform: Makes more difficult to remedy prison conditions.

Automated Records Management System
Hex-Dump Conversion

- Federal Prisons: Prohibits certain prisoner amenities. Requires prisoners to work.

Violent and Repeat Juvenile Offenders

- Juvenile Justice Reform: Treatment of juveniles age 14 and older as adults for violent crimes and drug crimes (prosecutor discretion) in federal court. Expands availability of juvenile records, fingerprints and photographs.
- Juvenile Gangs: Provides \$100 million for hiring of U.S. Attorneys and attorneys in Justice Department to prosecute juvenile gangs. Creates federal penalty with mandatory minimums for solicitation or recruitment of criminal gang activity. Increases sentencing guidelines for participation in crime as gang member.
- Juvenile Crime Control and Accountability: Revokes OJJDP and creates Office of Juvenile Crime Control and Accountability. Establishes state incentive block grants (\$3.25 billion/5 years) to encourage: use of graduated sanctions, hiring of prosecutors and police to control juvenile crime, curfews, and prosecution of juveniles as adults.

Miscellaneous:

- Schedule I Drugs: Requires Attorney General to promulgate rules to revoke DEA license of physicians prescribing a Schedule I drugs.
- Anti-drug Use Public Service Requirement: FCC to encourage priority use of public service resources to promote youth drug abuse prevention and education.
- Child Porn: Secretary of State required to review all extradition treaties to ensure offenses involving child pornography is are extraditable offenses.
- 2,000 Boys and Girls Clubs Before 2000: Authorizes resources for 1,000 new clubs.
- Cellular Telephone Interceptions: Adds penalty of imprisonment of up to 1 year.

As Governor of Arkansas and Chairman of the National Governors Association, I was committed to reforming welfare. Over the past four years as President, I have worked tirelessly to improve the lives of the millions of families stuck in poverty with no way out.

Then, last August, I was given the opportunity to sign a far reaching set of reforms that I believe offers those on welfare the opportunity to improve their lives and the lives of their children. I signed that legislation because I believe in my heart that it will make a positive difference in the lives of millions. I am publicly and *personally* committed to ensuring its success.

But I can't do it alone. That is why last summer I challenged all of you to help me move *at least* 1 million recipients off the welfare rolls by the year 2002. Again, I challenge you -- help me move 1 million welfare recipients into work. I call on religious organizations, community organizations, educational institutions, state government, neighborhood organizations, and others to rise to the challenge I have laid before you. And again, I call on the business community to step forward. As much as someone on welfare wants to work and as hard as she might try to find employment, if we don't offer jobs, our effort will fail.

Just a few weeks ago, I met with 14 CEOs committed to meeting my challenge. And for these committed CEOs, there are thousands more I have heard from. I am heartened by this resurgence in corporate responsibility and corporate citizenship. But while these corporations are giving, they are getting back too. They have pledged to hire motivated, hard working individuals who ask *only* for a chance to succeed. These corporations know this. That is why they are involved.

And that is why I am thrilled to announce that XXX, XXX, and XXX, who are sitting in the audience tonight with the First Lady, have agreed to lead a corporate effort to help meet my challenge. Along with a dear and trusted friend of mine and the former head of the Corporation for National Service, Eli Segal, they will mobilize the business community to help put 1 million welfare recipients to work.

Some corporations will directly hire welfare recipients. Others, who may not have available jobs, will encourage and motivate different businesses to hire. Still others might fund specific programs, offer leadership, call on contacts, or recruit other corporations and their employees to the effort.

But whatever their role, of one thing I am sure. If every one of you watching and listening tonight pledges in some way to help those who simply need a chance, we will far surpass the challenge to move 1 million welfare recipients to work. We will have met a more profound challenge: that of community and spirituality spread nationwide.

A quick report on a meeting this afternoon with Kitty Higgins, Elena Kagan, HHS Chief of Staff Bill Corr, and Assistant Secretary for Health Philip Lee.

Background

As you know, between 1932 and 1972 the Public Health Service (now part of HHS), together with the Tuskegee Institute, conducted a long-term study of untreated syphilis known as the "Tuskegee Study." For the purposes of the study, federal, state and local officials allowed about 400 African-American men to go untreated for syphilis, even though treatment was available. (11 of these men are still alive.) The study was stopped only after it became public in 1972. The government then agreed to provide medical care to the victims and their families for the rest of their lives.

The Government's Study

In 1996, CDC and HHS sponsored a Tuskegee Syphilis Study Committee (technically the President's committee, although I do not believe he has ever publicly commented on the issue). In May, 1996, the Committee issued a report which recommended that the President apologize on behalf of the government. The report also suggested initiatives in minority health, training for health care workers serving in minority communities, and a clearinghouse to help investigators conduct ethically responsible research. The study has gotten a great deal of media attention, much of it focussed on the fact that the incident has fueled African-American distrust of government and public health authorities.

HHS's Request for a Presidential Event or Message

HHS is now requesting some kind of Presidential involvement -- ranging from a proclamation or press statement, to an actual Presidential event. They initially asked that this happen before February 10th (which is clearly impossible), because that is when an HBO movie about the Tuskegee Study will premiere; at the very least, they would like to do this by the end of February, which is African-American History Month.

HHS was arguing that the President should simply issue an apology, since that was the

Committee's main recommendation. Apparently, HHS was not prepared to act on any of the Committee's other recommendations. Kitty, Elena and I agreed that it is almost certainly not worth Presidential involvement unless we can show real action. HHS promised to report back ASAP with possible steps that could be taken.

The key questions are:

Is this issue worth the President's involvement, even if we can show action?

If so, is it better to quietly issue a proclamation or statement or to design an actual event?

If not, should HHS do something on their own?

Please advise; once we receive more options from HHS, we plan to hold another meeting on this issue.



Message of Event

3. To reaffirm the President's campaign commitment to expand Family Leave to parent-teacher conferences and children's routine medical appointments.


It was decided not to include mention of our flextime proposal, or to discuss when we will resubmit the FMLA expansion bill (originally submitted on the last day of the 104th Congress), since we do not yet know if these two proposals would be combined in one bill.

Terry Edmonds is preparing the President's remarks.

A briefing will be held in the President's dining room, from 9:45 to 10:00. The event will take place at 10:06 in the Oval, followed by the usual receiving line.

P6/(b)(6) We are also bringing in Clifton "Stan" Sorrell, CEO of the Calvert Group, a \$5.2 billion, 175-employee investment company in Bethesda, which has been implementing FMLA and already offers the leave policies we are proposing under our FMLA expansion. Mr. Sorrell was at the FMLA signing in 1993 (his company has been recognized as one of Working Mother's best 100 companies four years in a row, and was also one of Bush's Thousand Points of Light). Sorrell will be bringing two of his employees who have used Family Leave.

The current plan is for the President to read the radio address from his desk, with Mr. and Mrs. Sens standing behind the desk on one side, and Mr. Sorrell and his employees on the other side. TALKING POINTS ON THE STATE OF THE UNION ADDRESS
Monday, February 3, 1997

A concrete action plan. In his Inaugural address, President Clinton presented his larger vision of preparing America for the 21st Century. In the State of the Union and budget, the President will present his clear, concrete and consistent action plan to implement that vision.

At a time of peace and prosperity, our great enemy is inaction. The President will emphasize the unique opportunity America faces to build on the strong economic foundation we have established, and also the importance of taking action now to share the 21st Century.

Balancing the budget to keep the economy strong and investing in critical priorities. The President will demonstrate that he has moved the country beyond the false choices of the past -- that we can finish the work of balancing the budget, to lower interest rates and keep the economy growing, while still investing in those things that help the American people thrive and our economy grow.

Working together with all sectors of society. The President will stress the responsibility shared by all sectors of society (states, localities, businesses, communities and families) to work together to meet our challenges. In his address, he will issue a call to action that must be answered by all Americans, and he will highlight those who are already stepping up to the challenge of preparing America for the 21st Century.

Key points to emphasize: education, leadership in the world and unity. The President's address will place a special focus on these three areas -- giving our children a world-class education for the 21st Century, remaining the world's indispensable nation, and forming a stronger, more perfect union here at home.

STATE OF THE UNION ADDRESS -- THEMATIC OUTLINE
Monday, February 3, 1997

1. Finishing the unfinished business of our country. The President will open with a strong statement of his determination to finish the job of balancing the budget, reforming welfare and reforming campaign finance laws, to lay the foundation for preparing America for the 21st Century.

2. Strengthening education as the number-one priority. The President will emphasize that nothing is more important to preparing America for the 21st Century than giving our children a world-class education. That is why the President is proposing the largest education budget in history, providing record investments from pre-school to high school to college, and he is focussing on the responsibility all families and communities share to renew our schools at all levels. His address will place a special focus on the need to set the highest standards for students, teachers and schools.

3. Harnessing the powerful forces of knowledge, science, and technology. In the first State of the Union to be carried live over the Internet, the President will discuss his plans to spread the benefits of technology and research to all Americans, from our schools to our hospitals to our homes.

4. Building stronger families to help parents pass on their values to their children, and stronger communities to prepare America for the 21st Century. Melanne had spoken to Reiner a few weeks ago and promised this meeting specifically to discuss the President and Mrs. Clinton's roles in his TV special with all relevant White House staff. As you may know, he envisions them appearing at the end of the special in a "call to action" segment. She then spoke to Don, who said that, since he and McCurry oversee all POTUS television appearances, they should be engaged in these discussions. For that reason, Lorrie McHugh, Don Baer and Ann Lewis are scheduled to come to tomorrow's meeting.

Reiner, however, is bringing with him the entire group (from Michael Levine from Carnegie to Ellen Galinsky from the Families and Work Institute), suggesting that he has other things on his agenda, namely, the White House Conference on Early Learning and the Brain.

Perhaps it makes sense for Bruce to open the discussion and say that while we have the Communications folks in the room, we should talk about the TV special, allowing them to leave if they'd like while we discuss other issues.

Re: the WH Conference, there obviously aren't a lot of specifics to divulge to Reiner and company, apart from what the President will have said in his State of the Union address, but we can convey that we will certainly be in touch to consult.

On another front, we should probably all sit down at some point to discuss the Conference. FYI, Mrs. Clinton has indicated an interest in having the Conference last for more than two hours, so as to be more credible (although the President clearly would not need to be there for that long) and anchoring the Conference in the many practical things that parents can do to apply the recent research to their youngest children. Jeanine and I plan to compress the many recommendations of themes and participants that we have received, and hope to have a proposal to you by COB Friday.

REMOVING BARRIERS TO WORK FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

The President's budget includes important steps to make it possible for more people with disabilities to work. A large and growing number of people with disabilities can work, and want to work. With the ADA, changes in societal attitudes, and advances in technology, it is clearer than ever that being disabled does not mean that you can't contribute to our nation's economy. However, people with disabilities face a variety of complex barriers to work.

Therefore, the President's budget addresses this critical problem with the following three initiatives designed to assist people with disabilities who are eligible for Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI):

- **New State Option on Medicaid:** The budget proposes to help people with disabilities work without losing their health care coverage. Today, people on Supplemental Security Income (SSI) who go to work lose Medicaid if their earnings exceed caps that vary by state. Yet, it is often especially difficult for people with disabilities to get private insurance, especially coverage for any preexisting conditions. As a result, many people who are eligible for SSI "manage" their income to ensure that they keep Medicaid -- by stopping work when they hit the caps, or even turning down promotions. The President's proposal would create a new state option that would allow SSI beneficiaries with disabilities who earn more than these caps to keep Medicaid by contributing to the cost of their coverage as their income rises.
- **Medicare:** The President's budget authorizes a four-year demonstration to encourage Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries to return to work. Under the demonstration, certain SSDI beneficiaries who have exhausted their coverage [under a trial work period and an extended period of eligibility] would be eligible for up to four additional years of premium-free Part A coverage.
- **Pay for Results for Rehabilitation Services:** The Administration is proposing a new strategy to encourage more SSDI beneficiaries and SSI recipients to return to work. Currently, the Social Security Administration (SSA) refers some SSDI and SSI beneficiaries to State Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) agencies. Under this pilot proposal, SSDI and SSI beneficiaries could choose their own public or private VR providers. Providers who successfully assist beneficiaries in leaving the rolls and returning to work would be paid a percentage of the disability benefits saved. These payments would continue only as long as the person remained off the rolls, up to a maximum of five years. Because providers would be rewarded for results rather than for their costs, this should encourage more providers to have a continuing interest in their clients' long term success, which in turn may lead to more beneficiaries returning to work.

This plan creates new ways to help people find work and achieve their goals. The Administration looks forward to working with the Hill to enact these proposals. Since there are members of Congress from both sides of the aisle who are also working to solve this problem, we

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are hopeful that we will have a constructive dialogue that will lead to the enactment of legislation.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 6 /U.S. Newswire/ -- The Arc of the United States, a national organization on mental retardation, is deeply disappointed in today's announcement by the Social Security Administration (SSA) of its new, overly harsh standards for a child's eligibility for benefits under the Supplement Security Income (SSI) program. While we acknowledge the attempt by the SSA to recognize the importance of functional abilities in assessing SSI eligibility, we reject as excessive the severity thresholds the new requirements establish. The SSA had considerable leeway in setting the new eligibility standards, yet chose to push for changes that go beyond what was necessary under last year's welfare law. The Arc is also very disappointed that this decision appears to have been driven by budget targets, rather than by what is in the best interest of the children involved. The proposal is expected to save \$4.8 billion over the next six years.

To achieve the Clinton Administration's budgetary goals, 135,000 children with disabilities who are currently on the SSI program must lose essential benefits that serve as a lifeline for keeping the family together. It is estimated that an equal number will have to be denied access to this lifeline program over the next six years. This equals a total of almost 250,000 children with severe disabilities who will lose or be denied critical benefits.

Today's decision will have a staggering impact in a number of ways:

-- Families across America will lose basic support and, in many

cases, medical benefits. Already families are reporting to The Arc that they will be forced to give up their child to foster care or institutionalization. Removing a child from loving parents and a home atmosphere increases the likelihood that a child will never achieve her or his highest level of functional ability and violates all of our values regarding family life.

-- The potential influx of these children into state and local service systems will place a severe strain on local communities, if the children receive any assistance at all.

-- While these changes may help cut federal spending, the impact that they will have on the families who are already living at or near poverty will be devastating. The children who are dropped from the SSI program remain severely disabled and in need of assistance. If state and local governments cannot or will not make up the difference in lost support to these children, their families will simply find themselves abandoned in their efforts to provide proper care.

The Arc demands that the administration:

-- Take responsibility for thoroughly assessing each child before dropping him or her from the rolls;

-- Evaluate the impact of these new eligibility requirements on families of children with disabilities by tracking what happens to the families that lose these critical supports;

-- Ensure that all families being reviewed have information about available assistance in the review process;

-- Continue providing SSI assistance to families of children with sever disabilities who are already on the program until a final decision is made by a Social Security judge.

The Arc calls upon the public to express its disapproval of these new eligibility standards through the planned public comment period. It is only through the activism of the public that this damaging decision can be amended.

As a result of today's announcement, The Arc expresses its grave concern for children with disabilities and their families as they are dropped from federal assistance rolls.

Founded in 1950, The Arc is the nation's largest volunteer organization dedicated solely to issues of mental retardation. There are 140,000 members working through 1,100 local and state chapters. **Supplemental Security Income New Childhood Disability Standard
February 6, 1997**

The welfare law required SSA to provide a new tightened definition of childhood disability for the SSI program, which provides monthly cash payments and Medicaid for low-income disabled children. SSA was challenged with formulating a standard that both meets the intent of Congress to tighten eligibility and ensures that severely disabled children and their families are protected under the new law. SSA is announcing that standard at 2 PM today.

SSA's Standard:

- The Administration is confident that the standard in the regulations SSA has developed meets the letter and the spirit of the law in ensuring that needy children with severe disabilities are protected.
- *Numbers:* Of the approximately 950,000 children currently receiving benefits, CBO estimated that between 100,000 and 260,000 children would lose benefits under the new eligibility definition in the welfare law. SSA estimated last year that 190,000 children would lose benefits; **SSA estimates that under its new standard the total number of children who will be removed from the rolls is 135,000 -- in the low range of CBO's initial estimates for the law.**
- *Type of Disability.* Most of those affected under SSA's standard can be categorized as children with less severe mental impairments -- such as less severe learning disabilities or behavioral disorders. The new rules provide guidelines for evaluating more severe impairments -- such as Down's Syndrome, severe mental retardation or autism -- to ensure that such children remain eligible under the new standard. Because disability determination is a complex issue, regulations in this area are difficult and complicated. For a description of the more specific details of the regulation, the SSA Commissioner should be contacted.

Medicaid Coverage:

- The President is also proposing a legislative change to soften the impact of the eligibility changes. The legislative change would allow disabled children who lose their SSI eligibility under the new definition of childhood disability to retain their Medicaid health coverage -- so that the medical needs of these families continue to be met.

Ongoing Evaluation:

- SSA will track the effects of the implementation of this law. If they discover that revisions or improvements in the law are needed, they will recommend such changes.
