**Talking Points: DNC/Domestic Partner (Health Care)
Benefits for Same Sex Partners**

Background: Starting July 1, 1997, the DNC will make available to domestic partners of its gay and lesbian employees its health care benefits program. The proposed definition of domestic partners is: "two unmarried adult individuals of the same sex who have cohabitated for at least twelve consecutive months in an exclusive, intimate relationship to be of indefinite duration."

Q: What is the President's view of the DNC's decision to provide same sex domestic partner benefits for its employees?

A: He believes that businesses and not-for-profit organizations have that option. It is up to them to determine what is in their best interest and in the best interests of their employees. It is noteworthy that some of America's largest and most prominent corporations such as American Express, Bank of America, Eastman Kodak, IBM, Microsoft, Time Warner and Xerox now provide domestic partner benefits. The DNC appears to have made a similar business decision.

Q: Did the President approve the DNC policy before it was announced? Was he aware of it?

A: No. Decisions relating to employee benefits are made by the Chairman and senior DNC management. The White House was made aware of the policy change at a staff level.

Q: What is the White House policy on this -- are White House employees eligible for domestic partner benefits?

A: No. White House employees are governed by the same rules as all other federal employees and these benefits are not currently available to federal employees.

Q: Would the President support an effort to make domestic partner benefits available to federal employees?

A: As there are millions of federal employees, this issue - which is relatively new - would at a minimum first have to be studied by Congress and the Executive Branch and examined under a cost/benefit analysis.

Q: Is such a study currently underway?

A: Not to my knowledge.

Q: The President's supporters in the gay community, many of whom are still angry with him for

signing the Defense of Marriage Act last year, argue that if he is not going to let them get married, then domestic partner benefits are an important way to give recognition to their relationships. Does the President agree?

A: The President is aware that many communities and institutions are considering whether basic benefits can be provided outside the context of traditional marriage. The challenge in addressing these issues is to remain sensitive to the values of our communities while preserving the fundamental right to live free from unjustified discrimination. In our country's history we have, for good reason, looked first to state and local governments, as well as the private sector, to consider evolving issues like these. I think that the President supports the efforts of business and communities to find solutions that work for them and their employees in an age when many Americans are in non-traditional relationships.

Race/Reconciliation

Thus far, coverage of the race/reconciliation issue has been both accurate and positive. It has piqued the interest of many reporters -- stories have already appeared in the New York Times, Knight-Ridder, Newsday, the Chicago Tribune and many others. CNN, TIME, US News & World Report and Newsweek are all looking at big packages they would like to run in the next few weeks. Most of them understand that the President has a long-term commitment to the issue. To a person, the reporters see the President's initiative as transcendent and historical.

The problem we face is that there has been such a long buildup to this speech that when June 14 actually comes, reporters will look for something tangible (besides the names of the commission members) to come out of the speech. If they consider this speech mushy, we will face the headline "there is no there there." It is essential that our administration talkers stress that the President wants to set a tone and spark a dialogue on race -- that in and of itself is progress.

Goals

1. Inform reporters about the President's long-term commitment to and understanding of the issue of race in America. (Background as a white Southerner, significant speeches on race, the affirmative action review, etc.)
2. Plan to give out some information regarding the structure of the commission, its scope, agenda, etc. to White House press corps via tongs and structured interviews.
3. Make certain that alternative media are aware of the President's initiative on race.

PRESIDENT CLINTON RECOGNIZES SURVIVORS
OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE SYPHILIS STUDY AT TUSKEGEE
May 16, 1997 --- DRAFT ---

Today, President Clinton recognized the injustice done to the participants of the Public Health Service syphilis study in Tuskegee, Alabama. The President formally apologized to survivors, their families and the nation for the unethical study that left as many as 400 African American men untreated for syphilis. The Public Health Service (PHS) began the experiment in 1932 and did not end it until 1972 -- many years after penicillin was available to treat the disease.

Today, President Clinton also signed an executive order extending the charter of the National Bioethics Advisory Commission (NBAC) to October, 1999 to ensure a continued, national focus on bioethical issues. Building on the work of the President's Advisory Committee on Human Radiation Experiments, an NBAC subcommittee will make recommendations this fall for further strengthening protections for human research subjects.

President Clinton also announced 4 additional steps the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will take to ensure we learn from the PHS syphilis study, rebuild trust, and protect human subjects in the future.

- o **Building a lasting memorial.** The President announced that HHS will award a planning grant to Tuskegee University to pursue establishing a Center for Bioethics in Research and Health Care at the University. The Center would be a lasting memorial and would support efforts to address the legacy of the syphilis experiments and strengthen bioethics training.
- o **Increasing Community Involvement and Restoring Trust.** The legacy of the PHS study still impedes efforts to conduct promising research, particularly involving minorities, and to provide the best health care services to all Americans. Today, the President directed the Secretary of HHS to issue a report, within 120 days, detailing effective strategies to more fully involve communities, especially minority communities, in research and health care.
- o **Strengthening Researchers' Training in Bioethics.** The President directed the Secretary of HHS to develop bioethics training materials to help researchers effectively apply ethical principles in diverse populations. In partnership with private organizations¹, within one year, HHS will complete and disseminate course materials that build on core ethical principles of respect for persons, beneficence, justice, and informed consent, and that help ensure researchers successfully apply these principles in all communities.
- o **Providing Post-Graduate Fellowships to Train Bioethicists, Especially Minorities.** To increase and broaden our understanding of ethical issues in clinical research, HHS will offer fellowships, beginning in September 1998, to promising students enrolled in bioethics graduate programs. HHS will make special efforts to recruit minorities currently underrepresented in the field.

¹Partners will include the Association of American Medical Colleges, the Association of American Universities, the Association of Schools of Public Health, the National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education, and the Association of Minority Health Professions Schools.

DRAFT: TUSKEGEE AND MORGAN STATE

Two events coming up this week offer opportunities to talk about the President's initiative on racial reconciliation:

- **Tuskegee Apology:** a ceremony recognizing the survivors of the study at Tuskegee, to be held at the White House on Friday May 16; and
- **Morgan State Commencement:** a commencement address at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland on May 18.

General

When commenting on these events you may want to make these points:

- Both events are examples of the President's commitment to the issues of racial reconciliation, and to moving beyond past discrimination to current and future practices.
- Note the President's personal leadership in these events. (This is an opportunity to deal with the commission questions -- e.g. whose on it, what is it, etc. -- make the point that these events and the idea of a commission appointed by the President are not the story.)
- These events are part a comprehensive *Presidential Initiative* in which Bill Clinton, with his personal history and commitment, is directly and regularly involved. It is a process in which he has been engaged in over the last four years (e.g. Memphis and Austin speeches) and throughout his life, and which will intensify in the near future as he calls the American people's attention to this issue.

Tuskegee Apology

- The President will issue an apology on behalf of the federal government to the survivors (including families) of the study at Tuskegee. He will then go on to make several policy announcements which will address this issue, and help ensure that future scientific research will be more inclusive of, and sensitive to, racial minorities.
- The study at Tuskegee is a shameful episode in our nation's history, and it has left a legacy of distrust between the African American community and the research community. *The right thing to do is to acknowledge and apologize for the past, and then to institute action steps for the future.* This is a model for the kinds of action you may see recommended in the President's Initiative when appropriate.

Morgan State University

- In choosing to make his first commencement address at Morgan State University, a historically-black school, the President is also addressing the issue of racial division, but indirectly in that he is *not* delivering a speech on race to an African-American audience. It will be a major address about the role of science in preparing America for the 21st century.
- Thus, instead of speaking about race to a minority audience, the President will speak at Morgan State about an issue of national interest that transcends race; and will address the topic of race at the University of California at San Diego, a college and state with many races and ethnicities. This is an example of how he hopes in the coming year to inspire dialogue and conversation both about the issue of race itself, and among Americans of different races about the issues and values that bring us together.
- Of course, there is an obvious connection, which the President will address, between the role of science, the importance of having ethics that inform and guide our approach to science, and the study at Tuskegee .

TWO DOZEN GROUPS SEEK MANDATORY COUNTER ADS TO TV-RADIO ALCOHOL
COMMERCIALS

Citing cigarettes as precedent, 24 groups petitioned FCC Wed. to require TV and radio stations to air counter ads for beer, wine and hard liquor commercials. Petition claimed that ads "threaten the public interest and public safety by glamorizing their appeal to children." Request was filed by National Council on Alcoholism & Drug Dependence (NCADD) and Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), plus 22 other groups. In immediate response, NAB Pres. Edward Fritts said "there is absolutely no need" for Commission to require such ads.

In related action, American Academy of Pediatrics urged FCC to "investigate the impact of liquor advertising on television on children." In letter to FCC Chmn. Hundt, Council Pres. Robert Hannemann said group supports Commission investigation of liquor ads and "strongly urges that such a hearing be inclusive of the beer and wine industry... As pediatricians, we see the influence the media... historically have had on America's children and adolescents. Equating alcohol use with athletic prowess, social popularity and physical beauty serves to draw this particularly susceptible population into illegal use and abuse of alcohol."

NCADD and MADD charged alcoholic beverage industry "has used the nation's airwaves to create a distorted view of a product which, in reality, is associated with the leading causes of death among teenagers. Without intervention of the kind the FCC has taken before [on cigarettes], parents, schools and public health organizations will never have the resources to compete with the millions of dollars worth of prodrinking messages that are broadcast into American homes every year."

Petition asks FCC to require any station or network that airs commercials for alcoholic beverages (including beer and wine) to carry "a significant amount" of counter ads free "within reasonable proximity" of alcohol ads. Petition cites as legal justification 1967 FCC rule (before cigarette ads were banned by Congress) under now-defunct fairness doctrine that required stations to air one free antismoking spot for every 4 paid cigarette commercials. Catalyst for petition, groups said, was Distilled Spirits Council deletion of ban against broadcast hard-liquor ads from its voluntary code.

Beer Institute official Jeff Becker said brewers "have a history of responsible public service announcements... We've done a tremendous amount of work in being part of the solution to drunk driving and alcohol abuse." Elizabeth Board of Distilled Spirits Institute said TV stations and networks have refused to accept industry efforts to pay for commercials on alcohol abuse when sponsoring company is named.

Fritts said surveys indicate that TV-radio stations are "widely disseminating antialcohol abuse prevention messages... Our latest estimates indicate that approximately one billion dollars annually" in time are donated to such messages by broadcasters. NAB's own effort -- Stations Target Alcohol Abuse Reduction (STARS) -- has "played a significant role in creating an awareness of the dangers of alcohol abuse," he said.

Hundt has called repeatedly for FCC investigation and hearing into alcohol ads, but has been unable to get necessary 3 votes to start inquiry (CD May 13 p6). Comrs. Chong and Quello contend that FTC, not FCC, has authority over liquor ads; Comr. Ness said she believes Commission could conduct investigation but she hasn't decided whether it has jurisdiction to take any specific action (CD May 14 p7). After filing of petition Wed., Hundt said "FCC's statutory duty to ensure that the public airwaves are used in the public interest requires us to act." President Clinton also is among those calling for FCC action on liquor ads.

Talking Points on FLSA

5/15/97

This Administration is committed to moving people from welfare to work. This Administration is also committed to making sure that workers get paid at least the minimum wage for their efforts.

- That means all workers who do real work -- whether or not they come off the welfare rolls.
- You know as well as I that there are complicated legal questions here, involving who counts as a "worker" and who as a "trainee" under the minimum wage law.

Our agency lawyers believe that the welfare law says that that people who leave welfare for work should be treated like other workers:

- If they are workers, not trainees, they should receive the minimum wage, overtime, and unemployment insurance.
- Their employers must adhere to the Occupational and Safety Act and anti-discrimination laws.

Not all welfare to work activities will be considered "work" under the Fair Labor Standards Act. But those that are work should be treated like work. That's not just our view -- it is the law.

Q&A

Question: Won't this end welfare reform as we know it by making work more expensive?

Answer: Not at all. States that want to have workfare programs can do so -- combining TANF and food stamps will pay the minimum wage for 20 hours a week in virtually every state [except Mississippi]. Besides, welfare reform is about placing people in real, private sector jobs -- workfare should be only a temporary last resort. A better alternative would be for states to use the welfare funds to subsidize private sector jobs.

Question: Are most welfare recipients who are working going to be considered "employees"?

Answer: Welfare recipients would probably be considered employees in most of the work activities described in the new welfare law. Exceptions are most likely to include individuals engaged in job search, vocational education, and secondary school. The Labor Department will advise states based on their particular programs.

Question: What's the difference between a trainee and a worker under FLSA?

Answer: An individual is in training if:

- Training is similar to that given in a vocational school;
- Training is for the benefit of the trainee;
- Trainees do not displace regular workers;
- The employer derives no immediate advantage from the trainees' activities;
- Trainees are not entitled to a job after training is completed; or
- The employer and trainee understand that the trainee is not paid.

Question: Can Food Stamps count as wages?

Answer: We believe that through waivers or other mechanisms such as the Simplified Food Program option now in law, states would be able to count food stamps as wages for all those required to work under the new welfare law.

**IMPACT ON STATES
OF PAYING MINIMUM WAGE FOR WORKFARE¹
Example: Family of Three**

Minimum Wage Costs

The monthly cost of a \$5.15 minimum wage for 20 hours a week is \$443 and for 30 hours a week is \$664. The welfare law's work rates for single parent families are currently 20 hours a week; they rise to 30 hours in the year 2000.²

If States Use TANF Funds as "Wages"

In 36 states, current TANF benefits are not enough to pay for 20 hours a week at the minimum wage. In 48 states (all but Alaska and Hawaii), current TANF benefits are too low to pay for 30 hours per week of work at the minimum wage.

If States Use TANF and Food Stamps Funds as "Wages"

In one state, Mississippi, the combined TANF and food stamp grants are not enough to pay for 20 hours a week of work at the minimum wage. In 20 states, the combined benefits are not enough to pay for 30 hours a week of work. These states are:

¹ This table points out the potential shortfall for workfare programs, in which public funds would be the only source of wages for the recipient. In a wage subsidy program, the shortfall would be filled by a contribution from the employer. Thus, the application of the minimum wage will likely encourage states to have work subsidy, rather than workfare, programs.

² The new law requires for single parent families a minimum of 20 hours of work a week in 1997 and 1998, 25 hours in 1999 and 30 hours in 2000. The minimum for two parent families is 30 hours a week for all years. These calculations assume an average of 4.3 weeks per month.

TALKING POINTS ON PRESIDENT CLINTON'S COMP TIME PROPOSAL
Thursday, May 15, 1997

The President's Proposal Offers Employees Real Choice and Flexibility;
The Ashcroft Bill Gives All the Choice -- and all the Control -- to Employers

President Clinton's comp time proposal strengthens families by offering employees choice and flexibility:

- If they work overtime, they can be paid time and a half, as the law now requires, or they can take that payment in time-off to be with their families -- an hour-and-a-half off for every hour of overtime they have worked.
- Simply put, employees make the choice that is best for them -- money in the bank or time on the clock. That means more choice, and more flexibility, for working families.
- Comp time can be used for vacation, extended maternity leave, or to spend more time with one's children or parents -- making it easier to raise children and balance the obligations of home and work.

The Republican version of "comp time" legislation that is up for a vote today would make families worse off than they are today -- taking away their choice and flexibility, often denying them the benefit of time-and-a-half for overtime worked, and effectively repealing the 40-hour workweek.

Under the Ashcroft Bill, now awaiting a vote in the Senate:

- Some employees who work and extra hour would get only an hour off -- less overtime than they would be eligible for today, or under the President's proposal. *That's money out of their pocket.*
- Employers can force employees to make up their time off -- for example, by making them work over the weekend without paying time-and-a-half. *They could not do this under the President's proposal.*
- Employers can deny employees' request to use comp time for critical family needs by claiming the business would be "unduly disrupted." *They could not do this under the President's proposal.*
- Employers can decide to cash out an employee's earned comp time above 80 hours at any time with 30 days notice, even if the employee had a long-planned use for it -- such as maternity leave. *They could not do this under the President's proposal.*
- Employees are not adequately protected against losing the cash value of the comp time they have worked for and earned if their employer goes bankrupt. *The President's proposal offers this crucial protection.*

- Employers can eliminate paid leave plans and replace them with comp time plans, leaving employees worse off. *This is flatly prohibited under the President's proposal.*

THE CLINTON AND ASHCROFT BILLS ARE LIKE NIGHT AND DAY:

- *The Ashcroft bill ends the 40 hour work week and the basic right to time-and-a-half pay for overtime work.* The President's bill protects and guarantees them.
- *The Ashcroft bill gives employers all the control and flexibility.* The President's proposal gives more choice, control and flexibility to employees and their families.
- *The Ashcroft bill offers no protection against unscrupulous employers.* The President's proposal does.

The vast majority of our employers will be fair to their workers under any system. But as we modernize our laws to fit a changing workplace we have to uphold historic safeguards for all our employees. It should be up to employees and their families, not employers, who should choose if, when and how they take and use comp time.

As President Clinton said in his March 22 Radio Address: "The moment a responsible comp time bill hits my desk I will gladly sign it...[but] I will have to veto any legislation that fails to guarantee real choice for employees, real protection against employer abuse, and real preservation of fair labor standards including the 40-hour week."

TWO DOZEN GROUPS SEEK MANDATORY COUNTER ADS TO TV-RADIO ALCOHOL COMMERCIALS

Citing cigarettes as precedent, 24 groups petitioned FCC Wed. to require TV and radio stations to air counter ads for beer, wine and hard liquor commercials. Petition claimed that ads "threaten the public interest and public safety by glamorizing their appeal to children." Request was filed by National Council on Alcoholism & Drug Dependence (NCADD) and Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), plus 22 other groups. In immediate response, NAB Pres. Edward Fritts said "there is absolutely no need" for Commission to require such ads.

In related action, American Academy of Pediatrics urged FCC to "investigate the impact of liquor advertising on television on children." In letter to FCC Chmn. Hundt, Council Pres. Robert Hannemann said group supports Commission investigation of liquor ads and "strongly urges that such a hearing be inclusive of the beer and wine industry... As pediatricians, we see the influence the media... historically have had on America's children and adolescents. Equating alcohol use with athletic prowess, social popularity and physical beauty serves to draw this particularly susceptible population into illegal use and abuse of alcohol."

NCADD and MADD charged alcoholic beverage industry "has used the nation's airwaves to create a distorted view of a product which, in reality, is associated with the leading causes of death among teenagers. Without intervention of the kind the FCC has taken before [on cigarettes], parents, schools and public health organizations will never have the resources to compete with the millions of dollars worth of prodrinking messages that are broadcast into American homes every year."

Petition asks FCC to require any station or network that airs commercials for alcoholic beverages (including beer and wine) to carry "a significant amount" of counter ads free "within reasonable proximity" of alcohol ads. Petition cites as legal justification 1967 FCC rule (before cigarette ads were banned by Congress) under now-defunct fairness doctrine that required stations to air one free antismoking spot for every 4 paid cigarette commercials. Catalyst for petition, groups said, was Distilled Spirits Council deletion of ban against broadcast hard-liquor ads from its voluntary code.

Beer Institute official Jeff Becker said brewers "have a history of responsible public service announcements... We've done

a tremendous amount of work in being part of the solution to drunk driving and alcohol abuse." Elizabeth Board of Distilled Spirits Institute said TV stations and networks have refused to accept industry efforts to pay for commercials on alcohol abuse when sponsoring company is named.

Fritts said surveys indicate that TV-radio stations are "widely disseminating antialcohol abuse prevention messages... Our latest estimates indicate that approximately one billion dollars annually" in time are donated to such messages by broadcasters. NAB's own effort -- Stations Target Alcohol Abuse Reduction (STARS) -- has "played a significant role in creating an awareness of the dangers of alcohol abuse," he said.

Hundt has called repeatedly for FCC investigation and hearing into alcohol ads, but has been unable to get necessary 3 votes to start inquiry (CD May 13 p6). Comrs. Chong and Quello contend that FTC, not FCC, has authority over liquor ads; Comr. Ness said she believes Commission could conduct investigation but she hasn't decided whether it has jurisdiction to take any specific action (CD May 14 p7). After filing of petition Wed., Hundt said "FCC's statutory duty to ensure that the public airwaves are used in the public interest requires us to act." President Clinton also is among those calling for FCC action on liquor ads.

2. We should try to meet briefly with Rob Malley on Monday to discuss how we want to revise the options memo. At the meeting, we should decide a timeframe revising the memo and at what point we want to call our first working group meeting. I've already received input from both Rob and Steve about who we should invite.

3. Rob has received a meeting request on the suspension issue by some outside groups and immigration lawyers. He wanted to run it by us to see if we wanted to be in on it or he should hold them off entirely for now. He did tell them that if we met at all, we would just be listening to their concerns, not commenting on the Administration's policy. He would like to hear from us ASAP on whether to hold such a meeting.

4. I have a better understanding of the litigation on suspension that was in the papers the other day. Main issue: how INS is counting immigrants' length of residency in the US to determine whether they are able to meet the 7-year residency threshold for the hardship exception. Let's discuss this at greater length.
