Grandparent and Family Caregiver Support Act

Talking Points

- In welfare reform, we agreed to give states the discretion to identify their most vulnerable populations -- battered women, people with AIDS, those too disabled to work, grandparent caregivers -- and decide who would be exempt from time limits and work requirements.
- This is not something we think we can re-open, but we'd be glad to speak to you about it further.

Background

The Grandparent and Family Caregiver Support Act would prohibit States from applying the work requirements and time limits in the welfare reform law to grandparents and other family members caring for children on public assistance. Currently, states can exempt up to 20% of the caseload from the time limits and must have 25 percent of the caseload working in 1997, 30% in 1998, 35% in 1999, 40% in 2000, 45% in 2001 and 50% in 2002.

RE: Reconciliation Outreach Efforts

In developing recommendations for your initiative on race and diversity, we consulted a number of individuals and national leaders who have spoken out on this issue in the past. We explained that you were considering a number of proposals that would speak to the unresolved issue of racial and ethnic discrimination, and would focus on the great challenge facing our country as we move into the next century. We solicited their views regarding the advisability of a Presidential initiative on race, whether such an initiative should take the form of a commission or some type of a White House summit, and asked for suggestions of who should be asked to serve on a commission, if that were to be established.

Everyone we called supported the idea of a Presidential initiative; many speaking enthusiastically of your unique ability to speak to the nation on the subject of race and reconciliation and to move the country toward racial healing and tolerance. For example, Father O'Donnovan and Father Hesburgh both expressed strong support for your taking on the race issue. Father Hesburgh cited your success with the Memphis speech and said he felt America is ready to face this issue and suggested that you should try to build on the 1964 Civil Rights Act.

Several people expressed concern about creating a commission believing that it would run the risk of being big on rhetoric and short on substance. Some argued that there has been enough study; that it was time for action. Among those cautioning against a commission were Al Fromm, Xavier Becerra and Hugh Price. Others such as Kwesi Mfume and Joe Lowery, while not opposing a commission, were more concerned about the potential lack of concrete actions. John Sweeney thought selecting a commission would be hard but supported your effort to engage the public on the issue. Senator Moseley-Braun thought a commission was an excellent idea and that you were ideally suited to leave a lasting legacy on the matter of race. She believes that you have the credibility and can give direction to the nation on this important issue.

Hugh Price also suggested that the real challenge for the future is ensuring that what he called the "opportunity structure" be open to all populations in the country, and not just focus on past discrimination. He proposed that you convene a dialogue with mayors who have real life experiences with interactions among different people and the difficulty of governing diverse

populations. Andrew Young argued that you would get much further by focusing on the issue of poverty and highlighting the common goal of economic security. He also thought consideration should be given to human relations and how we develop respect for all types of diversity.

Representative Mink said that the commission should have a name that was inclusive and that a commission on race was a very bad idea which conjured up very negative and divisive signals. Representative Matsui agreed with the idea of a reconciliation commission and suggested several prominent Asian-Americans be considered. Becerra of the Hispanic Caucus also stressed the importance of going beyond a black and white dialogue. Ron Allen, a Native American leader, expressed great concern that racism was at the very heart of the problems besetting the Native American community but that a commission on race would not address the needs of this community. Substantial participation by Native Americans in this initiative will be required to allay concerns.

Anna Devere Smith argued that the press should be challenged and included in the effort to bring about reconciliation.

We also had lengthy conversations with both Mayor Dennis Archer and Mayor Willie Brown; both of whom were highly supportive and pleased to be asked for their advice. Mayor Brown was particularly interested in trying to identify new leadership -- younger people not already previously identified with the Civil Rights movement to participate in this effort. Both indicated they will applaud you when you make your speech. .

Lastly, we have spoken with Rev. Jackson who stressed that vision, policy and politics must be connected. The key question for him is whether you are prepared to make some bold moves to advance this effort with particular emphasis on our criminal justice system and our economic structure. While he believes that you are deeply committed to the issue, but the initiative must be more than dialogue.

Before the initiative can be announced and before your speech, there are two critical calls that remain to be made: Rev. Jesse Jackson and Mary Francis Berry, Chair of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights. There is no plan to place either on the commission, but we propose to consult with them regularly throughout this effort. Our recommendation is that you speak with Rev. Jackson to ensure his support for your initiative.

We also suggest that the Vice President speak with Mary Berry. The U.S. Civil Rights Commission, in particular, has addressed aspects of this issue of race as part of their ongoing work and one question that will have to be answered is why create another commission. Certainly there are opportunities to use some of the Commission's findings and research as we do our work.

Before the speech is given, we plan to call 10-15 key elected officials nationwide to give them advance notice of the speech. Additionally, attached is a much longer list of people whom we intend to call in advance of the speech

1. Welfare -- Permitting States to Purchase Food Stamps for Those Losing Federal Benefits: As part of the supplemental appropriations bill, Congress has agreed that states that wish to continue food subsidies to certain individuals losing Federal food stamps because of the welfare reform law can do so by purchasing food stamps from the federal government. This includes both legal immigrants and unemployed non-disabled childless adults. A few months ago, Washington State asked the Department of Agriculture if it had legal authority to sell coupons to states to provide benefits for legal immigrants. Unfortunately, the Department's legal analysis indicated that it did not. However, we assisted the state in drafting a legislative proposal, and it has been agreed to by the conferees, with the option also applying to non-disabled childless adults subject to the new food stamp work requirement. Maryland and Massachusetts are among the states planning to take advantage of this new option for legal immigrants.

Note to Elena: I previously told you states with EBT (Maryland) were out of luck on this legislation, but I was wrong: any state can take advantage of this.

2. Teen Pregnancy -- National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy You asked whether we have any continued involvement with the National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy, which we helped get started. On May 2nd -- the same day you announced the budget deal -- the First Lady marked the Campaign's first anniversary in an East Room ceremony recognizing 12 individuals working to lower teen pregnancy rates. During its first year, the Campaign has focused on building its organization, engaging the media to promote pregnancy prevention messages, establishing linkages with state and local groups, and commissioning research on the problem and promising solutions. Former Gov. Thomas Kean, the Campaign's chairman, spoke along with the First Lady at the May 2nd event.

3. Welfare Maintenance of Effort and the Contingency Fund The governors also expressed concern about an issue involving maintenance of effort and the welfare contingency fund. In the welfare law, there are maintenance of effort requirements for both the TANF block grant and for the contingency fund states can access during recessions. There are two major differences between the MOE for the contingency fund and for the TANF block grant: states must maintain more of their historic state spending to access the contingency fund (100% vs. 75 or 80%) and they can count fewer kinds of state spending to meet the contingency fund MOE. It is the latter difference the governors propose to change. They argue that because states plan their programs around the definition for the basic TANF block grant, they may not be eligible for the contingency fund when they need it. They propose to unify the MOE definitions by adopting the easier-to-meet TANF definition which allows states to count state spending in programs for families that are not programmatically connected to the TANF block grant. We have generally resisted any attempts to weaken the maintenance of effort requirement and opposed accepting this change in the welfare technical corrections bill.

4. Immigration -- Impact of Immigration on the U.S.: A study released by the National Research Council found that immigration benefits the U.S. economy overall-- by as much as \$10 billion annually-- and has little negative effect on the income and job opportunities of most native-born Americans. Only in areas with high concentrations of low-skilled, low-paid immigrants are state and local taxpayers are paying more on average to support the publicly-funded services that immigrants use. While on an annual basis new immigrant families receive more in publicly-funded services than they pay in taxes, over the long term, the majority of new immigrants and their descendants will add more to the government coffers than they will receive during their lifetimes. In recent decades, however, the wage gap between new immigrants and native-born workers has grown substantially. The gap is largely attributable to the lower educational and skill levels of newer immigrants.

The study was funded by the U.S. Commission on Immigration Reform. The National Research Council operates the National Academy of Sciences and National Academy of Engineering.

5. Education -- School Voucher Amendment Passes in the Senate: During the debate on the budget resolution, the Senate passed an amendment, offered by Sen. Lott, which provides education vouchers for children who have been the victim of violent crimes. The bill provides for budget authority for this provision in FY2000, but no outlays in any year. The amendment passed by a 51-48 vote; no Democrat voted for the amendment, and four Republicans (Chaffee, Jeffords, Collins and Spector) voted against it. Both Sen. Lott and Sen. Dominici voted for the amendment.

The amendment was a surprise to almost everyone, and we are still not sure why it was drafted with no budget but no outlay authority. The expectation is that it will easily be dropped in conference. The main point seems to have been to provide an important symbolic victory. We believe this is the first time a voucher provision has ever passed in the Senate.

6. Education -- New Charter Schools Study: Next Wednesday the Department of Education is scheduled to release the first year findings of a planned 4-year study of charter schools and their impact on student achievement. The study includes an annual survey of all charter schools every year for 4 years. The first year results, are based on studies of schools in the ten states that had charter schools legislation when the study began. Key findings include:

- Over half of all charter schools are newly created; almost one-third were pre-existing public schools; a little over one-tenth were pre-existing private schools.
- In most states, charter schools are at least as economically and racially diverse as the overall population in the state's public schools. In several states (e.g., Arizona and Colorado) charter schools are less diverse.
- The three most significant obstacles cited by charter school leaders are lack of start up funds, lack of planning time, and inadequate facilities. Only 6% said federal regulations were a significant barrier to getting underway.

7. Education -- Reauthorization of Idea You requested additional information in response to a May 16 Wall Street Journal article which suggested that the overhauled IDEA does not go far enough in enabling school authorities to deal with disruptions caused by students with disabilities.

The new bill continues to provide procedural safeguards for students with disabilities, in order to protect their right a free and appropriate education. Within that framework, it strengthens the ability of teachers and principals to deal with disruptive or dangerous students, including those with disabilities. It does this by:

- making it easier for principals to remove children with disabilities who bring a gun, weapon or drugs to school, or who pose a danger to themselves, their teachers or their classmates from the classroom, while continuing to provide them with an education in another setting.
- making it easier to address a child's behavior problems early on -- before they get out of hand -- by requiring that these be considered in the development of an Individual Education Plan, and by making the regular classroom teacher a part of the team that develops the plan.

These changes were worked out in a bipartisan, bicameral group that also included the Administration and representatives of the education and disabilities communities. While not ideal from anyone's point of view, it represents something that all parties could agree to. Especially since education has such a strong culture of regulation, especially in special education, the maintenance of procedural requirements for removing students with disabilities from school (which have been at the heart of the federal guarantee of access to education) the bill

may be seen by some in the education community has still tying the hands of local administrators.

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STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT Hex-Dump Conversion

Today, I have approved H.R. 911, the "Volunteer Protection Act of 1997," which will provide volunteers working for non-profit and governmental entities certain protections from civil liability. Citizen service is the main way we recognize that we are responsible for one another, that we are members of a true community, with all of us working together.

Governments at all levels must encourage all our citizens to volunteer for service. This bill is a small part of what the federal government is doing to help people serve.

H.R. 911 is a limited and targeted bill that deals with the specific concerns of individuals serving our communities without compensation. It preserves for the states, the traditional source of tort law, not only the ability to opt out of the bill's provisions entirely, but also the right to require proper licensing and evidence of financial responsibility. It is important that none of the bill's limitations on liability will apply to misconduct that constitutes a crime of violence, an act of international terrorism, a hate crime, or to any misconduct that involves intoxication, drug use, a sexual offense or the violation of any State or Federal civil rights laws, or to actions on behalf of any organization that engages in hate crimes. Anyone hurt by a negligent volunteer will have recourse against the organization for whom the volunteer was working.

I remain concerned, however, that H.R. 911 contains both an absolute prohibition on joint and several liability for non-economic damages and elements of one-way preemption. These are both modifications of tort law that make it harder for innocent injured parties to recover. I emphasize that my signing this specialized and limited bill designed to promote individual citizen service in no way mitigates my opposition to these modifications if they were to be applied more generally. A prohibition on joint and several liability for non-economic damages hurts those least able to recover on their own -- poor, sick and older Americans. One-way preemption usurps state prerogatives to balance the rights and responsibilities of plaintiffs and

According to the Education Department, there are at least six school districts where kids from at least 1000 language backgrounds can be found. These include:

1. New York City (which is 5 counties itself; I don't have a county-by-county breakdown.
2. Chicago
3. Detroit
4. Milwaukee

6. Montgomery County, Maryland

This list is not exhaustive; the head of bilingual education started calling around at our request, and stopped at 6.

Elena-- on the voucher amendment, Lott did not introduce this; Dominici did for Coverdale. See how much confusion is rampant on this?

I would stress in the weekly (1) that it happened; (2) that it was occasioned by confusion; it happened quickly, the amendment was so poorly drafted that it is unimplementable; (3) that it provides something of a symbolic victory but one that we can and will downplay because of the confusion.

Weekly report:

SCHOOL VOUCHER AMENDMENT PASSES IN THE SENATE:

During the debate on the budget resolution, the Senate passed an amendment, offered by Sen. Lott, which provides education vouchers for children who have been the victim of violent crimes.

The bill provides for budget authority for this provision in FY2000, but no outlays in any year. The amendment passed by a 51-48 vote; no Democrat voted for the amendment, and four Republicans (Chaffee, Jeffords, Collins and Spector) voted against it. Both Sen. Lott and Sen. Dominici voted for the amendment.

The amendment was a surprise to almost everyone, and we are still not sure why it was drafted with no budget but no outlay authority. The expectation is that it will easily be dropped in conference. The main point seems to have been to provide an important symbolic victory. We believe this is the first time a voucher provision has ever passed in the Senate.

NEW CHARTER SCHOOLS STUDY

Next Wednesday the Department of Education is scheduled to release the first year findings of a planned 4-year study of charter schools and their impact on student achievement. The study includes an annual survey of all charter schools every year for 4 years. The first year results, are based on studies of schools in the ten states that had charter schools legislation when the study began. Key findings include:

- Over half of all charter schools are newly created; almost one-third were pre-existing public schools; a little over one-tenth were pre-existing private schools.
- In most states, charter schools are at least as economically and racially diverse as the overall population in the state's public schools. In several states (e.g., Arizona and Colorado) charter schools are less diverse.
- The three most significant obstacles cited by charter school leaders are lack of start up funds, lack of planning time, and inadequate facilities. Only 6% said federal regulations were a significant barrier to getting underway.

REAUTHORIZATION OF IDEA

You requested additional information in response to a May 16 Wall Street Journal article which suggested that the overhauled IDEA does not go far enough in enabling school authorities to deal with disruptions caused by students with disabilities.

The new bill continues to provide procedural safeguards for students with disabilities, in order to protect their right a free and appropriate education. Within that framework, it strengthens the ability of teachers and principals to deal with disruptive or dangerous students, including those with disabilities. It does this by:

- making it easier for principals to remove children with disabilities who bring a gun, weapon or drugs to school, or who pose a danger to themselves, their

teachers or their classmates from the classroom, while continuing to provide them with an education in another setting.

- making it easier to address a child's behavior problems early on -- before they get out of hand -- by requiring that these be considered in the development of an Individual Education Plan, and by making the regular classroom teacher a part of the team that develops the plan.

These changes were worked out in a bipartisan, bicameral group that also included the Administration and representatives of the education and disabilities communities. While not ideal from anyone's point of view, it represents something that all parties could agree to. Especially since education has such a strong culture of regulation, especially in special education, the maintenance of procedural requirements for removing students with disabilities from school (which have been at the heart of the federal guarantee of access to education) the bill may be seen by some in the education community as still tying the hands of local administrators.
