## **MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF EDUCATION**

Subject: Turning Around Low-Performing Public Schools

Since taking office in 1993, and with your strong leadership, my Administration has pursued a comprehensive effort to strengthen public schools. We have worked to raise academic standards, promote accountability, and provide greater competition and choice within the public schools, including support for a dramatic increase in charter schools. Moreover, we have worked to make the investments necessary to improve teaching and learning classrooms across America, through efforts to keep our schools safe and free of drugs; provide students who need it extra help to master the basics; increase parental and community involvement; recruit, prepare, and provide continuing training to teachers and reward excellence in teaching; and make sure every school has access to and can effectively use 21st Century technology.

This strategy is starting to produce results. We know for certain that all students can learn to high standards, and that every school can succeed if it has clear instructional goals and high expectations for all of its students, if it creates a safe, disciplined and orderly environment for learning, helps parents be involved in their child's education, and uses proven instructional practices. All schools must be given the resources, the tools, and the flexibility to help every student reach high standards.

Yet no school improvement strategy can succeed without real accountability for results, as measured by student achievement. Excellent schools and schools that show significant improvement must be recognized and rewarded. At the same time, schools that demonstrate persistently poor academic performance -- schools which fail to make adequate progress in educating all students to high standards -- must not be ignored. No American child deserves to get a second class education. Instead, local and state education officials must step in and redesign failing schools, or close them down and reopen them with new, more effective leadership and staff.

A growing number of states and cities have begun to take these steps. In addition to Chicago, cities such as San Francisco, Philadelphia and New York, and states such as Maryland and Kentucky identify low performing schools and take steps to intervene if these schools fail to make progress. These steps often include the implementation of school improvement plans -- providing after-school academic help to students, strengthening training and assistance for school staff, creating smaller and more personal settings, such as schools-within-schools -- and, where necessary, reconstitution of the school and replacement of the school principal and other staff.

We must encourage and help more cities and states to take up the challenge of turning around low performing schools and helping the students they serve get back on the path to meeting high standards. We can do this by making widely available information on what works and what doesn't, and by ensuring that Department of Education resources are most productively

used for these purposes.

In order to accomplish this, I am directing the Department of Education to:

**1. Produce and disseminate widely guidelines on effective approaches to turning around low performing schools.** There is much of value to be shared from the lessons and experiences of cities and states that have already successfully intervened in low performing schools, as well as from research and development on effective school improvement practices, and from business experience in managing high performance organizations and in turning round low-performing companies, and other sources. We know that there are now several promising models of school reform, ranging from the New American Schools designs to Robert Slavin's Success for All program. These lessons must be summarized in clear and useable formats, and made widely available to educators, parents, state and local policymakers, business leaders and others working to improve public education.

**2. Help states and cities committed to turning around low-performing schools use existing Department of Education resources to accomplish this goal.** U.S. Department of Education programs should help and encourage more states and cities to develop sound, comprehensive approaches to turn around low performing schools and help students in them get a better education, and, once developed, should support their implementation. In particular, the Education Department should develop a strategy to ensure that appropriate funds provided to state and local education systems under its existing programs can easily and effectively be used to support efforts to turn around failing schools. Second, the Education Department should develop a strategy, in collaboration with states and cities, to provide appropriate research, dissemination and technical assistance resources to support state and local initiatives. Third, the Education Department should consider whether additional federal incentives could effectively increase the number of states and cities that adopt rigorous accountability policies and effective strategies to intervene in failing schools.

Many Education Department programs are already well suited for intervening in failing schools, because they can be used to provide extra help to students during and after the school day, support high quality professional development for teachers, and plan and implement effective school reforms. The Education Department's should ensure that local school districts can access federal funds and use them in an integrated fashion to support their comprehensive efforts to improve low performing schools. Where there are statutory barriers to accomplishing this purpose they should be identified so we can work with the Congress to change them.

A number of existing Department of Education programs, including Title I and Goals 2000, require participating states and school districts to hold schools accountable for results, and provide resources that can be used for these purposes. Other existing programs also provide resources that can be used to address key problems faced by low-performing schools, such as the Eisenhower professional development program. The 21st Century Schools program can help

keep schools open longer hours and provide a setting in which students can get extra help after school. And the Public Charter Schools Program can be used to provide start-up funds to replace failed schools with new charter schools, or to provide students in low performing schools with additional choices within the public schools.

New initiatives under consideration in Congress can also provide important help. The Balanced Budget Agreement I reached with Congressional leaders last summer commits the Congress to enacting an early reading program consistent with the principles of my America Reads initiative. When fully established, this program will help mobilize an army of one million volunteer tutors to give students who need it extra help in order to learn to read independently by the 4th grade. These volunteers can be especially helpful for students in low performing schools.

In addition, the bipartisan Porter-Obey Comprehensive School Reform legislation currently under consideration by the Congress will, if funded, provide resources to assist schools implement proven practices for improving student learning. This can be particularly helpful to low performing schools.

Together, these initiatives can help local school districts turn failing schools into successful schools by improving teacher training, strengthening instructional practices, overhauling school management and implementing schoolwide reforms. They can provide students who need it extra help, during and after school. And they can provide students with additional choices within the public schools.

We know of several promising models of reform, ranging from the New American Schools designs to Robert Slavin's Success for All program. These lessons must be summarized in clear and useable forms, and made widely available to educators, parents, state and local policymakers, business leaders, and others working to improve public education.

**2. Help states and cities committed to turning around low-performing schools use existing Department of Education resources to accomplish this goal.** U.S. Department of Education programs should help and encourage more states and cities to develop and implement sound, comprehensive approaches to turn around low-performing schools and help students in them get a better education, and, once developed, should support their implementation. The Department should develop a plan to provide training and technical assistance to states and cities seeking to turn around failing schools. In addition, the Department should inform states and cities with how they can use funds from existing Education Department programs to support their objectives. Many programs, such as Title I, Goals 2000, the Public Charter Schools Program, and the 21st Century Schools Program, are well suited for intervening in failing schools, because they can be used to provide extra help to students during and after the school day, support high quality professional development for teachers, and plan and implement effective school reforms. The Education Department should ensure that local school districts can easily and effectively access federal funds from such programs and use them in an integrated fashion to support comprehensive efforts to improve low performing schools. Where there are statutory barriers to accomplishing this purpose, they should be identified so we can work with the Congress to change them.

Together, these initiatives can help local school districts turn failing schools into successful schools by improving teacher training, strengthening instructional practices, overhauling school management and implementing schoolwide reforms. They can provide students who need it with extra help, during and after school hours. And they can provide students with additional choices within the public schools.



California Bilingual Education (English for the Children) Initiative Meeting

3. What is the research and evidence on the impact of bilingual education programs? Are the initiative advocates basically on the mark or off the mark in claiming that only 5% of LEP kids in bilingual education programs gain English proficiency each year?
4. What are the California politics on this issue?
5. How are the Hispanic groups responding to this initiative--is there a unified position? How does this intersect with national test politics?

Subject: Private sector compliance activity funding and potential adr savings

You asked me to prepare a "back of the envelope" calculation of potential savings through increased use of mediation versus full investigation.

EEOC's budget allocates \$140 million to private sector compliance activity. This is the full cost of salaries and rent and computers and travel that the Commission spends on processing individual complaints of discrimination from private sector employees. EEOC spends an average \$1,750 on each of an estimated 80,000 cases annually.

Using ADR contracts of \$500 per case results in "savings" of \$1,250 per case processed. If 10 percent of the 80,000 cases were resolved using ADR, this would result in a "savings" of \$10 million for FY 1999. This funding could support 200 additional positions for private sector enforcement of more complex cases as well as help to reduce the time it takes the Commission to resolve cases from 1 year to 6 months by 2002.

You probably know this, but the President misspoke today in the DLC speech on America Reads. He said:

"Today, good news -- I expect to sign into law full funding for the America Reads challenge, which will significantly increase support, Senator Wofford, for Americorps, a legacy of the DLC, so that our young citizen service can harness the energy of a whole army of volunteer tutors, now including over 800 colleges and universities in America who are going out into schools to teach young children to read."

The suggested language I gave Waldman said, "Today I will sign an appropriations bill that will give the AmeriCorps program its first significant increase in funding since 1995. Those funds will support one of my highest priorities, the America Reads initiative..." I assume he ad-libbed the full funding line. Shireman says that Gene and Jake have clarified this for the press.

**Questions and Answers on School Vouchers**  
**October 27, 1997**

**Q: Democrats are filibustering the DC voucher bill in the Senate, and today they are scheduled to debate the Coverdell K-12 education savings accounts. Republicans are also considering adding a voucher provision to bipartisan charter schools legislation that you have endorsed. And tomorrow you are scheduled to meet with a number of House and Senate leaders and a family who support vouchers. Do you continue to oppose school vouchers, and if so, why?**

**A:** I strongly oppose any legislation allowing the use of federal taxpayer funds for vouchers.

We need to focus on strengthening the public schools that serve nearly 90% of students and expanding choice within the public education system, such as through charter schools.

Vouchers would siphon critical dollars from neighborhood public schools that are already short on resources in order to send a few selected students to private schools, and would distract attention from the hard work of reform needed to change failing schools into good schools and good schools into outstanding schools.

As I made clear in Chicago yesterday, no child deserves to get a second class education. Where schools are failing, local and state education officials must step in and redesign them, or close them down and reopen them with new, more effective leadership and staff who will raise standards, put into place effective reforms, and create safe, disciplined learning environments where students can succeed.

**Q: Some argue that vouchers are vital to help children escape ineffective, dangerous schools. What is your response to that?**

**A:** My opposition to vouchers is based more on what happens to students who do not participate in a voucher program than on what may happen to the few who do. The fact is that 90% of our students attend public schools, and our primary responsibility, especially with limited federal resources, is to make sure that the public schools they attend are among the best in the world. This means concentrating our time and money on raising academic standards, improving teaching, providing schools with technology and other up-to-date learning tools, and creating charter schools and other forms of choice within the public school system. Vouchers only drain financial resources and energy away from our most important task -- improving our public schools.

**QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**  
**October 27, 1997**

**Q: THE NEW YORK TIMES INDICATED TODAY THAT YOUR NOMINEE FOR HCFA ADMINISTRATOR, NANCY-ANN MIN DEPARLE IS BEING HELD UP OVER SENATOR KYL'S MEDICARE AMENDMENT. WHAT IS YOUR RESPONSE?**

**A:** If true, I am very disappointed that Senator Kyl or anyone else would hold up a well-qualified candidate from being confirmed as Administrator of the Health Care Financing Administration. The Medicare and Medicaid programs and the millions of Americans they serve cannot afford to have a delay in Nancy-Ann Min DeParle's confirmation.

With regard to Senator Kyl's proposal, which would allow physicians to privately contract with Medicare beneficiaries, I do have some concerns. First, it is premature to open up the Balanced Budget Act and all of the carefully constructed Medicare policies we passed into law just two months ago that will modernize the program extend the life of the trust fund for at least a decade. We should implement all of these reforms before opening up this debate. Second, representatives of the elderly, including AARP, have raised serious concerns about the Kyl Amendment citing the potential for fraud as well as reduced access to much needed physicians in rural communities. These and other concerns about Kyl's proposal deserve careful consideration before any modification to current law is made.

**Q: IN RECENT TESTIMONY BEFORE THE SENATE LABOR COMMITTEE, DONNA SHALALA INDICATED THAT THE ADMINISTRATION INTENDED TO SEND LETTERS TO STATES WHO HAVE MADE SETTLEMENTS THROUGH THE TOBACCO INDUSTRY THAT AFFIRM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT'S STATUTORY AUTHORITY TO ITS PORTION OF ANY MEDICAID SAVINGS?**

**A:** The Medicaid program is funded by both the Federal and State governments. (Federal government funds on average 57 percent of these costs). The law provides that the Federal portion of any recaptured Medicaid expenditures by the states, whether it be for fraud and abuse cases or other provider overpayments, must be returned to the Federal government.

While we must enforce the law, we also well recognize that a national legislative agreement on tobacco will inevitably raise Federal/state allocation issues that must be addressed through the legislative process. We look forward to working with the states on this important issue.

**Q: CAN YOU GIVE US ANY INDICATION AS TO WHO YOU ARE CONSIDERING TO APPOINT TO THE MEDICARE COMMISSION?**

**A:** As you know, we have to announce these appointments on December 1. I am still in the process of considering a range of highly qualified candidates with a wide variety of backgrounds and expertise in health care and the Medicare program. I have yet to make any final decisions at this time.

**Q: WILL YOU BE APPOINTING ANY MEMBERS TO THE COMMISSION?**

**A:** There are obviously lots of members who could add a tremendous amount to this Commission. However, I have not made any final decisions.
