Julie, OMB, and I are opposing INS and the State Department actions that are endangering our efforts to sign up as many children for Medicaid as possible and to restore food stamps and other benefits to legal immigrants. A formerly obscure feature of immigration law requires the INS or State to bar people from the U.S. who are likely to be a "public charge." Because of crackdowns by INS/State since welfare reform passed, word has spread in immigrant communities that signing up yourself or your children for Medicaid or other benefits puts you at risk with the INS -- and while these fears are exaggerated, they are not crazy. For example, legal immigrants with green cards who leave the country for more than 6 months are not permitted to re-enter the country if they are currently on Medicaid.

The INS wants to issue guidance that current receipt on SSI, TANF, Medicaid, or sometimes food stamps automatically makes you a public charge -- even though you're legitimately eligible for benefits -- preventing you from adjusting your immigration status or leaving the U.S. for more than 6 months. (They say this is current policy, but that's quite murky.) The advocates are starting to jump on this issue. We have enlisted Rob Weiner of WH counsel and James Castello at DOJ to help us figure out whether the law will allow us to rescue just Medicaid or whether we can go even further to say the INS shouldn't consider receipt of benefits in determining public charge, but simply look at income, assets, etc. The further we go, the more we will enrage Lamar Smith. The INS is fearful of provoking him, and feels that some of the options we're considering fly in the face of the common sense meaning of the term "public charge." The State Department appears baffled that we are concerned about this issue and dug-in to their position.

Just wanted to make sure you're aware and on board. Chris, Bruce Bullen of Massachusetts has written you on this issue.

The Senate will convene Thursday, May 21, at 9:30 a.m., and resume consideration of S. 1415, the Tobacco legislation, with the Gregg second degree amendment to the Gregg-Leahy amendment striking the liability caps pending.

A roll call vote on a motion to table the Gregg-Leahy amendment may occur as early as 11:00 a.m. (No consent agreement has been entered regarding this vote.)

Following disposition of the Gregg-Leahy amendment, Senator Durbin is expected to offer an amendment regarding the look-back provisions.

Upon disposition of the Durbin amendment, the Senate is expected to consider the farmer provisions in the modified committee substitute, including a vote on the motion to strike the Ford language, followed by a vote on the motion to strike the McConnell/Lugar language.

(No consent agreements have been entered regarding the Tobacco bill schedule.)

Dear Senator McCain:

I support your efforts in helping to pass comprehensive tobacco legislation which dramatically reduces youth smoking and to remove Section 604 which requires Indian tribes to collect state taxes on sales of tobacco products.

Since the formation of the Union, the United States has recognized Indian tribes as "domestic dependent nations" that exercise governmental authority over their members and their territory. Where Indians manufacture tobacco products on their own lands, state taxes on reservation-generated tobacco products would normally be pre-empted under the tribal self-determination doctrine. Section 604, as currently drafted, interferes with this fundamental principle. Even with respect to state taxes collected on sales of pre-packaged goods to non-Indians, Section 604 violates traditional principles of comity and federalism, which demand that state-tribal relations be developed based on dialogue and cooperation between states and tribes.

Section 604 establishes a complex scheme to address a problem that states and Indian tribes have already resolved or have the means to resolve. At least eighteen states have entered into state-tribal tax agreement with numerous Indian tribes. These agreements ensure that a single tax is imposed, provide a stable tax framework, and ease tax administration significantly. By unilaterally requiring Indian tribes to collect the state taxes and also adding the federal government as an intermediary, Section 604 enormously increases the burden of collecting taxes, without any substantial benefit to the states or the Indian tribes. Federal accounting, oversight, and administrative costs will increase to implement this new legislative scheme.

Agreements are the best mechanisms for mutually satisfactory resolution of tax collection issues between states and tribes. Even if states and tribes are unable to reach agreement, however, states may impose their taxes at the wholesale level to collect taxes on goods that are destined for sale to non-Indians.

As originally drafted, the McCain bill did not disturb the current system, which has worked for both the tribes and the states. It permitted the states and the tribes to work together to collect the state's revenues and to share revenues if they so desire. Moreover, it vindicated the federal government's trust responsibility to Indian tribes and recognized their status as domestic dependent nations.

Thank you for your important work in this area.

**Tobacco -- Senate Update:** On Monday, the Senate began consideration of the McCain bill. Members filed approximately 100 amendments and debate has proceeded at a slow pace. The following amendments were considered:

- Faircloth amendment to impose a \$250 per hour cap on attorney fees. Rejected.
- Kennedy amendment to increase the price to \$1.50 per pack phased in over three years. Rejected: 58-40.
- Ashcroft amendment to strike the \$1.10 per pack price increase. Rejected: 72-26.
- Gregg-Leahy amendment to remove the \$8 billion liability cap and other liability protections. Adopted 61-37.
- Gramm to eliminate the tax code's marriage penalty.
- Durbin amendment to increase the company-specific penalty and reduce the industry wide-penalty.
- Amendment to strike Senator Ford's LEAF Act (and keep the Lugar farm provisions.)

Given the slow speed at which they are proceeding, it is currently unclear whether the Senate can wrap the bill up before the Memorial Day recess, or whether debate will continue after they reconvene in June. [THIS IS SUMMARY AS OF 4:00PM THURS; WILL NEED TO BE UPDATED.]

**Tobacco -- MMWR Study:** The Centers for Disease Control released on Thursday new statistics on teenage smoking patterns and addiction. The data found that: (1) teenagers find it difficult to quit smoking -- 86 percent of teens who smoke daily and try to quit are unsuccessful; (2) teenagers underestimate the addictiveness of nicotine -- 75 percent of teenage daily smokers who expect to quit are still smoking five years later; (3) casual smokers become hooked -- 42 percent of young people who smoke as few as three cigarettes per month go on to become regular smokers. Currently, 36.4 percent of high school students smoke.

**Immigration -- H-1B visas:** Last Wednesday, the House Judiciary Committee approved by a vote of 23-4 a bill, authored by Rep. Lamar Smith, increasing the cap on H-1B visas while making substantial reforms to protect qualified U.S. workers from being displaced or passed over

in favor of temporary foreign workers to the program. Unfortunately, the Smith bill does not contain a training component. Prior to the mark-up, Secretaries Daley and Herman and the Attorney General sent a letter to Chairman Hyde indicating that the Administration would support the bill if it were modified to include a meaningful training provision and a more modest increase in the cap.

Last week, the Senate passed a similar bill that temporarily increases the cap and authorizes money for increased training through Title IV of the JTPA, but does not include any meaningful reform of the H-1B program. OMB sent a Statement of Administration Position (SAP) that related if the final bill did not include meaningful reform of the H-1B program, the Secretary of Labor would recommend a veto.

**Immigration -- INS Reform:** Last Wednesday, Rep. Rogers introduced an INS restructuring bill that generally tracks the recommendations of the United States Commission on Immigration Reform. The bill was referred to the Judiciary Committee. INS has prepared draft legislation that would implement our restructuring plan, which we plan to have introduced soon after the Memorial Day break (possibly by Rep. Watt or Sen. Kennedy). Sen. Abraham has announced his intention to hold hearings starting in June on INS restructuring, though he has stated it is unlikely that a restructuring plan would be in place by the end of this Congress.

**Crime -- COPS Event:** Next Friday, we have an event tentatively scheduled to: 1) celebrate the milestone of the 75,000th cop funded under your COPS initiative; and 2) launch a new pilot project to target COPS funding toward distressed neighborhoods. The first phase of the pilot will fund more than 500 officers; the COPS office is currently finalizing the list of participating cities which they expect will include 10 large and 10 small cities across the country.

**Crime -- Police bills:** Last Friday, the Congress passed two bills strongly supported by law enforcement and the Administration. One bill creates a grant program to help local law enforcement agencies purchase additional bulletproof vests; the other helps fund counseling services for dependents of slain officers. We are working with Rahm Emanuel and Legislative Affairs to schedule a signing ceremony for these bills as part of the COPS event, or at some later date.

**Drunk Driving -- .08 BAC:** Last weekend, conferees to the highway bill agreed to include a new \$500 million incentive grant program for states with .08 BAC laws instead of imposing sanctions on states that fail to pass .08 laws. MADD and others such as Senator Lautenberg and Representative Lowey were extremely disappointed with the outcome on the .08 issue. Conferees and committee staff are pushing hard to complete their work to allow the Congress to vote on the final bill prior to the Memorial Day recess.

**Health Care -- Patients' Bill of Rights Update:** There were reports this week that Speaker Gingrich is trying to stop any patients' bill of rights legislation from moving this year by stalling and diluting the efforts of his Republican task force led by Rep. Hastert.

**We have learned that Rep. Norwood shares our frustration and is quietly talking to Rep. Dingell about a possible discharge petition to bypass the House Republican Task Force and the Committees of Jurisdiction. We are extremely encouraged by these discussions and are pursuing this and other strategies to move this legislation. To increase momentum on this issue, you are scheduled to participate in an event next week to release a state-by-state analysis to illustrate how many Americans are not covered by state patient protection laws, even where they exist (125 million). This event will also highlight why the patients' protections are so important to women -- women are larger consumers of health care than men and reports now confirm that complaints made by women are seen as less urgent than men and consequently, women are less likely to be referred to specialists. Nancy Dickey, the newly-appointed first women chair of the American Medical Association, is also scheduled to participate in this event.**

**Campaign Finance Reform -- Free TV Petition:** Today, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) will place into circulation a Notice of Inquiry (NOI), opening a proceeding on free and discounted air time for candidates. The NOI is expected to pass within the month at which point it will become open for public comment. The FCC will conclude the NOI and submit a report to Congress by the end of the year. The recommendations of The President's Advisory Committee On the Public Interest Obligations of Digital Broadcasters will be included in the FCC's final report to Congress.

**Education -- Bilingual Education:** The House Subcommittee on Children, Youth and Families reported out a bill offered by Rep. Riggs that would replace the current bilingual and immigrant education programs with a block grant to states to help LEP students master English within two years. States would be required to cut off funds to any local program that does not meet the 2-year deadline for all students, and would be prohibited from exempting any students from state testing programs in English if the student has been in school for two years. **Funds under this bill would be less effectively targeted to high need communities than in the current program. The bill also ends funding for teacher training.** In addition, this bill would void existing compliance agreements between the Education Department's Office of Civil Rights and local school districts regarding the provision of services to LEP students, and would prohibit the Department of Education from entering into additional agreements until it proposes, and Congress ratifies, guidelines and compliance standards for Title VI. DPC staff have been working closely with other WH offices and the Education Department to develop a strategy for addressing the Riggs bill, and to prepare alternative legislation that could be introduced if appropriate, which fully reflects the principles for strengthening programs for LEP students you approved along with the decision to oppose the Unz Initiative. We will send you a more detailed status report on this issue this coming week.

*Note to Elena: You may recall that we have been talking about linking any veto threat to the Riggs bill to the introduction of an alternative bill reflecting our anti-Unz principles--despite the wishes of the Hispanic Caucus that we threaten to veto but not propose an alternative. The bill that was marked up today is a new Riggs bill, including civil rights and testing*

*provisions described above that were not included in the draft we had seen. I believe that the new Riggs bill may change our calculations about linking the veto threat and alternative legislation, because the civil rights provisions seem to be so objectionable on their own. I've written the paragraph above to give us the room to consider this possibility, and hope that your final version will do the same.*

**Education -- Class Size:** Congressional Democrats and the NEA, AFT and other education groups are upset that the agreement we reached with NGA on spending the state share of tobacco funds did not include your class size reduction proposal, and some fault us for walking away from this initiative. In response, we met with Sen. Patty Murray, the prime Senate sponsor, and agreed to look for ways to help keep this issue alive, including looking for offsets that would enable her to bring this to the floor for debate. Even though the chances of enactment are slim, our ability to mobilize the education groups behind our overall education agenda as we head into the Fall depends in part on continuing to press for funding for your class size proposal.

**Education -- New Orleans Schools:** Several weeks ago you expressed concern about a controversy involving the Education Department's Office of Civil Rights and the New Orleans schools, regarding the use of IQ tests for admission to the Benjamin Franklin High School, a selective magnet school. OCR has been working with the local school board to resolve a complaint about the use of IQ test cutoff score as an admissions requirement regardless of grades or other indicators of academic performance. The local school board has already agreed to halt that practice, and to develop a new approach that would still maintain high admissions standards. The immediate controversy revolved around a decision by the local school board to rescind admission decisions that had already been announced for the next school year. OCR has told the board not to rescind its admissions decisions for the coming year, but instead to focus on developing new admissions criteria for the following school year. OCR understands the importance of working with New Orleans to resolve this in a fashion that enables the school to maintain high standards, and that does not undermine the Administration's commitment to high standards and testing.

**Welfare Reform -- Welfare-to-Work Celebration:** A series of activities are scheduled for May 27th to celebrate the success of the welfare-to-work effort, with a particular spotlight on the Welfare-to-Work Partnership and on the importance of job retention. As part of the celebration, you will join a small working meeting of CEOs from the Board of the Partnership and key Cabinet officials in the Roosevelt Room, where you will have a chance to congratulate these businesses for their extraordinary success in both hiring and retaining welfare recipients, and urge them to sustain their commitment. Over the last year, the Partnership has grown from 100 businesses to 5,000 today, and their business partners have hired 135,000 welfare recipients. In a recent survey of these businesses by the Wirthlin group, 75% found welfare recipients to be good, productive employees. United Airlines and others have found that the people hired off welfare have higher retention than other new employees.

Following the working meeting is an event in the East Room where you will be joined on the program by the VP, Eli Segal, Jerry Greenwald from United, and a welfare-to-work success story. At the event, you will announce the first round of Welfare-to-Work Competitive grants and the latest welfare caseload reductions, and you will challenge the Partnership to double the number of people hired by their business partners in the coming year. **In the front row will be the success stories you met in Wichita and St. Louis, along with new success stories from United, UPS, and other companies. Other invitees include a group of Welfare-to-Work Competitive grant winners (from local governments, PICs, and non-profit organizations). In conjunction with the event, the Partnership will release a report called the *Road to Retention*, which profiles the retention successes of 16 large and small businesses. The Partnership will also release welfare-to-work PSAs.**

## Poverty Measurement Policy Working Group -- May 26

The primary purpose of this meeting is to try and reach consensus around a key set of policy recommendations related to the issues our group has been discussing over the past three months. These are recommendations to the Census about how they might present their alternative poverty measurement calculations. Attached to this agenda is a one-page summary of the NAS recommendations for a new poverty line measure, and a one-page summary of the four policy issues we've discussed at our last four meetings.

### AGENDA

#### I. Key issues to be discussed

**A. How should the thresholds be determined** in the first year an alternative measure is published? To be specific: should the alternative poverty rate be benchmarked in 1997 to be identical to the 1997 official poverty rate or is there an alternative "benchmark" that makes more sense?

(Note: We appear to have a general consensus within the group from our earlier discussions to support benchmarking the alternative poverty rate to the 1997 official rate.)

**B. How should the poverty thresholds be updated over time?** Specifically, (1) should they be adjusted on an annual basis by the overall CPI or by a CPI for food shelter & clothing only and revisited every 5-10 years for a more complete recalculation; or (2) Should they be completely recalculated each year as a share of current expenditures on food, clothing, and housing?

(Note: There seemed to be general consensus for the first approach, particularly if a CPI for food, shelter and clothing was used. OMB seemed reasonably confident that they and Census could establish a process to assure that poverty measurement is reviewed on a regular basis.)

**C. Should the poverty thresholds be adjusted for geographic variations in the cost of living?**

(Note: There seemed to be general consensus that any "base" alternative poverty measurement should not include geographical price variation, although Census may well want to publish an alternative that includes this as part of the NAS recommendations.)

**D. How (if at all) should the adjustment for Medical out-of-pocket (MOOP) expenditures occur?** Specifically, should the Census follow the NAS recommendations to impute MOOP and subtract it from individual income before calculating individual poverty status?

(Note: There is more disagreement on this issue than on any other. The three deputies present at our last meeting generally agreed that the Census should follow the NAS recommendations for now, but that further work refining these calculations (and considering other alternatives) should go forward. But some of the staff present at the meeting were in less agreement.)

**E. Do we have any recommendations to Census about how to present their alternative poverty calculations?** Specifically, do we want to recommend they present a primary "base" alternative poverty calculation (for instance: benchmarked to 1997, updated by the CPI for necessities, without geographic price variation, and including MOOP), and then a few alternatives (with and without MOOP, with and without geographic price variation)?

## NAS Recommendations on How to Measure Poverty

A poverty measure consists of two pieces: (1) A definition of family resources, and (2) A poverty threshold against which resources are compared. If resources are below the threshold, a family is considered poor.

### (1) Defining Family Resources

Family resources = Cash income

+ Near money in-kind benefits (food stamps, housing subsidies, school lunch, LIHEAP, etc)

- Taxes

- Child care costs (for families in which there is no nonworking parent, with a cap, and not to exceed the earnings of the parent with lower earnings)

- Work expenses (a flat amount per week of work)

- Child support payments

- Out of pocket medical care expenditures, including health insurance premiums.

### (2) Defining a Poverty Threshold

The threshold should be determined for a family of four (two adults and two children) based on a point in the distribution of annual expenditures by such families on food, clothing, and shelter, plus a small multiplier. (This is based on Consumer Expenditure Survey data, probably using a three-year average to guarantee adequate sample size.) The recommended percentage of annual expenditures is between 30 and 35 percent (i.e., 15 to 20 percentage points below the median); recommended multipliers are between 1.15 to 1.25.

Thresholds for other family sizes should be determined based on an equivalence scale calculation. The NAS panel recommends using

$$\text{Scale value} = (A + PK)^F$$

where A is the number of adults and K the number of kids. P is the scaling for children (if P=1, kids are treated the same as adults); and F is the scaling for family size. The NAS panel recommends P=0.70 and F in a range of 0.65 to 0.75.

Geographic costs of living are taken into account, based on a regional index of housing costs (which varies by size of metropolitan area and region of country) which is weighted by the share of housing costs in the expenditure bundle.

Over time, new poverty threshold should be updated by recalculating annual expenditures on the most recent three years of data, and reapplying these other calculations using the most recent data available on housing costs.

#### **Pros of benchmarking:**

There may be large political advantages to saying “We want to improve the measure of poverty, but to show you that we’re doing this in a non-political manner, we’ll benchmark so there is no change in the overall aggregate poverty rate in the year we implement this change.” There are still those who will be upset about the changes in the distribution of poverty or in the past history of poverty rates, which will change (you can benchmark one year only.)

#### **Cons of benchmarking**

Backing out a threshold so that the current poverty rate is unchanged produces a threshold that is very far down in the percentile distribution of expenditures on food, shelter and clothing -- somewhere around 20-25% rather than the 30-35% range recommended by the NAS.

#### **Pros of using the NAS alternative** (which establishes a higher threshold and higher poverty rates)

Utilizes the recommendations of the NAS panel, based on their judgement about the accumulation of evidence.

Maintains threshold levels that are very similar to the current thresholds (it’s not clear how much this matters given the resource definition has changed.)

#### **Cons of using the NAS alternative**

Results in a substantially higher poverty rate, which will draw an great deal of criticism. At the same time, it has the same problems as benchmarking, in that it also changes history and it changes the relative poverty share of different groups (although all subgroup poverty rates would go up.)

#### **Pros of a more relative approach (B or C above):**

1. CPI-adjusted thresholds become obsolete over time. As standards of living change, so do social norms.
2. If we don't create the expectation of a regular recalculation/update of the poverty line, we'll end up in 30 years exactly where we are today, using an outmoded statistic.
3. If we calculate the thresholds relative to some level of median expenditures on necessities, it is most consistent if we update in the same way, i.e., with a procedure that changes the thresholds relative to median expenditures on necessities.

#### **Pros of CPI updating (A or B above):**

1. Relative changes create a moving target of poverty. In the short run, one is most interested in knowing how many people have purchasing power above a pre-set level. If the level changes with standards of living, it's much harder to interpret the poverty statistics.
2. Standard of living changes (and social norm changes) occur only very slowly. Better to take them into account every-so-often, rather than to embed them annually into the poverty rate.
3. If we update with a CPI for necessities only (food, shelter, & clothing), we might capture most of the relevant changes (since much of the change in expenditures on these items is due to price changes rather than quantity changes) and have an easier time explaining the short run updating procedure.

### Policy Issue 3: Adjusting for Geographic Variations in Cost of Living

#### Agenda

#### **Reasons to adjust for geographic variation:**

If the poverty thresholds provide a measure of "income needs" they should reflect cost of living differences across regions. Theoretically, most statisticians/economists agree that such adjustments should be done if the data is available.

#### **Reasons not to adjust for geographic variation:**

Adjustments in the thresholds can lead to a "slippery slope", with advocacy groups arguing that such price adjustments should be done in a wide variety of program benefit payments as well. This can also lead to much greater efforts by legislators to intervene in exactly how the "correct" regional price adjustments are done.

Researchers would not be able to duplicate poverty counts based on geographic price variation because the detailed geographic information required to calculate these would violate privacy constraints in some cases.

#### **Tentative consensus among the group:**

\* If Census decides that they want to publish a poverty count based on thresholds with geographical price variation, we recommend that such an adjustment not be part of the "base" alternative poverty count, but one of the alternatives.

\* At some point in the future, should we discuss changing the poverty guidelines used for program purposes, these should not include geographical price variation.

## Policy Issue 4: Accounting for Medical Out-of-Pocket (MOOP) Expenditures

#### **Pros of handling MOOP as recommended by the NAS (subtracting it from income):**

\* The NAS argues (and some of our group strongly agree) that it is better to remove MOOP from the income side rather than add it into the threshold side.

\* This is the approach that Census has investigated and can implement in a timely fashion.

\* The alternative of ignoring MOOP entirely (neither taking account of it in the thresholds nor the income side) has real credibility problems, given extensive attention to the problems of lack of insurance and high out-of-pocket medical expenditures.

\* If we do this adjustment now, further changes that better take account of MOOP in the future will involve relatively small changes to the poverty numbers. If we don't do it now and want to take account of MOOP in the base alternative in the future, it will involve a major realignment of numbers.

#### **Cons of handling MOOP as recommended by the NAS:**

\* The data for imputing MOOP is not as recent as we'd like (although this will improve markedly in the next few years.)
