EXCERPTED REMARKS

ON LONG-TERM CARE TAX CREDIT

DOVER, NEW HAMPSHIRE

February 18, 1999

I want to talk this morning about meeting the greatest challenge of the new century: the aging of America. As the Baby Boom becomes the Senior Boom, long-term care will become a growing need. So it is more important than ever that we help families provide that essential kind of care for their loved ones. In my balanced budget, I have proposed and paid for a long-term care tax credit of \$1,000 to help families do exactly that. . .

Providing long-term care at home is, more and more often, a common choice, but it is rarely an easy one. . . We have taken steps to ease the burdens on these families in a number of ways: by strengthening Medicare, by extending the trust fund, by promoting prevention and cracking down on fraud and abuse. But the aging of America in the 21st Century will demand more of us. The long-term care tax cut I proposed last month would help to meet the needs of individual families, empowering them to do what is best, showing them how very much we value the work they do. . . Caregiving is a vital and sacred compact among generations -- and one we should recognize and reward as a nation.

A long-term care tax cut is exactly the kind of tax cut we should be making. As you know, we are engaged in a great national debate right now about how to use the budget surplus. Now, we can all agree that America should have tax cuts. But there are two very different ways we can go about it. First, there is the old way -- failed and full of risk -- that some Republicans are trying to resurrect. They are saying: splurge today, save tomorrow. That's not the approach that Vice President Gore and I have proposed. Our approach says invest today, save for tomorrow. Our kind of tax cut is one that doesn't destroy our fiscal discipline, but preserves it. Our kind of tax cut is not indiscriminate, but is, instead, targeted to meet people's real needs for the future. Above all, our kind of tax cut allows us to meet our responsibility to future generations -- and to invest the lion's share of the surplus in saving Social Security and Medicare first.

Even some Republican moderates are coming to see the wisdom in this approach, in targeted tax cuts. I look forward to working with them to make the right choices for future generations -- to make sure we don't squander our historic opportunity to save Social Security and Medicare, and pay down the debt. As I said in my State of the Union Address one month ago, we can make good on that opportunity -- while providing tax relief like USA Accounts, and while making targeted tax cuts in areas from urban investment to clean energy technology, and from child care to long-term care. That is the way we should use our surplus: We should invest it. Invest it in America's future.

PRESIDENT CLINTON: EDUCATION INVESTMENTS THAT WORK

February 22, 1999

Today, in an address to the National Governors Association, President Clinton will reiterate his call for a new era of accountability in American education, and will ask Congress to pass his agenda to give states the tools they need to provide all children with a world-class education.

Building on What Works to Strengthen Accountability. In his State of the Union address, President Clinton announced a package of accountability measures designed to hold students, teachers, and schools to the high standards that will be the keys to success in the twenty-first century. In his remarks to the nation's governors at the White House, President Clinton will discuss his plan to support state and local school reform efforts through bold new steps to insure that federal support for education is directed only toward programs and policies that work to improve student achievement. The President will shortly send to Congress his Education Accountability Act, which will require states and school districts that receive federal funds to end social promotion; to insure that all teachers are qualified; to turn around their lowest-performing schools; to provide parents with annual report cards on school performance and to institute effective school discipline policies.

National Leadership in Support of State Reform. President Clinton will also applaud the efforts that North Carolina, Michigan, Delaware, Pennsylvania, California and other states are making, under the leadership of committed governors, to implement these common-sense principles. The President will call on all states to take similar steps to ensure that all of America's children reap the rewards of strengthened accountability. While states and school districts have made important progress in instituting rigorous academic standards, a great deal of work remains to be done to help schools, teachers and students meet those standards. Only 26 states now require students to pass high school graduation exams, and far fewer have policies in place to require students to show that they have mastered the skills necessary to be promoted from grade to grade. Just 19 states have policies to intervene in low-performing schools and turn them around. And there are some 50,000 people teaching in America's schools on emergency teaching licenses - which means that they have not met the standards set by states for beginning teachers.

Investments To Support World-Class Education. The President's effort to support high academic standards for all children includes an unprecedented

commitment of national resources to help states and local districts improve education. President Clinton's balanced budget calls for strengthened investments in education to hire 100,000 teachers to reduce class size in the early grades, modernize up to 6,000 schools, triple funding for after-school activities, improve the quality of teaching, increase literacy, enhance the use of technology in the schools, recruit outstanding teachers in underserved high-poverty rural areas and inner cities, and provide new pathways to college for disadvantaged students.

As many of you know, Harris has worked extremely hard to develop strong bi-partisan support for AmeriCorps. This prospecting for support is time-consuming, and the results come slowly. Sometimes they come so slowly that one wonders if they are coming at all.

Well today we got a big break, one that Harris has been working on for a long time. In a story in today's Columbus Dispatch, Rep. John Kasich said that he has changed his mind about AmeriCorps, and that he would no longer vote to eliminate the program.

Some time ago, Kasich visited the Harlem Peacemakers program and was exceptionally impressed by the program. He was surprised to learn that many of the people working with the program were AmeriCorps members, and soon thereafter told Harris that this experience was causing him to rethink his view of AmeriCorps. Kasich then had a long session with Harris in which he learned more about AmeriCorps, and clearly seemed to be reconsidering his position. Today's story shows that he has completed his decision-making process.

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### Kasich reverses on AmeriCorps

MUSCATINE, Iowa -- When Rep. John R. Kasich visited an AmeriCorps office Friday during a campaign stop for his presidential bid, he revealed that he has changed his mind about the federal program.

The Westerville Republican and House Budget Committee chairman said he has been transformed in recent months from a foe to a fan.

Kasich in the past joined many other Republicans trying unsuccessfully to eliminate the Clinton administration program. AmeriCorps provides a stipend and educational scholarships to those who spend a year in public service jobs.

Critics have said AmeriCorps isn't a true volunteer effort because participants are paid. Some questioned whether the benefits are worth the cost.

But AmeriCorps has stopped calling its participants volunteers, and Kasich said he has witnessed AmeriCorps making valuable public-service contributions.

"I have seen them do some amazing things in Harlem . . . I know that AmeriCorps workers were involved in a number of the homeless programs," he said. "I would like to spend some time trying to refocus pieces of it and trying to make it more of a public/private situation, but I don't think I would cast a vote anymore that would eliminate it."

Kasich said the program can be made more effective, "but they've done some really great work, and I'm impressed with them."

Tina Dunphy, a slightly surprised AmeriCorps project director who greeted Kasich when he entered her storefront office in this eastern Iowa town, said 20 "members" work here on such projects as tutoring and mentoring elementary-school students.

Clinton has requested \$585 million for AmeriCorps in his 2000 budget proposal, a \$113 million increase over current funding. The increase would add 20,000 participants to the program, for a total of 70,000. Clinton has proposed funding 100,000 members in 2002.

**Gun Tracing  
Question and Answer  
February 22, 1999**

**Q: Over the weekend, the Treasury Department released a report on its gun tracing efforts. What were the major findings of the report?**

**A:** Yesterday, the Treasury Department released its second major report on President Clinton's Youth Crime Gun Interdiction Initiative (YCGII) in place in 27 cities across the nation. Among the report's major findings were:

- Over 25 percent of guns recovered by law enforcement in the 27 cities are moving rapidly from retail sale to point of recovery by law enforcement. This short "time to crime" suggests that these guns were likely to have been illegally trafficked.
- Over half (51 percent) of the guns used in crimes by juveniles and youths ages 18-24 were acquired by intermediaries such as straw purchasers acting on behalf of the real buyer.
- Over 11 percent of guns used in crime were possessed by juveniles (age 17 and under), and over 32 percent were possessed by youths ages 18-24.
- Semi-automatic pistols were predominant among crime guns in each of the 27 cities, and constitute over half (52 percent) of all trace requests.
- Over one-third of traffickers involved in illegal trafficking investigations had prior felony convictions.

The 27 cities included in the YCGII report are: Atlanta, Baltimore, Birmingham, Boston, Bridgeport (CT), Chicago, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Detroit, Gary, Houston, Inglewood (CA), Jersey City, Los Angeles, Memphis, Miami, Milwaukee, Minneapolis, New York, Philadelphia, Richmond (VA), Salinas (CA), San Antonio, St. Louis, Seattle, Tucson, and Washington, DC.

**In addition, a performance report released by the Treasury Department on YCGII last week, showed that of ATF's 648 illegal trafficking investigations involving youth and juveniles -- 51 percent involved straw purchasers or straw purchaser trafficking rings.**

The President's FY 2000 budget includes an additional \$11.2 million for YCGII for more tracing and new ATF agents to bolster trafficking investigations-- bringing the total funding for this initiative to \$45.2 million.

Enclosed for the consideration of the Congress is a bill entitled the "Hazard Reporting Protection Act of 1999." Its purpose is to enhance protections for employees who report workplace hazards to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). These whistleblower protections are intended to protect an employee from discrimination or discharge from his or her position based on reporting an injury, illness or unsafe condition.

On April 28, 1998, Charles Jeffress, Assistant Secretary for OSHA, testified before the U.S. House of Representatives Subcommittee on Workforce Protections regarding amendments to the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (OSH Act). Assistant Secretary Jeffress emphasized that one way to strengthen protections for workers would be to increase the protections under section 11(c) of the Act. He testified that under the current protections, the Inspector General of the Department of Labor found that "whistleblowers" often face retaliation for exposing unsafe or unhealthy conditions. He has pointed out that in its current state, the provisions in section 11(c) are too weak and too cumbersome to provide effective protections for workers. Today, I propose that the OSH Act be amended to reflect these concerns.

Support for strengthening section 11(c) can be traced back to a report of the Administrative Conference of the United States in 1987. Secretaries of Labor Ann McLaughlin, Elizabeth Dole and Robert Reich each stated their support for increasing the statutory safeguards for employee whistleblowers. Efforts to pass legislation amending whistleblower protections have been attempted since the 101<sup>st</sup> Congress. It is time that affirmative steps are taken to correct a problem that has been apparent for over a decade.

The amendment to section 11(c) is an effort to bring OSH Act protections to the levels afforded by other federal statutes such as 49 U.S.C. 31105, the whistleblower provisions of the Surface Transportation Assistance Act (STAA), the Federal Whistleblowers Protection Act of 1989, and the Mine Safety and Health Act. If employees cannot be protected against retaliation, they will not feel free to bring hazards to the attention of management or violations of the law to the attention of OSHA. Effective whistleblower protections are essential to the kind of employee involvement the nation needs to make continued improvement in the

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safety and health of our workplaces.

The mission of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration is to assure safe and healthful working conditions for working men and women. It is under this charge that the proposed amendment to section 11(c) of the OSH Act is presented to Congress.

To amend the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 to

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of

**SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; REFERENCE.**

(a) SHORT TITLE.--This Act may be cited as the "Hazard Reporting  
Protection Act of 1999."

(b) REFERENCE.--Except as otherwise expressly provided,  
whenever in this Act an amendment or repeal is expressed in terms  
of an amendment to, or repeal of, a section or other provision, the  
reference shall be considered to be made to a section or other  
provision of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C.  
651 et seq.)

**SEC. 2. EMPLOYEE ACTIONS.**

Section 11(c)(1) (29 USC 660(c)(1)) is amended by adding at

**SEC. 3. PROHIBITION OF DISCRIMINATION.**

Section 11(c) (29 USC 660(c)) is amended by striking out  
paragraph (2) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"(2) No person shall discharge or in any manner discriminate

against an employee for refusing to perform the employee's duties when the employee has a reasonable apprehension that performing such duties would result in serious injury or serious impairment of health to the employee or other employees. The circumstances causing the employee's apprehension of serious injury must be of such a nature that a reasonable person would conclude that there is a danger of serious injury or serious impairment of health. In order to qualify for protection, where possible, the employee must have communicated to his employer the danger perceived."

**SEC. 4. PROCEDURE.**

Section 11(c) (29 USC 660(c)) is amended by striking out paragraph (3) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"(3) Any employee who believes that he has been discharged, disciplined, or otherwise discriminated against in violation of paragraph (1) or (2) may, within 180 days after such alleged violation occurs, file (or have filed by any person on the employee's behalf) a complaint with the Secretary alleging such discharge, discipline, or discrimination. Upon receipt of such a complaint, the Secretary shall notify the person named in the complaint of the filing of the complaint.

"(4) (A) Within 90 days of receipt of a complaint filed under paragraph (3), the Secretary shall conduct an investigation and determine whether there is reasonable cause to believe that the

complaint has merit and notify the complainant and the person alleged to have committed the violation of paragraph (1) or (2) of the Secretary's findings. Where the Secretary has concluded that there is reasonable cause to believe that a violation has occurred, the Secretary's findings shall be accompanied by a preliminary order providing the relief prescribed by paragraph (D).

"Thereafter,

"(i) the person alleged to have committed the violation or the complainant may, within 30 days, file objections to the findings or preliminary order, or both, and request a hearing on the record, except that the filing of such objections shall not operate to stay any reinstatement remedy contained in the preliminary order.

"(ii) Where a hearing is not timely requested, the preliminary order shall be deemed a final order which is not subject to judicial review.

"(B) If the Secretary has not issued findings under paragraph (4) (A) within 90 days, and the employee or representative of the employee files a request for a hearing with the Secretary, the Secretary shall afford an opportunity for a hearing on the record.

"(C) When requested, a hearing shall be conducted by an administrative law judge of the Department of Labor and a recommended decision and order issued expeditiously. The legal burdens of proof

that prevail under section 1221 of title 5, United States Code, shall govern adjudication of violations under this subsection. The Secretary shall issue a final order within 120 days of the issuance of the recommended decision. In the interim, such proceedings may be terminated at any time on the basis of a settlement agreement entered into by the Secretary, the complainant, and the person alleged to have committed the violation.

"(D) If, in response to a complaint filed under paragraph (3), the Secretary determines that a violation of paragraphs (1) or (2) has occurred, the Secretary may order -

"(i) the person who committed such violation to correct the violation,

"(ii) such person to reinstate the complainant to the complainant's former position together with the compensation (including back pay), terms, conditions, and privileges of the position,

"(iii) compensatory damages, and

"(iv) exemplary damages.

"Upon issuance of such an order, the Secretary may assess against the person against whom the order is issued a sum equal to the aggregate amount of all costs and expenses (including attorney's fees and expert witness fees) reasonably incurred, as determined by the Secretary, by the complainant for, or in connection with,

the bringing of the complaint upon which the order was issued, including costs and expenses incurred upon review before a court of appeals.

"(E) In conducting an investigation or adjudication under this paragraph, the provisions of section 8(b) of this act shall apply.

"(5) (A) Any person adversely affected or aggrieved by a final order issued under paragraph (4) (C) may obtain review of the order before the United States court of appeals for the circuit in which the violation, with respect to which the order was issued, occurred, or the circuit in which such person resided on the date of such violation. The petition for review must be filed within 60 days from the issuance of the Secretary's order. Such review shall be in accordance with the provisions of chapter 7 of title 5, United States Code. An order of the Secretary subject to review under this subsection is not subject to judicial review in a criminal or other civil proceeding. The commencement of proceedings under this subsection shall not, unless ordered by the court, operate as a stay of the order of the Secretary.

"(B) Whenever a person has failed to comply with a final order or an order of reinstatement issued under paragraph (4), the Secretary or the person on behalf of whom the order was issued may file a civil action in the United States district court for the district in which the violation was found to occur in order to enforce such order.

**DRAFT LEGISLATION TO AMEND SECTION 11(c) OF THE OSH ACT-2/12/99**

In actions brought under this subparagraph, the district court shall have jurisdiction to grant additional appropriate relief in light of the noncompliance."

**SEC. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Act shall take effect ninety days after the date of enactment of this Act.

**DRAFT LEGISLATION TO AMEND SECTION 11(c) OF THE OSH ACT – 2/12/99**

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

Section (1) sets forth the title of the Act as the “Hazard Reporting Protection Act of 1999.”

Section (2) amends §11(c)(1) the OSH Act to clarify that employees cannot be discriminated against for reporting any “injury, illness or unsafe condition.”

Section (3) replaces §11(c)(2) with a prohibition against discriminating against an employee who refuses to work in what he reasonably believes is a condition that poses a serious danger of injury or impairment of health. This protection applies when the employee, where possible, has communicated to his employer the perceived danger.

Section (4) amends the procedures for seeking a remedy under §11(c) by striking paragraph (3) and increasing from 30 to 180 days the time an employee has to file a complaint with the Secretary. Section (4)(4)(A) retains the 90-day time frame for the Secretary to complete an investigation and provides that, if after investigation, the Secretary finds reasonable cause to believe the employer unlawfully discriminated against the employee, the investigative findings and a preliminary order reinstating the employee will be issued. The employer has 30 days to file objections to the findings and request a hearing. If a hearing is not requested within 30 days, the order becomes binding and is not subject to judicial review.

**DRAFT LEGISLATION TO AMEND SECTION 11(c) OF THE OSH ACT – 2/12/99**

Section (4)(4)(B) allows the employee (complainant) to request a hearing if the Secretary has not issued findings within 90 days.

Section (4)(4)(C) requires that an administrative law judge (ALJ) of the Department of Labor preside over the hearing. The Secretary must issue a final order within 120 days of the ALJ's decision. 5 U.S.C. §1221 states the appropriate burdens of proof. The proceedings can terminate at any time if the Secretary has reached a settlement with the employer.

Section (4)(4)(D) authorizes the Secretary to order any of four remedies in response to a valid complaint: correction of the violation, reinstatement of the employee to his former position with compensation, compensatory damages, and exemplary damages. Once an order is issued, the Secretary may assess reasonable costs and expenses (including attorney's fees and expert witness fees) reasonably incurred through bringing the complaint on which the order was issued. Such costs and expenses would include those incurred upon review before a court of appeals.

Section (4)(4)(E) states that §8(b) of the OSH Act (subpoena power) will apply to investigation and adjudication under this provision.

Section (4)(5)(A) gives an employer adversely affected by a final order the opportunity to bring his or her case in a federal court of appeals with appropriate jurisdiction. This petition for review must be filed within 60 days from the date the Secretary's order was issued. An order

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subject to review under these provisions cannot be heard in a criminal or other civil proceeding. Commencement of appeal proceedings will not stay the Secretary's order, unless ordered by the court.

Section (4)(5)(B) authorizes the Secretary or the employee (complainant) to file a civil action in a federal district court with appropriate jurisdiction if the employer has failed to comply with the final order or order of reinstatement. The district court may grant additional appropriate relief as it sees fit.

Section (5) sets the effective date as ninety days after enactment.

Q A lot of the governors were demanding that the federal government meet its share of special education funding before the President proposes, as he has already, a whole bunch of new education programs. I'm wondering what is his response going to be to that, how is he going to try to -- or is he going to try to assure --

MR. LOCKHART: Let me look at that, because I'm not aware of any special education issue between the states and the federal government. I think the President laid out his ideas for what the federal government should do as far as lowering class size, building new schools, and also as far as holding states accountable to certain standards and results. But on special ed, I'll just have to look into it.

Q Could you take that on special ed?

MR. LOCKHART: Sure.

Q Supposedly, Head Start, they were saying that they want those programs funded first before --

Q Was the President moved at all by what the governors said about cutting the strings that he wants attached to the additional education funding?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, I think the President believes and has believed, as a former governor, that the place where the majority of educational decisions are made are on the state and local level. And that will continue. I think what the President has said in his State of the Union and in the budget is that it's time to stop throwing good money after under-performing schools and schools that can't meet standards. It's time to make people reach a standard as far as what they expect to get from the federal government.

It's not about how they teach. It's not about how they make the decision of how they're going to run their school. It's about expecting some results.

Q Governor Leavitt said that the states -- or certainly his state welcomes additional federal funding for education, but in terms of being a limited partner and not a managing partner. They feel that the federal government is trying to impose its will on the state administration of

education.

MR. LOCKHART: I think they clearly haven't taken a close enough look at what the President is talking about. The President is talking about looking around the country, finding the best practices, trying to replicate best practices, looking at programs that work. But the bottom line is results. Schools, local communities, local jurisdictions will continue to have the ability to decide how they want to implement education, education reform. But the bottom line is the federal government for too long has put money into local school districts that are aren't performing and it's time to start focusing on results.

Q Is it just results? I mean, is it just some bottom line result? Isn't the President also suggesting to people the way they should proceed, what kinds of students they should work with, what kinds of programs should be set up for them?

MR. LOCKHART: I think the President has said -- and he's been saying for years -- that we need to look at a state like North Carolina, where things are working, and say, what can we draw from North Carolina, from programs that were started on the state and local level and how we can replicate that around the country. But there's no one in Washington that's trying to tell people actually how they have to run their school districts. We're saying that it's time to start demanding results.

Q Aren't there some things, though -- when you did the State of the Union and you put out a little briefing paper, there were three or four steps on various things, including students that haven't met promotion standards for promotion.

MR. LOCKHART: Sure.

Q Isn't federal government laying out some things that it will insist the states do, step by step, rather than just saying you should do a better job on this front?

MR. LOCKHART: No, they're expecting results. And one of the results is that we stop moving people along before they're ready to move along. And how states do that is, they can work off of the models that have worked in other communities around the country, they can come up with their own novel approach. But what the federal government is saying is, it's time to stop allowing people just to keep promoting those, even though they're not ready for the next level of education.

Q How do you decide, though, whether they are or are not doing what you want them to do in order to get the money?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, we're going to have to work with states and local governments, but I think there are clear standards that schools will have to meet in order to qualify for some of the federal funds that are available. You know, it's not just you have to meet these standards or you're not getting it, we have -- I think the President has tripled the after-school budget to work with the students who need the most help, to give students who need extra help the attention they need in order to get the skills they need to move on.

White House Watch: The Day After

A few hours after the Senate acquitted President Clinton last Friday, Paul Begala celebrated by taking his young sons to the rodeo. The weary presidential counselor had come for some relaxation; instead, he found allegory. The rodeo announcer declared that a fellow named J.W. Hart would be riding that night--for the first time since a nasty spill last year earned him 80 stitches and 30 staples in his head. Good ol' J.W., the announcer said, had to pull out some of the staples that night just to put on his ten-gallon hat. "For me, it was a fitting metaphor," Begala says. "You get sutured up and climb back on. My heart went out to him: there he was, back on that bull."

The White House staff, too, was back on its prescandal bull this week. After a three-day weekend and a presidential jaunt to Mexico, the senior staff meeting Tuesday was almost boring in its efficiency. Counsel Charles Ruff, after months in the spotlight, delivered a one-word report: "Nothing." Press Secretary Joe Lockhart stepped up the push for a first-in-ages Clinton press conference amid signs the president might actually do it. The White House drug office, of all things, delivered the longest report of the morning, and representatives of the bureaucracy's alphabet soup--OMB, CEQ, DPC, NEC, NSC--basked in their sudden return to relevance.

"All these people who had been on page twentyone for the last year are now on page one," says one top Clinton aide. The White House plans a profusion of Social Security and USA Account events, plus new attention for Kosovo, Iraq, and even Ghana. One long-neglected national security adviser remarked excitedly to his colleagues: "Sixty-four foreign policy stories today in The New York Times! It's like the old days!"

As for the scandalmen, it's more like nap time. "I was thinking of having a 'will spin for food' sign made up," says Jim Kennedy, the scandal spokesman. "It's amazing: my pager didn't go off once on Sunday." Kennedy, who, like most staffers, took President's Day off, will

spend the next few days  
cleaning off his desk.

Things are much the same for the White House press corps, which, after a year of wishing away the scandal, seems to have more of a sense of dread than relief. There was an eerie calm in Washington the Day the Scandal Died. Nobody was staking out the Mayflower. Not a camera was posted outside Monica's lawyers' offices. At the White House's Northwest Gate, where Monica threw her now-infamous jealous fit upon learning from the Secret Service that her man was in the Oval Office with another gal, all was quiet. Inside the briefing room, bored photographers were watching a TV talk show titled "My Daughter Dresses Too Revealing." Out on the lawn, television correspondents were applying makeup, getting ready to tell the world what it already knew: Clinton was off the hook. The only disturbance was a stiff breeze, which disrupted the correspondents' equipment--and hairdos. A few minutes before the vote, a windswept Sam Donaldson stormed into the briefing room, shouting "Jesus Christ!" A woman laughed. "Hold that toupee," she said after he passed.

There were occasional bursts of jubilation as the afternoon progressed, first with the Senate acquittal and then with the Clinton acceptance speech. "He's free! Free Willy!" a gentlelady of the press exclaimed. But despite the professions of relief, reporters quietly confided to each other a different sentiment--boredom. "Who are we going to throw out now?" one asked. "It doesn't feel very historical, does it?" mused another. "Now what are we going to write about?" a reporter for a big daily asked. "That," somebody responded, "is what I'm afraid of." Me, too. How are we going to fill our pages without the scandal? Are we now to turn to the much-neglected stories of the past year? Will we finally learn the details of the education policies Monica Lewinsky shared with the president? Will we explore the legal precedents in Ken Starr's defense of Meineke Discount Muffler? The boredom has already set in. Even before the vote, the press was trying to make the roll call into a parlor game, predicting the irrelevant matter of whether there would be 50 votes for either charge. By the Monday following the vote, deflated networks were already returning to JonBenet Ramsey. NBC's Jamie Gangel, who snagged the first Linda Tripp interview, was reduced Tuesday to doing a way-too-long segment on the revival of roller derby.

At the moment, the press is entertaining itself by trying to catch Clinton and his aides in flagrante delicto, gloating. Lockhart felt compelled to declare the White House a "gloat-free zone," and the no-gloat policy was so strictly enforced that the press-office staff showed not so much as a grin when

Clinton was acquitted. Lockhart's office curtains were drawn Friday to hide whatever gloating happened inside. Photographers with telephoto lenses found an open window on the second floor of the White House, but the gloaters quickly discovered the espionage and drew the shades. After the acquittal vote, a White House janitor walked out with an empty case of Maker's Mark whiskey--tantalizing evidence that somebody must be gloating somewhere inside the mansion.

Moments later, I was almost knocked over by a stampede of photographers chasing Ruff's wheelchair as he made his way through the gate to the Bombay Club for lunch. A reporter later asked Lockhart whether such a conspicuous departure for lunch was smoking-gun evidence of gloating. "If you think walking out through one gate over another is some sort of signal to someone, you're overthinking," Lockhart said. Looking for gloating in all the wrong places and finding none, journalists had to content themselves with fantasies about behind-the-scenes gloating. "They're probably in there trying to stick rags down his throat," one correspondent said of Clinton after the acquittal. When Lockhart's briefing was delayed, another journalist suspected surreptitious gloating. "Joe can't keep himself from smiling," he said. "They have to wait until he stops. It's a gloat-free zone."

Actually, the only gloating I could detect at the White House was gloating about not gloating. Relieved, they said. Content, yes. Liberated, certainly. But gloating? "No," said Lanny Davis, who proceeded to parse the definition of gloating. "I don't mind saying I feel vindicated," the spinner said. "I intend to constantly remind every Republican member of the House who voted for perjury to call Fred Thompson and Richard Shelby," two GOP senators who voted against the perjury article. But, Lanny, isn't that gloating? "That part of it isn't gloating," Davis said. "It's vindication. It's legitimate."

Clintonites have good reason not to gloat. For one, there's no predicting what Starr might try next.

"How many days you think will pass after the impeachment trial before Starr files a sixty-three-count indictment against the president?" one Clinton aide asked. "He's on a mission from God." A number of White House aides, burned out by the scandal, are heading for the door now that it's over. Greg Craig and Lanny Breuer will leave the counsel's office; two other members of the scandal team, Adam Goldberg and Don Goldberg, have already left. Elena Kagan, number two at the Domestic Policy Council, is off to Harvard; even Begala is said to be leaving.

Too many White House aides have been saddled with huge legal bills, have been personally devastated, or are just worn out by scandal management. "I feel as if I've been hit by a truck," says

Larry Stein, Clinton's top lobbyist. One senior Clinton aide says he's tired of the "doe-eyed" looks of reporters who profess distaste for scandal and delight now that it's over. "I'm sure it's hard to cover a fire," he says, "but don't dare tell me covering a fire is harder than having the [expletive] house burning down around you."

Today, the President and the First Lady, along with Governors Carper and Leavitt and Secretary Shalala, launched the nationwide "Insure Kids Now" campaign designed to enroll every eligible but uninsured child in Medicaid and the new Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). Building on his efforts to ensure that it is easy and accessible for families to enroll their children, the President has engaged a broad-based, bipartisan, public-private coalition to use whatever means possible to educate and assist families in insuring their children. This includes launching a nationwide, toll-free number set up by the National Governors' Association in partnership with the White House and Bell Atlantic, allowing families to get essential information; airing public service announcements on TV and radio; placing the toll-free number on corporate products; enlisting grass-roots organizations to get the word out; and stepping up activities by over 10 Federal agencies that interact with working families. Altogether, these actions will make a major contribution towards the President's goal of covering up to 5 million uninsured children.

**CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE INITIATIVE**

The President and First Lady have made improving children's health a priority. Studies show that children without health insurance are more likely to be sick as newborns, less likely to be immunized as preschoolers, and less likely to receive medical treatment when they are injured.

- **Historic, new options for children.** The President, with bipartisan Congressional support, created the State Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 1997, which devotes \$24 billion dollars over the next five years for health coverage for children. Today, 47 states have implemented CHIP and expect that they will enroll over 2.5 million children when fully operational.
- **Greater challenge: enrolling children.** Ensuring that all eligible children get enrolled in health insurance is a formidable challenge. Barriers like complicated applications, lack of coordination between children's programs, and the perception that working families are not eligible prevent uninsured children from getting the coverage that they need. For the first time, major TV and radio networks, corporations, health care organizations, religious groups, and other community-based organizations can join Federal agencies in raising awareness of the importance of children's health insurance.

- **Launching "1-877-KIDS NOW" Hotline.** Today, Governors Carper and Leavitt unveiled 1-877 KIDS NOW, a new toll free number developed by the National Governors Association in partnership with Bell Atlantic and the Administration, that provides state-specific information about Medicaid and CHIP to families in all 50 States. Families calling the line will speak with a person who can provide information about eligibility criteria, benefits, and how to apply for coverage. Beginning in

October, HHS will assume responsibility for this line.

- **Running public service announcements on national television about Insure Kids Now.** Beginning tomorrow, to help surround families with information about Insure Kids Now, NBC, ABC, Univision, Turner Entertainment, the National Association of Broadcasters, and Viacom/Paramount will air public service announcements providing information about the importance of health insurance and promoting the Insure Kids Now number.
- **Airing radio advertisements about Insure Kids Now.** Today, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will begin funding radio ads on Insure Kids Now in 45 States and DC, starting with California, Utah, Colorado, Alabama, Illinois, Ohio, Kentucky, North Carolina, New Jersey, Connecticut, and Maine. Later this year, Radio Disney and Bonneville will run similar ads nationwide. Radio advertisements reach over 77 percent of consumers daily, making them an incredibly effective way to reach the millions of families with children who are eligible for Medicaid or CHIP. In addition, when radio and television are used together as part of a larger educational campaign, over 70 percent of people remember the visual images of the television advertisement when hearing the radio advertisement.
- **Publishing editorials and writing articles about Insure Kids Now.** This spring, USA Today will publish an editorial and Blue Cross/Blue Shield will publish a full page advertisement in the April issue of Time Magazine on children's health insurance. In addition, Pfizer, the American College of Emergency Physicians, the American Nurses Association, the United Way, American College of Physicians, the National Collaboration for Youth, the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials, Wyeth Lederle, Kaiser Permanente, Volunteers of America, the March of Dimes, the Points of Light Foundation, Hope for Kids, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the National Education Association, and religious organizations from across the country have agreed to put information on Insure Kids Now in their product handbooks, circulars, and mass mailings, as well as distributing posters featuring the Insure Kids Now number to their clients and constituents. Print media is an effective educational tool, especially when used together with other media, because it allows the reader to reread and thoroughly digest the information.
- **Printing the Insure Kids Now toll free number on commonly used products.** Public service announcements and advertisements are only one component of a successful communications campaign. Building on a series of commitments made in 1998, K-Mart, General Motors, the American Dental Hygienists Association and American Medical Response have joined the Insure Kids Now campaign and have pledged to put the new toll free number on grocery bags, toothbrushes, diaper boxes, pharmaceutical products, child safety seats, and on the sides of buses.
- **New Federal efforts to promote children's health insurance outreach.** The President has both legislative and administrative proposals to help enroll children in Medicaid and CHIP, including Over \$1.2 billion in his FY 2000 budget for children's health outreach, through proposals that will help states access additional funding for successful outreach activities, and new actions by the Federal Task Force on children's health outreach, including launching the new "InsureKidsNow.Gov" website today that provides information about state programs and the Administration's public-private outreach campaign; distributing 145,000 posters to over 20,000 health centers, providers, and other grantees; sending 92,000 USDA employees information about outreach on March 8 on their wage and earning statements, including the national toll-free number; and sending a letter and posters with the Insure Kids Now number from the Department of Justice to all 170 sites in Operation Weed and

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Feed, a crime prevention and community revitalization initiative.

**A NATIONAL EFFORT TO REDUCE CLASS SIZE:  
SMALLER CLASSES WITH WELL-PREPARED TEACHERS**

February 23, 1999

**AN OPPORTUNITY FOR BIPARTISAN PROGRESS IN EDUCATION** Last year, President Clinton proposed a historic initiative to reduce class size in the early grades when children learn to read and get a solid foundation in the basics by hiring 100,000 well-prepared teachers over seven years. Congress enacted a down payment on this request last year with bipartisan support, providing a one-time \$1.2 billion appropriation to help communities hire approximately 30,000 teachers nationwide. This week, Congress has the opportunity to build on its bipartisan efforts to reduce class size and finish the job by passing legislation authorizing this initiative for the next six years.

**SUPPORTING EFFECTIVE LOCAL PLANNING** Under the initiative enacted into law last year, school districts will begin to receive funding this July 1 in order to hire teachers to begin reducing class sizes this fall. While last year's one-year appropriation provided an important start on President Clinton's seven-year initiative, Congress has the chance to support effective local planning by giving school districts the confidence they need that funding will be available under this initiative for years to come. Rejecting this legislation this week will send a dangerous message to school districts about the prospects for continued funding just at the moment when they are beginning to make decisions about how to implement this new initiative.

**INCREASED FUNDING FOR COMMUNITIES ACROSS THE NATION** In this year's budget, President Clinton and Vice President Gore proposed \$1.4 billion to hire a total 38,000 teachers.

**SMALL CLASSES MAKE A DIFFERENCE.** Studies show that smaller classes help teachers provide more personal attention to students and spend less time on discipline; as a result students learn more and get a stronger foundation in the basic skills. Research shows that smaller class size increases student achievement, reduces discipline problems and increases instruction time for teachers, and make the greatest difference for students in the early grades and for minority and disadvantaged students. According to studies, students from smaller classes in North Carolina, Wisconsin, Indiana, Tennessee, and from across the nation outperformed their peers in larger classes. A national study of 10,000 4th graders and 10,000 8th graders found the greatest impact of smaller classes on inner-city youth.

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**ENDORSEMENTS FROM MAJOR EDUCATION ORGANIZATIONS.** Most major education organizations have expressed support for the President's initiative to reduce class size.
