Charter Schools: The Pennsylvania legislature passed a charter school law last week. We have not seen the final bill, but from what we know now, it appears to be generally consistent with the principals underlying our charter schools program. Several press accounts suggest that one factor featured in the debate over final passage is the fact that Pennsylvania would become eligible for several million dollars in federal charter schools funds. The bill passed with bipartisan support; an overwhelming majority of Republicans as well as a slim majority of Democrats, including a number of minority legislators from Philadelphia.

The bill will be signed into law next week. We are checking to see if it will be possible for you to mark the occasion by releasing a Charter Schools Guide from the Education Department, and highlighting the Department's newly created Charter Schools Web Site.

Title IX: Celebrating 25 Years of Progress

I. PURPOSE

You are scheduled to speak at the event celebrating the 25th Anniversary of Title IX co-sponsored by the Coalition of Women and Girls in Education representing over 50 organizations and the Jackie Joyner-Kersey Youth Center Foundation. You will receive the just-finished report on Title IX from Sec. Riley and sign a Presidential Directive entitled Strengthening Title IX Enforcement and Addressing Discrimination on the Basis of Sex, Race, Color and National Origin in Federally Conducted Education Programs. The audience of 150 will be comprised of Members of Congress, representatives from the co-sponsoring organizations, board members of your Council of Physical Fitness and Sports, and other leaders gathered from around the nation to celebrate this milestone.

II. BACKGROUND

HISTORY OF TITLE IX

Monday, June 23 marks the 25th anniversary of the signing of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. Title IX, one of the nation's landmark civil rights laws, was enacted by Congress to prohibit sex discrimination in all aspects of American education in the classroom, in course offerings, in the school workplace, and on athletic fields.

As the women's civil rights movement gained momentum in the late 60's and early 70's, Americans began to focus attention on inequities that harmed the progress of women and girls in education. The initial impetus behind Title IX was the 1970 class action suit filed by the Women's Equity Action League (WEAL) against colleges and universities charging them with "an industry wide pattern of sex bias against women who worked in these institutions." In response, the House held its first hearing on sex discrimination in 1970. In 1971, Congress introduced several education bills that included sex discrimination proposals and in the Spring of 1972, the Senate and House passed Title IX. President Nixon signed Title IX into law on June 23, 1973.

Title IX has broken down many of the barriers that prevented girls and women from choosing educational opportunities and careers they would have liked to pursue. Twenty five years after its passage, the implementation of Title IX has resulted in tremendous improvements in educational and related job opportunities for millions of young girls. By the year 2005,

women workers will make up 47 percent of the labor force and for the first time, their educational backgrounds makes them well prepared to assume high level employment opportunities that will improve their quality of life as well as our nation's economy.

Since the early 1990's, men and women have been graduating from college in equal proportions--an historic event in our nation's history. Since 1970, the proportion of women who have a high school diploma rose significantly and for African American women the high school graduation rate more than doubled. Dropout rates have dropped significantly among high school females who become pregnant or have a child--the law prohibits schools from discriminating against them in educational programs due to their status as a mother.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTIVE

Background on Executive Directive Strengthening Title IX Enforcement and Addressing Discrimination on the Basis of Sex, Race, Color and National Origin in Federally Conducted Education Programs

You will issue an executive memorandum with two parts to the heads of executive agencies and departments.

First, the memorandum directs each federal agency to develop a plan to enforce Title IX. A number of agencies have never adopted regulations or complaint procedures to enforce Title IX. This memorandum will require all federal agencies to consult with the Attorney General and report back to you within 90 days on measures to ensure effective enforcement, including methods to make all recipients of federal financial assistance of their obligation not to discriminate and to put in place grievance procedures to handle Title IX complaints.

Second, the memorandum addresses discrimination on the basis of sex, race, color and national origin in federally *conducted* education programs and activities. Currently, Title IX generally prohibits discrimination based on sex, and Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 generally prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color or national origin in education programs or activities that *receive federal assistance*. However, these laws do not apply to comparable education programs or activities that are *conducted by the federal government*. The executive memorandum will take action against discrimination in education programs or activities conducted by the federal government as well. It will not affect military training programs (just as Titles IX and VI do not apply to military training), but it will cover the military's civilian programs, including the schools it operates.

We are not aware of any particular incidents of discrimination in federal agencies. This order will simply hold the federal government to the same standards of non-discrimination in educational opportunities that we now apply to education programs receiving federal assistance.

“Title IX: 25 Years of Progress” which provides an overview of the accomplishments in the educational achievement of girls and women since Title IX’s passage. The following are some of the key highlights of the report:

- The large gaps in educational attainment between males and females that were striking in 1972 are virtually nonexistent today. For example:
- **In graduate and professional schools**--When Title IX was first enacted , 9 percent of medical degrees went to women. In 1994, women received 38 percent of medical degrees. Women account for 43 percent of law degrees, up from 7 percent in 1972.
- **In colleges**--More than 100,000 women participate in intercollegiate athletics, which is a four-fold increase since 1971.
- **In high schools**--Girls are slightly more likely than boys to complete high school. In 1995, 87 percent of young adult females had completed high school compared to 86 percent of young-adult males. Almost equal proportions of males and females are taking vocational-technical courses, and girls are most likely to be enrolled in business programs.
- **The next 25 years**--Today, even with the many advances women have made in academics, employment and athletics, we still have work to do in our efforts to achieve equality. Even though women make up over half of the labor market, they are often paid less than men. In 1993, women who had majored in the natural sciences earned 15 percent less than men who majored in the same field.

According to APWA and Lyn Hogan (who heard it from Mickey Kaus), there is something bad for private welfare to work efforts in the Ed/Workforce bill. I'm still not clear on details, but according to Elaine Ryan it says that under TANF, states may not require welfare recipients to participate in private sector jobs, subsidized private sector jobs, or subsidized public sector jobs, "unless the recipient is compensated at the same rates, including periodic increases, as trainees or employees who are similarly situated in similar occupations by the same employer and who have similar training, experience and skills, and such rates shall be in accordance with applicable law. (Not clear what last phrase means; Elaine wonders if this is Davis-Bacon type stuff??)

Not clear to me how much this requires beyond current practice, but Elaine and Mickey Kaus think it's very bad. Lyn says AFSCME snuck it in, and Haskins was shocked when he heard about it after the fact.

On a second issue, Elaine raised an interesting criticism of Haskins' FLSA solution that may or may not be significant, depending on how extensively you think states will make use of the trainee exemption. She says his language mandates paying the minimum wage for trainees, which our position does not. Elaine is very much into finding a solution here by making sure

the trainee option is wide enough. She thinks everyone's picture of workfare being ditch-digging is erroneously based on what Giuliani's doing, and that in fact states will create office workfare assignments that are closer to training. She just sent us a piece arguing that DOL created a big FLSA exemption for our school to work program by hanging their hat on the trainee exception, and thinks there is a precedent there.

Comments on US Conference of Mayors resolution on welfare reform:

Overall: The resolution agrees with our goal of reforming welfare with an emphasis on work, and supports many of our specific policies, such as creating a \$3 billion welfare to work program, enacting a targeted welfare-to-work tax credit, and restoring benefits to legal immigrants. It also voices concerns about the end of the entitlement to assistance, the level of budget cuts in the welfare law, and whether there will be enough jobs for welfare recipients in many cities. It goes beyond the policy in the President's budget by supporting restoration of food stamp benefits for legal immigrants (we restored SSI and Medicaid, but not food stamps) and including SSI for non-disabled elderly legal immigrants, as well as the disabled.

Possible suggestions for improvements:

1. Drop Item 2, which is an unnecessarily negative description of the welfare law. They will probably resist.
2. We could ask them to drop references to improvements we were not able to secure in the budget agreement -- but it is not critical, and they will rightfully protest, so I would not recommend asking. These items are: restore food stamps to legal immigrants; restore SSI to elderly non-disabled legal immigrants; restore food stamps to childless adults who can't find work; repeal other food stamp cuts (i.e., shelter deduction, standard deduction, vehicle asset limit).

Today I am directing my Bruce Reed, my Domestic Policy Advisor, and Donna Shalala, the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services, to consult with public health experts and subject this agreement to the strictest scrutiny. I expect them to report back to me on whether this agreement is the best means of protecting the nation's public health interests.

Q&A on Tobacco Settlement

June 20, 1997

Q. Did the Administration help close the deal?

A. No. My staff monitored the talks closely so that we would be in a position to evaluate and respond to any possible settlement. We consistently told the parties that they would have to close an agreement on their own, and they were able to do so without any help from the Administration.

Q. How will you proceed?

A. I have asked my Domestic Policy Advisor, along with the Secretary of Health and Human Services, to undertake a thorough public health review of this agreement. They will consult with all interested agencies, members of Congress, and the public health community.

Q. How long will the review take?

A. The review will take as long as necessary to conduct a careful analysis, but we will seek to work promptly and expeditiously. We expect this to be a matter of weeks, not months.

Q. Dr. Kessler and Dr. Koop have asked in a letter to you that you give them 30 days to complete their own review before signing off on anything. Are you going to wait?

A. I intend to consider closely the views of the public health community, including Drs. Koop and Kessler, before rendering any judgment on the settlement. But it is premature to commit to any firm timetable for reaching my conclusion.

Q. What will you look at in evaluating this agreement?

A. We will evaluate whether this agreement protects the public health -- and particularly the health of our children. We will pay special attention to the part of the agreement dealing with FDA jurisdiction. The actions the FDA has taken under this Administration forced the industry to the bargaining table, and we will insist that the FDA has all necessary authority to regulate nicotine and tobacco products. We also will carefully review the financial terms of the settlement, including whether the money will go toward protecting the health of our children and the general public.

Q. The final deal limits punitive damages -- a key concession to the tobacco industry. Won't you oppose that given your previous opposition to caps on punitive awards?

A. The limitation on punitive damages for past misconduct is not a deal-breaker for us. We understand that the attorneys general extracted substantial concessions from the tobacco companies for this limitation, and we will evaluate whether the agreement as a whole advances the nation's public health interests.

Q. Are you taking a political risk in considering approval of this settlement?

A. This isn't about politics; it's about protecting the public health. We didn't think about politics when we took on the tobacco companies last year with our announcement of the FDA rule.

And we won't look to politics now in evaluating this agreement.

The Freddie Mac Section 8 Homeownership Empowerment Voucher Pilot Program

Announcement

Today, Freddie Mac has agreed to help make Homeownership available for up to 2,000 low income people through an innovative program proposed by the Clinton Administration. To help guarantee the success of the Administration's proposal to permit the use of Section 8 rental subsidies as Homeownership Empowerment Vouchers, Freddie Mac, in partnership with the Department of Housing and Urban Development, will participate in a demonstration program to help provide financing for 1,000 to 2,000 lower-income families to purchase their own homes. This project will help make mortgage funds available to working, lower-income families across the country who have demonstrated the ability to manage their finances but have not had the means to purchase a home.

Background

Under an administration proposal currently awaiting action by Congress, working lower-income families that qualify for HUD's Section 8 rental housing assistance could instead request Empowerment Vouchers to help reduce the gap between the amount the family can afford and the monthly payment on a mortgage.

Under the Freddie Mac pilot program, first-time homebuyers will obtain mortgages for up to 97 percent of the value of their home, with the Mortgage Guaranty Insurance Corporation providing private mortgage insurance on the loans. It is anticipated that a reasonable amount of funds for the down payment will be contributed by the family. The remainder of the down payment, and other funds necessary to close, may come from state or federal programs, gifts, or grants. The borrower will contribute a reasonable percentage of his or her income towards housing costs; the balance of the monthly mortgage payment will be provided through the Empowerment Vouchers. The borrower will receive comprehensive homeownership counseling before and after the purchase.

Participation by Freddie Mac, a leading secondary market agency, and MGIC, a leading mortgage insurer, is important because the underlying mortgages to be used with the Empowerment Vouchers will be originated by private mortgage lenders. These lenders require mortgage insurance and secondary market investors in order to originate the loans.

President Clinton and HUD Secretary Andrew Cuomo propose to provide responsible working families with the option of using Empowerment Vouchers because homeownership is an important component of an urban revitalization strategy. Homeownership encourages self-sufficiency, allows families to develop community ties and support networks, encourages the formation of household assets, assures continuity of schooling for children, stabilizes distressed neighborhoods, and equalizes housing opportunities for minorities, whose homeownership rates are far lower than those of the nation as a whole.

President Continues to Fight to Expand Health Care Coverage for Our Nation's Children

Today the President joined Kaiser Permanente in announcing that the health plan will give \$100 million to provide health care coverage to up to 50,000 uninsured children in California. Kaiser is responding to the President's challenge at the Summit on Service, and their initiative complements the President's commitment to a national effort to extend health insurance.

This President will continue to fight hard to make sure that extending health care coverage to millions of uninsured children is a top priority in any balanced budget deal. The President fought hard to ensure that the balanced budget agreement included \$16 billion to provide meaningful health care coverage to uninsured children. The President also supports the action by the Senate Finance Committee to raise a 20 cent tobacco tax to allocate additional Federal support for children's health.

The President outlined the principles he will use in evaluating children's health initiatives emerging from the Budget Agreement. The President is committed to making sure that any investment in children's health care meets three principles: **(1) that coverage is meaningful:** from checkups to surgery -- children should get the care they need to grow up strong and healthy; **(2) that coverage is targeted:** through grant programs and Medicaid, this investment should cover as many uninsured children as possible; and **(3) that this investment supplements not supplants coverage:** this investment should cover children who do not currently have insurance -- rather than replace public or private money that already covers children.

The Balanced Budget and the Kaiser announcement build on the President's previous successes in strengthening health care coverage for children.

- **Children and the Kassebaum-Kennedy Law.** By signing this bill into law, the President helped millions of Americans -- and their children -- keep their health care coverage when they change jobs.
- **Children and Medicaid.** Throughout his Administration, the President has fought to preserve and strengthen the Medicaid program; its coverage of about 20 million children, makes it the largest single insurer of children. The Administration has partnered with states through Medicaid waivers to expand coverage to hundreds of thousands of children.
- **Children and the Environment.** The President signed an Executive Order to reduce environmental health and safety risks to children by requiring agencies to strengthen policies and improve research to protect children and ensure that new regulations consider special risks to children.
- **Children and Tobacco.** The President has also taken action to limit children's access to tobacco. Each day about three million children become regular smokers and 1,000 of them will die from a tobacco-related illness. To reduce this trend, the President issued guidelines to eliminate easy access to tobacco products and to prohibit companies from advertising tobacco to kids. According to former FDA Commissioner David Kessler, the possibility of a comprehensive, public health oriented settlement with the tobacco industry could not have come about without the President's leadership in this area.
- **Children and Immunization.** During the Clinton Administration, childhood immunizations have reached a historic high. The President's childhood immunization initiative expands community-based educational efforts and makes vaccines more affordable. In 1995, fully 75 percent of two-year olds were immunized -- an historic high.
