SUBJECT: BOOK ROLL OUT STRATEGY/ONE AMERICA EVENT

I. INTRODUCTION

The release of your book/report to the nation, which was committed to as part of your Initiative on Race, provides a unique opportunity to frame both the past and the future of your lifelong effort to build bridges between people of different backgrounds. It offers a chance to recap the many accomplishments of the Initiative and its Advisory Board and to close that chapter. Likewise, this release offers an occasion for you to lay the foundation, personally, for the next chapter – the final efforts of your administration to close opportunity gaps and promote racial reconciliation.

While, in some respects, the new chapter officially started with the announcement of the White House Office on the President's Initiative for One America, an event around the book release would be your first statement on the creation of your new office and your intentions for it. The release of the book also would serve as a link or transition between the work of Initiative and the new office, in terms of policy and in terms of community efforts, both of which your book addresses.

This memo describes the activities that should take place prior to the release of your book, in order for the rollout and the book to be most effective. In addition, we have provided you with several options for events at which the book could be released. Only one of those options, Option E, focuses narrowly on the book. The other options focus more broadly on the book and its context, as described above.

II. PRE ROLL-OUT

A) Confidential Review

We recommend that a small group of your top confidantes receive a copy of the book for confidential review as far in advance of the roll-out as possible. Their feedback will be invaluable in the final editing as well as in planning for the marketing and rollout. Please find below some suggested names. We recommend that this group be no greater than 5-7 individuals.

B) Media Outreach

We recommend a press roundtable with 3-4 key reporters who have covered the initiative regularly since the June 1997 commencement address. This roundtable would give you the opportunity to discuss directly address (1) the achievements of your Initiative on Race (2) your expectations for the new WH Office on the President's Initiative for One America, and (3) the connection between your overall policy initiatives and efforts to close opportunity gaps that affect people of color. At the same time, you would lay the foundation for the roll-out.

C) Validators

We recommend that a broad group of individuals who can serve as validators and surrogates to the media and the public be briefed on the contents of the book and the rollout plan. With your approval, we would contact these individuals a day or two prior to the book's release. (We have attached a list for your review.)

D) Book Distribution

We need to finalize a distribution strategy for the book as soon as possible, before moving ahead with a rollout plan. A decision to sell the book at retail outlets versus through the GPO presents different considerations for the rollout plan.

III. ROLL-OUT OPTIONS

A) WH South Lawn or East Room event / Cabinet members at various sites

You would speak to a large audience on the South Lawn or a smaller group in the East Room. Audience members would be multiracial - African Americans, American Indians, Asian Americans, Hispanics, and whites -- and would include people from around the country and from organizations that have worked with the Race Initiative to further your

goal of achieving One America.

On the same day, Cabinet members would host events in cities across the country where your Race Initiative sparked efforts to promote racial reconciliation.

The large event on the South Lawn, similar to the Arab-Israeli Peace signing would maximize the number of people in attendance and allow significant diversity in the audience and the stage. The East Room provides a more intimate setting.

The Cabinet events would build on the accomplishments of different efforts in cities to fight intolerance and promote diversity. This option highlights your efforts, the Administration efforts, as well as community efforts toward reconciliation.

B) Outside Beltway Event / Cabinet members at various cities

This option is similar to option A, except you would deliver your speech to an audience outside of D.C. In choosing a site, we would look for a location where, as a result of your Race Initiative, efforts are underway to further your goal of achieving One America.

As in option A, Cabinet members would host events on the same day in cities across the country where your Race Initiative sparked efforts to promote racial reconciliation.

Option B calls attention to the same themes as option A, but, by spotlighting a specific example, places the emphasis on what a community can accomplish, working together.

C) White House East Room / Sectoral Leaders events

You would speak to sectoral leaders and invited others, convened in the East Room, following a half-day of simultaneous mini-conferences in DC hosted by the various sectoral leadership groups. These mini-conferences would be organized in conjunction with your office on the President's initiative for One America. Each would focus on the workplan detailed in your book and how the specific sector could implement a course of action.

Before your speech, you would meet privately with the sectoral leaders hosting events to hear about the efforts they plan to undertake.

We recommend that 3 sectors be selected to host mini-conferences from among the following communities: education, faith, organized labor, legal, human rights commissions, and the media.

Option C highlights efforts started during the Race Initiative and continuing through your Office for the President's Initiative on One America to mobilize various communities to help bridge racial divides. This option enables sectoral groups to demonstrate their ongoing commitment to achieving one America, while focusing more specifically on the book than Options A or B.

D) White House Conference on One America

You would speak to participants of a WH Conference on One America, similar to the WH Hate Crimes Conference. The conference would feature panels, presentations, and discussions on the challenges toward building One America -- such closing gaps in education, healthcare, civil rights enforcement, economic empowerment and police conduct -- as well as efforts that are underway to promote racial reconciliation.

Option D shines a spotlight, again, on issues raised during your Initiative of last year and in the book. These are the same issues your Administration and your new White House Office on the President's Initiative for One America are attempting to address.

In order to be successful, the conference must advance these issues beyond where the Initiative, at least, left them. The planning to achieve that objective as well as to arrange the logistics for such a conference would require putting the book release off for several months, at best.

E) Book release in WH East Room

You would announce your book's release to a multiracial audience with Cabinet members behind you. You would speak almost exclusively about the book and its release.

Option E emphasizes the book, over the context in which it was developed.

RECOMMENDATION

We recommend that you choose option A, WH event with Cabinet members hosting events in cities around the country. We suggest the White House site be the South Lawn, which would allow for a truly inclusive event - "A Celebration of One America". The imagery of you, America's President, at America's house with representatives of all of America's people is fitting for your vision for unity.

We believe that the combination of a WH South Lawn event and successful local events led by Cabinet Secretaries would highlight the accomplishments of your Initiative on Race -- dialogues, policies and actions in local communities. Such a combination of events also looks forward to the continued work of your Administration to close opportunity gaps that affect people of color. That work, spearheaded by your policy shops and your new White House Office on the President's Initiative on One America, will involve individuals attending the WH event, individuals attending the Cabinet events and individuals like them in every American community. Your book would offer these individuals a guide to what the future could look like and how they can get there.

Maria & Chuck:

These are paragraphs from Gore's speech Sunday night in Detroit. He's against racial profiling, period. (Doesn't mention data collection, though.)

I urge you to have a communications strategy to reconcile the DPC/DOJ recommendation with Gore's position.

And -- before I get attacked by everyone -- let me stress that I did not have a hand in this section of the speech. As you know, I tried to get you to resolve the executive order issue in time for Gore to say something about it; when Maria said it was impossible, I relayed that to OVP staff.

"Now, I am proud of our nation's law enforcement. I'm proud of the 100,000 new community police we are putting on our streets, and the work they are doing to protect all of our families.

But I want to be perfectly clear: the strong arm of justice must also respect justice. I am outraged by recent reports of "racial profiling." DWI is a crime in this nation. DWB shouldn't be. It is wrong to pigeon-hole and punish innocent citizens on the basis of race. It is wrong to stereotype somebody as a suspect simply because of the color of their skin.

Let be very clear: I believe we should abolish racial profiling in America. And any police department in America that is using it should stop right now.

Right now, our administration is exploring this issue -- to see what we can do to help end this hateful practice, once and for all."

Quite obviously, it would be a bit legalistic to say that "police department" does not apply to Federal law enforcement.

Subject: Religious Liberties Protection Act

We have received word that Rep. Canady intends to move quickly on RLPA, the Religious Liberties Protection Act. In general, RLPA would create a religious free exercise defense to many state laws that are inconsistent with the religious beliefs or practices of individuals. In order to apply the law, the government would have to show that it was particularly important to apply the law to the individual with religious objections. You may recall that RLPA is a sequel to RFRA, the Religious Freedom Restoration Act. RFRA became law a few years ago but was largely struck down as beyond Congress's power. RLPA is intended to restore the major part of RFRA that was held unconstitutional.

The President strongly supported RFRA, and it was widely supported in Congress. However, some of the potential implications of the bill are now better understood. In particular, RLPA could provide a religious liberties defense to many state laws, including some civil rights laws, such as fair housing laws that prevent discrimination against gays and lesbians and unmarried persons. This result is not certain, but it is certainly possible, at least in some states. As a result, the gay community, supported by many civil rights groups, oppose RLPA as currently drafted. Last year, no Democrats on the House Constitution Subcommittee supported the bill after they heard from this community. Canady wants to move this bill quickly, and the Administration is going to have to decide how to respond. We will discuss the Administration's response to this bill on Monday at 1:00 in 472 OEOP. Representatives of DOJ will also attend. Can you come or send someone? Thanks.

Dear Mr. Chairman:

As you know, yesterday I unveiled a comprehensive proposal to strengthen our federal firearms laws in four important ways: by (1) expanding the successful Brady Law; (2) further restricting youth access to guns; (3) cracking down on illegal gun traffickers; and (4) strengthening the ban on assault weapons. In the coming days, I will transmit this legislation to Congress. I believe that Congress should be able to pass within weeks or months everything in this legislation, which builds on efforts that have proved highly effective in keeping guns out of the hands of criminals and youth. Consider some of the bill's specific provisions:

My legislation will extend Brady background checks to all gun show sales, as well as to the purchase of explosives. Justice Department studies show that Brady background checks have stopped hundreds of thousands of illegal handgun sales. Extension of the background check requirement to gun shows and explosives will strengthen our ability to keep dangerous weapons out of the hands of criminals.

My legislation will raise the age of the current youth handgun ban from 18 to 21 years of age. With ATF gun trace data showing that more crime guns are traced to 18 and 19 year-olds than to any other age group, this proposal is an obvious way of reducing gun violence across the country.

My bill will also ban youth possession (again, until the age of 21) of all semiautomatic assault rifles and large capacity ammunition clips with more than 10 rounds of ammunition. In 1994, you and other Republicans stood up to the gun lobby and supported the original ban on assault weapons, which applied to newly manufactured weapons. My legislation will prevent juveniles from owning these weapons regardless of the date of manufacture.

And my legislation will limit handgun sales to no more than one per month per person, so that gun runners, hiding behind straw purchasers, cannot buy handguns in bulk and divert them to the street. It will also help law enforcement to trace more crime guns to their source, and to crack down on gun dealers involved in illegal gun trafficking.

For more than six years, we have made great progress in reducing gun-related crime and violence in America. In fact, the number of violent crimes committed with guns has dropped by more than 25 percent during that time. Gun violence, however, remains a serious problem in our nation, and much more needs to be done. Passing comprehensive firearms legislation is one thing we can and must do to address this important issue. I ask that you bring these common-sense measures to a vote as quickly as possible.

President Clinton: Making Our Schools Safe, Disciplined and Drug-Free
May 8, 1999

In his radio address to the nation, the President will unveil new proposals to help make our schools safer and drug-free including initiatives to: require counseling for students who bring firearms and bombs to school, promote programs that educate students on the risks associated with firearms, and allow more education funds to be spent on alternative schools, character education, and other programs. These proposals will be included in the Administration's proposal to reauthorize the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act (SDFSCA), which will be transmitted to Congress next week. In addition, the President will call on the Departments of Education and Justice to work together and provide funds to facilitate information sharing on troubled youth between schools and other agencies.

Improving school response to kids bringing weapons to school. The President's Safe and Drug-Free Schools proposal will contain a number of measures to help schools prevent and respond to kids who bring weapons to school. Specifically, the proposal will:

- **Require counseling for gun-toting students.** Under current law, schools are generally required to expel any student who brings a gun or explosive device to school, as well as to report that student to local law enforcement officials and juvenile justice authorities. During the 1996-97 school year, this national policy of "zero tolerance" for guns resulted in more than 6,000 students being expelled from school. Under the President's new proposal, schools will now also be required to refer every student who brings a gun on to campus to a mental health professional for assessment. If the student is determined to pose an imminent threat to himself or others, he will be required to receive appropriate treatment before being permitted to return to school.
- **Support programs that educate students about risks associated with guns.** Although the current SDFSCA Program funds a broad range of drug and violence prevention programs, gun safety education programs are generally not funded. The President's new initiative will allow funding for programs that educate students about the risks and possible consequences associated with firearms and helps them to make safe choices and avoid injuries.

Dealing with disruptive students and helping to instill common sense values.

- **Facilitate information sharing on troubled youth.** Maintaining a safe school environment requires the forging of partnerships to share information between schools and other agencies that serve young people -- such as police departments, courts, and youth parole and probation offices. The President will instruct the Departments of Justice and Education to work together to identify more effective mechanisms for sharing information consistent with current law, and to provide \$1 million for training and technical assistance on information sharing to educators, law enforcement, juvenile justice authorities, and social service providers.

- **Promote alternative schools and “second chance” programs.** Students who constantly disrupt classes and engage in fights make it more difficult for teachers to teach and for other students to learn. The President’s SDFSCA initiative will provide additional funding incentives to allow schools to fund “second chance” programs that enforce clear, consistent discipline codes; require counseling for problem students; and separate chronically disruptive and violent kids from the rest of the class by placing them in alternative schools and other similar programs. The President’s FY 2000 budget also includes \$9 million for the development of model programs and strategies that establish consequences for disruptive students while keeping them on track academically.
- **Expand character education programs.** Current law prevents the Secretary of Education from making more than 10 grants per year for character education programs, and limits overall funding for each state to \$1 million over a 5-year period. The President will recommend lifting these restrictions so that more states can implement character education programs that help instill common sense values in our children.

Helping communities respond to school shootings. The President’s Safe and Drug Free Schools reauthorization will contain his Project SERV initiative -- developed with the help of the communities impacted by recent schools shootings -- to provide immediate assistance as soon as a school-related violent or traumatic incident occurs, through:

- **A \$12 million Emergency Response Fund** to help communities meet urgent and unplanned needs, such as additional security personnel, emergency mental health crisis counseling, and longer-term counseling to students, faculty, and their families. Officials from the Departments of Justice, Education, HHS, and FEMA worked together to help schools impacted by last year’s shootings. These agencies will continue to work together as part of Project SERV, and improve ongoing federal crisis response efforts.
- **Crisis response experts** identified and funded by the Departments of Education, Justice, Health and Human Services (HHS), and the Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA), who can help local officials identify and respond to community needs, help in developing a plan to address those needs, and assist in locating necessary financial and human resources.

The New Safe, Disciplined, and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Program

The Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Program represents the federal government’s largest effort to prevent youth drug use and school violence. At the White House Conference on School Safety, the President proposed overhauling the SDFSC program to provide more effective prevention programs for the reduction of drugs and violence in schools, more accountability for results, and better targeting to those schools that need the most assistance. Under the President’s new *Safe, Disciplined, and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Program*, school districts will be expected to develop comprehensive plans that:

Adopt and enforce, clear and fair discipline polices, such as zero tolerance polices for guns and drugs, school uniforms, closed campus policies, and parent notification and

involvement.

Establish security procedures for schools which could include the use of metal detectors and to implement formal agreements with law enforcement officials to patrol school grounds and pathways to school.

Provide effective anti-drug and violence prevention programs, including research-based, proven effective programs that teach responsible decision-making, mentoring, mediation, or other activities aimed at changing behaviors.

Increase accountability by collecting data and reporting results to the public through annual report cards on the number and type of school-related drug and/or violence incidents.

Assess and intervene for troubled youth through procedures to identify students for evaluation and counseling; training for teachers and staff; and providing linkages between district officials, mental health, and other community professionals where appropriate.

Connect students to responsible adults in the community through after-school activities to extend the school day or mentoring programs, to keep students away from drugs and violence -- and out of trouble.

Develop a plan for crisis management that responds to traumatic incidents on school grounds, such as shootings on school grounds or drug overdoses.

Building on a Record of Accomplishment

- **Funding comprehensive school safety efforts.** The President's Safe Schools-Healthy Students initiative represents an unprecedented collaboration between the Departments of Justice, Education, and HHS to allow 50 communities to receive up to \$3 million for each of the next three years to adopt comprehensive, community-wide approaches to violence and drug prevention. Through this \$380 million initiative, communities will receive assistance to fund school counselors and other mental health services, metal detectors, officers for schools, and after school and conflict resolution programs by the start of the 1999-2000 school year. The President's Safe and Drug-Free Schools reauthorization proposal will help schools to engage in comprehensive community-wide efforts like the Safe-Schools initiative.
- **Adding more law enforcement to prevent crime, violence, and drugs in schools.** School resource officers provide schools with on-site security and a direct link to law enforcement agencies. Last month, President Clinton announced \$70 million in Justice Department COPS Office grants to hire more than 600 police officers in schools in 336 communities across the country. This was the first installment in meeting the President's pledge made at the White House Conference on School Safety to provide funds for up to

2,000 officers in schools this fiscal year.
