## ***PROLOGUE***

Floods, earthquakes, hurricanes, wildfires, tornadoes and technological disasters cause billions of dollars of damage annually throughout the United States. The loss of lives, injuries and damages to homes, businesses, or workplaces cause incalculable hardship and emotional suffering, and tear at the very fabric of our lives and our communities.

Imagine that you were somehow able to watch, from a distance, a major disaster unfold. You would see suffering and devastation – but that would be only part of the story.

You would also see lots of people move into action – people from government agencies, private organizations, businesses and volunteer groups. You would see them working as a team to keep essential services operating, provide first aid, food and water, clear debris, rebuild homes and businesses, and prevent the disaster from happening again.

Over time, you would begin to see a pattern to the activity. You would see the results of planning and coordination in the execution of an effective response. And you would observe that communities and individuals could lessen the damage that disasters cause, and sometimes avoid it altogether.

The pattern behind the activity is called “emergency management.” It is the process through which America prepares for emergencies and disasters, responds to them, recovers from them, rebuilds, and mitigates their future effects.

### ***What We Do***

The Federal Emergency Management Agency is the federal government unit that has leadership responsibilities for the nation’s emergency management system.

Local and state programs are the heart of the nation’s emergency management system, and most disasters are handled by local or state governments.


When the devastation is especially serious and exceeds the capability and resources of local and state governments, states turn to the federal government for help. Once the President has declared a major disaster, FEMA coordinates not only its own response activities but also those of as many as 27 other federal agencies that may participate.

Federal agencies help states and localities recover from disasters by providing services, resources, and personnel to perform necessary functions, such as transporting food and potable water to the area, assisting with medical aid and temporary housing for those whose homes are uninhabitable, and providing generators for electric power to keep hospitals and other essential facilities in operation.

### ***Who We Are***


FEMA is made up of more than 2600 full time employees and more than 6000 “on call” employees around the nation who entered public service to help others.

# FEMA Organizations





# Grade




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# Gender






# Employee Types

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# **FEMA's Constituent Groups**

## **National Governors' Association (NGA)**

The Office of Intergovernmental Affairs (IGA) works in partnership with the National Governors' Association (NGA) in support of FEMA's mission and strategic goals. Representing Governors of all fifty states, NGA provides a forum to communicate with State Executives concerning the Agency's policies, programs, and initiatives. Under the cooperative agreement with the Agency, NGA also is developing a Governor's handbook on disasters and a Governor's handbook on terrorism. NGA has been instrumental in making mitigation and disaster resistance a part of "Smart Growth," the major initiative of the Association this year under NGA President, Governor Parris Glendening of Maryland. IGA also works with NGA's affiliates, the Southern Governors' Association (SGA) and the Western Governors' Association (WGA). IGA has a close relationship with NGA staff and key leadership, which benefits the Agency both before and after disasters.

## **National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL)**

The National Conference of State Legislatures is a bipartisan organization that serves the legislators and staffs of the nation's fifty states. NCSL provides research, technical assistance, and opportunities for policy-makers to exchange ideas on state issues. IGA has worked with NCSL to find opportunities to reach out to state lawmakers in support of FEMA's programs, policies, and initiatives. This partnership has led to activities such as workshops, panel discussions, and newsletter articles to address, inform and engage NCSL membership on emergency management issues. IGA has a good working relationship with NCSL staff and continues to work to create outreach opportunities with the organization.

## **United States Conference of Mayors (USCM)**

The United States Conference of Mayors is one of FEMA's strong intergovernmental partners. USCM is the official nonpartisan organization of cities having populations of 30,000 or more. There are about 1,100 such cities in the country today and a majority of them belong to the USCM. IGA's partnership with this organization has provided the Director of FEMA and other senior leadership direct contact with city officials through speaking engagements at their annual and legislative conferences, policy and rulemaking meetings, and USCM staff meetings. USCM has also given the Director of FEMA additional opportunities to interact individually with a large number of mayors. IGA's outreach through informational booths, panels, and committee meetings has enabled FEMA to address mayors' concerns and raise the visibility of FEMA policies, programs, and initiatives. IGA has a close relationship with USCM staff and its key leadership. The President of USCM, Brent Coles of Boise, Idaho, is a FEMA Project Impact mayor. The U.S. Conference of Mayors also signed a Memorandum of Understanding with FEMA during the Project Impact Summit to pledge their support of disaster mitigation efforts.

## **National League of Cities (NLC)**

The National League of Cities has been a strong ally of the Agency through IGA. NLC has been an active participant in the development of Stafford Act Amendments and has contributed to the success of Project Impact and other FEMA initiatives. This relationship has given the Agency opportunities to receive comments on how policy and programs would affect their members. FEMA's work with NLC has included policy development, informational booth outreach, workshops, and committee meetings. IGA has developed a particularly close relationship with the NLC Insurance Risk Pools, a new group for FEMA. IGA has a close relationship with NLC staff and the current President of NLC, Mayor Bob Knight of Wichita, Kansas. Mayor Knight has adopted emergency management as one of the initiatives for NLC during his tenure as President.

## **State Municipal Leagues**

IGA has pursued a concerted strategy to reach out to State municipal leagues on the Agency's programs, policies and initiatives. The relationships formed with the executive directors and presidents of State municipal leagues has given FEMA opportunities to spread the Agency's message and vision through workshops, panels, informational outreach booths, committee and policy meetings, newsletters, magazines and guides. These relationships have also proven to be invaluable during times of disaster in the affected States. The leagues acted as the eyes and ears of the Agency to bring concerns about and successes of disaster response and recovery to our attention and often notified us of concerns before they reach the media or were given congressional attention. IGA has developed strong relationships with many executive directors and presidents of State municipal leagues across the nation.

## **National Association of Counties (NACo)**

The National Association of Counties has been a strong advocate for FEMA and its mission. FEMA and NACo joined forces through a cooperative agreement with the Joint Center for Sustainable Communities, through which the concept of building disaster-resistant communities was strengthened. NACo also partnered with FEMA in developing awards to recognize elected county officials who have acted to make their communities more disaster resistant. NACo has sponsored meeting for the Director of FEMA with the State Association presidents and executive directors. NACo has enabled workshops, panels, committee meetings, seminars, informational outreach booths, and local official casework on the programs and policies of FEMA. IGA has a strong working relationship with NACo staff and immediate past NACo President, C. Vernon Gray, who received the first Local Official's Award for Building Disaster Resistant Communities from the Director of FEMA for his active support of our Agency and its mission.

## **State Associations of Counties**

IGA has worked very hard to strategically reach out to State associations of counties on the Agency's message and programs. The relationships formed with the executive directors and presidents of State associations of counties have given FEMA the opportunity to interact

with county officials through workshops, panels, informational outreach booths, committee meetings and policy, newsletters, magazines and guides. These relationships also proved invaluable to the Agency during times of disaster in applicable States. For example, the Ohio State Association published articles to inform and clarify FEMA programs and policies, which helped local officials in Ohio. The associations acted as the eyes and ears of IGA to bring concerns and successes of disaster response and recovery to our attention and often notified us of concerns before they reached the media or the congressional level. IGA has developed strong relationships with many executive directors and presidents in state associations across the nation.

## **National Association of Towns and Townships (NaT&T)**

The National Association of Towns and Townships has been a good partner with FEMA. NaT&T has provided opportunities for FEMA to communicate with their membership about FEMA programs, policies, and initiatives through informational booth outreach, committee meetings and keynote conference speaking opportunities for the Director and senior leadership. IGA has a good working relationship with NaT&T staff and has worked closely with them on policy issues.

## **National Association of Development Organizations (NADO)**

The National Association of Development Organizations is another new organization for FEMA. A strong advocate of making communities more disaster resistant, NADO is working through a cooperative agreement with IGA and the Mitigation Directorate's Project Impact to coordinate peer mentoring on disaster resistance among local representatives involved in Project Impact. NADO created an emergency management task force to review the policies, programs and initiatives of FEMA, as well as show strong support for map modernization initiatives. One of NADO's members received the organization's Innovation Award for its work as a Project Impact community. Further, the President of NADO awarded the Director of FEMA the highest organizational award at the annual conference for his work to strengthen America's rural communities. NADO has given FEMA numerous opportunities to address its members through committee meetings, policy, informational booth outreach, workshops, panels, a special edition of the NADO Digest highlighting emergency management, and keynote speaking events for the Director and key leadership. IGA has a close relationship with NADO staff and leadership.

## **National Association of Regional Councils (NARC)**

IGA continues to work with the National Association of Regional Councils to expand the relationship. Similar in structure to NADO, NARC looks at regional development in a more urban light. IGA continues to build this relationship and seek opportunities for the Agency.

## **National Rural Development Council (NRDP)**

The National Rural Development Partnership (NRDP), which strengthens rural America through collaborative partnerships, is a potential mechanism to help FEMA address rural needs before and after disaster strikes. Bringing together Federal, State, local, and tribal representatives, as well as public and private organizations, the NRDP, through its State Rural Development Councils, works directly with institutions at every level. FEMA and NRDP have already collaborated on blizzard and flooding disaster recovery, rural emergency preparedness, tribal planning, and other initiatives. Key members of the NRDP include 40 State rural development councils. Over 40 government agencies and nonprofit organizations of the NRDP are involved in Project Impact. IGA has a strong relationship with NRDP's staff and leadership.

## **Neighborhoods USA (NUSA)**

Neighborhood USA is a new organization for FEMA. A national organization representing neighborhood groups, NUSA has provided opportunities for our Agency, through workshops and informational booths, to address their members on how they can become disaster-resistant neighborhoods and communities. IGA has a close working relationship with their leadership.

## **National Emergency Management Association (NEMA)/ Council Of State Governments (CSG)**

The National Emergency Management Association works in partnership with FEMA in many directorates. On behalf of FEMA, IGA coordinates with NEMA to be the central entry point for State Emergency Managers into the Agency's directorates, regions, and offices. IGA manages the cooperative agreement with NEMA on behalf of all program areas in FEMA. NEMA and FEMA, under their cooperative agreement, work to ensure that the perspective of States is adequately considered in the Agency's programs, policies, and initiatives.

## **International Association of Emergency Management (IAEM)**

The International Association of Emergency Management provides IGA an avenue through which to learn of the issues and concerns of local emergency management professionals. This partnership with IAEM has given the Agency opportunities to work with the leadership and members of this organization to review programs, policies, and initiatives, and gather their comments, through panels, workshops, and informational booth outreach.

## **International City/County Managers Association (ICMA)**

The International City/County Management Association is a developing partnership for the Agency. IGA is working with this organization to identify ways to jointly achieve common outreach objectives. Despite a very small staff, IGA will continue to build a partnership with this organization to further the Agency's mission and strategic goals.

## CHRONOLOGY OF FEMA'S EVOLUTION AND INNOVATIONS

**1993**

- President Clinton swore in James Lee Witt as the director of FEMA. Witt is the first director of FEMA to have professional emergency management experience prior to being appointed.
- Major Disaster Declarations: 32; Emergency Declarations: 19; Fire Suppression Authorizations: 6.
- FEMA and the National Emergency Management Agency became partners.
- The Hazard Mitigation and Relocation Assistance Act was enacted.
- The Volkmer Amendment enhanced the incentive for states and communities to implement mitigation by revising cost-sharing requirements and increasing significantly the amount of federal money available under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.
- The Natural Disaster Protection Act urged that preventative actions be taken to reduce the loss of life and property, as well as the economic consequences of a catastrophic disaster.
- Nine states suffered serious damage from the Midwest floods.
- Vice President Gore attended FEMA's "All Hands" meeting, where Director Witt outlined his plans for the agency's new organizational structure and management assignments. FEMA's reorganization created the Office of the Director, a National Security Coordinator, the Office of Congressional and Governmental Affairs, the Office of Emergency and Public Information, the Office of Equal Opportunity, the Office of Human Resources Management, the Office of Financial Management, Policy and Assessment, and the Executive Board.
- Between April 1993-April 1994, Director Witt testified 15 times before eight different Congressional committees and subcommittees on issues relating to FEMA.
- Director Witt signed the Labor-Management Agreement, establishing the FEMA Labor-Management Partnership Council.
- FEMA's Internet site ([www.fema.gov](http://www.fema.gov)) established.
- The National Performance Review (NPR) was activated. Director Witt designated FEMA as a NPR Reinvention Laboratory, empowering employees to cut through red tape, exceed customer's expectations, and unleash innovations for improvements.

## 1994 – Chronology – Federal Emergency Management Agency

- Major Disaster Declarations: 36; Emergency Declarations: 1; Fire Suppression Authorizations: 20. A total of \$3.4 billion in disaster aid was provided.
- The Northridge earthquake hit southern California, affecting over 667,000 people and taking 61 lives. FEMA provided more than \$20 million in disaster relief.
- The final report on the Midwest floods was issued.
- FEMA's first strategic plan *Partnership for a Safer Future* was published in December. The plan recognizes that the agency must lay a solid foundation on which to build an effective emergency management organization to provide for a safer future.
- The Arson Prevention Act of 1994 authorized grant awards for demonstration programs in arson prevention and control.
- The National Flood Insurance Reform Act of 1994 established the National Flood Insurance Program. The program is administered by the Federal Insurance Administration (FIA) and the Mitigation Directorate), both components of FEMA.
- A Unified National Program for Floodplain Management was established.
- The Floodsafe 1994 Campaign recognized the one-year anniversary of the Midwest Flood and promoted flood prevention, mitigation and preparedness measures, and flood insurance. Flood Awareness Day was also developed.
- Vice President Gore presented FEMA with the prestigious "Hammer Award" for "Renewal of the Agency". The award recognized a major reorganization, a proactive, all-hazards approach emergency management, and improved customer service for those affected by disasters.
- The National Performance Review report commended FEMA for implementing all recommendations for the agency's improvement.
- The Emergency Alert System (EAS) replaced the Emergency Broadcast System (EBS). The system provides a tool for the President and other officials to warn the public about emergencies.

## 1995 – Chronology – Federal Emergency Management Agency

- Major Disaster Declarations: 31; Emergency Declarations: 2; Fire Suppression Authorizations: 3.
- A bomb destroyed the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City on April 19. FEMA assumed primary responsibility for responding to the incident. FEMA deployed 11 Urban Search & Rescue teams, who recovered 165 victims of the bombing. This was the first time a disaster declaration was issued under section 501 (b) of the Stafford Act.
- Disaster declarations were issued for the destruction caused by Hurricanes Opal, Marilyn, Luis, Humberto, Felix and Erin.
- Over 800 representatives of state and local governments attended the first National Mitigation Conference.
- The Federal Insurance Administration launched Cover America, a nationwide public awareness campaign, which targeted 36 cable networks, three broadcast TV networks, 21 syndicated programs, and 28 magazines.
- The Office of Policy and Assessment and the Office of Regional Operations merged creating the Office of Policy and Regional Operations.
- The Automated Construction Estimating (ACE) system, a hand-held computer used by disaster inspectors, received semi-finalist recognition from the Ford Foundation for its Innovations in Government competition.

## 1996 – Chronology – Federal emergency Management Agency

- Major Disaster Declarations: 74; Emergency Declarations: 8; Fire Suppression Authorizations: 61.
- The president declared major disasters for 14 Eastern states as a result of the Blizzard of '96. Declarations were also issued for Hurricanes Bertha, Hortense, and Josephine as well as Hurricane Fran, which severely impacted five states along the Atlantic coast.
- President Clinton elevated FEMA to cabinet status.
- FEMA won the 1996 Public Employees Roundtable Public Service Excellence Award in the Federal Category. The agency also received the TELLY Award for the videotape production "The Next Generation" that demonstrated the Automated Construction Estimating (ACE) system.
- Urban Search & Rescue teams conducted a major field mobilization in support of the 1996 Olympic Games. FEMA's Region IV also provided assistance after the Centennial Park bombing incident.
- FEMA hosted the first of two U.S./Japan Earthquake Policy Symposiums in the aftermath of the Northridge, Calif. and Kobe, Japan earthquakes.
- The National Earthquake Program Office was established as the result of the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy report "Strategy for National Earthquake Loss Reduction."
- President Clinton announced the National Arson Prevention Initiative (NAPI), after a series of church arson fires. Leaders of eight national fire service organizations pledged partnership in the fight against arson and signed the President's Partnership for Fire and Arson Protection.
- The Federal Radiological Emergency Response Plan (FRERP) established an organized and integrated blueprint for a timely, coordinated federal response to peacetime radiological emergencies.
- The United States and the Russian Federation entered into a Memorandum of Understanding to collaborate on preventing natural and man-made disasters and assisting in disaster response.

## 1997 – Chronology – Federal Emergency Management Agency

- FEMA responded to 43 major disasters declared by President Clinton in 27 states and three Pacific Island territories. The agency provided housing assistance worth \$319 million to 127,064 disaster victims and another \$100 million in grants to meet other serious disaster-related needs. The most costly disaster, the Red River floods in the Upper Midwest floods, required \$466.7 million in FEMA relief assistance.
- FEMA approved more than \$107 million for the purchase of 3,000 flood-prone properties, most of which were affected by the Red River Valley flood. The agency also distributed \$16 million to states and communities for planning and implementing cost-effective measures to reduce future flood damage.
- Project Impact, a mitigation and preparedness initiative designed to foster public awareness, individual responsibility and community ownership, was officially launched with seven pilot communities. FEMA provided over \$200,000 in grants and technical assistance to the communities to retrofit or rehabilitate critical public facilities and residences. The pilot communities were from the states of Maryland, West Virginia, Mississippi, North Carolina, Florida, Washington and California.
- The FEMA Radio Network (FRN), which provides current response and recovery information to radio stations nationwide, became operational on February 28.
- The agency developed a Program Management Plan to address Year 2000 problems and to make computer systems Y2K Compliant.
- FEMA chaired a federal interagency task force that delivers \$2 billion of federal assistance for long-term recovery of the Upper Midwest after the Red River Valley Flood.
- FEMA for Kids, an interactive computer-based program, was developed for use in elementary schools.
- A National Task Force on Emergency Response, comprised of 29 government agencies and national service organizations, provided expert information to cultural institutions and the public on protecting and salvaging valuable artifacts after disaster.
- FEMA conducted its first interactive seminar where federal, state, and local leaders addressed major policy issues involving a potential catastrophic earthquake on the New Madrid fault.
- FEMA entered into an unprecedented agreement with Russia's emergency management organization that established a bilateral work plan and protocol for exchanging information and expertise on emergency preparedness and disaster response practices.

## 1997 – Chronology – Federal emergency Management Agency

- A state-of-the-art CD-ROM / virtual-reality arson investigation training program was produced in partnership with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, American Insurance Co. and National Fire Protection Association.
- NEMA and FEMA developed the Capability Assessment for Readiness (CAR) process, part of the State PPA/CA improvement cycle. The process assesses the operational readiness and capability of the federal/state emergency management partnership to mitigate against, prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters.
- The Emergency Information Infrastructure Partnership (EIIIP) was launched.
- A Hurricane Liaison Team was developed that deploys to the National Hurricane Center when tropical systems develop.
- FEMA established a Territory Logistics Center Program to provide centralized control, rapid deployment and accountability for disaster field locations.

## 1998 – Chronology – Federal Emergency Management Agency

- FEMA responded to 65 major disaster declarations involving 34 states, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, the Marshall Islands and Micronesia. More than \$590 million in disaster housing assistance and another \$345 million in grants to help meet serious disaster-related needs was provided to affected individuals.
- More than \$1.6 billion in disaster aid was provided as a result of the Atlantic hurricane season, including \$1.3 billion for the Hurricane Georges relief effort in Puerto Rico.
- The ten declared disasters resulting from Hurricanes Bonnie, Earl and Georges were the most hurricane-related disasters since 1985.
- A record number of tornado-related disasters were declared, topping the previous high set in 1992.
- Florida led the nation with six Presidential major disaster declarations, followed by New York with four, and Alabama, North Carolina, Tennessee and Texas with three each.
- Flooding was involved in 48 of the year's declared declarations.
- The agency improved its disaster response, averaging an eight-day turnaround in getting checks to disaster victims. The agency had averaged a 10-day turnaround in 1997, and a high of 20 days in 1992.
- In addition to major disaster declarations, 10 emergency declarations and 54 fire suppression grants, covering six states, were authorized.
- The agency designated 117 Project Impact Communities as well as more than 680 business partners. More than \$30 million in FEMA funding was made available in support of Project Impact initiatives. The goal of at least one Project Impact community per state was realized.
- FEMA chaired federal Interagency Task Forces to develop long-term recovery strategies for areas impacted by the Northeast ice storms in January, the Alabama tornadoes in April, and Hurricane Georges in Puerto Rico in September.
- More than \$41 million was distributed to states for planning and implementing cost-effective community mitigation projects that reduce the risk of future losses from floods, hurricanes and other natural disasters.

- More than 600 representatives from the 57 Project Impact communities gathered to share disaster-reduction strategies in the FEMA-sponsored Inaugural Project Impact Summit in December.
- The first National Tornado Forum pulled together local, state and national experts on tornado hazards and wind mitigation.
- The U.S. Fire Administration Kids Page became the first national fire-safety web site dedicated to teaching children fire-safe behavior.
- FEMA produced a public education program with Sesame Street and the Children's Television Network for day-care providers.
- A CD-ROM edition of the FEMA for Kids Web site was distributed by schools nationwide.
- The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) developed a disaster relief and damage prevention resource guide to support Project Impact.
- Fannie Mae became a partner in Project Impact.
- Vice President Al Gore's Partnership for Reinventing Government honored FEMA as one of its 32 "high-impact" federal agencies.

## 1999 -- Chronology -- Federal Emergency Management Agency

- The total number of disasters declared included: Major Disaster Declarations: 49; Emergency Declarations: 19; Fire Suppression Authorizations: 41. \$118.5 million was obligated for disaster support activity.
- The Office of Intergovernmental Affairs was created.
- In FY1999, FEMA processed 750,000 claims for disaster assistance, awarded \$400 million in disaster housing payments, and handled more than 1 million calls on the customer service helpline.
- The agency released HAZUS99, a natural hazard loss estimation methodology software program for earthquake-related mitigation, as a tool for use during disaster response.
- FEMA served as lead for the Emergency Services working group of the President's Council on Y2K Conversion to help state and local emergency management organizations, fire services, and emergency medical services.
- The 17 declared major disasters are the most ever for a hurricane season. The disaster declarations were issued for four Atlantic hurricanes involving 14 mainland states. In addition, two emergencies were declared for Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands as result of Hurricane Lenny
- The 13 major disaster declarations for Floyd alone are the most for any single hurricane or other event, eclipsing the nine declarations for the Midwest Floods of 1993. (The East Coast Blizzard of 1996 had 14 major disaster declarations issued but only for emergency snow removal.)
- FEMA funding for 1999 hurricane declarations currently totals \$457.2 million. More than \$420 million of that total has been obligated so far for Floyd, including \$223.8 million for North Carolina; \$47.9 million for New Jersey; \$41 million for South Carolina and \$34.6 for Virginia.
- So far, 144,854 Floyd victims have registered for federal aid in the nine declared states designated for Individual Assistance, including 74,267 in North Carolina. This exceeds the 83,800 registrations for Hurricane Fran in six declared states, including 72,736 registrations in North Carolina.
- More than 42,973 homes sustained some degree of damage from Floyd, according to federal/state damage surveys. Of that total, some 11,779 dwellings were either destroyed or heavily damaged. Seventy-nine deaths and five injuries are attributed to Floyd. More than 105,580 people required emergency shelter. Approximately 4 million were evacuated in North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and Florida.

- A total of 62 Fire Suppression Authorizations were approved for fire activity during 2000. The incidents began on January 3 and continued throughout the year. States affected include New Mexico (the Cerro Grande fire), Washington, Texas, Montana, Nevada, Wyoming, Minnesota, Colorado, Texas, Kentucky, and South Dakota.
- Worcester, MA becomes the pilot Project Impact Community for fire resistance.
- The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, an amendment to the Robert P. Stafford Act, was approved and signed into law.
- Sixty-three new Project Impact Communities were designated for FY2001, putting the total number of communities now associated with Project Impact at 247. Over 1,100 business partners are now part of the Project Impact initiative.
- The first no-notice national counter terrorism exercise, called TOPOFF, was held.
- The first Integrated Emergency Management Institute course was developed and presented to the Arizona Gila River Indian Tribe.
- FEMA and the University of North Carolina-Wilmington conducted the first conference for institutions of higher learning from selected Project Impact Communities.
- Memorandums of Understanding were signed between FEMA and the New York State Emergency Management Office, Humane Services of the U.S., NASA, Coleman Powermate and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.
- All 10 regions completed their COOP plans that outline how the region will handle an emergency that prevents them from using their Regional Office.
- FEMA participated in National Security Special Events for OPSAIL, VA, MD, and PA and the National Democratic and Republican Conventions held in Philadelphia and Los Angeles.
- A Comprehensive HAZMAT Emergency Response – Capability Assessment Program (CHER-CAP) conducted a full-scale exercise for hospitals, EMS, fire departments, public works, and local and state emergency management agencies.


