I was an intern here in the summer of 1968. I lived on the George Washington University campus, the same place the Wellesley interns will live this summer, arriving just in the aftermath of Martin Luther King and Bobby Kennedy's assassinations.

It was a time of great political ferment for our nation. And the 14 Wellesley interns in Washington were in the thick of the most spirited debates our nation was having about domestic and foreign policy issues.
