WHITE HOUSE EASTER EGG HUNT AND EGG ROLL SCHEDULED FOR APRIL 12

WASHINGTON, DC -- The White House will hold its traditional Easter Egg Roll and Hunt on Monday, April 12. The Easter activities at the White House this year will be expanded to allow more families the opportunity to participate.

This year, only the Easter Egg Roll and Hunt will take place on the South Lawn of the White House. All entertainment will be moved to the Ellipse to make more space available for the Roll and Hunt. Families with children over eight years of age should proceed directly to the Ellipse.

White House Easter Egg Roll and Hunt:

DATE: Monday, April 12

LOCATION: The White House South Lawn
1600 Pennsylvania Avenue

ENTRANCE: Southwest Gate

TIME: White House Lawn - Gates open at 10:00 AM and close at 2:00 PM.

Entertainment on the Ellipse - Activities begin at 9:30 AM and conclude at 3:00 PM.

TRANSPORTATION: It is suggested that families planning on attending the White House Easter activities use Metro services.

Editors Note: Monday, April 12 is expected to be the peak of the Cherry Blossoms and downtown Washington will be very congested.

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HARD BOILED FACTS

- o Adults must be accompanied by a child age 3 to 8 years of age to enter the White House Lawn. The entertainment on the Ellipse is open to children of all ages.
- o Entrance to the White House Lawn, through the Southwest Gate, begins to form at 7:00 AM.
- o There will be 30,000 wooden eggs used at this year's event. The eggs are painted in pastel colors and feature a silhouette of the White House and the signatures of the President and First Lady. A number of the eggs are signed by celebrities.
- o There will be 5,000 hard boiled eggs used for the Egg Roll. The eggs are dyed by the White House Chef.
- o Entertainers on the Ellipse will perform on three stages. Those expected to participate are Peter, Paul and Mary; Sesame Street Live; Thomas the Tank; Rory; and Trout Fishing in America. (A complete list of entertainers will be available next week.)
- o In the event of rain, the Easter Monday activities will be cancelled.

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The original site of the Easter Egg Roll was on the grounds of the United States Capitol. The event was begun during the Presidency of James Madison (1809 - 1817), at the suggestion of his wife, Dolly Madison. Mrs. Madison was fascinated to learn that Egyptian children rolled colored eggs on the site of the Pyramids. She thought the children of the Washington area would enjoy this enchanting sport.

In 1877, under orders from members of Congress, Capitol policemen forced the children to leave the grounds. Some Congressmen, tired of slipping and sliding on the remains of the boiled eggs, felt the grounds could no longer be torn up in a way. Some sources tell us that one irritated nursemaid, followed by several of her charges, stormed down to the White House where she demanded access to the White House grounds for egg rolling. Others claim that President Rutherford B. Hayes, riding by the Capitol grounds in his carriage, saw the tearful children, and invited them to the White House for their egg roll.

In 1878, President Hayes and his wife, Lucy, officially opened the White House grounds to children of the area for egg rolling on Easter Monday. The event has been held on the South Lawn ever since, except during World War I and World War II. During the war years, the Easter Egg Roll was held at the National Zoo, and at other Washington locations.

By the late 1800's games such as Egg Picking, Egg Ball, Toss and Catch and Egg Croquet were popular activities on Easter Monday. Some children especially enjoyed floating empty egg shells in the South Lawn pool. However, the favorite game was the traditional sport of egg rolling.

The White House Easter Egg Roll is eagerly awaited each year by thousands of children. It is held on the Monday after Easter, on the South Lawn of the White House. Children hunt for brightly colored wooden signature eggs hidden in hay. Many of these eggs have been signed by famous people. The Vice President, Members of Congress, Cabinet Secretaries, as well as eggs signed by the many celebrities who visit the White House during the year, are nestled in the hay. Of course the real treasures are the eggs personally signed by the President and First Lady. The children attending the event take part in many wonderful activities, but rolling a hard boiled a hard boiled egg down the lawn is till the highlight of the day.
