**THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. CLINTON HONOR
THEIR MAJESTIES THE EMPEROR AND EMPRESS OF JAPAN
AT A WHITE HOUSE STATE DINNER**

WASHINGTON, DC -- The President and Mrs. Clinton will host their Majesties, The Emperor and Empress of Japan at a State Dinner at the White House on Monday, June 13, 1994. The White Tie dinner will begin at 7:15 PM with the arrival of their Majesties at the White House North Portico. Dinner guests will begin arriving at the East Executive Entrance of the White House at 7:00 PM. The President's United States Marine Orchestra will perform in the Grand Foyer.

The guests will be greeted by the President and Mrs. Clinton and Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko in the Grand Foyer of the White House. Following the receiving line, the President and Mrs. Clinton will escort their Majesties through the White House Blue Room and down the South Portico Stairs to the Rose Garden. The United States Army's Strolling Violinists will line the driveway to the Rose Garden.

The tables in the Rose Garden will be set with the Reagan China, gilded flatware and crystal stemware with a golden rim by Lennox. The red and cream table skirt design is known as Crimson Renaissance. The floral center pieces are topiaries containing pink candia roses, red and white florabunda roses, and variegated ivy. The topiaries are surrounded by three similar arrangements and six votive candles. During dinner, the Marine String Ensemble will perform and the Army Strolling Strings will entertain during the dessert course.

Following the dinner, the guests will be entertained by Maestro Mstislav Rostropovich. Cellist Maestro Rostropovich will be accompanied by Lambert Orkis on the piano. Rostropovich is expected to play the following selections, Adagio by Bach/Silotti, Piece in a Folk Style by Schumann, Scherzo from the Sonata for cello and piano by Shostakovich, and Dances of the Elves by Popper.

At the conclusion of the entertainment, the President and Mrs. Clinton will escort the Emperor and Empress to the North Portico for their departure.

"EAGLE" SCULPTURE CREATED BY ALLAN HOUSER

This sculpture was specially created by Native American artist Allan Houser for Their Majesties The Emperor and Empress of Japan.

The sculpture is carved from steatite, a gray stone quarried in the southeast area of the United States. For Native Americans, the eagle is a divine messenger between the human world and the spirit world. His feathers have powered prayers on this continent since before memory. The eagle is also a widespread clan totem symbol.

Allan Houser (his Indian name is Haozous) was born on June 30, 1914, on his family's farm near Apache, Oklahoma, and is today an internationally celebrated artist. As a gifted interpreter of the changing tribal world he knows so well, he has created a unique sculptural legacy.

**GIFT TO BE PRESENTED TO THE PRESIDENT OF
THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
FROM THE EMPORER OF JAPAN**

GOLD LACQUER HAND-BOX

The oldest known piece of Japanese lacquer-ware was made in the Asuka Period (CE552-645) and is preserved at the Horyuji Temple in Nara. It still keeps its unique luster. It is an object with history of some 1350 years.

Over a long period of time, uniquely Japanese styles of lacquer ware came to be developed using gold or silver lacquer, mother-of-pearl inlay and many other lacquer-coating techniques. Art objects and everyday utensils alike came into familiar use under the generic of "nurimono" (coated-wares).

The design shows a pattern of iris flowers that bloom in May and June. From olden times in Japan the iris was used as a charm to dispel pestilential vapors and ward off all malice and evil. This plant symbolism still enlivens the tradition of iris-sake and iris-baths. Gold lacquer and mother-of-pearl inlay went into the making of this very traditional Japanese piece.

PEARL BROOCH

A Mikimoto pearl and sterling silver white birch leaf brooch.

It is a Japanese tradition for individuals to have a personal symbol, and the white birch is the Empress' personal symbol.

PIAZZA NAVONA

PIAZZA NAVONA

Piazza Navona lays claim to being the hear of Rome. Its elliptical shape matches exactly the outlines of the stadium built there by the Emperor Domitian in 886 A.D. Until the Middle Ages, Piazza Navona was used for jousting, horse racing and water festivals.

In 1644 Pope Innocent X of the Pamphili family commissioned the Sant'Agnese in Agone church, designed by Borromini, three marvelous fountains, and the Palazzo Pamphili (now the Brazilian Embassy).

The church honors Sant'Agnese, a fourth century martyr. In 304 A.D., Sant'Agnese, at the time a 13-year-old virgin, refused to renounce her religion and as punishment was thrown into a brothel near Piazza Navona. Legend holds that as she was about to be paraded naked, her hair grew to a miraculous length to save her modesty. She was killed soon afterwards. Her remains were interred in the Basilica of Sant'Agnese Fuori le Mura and an oratory was built on the site of her death. It eventually was transformed into the Church of Sant'Agnese in Agone. Several baroque masterpieces, including Antonio Raggi's *Martyrdom of St. Cecilia*, Ercole Ferrata's relief, *The Stoning of St. Emerenziana* (another martyr who was killed after she was discovered praying at Sant'Agnese's tomb), and Alessandro Algardi's *The Miracle of the Hair of St. Agnes*, decorate the church.

The Fountain of the Four Rivers located in the square is Bernini's greatest fountain and his best known work. It was commissioned by Innocent X in 1648 as part of his plan to improve the approach to the Palazzo Doria Pamphili. The four rivers are symbolized by four massive figures perched on a crag of travertine. Each represents one of the four rivers of Paradise, the Nile, Ganges, Danube and Plato and the four known corners of the world, Africa, Asia, Europe and America. The dove on the top of the obelisk is a symbol of the Pamphili family.

The Fountain of the Moor is the work of Giacomo della Porta. Built in 1575, the central figure of the so-called Moor (actually a marine divinity grappling with a dolphin) was added by Antonio Mori from a design by Bernini. The encircling tritons are 19th-century copies of the 16th-century originals.

Today Piazza Navona is a favorite of Italian and foreign tourists. In December it is transformed into a month-long Epiphany festival which keeps the square's old festive spirit alive.

Emanuele Gianturco Public Elementary School

The public elementary school "Emanuele Gianturco" is located on Via Palombella in an eighteenth century palazzo, originally built as a residence for the Aldobrandini family; later that same century it became a religious institution, where sisters established a school for Roman children. After the unity of Italy (1871) it became one of the first public schools in Rome. The current name recalls the political liberal Emanuele Gianturco, minister of Public Instruction in 1894.

The school building is built on three floors plus a terrace. The first floor has the office of the secretariat and the headmaster, the library and the computer lab. The second and third floors have the classrooms and various labs—for music, painting and English language, plus a video room.

The top floor has a terrace with a fully-equipped science lab and a meteorological center operated in cooperation with UCEA (the oldest meteorological center in the Rome district.) From the terrace there are splendid views of the rooftops and monuments surrounding our school: among the most famous are those of the Pantheon, Saint Eustachio Church, Saint Ivo alla Sapienza.

The school is the only one in Rome which participates in the European Project — PEC — in cooperation with Holland, Spain and England for the instruction of foreign languages starting from the first grade. The European Project represents an experimental methodology for foreign language teaching. Starting in first grade, the children study the foreign language with methods that emphasize having fun while learning grammar and vocabulary. For example, the students learn the language while drawing or playing dominoes.

VILLA TAVERNA

Villa Taverna (Ambassador's Residence)

Villa Taverna is the official residence for the Ambassador and Mrs. Bartholomew. It is located approximately one mile from the Embassy on the northern edge of the Villa Borghese. It is situated on seven acres in the Parioli section of Rome.

The villa has been in existence since at least 955 A.D. Beneath the estate lie several catacombs dating from 270 A.D., part of the Catacombs of Saint Valentine. The estate, which formerly included vineyards and farmlands, belonged to the Catholic Church for many centuries. In 1824, Pope Leo XII gave the villa and the Parioli vineyard surrounding it to the Roman Seminary, which used it as a summer residence as well as a working farm. Several popes made use of the residence in subsequent years, including Pope John XXIII when he was a seminary student.

After the turn of the century, the Villa Taverna (then called the Villa Parioli) yielded most of its lands to the encroaching city of Rome. Reduced to its present size—about one city block—it was sold to Count Ludovico Taverna, a distinguished Milanese nobleman who gave the property his name. It was Count Taverna's daughter and heir, the Princess Borromeo-Taverna, who rented the villa to the United States Government in 1933 as an ambassadorial residence.

The Italian Government took over the building during World War II. By the time Rome was liberated, the Villa was being used as a hospital, administered by the Knights of Malta, to prevent it from being appropriated by the Germans as officers quarters. The U.S. Government resumed occupancy of the property at the end of the war and purchased it in March, 1948, designating it as the Ambassador's residence.

The Villa itself is a large three story structure. The ground floor consists of the representational and public rooms (dining rooms, study, salon and entrance portico). A service wing contains the kitchen and storage rooms. The second floor contains the private living quarters for the Ambassador. Guest suites and guest bedrooms are located on the third floor.

Located on the Villa's grounds is a separate building containing a movie theater with seating for 70. A swimming pool is located adjacent to the theater with a tennis court situated on the opposite side of the property. Three fountains of different styles and epochs adorn the residence's Italian-style landscaped garden, along with statues and relics that were brought to the property centuries ago.

The Academy is funded by gifts from individuals, colleges and universities, foundations, corporations and the National Endowment for the Humanities and the National Endowment for the Arts.
