WHITE HOUSE CHRISTMAS TREE TO BE PRESENTED TO
FIRST LADY HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON

WASHINGTON, DC -- First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton will be presented with the official White House Christmas Tree on Thursday, December 1, 1994 at 10:30 AM.

The Christmas Tree will be delivered to the White House by Louis W. Schmitt and his family. The Colorado Blue Spruce tree was grown at the Schmitt Tree Farm, "Santa's Forest," near Holt in Clinton County Missouri. The 18 1/2 foot tree will be placed in the Blue Room of the White House and will be on display there throughout the Christmas season. The Schmitt farm was named the 1994 National Grand Champion Growers by the National Christmas Tree Association.

The tree will be brought up the White House's driveway to the North Portico by a horse drawn carriage.

1994 WHITE HOUSE CHRISTMAS CARD FEATURES THE RED ROOM

WASHINGTON, DC -- The 1994 White House Christmas Card is a reproduction of artist Thomas McKnight's "White House Christmas." Featuring the Red Room, the casein on canvas painting was done especially for this year's Holiday Card. (Casein is the mixing of paint pigment with a milk protein) The card was printed by American Greetings at its Corbin, Kentucky plant and will be sent to approximately 200,000 families.

American artist Thomas McKnight, of Palm Beach, Florida, began working on this year's Holiday Card when he visited the White House during December of 1993. In 1982, McKnight was one of thirty artists selected to paint easter eggs for a White House and Smithsonian exhibit, and his 1988 serigraph "Constitution" was chosen as the official image for the U.S. Constitution Bicentennial. A print of the serigraph by McKnight hangs in the private quarters of the White House.

The Democratic National Committee paid for all production and mailing costs associated with this year's card.

- Socks, the first cat, is sitting beside the fire.
- There is a saxophone under the tree.
- The painting above the Red Room door is from McKnight's "Wanderer" series. The painting depicts the artist walking by a river with his wife's dog, Shadow.
- The open book on the Red Room chair is the artist's sketch book.

WASHINGTON, DC -- The President and Mrs. Clinton are hosting Ukrainian President Leonid Kuchma and Mrs. Kuchma (Lyudmyla) at a White House State Dinner on Tuesday, November 22, 1994. The black tie dinner will begin at 7:15 PM with arrival of President and Mrs. Kuchma at the White House's North Portico. Dinner guests will begin to arrive at 7:00 PM at the White House's East Executive Entrance.

Guests will be received by the President and Mrs. Clinton, and President and Mrs. Kuchma in the Grand Foyer of the White House. Following the receiving line, the President and Mrs. Clinton will escort President and Mrs. Kuchma into the State Dining Room.

The tables in the State Dining Room will be set with the Reagan China, vermeil flatware, and Morgantown Crystal on a gold damask table skirt. The floral center pieces feature red lion amaryllis, vanilla roses, peter john chrysanthemums and cream gerber daisies arranged in bamboo vermeil bowls. The center pieces will be surrounded by four 11 inch classic gold candle sticks with 24 inch cream tapers.

Following the dinner, the guests will be entertained by Ms. Nancy LaMott in the East Room. Ms. LaMott is expected to sing "Listen to My Heart," by David Friedman; "Pick Yourself Up," by Jerome Kern and Dorothy Fields; "Have You Got Any Castles, Baby," by Henry Mancini and Johnny Mercer; and "I Love a Piano," by Irving Berlin.

At the conclusion of the entertainment, the President and Mrs. Clinton will escort President and Mrs. Kuchma to the North Portico for their departure to Blair House. Guests will be invited to continue the evening with dancing in the Grand Foyer.

"THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS"

WASHINGTON, DC -- The classic Christmas carol, "The Twelve Days of Christmas," is the theme for this year's Christmas at the White House. Students from Blue Ribbon Schools, students from university art/design schools and Tole Painters, from all around the country, were invited to create the ornaments used throughout the White House.

The White House Christmas Tree, an 18 1/2 foot Colorado Blue Spruce located in the Blue Room, is covered with ornaments depicting partridges in pear trees, turtle doves, french hens, calling birds, golden rings, geese a-laying, swans a-swimming, maids a-milking, ladies dancing, lords a-leaping, pipers piping, and drummers drumming. The thousands of ornaments displayed reflect the imaginations and talents of the individual artists, while remaining true to the spirit of the original carol.

The tree skirt for the Blue Room Tree consists of individual quilted panels representing each of the fifty states, territories and the District of Columbia. The quilted hunter green velvet panels are each uniquely designed, using a variety of quilting techniques.

The Ginger Bread House, located in the State Dining Room, is a replica of President Clinton's childhood home in Hot Springs, Arkansas. 416 Park Avenue in Hot Springs, Arkansas is decorated for the holiday season with wreaths in the windows and Santa Claus preparing to go down the chimney.

Working from photographs, the White House master pastry chefs, Roland Mesnier and Franett McCulloch, captured every detail of the President's childhood home -- the slopping roof of the front porch, green shutters, tudor molding and the President's black german shepherd, "King," sitting on the porch. The house is constructed of approximately 70 pounds of ginger bread and is held together with chocolate. Santa Claus, the wreaths, reindeer and german shepherd are made of marzipan.

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STOCKING STUFFER TIPS:

o There are 40,280 white lights used on the Christmas Trees throughout the White House, 5,040 of which are used on the Blue Room tree.

o 99 university art/design schools created ornaments to be used throughout the White House.

o The Children's Christmas Tree located in the East Visitor's entrance of the White House is decorated with 350 ornaments made by children who attend Blue Ribbon Schools. The Blue Ribbon School Program, sponsored by the United States Department of Education, recognizes and supports primary and secondary schools that are noted for their exceptional arts education.

o The National Society of Tole and Decorative Painters created hundreds of hand painted ornaments depicting the Twelve Days of Christmas. Tole painting is a general term historically used to describe decorative painting on tin surfaces. Today Tole painting encompasses many painting styles, methods, techniques and mediums.

o Volunteers started work two weeks ago preparing wreaths, garlands and greenery arrangements at a warehouse in Maryland. On Friday, December 1, a large cargo truck arrived at the White House containing all of their handy work. For some of these volunteers the tradition of helping out at the White House has become a tradition that has been passed from generation to generation.

1994 WHITE HOUSE CHRISTMAS CARD FEATURES THE RED ROOM

WASHINGTON, DC -- The 1994 White House Christmas Card is a reproduction of artist Thomas McKnight's "White House Christmas." Featuring the Red Room, the casein on canvas painting was done especially for this year's Holiday Card. (Casein is the mixing of paint pigment with a milk protein) The card was printed by American Greetings at its Corbin, Kentucky plant and will be sent to approximately 200,000 families.

American artist Thomas McKnight, of Palm Beach, Florida, began working on this year's Holiday Card when he visited the White House during December of 1993. In 1982, McKnight was one of thirty artists selected to paint easter eggs for a White House and Smithsonian exhibit, and his 1988 serigraph "Constitution" was chosen as the official image for the U.S. Constitution Bicentennial. A print of the serigraph by McKnight hangs in the private quarters of the White House.

The Democratic National Committee paid for all production and mailing costs associated with this year's card.

- There is a saxophone under the tree.
