**GIFT PRESENTED BY THE PRESIDENT TO  
HIS EXCELLENCY PRESIDENT JACQUES CHIRAC**

One of the Official Gifts for President Chirac from President Clinton on the occasion of his state visit to the United States is a hand-crafted sterling cache pot. The piece features an etched border design inspired by a cornice found in the East Room of the White House and an etched floral design taken from the fireplaces in the Green and Red Rooms of the White House. The flower in the center is dogwood blossom, a tree frequently found in the President's home state of Arkansas. The cache pot was designed exclusively as a gift for President Clinton to present for state visits.

The other gift from President Clinton is a teleprompter. When President Clinton went to France for the D-Day Commemorative ceremonies in 1994 he spoke before the National Assembly. After that speech, Paris was amazed that the President was able to speak without a note. As it turns out the White House had brought its teleprompter to Paris and the President had used it during the speech. The teleprompter is presented to President Chirac and the National Assembly from President Clinton

**GIFT PRESENTED BY MRS. CLINTON TO MRS. CHIRAC**

The gift presented to Mrs. Chirac from Mrs. Clinton is a bronze sculpture created by the artist John Cavanaugh of a female figure entitled "Cantebury." Mr. Cavanaugh was one of the foremost bronze sculpture artists in the United States.

Mrs. Margaret Thompson Biddle, heiress to a Montana mining fortune, bequeathed to the White House in 1956 her collection of gilded silver - 1574 pieces, mostly 18th and 19th century English ware, including examples by some of the most prominent smiths such as George Wickes, Paul Storr, and Richard Sibley. This collection was received at the White House in January 1958.

- \* CANDELABRA, pair, 1808-1809, London, by Benjamin & James Smith. Three scrolled arms; triple-herm shaft (Greek female faces and feet); paw-footed legs on triangular base; later engraved arms of George, Lord Curzon, Viceroy of India and British Foreign Secretary. (H. 27 1/8 in.)

Benjamin Smith, working in several different partnerships, was one of the chief rivals of Paul Storr, both of whom were often employed by the prominent London firm Rundell, Bridge and Rundell.

- CANDELABRA, pair, 1809-1810, London, by Paul Storr. Three scrolled arms; triple-herm shaft (Greek female faces, but no feet); paw-footed legs. (H. 28 in.)

Paul Storr, the leading English Regency silversmith.

- CANDELABRA, pair, 1810-1811, London, by William Pitts. Spiral of three leafy arms; eagle on shaft. (H. 21 in.)

Reportedly derived from an 18th century model attributed to Paul Lamarie, this form was frequently made by Pitts and his contemporaries, including Paul Storr.

- CANDELABRUM, 1835-1836, London, by Paul Storr. Three scrolled arms; eagles on base at shell feet. (H. 28 3/8 in.)  
Related to the 18th century model used by Pitts and by Storr himself 25 years earlier.

- CANDELABRA, pair, 1821-1822, Sheffield, by R. Gainsford. Two spiraled arms; heavily worked with leaf and feathered scrolls. H. 18 3/4 in.
