FIRST LADY HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON TO WRITE WEEKLY COLUMN

WASHINGTON, DC -- In a speech to the American News Women's Club, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton today announced that she will begin writing a weekly syndicated column. The First Lady's column will begin July 23, 1995.

The column will draw on Mrs. Clinton's experiences as First Lady and on her observations of women, children and families she has met across the country and around the world.

"This newspaper column presents a unique opportunity to share my experiences in the White House and as First Lady with the American people," Mrs. Clinton said.

Mrs. Clinton's column will be syndicated by Creators Syndicate. Creators Syndicate first approached Mrs. Clinton more than two years ago about writing a column. Founded in 1987, Creators is one of the largest newspaper syndicates in the world and distributes to 2400 newspapers worldwide. The company represents more than 80 newspaper features, including columnists Ann Landers, former Vice President Dan Quayle, Mark Shields, Molly Ivins and Robert Novak; editorial cartoonists Herblock, Mike Luckovich and Doug Marlette; and cartoons such as B.C. and the Wizard of Id, by Johnny Hart.

"We are deeply honored to represent Hillary Rodham Clinton," said Richard S. Newcombe, president of Creators Syndicate. "She has extraordinary courage, intelligence and vision, and her fans number in the millions. We look forward to syndicating her newspaper column."

Mrs. Clinton will take no money for writing the column. Creators Syndicate will pay expenses associated with the writing and syndication of the column.

Mrs. Clinton will make brief remarks in the East Room of the White House prior to the reception.

On Monday evening, Mrs. Clinton will speak at the RESULTS organization's 15th Anniversary Banquet. RESULTS is a non-profit international organization dedicated to ending hunger and poverty around the world.

GILDED SILVER HOLLOWWARE FROM THE BIDDLE COLLECTION

Mrs. Margaret Thompson Biddle, heiress to a Montana mining fortune, bequeathed to the White House in 1956 her collection of gilded silver - 1574 pieces, mostly 18th and 19th century English ware, including examples by some of the most prominent smiths such as George Wickes, Paul Storr, and Richard Sibley. This collection was received at the White House in January 1958.

CANDELABRA, pair, 1808-1809, London,
made by Benjamin & James Smith.
Triple-herm shaft (Greek female faces and bare feet).
Once belonged to George Nathanson Curzon (1859-1925)
viceroy of India (1898-1905) and British foreign
secretary (1919-1924). In 1895 Lord Curzon had
married Mary Leiter, daughter of Chicago millionaire
Levi Leiter, at St. John's Church, Lafayette Square,
a wedding attended by her friend First Lady Frances
Folsom Cleveland and Washington society including
the Theodore Roosevelts.

CANDLESTICKS, set of four, 1791-1793, London,
made by John Schofield.
Taller, vasiform shaft with classical leaf decoration.

CANDLESTICKS, set of four, 1812-1813, London, made by Paul Storr.
Shorter; heavily chased with shells and mythological masks
on square base.
Once belonged to George Nathanson Curzon
(see candelabra above).

SAUCE TUREENS, two by Paul Storr, London, 1806-1807
(also maker of candlesticks above),
one by Benjamin & James Smith, 1810-1811
(also makers of candelabra above).
Footed circular bowl; reeded handles from lion mask mounts.
Form common to two of the foremost London silversmithies of
the early 19th century.

The Woltner family owned Chateau La Mission Haut-Brion in
Bordeaux since 1887 and sold when faced with the problem of
succession of ownership in 1977. La Mission Haut-Brion is one of
the "esteemed five" of French wineries. The land they purchased
in Napa Valley had been farmed by Frenchmen, Brun and Chaix, in
1877. This winery produces only Chardonnay.

Domaine Drouhin Pinot Noir 1991, Oregon

This winery is a pioneer in Oregon winemaking, serving as the
first notice that Oregon is recognized as a world quality wine
producing state. The Drouhin family is one of the most renown
producers in Burgundy, both as grower and negociant. His daughter
Veronique is the winemaker on site in Oregon.

Roederer Estate Sparkling Wine, "White House Cuvee" Mendocino
Roederer is one of the "Grande Marques" in Champagne. They came
to California in the 1980s and selected Mendocino County for a
location due to it's cooler climate. The "White House Cuvee" is a
slightly higher dosage which makes it a good compliment to after
dinner enjoyment.

PORTRAITS OF PRESIDENT AND MRS. GEORGE BUSH

The official portraits of President and Mrs. George Bush were presented to the White House in an East Room ceremony on July 17, 1995. Both portraits were painted by Herbert E. Abrams. Funds for their acquisition were donated by Robert E. and Elizabeth W. Krueger, of Lafayette, California, through the White House Historical Association which commissions portraits of Presidents and First Ladies for the White House collection.

President George Bush

President Bush is depicted in a three-quarter length pose standing in his office in the White House Residence. Behind him is the 1868 painting by George Healy entitled, The Peacemakers, one of Mr. Bush's favorite White House paintings. Flanking President Bush are a globe and chair like those used in the Oval Office during his presidency. His left hand rests on the side chair while his right hand holds a document. He is shown wearing a dark blue suit, a blue shirt, and a red striped tie.

This likeness was executed from sittings made in Houston and Kennebunkport, Maine in 1994. It is signed and dated at the lower left. The dimensions of the portrait are:

canvas - 50 1/4 x 40 1/8 in. (127.6 x 101.9 cm.)
frame - 58 3/4 x 48 15/16 in. (148.2 x 124.3 cm.)

The portrait of President Bush will be hung on the State Floor with the portraits of other 20th century presidents.

Barbara Pierce Bush

The portrait of Mrs. Bush depicts her in a half-length pose seated in front of a low bookcase containing numerous books, symbolic of her lifelong interest in literacy. At left is a photograph of Millie, the Bushes' beloved springer spaniel, and, at right appears a small vase of yellow roses, the official flower of the state of Texas. She is shown wearing a dark blue suit with three large gold buttons inlaid with brightly colored stones, a three-strand pearl necklace, and pearl earrings.

This likeness was painted in 1994 from sittings in Kennebunkport, Maine and Houston. It is signed and dated at the lower right. The dimensions of the portrait are:

canvas - 38 x 31 7/8 in. (96.5 x 81 cm.)
frame - 46 x 40 1/8 in. (116.8 x 101.9)

The portrait of Mrs. Bush will be hung in the Ground Floor Corridor with the portraits of the most recent former first ladies.

Both are oil on canvas paintings mounted in gilded wood frames.

Herbert Abrams, of Warren, Connecticut, received his principle training at the Art Student's League in New York. A veteran of World War II, he has painted over 200 dignitaries including the official White House portrait of President Jimmy Carter.

**BLUE ROOM REFURBISHING COMPLETED WITH THE
INSTALLATION OF CARPET**

WASHINGTON, DC -- A new oval carpet was installed in the Blue Room of the White House on July 5, 1995. The installation of the carpet completes the refurbishing of the Blue Room. The refurbishing project began in January of 1995. The wool carpet has a blue field with gold rosettes and an eight foot center medallion with classical motifs of scrolls, vines, flowers and lyres in cream, gold, red and blue. The motifs are repeated in the blue and gold border.

The design of the carpet, measuring 23.6 feet x 33.1 feet, was adapted from an original design for a neoclassical English carpet of about 1815, the period of the furnishings acquired by President James Monroe for the Blue Room. The design of the carpet is owned by Woodward Grosvenor & Co Ltd. in England. Woodward Grosvenor & Co Ltd. is represented in the United States by J.R. Burrows Company in Rockland, Massachusetts. The needlepoint weave carpet was made by the Stark Carpet Corporation and loomed in Henderson, North Carolina. The cost of the carpet was \$50,500.

Renovating and refurbishing of the Blue Room began January 3 of 1995. Work done in the Blue Room included replacing the wall paper, drapes and furniture fabric, repainting the room, and the preservation and conservation of historic objects in the room.

The Blue Room is one of three oval rooms in the White House and is located on the State Floor. The room, seen by 1.2 million visitors a year, was last refurbished in 1972. The draperies and furniture upholstery had become soiled, worn and sun damaged and needed to be replaced, as did the badly worn mid-nineteenth century Chinese carpet which had been in the room since 1975.

The Blue Room renovation/refurbishing is the first major White House project funded exclusively by the White House Endowment Fund. The White House Endowment Fund was established in 1990 as a non-profit charitable organization to raise a \$25 million endowment. The purpose of the endowment is to support, in perpetuity, the preservation and conservation of the public rooms of the White House, and the acquisition of objects for the White House collection of fine and decorative arts.
