The White House announced today the acquisition of Bear Lake, New Mexico, a painting by one of America's foremost artists, Georgia O'Keeffe, for the permanent White House collection. The painting will be unveiled by (the President and) Mrs. Clinton at a White House ceremony on October 24, 1997. Following the unveiling, the painting will hang in the Green Room of the White House. This is the first painting by a major 20th century American woman artist to be exhibited in the state rooms of the White House.

Bear Lake, New Mexico (1930, oil on canvas, 30 x 40 in.) is a landscape painting of an area north of Taos on Taos Pueblo land. A sacred site by the Taos Indians, the area is not accessible to the public.

Georgia O'Keeffe (1887-1986) went to New Mexico for her first extended visit in 1929 and painted this work the next year. For the next two decades, she would continue to visit New Mexico during the summer months and spend the remainder of the year in New York City. In 1949, three years after the death of her husband, Alfred Stieglitz, she moved permanently to Abiquiu, New Mexico.

Bear Lake, New Mexico was done at an important time in O'Keeffe's career. A pencilled star made by O'Keeffe on the backing board of the painting indicates that she considered this a significant work. She painted two other scenes of Bear Lake. One, a vertical canvas, is in a private collection; the other, an abstract work was destroyed. Bear Lake, New Mexico was exhibited once, in 1931, at An American Place, the Alfred Stieglitz gallery in New York City where O'Keeffe exhibited her work from 1930. The painting remained in her possession until her death in 1986.

The acquisition of this painting was recommended by the Committee for the Preservation of the White House. Mrs. Clinton serves as an honorary chair. It is a gift to the White House from the Georgia O'Keeffe Foundation, Abiquiu, New Mexico, and William D. Rollnick and Nancy Ellison Rollnick, New York.

Twenty-one women artists are now represented in the permanent White House collection. Among them are Mary Cassatt, Anna Mary Robertson Moses (Grandma Moses), Lilla Cabot Perry and Henriette Wyeth.
