FIRST LADY HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON LAUNCHES USAID PROGRAM TO PROVIDE ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUNG JORDANIANS

AMMAN, Jordan -- First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton today launched a \$5 million U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) initiative that will provide economic opportunities for Jordanian youth. The program is called "INJAZ" which means "achievement" in Arabic.

INJAZ will foster entrepreneurship among 14 to 24 year old Jordanian youth and encourage greater business community involvement and school participation in preparing young Jordanians to enter the workplace. This initiative, modeled after the U.S. Junior Achievement program, is the first nationwide effort to develop direct linkages between Jordan's business community and its public and private schools. The program's activities will include training and secondary-level curriculum development and instruction. In addition, it will afford Jordanian youth an opportunity to have hands-on experience in operating a business and gaining practical work experience through internships. There will also be job placement assistance through a "Youth Job Bank" for the older youth.

INJAZ has launched its program in Amman schools and in economically disadvantaged regions of the country. Approximately 220 youth in Amman will benefit from the program this year. The program will expand into several more cities and the number of youth that will benefit from the program will increase to over 1000 in the year 2000 and nearly 10,000 by 2004.

The INJAZ program is managed by Save the Children/USA.

The United States, through the U.S. Agency for International Development, provided Jordan with \$200 million in development assistance in Fiscal Year 1999. USAID's program focuses on three main areas: water, economic opportunity and health and family planning. The U.S. Agency for International Development is the United States government agency that provides development and disaster assistance around the world.

FIRST LADY HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON INAUGURATES USAID PROJECT TO IMPROVE THE HEALTH OF PALESTINIAN MOTHERS AND BABIES

WEST BANK -- First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, today inaugurated a \$3.8 million pilot project funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to improve the health of Palestinian mothers and babies.

The new project will significantly upgrade the quality of health care services for infants and babies by refurbishing and re-equipping 32 clinics in Jenin, Gaza City and Hebron. It will also provide training and supervision of village level health care staff, and health education and counseling for couples on family health issues including child spacing. In addition, the pilot project will test the effectiveness of approaches to encourage more mothers to seek antenatal and postpartum care.

The project is managed by two U.S. non-governmental organizations - the Population Council and CARE International - in partnership with several Palestinian non-governmental institutions. Activities are coordinated with the Palestinian Authority Ministry of Health and other international donor organizations.

This project establishes the basis for an expanded USAID health program. The expanded program is expected to involve additional clinic refurbishing, as well as other new activities related to the health sector.

The United States, through the U.S. Agency for International Development, has provided \$75 million annually since 1993 to expand economic opportunities, improve access and use of water resources and encourage the establishment of a functioning and accountable democratic system of governance in the West Bank and Gaza. USAID's work in the West Bank and Gaza supports U.S. interests in directly supporting the Middle East peace process, and in promoting regional stability, economic prosperity and adherence to democratic principles. STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT AND FIRST LADY

We were saddened to hear of the death of Walter Payton. In the long highlight reel of this life cut short, Walter Payton will always be a man in motion: breaking tackles, breaking records, clearing every obstacle in his path. From the first day he donned the uniform of the Chicago Bears, in 1975, until his retirement 13 years later, Walter Payton missed only one game – and that was because the coach ordered him to rest his ankle. He followed a long line of great Bears running backs and became the greatest of them all. The record books confirm that. But individual triumphs would never mean as much to Walter Payton as a victory he could share with his teammates and with the fans who endured, season after season, the icy winds of Soldier Field. Walter Payton would not stop running until his Bears were as great as the Bears of old, until they had again won the Super Bowl – which they did, in dramatic fashion, in 1985.

Walter Payton faced his illness with the same grit and determination that he showed every week on the football field. The people of Chicago – and all Americans who love the game of football – will miss him profoundly.

We would like to offer our condolences to Walter's wife, Connie, and to their two children, Jarrett and Brittney. Our hearts are with them today.
