**FIRST LADY HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON HIGHLIGHTS FINAL EXHIBITION
OF 20th CENTURY AMERICAN SCULPTURE AT THE WHITE HOUSE**

WASHINGTON, D.C. --- First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton hosted a reception today to mark the final exhibition of 20th century American sculpture at the White House. The exhibition, "A View from Denver," will be on display in the Jacqueline Kennedy Garden through February 2001. This is the eighth installation in a series conceived by Mrs. Clinton.

The current exhibition, which opened in October 1999, was organized by the Denver Art Museum in collaboration with the Museum of Outdoor Arts and the Ginny Williams Family Foundation in Denver. Twelve works from these public collections are featured (list attached).

The first six exhibitions focused on works by contemporary artists from museums in various regions of the United States. The seventh exhibit explored the influences of the French sculptor Auguste Rodin (1840-1917) on 20th century American sculpture.

As the First Lady said of the series in a recent book foreword, "What you will discover is not only the richness and diversity of contemporary American sculpture, but also a brilliant reflection of America's imagination, creativity, and progress over the last hundred years—the American century."

In early 1994, as chair of the Committee for Preservation of the White House, Mrs. Clinton first raised the possibility of showcasing contemporary American sculpture on the White House grounds. Under the auspices of the Association of Art Museum Directors and through the generosity of the Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Foundation, the first exhibit opened in October 1994. The Foundation has supported all eight installations.

Mrs. Clinton's foreword can be found in 20TH Century American Sculpture in the White House Garden, published in October 2000. The book features photographs of every sculpture from the eight exhibitions along with commentary by the photographer, David Finn.
