

TO: ODI, Bad Nauheim

1. Reference is made to the conversation in mid July on this point between Mr. Born of this Branch and Mr. Harris. Reference is further made to the attached copies of letters from the director of the Berliner Hauptarchiv.

2. Because ODI is the staff element in OMGUS which is responsible for initiating policy with respect to "documents" that have been taken into custody of military government for purposes of exploitation or for other reason, the several interrelated matters enumerated in this memo are brought to the attention of ODI.

a. Your attention is recalled to the final report of the Committee on the Disposal of Nazi Documents and Related Materials, presented to the director of ODI on 1 July 1948 after ten months of examination and reflection, which recommended the considered disposition of some 300 tons of records mainly in the custody of the 7771 Document Center.

b. In addition to the records just mentioned hundreds of tons of records had been collected in 1945 at the Ministerial Collecting Center which became a part of the 7771 Document Center in February 1946. As early as 1945 some of the records of this general collection were returned to German hands as "functional" (e.g., Reichsbahndirektion), and in 1946 and 1947 many other groups were turned over to German agencies or to elements of US or Allied military governments for use.

c. In addition to the large groups just mentioned, there must inevitably be scattered items which were never assembled

at a central point, but which are still in the custody of Military Government.

d. In addition to those items held by Military Government there are the considerable groups of records held by other agencies; e.g., US State Dept - UK Foreign Office, which has the German Foreign Ministry; the successors to USFET, G-2 Document Control which have not only records but also libraries such as that of the Publikationsstelle formerly at the Prussian Privy State Archives in Berlin-Dahlem.

3. There is currently a very considerable interest in having returned to the Germans such materials as may properly be returned and with which our exploitation is completed. This interest is based upon two criteria: care of records, need for research materials.

a. There is already considerable feeling among the Germans on the subject of their modern records. In connection with this point we call attention to an article which appeared in the Rhein-Neckar Zeitung of 9 March 1949, page 2, entitled "Wer schreibt die deutsche Geschichte?" At the annual meeting of the Society of German Archivists in Wiesbaden on 31 May 1949 the members adopted a resolution recommending the establishment of an archive of the German Bund and urging that the records now in the custody of Military Government be turned over to the custody of that archive. The matter is of no little importance if we expect the German historians to render to their people a scholarly account of German recent history.

b. A specific example is the request for custody of such records put forward in the letter from the Berliner Hauptarchiv which is the former Prussian Privy State Archives. In my opinion the specific request is unrealistic because of the situation in Berlin and the condition of the buildings of the Berliner Hauptarchiv, but the principle is valid.

c. At the present time Dr. Walter Dorn, formerly Advisor to General Clay on Denazification, and now here on a special assignment, is said to advocate early return to German custody of materials which Germans need for historical research. Unfortunately I am unable to verify this report at first hand.

Visiting Expert for Archives, ECR Div, OMGUS, who devoted considerable space in his final report, dated 9 July 1949, to the matters of archives under international law, German archives and modern records under the Occupation, and the problems facing the Allies in the formulation of the peace treaty, appears to share the views attributed to Dr. Dorn.

e. The remarks just noted may appear to be not completely in accord with the recommendations of the Committee to ODI. Actually two problems run parallel: that dealt with by the Committee, and that which arises from Allied custody of records such as those of the German Foreign Office. This difference clearly illustrates the type, the magnitude, and the seriousness of the problems.

4. It is suggested that the matter of German records in US custody requires thorough consideration at this time, not only from the German interests of proper records administration, or from the German interests of availability of research materials, or from the convenience of American Military Government which would free itself from custodial and moral responsibility, but also from the long range interests of American Military Government which wishes to have established a democratic German state acquainted with the facts of recent history and profiting from the lessons contained in them.

a. It is further suggested that you may want to bring this subject to the attention of the appropriate persons in EUCOM with a view to securing the release at this time of items whose exploitation has been completed.

b. The draft of a suggested command letter is enclosed.

5. We should like to hear from you at your convenience to learn your reactions to the general proposal.

MEMORANDUM:

TO : Colonel Kluss.

1. Refer to your letter dated 30 Nov 45, GMC-EDON 007, which we are answering by first indorsement, ED 000.4-11 Rec, dated 9 Jan 46. It seems that we are a long time in answering your letter, but I assume that the MPAA at Hochst and here have been in communication informally. I do not think that our reply covers all of the points of your letter. It seems to me that the reestablishment of museums, libraries, and similar institutions in the several Lander is now a matter for the German authorities. The Minister-President of each Lander will have at his disposal certain, and probably rather limited quantities, of building material, labor and other resources. It will be up to him to decide whether to use these resources for the purpose of repairing or rebuilding museums and other similar institutions for cultural objects, or whether the material and resources available to him should be used for housing and other purposes. I do not think that the U.S. Military or Military Government authorities would any longer step in and divert building materials to the construction and repair of museums. If the Lander authorities are able to provide suitable structures and guards for works of art, etc., it would seem entirely appropriate that we utilize such space for collecting points and eventually turning them over to the Germans for their art and cultural objects.

2. I do not think we can delegate to the Germans the responsibility for returning looted art treasures to liberated nations. It seems to me that it is our responsibility to go through all of the collections and take out items subject to restitution before setting the rest of the stuff aside for eventual shipment to the United States or return to the Germans. It may be that the task of going through all of the collections in the repositories in order to take out the items subject to restitution is presently beyond our capabilities, for it seems that problem must be faced, and I would appreciate having your opinion on the best solution to it.



Report from 12 September 1946

In the time from 23 to 29 April 1946 the Russian Military Government, represented by Mr. Sowikow, has transferred 697 boxes from the Moltke-mine. In the main there were books from the Berlin State museums libraries. Some of the boxes were marked with red initials B.Z., which might be boxes with books from the Dr. Zahn Library. But we have no exact details about that and about how many cases there have been with these initials. All cases were shipped in 5 railway-carriages under the supervision of Mr. Sowikow.

Date of the inshipment 23 - 29 April 1946.

The Deutsche Reichsbahn, Güterbahnhof Schönebeck, (German railroad goods station in Schönebeck), found out that the library of Dr. Zahn and the Museum Library has been shipped by the Red Army (under the supervision of Sowikow, representative of the cultural committee) to Berlin - Zentralviehhof (Berlin - Central slaughter house) as occupation property with the address as receiver: Red Army.

In the time from 9 to 14 April 1946 the following transfer and shipment has been made from Solfeld I Glocke 1-5 of items of the State Museums of Berlin by order of the Russian Military Government, represented by the Lieutenant-Colonel Wostrikow and Lieutenant Sperenski:

- a) Museum für Völkerkunde
- b) Museum für Früh- und Vorgeschichte
- c) Zeughaus a.s.o.

**REPORT FOR DIRECTOR OF WAR RECOVERY TO DIRECTOR**

In a letter dated June 21, 1950, the Minister of Education and Science, Soviet Zone, has presented the issue to the Göttingen Library of the State Minister and demanded the return to Germany. Our reply stated surely that further pressure of the Minister by the Germanische Landesbibliothek is not accepted but that, permitting an over-all settlement of the problem of displaced art and cultural objects, is consent to returned.

It is not known how much control the Soviet Authorities still exercise in these matters in Germany.

We are anxious to recover the Hildburghausen and other severely damaged paintings held at Dresden and Berlin, but are reluctant to consider opening negotiations even on a German-to-German basis lest this raise the question of Russian State and other instance property held here and in the British zone. The quantity of Soviet wartime property in the Soviet zone is very small and not worth jeopardizing our own position. It is possible that the Soviet and German Government Ministers could arrange a private exchange of the colors and paintings for the reactors. Question of application article VI of the law is also arises. May we have your accurate and advice?

Chairman informed the Meeting that this matter was in the hands of RD&R Division and proposed that the "Notice to Holder of Looted Property" be given to Dr. Buschbeck, one of the directors of the gallery, in respect of the pictures in order that they might not be moved pending instructions from Higher Level.

The Soviet PCO pointed out that when he discovered Dr. Buschbeck was packing the pictures in question for removal he asked on what authority this was being done and was told that there had been a verbal order from the Ministry of Education. The Ministry denied this. The Packing was stopped. The Soviet PCO was of the opinion that this was only one of many such cases and that the Austrian authorities were hiding looted property which should have been declared under Order No.12.

The French PCO proposed that the Ministry of Education be required to furnish a list of all looted property held by Museums in Vienna, which should be investigated by the Survey Team.

Chairman informed the Meeting that it was only required to safeguard the pictures pending a decision of RD & R Division. The Commission could only take further action if ordered to do so by the Allied Commanders.

It was agreed to instruct the Survey Team to make a list of the pictures and then to serve a notice on Dr. Buschbeck as present holder of them.

  - (1) The Joint Property Control Temporary Commission has the right to prosecute violations against Military Government Instructions, but advised him to withhold process in subject matter as the particular Director already communicated with the French Reparations, Deliveries and Restitution Division in this case.
  - (2) As to the question which court would be appropriate to prosecute such cases it was referred to an Extract of the Bulletin of the Allied Commission, Austria No.6, May 1946 in which it is stated:

I. Cases subject to prosecution by the Inter-Allied Kommandantura will be acted upon by the Court of the power which arrested the person subject to prosecution;

II. Cases in which the Austrian police arrested the person subject to prosecution will be acted upon by the nation whose representative is in the chair at that time.



Subject: Non-obedience of Military Government Instruction No.1 by Austrian officials

The Chairman (Soviet PCO) submitted to each member of the Commission a draft letter to the Chief, Commander, VIAC including the proposals of each PCO. After a detailed discussion of every point in this letter the PCOs agreed:

- (1) To inform the Chief Commander, VIAC that the Austrian Museums and the Dorotheum failed to declare looted property located in the International Zone (First District); that from the explanations made by Austrian officials before the Commission there appears to be a difference between the Austrian and the Allied interpretation of Para.1 of subject order, and Para.4 is not being given its full significance; that according to investigations of the Commission these non-declarations of objects of art on the part of the Austrian Government are not merely accidental but appeared to be deliberately taking advantage of the ambiguity apparently contained in VIAC Military Government Instruction No.1.
- (2) To request the Chief Commander, VIAC to send a letter to every Ministry concerned and to the Bürgermeister of Vienna instructing them to issue orders to the Directors of all Museums, Libraries, laboratories and other institutions where objects of art might be kept under custody and requesting a list of objects of art and other properties acquired by them in any way whatsoever, even if they are not located in the institution anymore, since 1 Sep 1939. Thirty (30) days to comply with was recommended.
- (3) To send a copy of this letter to the Reparations, Deliveries and Restitution Division.

MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Kassel Landesmuseum Paintings in Vienna

TO : Major LaFarge

1. Reference correspondence in MFAA Section files regarding presumed location of a portion of the paintings collections of Landesmuseum, Kassel, in the Postsparkasse, the Länderbank and the Arbeiterbank, Vienna.

2. Initial conference with Dr. Buschbeck, Kunsthistorisches Museum, on evening of 11 July 46 disclosed that he was aware that a few "unimportant" paintings of the Kassel Collections were in the Kunsthistorisches Museum. He also was aware that there were a few Kassel items in the Postsparkasse. Dr. Buschbeck agreed to accompany the undersigned in an inspection of these repositories the following morning.

3. Accompanied by the guardian, Dr. Buschbeck and the undersigned examined a portion of the paintings in the museum repository in the second subbasement of the Postsparkasse and located and identified thirty-two (32) pictures on the Kassel list - these are indicated by the letter "P" on the attached list. (Note: Pictures marked M are in Kunsthistorisches Museum. Kunsthistorisches Museum and Restitution Branch USFA have copies of marked list). These pictures appear to be in reasonably good condition (they are mostly without frames) and storage conditions are satisfactory. A very large number of the Kunsthistorisches Museum paintings are in these same vaults as well as a large part of the armor collection. The security is excellent, access to the vaults being had only through a single entrance which is closed by a steel door requiring the use of a series of keys in a complicated sequence.

4. On the afternoon of the same day the undersigned visited Dr. Buschbeck in his office in the museum and

checked the Kunsthistorisches Museum inventory (see attached) against the Kassel list. Twenty-nine (29) Kassel paintings are stored in the museum. Thus all but two (2) of the paintings on the Kassel list were accounted for. (Note: the undersigned did not have an opportunity to inspect the items on the museum inventory list, as Dr. Buschbeck was obliged to attend an official opening of a French exhibition but judging by the care afforded Kunsthistorisches Museum Collections it may be assumed that this group of paintings is well cared for).

5. Rechecking the Kassel list, it appears that the items listed on page three as being in Arbeiterbank and Länderbank were at some time moved to - or possibly originally stored in - the Postsparkasse. Since the two pictures as yet unlocated were listed as originally deposited in Postsparkasse, they could not have been mislaid as result of transfer. It was not possible during the brief stay of the undersigned in Vienna to check all the rucks of pictures in the Postsparkasse vaults. Dr. Buschbeck will institute a search for these two pictures and there is a reasonably good chance that they will be found. Many of the Kassel pictures in the Postsparkasse had no labels, numbers, or markings so it is possible that they may have been placed in any of the many rucks by a museum workman.

6. Lt. Col. McKee was contacted regarding the possibility of moving these pictures from Vienna to Kassel. He stated that the Allied Power holding the ACA Chair was in charge of the International Sector (Bezirk I) in which the two repositories are located. There is hardly time to effect the move this month. Lt. Col. McKee does not recommend attempting the move during the month of August (Soviet in Chair) but feels that the matter could best be expedited in September when the U.S. Element is in charge. To move the pictures by air would involve a number of difficulties - many of the pictures are of considerable size and further since the air port is located well outside of the city of Vienna (more than one hour and a half by bus) a long haul by trucks over uncertain roads in Soviet Zone would be required. A railway car attached to the "Mozart", U.S. train running from Vienna to Salzburg, would seem the safest means of transportation.

7. It is recommended that the Chief MPAA, Land Greater Hesse, Lt. Theodore Heinrich, be sent to Vienna in

August to check situation at that time and to make the necessary arrangements for packing and transportation. Lt. Heinrich is exceptionally well qualified for this work. As former MFA&A Officer for Kassel he is well acquainted with all the details of the situation. As former railway expert for G-2 SHAEF, he is particularly qualified to handle the transportation arrangements. It is suggested that Lt. Heinrich's visit be made sufficiently early that any necessary correspondence or cables between this headquarters and USFA can be exchanged before 15 September at which time the shipment should be made.

Dear Mr. Draper:

One year has already elapsed since the receipt of the attached letter from the Division of Monuments, Cultural and Art Values, and Archives, signed by Mr. Richard F. Howard. However, to our repeated requests for entry permits into the U. S. Zone of Occupation in Germany for Soviet experts on cultural and art values no positive reply has reached us up to now, despite the statement, contained in that letter, that at the collection points in Munich, Wiesbaden and Offenbach there were Soviet-owned cultural and art values ready for shipment.

I should like to ask you to issue permits to Soviet cultural and art experts to enter the zone in order that they might visit and inspect museums and also arrange for the shipment of property located at the collection points in Munich, Wiesbaden and Offenbach.

At the same time, the Soviet experts would get to the bottom of the question concerning the 160,000 books and documents which, according to Mr. Howard, had been shipped by Lt. Colonel Novik from Offenbach on 10 June 1946. According to our information, Lt. Colonel Novik had not actually made that shipment but had merely issued a receipt.

Difficult to understand Russian belief indicated in your NS-71 that Hungarian property in US Zone of Germany subject to restitution in view of Quadripartite approval in Allied Control Authority Committee of paper which provides: "No Nation shall be eligible for restitution unless its territory was occupied in whole or in part by the German Armed Forces or the forces of her allies and unless it is a United Nation, or shall have been specified by the Allied Control Council." Above paper is now pending before Coordinating Committee.

Estimates requested follow. These estimates are subject to fairly wide margin of error, but valuation figures given are probably generous.

In addition, US Zone of Germany contains some Hungarian industrial machinery, securities and paper currency and a negligible amount of monetary silver, but no estimates of value for these categories are available. Imperial Regalia of Hungary are also in our custody.

State Department on 7 March authorized restricted restitution to former enemy countries. However, we advised State Department that such action would be unilateral and in conflict with Quadripartite Agreement and requested reconsideration of instructions unless Quadripartite agreement to modified policy is obtained. Cannot understand in view of above why Soviet Representatives have not presented problem in Allied Control Authority.

In considering questions of restitution  
our present thoughts are these:

1. Restitution, as we understand the term, means the delivery of particular items of property free and clear of any obligations either to pay for such items in acceptable currencies or to account for their value as a part of the total reparations claim which a particular nation may ultimately be allowed by the reparations commission.

2. Restitution, even of art objects, should turn on the conditions and circumstances under which a particular art object was taken or removed. If taken and paid for, even though such payment may have been made in occupation currency, those receiving such payment became possessed of legal tender which they could use to purchase tangible property or goods. To apply restitution to an art object removed under such circumstances allows both the cake and the penny. Short answer may be made to the argument that payment in occupation currency amounted to looting an occupied country of its tangible assets. All of the warring nations, regardless of whether they have been occupied by the enemy, have suffered depreciation in the purchasing power of their currencies and the loss or

destruction of art objects, architectural monuments and other items from their cultural heritage. This means that even though for cultural reasons a particular art object ought to be returned to the country from which it was removed, such return should not be deemed to be restitution unless such object was actually stolen without payment of any kind.

3. As regards industrial machinery, railroad rolling stock and the like, even where such property can be specifically identified, restitution free and clear of any subsequent obligation to account for the value of such property as a part of reparations should not be made. It is impossible fairly to differentiate between property which may be found and identified, and property that either cannot be found or was destroyed by bomb or shell fire or sunk upon the high seas.

4. Extreme care should be exercised in approving the withdrawal from Germany of any property, regardless whether claimed as restitution or otherwise, where it is likely that demands for property of the character by the Allied Powers will probably exceed the total supply of such property that is likely to be available for removal from Germany. Particularly in the case of gold, precious metals, foreign currencies, and any foreign exchange assets, it is now obvious that the demand for this type of property by the Allied Nations is certain to exceed the supply. Therefore no withdrawals of any property of this character in any form whatsoever should be approved.

5. No restitution in kind would be approved in any form. Once commenced for gold, currency, precious metals, railroad cars, machinery, cattle or other types of property, restitution in kind will most certainly be used as a means of attempting to secure a preference over and above the amounts allowed by way of reparation and tend to remove much of what would otherwise be available for reparation.

Dear General Clay:

An intolerable situation has developed with regard to the restitution of Soviet property from the American Zone of Occupation in Germany. It is a known fact that the Hitlerites removed to Germany huge quantities of valuable property from the temporarily occupied parts of the Soviet Union. It is likewise a known fact that a great part of these valuables were found in the Western parts of Germany, among which is the territory of the present American Zone of Occupation. While retreating under the crushing blows of the Soviet Army, the Hitlerites endeavored to cover the traces of the looting which they committed on Soviet territory. For this reason, Soviet property was usually transferred from the Eastern regions of Germany to the Western.

Almost three years have elapsed since the occupation authorities undertook to implement the agreements on the restitution (return) of property belonging to the despoiled countries. This gave ample time for the restitution of Soviet property from the American Zone to be nearing a satisfactory completion; however, the fact is that work has actually not begun.

According to the reports on restitutions, which was confirmed by the Control Council Bodies, total property returned from the American Zone to all countries which suffered from Hitler's invasions amounted, as of 1 February 1948, to only 156,915,935 marks (this does not include cultural and art treasures). Of this amount the Soviet Union, which suffered the greatest losses, received looted Soviet property amounting to only 201,570 marks. After the aforementioned report was prepared there was no material improvement in the matter of restitution of Soviet property. This is confirmed in the reports published by the American Military Government in December 1948, which states that, as of 31 December 1948 property returned from the American Zone (again excluding cultural and art treasures) to all countries amounted to 299,686,000 marks, out of which, property amounting only to 281,000 marks was transferred to the Soviet Union, that is 0.09 per cent of the total sum. Thus the Soviet property returned amounted to 80,000 marks only, whereas for the same period, property amounting to 174,000,000 marks was returned to other countries, mainly to those belonging to the Western bloc.

Neither is it possible to call normal the situation with regard to the restitution of cultural and art treasures belonging to the Soviet Union. During the whole period of restitution work the American authorities returned to the Soviet Union only about twenty carloads of miscellaneous archives, books and other objects, and only one piece of sculpture \*.

The facts show that the reason for such unsatisfactory results in the restitution of Soviet property from the American Zone of Occupation is the endeavor of American authorities to effectively disrupt the return of Soviet property looted by the Hitlerites.

This is proved by the following instances:

1. Having taken no measures to uncover Soviet property, American authorities obstruct the work of the Soviet Restitution Mission in their search for Soviet property in the American Zone. American authorities, pursuant to obligations assumed under international agreements, ought to have seen to it that all German persons, physical and judicial in the American Zone who have in their possession Soviet property should submit a statement (declaration) to the effect that they possess such property. However, this was not done. The Reparation Division of the Soviet Military Administration received only 827 declarations from the American authorities. Moreover, the majority of objects listed in these declarations were of such little value that the Soviet representative saw no point in submitting a claim for restitution. Among these objects there were for instance, worn shoes and clothing, household bags, etc. For this reason, the Reparation Division of the Soviet Military Administration found it possible to submit claims only on 357 German declarations. The insignificant number of German declarations, as well as the slight value of most objects listed in the declarations, show that large German concerns, and the military and fascist criminals conceal the more valuable Soviet property - equipment, raw material, materials, looted rare and unique cultural and artistic objects. In spite of this American authorities take no measures to uncover Soviet property nor to punish the individuals concealing this property. Pursuant to restitution procedure confirmed by the Control Council Bodies, American authorities were to authorize members of the Soviet Restitution Mission to visit German concerns, archives, museums, picture galleries, and private collections for the purpose of uncovering Soviet property. However, such authorizations as a rule were not issued even in those cases when Soviet authorities possessed information as to the whereabouts of Soviet property. For instance, Soviet authorities know that one of the unique reliques of the Orthodox Church, the "Tikhvin Mother of God" ikon is in the American Zone of Occupation and is concealed by one Johan Rishsky. Repeated requests made by the Soviet Restitution Mission and the Reparation Division of the Soviet Military Administration for an authorization to inspect the ikon and for its return were refused by American authorities. The violation of their obligation by American authorities in regard to the search for Soviet property, as well as the limitations imposed on the activities of the Soviet Restitution Mission prevent the uncovering of the greater mass of the looted Soviet property and its return to the Soviet Union.

2. American authorities, under various pretexts, reject the claims for restitution of Soviet property already submitted to them by Soviet authorities, even in those cases when there are German statements (declarations) to the effect that they are in possession of Soviet property. American authorities concerned with restitutions declare in such cases that allegedly the ownership of the property by the Soviet Union and the fact of its removal to Germany are not sufficiently proved. In this

convention, without any foundation, they request that some sort of additional characteristics of the property be submitted, or additional proof of ownership or proof of its removal by force, establish deadlines in an ultimatum form for the submission of the above-mentioned additional data and if these deadlines are not met, the claims are considered automatically cancelled.

Thus, the American authorities cancelled Soviet claim No 690, of 10 July 1947, for the restitution of electric-power equipment removed from the Soviet Union by the entrepreneur firm of "Energiaheim GMBH", despite the fact that Soviet ownership of that equipment, as well as its removal to Germany by force, were confirmed in a formal German declaration. Similar treatment was accorded by the American authorities to Soviet claims No 667, 805, 817, 715, 766, 769, and 589 for agricultural machinery, engines, electric motors and compressors. All these claims had been submitted likewise on the basis of German declarations.

The American authorities in charge of restitution, in their effort to prevent the return of Soviet property, make, in a number of cases, false reservations which alleged that Soviet property looted by German firms, had been brought into USSR territory by the Germans themselves. In so doing, the American authorities were ignoring the fact that the claims of the Soviet authorities to that property were based on German declarations which acknowledged that the property in question was in fact Soviet property.

In other instances, the American Restitution agencies have declared that Soviet property was used by some German enterprises, or that it was sold or stolen. Such a reply, for example, was given with regard to claims No 765, 807, 1124 for rolls, 73 cases of thermometers and manometers, etc.

The result of such unfriendly actions, even in the light of data shown in the aforementioned report of the American Military Government of 9 December 1946, was that the American authorities turned down as many as 75% of Soviet restitution claims for Soviet equipment, and raw and other materials.

3. Not even the insignificant portion of Soviet owned property which is being returned to the Soviet Union, has been subjected in a number of cases to deliberate spoilage or to theft. For example, towards the end of December 1946, the American authorities delivered to the port of Bremen a shipment of Soviet property of which 80%, to say the least, represented scrap (damaged and smashed tractors, lathes, etc.), even though the declarations by the German firms stated that the property in their possession was in good condition. Upon delivery to the port of Bremen of another shipment of Soviet property, the Soviet representatives discovered that the cases contained pieces of rusty metal instead of leather.

The American authorities are not taking the necessary steps to insure the safety of Soviet restitution property. The Soviet Military Administration is not aware of a single case when the American authorities punished those guilty of damaging or stealing Soviet property.

4. Despite this obviously unsatisfactory overall situation as regards the restitution of Soviet property, the American authorities have at present effectively put a stop to all restitution work in the American Zone, a circumstance which represents a violation of international obligations assumed by the American side. In particular, the American authorities:

a. Have, in violation of agreements concluded by the occupying powers, announced their decision, according to which the restitution of property leased by the Hitlerites and now in the United States Zone must be terminated on 31 December 1948;

b. Have, in violation of a decision of Control Council bodies concerning the establishment of restitution missions, prevented the Soviet mission from attaining full personnel strength, and, since 4 December 1948, have stopped its operation altogether.

5. The American authorities are striving to take advantage of the Soviet Union's interest in the restitution of Soviet property in order to obtain indirect recognition of the American actions with regard to the splitting of Germany. This is proven by letters from the American authorities who are in charge of the restitution of Soviet property. In reply to a request of the reparation division of the Soviet Military Administration for entry permits into the United States Zone to Soviet representatives on property restitution, the Reparation Division of the United States Military Government, in letters dated 18 January and 4 February 1949, stated that the functions of the restitution mission should henceforth be assumed by consulates to be established, on a reciprocal basis, both in the Soviet and the American Zones of occupation in Germany.

It is evident from this that resumption of restitution work in connection with Soviet property is made contingent by American authorities upon consent of the Soviet Occupation Authorities to the establishment of consulates representing the occupying powers in the various occupation zones of Germany.

The Soviet occupation authorities are unable to consent to a proposal which represents an attempt to compel us to agree to treating the zones of occupation as separate states and to establishing a Western German State. A consent of this kind would obviously be in accord with the views and practices of the American authorities who, ignoring international obligations, are striving to bring about the political and economic splitting of Germany, and who have been for a long time concerned with the creation of a puppet German state. However, such an agreement would be in radical contradiction to the position held by the Soviet authorities who have been consistently defending the unity of Germany and its transformation into a democratic sovereign state and are emphatically opposed to any proposal aimed at splitting the country.

The proposal of the American authorities is devoid of any practicable basis. Indeed, the American authorities desire that the aforementioned

consulates should be established and take over, on a reciprocal basis, the questions of property restitutions. But the United States, not having been subjected to German occupation, cannot therefore raise the question of the restitution of American owned property from the Soviet Zone of occupation, or of the establishment of American consulates within the Soviet Zone for this purpose.

6. Having unlawfully detained in the United States Zone Soviet owned property which had been looted by the Hitlerites, including valuable relics of national culture and art, and having allowed actions of Hitlerite criminals who looted Soviet property to go unpunished, the American authorities are causing material damage to the Soviet Union and ignore the national sentiments of the Soviet people. The Soviet people cannot be reconciled to the fact that instead of valuable equipment removed by Hitlerites from Soviet enterprises, and precious and unique property stolen from museums and palaces in Leningrad, Kiev, Odessa, Kharkov, Minsk, Mogilev, etc., they receive in return valueless and deliberately damaged items.

All of the aforesaid furnishes ground for qualifying the actions of the American authorities in charge of the restitution of Soviet property as inadmissible and unlawful. I insist on the removal of arbitrary and unlawful actions in a matter of such importance and on the continuation of the restitution work in accordance with the procedure approved by the Control Council.

I assume, General, that you will instruct the appropriate American authorities:

1. With a view to expediting and completing restitution work on Soviet-owned property, to make it possible for the Soviet Restitution Mission to continue its work by increasing its staff (to 15 persons) and by establishing mission branches consisting of three persons in each of the Laender of the United States Zone of occupation.
2. To render to representatives of the Soviet authorities all necessary assistance in locating Soviet-owned property.
3. To provide members of the Soviet Restitution Mission, in accordance with the decision of the Control Council, with the opportunity to inspect German enterprises, archives, museums, picture galleries and private collections, as well as to examine pertinent documents with a view to locating Soviet-owned property.
4. To eliminate any delay in connection with the transfer of Soviet property already located.
5. To take measures to prevent the concealment or deliberate spoilation of Soviet property and to prosecute any person committing or encouraging such acts; and to replace any damaged property with other property of equal value.

Dear Marshal Schkolovsky:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of 5 March 1949 regarding the restitution of Soviet property from the American Zone of occupation in Germany.

I agree with you that sufficient time has elapsed to implement the agreements on the restitution of properties belonging to the despoiled countries and I am glad that our efforts to expedite the program in the U. S. Zone have brought it to substantial completion. I have been pleased with the expression of appreciation which we have received from several of the nations which participated in this program.

Of course, I find it impossible to reconcile your statement without supporting data that the return of restitution properties to your Government has not begun with the actions which we have taken to process the claims filed by your Government.

As to your comments regarding the restitution of cultural and art objects to the Soviet Union I must point out that valuable cultural properties which were returned to your Government during the past three years include silverware, ikons, sculptures, paintings and religious paraphernalia and some 500,000 books including many rare books. In addition to the return of properties located as a result of the investigation of claims submitted by your Government we have also returned a number of paintings for which no claims were filed. We believed this action on our part was a positive demonstration of our desire to fulfill our obligations to restore looted properties.

Your statement that American authorities are endeavoring to disrupt the return of Soviet properties is a misrepresentation of the facts. We have applied the same procedures for the restitution of properties to your Government as were applied to the other fourteen nations engaged in the restitution program. The procedures for the declarations of properties subject to restitution were carried out fully in accordance with the quadripartite agreements to which your Government was a party. However, it is pertinent to note that since establishment of the Missions in 1946, the Soviet Restitution Mission has been subject to continual shifting of personnel, with long periods elapsing

between the departure of one group for Berlin or Moscow and its replacement by another group. Because of this the work of the American authorities was hampered. This matter was repeatedly called to the attention of the Soviet representatives to no avail.

Furthermore, I cannot agree with your statement that restitution has covered only items having little value, as the records reveal that thousands of items having considerable value have been restituted.

I would remind you that the Allied Control Council did not provide a procedure whereby independent investigations and searches would be made by Allied restitution missions. I do not understand that such unrestricted searches have been permitted in your Zone. In fact, the few of our special missions which you have received have been strictly limited in the locations in which they could proceed. The restitution investigations and searches have always been considered the responsibility of the Zone Commanders of the respective Zones. I believe that this is a general principle to which you always adhered.

As to your comment regarding the large percentage of rejections of Soviet claims, I can say only that the Soviet claims were not prepared as carefully as were the claims filed by other nations. This matter was repeatedly called to the attention of your Restitution Mission, but little, if any, additional supporting data was furnished to support subsequent claims. We have thus had to return some claims without processing because there was insufficient information furnished to establish either the location or adequate identification of properties claimed.

Your representatives have also presented claims for the restitution of properties which were taken into Russia by the German armies and were removed by those armies at the time they were driven from your country. Inasmuch as these properties were never dispossessed from Allied countries or peoples, they do not fall under the provisions of the London Declaration of 5 January 1943, which is the basis of all restitution.

You have referred to your specific claim for the "Tiechwin Madonna" icon. I have already informed your headquarters that this claim is still under investigation by our field forces. However, we have not found or identified this icon.

I cannot accept your implication that we are deliberately permitting restitution properties to be damaged. The procedures which we have established provide for the full protection of such properties.

from the time they are taken into the custody of Military Government. Damage to these properties, therefore, seems almost certainly to have been incurred before they came into our custody. Damaged properties, in accordance with normal procedures, are returned to the claimant nations without undergoing repairs.

Your statement that we have put a stop to all restitution work in the American Zone is not a correct statement of fact. Your headquarters has been informed that we will continue to receive and process claims of especially meritorious nature.

As to further restitution work of your representatives in the U. S. Zone of Germany, I must repeat that it may be performed by your Military Mission now stationed in the U. S. Zone, until such time as you are willing on a reciprocal basis to establish Consulates as proposed to your headquarters in a recent communication.

In view of the accreditation of these Consulates to Military Government, I regard your charges that their acceptance contributes to the split of Germany as nebulous.

I am surprised that you charge the U. S. authorities with failure to carry out our restitution obligations in accordance with quadripartite agreements. The last reports filed quadripartitely in February 1948, covering the deliveries for restitution through January 1948, record that whereas the USSR had delivered for restitution properties totalling only 45,146,621 RM (1938 value), deliveries from the U. S. Zone to the claimant nations totalled 126,915,935 RM (1938 value). The statement in your letter that much of the properties looted from the USSR by the German forces had been taken to the Western part of Germany, is not consistent with the fact that of the 45,146,621 RM of property then reported as restituted by your forces from the Eastern part of Germany, nearly 50 per cent, or 20,535,300 RM was delivered to the USSR. For your information, since the filing of the above-mentioned quadripartite reports, deliveries of restitutable properties from the U. S. Zone of Occupation of Germany to the countries occupied by the Germans, have reached more than 300,000,000 RM which does not include the probably greater value of the large volume of returned cultural properties.

Your attempt to relate the restitution program to the political and economic splitting of Germany as a whole is without foundation. The record of negotiations entered into by the four occupying powers

Our records show that there are still 41 active Soviet claims in Bavaria, 14 in Wuerttemberg-Baden, and 9 in Hesse, mostly based upon declarations. Many of these are of small value and for unimportant objects. It is urged that your representatives assist in investigating and in collecting these claims for shipment and arrange shipment as soon as possible. In addition to the objects claimed there are some materials already in the Collecting Points in Munich, Wiesbaden and Offenbach which are ready for shipment and should go at once before it is necessary to close these installations. We do not have the personnel or time to handle these claims as carefully as we would like and your cooperation will be most appreciated. We do not wish to drop any such claims without investigation or consent of your representatives, but if we cannot show substantial progress in the next two or three weeks it may be necessary to do so on the basis of our own judgment as to the value and quality of the objects involved. Any suggestions regarding the expediting of this program especially concerning the important objects will be received with the greatest appreciation.




