1. Dr. Rasp was questioned concerning subject library by Mr. Beell on 26 July 1946 at Darmstadt. He denied that the library contained any confiscated Jewish books or literature, but admitted that in the Landesbibliothek were a few Torah scrolls which had been "taken under protection" by the library in order to prevent destruction of these objects.

2. Dr. Rasp had not reported these holdings in the questionnaire which he had submitted on 23 April 1946 and was unable to give any explanation for the omission.

3. The Offenbach Archival Depot has been informed about the Torah scrolls and will take them into custody. A further search will be made to determine whether the library contains any confiscated Jewish literature.



b. Events.

- 24 May 46 - Conference with Lt. C.R. Blumenstein: Possible use of ERR material in the Nürnberg trials.
 - Captain J.G. Schönau left for Holland.
 - A Tea silver set consisting of 10 pieces; the metal plate on the case reads as follows: "Maison Odile Preyost, Recipon & Cie Orfèvres, Paris" was turned over to Collecting Point, MFA&A, Wiesbaden.
- 27 May 46 - Major D.P.M. Graswinckel returns from Holland.
 - Capt. I. Bencowitz went to Giessen to inspect Russian books located there. Only 23 cases of brochures out of a carload of material still remained in the library.
- 28 May 46 - Conference with Lts. Ford and Poste, MFA&A Officers, Mil. Gov. Office Württemberg-Baden. Subject: Movement of books from Heilbronn Salt-mine to Offenbach Archival Depot. Lt. Ford was to notify Capt. Bencowitz when the work of packing can start - sometimes in June.
 - Rabbi Moise Liber arrived from Paris and immediately got busy identifying French manuscripts and articles from French Synagogues. In the process he managed to identify much Netherland material. The Rabbi promised to return to the Depot sometimes in June.
 - Capt. Bencowitz is assigned to the Food and Agriculture Section, Wiesbaden on 10 day SD. The order was later rescinded by Lt. Col. Sheehan.
- 29 May 46 - Telephone call from Munich and Nürnberg to Major Graswinckel corroborated the authorization to remove books from Staffelstein.
- 30 May 46 - Conference between Capt. Bencowitz and Mr. Reed from MFA&A Office in Berlin. Subject: Library lists of restituted books.
- 31 May 46 - First truck load (64 cases) of books from Staffelstein arrived.
 - Capt. Bencowitz was ordered, assume the post of senior Officer of In & Security Office, LK & SK Offenbach.
 - Capt. Rackovsky left for the States and the Depot lost a tireless worker and a wise counsellor. His services to the Depot have been of inestimable value.

- 1 June 46 - Capt. Bencowitz assumed his duties as senior Officer of Liaison & Security Office, LK & SK Offenbach.
- Conference between Capt. Bencowitz and Lt. Poste, PRO, Mil. Gov. Office, Württemberg-Baden. Subject: Historical background of the OAD.
- 4 June 46 - Major L.G. Perry, British Restitution Officer removed eighteen cases of books, and massonic documents, and emblems looted by the Germans from the British Channel Island.
- 9 June 46 - Conference between Capt. Bencowitz and Lt. Col. N.P. Novik, Russian Restitution Officer. Subject: Restitution of books and library material to Russia, Ukraine and white Russia.
- 10 June 46 - Lt. Col. Novik contacted by phone the Russian representative in Major LaFarge's Office in Berlin and received authority to sign for books belonging to Russian, white Russian, and Ukrainian Libraries. The Officer signed for 760 cases, approximately 167,200 books. It has been agreed that a Russian Officer will arrive as soon as possible to arrange for the transportation of these books.
- Telephone conversation between Capt. Bencowitz and Major Goodman (Capt. Rae's Office, MFA&A Officer for Land Bavaria). Permission was granted to move the books from Waischenfeld, LK Hollfeld, Bavaria.
- 12 June 46 - Conference between Capt. Bencowitz and Capt. Gordon W. Gilkey, USFET. Subject: Films and photographs showing army formations.
- Movement of 318 cases of books from Staffelstein completed.
- 14 June 46 - The books from Waischenfeld, 54 cases, primarily Netherland libraries, were brought to the OAD.
- 17 June 46 - A seven reel film found in the OAD was shown in the projection-room of the Special Service in Frankfurt. It was found to be a Russian film, Titled Prof. Mamlok, with written transcriptions in Belgian and Dutch. The subject of the film is the underground movement in Germany against the Nazis soon after the latter assumed powers.

a. A more complete and corrected list of Library Collections which have gone through the sorting process is inclosed (see Inclosure 2). It should be noted that every identifiable Library mark has been included in the list. In many cases only a few books represented a given library. It does not always mean therefore, that the entire library, or even a sizable portion of it went through the Depot, merely because its name appears on the list.

b. Sorting Program.

The last stages of the sorting processes of the books on hand are being completed. It is the policy of the Depot to reduce the books to groups of the smallest possible denominator in so far as future possible disposition is concerned.

(1) Semi-identifiable books.

Among the semi-identifiable books two types of markings were isolated.

(a) Ex-Libris.

Books with about five hundred different Ex-Libris were sorted out and recorded. A catalogue of photographs of all Ex-Libris was compiled. Each Ex-Libris was numbered and the number of books, corresponding to each Ex-Libris was recorded. These books are stored in numbered boxes. Books, the owners of which are Netherland or French are packed for immediate restitution. The list of all others is inclosed (see Inclosure 3).

(b) Names, stamped or hand written.

Books marked with some private name have been handled in the same manner. The names are listed, the number of books marked, and recorded. The books are stored in numbered boxes. Thus it is possible to tell how many books belong to any one name and they can be immediately located. Books, the owners of which are Netherland or French are being packed for restitution. A list of these names with the corresponding number of books is inclosed (see Inclosure 4).

(2) Unidentifiable books.

The unidentifiable books have been sorted out according to languages. German language books sorted out in two groups: Jewish cultural subjects, and classical literature and scientific books. (See Sect. B - 4).

- (a) Books in the Hebrew language 43.0 per cent
- (b) German language books, Jewish cultural and historical subjects 16.0 per cent
- (c) German language books, classical literature and scientific subjects 8.0 per cent
- (d) French language 6.4 per cent
- (e) Various other languages 1.0 per cent
- (f) Brochures and News-papers 25.6 per cent

8. Recommandations.

At present there are only 157,695 books undergoing the final stage of sorting. The known, to us, repositories in Western Bavaria - Schloss Banz, Staffelstein, and Waischenfeld - have been evacuated and the books brought to the Offenbach Archival Depot. It is recommended:

- a. A thorough survey be made of books still in the American Zone and intended for the Offenbach Archival Depot.
- b. A concerted effort be made to bring the books to the Depot and that a high priority should be given to this movement.

Plans for the future of the Offenbach Archival Depot can be made on the basis of the survey and the estimated rate of book shipment to the Depot. At the present state we can close the operation of the plant by the end of August - and have all books boxed, inventoried and stored away. If it is continued as an operational institution its staff will have to be drastically reduced, unless books are made available to the Depot during the month of July.

SUBJECT: Material wrongfully sent from Offenbach Archival Depot and presently at Jerusalem

TO : Chief of Staff

I. DISCUSSION.

a. With reference to confidential telegram from the Political Adviser to the Consulate General at Jerusalem (TAB "A"), attention is invited to the following:

a. The material referred to is known to contain identifiable restitutable matter of great value, including a number of items belonging to Russian museums and libraries, at least three of Italian ownership, one of Austrian ownership, and one apparently belonging to a Dr. Josef Breuer, 728 West 181st Street, New York (see TAB "B").

b. With the concurrence of the Inspector General, telegrams (TAB "C") were dispatched requesting immediate return of the five boxes by the most expeditious means. These telegrams were coordinated with Political Affairs and the Inspector General.

c. Concerning Jewish material, discussions beginning at least as early as December 1945 between the State, War and Navy Departments and OMBUS indicate particular interest and concern on the part of many individuals and groups; and indicate further that even the Jewish peoples are far from unanimous in their ideas with respect to the disposition of such religious and cultural objects. W-36514 dated 2 May 46 (TAB "D") presents proposals of a "committee representing leading Jewish organizations" and suggests no restitution to "governments of countries where Jewish communities have been substantially eliminated", but our CC-5925 of 14 June 46 (TAB "E") points out this would mean revision of Central Council definition of restitution. Then WZ-94368 of 14 July 46 (TAB "F") outlines completely different plans proposed by various Jewish organizations, with a proposed State Department reply which again differs and suggests a trustee board of all interested organizations. Our CC-9626 of 24 July 46 (TAB "G") once more reaffirms quadripartite commitments and points out difficulties inherent in permitting any private organization to abrogate the powers of governments. Again, our CC-5664 of 16 October 46 (TAB "H") in answer to further sweeping proposals in WZ-81072 of 22 September 46 (TAB "I") is clear and unequivocal in stating that objects removed by the Germans from Jews or Jewish organizations or groups in formerly occupied countries should be restituted to those countries. This restitution of identifiable items is in accordance with our quadripartite commitments and is the only just procedure to follow in regard to Jewish interests in formerly occupied countries regardless of the desires of some elements of American Jewry or individual Jews or Jewish organizations. Some of these, as we have seen, are not above extra-legal methods to accomplish their personal ends.

d. Concerning unidentifiable Jewish material, eventually determined to be impossible to restitute, the exchanges mentioned above as well as JCS 1570/9 as quoted in cable WZ-85682 dated 16 November 46 (TAB "J") indicate that special directives will be received. This cable states (par 1 D) that "Jewish books, manuscripts and literature of cultural or religious importance will be excepted ((from the directive to turn over other unidentifiable material to IOM)) and disposed of pursuant to separate directive." Therefore, no group or organization except Military Government can as yet be recognized as a proper trustee for this material.

e. To be of any value from a restitution viewpoint, any inventory made in conformity to the telegram from the Political Adviser (TAB "A") should include all possible details of identifying marks, ex libris book plates, etc., which might be of value in determining the provenance and restitutability of the valuable items involved. Complete facilities and reference material for such inventory are available at the Offenbach Archival Depot and nowhere else.

f. If these materials should remain in Jerusalem, both identification and restitution would be difficult if not impossible to control.

2. In view of the above facts, it is respectfully suggested that the facilities at Offenbach would be much more suitable for the proper eventual identification and disposition of the material, and its return to Offenbach, as already directed, would prevent a considerable wrong to the probable eventual rightful owners of much of the material. It would enable the Restitution Branch to fulfill its commitments, and would prevent criticism of the United States by other powers which naturally expect these commitments to be carried out.

3. Eventually, all screened and unidentified objects would be turned over to a properly accredited custodian (see IX-85682 - TAB "G"), but not until the approved identification and restitution procedures had been carried out, and such custodian has been approved by JCS or SWNCC.

II. ACTION RECOMMENDED.

It is recommended that the above facts be called to the attention of the Military Governor and that the cable of 1 May 1947 at the R&P TAB be reaffirmed.

My dear General Clay:

Following our meeting this morning, I have looked into our correspondence file and am happy to send you excerpts from three (3) letters bearing upon the problem of the disposition of Jewish books. The first two (2) letters were addressed to Dr. H. M. Lydenberg who has just returned home from duty with this Mission and who was especially charged with liaison with our British colleagues. I quote first from a letter to Dr. Lydenberg dated 17 May 1946 from Dr. Jean Thomas, Deputy Executive Secretary of the Preparatory Commission of UNESCO:

"At the end of 1945, a proposal was made to us through Count Rewentlow, Danish Minister in London and Mr. C. E. AAGAARD, Danish delegate to UNESCO, that we should support the establishment of a world Jewish Library in Copenhagen formed out of the many thousands of valuable Jewish books which have been found in German occupied territory and which cannot be returned to their previous owners.

"Later this scheme was further endorsed by the Danish Library Authorities who declared their willingness to defray all working expenses and proposed also that it should be maintained by the Royal Library in Copenhagen, if possible under UNESCO auspices.

"The Preparatory Commission of UNESCO has not yet considered this proposal and I cannot say, therefore, that it has our approval but all the persons here who have considered it agree that the scheme has many merits and is one which the Preparatory Commission should be encouraged to consider at the first possible moment.

"We have been dismayed to hear, in the last few days, from Dr. Schmidt-Phisaldeck, Librarian of the Royal Library, Copenhagen, in a letter a copy of which I enclose, that there is a risk of many of the books with no rightful owners being transferred to Palestine before the Danish Scheme has been discussed.

"These are exactly the books which would form the nucleus of the Copenhagen collection.

"It would be most regrettable if the scheme would be prejudged by the actual removal of any books or by permission being given for their eventual removal until the serious and generous proposal from Denmark has been properly debated.

a second letter addressed to Dr. Lydenberg dated 28 June 1946 and signed by Edward J. Carter, Counsellor for Libraries and Museums of the same Commission, reads in part as follows:

"Since I communicated with you last and also since the correspondence you had with Professor J. Thomas, with regard to the Jewish Library in Copenhagen, we have had a meeting of the Libraries Committee of the Preparatory Commission, when one of the things which received definite support was a proposal that UNESCO should establish an International Clearing House for publications, which may be able not only to continue the work of the Inter-Allied Book Centre in London, which closes down at the end of this year, and of the American Book Centre, but will also be able to serve as a collecting and distribution centre for material discovered in Europe."

On 12 June 1946, Mr. Verner W. Clapp, Director of the Acquisitions Department of the Library of Congress, wrote to me as follows:

"Disposition of Jewish Books in Offenbach Disposal Center—Dr. Evans has consulted with Prof. Baron and other representatives of the Commission on European Jewish Cultural Reconstruction. Our position with regard to these books is as previously stated. We will not touch them (or the unconstituted residue of them) unless requested to do so through official channels. A possible disposition that has been discussed is as follows:

"(a) Each of the four occupying powers to assume custody (by Control Council Decision) of unconstituted residues of such books within its zone, final disposition to be made by its national library.

"(b) The national library in each case to get together with Jewish interests and plan a distribution, sort and catalog the books.

"(c) Before distribution is effected, anybooks identifiable as coming from a particular country (Poland, Russia, etc.) even though not identifiable as deriving from a particular library or group would be offered to that country."

I hope that these excerpts will be of some aid to you in filling in the background of the problem.

1. A quantity of cultural material under your jurisdiction may be known or suspected to have been the property of Jewish or other former German nationals who were dispossessed or otherwise forced to dispose of their holdings under the Nazi regime. Some of these individuals may still be resident in Germany; others may be refugees abroad and may or may not have acquired new citizenship in other countries.

2. Pending the final decision and establishing of procedures for the restitution of such property, it is desired that you segregate into separate spaces, designated as "Internal Loot", within Art Collecting Points or Archival Depots in your area all such cultural material described in paragraph 1, and that as soon as practicable you forward to this headquarters full property card inventories (with photographs) of each art item, or complete lists of each category of archival collections, showing for the latter the original owner, the character and the quantity of the material.

middling size but minimal value. For the present, further evacuation of repositories and action on claims involving property more bulky than ordinary souvenir water - coloours is at a virtual standstill.

- d. A constantly increasing number of scholars is requesting permission to make use of one or another category of material stored in the Collecting Point, whether through personal study visits or by means of photographs. The latter requests can generally be met if photographic paper is supplied, although frequent embarrassment is caused by the fact that negatives of material photographed in the early days by Foto Marburg are still blocked. Response to these requests therefore requires either permission of OMGUS or rephotographing of material urgently required for scholarly publications in the United States, England, France, Switzerland, Belgium, The Netherlands, Germany, Italy and Austria. Judging by the number of visitor requests on hand, it is anticipated that with return of good weather presently available facilities will be fully employed.
- e. Museum requests for temporary loan for exhibition purposes of materials deriving from the Berlin collections are steadily increasing and the Collecting Point appears to be gaining some reputation for ill-will in German museum circles through the necessity for refusing all such requests. It is believed that misunderstandings could in large part be avoided if a statement on this ban be prepared for reading at the meeting of German art historians and museum directors, which, it is understood, will take place in June.
- f. The seventh exhibition, "The Haubrich Collection" of contemporary German and French paintings, drawings and sculptures, was closed on 30 March. During March the show was visited by 4582 persons and receipts were RM 7190.44. Total attendance was 9474 and the sum of RM 21.736.12 was received. The Ministry made less effort than usual to bring school groups from other communities, and was not notably diligent in its publicity activities, which resulted in a smaller attendance than usual. Nonetheless this exhibition, which was of an unusually challenging nature to the young generation in Germany, provoked a most encouraging response particularly among university students and the City of Cologne, which arranged the loan of this interesting collection to Wiesbaden, expressed itself as very well pleased both with the galleries provided and the interest shown by the young people.

6. Offenbach Archival Depot (see Annex "D")

a. Out-shipments comprised:

Two freight-cars with 158 cases containing 26,568 items of material restitutable to the Italian Government, which were shipped to Italy via the Munich Collecting Point where a combined shipment was being organized; and 11 cases containing 1690 items belonging to the Bavarian Gewerkschafts - bucherei, also forwarded to the Munich Collecting Point for distribution; and two truckloads with 45 cases containing 8190 items and eight filing cabinets deriving from the Reichskolonialbund Library, turned over to the Stadt- und Universitaetsbibliothek, Frankfurt/Main on extended loan.

- b. The only in-shipment consisted of forty-five parcels of weather records from the Fifth Weather Group at Wiesbaden, restitutable to a variety of Allied nations.
- c. As of 31 March, the Depot had handled a total of 3,147,274 items, of which 2,349,448 items had been restituted to claimant nations or returned to German institutions, leaving 797,826 items on hand.

VI. Miscellaneous Notes.

a. It was reported that a collection of 1,00 - 1,500 books belonging to the Rosenberg organization were stored in Wallau. This was reported to Capt. Bencowitz, Offenbach Archival Depot, who dispatched a truck to pick up the books. Only 98 books were found, further investigation should be made to find out what has become of the other books.

b. An archives and library officer in the Culture Ministry for Greater Hesse has not yet been appointed. A conference with Dr. Schramm is planned in the forepart of June. It is hoped that arrangements can be made at that time for the appointment of an archives and library officer for Greater Hesse. The services of this man are needed.

c. Continued progress on the survey of archives and libraries in Greater Hesse has been made during the past month. Practically all institutions in RB Hessen and RB Kassel and about one-half of those in RB Wiesbaden have received copies of the Questionnaire and the Statement of Legal Ownership of Archives and Libraries. It is hoped that all important institutions will return their reports by the end of June.

d. The program of inspection of all the important archives and libraries in Greater Hesse has continued during the month. Twenty eight institutions or repositories were visited during the month. All important institutions in RB Hessen have been visited at least once, and a few in RB Kassel and RB Wiesbaden have also been inspected. It is planned to visit the remaining places sometime during the next two months.

Report.

On 30 May, 1946 hours, Mr. Schorb entered the building and left it again at 1950 hours, handing in the key to Capt. Bencowitz's room, while the keys to the office were still hanging on the key-peg in Captain Bencowitz's office.

Since it is our task to see to it that all rooms are locked, we controlled immediately and stated that the windows in the Office of Captain Bencowitz and in the adjoining offices were open. While closing the windows, we noticed that in Captain Bencowitz's office the second cupboard from the window was open, although ~~remembering~~ as far as we know, it ought to be locked. We know what is in this cupboard, for Captain Bencowitz took cigarettes out of it in our presence and gave them to us (Vogel and Arnold). After we had stated that the cupboard was open, it occurred to us that Mr. Schorb's behavior had been strange, and we reproached ourselves for not having inspected the contents of Mr. Schorb's brief-case which was extraordinarily bulky. If Mr. Schorb had taken the ordinary way through the main gate of the I.G. Farben plant, we could have still stopped and checked him. He had, however, not taken this way, but instead had jumped over the wall of the I.G. Farben compound.

The same night at 0200 hours we informed our foreman, Mr. Krichel, who came to this place and inspected with us the open cupboard and its contents. Since we had regarded Mr. Schorb as someone who enjoys the confidence of Captain Bencowitz, we had not suspected him in any way and therefore had not thought of inspecting his briefcase. Only after we had found the cupboard open did we begin to get worried and regretted not to have opened the bulky briefcase. Mr. Schorb's behavior and the unusual way of his exit added to our suspicion that he might have taken something from the open cupboard.







The fact that the first sorting processes have been completed by the end of April has enabled the establishment of a permanent schematic working plan of the Depot. The books, as they arrive, are taken to the top floor. The boxes are opened, the contents examined, and then sent to appropriate departments (See Inclosure 3).

The books and documents from the sorters are taken to the packing room or to the storage of unidentifiable books on the 2nd floor.

3. Recommendations.

- a. The Offenbach Archival Depot has been designated as the sole Archival Depot in the U.S. Zone (Auth: Ltr, Lt. Col. G.H. Garde, Adjutant General, OMGUS, dated 1 May 46, subject: Removal to Central Archival Depot of Archives, Books and other Library material). It is estimated that with the present staff and program all the books can be sorted and crated by the end of August. It is urgent therefore that the transfer of books and library material to the OAD be expedited. Unless more books arrive to the OAD at a more rapid rate, the staff will have to be reduced and the completion of the assigned task thus very much delayed.
- b. A large file of documents and photographs of the Einsatzstab Reichsleiter Rosenberg (ERR) has been collected and is growing daily. It is suggested that this file be kept intact in the OAD or transferred to some other institution where this material can be studied by interested U.S. personnel.

TO : Executive Officer, USACA

a. Request reconsideration of decision to obtain JCS approval of draft letter of instructions, "Release of Properties From Control of U. S. Military Government to Control and Administration of the Austrian Federal Government", submitted for approval by this division as per attached correspondence.

b. By the terms of the Control Agreement, 28 June 1946, the right of direct action by the occupying powers with respect to properties in Austria is limited to the "care, protection and restitution of United Nationals' property" and the "disposition of German properties". No properties within the classes comprising the subject of the draft letter of instructions fall within the limitations of the Control Agreement, with the possible exception, pending upon interpretation, of the property described in the draft letter of instructions under paragraph "d".

c. The Austrian Federal Law No. 157 on the appointment of public administrators, establishes the legal machinery necessary for direct administration by the Austrian Federal Government Agencies, over the classes of property involved in the proposed release. Further, the Austrian laws on the prohibition of the Nazi Party and the "Denazification Law" provide for disposition of certain classes of the property covered in the proposed letter of instructions, which cannot be accomplished so long as the properties remain under Military Government control. January 1947, addressed to the Federal Ministry for Property Control and Economic Planning, all Nazi organizational properties were released for administration and disposition to the Austrian Federal Government.

d. With respect to the properties described in paragraph "d" of the proposed letter of instructions, these properties comprise that class of which the owner, as an Austrian citizen, was dispossessed through force, duress, or otherwise, in connection with the ascension to power of the National-Socialists. These dispossessed owners, having fled Austria, now hold United National citizenship. The Austrian Federal Laws on internal restitution of such dispossessed properties, establish the legal machinery necessary to the restoration of their property rights to such "claims". The responsibility for the restitution of such properties is rightfully that of the Austrian Government, and a further retention of such properties under Military Government control, makes difficult the implementation of the Austrian laws designed to effect such restitution. The care, protection and preservation of this class of properties, pending their restitution, is guaranteed through the Austrian Federal Law of 10 May, on the "registration of aryanized and other properties of which the owner was dispossessed under the National-Socialist regime". Under this law it is a penitentiary offense for failure to register such properties, and any person in any way connected with properties falling within this group, as owner, occupant, lessee, custodian, administrator, or otherwise, is obligated under penalty of fine and imprisonment to insure the protection and preservation of the property.

e. The action proposed in the draft letter of instructions will accomplish in the U. S. Zone of Occupation what has already been in effect in

It is the opinion of this division that the failure of this headquarters to act upon the proposed "release", which has been delayed to this point pending the passing of the Second and Third Austrian Restitution Laws, will result in leaving the United States Element subject to criticism for carrying out a policy in its zone of occupation contradictory to the U. S.

Element's representations and avowed policies expressed at conferences being held on the subject of the Austrian peace treaty.

Military Government Property Control Officers are being instructed to write a letter to each administrator of property to be released, "terminating" his appointment by the U. S. Military Government. The program of the Monuments and Fine Arts Branch of the R. D. & R. Division includes two major activities:

- a. The protection and eventual restitution of displaced art treasures in the American Zone;
- b. The initiation of repair projects on war-damaged monuments of cultural and artistic value in Austria.

Displaced Art Treasures

These include:

1. Art-loot brought by the Germans to deposits in Austria and which are for the most part non-Austrian; and
2. Austrian art, belonging to the State, to the Lands, and to monasteries.

The art-loot is concentrated chiefly in the saltmine of ALT AUSSEE where many objects from Belgium, Holland, France, and Austria were deposited. Smaller deposits are:

At the saltmine at HALLEIN, where the Hertziana Library from Rome was housed;

At Schloss KOGL near the Attersee where objects were stored by the Nazi international looting organization, the Einsatzstab Rosenberg;

At the Villa WELZ at St. Gilgen, where many pictures bought in France were placed;

At Schloss LICHTENBERG near Saalfelden, containing German and Austrian material and part of an international library removed by the Germans from Italy.

At Schloss FISCHORNE near Zell am See where art-loot from Poland was stored.

Progress of the Work

Since these deposits of non-Austrian art have international significance, they have been given the first priority of attention. The mine at ALT AUSSEE is the largest deposit of art-loot in central Europe. Early in August this Branch recommended that the non-Austrian art material contained in the mine be moved to the American art collecting point at Munich. This recommendation was approved by CG, USFA at the end of September. Since the first week in October the actual removal from the mine has been in operation, an operation which necessitates the use of 12 trucks with drivers and guards, and a large staff of personnel for checking, loading, and supervising the operation. Because of the terrain and the conditions at the mine, only four trucks can be loaded per day. About 60 truckloads have already been removed. It is expected that the operation, which is going along very smoothly, will be completed by the first of November.

The removal of the Herziana Library from the mine at HALLEIN has been in progress for several weeks. It is being removed to the Property Control warehouse at Salzburg, and the operation will be concluded this week.

The removal of the objects from Schloss KOGL will follow the termination of the ALT AUSSEE operation, since they are to be sent to Munich too.

The contents of Villa WEIZ have already been removed and are in the warehouse at Salzburg.

The removal of the books stored at Schloss LICHTENBERG and which were brought there from Italy should be accomplished by the first of December.

The Polish material in Schloss FISCHORNE has been inventoried and is now being removed to the warehouse at Salzburg. This operation will be completed very shortly.

Displaced Austrian Art

This art falls into two categories, that which belongs to the Austrian State, and that which belongs to monasteries and to the Land museums. It is art which was removed for safety against air raids to various deposits. The former category alone is a major concern of the MFA Branch since it is State property, and consequently is under its control until such time as it is handed over to the Austrian government.

An important deposit of such State-owned art is in the saltmine at LAUFFEN near Bad-Ischl, where most of the most important objects of the National Museum in Vienna are stored. Before the arrival of American troops in this area two Nazis removed a sizable quantity of objects from the mine, including about 185 pictures, 49 sacks of tapestries, and other objects. These were later recovered by American troops and are in the Salzburg warehouse. They are to be returned to Vienna within the next month to be placed on exhibition at the Hofburg together with other important pictures now at Lauffen. The remaining major portion of the Lauffen deposit will remain in situ until conditions are more favorable for its removal.

The Austrian art of the second category, i.e. of the monastic and Land collections, has already in great part been or is in process of being returned to its proper place by the Austrian museum officials themselves under the supervision of Land MFA officers.

Since about 15 % of the objects at ALT AUSSEE are Austrian, these objects will be gathered together in one chamber of the mine at the conclusion of the operation of removing the non-Austrian objects to Munich.

Some work of repair has already been begun at Salzburg but in most cases this has been undertaken by the Austrians themselves. In Vienna the most important monuments which are damaged lie in the International Zone. A program of priority projects has been drawn up by the Chiefs of the MFA Branches of the Four Nations and transmitted to the Allied Executive Committee for approval.

Atchd recommendation was approved by Col. McKee ~~on~~ Friday afternoon before he went on leave. I thought he would call me in and discuss some line of action but he evidently didn't think it necessary. There is really nothing much to discuss...~~but~~ and since he has gone and I thought you would be in the Zone this week I intended to follow up my recommendation with action. Now, however, that you are here I wanted you to be informed...

The first paragraph of the atchd note is no longer correct -- in order to be sure about the Alt-Aussee inventory I called the Denkmalamt and they sent a man over with their record (plus an interpreter) and we checked each inventory number. The condition in which I found the inventory was - to put it mildly - incredible. The atchd extraction from the inventory labeled "Items from undetermined property and purchases" is about the only section of the inventory which concerns us now. Owners written in with pencil are "presumed" owners. You can see it is a hodgepodge of presumed French, Dutch, Belgian, Jewish loot and simply unknown. Much property ~~was~~ from this group (which was labeled by Miller as unknown) has been moved out -- this must be checked to see what happened to it and on whose orders it was moved. There was one case of the Bundesministerium refusing to release a painting to Zone Command because it (the Bundes...) hadn't decided if it was Dutch or Belgian property. This is not within the jurisdiction of the Bundes... They have physical custody only of property of this category and must surrender it upon request of the Americans.

I telephoned Leonard, from Art Collecting Center, and asked him if he could be in Salzburg next Monday. He said he could. I will be there Sunday for the Festivals and could stay over Monday and start cleaning this up. The summer is almost gone and we must work fast. However I do not want to go to the Zone and work on this without letter of authorization. It is a nasty job - cleaning up someone's else's mess. EVE - 19 Aug 47

Secured atchd - and another list (see ltr from Zone dtd 9 July 47) - from Kennedy's office, which represents everything which has been released from Alt-Aussee Mine by the Bundesministerium fur VuW. Will make notation on our Alt-Aussee inventory. Kennedy's office now has the English inventory - on which I made notations of atchd deletions so now the ~~two offices~~ records of his office and ours check.

It is possible that "MS" did not mean exactly what he said in the letter of 9 July 47 - but it was taken literally by those in Kennedy's office working on Fine Arts even tho it makes a travesty out of the purpose for which Art Collecting Center in Munich was established -- that of handling art objects of doubtful or unknown origin and/or ownership -- see par 2.

Par 3 is equally bad -- definitely identifiable art objects need not be processed thru Munich except as a convenience.

In view of shortage of personnel - and the fact that we have no MFA representative in the Zone - recommend that we start at once to clear all non-Austrian property (even the identifiable art) out of Alt-Aussee and transport to Munich. This last is recommended inasmuch as it is impossible to get art experts to come into the Zone to accept the identifiable art, whereas Munich has such experts assigned to them for continuous duty.

The Art Collecting Center is anxious to get all of this property into the Center this summer because of the pending reduction of personnel and ~~increased~~ anticipated loss of experts.

For your conference with Hofrat Reith -- Re: ALT-AUSSEE

First, you might try to allay his fears about the property going to the Art Collecting Center (as a nice gesture) because CONTROL of everything sent from Austria by us to Munich remains with this headquarters. The Art Representative (Leonard) in Munich acts in a dual capacity - one of them being representative for us on all art coming from Austria. This headquarters can request the return to Austria (at any time) of anything we send to Munich.

Second, the so-called "receipt for Alt-Aussee" is actually nothing but a "transfer of property guardianship" and is so labeled.

Hindsight now shows us that the paper transferring this guardianship was not carefully enough drawn and has left room for misunderstanding. Back at that time apparently ~~xxxxxx~~ it was not possible for anyone to have the foresight to draw a more explicit paper.

There should be no misunderstanding, however, as to what the intentions were -- and certainly not to us when we consider our restitution directives. It is a well established fact that restitution of looted property in Austria is the sole responsibility of each Commanding General in his own zone. We cannot delegate this responsibility to the Austria Government.

The intention of course of the above paper was to release not only physical custody but jurisdiction of purely Austrian art.....and physical custody but NOT jurisdiction of ~~xxxxxx~~ art which had already been identified as non-Austrian but remained in the Mine, and the great quantity of unidentifiable (at that time) art.

Much of this property is now believed to be Dutch, French, Belgian, etc. but the majority of it is unknown. The Art Collecting Center was set up for the very purpose of processing art of this category - that is it's primary function. The Bundesdenkmalamt has tentatively labeled some of it as Austrian. If they can come forward with proof that it was in Austria prior to the war there will be no necessity to send this to Munich -- otherwise the whole lock, stock and barrel of everything on the list headed "Items from Undetermined Property and Purchases" - pages 67 to 82 of the inventory - should go to Munich.

← The Austrians certainly need have to qualms about Austrian property coming back to Austria - they know from past experience it does as we have almost routine transports of art returning all the time from Munich.

We also intend to send all the stuff tentatively earmarked Dutch, French and Belgian to Munich as it is impossible for these countries to secure art experts to work in the zone -- and there is a complete and perfect setup for this sort of thing in Munich. We should do as it was intended in the beginning, to utilize the Munich collecting center rather than attempt a duplicate setup in our small headquarters of USFA.

Again to make him feel good -- the Collecting Point is happy to welcome to the two ^{Austrian} art experts who will shortly leave ~~for~~ Munich for at least 6 months work. Austrian interests will be protected - but we've got a job to do.

Dear Frank and Ted:

There are enclosed herewith two copies of cable 4970 of May 17, 1950 from USFA to the Department of the Army. Colonel Love from the Pentagon brought it to us personally about a week ago, at which time we had a long discussion with him and the Austrian desk officers in the Department of the troubled situation surrounding the Aussee property and what more we could do to improve matters. The USFA text is being transmitted with Colonel Love's permission in order that you may be kept fully informed concerning all aspects of the problem; Colonel Love has requested in the interest of not arousing the troubled spirits in USFA further, that the copies enclosed herewith be for your information only.

It was clear to all of us at the recent meeting that the recent cable to USFA and note to Austrian Legation, texts of which we sent you by airgram, have not gotten us very far towards the establishment of an atmosphere of confidence and understanding in this matter. This is proved not only by the USFA cable, but also by personal impressions which Colonel Hamblen recently brought back from Vienna and by continuous reference to the Aussee property on the part of representatives of the Austrian Legation in Washington whenever they meet with the Austrian desk officers.

It seemed to all of us that whatever suspicions and fears USFA and the Austrian Government might have in regard to the further disposition of the Aussee properties were not entirely created out of thin air. The people in Austria had been led to believe that the residual properties would be returned for further disposition there once we came to

the point of terminating our operations in Germany. When OMGUS was foolish enough to turn over Munich to the custody of the Germans and furthermore take other steps, the effect of which was to impede the remaining cultural restitution operations, it is understandable that the Austrians had thought that the point for return of the properties had arrived. Doubts naturally arose as to our intentions when the residual property was not returned, and these doubts grew into a kind of belligerent suspicion if only because of the aggressive activities of Dr. Auerbach and the fact that the "further processing" of the remaining properties, of which we have made such a point, appeared to the Austrians to have very nearly come to a halt.

There are other factors as well. As you know this Government has for a long time regarded Austria as a liberated country, a fact which the Austrians never let anyone forget. From the Austrian point of view, their status is practically the same as that of France or Belgium etc. Whatever the situation may actually be, it is one involving major psychological and prestige factors which do not lend themselves, particularly at this time, to profitable discussion or debate. In regard to the Aussee collection, the Austrians would be inclined to feel that if we had found these properties in France and subsequently moved them to Germany for screening, the French would have some very clear rights to be considered in the disposition of the property, and under the circumstances attending this case to have the property returned to France forthwith; the Austrians obviously cannot understand why they should be treated with less consideration.

It was agreed at our meeting that to return the remaining properties to Austria forthwith, as requested in the USFA cable, would be highly unprofitable from the point of view of the speediest disposition thereof. It was also agreed that we would have to do everything in our power to allay existing suspicions and get on with the remaining work as rapidly as possible. We have drafted a reply to USFA incorporating these points which is now under consideration and of which we will send you a copy as soon as it goes out.

We feel it only fair and necessary to tell you that in our judgment the situation will remain critical for some time

to come.

to come. We were able to persuade the other participants in the meeting as to the undesirability of immediate transfer of residual Aussee properties to Austria only because we asserted that these properties were now being processed, and that there was every hope that HICOG could get on with this work quickly and bring it to a early conclusion. We fear that any delay in this HICOG processing operation will be challenged and will lead to the firmest demands, which we doubt can be resisted, that HICOG relinquish the remaining properties at once.

Under the circumstances we would like to urge you to consider every and all steps to make the disposition of the remaining Aussee properties the number one priority of your cultural restitution activities. We note in this connection that our suggestion for the employment of a full time Fine Arts Officer at Munich does not appear as yet to have been acted upon. We hope that this matter is under urgent consideration in HICOG, for we fully understand that Ted can not give full attention to Munich at the same time that he is in full charge of Wiesbaden, and we feel that a full time American is required at Munich if we are to make any real headway there at all.

We also want to urge you to take immediate steps to prepare a full accounting for every art object which was transferred from Austrian depositories to Germany for further disposition, to make a report thereon available to the Department as soon as possible with statistical indication as to the disposition of properties to date, and thereafter to keep the accounting and reporting on a current basis. We suggest this both in the interest of good administration and because we are certain that we will be pressed for such an accounting before too long, and certainly at the time when we transfer any residual items to Austria. In this connection, we regret to tell you that the various sets of figures which were transmitted last fall are still far from clear to us and gave rise to some embarrassment when they were discussed with the Austrian desk officers in the Department some months ago.

Ted will recall the urgency with which, in our conversations with him, we viewed the earliest possible conclusion of our cultural operations at Wiesbaden and Munich. At that time we thought there might be a fair chance

chance that the High Commission set-up might be changed before too long. Although it is now apparent that there will be no drastic revision in the Occupation Statute this year, the pressure nevertheless remains. We must press on with the cultural work generally, and the Aussee properties only highlight this necessity.

SUBJECT: Discussions between RD&R Div., USACA and OMGUS
Relative to MFAA Activities in Austria and Germany

Conversation between Lt Col. McKee of RD&R Div., USACA, Capt. Grier of OMGUS, Berlin, and Capt. Rae of OMG, Bavaria.

1. Pending the establishment of final quadripartite or unilateral restitution agreements, it was agreed that Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives materials belonging to Austria or Germany would be moved to the territory in which they had been located before the war and into the custody of the military organization now supervising the government of said territory.

2. Lt. Col. McKee also agreed that OMGUS or OMGB investigators for MFAA materials should, upon proper clearance with G-2 and other interested agencies, operate freely in the American Zone in Austria. Upon discovery of MFAA materials in the American Zone, said investigators will first clear with Chief, Reparations and Restitution Branch, USACA, before removing any such materials out of Austria.

3. In the exchange of MFAA materials, the claimant shall provide the necessary transportation and/or shipping facilities to effect return to proper location.

4. Lt. Col. McKee agreed to instruct any investigators that USFA may employ for the purpose of finding and locating auctioneers' and dealers' reports regarding sale of art objects in the U.S. Zone of Austria and Vienna during the war, to turn over such reports to the MFAA Sections, OMGUS.

5. Opinion was given by Lt. Col. McKee that public museum collections presently located in I. Bezirk, Vienna, are liable to restitution to the proper claimant nation or in the case of German public collections to the competent U.S. Military authorities.

FACT SHEET: ART RESTITUTION

VISITING AUSTRIA --- In wartime Austria, Gothic castles, of no strategic military importance, revived a role they had played centuries before and became islands of safety amidst the ravages of battle. Romanesque monasteries again became guardians of European culture while salt mines acquired deposits many times more valuable than the salt of the earth. The Nazis, it seems, had discovered that mountain castles, isolated monasteries, and subterranean salt mines made excellent air raid shelters for collections of looted art.

When the war ended Austria was a gigantic depot of art treasures which the Nazis had looted all over Europe. One of the most difficult jobs of the Reparations and Restitutions Branch of the United States Allied Commission for Austria has been finding these priceless treasures and restoring them to their pre-Nazi owners. The big art trove of the salt mines was uncovered almost as soon as the Third Army entered Austria, but the dozens of smaller depots in castles scattered throughout the U.S. Zone have been found only after diligent search by American restitutions experts.

Three years after the American arrival in Austria it is believed that almost all art depots of any size have been located and most of the "big"

restitutions completed. Miss Eve Tucker, Fine Arts Officer of the Restitution and Reparations Branch, estimates that during the past year alone she has helped to restore more than \$300,000,000 worth of paintings and art objects to countries looted by the Nazis.

Art treasures restored to their owners range from paintings like Cézanne's "Loving Couple" and Brueghel's "Conversion of St. Paul" to an eighteenth century pottery can and a box of poker chips belonging to Queen Wilhelmina of the Netherlands.

Battle flags and standards, captured from Austrian regiments during the Napoleonic wars and brought back to Austria by Hitler, were returned to France. An embroidered table cloth, a Louis XIV mirror, a bronze barometer, and a camphor chest were among other items restored.

Two declarations by the Allies during the war defined the broad lines of policy under which art works are returned to their pre-Nazi owners. In January 1943, representatives of Britain, France and the United States, meeting in London, declared that they reserved the right to find null and void any property transaction made in Europe during the Nazi occupation. In November of the same year, Britain, the USSR and the U.S. issued the Moscow Declaration, declaring that since Austria was the first victim of Nazi aggression, it would be treated as a liberated nation.

The Austrian Government has given complete support to the U.S. fine art restitution program. Many of the art treasures stored in Austria are actually Austrian, although some of the art works came from France, Italy, Germany

country with the second largest collection of looted art coming from Holland.

The Austrian Monuments and Fine Arts Office has cooperated with Miss Tucker from castle to salt mine. All cooperation has been necessary because identifying the art treasures is as exhausting a job as finding them.

The depots in the salt mines contained thousand of art treasures. The largest depot was in the Alt-Aussee mine, which was almost destroyed shortly before the Americans arrived. Against orders from Berlin, the local Gauleiter ordered the mine bombed. Fortunately he was disobeyed; the bombs which had been placed in the interior of the mine were removed to the entrance where they were detonated. The result was that, in effect, the undamaged treasure was sealed against destruction.

American experts found more than 400 tons of art treasures in this mine. Here were the art collections of the Rothschild, the loot taken by the Steering Division from Monte Cassino, most of Gordon Craig's Theatre Collection which the Nazis had seized in Paris, and museum collections from all over Europe. Most of these art works were intended for the Great Linz Art Museum and Library, which was one of Hitler's favorite projects for honoring Linz, the Austrian city only a few miles from his birthplace.

One of the paintings found in Alt-Aussee was Vermeer's "Artist in his Studio" which Count Jaromir Czernin-Borzin had sold to Hitler in 1940 for 1,650,000 Reichsmark.

As an offer of 2,000,000 Reichsmark for the picture by Andrew Melzon had previously been refused, the sale was considered to have been made under duress and the painting was turned over to the Austrian Government as pre-war Austrian

property.

The Leaffer saltmine contained about 150 tons of material from Austrian museums, among which were 787 paintings from the Museum of Art History alone. The halloin mine contained 545 cases of the Hertzina Library of Rome, a gold coin collection from the city of Salzburg and a collection of Himmer's personal loot.

The caves of the salt mines in which the art was stored were equipped with wooden floors, electric lights and racks upon which paintings could be placed. As the salt deposits in these caves had already been exhausted they were of no value to the operation of the mines. Their dry air and cold, even temperature, in fact, were actually beneficial to the stored paintings, although Miss Tucker and the other experts have found working in them for long periods very uncomfortable during their investigations.

Although nearly all the art works in the salt mines have been removed and restored to their owners, a large Hans Makart oil, "Venice doing homage to Catherine Cornaro", which is 1050 by 400 centimeters in size, is still in the Alt-Aussee mine. When the entrances to the mine were rebuilt, after the bombing, they proved to be too small for the removal of this painting. The depot will have to be destroyed to remove Makart's canvas, and at the present time the Austrian Government wishes the depot kept intact. The painting belongs to the National Gallery of Berlin, whose directors have agreed to let it remain in the mine, where it is perfectly safe, for the present.

Linz Tuckar has investigated some 20 other Nazi art depots in Austria. At St. Florian Monastery about 20 freight carloads of heavy antique furnitures, large baroque mirrors, antique musical instruments, large paintings and a library of 5,000 volumes on music, art and literature were found. These objects were brought to St. Florian by the Rundfunk Broadcasting Company and were to be used to refurbish the monastery as a broadcasting center. The Nazis, displaying a sensitivity not notable in places like Buchenwald and Dachau, planned to use the antique musical instruments in broadcasts of music by Bach, Mozart and Beethoven.

About 10 carloads of art objects, mainly of unknown origin, are still at St. Florian, which is maintained by USA as one of three depots where art of undisclosed origin is stored. Other depots are at Linz and Salzburg. The Linz depot, the Landhaus, is historically famous as it was from the balcony of this building that Hitler announced the Anschluss of Austria with Germany in March, 1938, the Salzburg depot is in Hellbrunn Castle, which was formerly the residence of the Prince Archbischep of Salzburg.

An important collection of Nazi loot was discovered in Castle Fischhorn, near Zell am See, Austria, which is owned by the former Peruvian Ambassador to Austria.

The SS took over the castle during the war and turned it into a Polish Art Depot under the supervision of SS General Fegelein, a brother in law of Eva Braun. Among the items stored at Fischhorn were 481 paintings, 81 tapestries and oriental rugs, 2,124 engravings and 17,000 library volumes.

In the disorder at the end of the war, "Holy Family", a painting by Raphael's teacher Sermoneta was removed from Castle Fischhorn by a peasant. With the aid of a parish priest, Miss Tucker subsequently recovered it, and as the Nazis had looted it originally from the National Gallery in Warsaw, returned it to Poland.

Fischhorn is infamous for more than its collection of looted art. At the end of the war American soldiers, struggling along the dusty highway below Fischhorn, saw a paunchy figure limping down the road toward them. Hermann Goering had decided to surrender.

Kremmünster Monastery near Linz is one of the oldest monasteries in Europe. Founded in 777 AD by the Benedictines, it had been used by the Nazis as a depot for sculptures, elaborate wood panelings and part of Gordon Craig's theatre collection, plus some paintings.

While this loot was being removed after the war, a priest stole a box containing 22 small paintings by Bavarian artists from an American officer because he was afraid that the box contained art from the monastery itself. After the officer's departure the priest examined the case and was embarrassed to find that it was not loot from the monastery. He reported the incident to Miss Tucker, and the paintings were turned over to American officials in Bavaria.

Many of the castles the Nazis used as depots were famous gathering places of European nobility. Castle Littersill, near Zell am See, Austria, was an International Sporting Club before the war where Princess Julianne of Holland

spent her honeymoon and the Duke of Windsor was a frequent guest. The SS took the castle over for their research foundation, the "Ahnenerbe", which housed the Tibetan Collection of the Swan Hedin Institute.

Miss Tucker, an ex-WAC who served with the Air Force in England during the war, has traveled some fifty thousand miles in the past year and nearly worn out a 1947 Ford. Her investigations have made her something of an authority on Austrian castles and monasteries, but long hours of investigation in the dark, musty atmosphere of centuries old buildings have taken their toll. She still appreciates the unique beauty of castles like Hintersill and Count Starhemberg's Castle Affording, but a certain amount of realism is mixed with her former enthusiasm. "I think the only thing colder and less romantic than an unheated 13th century castle," she says, "is an unheated 13 century monastery."

The nobles, living in one or two rooms of castles which contain hundreds, seem "almost fairy tale" personalities to Miss Tucker. Unused rooms are dusted and clean, but there is a lifeless stillness about them which seems to have been undisturbed since the days of the empire. Both used and unused rooms are cluttered with the accumulations of centuries. Inspection of odd nooks and crannies will reveal objects of art, furniture and paintings from the ages of chivalry.

The castles are usually the nobles' only possessions. Contrary to what might be expected, the nobles, though short of money, are not selling their art possessions because current prices are too low.

There is very little land belonging to the castles for the Peasants Wars of the 15th century took all but a small encircling strip. The Peasants are still a much more vital thing to the nobles than any of the recent conflagrations.

Miss Tucker will visit a castle in connection with a fine arts matter and soon find herself talking an old baron, sometimes dressed in colored velvet knee breeches, and his baroness about these "tres terrible" 15th century wars. Conversation with the baron will be carried on in a mixture of German and French, while the baroness may understand English shouted into her ear trumpet. After tea the baron and baroness will insist upon showing Miss Tucker through the castle which is often "more like a delapidated museum than anything else."

American restitutions experts frequently find themselves in situations which call for a great deal of diplomacy. Now that the treasures of the depots for the most part have been restored to their owners, new investigations are usually concerned with art treasures which have gotten into private hands.

A man who has acquired a work of art through what appears to him to have been legal channels is not easily convinced that his transaction is only one or two times removed from a case of nazi looting. Upon one occasion Miss Tucker had a rather heated discussion with a man who had information about a looted painting which she was trying to find.

It became time for lunch, and Miss Tucker was offered a bowl of soup, which she accepted. "You are very brave," her host said, when she began to eat. "I might be poisoning you..." The soup had no disastrous effect and afterwards Miss Tucker got the information she wanted without further difficulty.

The SS used Prince Eduard Auersperg's Castle Weitwirth to house a section of the Goethe Institute of the Deutsche Akademie of Munich. Some damage was done to the castle by employees of the institute, which greatly enraged the prince who is 85 years old. When Miss Tucker went to see him about returning the items to Munich, he was still mad.

"I did not completely agree with the Prince on his damage claims," Miss Tucker says, "but I had to get my points over carefully because of the Prince's age and the slight impression events of the last thirty years had made upon him. The family seemed to agree with my argument that cultural property should not be dissipated for minor damage claims, and enjoyed my disagreement with the old Prince so much that I was invited to stay for tea."

Restitutions are effected upon a governmental level. A country which has located a lost painting in the American Zone will file a claim through the American Legation in Vienna. This claim is forwarded to Reparations and Restitutions Branch, and Miss Tucker then investigates it. When a work of art is located in private hands the person possessing it is made military custodian of it until the claim is finally settled. The country which claims the work of art must establish proof and ownership. In the case of some paintings, names of former locations are stamped on their reverse sides, making identification quite easy. The Nazis frequently gave receipts for confiscated art treasures which are also useful in making identifications. Identified art works are turned over to the American Legation which returns them to the countries from which they were looted.

The experts who make the identifications of canvases work together harmoniously.

Miss Tucker says, "A Polish Art expert will be as ready to identify a painting from a French collection as the French expert will be to identify a painting from a collection in the Hague." Final decision concerning the justice of a claim is made by the Restitutions and Reparations Branch of USACA.

Art treasures of great value are frequently found side by side with works of no value at all. The Nazi experts usually showed excellent taste in their confiscations, but no selection at all was made in the wholesale confiscations of Jewish property. Many of the finest paintings which were confiscated came, of course, from Jewish owners. The collections of the Rothschilds, Rudolf von Gutmann and Saksor Bondi were all taken over by the Nazis. Among the collections of non-Jews confiscated by the Nazis was Count Antoni Lubomirski's famous collection of Italian and Flemish masters.

Despite the thousands of restitutions which have been made, the list of paintings and art objects still missing is a formidable one. Painters whose work is still missing include Rubens, Tintoretto, Durer, Rembrandt, Van Dyck, El Greco, Goya, Courbet, Renoir, Degas and Cezanne. USA's part in the restitution program will be completed in another year when final disposition of current claims will have been made.

"The gigantic search for their lost heritage which the nations of Europe have been conducting for the last three years," Miss Tucker remarks, "will probably continue for the next fifty."
