In connection with Mr. Scanlon's report on the investigation of the painting situation, he encountered a certain amount of opinion among people in art circles to the effect that there might be some improvement made in the administration of the control of art objects which might facilitate detection of disposition of looted property. WORKS OF ART - REAPERS OF WAR AND PEACE - By Georges Hildenstein

The problem of the works of art pillaged by the Germans does not, at first sight, seem to belong under the category of our most vital post-war duties. The fact that art is identified with the purpose of living of civilized nations and that it is close to their heart even when their very existence is in danger - certainly proves all the touching quality connected with this problem, but at the same time hides it under a sentimental value which too often prevents to realize, and especially weigh, its deep and real importance.

It suffices, however, to profit by this lesson, so painfully taught us by the enemy, to recognize the great importance attached to art by the most vandal and best organized people of our time; it suffices to recall the methodic exploitation of art treasures, organized by the subjects of the author of "Mein Kampf", in the conquered European countries, as they went from victory to victory - to realize that it does not concern a sentimental value but a very real value and, more than that, represents an economic, political and international weapon of great certainty, and for this reason extremely dangerous.

Studied under the light of its present and future consequences - this problem appears as being precisely among the most urgent ones to be examined and solved now.

Before approaching this examination and suggesting solutions, we, first of all, have to divert any possible misunderstandings. The tradition of art representing the spoils of war, and the lust of which these spoils have always been the legitimate object, goes back to the earliest times of history. The Napoleonic policy in the artistic field, just to choose an example in the most recent part of French history, has adorned this tradition with all the prestige of a desire for civilization which was its inspiration and basis. From there it is only one step to see in the German art policy another link of the same tradition, forged by the outrageously misleading genius of the Nazi invaders. From there, too, one does not have far to go to interpret our appeal concerning the question which arises in view of the artistic spoils hoarded by Germany, in the name of civilization, before her defeat.

To accept this at face value might not be entirely incorrect, and we would not blush if, in fact, it arose in defense - in which we intend to participate with all our strength - of those spiritual possessions which makes up our artistic patrimony and which is unanimously classified among the most precious treasures of which a country can boast. But a mis-

understanding would exist if one neglected to consider, besides the idealistic factor - the material point of view, more tangible, and for this reason more precarious, which today more than ever has become more inseparable from the question of works of art.

At a time when economic issues - alarming results of this war - threaten to upset the table of world-wide values, works of art represent one of the sure stable values which are maintained in spite of everything and which might be considered as quasi international gold value. If this can be argued against, where works of art or art objects of lesser importance or fame are concerned - it is incontrovertible and can defy any test where works of art (which truly deserve this name) are concerned, which by tradition and their commercial quota, often secular, have been endorsed by literature or precise documents with, so to speak, passports permitting their identification and control. It is this gold value, more than the minimal value which is so dear to us, which the Germans and certain Italians too, better than anyone before them, have realized and of which it is now our turn to take notice and realize its importance. Conscious of the part which it is destined to play, the Germans have not only organized, with an unmeasurable method, the pillage of all objects of this value scattered all over France, but also - and here is the danger - they have done, and are still doing, and this with just as much method, everything in their power to maintain this value and this source of foreign exchange and to secure its exploitation after their defeat.

Therefore, art represents one of the numerous fields where, if we do not act immediately and firmly, we risk that Germany, while losing the war, will win the peace.

The Germans did not even wait one week after the occupation of Paris to amply display their energy dispersed in pillaging works of art with all the organized and cynical precision of which they are capable. The Vichy government, blind or criminal, endorsed this activity. The annulment of the decree against racial persecution, the law depriving all persons having left France, legally or illegally, between May 10th and June 30th, 1940 of their French citizenship and their property, prohibition to cross the line of demarcation between the two zones of France, the increasing number of seizures taken against the Jews, measure directed against the free-press and parliamentaries - all this legal apparatus conferred an aspect of legitimacy to the most barbarous vandalism of modern history. After everything was pillaged from the homes abandoned by their evacuated or fugitive inhabitants the day after the occupation, always with a perfectly established and applied method, in a silent Paris without light, water, and half deserted, private property, that of Jews, of Gypsies, free-press, etc., automatically became the first so-called legal booty. The press, paid by the Germans for many years before the war which they

had foreseen and prepared for, and completely monopolized by them once their success was accomplished, supported this plundering. The wave of anti-Semitism, artificially let loose in the papers, represented the indirect action. Other publications expressed themselves more directly. The article recently published in New York and signed by Xavier Vallat, Commissioner of Jewish Affairs, who deplored that the seizure of Jewish property deprived the National Help Organization of funds which the sale of this property would have brought, is an example which could be multiplied many times by quoting all evil copy audaciously printed by French editors or officials collaborating with the Germans.

This supported by extremely precise information, which had been supplied long beforehand, perfectly documented and detailed, about the composition and location of artistic property, the Germans proceeded with the systematic seizure of private art treasures, patiently awaiting - this also methodically - the occupation of all of France in order to gradually seize all French artistic patrimony. Collections given into the safekeeping of obliging and vigilant National Museums and shipped to different castles in France for protection against bombings, were the objects immediately seized, made so much easier especially in view of the fact that many of these collections, among the most valuable ones of France, belonged to Jews. Concerning paintings which belonged to me, stored for safekeeping in the castle of Sarches, as well as my property of Soin-et-Oise, were seized nearly simultaneously, and did not fail to be followed by all the usual procedures to make the seizure appear like an outright sale.

Once the seizure was effected, the local emporiums continued to function for the profit of the invaders. The Germans took particular care as an art collector to have the works of art seized looked upon as simply having been stolen, taken away or even requisitioned. In anticipation of this future when as much profit as possible is to be obtained from the value of the objects thus seized, the threat of which we are trying to avert today, they made it a point to cover up their organized thefts by making them appear like valid and locally justified purchases. A willing collaborator, the half blind engraver Jacques Beltrami, was there to help the invaders. "These gentlemen must not pay more than it is worth" was the motto of his shameful mission. The sums which according to his appraisals of the value of the looted objects were to be set aside as due to the dispossessed owners, were credited to the French Government to be applied against the occupational debt. Considering the discrepancy between the prices set by such appraisals and the enormous occupational debt set, as you know, at 100,000,000 francs a day, all art collections of France, private or public, could have been "purchased" and "paid for" within a few days. Certain obliging dealers, more voracious than collaborators, together with German and Italian dealers who rushed to Paris all that they could find, did their shameful deeds in the name of the law which they could not be freely accomplished. They

Hitler and for his success in this, for Hermann Goering, for all Germans and all collaborationists whose purchasing lust rose the more their confidence in a Nazi victory fell. The officials, appointed by the French Government under German supervision in matters where the owners were absent (the Germans authorizing the return from the free zone into the occupied zone only with great difficulty, even for non-Jews), also proceeded with the extensive sales and liquidations, often were profiteers, informed or uninformed accomplices, intentional or unintentional agents of this insidious German art policy.

During this soaring business the prices rose to a staggering height and fantastic sums were paid. One can easily understand such a state of affairs. The money used for payment had only a fictitious value while the objects acquired represented a stable and sure value, not only for the present and past, but especially for the future.

France, after all other European countries beginning with Germany before the Nazi regime down to the smallest village of any one country invaded, has been dispossessed by Nazi Germany and Fascist Italy in one way or another, under the most cynical legal pretense or through the interpretation of a market so shamefully organized, of a great part of its artistic patrimony. The so-called legal aspect built around this plundering, and the firm which has planned, has covered up the traces of this plundering and will make the indispensable task of returning the pillaged objects to their legal owners after the war, insurmountably difficult. During the last moments of my stay in France I was offered a painting which I did not fail to recognize as being beyond doubt one which had been seized or stolen. I take the liberty to doubt that after my departure there were many buyers who when approached in the same manner I was, did as I did and informed the seller - ignorant, collaborationist or dishonest - of the origin of the object in his possession. Chances are that the painting in question, the sale of which I do not pretend to have prevented, today is among many others of the same kind, not in France or in Germany, but in Switzerland, Portugal or somewhere in this hemisphere. This is one example among thousands of others which perfectly illustrates the situation we are facing. Those responsible for the devastation of the European continent, by making use of the most precious national patrimony of its victims represented by works of art, have secured for themselves an enormous revolving fund in foreign countries, particularly in Mexico, where they will be able to use it through the medium of those countries who might have been permitted to remain neutral for this purpose. They will hold this purchasing power and reap the profits if a barrier, powerful, intransigent and insurmountable, is not erected with all diligence by all United Nations the very next day the war ends. Without speaking of the political and economic aids of the problem, the indigestible task of returning to their legal owners

action of individuals, the stolen art objects cannot be accomplished without the help of this barrier, provided that it be erected on this and in all countries simultaneously.

Organizations have already been founded here to prepare this restitution work. Under their auspices multiple and detailed lists have been prepared by the most competent authorities in the different art fields in order to facilitate the search for pillaged art treasures, their identification and preservation, as soon as the allied forces enter liberated Europe.

We cannot go into the different phases of the program demanded by such a situation in this first article. The urgency which brings us closer to the allied victory with the dawn of each day prompts us, however, to submit without delay the most essential point, in our opinion, of this program.

It is to be certain that an international art policy is to be the basis and condition of our future struggle against the catastrophic consequences of the German "art policy". New radical measures are the only ones which would permit the desirable and obligatory nature of such a policy. These measures are necessary now, even before the signing of a general or separate peace. These measures, although they might seem very radical, are the only effective ones and are the proclamation of an international reprimanding action concerning the works of art located in all European countries - with the exception of England - the legitimate ownership of which cannot be absolutely established prior to 1936.

It is no doubt superfluous to go into the details of the evident effect of such measures, united with the supervision of all borders and the temporary prohibition to sell works of art of European origin in the entire world. Applied on time, that is, at the very present hostilities cease, and especially applied simultaneously by all United Nations, these are the only measures which could set up the indispensable barrier against the functioning of the diabolic plan conceived by the enemy for his profit for the post-war period. Once this proclaimed reprimanding is applied simultaneously throughout the entire world, the measures to restore their property to the victims of Nazi pillage can then in turn be undertaken. But the basis of everything to be undertaken in the future, into the details of which we shall go in the next issue of this publication, remains this international reprimanding method and immobilizing the works of art in their diverse shelters. This alone will make it possible to find the traces, prevent further underlings and will ensure their return to their legitimate owners.

EVIDENCE THAT RESIDENT OF BOLEVA HAS ACCESS TO RENOIR PAINTINGS

Writer has been visiting various museums and art galleries, investigating values of oil paintings. Speaking of Renoir, he states:

"I saw a relatively small Renoir at Wildenstein (landscape) for U.S. \$30,000 - they told me that they have sold a Renoir flower arrangement for U.S. \$40,000 a short while ago. Of course Wildenstein (see Ex. Note) is very expensive but anyway! An art dealer from Dusseldorf - Dr. Schoenemann - said he would pay for a Renoir Nude U.S. \$3000-4000 and for a flower arrangement 6000-8000 without seeing them - provided they were legitimate. Obviously he would pay more too, and still expect a good profit. Confidentially, Maurice's art dealer has a Renoir (I only saw the photo) of a girl (I think the same one as your nude) but she is dressed which he offers for U.S. \$11,000. I am sure you will have no difficulty to sell the Renoirs at good prices if you can get them here - my advice: take them for yourself definitely (if possible giving me an option on one of them). I am quite serious - I would perhaps take one. Please write what you decide definitely. I heard that Utrillo is also bringing very good prices at present. I saw one oil - about the size of the one Muller in Buenos Aires had - for U.S. \$3500. I believe there you did get a bargain - really. I also inquired about Barent Cad - they quote around U.S. \$300-400. Schoenemann has one which is offered at U.S. \$500. Altogether prices for old pictures have not gone up nearly as much as for French Impressionists."

Dear Doctor Holzinger!

As I learned only from our telephone conversation this morning that you had not heard directly from Messrs. Wildenstein concerning their desire to borrow two paintings from the Nationalgalerie collections for their RENOIR exhibition - about which you had corresponded on the subject of a loan from Frankfurt - I am glad to confirm my remarks herewith.

Mr. Wildenstein had written directly to Dr. Rave requesting loan of "LA BOHEMIENNE" and "LA FAMILLE BERARD". Dr. Rave replied to Mr. Wildenstein that the decision would have to be made in Wiesbaden but that he had no objection.

Miss Hall and I discussed the matter and referred it to Washington, as we felt some doubt over the wisdom of lending Berlin paintings to dealers. The official reply was that, as we must rely largely on the cooperation of American dealers for the recovery of missing German-owned works of art which might come into trade channels, this office might use its own discretion in recommending occasional loan of painting from the Berlin collections for such purposes as the proposed RENOIR exhibition at Wildenstein.

In view of the short time available, transport in this case must be made by air and this would I think preclude sending the "FAMILLE BERARD" because of the great size. However, unless you consider its condition doubtful, I would recommend that you agree to loan of "LA BOHEMIENNE" for the period of the exhibition (March 22 - April 29). I should appreciate your answer on Monday so that I can reply by cable. The answer should include the insurance figure. If necessary I could take the painting with me on about March 13, when I expect to fly to New-York.



# German Loot

By Georges Wildenstein

## How To Regain Art Treasures

THE SALVAGE of European art treasures constitutes one of the most urgent problems which confront us. It is one which must be solved immediately, unless we mean to allow the Axis to compensate for its military defeat by economic and financial victories.

An important part of that problem—the protection and sheltering of monuments of art—has already been successfully taken care of. The combined efforts of special committees on both sides of the Atlantic, working in close collaboration with the armed and air forces, have paved the way for the excellent first-aid task accomplished by the liberation armies in this field.

There remains, however, a no less vital problem: that of the actual recovery and restitution to their rightful owners of the mobile works of art of artistic as well as of economic value.

Reports from liberated areas daily give us more data on and names of masterpieces of art which have thus far disappeared from their original homes as a result of that policy.

The first information received from Italy listed as missing 28 cases of Hellenistic and Roman sculpture, 291 paintings, 30 cases of smaller pictures. From Florence alone it was stated that nearly 500 paintings and sculptures are missing from the collections of the Uffizi, the Palazzo Pitti and of the Bargello, among them some of the world's greatest masterpieces.

From France it was reported more recently that private collections have suffered more than national ones. But this is no way to look at it. It only shows how shrewd has been the Nazi art-looting policy and how essential it is to be prepared for its possible harvest. Works of art in national collections are on record. They can therefore not be put on the market as easily as those originating from private hands. Nations' rights to claim back the works taken from them are unquestionable, while the rights of private ownership can be controversial. It is significant that in order to escape any controversy in the future, the Hitler museum in his native town of Linz, Austria, has been made up exclusively of works of art coming from private hands, and does not contain any formerly belonging to national collections.

It should be borne in mind, on the other hand, that private collections, particularly in France, were very often as important and valuable as the national ones. The Rothschild collections alone were estimated, before the war, at several tens of millions of dollars.

**Staple Value**  
This shrewd Nazi art-looting policy had most definite purposes and long-range implications. The Nazis were aware of their own currency's precariousness and of the necessity to secure for themselves, especially for the hour of their defeat, stable foreign currency and the greatest possible financial power abroad. Economic crises throughout the world made them equally alarmed about the instability of money values in general. They realized that, since the abandonment of the gold standard, works of art represent the most stable international value, and consequently, the safest investment.

In order to understand further what action is necessary to frustrate this Nazi plan, let us study each of its steps in detail.

1. The "securing" of works of art was executed with the assistance of the most adequate and helpful Nazi laws from 1936

on in Germany itself and then all over occupied Europe. Jewish collections provided the first easy objectives. They were followed by the collections belonging to political enemies or, generally, to all persons and even nations conveniently labeled as unfriendly to the master race.

2. The legal protection of the loot was assured in many ways and represents a most significant aspect of the subject. The Nazis knew that abolition of their laws by the victorious allies would automatically deprive them of the right to their booty. No art collection or single work of art was seized, requisitioned or robbed by them without their "legalizing" these crimes by some sort of sale certificate or exchange paper duly signed by their victims through force. Moreover, during the Nazi temporary conquest of Europe, most of the looted works of art were made the object of a series of successive transactions designed to disguise their origins.

3. Examples of the successful transfer of looted works of art from Germany to neutral countries are innumerable. A masterpiece of Brueghel, recently listed among the missing paintings from the Naples Museum and placed into "safety" by the Nazis at Monte Cassino, has already reappeared on the Stockholm market. Others may have been placed in that large safety vault lately reported to have been built for the German Embassy in Lisbon. Others may be part of the private property of an important neutral industrialist in Latin America, it was recently disclosed that he lent his name to cover properties which were transferred to him by high Nazi officials.

**Means of Recovery**  
There is but one way to assure this and to leave simultaneously the recovery of these European art treasures.

1. Unanimous United Nations declaration of a general moratorium on all art transactions with a consequent immobilization of all art properties in the European countries (with the exception of Great Britain) this to be assisted by rigorous control of all border customs (our sole means of action against neutral countries which might not join in this declaration), no limits whatever of value or time to be placed on those measures.

2. All works of art which have remained in the same ownership since 1936 (when the Nazis started their art-looting policy) would automatically be eliminated from the above measures.

3. All owners of works of art who have been deprived of that ownership would be requested to provide descriptive lists of those works with proofs or affidavits of their ownership.

4. The resulting global list of works of art taken from their rightful owners, nations and individuals, would have to be officially published and given the widest possible circulation in order to render worthless any pleas of ignorance of the terms of the law.

5. Owners of works of art thus officially listed as having been looted would be obliged to declare them, with the most severe penalties imposed on receivers of stolen goods.

6. Those objects would have to be confiscated and their recovery by their rightful owners assured.

7. For the small minority of cases in which the present owners of looted works of art would be able to prove their complete good faith in their acquisition, there would be foreseen an indemnity would

THE SALVAGE of European art treasures constitutes one of the most urgent problems which confront us. It is one which must be solved immediately, unless we mean to allow the Axis to compensate for its military defeat by economic and financial victories.

An important part of that problem—the protection and sheltering of monuments of art—has already been successfully taken care of. The combined efforts of special committees on both sides of the Atlantic, working in close collaboration with the armed and air forces, have paved the way for the excellent first-aid task accomplished by the liberation armies in this field.

There remains however a no less vital problem: that of the actual recovery and restitution to their rightful owners of the mobile works of art of artistic as well as of economic value.

Reports from liberated areas daily give us more data on and names of masterpieces of art which have thus far disappeared from their original homes as a result of that "policy."

The first information received from Italy listed as missing 26 cases of Hellenistic and Roman sculpture, 281 paintings, 30 cases of smaller pictures. From Florence alone it was stated that nearly 500 paintings and sculptures are missing from the collections of the Uffizi, the Palazzo Pitti and of the Bargello, among them some of the world's greatest masterpieces.

From France, it was reported more recently that private collections have suffered more than national ones. But this, in no way, is less disastrous. It only shows how shrewd has been the Nazi art-looting policy and how systematically it has prepared for its postwar harvest. Works of art in national collections are on record. They can, therefore, not be put on the market as easily as those originating from private hands. Nations' rights to claim back the works taken from them are unquestionable, while the rights of private ownership can be controversial. It is significant that in order to escape any controversy in the future, the Hitler museum in his native town of Linz, Austria, has been made up exclusively of works of art coming from private hands, and does not contain any formerly belonging to national collections.

It should be borne in mind, on the other hand, that private collections, particularly in France, were very often as important and valuable as the national ones. The Rothschild collections alone were estimated, before the war, at several tens of millions of dollars.

### Staple Value

This shrewd Nazi art-looting policy had most definite purposes and long-range implications.

The Nazis were aware of their own currency's precariousness and of the necessity to secure for themselves, especially for the hour of their defeat, stable foreign currency and the greatest possible financial power abroad. Economic crises throughout the world made them equally alarmed about the instability of money values in general. They realized that, since the abandonment of the gold standard, works of art represent the most stable international value, and consequently, the safest investment.

In order to understand further what action is necessary to frustrate this Nazi plan, let us study each of its steps in detail:

1. The "securing" of works of art was executed with the assistance of the most adequate and helpful Nazi laws, from 1936

on in Germany itself and then all over occupied Europe. Jewish collections provided the first easy objectives. They were followed by the collections belonging to political enemies or, generally, to all persons and even nations conveniently labeled as unfriendly to the master race.

2. The "legal" protection of the loot was assured in many ways and represents a most significant aspect of the subject. The Nazis knew that abolition of their laws by the victorious allies would automatically deprive them of the right to their booty. No art collection or single work of art was seized, requisitioned or robbed by them without their "legalizing" these crimes by some sort of sale certificate or exchange paper duly signed by their victims through force. Moreover, during the Nazi temporary conquest of Europe, most of the looted works of art were made the object of a series of successive transactions designed to disguise their origins.

3. Examples of the successful transfer of looted works of art from Germany to neutral countries are innumerable. A masterpiece of Brueghel, recently listed among the missing paintings from the Napier Museum and placed into "safety" by the Nazis at Monte Cassino, has already reappeared on the Stockholm market. Others may have been placed in that large safety vault lately reported to have been built for the German Embassy in Lisbon. Others may be part of the private property of an important neutral industrialist in Latin America. It was recently disclosed that he lent his name to cover properties which were transferred to him by high Nazi officials.

### Means of Recovery

There is but one way to assure this and to assure simultaneously the recovery of the European art treasures.

1. Unanimous United Nations declaration of a general moratorium on all art transactions with a consequent immobilization of all art properties in the European countries (with the exception of Great Britain); this to be assisted by rigorous control of all border customs (our sole means of action against neutral countries which might not join in this declaration); no limits whatever of value or time to be placed on those measures.

2. All works of art which have remained in the same ownership since 1936 (when the Nazis started their art-looting policy) would automatically be eliminated from the above measure.

3. All owners of works of art who have been deprived of that ownership would be requested to provide descriptive lists of those works with proofs or affidavits of their ownership.

4. The resulting global list of works of art taken from their rightful owners, nations and individuals, would have to be officially published and given the widest possible circulation, in order to render worthless any pleas of ignorance of the terms of the law.

5. Owners of works of art thus officially listed, as having been looted, would be obliged to declare them, with the most severe penalties imposed on receivers of stolen goods.

6. Those objects would have to be confiscated and their recovery by their rightful owners assured.

7. For the small minority of cases in which the present owners of looted works of art would be able to prove their complete good faith in their acquisition, there would be no compensation or indemnity of any nature and they would have to

1. On 19 June 45, a letter on the same subject was submitted to G-5 Section, Hq XIX Corps, US Army, to be forwarded through channels. A copy of this submission is attached. As no reply has been received, this second request on the same subject is submitted.

2. It has been found out that GURLITT has sent to the Commerzbank, Tuerth, for my father, an amount of RM 20180.00 in June 1942, as socalled final settlement on the pictures entrusted to his care and for sale.

3. As this sale like all previous sales of these paintings have been made under duress (my father having been of Jewish faith, and forced to emigrate from Germany leaving his holdings behind), it is felt that the provisions of MG law No. 52 are applicable in this case.

3. For this reason, it is requested to impound the files of the gallery GURLITT, formerly of Kurfuerstenstrasse 78, BERLIN, now, with the person of Dr. WOLFGANG GURLITT at BAD AUSSEE or ALT-AUSSEE Austria, and to extract from these files, and by interrogation of said Dr. WOLFGANG GURLITT the names of the purchasers of my father's paintings as well as their whereabouts. It may be well to scrutinize Dr. GURLITT's own stock of paintings to find out whether or not he has held back some of my late father's paintings. It is further requested to block the accounts and property of said Dr. GURLITT, on the basis of the provisions of law 52, until further action can be taken for restitution to the rightful owners, represented by the undersigned.

4. Under duress, my father has been forced to give my permission for an auction held by the predecessor of the gallery GURLITT, the firm of RUDOLF LEPKE (manager Mr. Krueger), BERLIN, in 1938, at which occasion a large number of valueable paintings owned by my father changed hands. It is desirable to find out from Dr. GURLITT,

1. In accordance with request contained in 1st Indorsement to basic communication, an investigation has been conducted and the following facts, conclusions and recommendations are submitted for consideration and further action.

## 2. Facts.

a. Interrogations were made at Bad Aussee, Oberoesterreich, on 15-16 January 1946, by Lt. Frederic Hartt, field representative of the Monuments and Fine Arts Branch, G-5, USFA, of Wolfgang GURLITT, of Julie GURLITT, his divorced wife, of Kaethe GURLITT, his present wife, and of Lillie CHRISTIANSEN, his Danish assistant of Jewish racial background. Each subject was interrogated separately preventing possibility of communication or collusion.

b. The two Mrs. GURLITTS maintain never to have heard of Herr MORGENSTERN.

c. Wolfgang GURLITT maintained that he had never known Herr MORGENSTERN personally; that he often brought pictures from the firm Rudolf LEFKE, whose director and owner was Herr KREUGER, whose latest known address was Burgteupitz near Koenigswarthausen, Brandenburg; that he took over from Lepke's certain pictures belonging to Herr Morgenstern, which were left over after an auction in 1938 at Lepke's, not attended by Gurlitt, and at which the pictures sold reached only the minimum price set by Morgenstern; that he sold some of the pictures to smaller dealers, because of the minor quality and small financial value of the pictures, as the evaluation prices set by Morgenstern himself indicates; and that in 1942 at the written request of Morgenstern he deposited in the Bank of Fuerth the sum of 20,800 RM, representing the total of the minimum prices of the unsold pictures minus a discount of 33.3%, customary among German dealers when minimum prices have not been reached.

d. All the interrogated subjects stated that the air-raid on Berlin of 22 November 1943 destroyed the Galerie Gurlitt, its store-rooms, its exhibition rooms and Gurlitt's private house.

All records of sale were lost in the ensuing fire as well as these Morgenstern pictures still in the basement of the establishment. The firms to whom other pictures were consigned were also destroyed.

e. A signed account by Wolfgang Gurlitt of the entire transaction is attached as Appendix A.

f. A thorough examination of the Gurlitt house at Bad Aussee was made by Lt. Hartt and Mr. Robert Miller in the absence of Gurlitt and Frau Christiansen, and before they were aware of a coming investigation, and revealed only files subsequent to 1943. An examination of the numerous pictures in the house would have produced no results because no inventory of his alleged property was submitted by 2nd Lt. Morgenstern in basic letter.

g. All art objects and files in the house were impounded on 15 January 1946, but order removed 16 January 1946 after the interrogation of Gurlitt.

h. A folder containing accounts of all transactions between Jewish persons and the Galerie Gurlitt was impounded, a receipt given, and is appended herewith as Appendix B. This folder escaped destruction in 1945 because it was sent to Bad Aussee previously for fear of retaliatory measures which Nazi authorities might take.

### 3. Conclusions.

a. The difficulty of investigating the matters alleged in the basic communication was increased by the lack of clarity in the two letters and by the absence of a list of the paintings claimed.

b. It is the considered opinion of the technically competent Monuments and Fine Arts officers making the investigation that the Morgenstern pictures which came into the hands of Gurlitt as represented in List 1 in the attached Appendix B, were of slight aesthetic or financial value. Most of them are pictures which would have brought extremely low prices at any sale. Doubt is therefore cast on the authenticity of the pictures bearing famous names and mentioned in paragraph 4 of Lt. Morgenstern's letter of 19 June 1945, particularly the GOYA and the DUERER. All the authentic Duerer Self-Portraits are well known and listed, and the Morgenstern picture does not appear among them.

c. The closely corresponding statement of the interrogated persons, none of whom could have had any communication with each other during the interrogation and to whom the investigation

came as a complete surprise, is believed to be an indication of the truth of those statements not open to objective proof. It must however be stated that the bulk of Herr Gurlitt's statements could not be checked under the present circumstances.

d. The non-Nazi character of Herr Gurlitt's cultural activities is attested by several of his art publications, examined by the MFA officer investigating, and are of a type vigorously condemned and extirpated by the Nazis.

e. Although a Reichsdeutscher, Herr Gurlitt has been permitted by Military Government to remain in Austria until 1 May 1946, as he was appointed to the direction of the Kulturanstalt in Bad Aussee by Nationalrat Albert Gaiswinkler, leader of the Socialist Party at Bad Aussee.

f. The transaction, as a dealing with a Jew exiled from Nazi Germany, would probably have exposed Herr Gurlitt to severe reprisals if discovered by Nazi officials.

g. The destruction of a large number of the paintings in the 22 November 1943 air-raid on Berlin meant that the entire transaction terminated in financial loss to Herr Gurlitt.

h. It is no longer possible to set a valuation on the destroyed pictures even if it were still possible to discover which of these paintings were actually destroyed. In any case restitution of any of the paintings taken over by Gurlitt is next to impossible, in the absence of the destroyed records of the Galerie Gurlitt.

i. The claims of Herr Gurlitt as to the date of the destruction of his four establishments in Berlin are susceptible of investigation in Berlin.

j. The paintings sold to Lepke's at the auction in 1938 are traceable only through Herr Krueger at the address mentioned above, or through associates of Herr Krueger.

k. It is not within the competence of the investigating officer to determine whether or not the transaction constituted duress as defined by MG law 52, mentioned in paragraph 2 of basic communication, dated 17 September 1945.

l. It is not believed that the findings of this investigation warrant the extreme step of blocking the accounts and property of Herr Gurlitt, as recommended in paragraph 3, basic communication.

#### 4. Recommendations.

a. That investigation be made at Headquarters, United States Forces, European Theater of:

(1) The folder of documents attached as Appendix B;

Herr Kommerzienrat Morgenstern aus Fuerth, ist mir persoenlich nicht bekannt, und habe ich ihn weder gesehen noch gesprochen. Der Kunsthaendler Herr K r u e g e r in Berlin, Schoenberger Ufer war Besitzer und Leiter des Kunstauktionshauses Rudolf L e p k e, Berlin, Potsdamerstr. Das Kunstauktionshaus wurde aufgeloeset, und das sehr schoene, fuer die besonderen Zwecke erbaute Gebaeude verkauft, und soweit ich unterrichtet bin vom Staat fuer die Sparkasse des Kreises Teltow uebernommen. Herr Krueger richtete sich ein kleines Buero in der obenerwaehnten Strasse ein. Da er in den neuen Raemen an Platzmangel litt, setzte er sich mit mir in Verbindung und fragte bei mir an, ob ich die Moeglichkeit haette eine groessere Anzahl Bilder und Kunstgegenstaende zum Verkauf zu uebernehmen, die er seinerseits nicht mehr unterbringen koenne. Er sagte mir, dass es sich u.A. um Bilder aus dem Besitz eines Kunden von ihm handele, des Kommerzienrates Morgenstern, und zwar um die Bilder, die auf einer Versteigerung, die er fuer den Genannten vor einiger Zeit vorgenommen hatte, unverkauft geblieben waren, da sie die Limiten auf der Versteigerung nicht erreichen konnten und aus diesem Grunde zurueckgingen. Er zeigte mir den Katalog der Versteigerung, der auch bebildert war, und aus dem hervorging, dass es sich um eine Sammlung von sehr geringer kuenstlerischer Bedeutung handelte, in der zum groessten Teil recht minderwertige Bilder von deutschen Kuenstlern des 19. Jahrhunderts enthalten waren, ferner Kopien nach Bildern alter Meister, und endlich eine Anzahl Bilder, die zwar den Namen grosser Meister trugen, deren Zuschreibungen aber in keiner Weise zutreffend waren. Da meine Galerie sich in erster Linie fuer Werke von Kuenstlern von Museumsrang einsetzte, kamen fast alle Bilder fuer mein Geschaeft fast ueberhaupt nicht in Betracht. Da ich aber Herrn Krueger gefaellig sein wollte, und er eine Raecumung seines fruheren Geschaeftlokals vornehmen musste, erklarte ich nicht mit der Uebernahme einverstanden. So gehoerte zu meinem Geschaeftsprinzip Bilder deren Qualitaet mir nicht ausagte, an kleinere, im Niveau bescheidenere Kollegen abzugeben, und dieselben dort kommissionsweise verkaufen zu lassen. So geschah es auch in diesem Falle. Um die Namen einiger dieser Kollegen, soweit sie mir noch im Gedachtnis sind, zu nennen, fuehre ich sie nachstehend auf:



meine Ausstellungsraume Berlin W, Luetzowplatz 27, und die Wohnung meiner Frau, Berlin W, Luetzowstr. 46 restlos vernichtet wurden. Die Zerstoeerung erfolgte bei dem ersten Flieger-Grossangriff auf den Westen Berlin's.

Zur Sache selbst ist weiter zu sagen, Kommerzienrat Morgenstern draengte auf restlosen Verkauf, beziehungsweise Gesamtuebernahme der Kollektion und bestand darauf, dass der Betrag, der vereinbart wurde, auf sein Konto bei einer Bank in Fuerth ueberwiesen wurde. Zu der damaligen Zeit war meine Mitarbeiterin Frau Lilly Christiansen nach Paris uebersiedelt, um den Verfolgungen der Nazi zu entgehen, und zwar aus rassischen Gruenden. Auf meine Veranlassung schrieb sie von Paris aus an Kommerzienrat Morgenstern, ob er nicht daran interessiert waere, den ihm zustehenden Betrag auf ein auslaendisches Konto zu bekommen, da wir damals die Moeglichkeit hatten, die Bezahlung von Paris aus vorzunehmen. In einem Schreiben an Frau Christiansen, wies Kommerzienrat Morgenstern die Einmischung von Dritten zurueck und schrieb, dass er nur mit Herrn Gurlitt zu tun haben wollte, die Bezahlung m u e s s e an das angegebene Konto in Fuerth erfolgen. Dieses Schreiben erregte bei uns grosse Bestueerzung, da wir befuerchteten, dass Kommerzienrat M. in diesem Sinne vielleicht auch nach Berlin schreiben koennte, was die schwerwiegendsten Folgen von Seiten der Nazibehoerde nach sich haette ziehen koennen. Odergemasse erfolgte die Bezahlung daher nach Fuerth, der richtige Eingang des Betrages muss bei der dortigen Bank festzustellen sein.

Von einem Bild von Duerer habe ich nie etwas gehoert, kann mir auch nicht vorstellen, dass ein solches bei der Auktion bei Lepke gewesen ist, der Auktion selbst habe ich nicht beigewohnt und habe das Material auch nicht in der Vorbesichtigung gesehen. Ein Kunstkenner kann Kommerzienrat M. nicht gewesen sein, was daraus hervorgeht, dass die meisten Bilder minderer Qualitaet und zum Teil auch falsch waren, wie zum Beispiel auch der sogenannte Goya.

Zusammenfassend moechte ich nochmal feststellen, wie dies ja auch aus den Taxpreisen hervorgeht, dass das Gesamtobject der Sammlung recht wertlos und uninteressant war. Ein direkter Verkauf von meiner Gallerie wurde daher auch nur von ganz wenig Objekten votgenommen, eines davon war das Bild von Kaulbach, dass die Kunsthandlung Combe, Berlin, Unter den Linden erwarb, aber auch dieses Bild war kein Museumsbild, was auch daraus hervorgeht, dass auch diese Kunsthandlung, eine sogenannte "Fremdenkunsthandlung", war. Von Lenbach waren, wie ich inzwischen festgestellt habe, zwei Bilder vorhanden und zwar das Portraet eines Malers, eine Faelschung, ein kleines Bismarck-Portraet, Gelskizze, die meiner Erinnerung nach an ein Fraeulein von Ganz, aus der bekannten Familie Ganz in Frankfurt/Main, die Kunsthaendlerin war, verkauft wurde. Allerdings handelte es sich hier um ein echtes Werk, das meines Wissens in der Thomabibliographie von Thode (Deutsche Verlagsanstalt, Stuttgart) abgebildet ist. Dort koennte es festgestellt werden, ich selbst besitze den Band leider nicht mehr, da er mit meiner gesamten kunstgeschichtlichen Bibliothek, die ueber 1600 Baende umfasste, in Berlin an dem obengenannten Tage der Vernichtung anheimfiel. 57

Zu meiner geschaeftlichen Taetigkeit moechte ich noch bemerken, dass ich selbst weniger Kunsthaendler als Aussteller und Veranstalter von Kunstausstellungen und Kunstfachverstaendiger bin, vor allem fuer die Kunst des 19. Jahrhunderts, und dass ich auf diesem Gebiet als besonderer Kenner gelte. Bis zum Jahre 1933 ist meine Galerie und mein Verlag fuehrend gewesen, von dieser Zeit ab habe ich die Ausstellungen fast soentlich eingestellt, da die Tendenz und Richtung meines Unternehmens unerwuenscht war. Ich moechte noch darauf hinweisen, dass von Seiten des Propagandaministeriums ein Verbot bestand, ueber mich in den Zeitungen zu schreiben, dass fast meine soentlichen Verlagspublikationen verboten, und von den Nazi's auf die schwarze Liste gesetzt wurden. Obgleich ich kein direktes Arbeitsverbot hatte, habe ich verlegerisch seit 1933 so gut wie nichts mehr herausgebracht. Nicht unerwaehnt moechte ich lassen, dass ich neben einem Buchverlag auch den groessten Verlag fuer moderne Graphik hatte, der erste Verleger von Kokoschka, Pechstein, Cesar Klein, Lovis Corinth und sehr vieler juedischer Kuenstler gewesen bin. Unter meinen Verlagsabteilungen hatte ich als Sonderabteilung einen Verlag "Juedische Kunst und Kultur", eine Tatsache, die meine Einstellung wohl auch eindeutig darlegt. Ich moechte auch noch darauf hinweisen, dass ich in meinen Geschaeften ueberhaupt nur politisch oder rassisch Verfolgte Mitarbeiter beschaeftigt habe, dass ich trotz aller persoenlichen Gefahr diese und viele andere Menschen geschuetzt, verborgen, ihnen die Flucht ins Ausland ermoeglicht habe, was jederzeit nachweisbar ist. Noch in allerletzter Zeit vor Kriegsende habe ich einem Mischling, der von der Gestapo in Berlin verfolgt wurde von Bad Aussee aus ueber Strassburg zur Flucht in die Schweiz verholfen, was mir eine Vorladung zur Gestapo in Linz und ein Verfahren wegen Spionage einbrachte, dessen Auswirkung lediglich durch das Kriegsende verhindert wurde. Schon vorher war ich in Berlin Vorladungen und Nachforschungen durch die Gestapo ausgesetzt. Aus diesem Grunde war ich nach Vernichtung meines Geschaeftes und meiner Wohnung in Berlin dort nur noch zum Schein bei einem Bekannten gemeldet, waehrend ich mich tatsaechlich hier in Bad Aussee befand, wo ich lediglich eine Meldung als Kurgast vornahm. Dadurch ergab sich die Moeglichkeit, dass ich mich bei einsetzender Verfolgung rechtzeitig gewart, noch einer Verhaftung durch die Flucht hatte entziehen koennen.

Dass ich soentliche Angaben wahrheitsgetreu und nach besten Wissen und Gewissen gemacht habe, bestaetige ich durch meine Unterschrift.


Last September your brother, Lt. Werner H. Morgenstern, came to this office and left with us a letter concerning the pictures of your father's collection which were sold under duress to the Gurlitt Gallery in Berlin. As Dr. Wolfgang Gurlitt is at Bad Aussee, the letter was forwarded to the United States Forces in Austria for investigation.

It has now been answered with a long account of the interrogation of Dr. Gurlitt and his associates. The principal fact that appears is that the Gurlitt Gallery, its store rooms, exhibition rooms and records were totally destroyed in an air-raid on Berlin on 22 November 1944. Thus the only pictures that might possibly be identified as formerly your father's property would be those which had been sold by the Gurlitt Gallery before this date.

I learnt today with regret that your brother was fatally injured in an accident last October. Your mother and yourself are thus, according to your brother's letter, your father's heirs. As your pictures were obtained from him in Germany, they fall under the class of "internal loot"; procedures for the return of this type of material to its rightful owners, whether now resident in Germany or elsewhere, have not yet been established, as the vast quantities of "external loot" now being returned to the governments of the Nazi-occupied countries have absorbed the energies of the available American personnel.

I recommend that you and your mother do not submit your claim until after 1 June when it is hoped that a procedure for handling internal restitution, probably through the German courts, will have been set up. Your enquiry should then be addressed to Office of Military Government for Germany (U.S.).
