Safehaven ReportSubject: SPOERL, Pablo - The Seminary at San José.

In Safehaven report No. 6, April 26, 1945, from this Embassy, the belief was expressed that the German Paulist priests of the "Seminario" at San José probably were serving for the concealment of German assets in Costa Rica.

Examination of personal documents of Germans which were in the former German Legation safe and were recently delivered by the Spanish Legation to the Costa Rican government, revealed that on December 17, 1942, Pablo SPOERL (P.L.), a German who was deported from Costa Rica on January 19, 1943, delivered to father KESSELHEIM of the Seminary, a safe, containing the following:

- 164 piece set of table silver
- 5 piece silver coffee set
- U. S. dollar bills, \$126.00
- Costa Rican Colones bills, ₡7,400.00
- Box containing following jewelry:
  - Gold ring, small diamond
  - Gold ring, 1.24 carat diamond
  - Gold ring, 1.10 carat diamond
  - Gold ring, 1.00 carat diamond
  - Heavy gold bracelet
  - Light gold bracelet
  - Two gold rings
  - Mexican silver platter.

Photostat of receipt signed by father KESSELHEIM for safe is attached. It constitutes positive evidence that the Seminary has been and is being used for the concealment of enemy assets.

Re: Treasure removals from German Embassy

I am attaching copy of Ministry of Foreign Affairs Note Verbale 177 of June 4 responding to our Aide Memoire of May 22 on above subject.

You will note that the five persons named in our aide Memoire of May 16 (KLEYENSTUEBER, FRANZBACH, ROHRSCHEIDT, KEICKEBUSCH, and OBERMULLER) plus two (MAINZER and KUHLMUTH) but not the other six (PFAU, FURCH, GENSROWSKI, KREMLER, CALARIS, and GISELE QUITAU) named in our aide Memoire of May 22, have been "interrogated" with the results as covered in Navasques letter of June 2 to Ackerman (sent you with my memo of June 5), to which the Ministry's present Note Verbale makes oblique reference in the last paragraph.

Limiting ourselves only to the 7 persons "interrogated" by Seguridad, your informants indicated that these 7 held the following in total, with which I contrast Navasques' report:

I would appreciate your comment on the foregoing. I assume that it is also still worth going after the six persons not yet interrogated by Seguridad. I have informed you orally re action being taken on the deposit with a Foreign Office official. Incidentally, do your sources know anything of the amounts which Dr. Schone and Holm mentioned in the Ministry's Note Verbale, should have received?

JOINT MEMORANDUM

MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS

The American and British Embassies desire to invite the attention of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to the immediate need for a census of German assets and for an examination of transactions of German nationals. These are indispensable measures if the principles of Bretton Woods Resolution No. VI, which were accented by the Spanish Government by the Decree Law of May 5, 1945, are to be a reality. Knowing that the defeat of their country was imminent for some months before it finally occurred, German nationals resident in Spain were forewarned that a decree blocking their accounts was a probability. Moreover, it is known that in March 1945 the German Embassy itself was directing the placing of all German resources outside of the reach of whatever measures the Spanish government might adopt as a consequence of Germany's defeat. On March 19, 1945, the German Consul in Bilbao told the German colony of Vizcaya to withdraw their funds and valuables from the Spanish banks and use whatever other means might prove most efficacious in evading the anticipated Spanish legislation blocking German funds. About March 22, 1945, the German Consulate in Valencia began to supervise the withdrawal of German funds from public institutions and the hiding of such funds. During the same month a series of meetings of German business men were held in Malaga to arrange for the systematic dispersal of German assets. As a result of the instruction and guidance of the German officials, German citizens and firms withdrew their funds from banks and transferred their property to Spanish nationals or Spanish firms, in the hope that

that any Spanish law designed to freeze their assets might be circumvented. It is well known that German nationals have been relatively free from the effects of the Decree under reference and that only a small proportion of the real German assets in Spain have so far been subject to blocking since they have been hidden under Spanish cloaks.

It is of the utmost interest and importance that a full account be obtained of the assets held by German individuals and companies. An examination of the sales of property, assets, and other transfers by German nationals to Spanish nationals appears essential to the realization of the principles adopted by the Spanish government in the Decree of May 5. In addition, looted property, the results of spoliation, can only be located by a thorough review of transactions since the beginning of the European War and a census of the assets of German nationals.

The American and British Embassies are receiving an increasing number of reports regarding the steps taken by Germans, under the direction of the German government, to evade the Spanish law and the rights of the Allied governments incident to the surrender of the German government. The American and British Embassies, therefore, would bear with satisfaction that the Spanish Government has further implemented its adherence to the Bretton Woods Resolution No. VI by the adoption of the census and review of transfers made by German nationals as requested by the American Embassy's note no. 207 of May 1, 1945, and the British Embassy's note of April 30, 1945.

It is noted that page 1910 of the BOLETIN OFICIAL DEL ESTADO No. 153 of June 2, 1945, carries a notice that Siemens Industria Electrica S.A. has declared a stock dividend. In their Joint Memorandum No. 3 of May 10, 1945, the American and British Embassies specifically requested that since this company is known to be German controlled its assets should be effectively blocked. The Embassies assume that the Spanish Government has taken measures to insure that the dividends of the Siemens Company are fully blocked so that there can be no dissipation of assets of the company.

SAFESHAVEN REPORT

Hans Bernhard Rohrbach  
 Belgian Diamond case  
 Embassy's Note no. 746, Jun 15, 1945 to  
 Ministry of Foreign Affairs

Please refer to Embassy's telegram to the Department no. 2172 dated July 14, 1944 and previous correspondence pertaining to Hans Bernhard Rohrbach who was arrested by the Portuguese authorities for endeavoring to violate customs laws by transporting looted Belgian diamonds weighing 555 carats into Portugal.

Some time ago the Belgian Legation instituted proceedings to recover the looted Belgian diamonds. In instituting the case the Belgian Legation relied upon Portuguese Decree-law no. 34,455 (see Embassy's despatch no. 1649, March 20, 1945). The routine legal proceedings have not been encouraging, chiefly because the Court has not taken into consideration the spirit behind subsequent legislation, namely Decree-law no. 34,600 (see Embassy's despatch no. 188 dated May 17, 1945).

The looted diamonds are being held by the Portuguese authorities as collateral against the fines and penalties assessed in the Rohrbach case. According to indications the Court may rule that the diamonds must be sold at public auction in order to liquidate the Government's claim. However, it is noted that the Portuguese authorities are unable for some time now to consider the case in the light of decree-law 34,600 and immobilize the diamonds until the rightful owner or the Belgian Consul, representing the owner, can file an appropriate claim. Having in mind that even though the fines and penalties are considerably more than the current market value of the collateral, namely the looted Belgian diamonds, and because it would be possible that a Court order may be issued requiring that the diamonds be auctioned or sold to the highest bidder, thereby vesting a ownership title which according to Decree-law 34,455 could not be disputed, Messrs. Hanley and Kauper recommended to the First Secretary of the Belgian Legation, Mr. Andre Bosset, that the Belgian Legation inform the Ministry of Foreign Affairs immediately of the apparent inconsistency between the solution being formulated by the Court and the spirit behind Decree-Law 34,600. Following the above suggestion, the Belgian Legation presented its note no. 3707 to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on June 19, 1945 (a translation from French, cf 3707 is enclosed as enclosure no. 1).

In substance the Belgian Legation's Note no. 3707 rejects the Portuguese Government to give full force to certain features of Decree-law 34,600 in reaching a decision in the matter entitled "Case of the Rohrbach Diamonds".

The following quotation is an excerpt from the translation of Note no. 3707 which quite clearly sets forth the arguments presented by the Belgian Legation:

"Therefore, the Belgian Legation would be very grateful to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Portuguese Republic for any measures that might be taken or direct intervention with the authorities of the Lisbon Customs, in the sense that the provisions of Article One of Decree-law No. 34,600 be observed until the case as a whole shall have become the object of a final judicial settlement."

The recurring intervention in this connection of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Portuguese Republic, following the new facts which have occurred in the Rohrbach case, is in fact fully justified in the face of the flagrant contradiction appearing between a legal provision, whose essence is that of an international diplomatic act, and the thwarting of that precise nature which, as the result of lack of precision in the text or of an error of interpretation, occurs with the first case of the practical application of the new decree in question."

In keeping with the Department's previous S.M.E.W.N. instructions to the missions to cooperate fully with the United Nations representatives on S.M.E.W.N. matters, the Embassy considered it appropriate to support the Belgian Note no. 3707 and on June 26, 1945 the Embassy presented Note no. 146 to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs "...urging that immediate measures be adopted under the existing laws to immobilize the property referred to in the above mentioned Note, until the claim of the rightful owner is recognized".

As a matter of additional information the British Embassy has also intervened on behalf of the Belgian Legation. Mr. F. G. Luntz, First Commercial Secretary of the British Embassy, approached an official of the Portuguese Government, informally, urging that the case be reconsidered in the light of the arguments set forth in the Belgian Legation's Note.

The submission of this despatch is not being postponed until a final decision has been reached by the Portuguese Government because there is no basis for judging how prompt final action is to be taken, even though there is reason to believe that a favorable recommendation has already been made to the appropriate Portuguese officials by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The Embassy will follow the action taken in this case and report further developments.

NOTE - L. MC ANDUM

On May 16, last, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Portuguese Republic, defining verbally the present position in respect of the "case of the Rohrbach diamonds", pointed out to the Belgian Legation that the promulgation by the Portuguese Government of Decrees-law Nos. 34,455 and 34,600, furnished to the Belgian authorities the legal means to continue their action for the re-torition of the said diamonds, which had been begun some months before through diplomatic channels.

The Legation therefore instructed the Belgian Consulate in Lisbon to start proceedings of "embargo of a third party" before the Fiscal Court, for the purpose of avoiding that the diamonds seized on the person of Hans Bernhard Rohrbach be sold at auction. The proceedings were begun on the basis both of the provisions of Decree-law No. 34,455 and of those of Decree-law No. 34,600.

The Fiscal Judge, after having declared that he was competent, rejected the request of the Belgian Consulate to which he denies the powers of administrator of affairs which had been set forth in Decree-law No. 34,455, while furthermore supporting his decision by arguments which, - if the jurisprudence which he establishes were to be followed - would defeat the purpose which was precisely that of the legislators when they promulgated the decree-law in question. For example, it must be pointed out that the Judge demands the certainty of identification of the owners of the diamonds. If this point of view were to be adopted, it would be evident that the provision giving special powers of administration to the Consuls of countries occupied or which have been occupied by an enemy Power, would be purposeless, since the ruling laid down by the Fiscal Judge would result in insisting on the legitimate owners defending the case themselves or by special proxy. Now, it is clear that the purpose of the Portuguese law is precisely to safeguard interests which, by reason of the circumstances of the war, might be endangered owing to the fact that the legitimate owners are not in a position to defend their rights.

Following the trend of his arguments, the Judge even reaches a point where he declares that proof has not been shown that the Belgian Consulate is really a third-party in the Rohrbach case, inasmuch as the lack of identity of the true owners of the diamonds permits some doubt as to the possibility of an understanding between the Belgian Consulate and Rohrbach himself (!!!?).

Therefore, in the face of such an interpretation, the Belgian Legation believes it indispensable, - so that the spirit which animated the promulgation of Decree-law No. 34,455 may not be regrettably deformed and its application thwarted

thwarted, that the text of the decree in question be clarified, especially as regards the powers given by it to the Consulates of occupied or formerly occupied countries.

Having turned down the "embargo of a third party", the Judge barred the sale of the diamonds. An appeal was immediately entered against that decision. Now, article one of Decree-Law No. 24,600 declares to be inalienable, under any pretext whatever, not transmissible as long as the respective cases shall not have become matters on which final sentence has been passed, the personal property which is precisely in the circumstances of the diamonds seized on the person of Hans Bernhard Rohrbach. Owing to the intervening appeal, no final judgment has been rendered in the case and the diamonds in question must temporarily remain inalienable and intransmissible.

Therefore, the Belgian Legation would be very grateful to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Portuguese Republic for any measure that might be taken of direct intervention with the authorities of the Lisbon Customs, in the sense that the provisions of Article One of Decree-Law No. 24,600 be observed until the case as a whole shall have become the object of a final judicial settlement.

The recurring intervention in this connection of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Portuguese Republic, following the new facts which have occurred in the Rohrbach case, is in fact fully justified in the face of the flagrant contradiction existing between a legal provision, whose essence is that of an international diplomatic act, and the starting of that precise nature which, as the result of lack of precision in the text or of an error of interpretation, occurs with the first case of the practical application of the new decree in question.

For all useful purposes and as documentary evidence, the Belgian Legation is enclosing herewith a copy of the sentence rendered by the Judge of the Pro Fiscal Board of Hearings, as well as some juridical considerations inspired by that judgment.\*

The Embassy of the United States of America presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and has the honor to refer to a Note no. 3707 file 63-4 dated June 19, 1945 which was presented by the Legation of Belgium concerning a quantity of diamonds known to have been looted from Belgian territory and which are now in possession of the Portuguese custom authorities by virtue of an act of confiscation at the time these diamonds were illegally imported into Portugal.

Pursuant to the principles established in Resolution VI of the Bretton Woods Conference of June, 1944, to which the Portuguese Government has expressed adherence by official act, and cognizant of a desire on the part of the Portuguese Government to prevent the disposition and/or commitment of looted property within its territory, the Embassy of the United States of America joins with the Legation of Belgium in respectfully urging that immediate measures be adopted under the existing laws to immobilize the property referred to in the above-mentioned Note, until the claim of the rightful owner is recognized.

The urgency of this matter is based on the fact that a public sale is understood to be contemplated for the purpose of satisfying certain claims and fines, which, if permitted to be consummated, will render more difficult and complicated the restoration proceedings of the rightful owners.

NOTICE TO ALL CREDITORS

The opinion seems to prevail among the public that the property in Switzerland of German citizens who have been expelled has been sequestered and is now being administered by the Swiss Clearing Office in Zurich. This is not the case. Such property still belongs to the persons affected by the expulsion orders and the Swiss Clearing Office cannot make use of it in any way. According to the decrees of the Swiss Federal Council of 10th February and 27th April 1945 concerning the provisional regulation of payments traffic between Switzerland and Germany, such property is blocked.

Persons domiciled in Switzerland who are creditors of expelled German citizens may assert their claims in the usual way and take such legal measures as they think appropriate. These claims need not be reported to the Swiss Clearing Office.

The disposal of property of exiled German citizens, especially the sale or a part of certain property, the liquidation or sale of business concerns, the reduction of business participations, the sale of real estate, etcetera, require, with the exception of the cases mentioned in article 5/2 of the above mentioned decree of the Federal Council, previous authorization of the Swiss Clearing Office.

Subject: Disposal of German Loot in South and Central America; Diamonds Recently Offered For Sale in Port-au-Prince

The Honorable

Sir:

I have the honor to refer to the question of the disposal of German loot in South and Central American countries and in view of the Department's interest in this question (Embassy's despatch no. 672 of March 29, 1945 relative to the Safe Haven Project), it is reported that it has come to the Embassy's attention that a quantity of diamonds has recently been offered for sale in Port-au-Prince. The Embassy's source of information is one of Haiti's richest and most prominent businessmen, and a person who might logically be considered as a likely purchaser. He was, however, not only uninterested in buying but suspicious of the stones' origin, and believing the matter might be of some interest to the Embassy, immediately informed it of the matter. It appears that the diamonds were offered to him by a Mr. Guillermo Giannattesi, who after displaying a considerable number of stones, both set and unset, ranging up to perhaps three carats, remarked that if they were unsatisfactory, he had many more in his baggage at his hotel.

The Embassy, believing the matter worthy of investigation, at once brought it to the attention of the Civil Attaché, a copy of whose memorandum is attached herewith.

Re: Guillermo Giannattesi

In connection with our previous conversation with reference to the suspected manipulations of his funds on the part of the above-captioned individual, by introducing illegally for sale diamonds and precious stones into certain Latin American countries, the following date is set forth for your information:

Immigration records reflect that Guillermo Giannattesi arrived at Port-au-Prince, Haiti, proceeding from Ciudad Trujillo, Dominican Republic via Pan American Airways on May 4, 1945. Therein it was recorded that he was born March 16, 1915, at Leon, Nicaragua; that he came to Haiti for purposes of commerce; that he had no previous acquaintances in Haiti; that he expected to remain fifteen days at the Splendid hotel; and that he expected to continue his travel to Cuba and Mexico.

He was in possession of Nicaraguan passport No. 308, issued February 2, 1945, by the Prefect of Police at Leon, Nicaragua, and obtained a Haitian visa on April 25, 1945, at Ciudad Trujillo, Dominican Republic. Upon his entry into Haiti he declared himself to be in possession of U.S. \$25.00 currency and U.S. 400.00 in travel checks.

Information reported to you and relayed by you to this office was to the effect that Giannattesi had approached Mr. \_\_\_, at which time he offered for sale diamonds ranging in size up to approximately three carats, set and unset, which he carried in a zipper wallet upon his person. Giannattesi reportedly made the statement to Mr. \_\_\_ that if the latter did not encounter diamonds to his liking in the collection he should call on him at the Hotel Sans Souci where he had "many more". As you advised, Mr. \_\_\_ stated that he did not make any purchases from Giannattesi, but was unable to state whether Mr. \_\_\_, partner of Mr. \_\_\_, had made purchases.

Investigation revealed that Giannattesi registered at the Hotel Sans Souci on May 4, 1945. Speaking only Spanish, he obtained the services as translator of one Johnson, Haitian masseur, to aid in making his contacts about Port-au-Prince. This apparently was subsequent to his approaching Mr. \_\_\_ in regard to the sale of diamonds. The ostensible business of Giannattesi was to sell dark colored sunglasses of Canadian manufacture, the trade-mark of which is unknown.

unknown. Johnson heard of, or saw, no indications that Giannattesi was attempting to sell diamonds.

According to Johnson, Giannattesi contacted Mr. \_\_\_\_\_, Rue de \_\_\_\_\_, (partner of Mr. \_\_\_\_\_). The two went to the National Bank of the Republic of Haiti, where the subject withdrew money from that bank which he subsequently deposited in the Royal Bank of Canada. As yet, the exact nature of this transaction has not been ascertained. Giannattesi next proceeded to the office of Dr. C. V. Villedrouin, Rue Capois, to have an examination of his eye, having some sort of inflammation. He made inquiries concerning the Guatemalan Legation which is non-existent in Haiti. Thereupon he proceeded to the Venezuelan Legation, presumably to obtain a visa. After calling at the representatives of the Dutch Steamship Lines, C. F. Madsen & Company, to ascertain whether it was possible to obtain passage by boat, he proceeded to Martijn & Company in connection with obtaining a ticket on the KLM Airlines.

On May 8, 1945, upon learning that Giannattesi contemplated departing Port-Su-Prince en route to Curacao, D.W.I., arrangements were made to effect an examination of his luggage, which failed to reveal any precious stones or anything of suspicious nature. Inquiries made of customs officials failed to reveal that Giannattesi had made any declaration concerning diamonds or precious stones upon his entry into Haiti. In as much as Giannattesi was in possession of an official passport, no search was made of his person.

By cable dated May 10, 1945, the Curacao office advised that Giannattesi arrived there May 8, 1945, without a landing permit. It was stated that his passport was stamped by the Dutch Consul in Haiti, Robert Stark, good for Curacao and Carecas, indicating improper procedure on the part of the Dutch Consul in Haiti. The police in that city were apprised of no suspected activities during his stay there until May 11, 1945, at which time he departed en route to Barranquilla, Colombia. No personal search of Giannattesi was made at Curacao.

Investigation is being continued at Colombia and upon the receipt of further information you will be advised thereof.

Sir:

That the Department may be kept currently informed of the subjects of memoranda submitted to the Spanish Government by the representatives of the British and American Embassies charged with the implementation of the Safehaven program, I have the honor to transmit herewith copies of the first five memoranda submitted thus far.

In consonance with the enabling act, Spanish banks and other entities have blocked the accounts and assets of the nationals of the countries which were occupied by the Axis, as well as of Axis nationals. The nationals of friendly countries have protested strongly to the representatives of their governments but the latter are without instructions from their home offices as to the procedure they should follow.

In the early conferences between the American and British representatives on the one side and representatives of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on the other, efforts were made to find a formula to unblock, at the earliest possible moment, the accounts of worthy concerns and nationals of the allied countries. As a first move the Spanish Government agreed to issue an order of public interest, unblocking the accounts of the Embassies, Consulates and career personnel of countries with which Spain has diplomatic relations. This excludes Czechoslovakia, Yugoslavia, Russia and Poland of the allied countries which had been occupied by the Axis, as they have not been formally recognized by the Spanish Government. As the accounts of the representatives of the latter cannot be treated as of public interest, they must be licensed and procedure for such licensing is now under discussion.

The Spanish authorities refused the request of the British and American Embassies that accounts and assets of nationals and corporations of the allied nations be unblocked upon the mere request of the diplomatic or consular representatives of such countries. This proposal was submitted by the British and American Embassies at the request of the French who claim that some 7/8,000 French accounts are now blocked and that the delay incidental to individual licensing will seriously impair the normal functioning of French business. The Spanish authorities insisted that all nationals of countries occupied must submit individual applications, but finally agreed that immediate favorable action would be taken on those applications supported by the British and American Embassies. This matter is still under discussion with the Spanish Government and with representatives of the various allied governments.

The representative of the Foreign Office agreed to consult with his advisers on the desirability of ordering the immediate unblocking of all accounts of and assets of allied nationals of less than 50,000 pesetas or to the extent of that figure on accounts which may be larger than 50,000 pesetas. The Spanish representative also proposed, and the British and American representatives agreed, to grant blanket authority for the withdrawal of living allowances by all nationals not to exceed 5,000 pesetas per month. These two proposals have been submitted for approval to the interdepartmental committee.

In the several meetings held with representatives of the Allied Governments, including the French, and in separate meetings held with the French, the latter have informed the British and American representatives that instructions have been received from Paris to associate themselves with the British and American Governments. However Paris considers that only the French Government should be informed of the data which the Spanish Government may develop concerning French assets and that the freezing should not extend to the list of persons and entities which will be submitted to the competent Spanish authorities. Furthermore, Paris desires that the sentence in Article 2 of the Embassy's note, "Any such arrangements shall provide for submission to the Government of the United States of full information on all licenses so issued", be changed to read, "Any such arrangements shall provide for the submission to the Government of the United States, Great Britain, and the allied country concerned". As this request was transmitted by the American Embassy in Paris to Washington, this Embassy is awaiting the Department's further instructions.

The French economic representatives have criticised the Spanish freezing decree and orders on the grounds a) that they were not consulted as to the text of the Spanish freezing decree before it was issued, b) that the legislation fails to

distinguish between the nationals of occupied countries and those of the Axis, c) that the decree fails to set forth clearly its objectives, hence makes no provision for exceptional treatment to be accorded to France or other of the Allies whose countries were overrun by the Axis, d) that the provisions of the Ministerial Order requiring Spaniards to make declaration of the foreign interests associated with them establishes a procedure which might be very prejudicial to French interests as it may disclose relationships which the French do not wish to have uncovered.

In an effort to meet French wishes, the British and American representatives have urged the Spanish representative either to exempt from freezing or to grant blanket unfreezing licenses to the concerns whose names may be submitted by the appropriate representatives of governments of the Axis occupied countries provided such lists also have the approval of the British and American Embassies. The Spanish representatives claim that the freezing decree which embodies the requests of the British and American Embassies, does not admit of administrative modifications or exemptions, although under the licensing authority granted to the Minister of Foreign Affairs, procedural acts may be taken which may facilitate the early licensing of determined concerns.

Modifications in procedure for the handling of these blocked assets are being given consideration by the Spaniards. The interministerial commission set up is to pass on juridical and policy questions; the mechanics are to be handled by a special office created for the purpose in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to which there will be attached experts from the various other ministries. Contacts will be maintained with the British and American Embassies through the Director of Economic Policy and the senior economic officers of the two Embassies; through the Chief of the Spanish Service with the head of the Axis Affairs special unit in the British (Mr. Milton) and American (Mr. Horwin) Embassies, and the Foreign Office experts with the experts of the two Embassies specializing on certain aspects of the investigations. (For example, Mr. Blankenship on licensing, etc.) There will be no mixed commission in the sense that action depends upon agreement between the three countries; to the contrary, Spain considers that it cannot delegate to foreign countries the right to implement Spanish laws, but it will keep the British and American Governments informed of the result of current investigations, of the orders it proposes to issue and will seek by friendly discussion to meet the wishes of the British and American Governments to attain the objectives set forth in our notes.

1. In April 1945 important German funds were placed with the Zurich firm, Metallogen, A.G., 13 St. Peterstrasse. This firm does not appear on the Black List. Jean Wagner, 37 Böcklinstrasse, Zurich, may have been the intermediary in these transactions. He is reported to have been working for the German Secret Service, and is in touch with Countess Maria de Hallwyl\* who is actively engaged in traffic in German funds.

2. The following firms in France, officially Swiss but in reality German companies, have been sequestered by the French:

S.A. Metal et Lurgi, 17 Place des Etats-Unis, Paris  
 S.A. Hoesch (Iron and Steel), 44 Rue de la Boetie, Paris

3. Xaver Franz Schwarz, treasurer of the Nazi Party, is reported to have transferred 3,000,000 Swiss francs to Switzerland.

4. Omer Pizani \*\*, Greek, residing at the Hotel Balmoral (which he bought recently) in Lausanne is the owner of a company which sells dried fruits. The principal factory of this company is in Hamburg, Germany, where Pizani resided before the war. The company has offices in Zurich and operates in Germany, Turkey, Spain and Portugal, as well as in Switzerland. The company is managed by his nephews. It is reported that Pizani pays a tax of 900,000 Swiss francs a year. He owns a home in Paris at 24 Rue Berlioz, which was never requisitioned by the Germans during the occupation of France. Pizani is also reported to have close relations with British diplomatic personnel.

5. The German Staatsrat, Dr. Scheiber, through the intermediary of his representative, Herr Quast, has been selling his property in Austria to Swiss interests. The proceeds from the sales remain in Switzerland at the disposition of Dr. Scheiber.

\* Countess Hallwyl, who reportedly resides at 132 Klaushaschstrasse, Zurich, is also in touch with Ruschewey of Vaduz, Liechtenstein. She may be the same person who participated in the Banque Charles affair in Monaco as a depositor.

6. The Messerschmitt family has been living at the Eschungen Hotel\* in Arosa since February 1945. This family, together with a certain M. Rey, a dressmaker in Geneva, apparently served as intermediaries between the Gestapo and the families of certain deportees. It is reported that a certain Muri, agent of Rey, was negotiating for the release of a Frenchman, M. Baureteau (or Bourbeau) by the German authorities. One of the members of the Messerschmitt family married a Swiss girl, in whose name he has deposited an important sum in silver, jewels and stocks. The family also are believed to be in touch with Giuseppe Baretta, representative of the International Red Cross.

7. A German patent for a new wristwatch called "Marquise" has recently been filed in Switzerland, and is apparently being used for a large scale safehaven operation. The watches are manufactured for the account of M. Huiter at Val de Travers (Neuchatel). There is a "royalty" of 10 Swiss francs on each watch which is paid by the Swiss licensee to German accounts. The Germans who are behind this enterprise are attempting, apparently with some success, to export these watches to the United States and South America through the following intermediaries:

- a. The Geneva representative of the Spanish firm Cerna (fruit exports).
- b. Giuseppe Baretta, brother-in-law of Huiter. As representative of the International Red Cross, Baretta was engaged in arranging for the exchange of British and Italian prisoners-of-war through Turkey. He has been attempting to visit Lisbon where his real purpose is reported to be the export of these watches.

It is also reported that more than 10,000 "Marquise" watches have already been exported to the United States. Baretta is believed to be the link between the Swiss interests in this enterprise and the Germans, with whom he is in contact through the Messerschmitt family.

8. The following Swiss banks are reported to be camouflaging German capital:

9. Although the Schweizerische Gesellschaft für Metallwerke\*\* has close relations with the German electric company, Allgemeine Elektricitäts Gesellschaft (A.E.G.), its name does not appear on the Black List. The same is true of Schweizerische Gesellschaft für Elektrische Industrie, Basle, which is closely related to the Deutsche Diskontsgesellschaft.

Unofficial translation text proposed Swedish legislation "Concerning restoration of certain property removed from occupied countries" follows:

1. It is with the province of the Crown to decree that paragraphs 10 below shall be applicable to any state whose territory was occupied by belligerent after August 1, 1939.

2. Property, which contrary to international law has been subjected to confiscation or similar measures, either by the occupying power or on its behalf, or which has been seized, and/or which the occupying power must be considered responsible, or which has been confiscated from its rightful owner by force or by threat or comparable conditions by the occupying power, or by its military or civilian personnel, shall be restored, if found in Sweden, to those deprived thereof or to their legal successors, even though the person owning the property in Sweden acquired it in good faith. If the person from whom the property was seized received remuneration for such property, it may still be compensated with the stipulation that the maximum payment shall correspond to the value of the reparation at the time of receipt thereof.

The above does not apply to property which constituted performances of deliveries made to Sweden by the occupying power, or which was transferred in accordance with a commercial treaty made with the occupying power, or which on the basis of pledges or with regard to compensation and other conditions, could be considered part of a normal business transaction.

3. Application for the restoration of property referred to in paragraph 2 may be submitted to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or to other Government Departments so designated by the Crown.

The Department concerned will transmit the application to the board prescribed in paragraph 4 below, however the preparation of the case has proceeded to a point which can suitably be done.

4. Cases concerning the restoration of property defined above shall be examined by a special board consisting of three members, of whom at least two shall have been practising judges. The members and their deputies shall be appointed by the crown. The stipulations of common law with respect to voting on judgments shall apply to the decisions of the board. Expenditures of the board are to be paid from general funds.

For the prosecution of cases referred to the board, witnesses and experts may be heard in a court or court. The board and the parties concerned are to be summoned to such hearing by the court of its judge.

The decisions of the board are incontestable.

5. If on the basis of an application made in accordance with paragraph 3, the board finds justifiable reasons for applying the definitions of paragraph 2 to the property, the board is empowered to order the property impounded.

If the application is approved, the board shall order the immediate seizure of the property, in this has not yet taken place.

6. A person ordered by the board to relinquish property referred to under paragraph 2 is entitled, if he has acquired the property in good faith, to appropriate compensation from general funds with due regard to what he paid for the property, as well as to reimbursement for his expenditures in the case.

Claims for reimbursement shall be submitted to the board within 6 months after the board's final decision that the property be relinquished. The right to reimbursement may otherwise be forfeited. If a decision is handed down that the property shall be relinquished without compensation, the question may be referred for examination by a general court if no claimant for compensation so desires.

If one has accepted collateral such property as must be relinquished under this law, such person has priority over the owner in receiving compensation from the amount paid in compensation, even though the payment is not yet due. The same stipulation shall apply in the case of persons holding the property as collateral for claims due.

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The amount of compensation for distrained property shall be paid to no distrainer, if the creditor so demands. If such compensation is for property which according to the collection law (Utsökningsslagen, PP1006 FF in Swedish law 644-TR.) has been impounded or placed under injunction, the amount shall be transferred to the chief collector who will dispose of the amount in accordance with the stipulations governing such cases in paragraph 180 of said law (placed in bank account - TR.).

8. If compensation shall be paid according to the above, the crown shall deduct from the interim owner of the property expenses incurred by the crown if he interim owner did not acquire the property in good faith.

9. That which is stipulated by this law concerning the right of compensation in accordance with paragraph 6, or deduction from reimbursement in accordance with paragraph 8 shall not be valid if the person claiming good faith is ordered to relinquish the property without compensation according to the law applicable in determining the validity of his acquisition.

10. Tampering with property impounded under this law is subject to imprisonment or hard labor up to a maximum of 2 years. If the circumstances are especially extenuating, a fine may be imposed. Fine shall apply to the crown.

11. The crown shall issue such detailed regulations concerning impoundments as may be necessary under this law. It shall also publication of the law in Sweden.

This law shall become valid on the day of its date of issuance as part of Svensk Författningsläge (Swedish State Treaty Law) and shall remain in force until July 1, 1946. The stipulations of this law shall apply after its expiration date when decision concerning the obligation to relinquish property has been handed down during the laws period of validity as also in regard to compensation included in such a decision and in regard to such violations of law covered in the law which were committed during the period mentioned.

Annex 2: Report (undated) on trade, clearings and contracts between Germany and Portugal, and the peseta financing arrangement of Germany in Spain.

These two reports have been forwarded by the Economic Warfare Department, Foreign Office, to the British Embassy at Madrid with the comment that they appear to corroborate the fact that the Spanish Government has not yet turned over the full amount of German funds in its possession. The British Embassy at Madrid has been given permission to use these reports to attempt to obtain further German funds from the Spanish Government.

## SAFEHAVEN REPORT

Subject: Authorization of increase in monthly drawings and a plan for the disposal of automobiles by blocked persons.

In June the Director General of Economic Policy submitted to the American Commercial Attaché and the British Commercial Secretary drafts of two orders, viz (1) authorizing an increase in monthly drawings from 5,000 pesetas to 6,500 pesetas, to blocked persons and (2) a plan for the disposal by blocked persons of their automobiles.

The increase in the monthly drawing was designed to make provision for the income and other taxes so as to leave the net amount which could be drawn at 5,000 pesetas. That order also proposed special facilities as regards payments of rents, particularly for agricultural properties which fell due either quarterly, semi-annually or annually. As it is difficult to arrange for owners to draw monthly installments under existing orders, it was proposed to give facilities for drawing an accumulation of the funds to a total not exceeding 5,000 pesetas per month for the period covered by the payment contract. The Embassies' representatives objected to increasing the monthly peseta withdrawals on the grounds that these sums, even after deducting such taxes as may be payable, are adequate to maintain a reasonable standard of living; that the proposal afforded many loopholes for evasions. As regards accumulations Embassies expressed agreement subject to suitable safeguards being taken to prevent abuses.

The proposal regarding cars was obviously intended to facilitate the acquisition of such German owned vehicles by Spaniards. As it also contained many other objectionable features, we objected on the grounds that we could not permit realization by Germans of any private assets at this stage and suggested that this order be held in abeyance for the time being.

are advised that we now have a complete list of all accounts held by S.G.S. for 11 persons who are nationals and residents of countries which are of interest except Germany. While we have been advised that S.G.S. holds no balances for persons in Germany, this statement has been questioned on the basis of an admission that advances were made to a German resident of Switzerland out of funds due Mr. Siepmann, the former manager of the Hamburg Control Company which was formerly affiliated with S.G.S., and it is possible that an additional report will be submitted if additional information is obtained at a later date.

In SAFEHAVEN Report No. 4 it was stated that:

"...It is reliably reported that since 1941 S.G.S. also has acted in a banking or fiduciary capacity by holding funds representing profits realized by its Balkan customers on shipments of merchandise to neutrals and to enemy territory. The transactions which resulted in the accumulation of profits involved over invoicing consignees; shipment of the merchandise against payment in Switzerland in Swiss francs, and withholding by S.G.S. of the excess payments or balances..."

"It is stated that the aforementioned funds and other property are beneficially owned principally by Jewish persons who are nationals of and residents of the above-mentioned countries and who were endeavoring (1) to profit from black market operations in local currencies of the Balkan countries; (2) to move funds out of their home countries; or (3) to insure that the funds would be safe from confiscation by their local authorities".

During the present investigation, however, a question was raised as to whether or not the above statement also were true for balances held for persons who are nationals and also residents of France, Holland, and Denmark and in reply the following memorandum dated June 18, 1945 was received:

"The only countries for which we hold financial accounts are Romania and to a very limited extent Bulgaria. We have never transacted such business for people in other countries."

From the foregoing it would appear that our earlier remarks do not hold for nationals and residents of Hungary, Croatia, Moravia, Slovakia, France, Holland, and Denmark. This conclusion seems to be correct since at our request the Geneva Consulate discussed the memorandum of June 18, 1945, further with the S.G.S. and on July 2, 1945 advised in part as follows:

"The memorandum of June 18 from S.G.S. is correct. Of the French list all but the last two entries have been held since before the war. The last two were acquired from a bank in free exchange for the account of the persons mentioned. The Hungarian gold (as also the French gold) was deposited with the S.G.S. without its having any knowledge as to how it had been acquired."

For your further information, we are advised by the Geneva Consulate in their letter of July 2, 1945, that all dollar balances are deposited in blocked accounts except one of \$4200 held for Maurice Roise Rothman, Bucharest, which is in the form of currency.

With regard to the balances held in French francs, the following was reported in the Geneva Consulate's letter referred to above:

"There is only one case involving a balance in French bank notes (S.A.R. DE TRANSPORTURI M.G.M. on the Rumanian list involving 250,000 French francs) and these were declared to the French Consulate here by the S.G.S."

"Holdings shown on the French list should supposedly be declared by the owners. S.G.S. has no obligation to declare anything in these cases. It is not known for sure, but the presumption is that the French owners have not made any declarations in order to avoid taxation."

This information is reported to Washington and London for whatever further action may be desired.

We should like to request again that this information be regarded as extremely confidential and be so handled that it will not be disclosed to Swiss or other sources. The request is for the protection of our informants who appear to have been very cooperative.

## SALEM REPORT

**Subject:** Eight pictures allegedly owned by Georges Biar, 1055 Fifth Avenue, New York City.

There follows a copy of a letter dated July 3, 1945, from R. J. Sullivan, Commercial Counsellor, British Legation, Bern, to Marcel Vialot, Financial Attaché, French Embassy, Bern:

"I have been approached by a certain Pierre Biar of Geneva, who has requested us to issue an escort pass for the despatch to New York of the following 8 pictures:

- 1) CO. 01: reine, bateaux et paysage
- 2) CO. 01: nature
- 3) CO. 01: paysage en hauteur avec arbres
- 4) CO. 01: bouli toule
- 5) CO. 01: maison
- 6) CO. 01: paysage avec maison
- 7) CO. 01: nature morte
- 8) CO. 01: lavaises

"These pictures are said to have been sold before the war by Monsieur Ganovitch-Wyspa, Paris to Monsieur Georges Biar, formerly of Lausanne but now at 1055 Fifth Avenue, New York. The pictures were originally deposited in the name of Georges Biar in the Chasse Bank, rue Cambon, Paris.

"During the German occupation of Paris, Pierre Biar was able to arrange with a certain Marcel Arnault, rue des Ursulines 1, Paris to have the pictures transported to Lyon, where they were deposited in the Westminister Bank, rue de la République 57. The manager of the latter bank, Monsieur Léon Courret, forwarded the pictures to Geneva where they arrived in April 1942, the forwarding being made by François Guérin, 41 rue des Herbiers, Lyon and Nataniel Le Coultre, Giro 54, Geneva.

Letter dated: May 21, 1945.

"Our pictures: Cuvelier writes: the Van Dyck has been removed from Maison Monnier & Co., by the Commandatur and not the Gestapo, so suppose it was sent to Goering's collection, most likely the Lanvin 'Venus and Adonis' has followed suit. I know that Pradin had an offer for the picture from the buyer of Goering, he met the man at Major Langton's villa here. I of course refused to meet him. I have just been reading in the Continental Daily Mail of a discovery of most wonderful art treasures near Salzburg - Goering's collection and Rothschilds. I sent you the affidavit, you must please try and contact with the proper authorities. I know the Gestapo in Brussels had a lot of my pictures and various pieces of furniture and told a friend of theirs they were prepared to hand over the lot to the actual owner, this was in 1943, of course, old chap, they just wanted to get me back. Pradin saw their copies of letters I wrote to America early in 1939, mentioning Hitler and Mussolini as a pair of the worst gangsters etc. I am convinced if I could get back to Brussels and set about it in the right way I could trace Beeren-Kemp and some of the others."

The writer states that her husband is head of the Society of Protestant History, a library containing 60,000 volumes, and is also Dean of the Faculte de Theologie: they live behind the library.

She states: "...some S.S. came in the library and stole some manuscripts, which are in German. They pretended to find out the inheritance up to the 16th Century of our Huguenots who fled to Germany so as to revindicate all that when the victory was there...."

The following is a paragraph of a copy of a letter from Holland:

"Chabot's Fauwen: the Rembrandt picture on loan in the Rijksmuseum has been sold to Hitler although the 'Rembrandt Verz' (probably Verzekerings - Insurance) tried to save it. Ch. behaved miserably."

He was formerly German, is said to have been naturalized about six years ago but not his opinions, which are said to be most unpleasant. He is buying a great quantity of pictures (Nathan has just shown him the Lotto, but in vain) and he also seems to be buying a good many Impressionists which the Germans have stolen from Paris."

5. Submission No. EIR 42323/42. From: Paul Rosenberg, 16 East 57th Street, New York, to: Maitre Leon Gouy, 8 Rue de Rive, Geneva. Letter dated: October 23/42.

Writer confirms his letter of August 21 giving a list of the paintings, and names of the buyers, but he fears that all the receipts have been scattered in various parts of France as a result of the removal of his effects against his wishes.

Writer believes that the receipts for the "Portrait de Mme. Jeantaud avec deux chiens" by Degas, bought from Kelenian and "Jeune Fille sur un Fond Bleu" by Renoir bought from M. Javal and which a Mme. Le Doux (Castel-Floirac) still retains, have never reached addressee.

Writer is not surprised that addressee has received no reply from M. Le Gal who is in Brittany and Mlle. Roisneau, 3 Rue de l'Ischarie, Paris.

Writer then summarizes the list of paintings with their sellers, among which are canvases by Braque, Bonnard, Corot, Degas, Picasso, Renoir, etc.

Finally, writer states that he is prepared, if possible, to have various people in U.S.A. certify that these paintings were sold to addressee's "companies", but he advises addressee to oppose the sale of the works so as to allow enough time to prove addressee's ownership.

The information contained in submissions EON 72676/45 and 45519/45 has been passed on to the French authorities by MIRO.

Dear Parsons,

May I refer to your letter No. 74. By now you will have seen my telegram No. 55 in the Consul-General's series on the subject of the assets of the six German Insurance Companies. It has not, as you will realise, been easy to obtain anything like even an accurate estimate of these assets, but it may be useful if I were to indicate the way in which the figure of LT. 2,000,000 was made up. It is as follows:-

Cash, bonds, securities (including those belonging to the Victoria Insurance Co. which has been in liquidation since 1939)	" 175,000
	<u>LT 1,175,000</u>

My informant who is very reliable was inclined to think that his estimate of LT.75,000 for cash, bonds, etc. might perhaps be on the low side and that it might be put at the higher figure of LT.1,000,000. This would bring the total up to LT.2,000,000 as stated in my telegram under reference. Since I sent that telegram I have received from another and I think equally reliable source some more detailed information on the same subject, which puts the total estimate at a slightly higher figure, but you will see that this estimate includes the Danube Insurance Company, which is in liquidation and which I have never taken into account before and that it also includes the Victoria which has been in liquidation since 1929. On the other hand the figures for the six German companies, more strictly speaking, would be at a lower figure than the estimate mentioned in my telegram under reference and would be placed at about LT.1,500,000.

You may care to refer in this connexion to my letter to you E.W. 2436 of November 30th. On page 3 of that letter I described available assets under two headings. Under heading B I indicated the depot fixe which has to be made by each Company before taking part in marine or fire insurance. This sum amounts to a nominal figure of LT.550,000, but as you will see from the details which I am attaching to this letter the present-day value of buildings, for example, is much higher than this figure, and as you will realise some of the German Insurance Companies put their deposit into real estate rather than into assets.

The type of asset which I described under heading A in my letter of November 30th is indicated in some detail in the attached memorandum, and I need hardly go into it further. As you know, it has been the custom if not indeed the regulation that the German Insurance Companies in this country should set aside a certain percentage of their annual premium income, which in practice amounts to not more than 10 percent. This sum is turned into bonds, securities, or may be held as cash, but is placed to reserve to meet any contingencies and, according to my informant, cannot be spent without the agreement of the Government.

I might add that the Aachen and Muchener Company have had some very large claims against it and therefore its liquid assets have not been very considerable. On the other hand you will see that the Victoria Company, although it has not operated in this country for some time, has some very considerable assets which it has accumulated during the last, say, 15 years.

I am sending an extra copy of this letter and its enclosure to you so that you may pass it on to the Neutral Trade Department III as a statement of enemy assets - safehaven for the insurance companies, information which, as you will realise, the Ministry has not had before.

Report with regard to the Management of the Reichsbank

In the opinion of my predecessor in 1931 as first substitute of the head of the Reichsbank I submitted a collection of rare coins consisting of several gold coins and some gold coins which had been in the possession of gold during the First World War. There was reason to suspecting that there were additional coins of numismatic and historical value mixed with these considerable quantities of gold coins which were stored in the vaults of the bank for a long time. By pointing out that under the existing circumstances a large part of these coins on the basis of the fine gold content or the possibility of a melting by the Prussian mint probably would result in substantial loss for the Reichsbank, I succeeded in obtaining permission of the "Department of the Reichsbankauptkasse" (Plenipotentiary for Affairs of the Reichsbank board of Directors) to order the sorting of all amounts of gold and silver coin with regard to numismatic considerations. The result was a valuable collection of rare coins. Subsequently an arrangement was made that all gold and silver coin received by the bank at Berlin or by other Reichsbank branches must be examined by employees in Berlin especially chosen and trained for this purpose. The sorted coin were stored separately and exhibited in the so-called "Money-Museum" of the Reichsbank. The Museum thus started in a very small way soon won the whole-hearted support of the President and the Reichsbank board of Directors. During the following years quite a number of bigger and smaller collections of importance were purchased at the cost of considerable sums of money. Some of these collections may be mentioned: The excellent universal collection of the University Lecturer Mr. Göttingen, the Celtic-Germanic collection of Dr. Albert in Brandenburg, the collection of gold coins of Mr. Mellerhoff, Berlin, the greatest existing collection of Preussisch-Pfälzische coins of the late Count Lehndorff, Schleswig, the special collection of coins of Max of Mr. Ries etc. Furthermore all auctions of coins were visited and after a careful check of the catalogues gaps were filled by the purchase of missing coins. Besides this all coins of numismatic importance which were discovered by the sorting of the deliveries of gold coin to the Reichsbank, were added to the amounts of the "Minerum" and thus preserved.

The amount of the treasures having increased extensively by the generous help of the Reichsbank board of Directors were stored in vault compartments of the old Reichsbank building, which in consideration of the vaults then available in the new Reichsbank building were no longer needed for other purposes. The impressive display of coin, arranged with assistance of modern facilities and with regard to the geographical and historical development of coin was appraised by professional museum-experts and approved by the Director Historical State and its opinions find full detail made an interesting and instructive object upon examination. The reputation of the Money-Museum was soon established by the enthusiastic comment of visitors from all lands and abroad. Other authorities of the Reich, Ministry offices subordinate to the Ministry of Finance and of Economics, often consulted with competent officials of the Department of the Reichsbank for information on the subject. In such very many a chapter in the historical-numismatic domain could be presented and many an interesting coin could be produced for examination. Thanks to the efforts of the members of the present administration in the arrangement of the necessary university equipment and funds it is now possible to furnish appropriate apparatus for the students to practice in a theoretical and practical way their studies of the history of the ancient and medieval Professor W. Barthold of the University at Halle. This has been

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obtained by purchases from private persons and on occasion of auctions. The most fruitful collecting of the officials of the museum was developed by regular visits to lectures on the subject at the University in Berlin and to meetings of the Numismatic Society, Berlin, of which the money-museum was a corporate member.

A special phase of numismatics and of coin-dealing are the prices, the appraisal of coins and the observing of price-levels. The necessary professional knowledge presupposes an experience of many years and a careful check and recording of prices paid in flea-markets or at auctions. For this purpose a great number of coin catalogues provided with price lists was on hand in the Library of the Money Museum. There existed also at that time an excellent card-index, primarily of German coins, well suited for instant recall and balancing to the Berlin coin collectors. When in 1938 the Reichsmuseum intended to emigrate to the United States without the right to保留 its card-index, the Reichsmuseum offered to buy the collection for 5,000,- Reichsmark. The Berlin Reichsmuseum however - at that time the largest and authority for such decisions - declined to contribute and to sacrifice the card-index. The Money Museum for its part, was interested in conferring this information to the public and in using it for research. On the other hand this could be done without prejudice to the interests of Rappaport. Therefore the Reichsmuseum Board of Directors agreed to pay Rappaport 5,000,- and to have the card-index duplicated by a photographic process.

Approximately 100,000 cards, packed in cigar-boxes, were photographed and Rappaport was permitted to take the copy of the card-index away. In the meantime he has sold his collection which is now owned by the New York Mint. The original card-index, however, was placed in modern cabinets of the Monet-Museum and currently maintained by an employee specially trained in the study of all available price lists and auction catalogues. This work was continued until the collapse of Berlin and the separation of the German Reichsmuseum by the Red Army. In numerous cases the card-index was used for the identification of coins by interested private and public circles.

An especially extended section of the Reichsmuseum was the Paper-money-collection which was stored in the walls walls of the old bank. The collection of German currency money was the only complete numismatic collection of this species. The notes were placed in frames of glass bordered by a white frame. 25 of these frames of double glass, each containing about 50 x 50 specimens were joined with a central steel column and 75 columns had been put up. Since in this case arrangements and dimensions were exemplary, Special blueprints gave a detailed description of this collection.

In view of the extent and value of the collections of the Money-Museum and its general importance the Reichsmuseum Board of Directors intended to remove the numismatics and coinage to an suitable rooms in the middle part of the new building of the bank. The collapse of the Hitler regime and Reichsmuseum however, has definitely terminated this project. In the further course of the war the exhibition-rooms in the vaults of the old bank building were closed in consequence of the increasing air-raids. The valuable collections, packed in boxes

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and the coin cabinets were located in their spacious compartments at the lowest of the vaults and between the vaults and the safe-deposit buildings. The chests of coins left there were from the Mint, treasury collections and received with the other valuables. All the documents, library and the safe-boxes, the files and the coin lists were removed for safety and in order to continue operations.

When the war started, I lost and the composition of Berlin and of the Reichsbank became uncertain. The president and the responsible members of the Reichsbank board of directors fled. According to an order of the president the remaining contents of vaults and safes were precipitately packed up and removed. Since it seemed to be impossible to pack up all valuations of the Money-Museum in an orderly manner, it was ordered to select only the most precious coins and to hand them over to the officials who were responsible for the transport. In this way nine large bags containing the most valuable and unique coins were brought to Merkers. These, however, represented only a very small part of the existing contents of the museum. By virtue of their numismatic and historical importance they are of inestimable cultural value. Their real value can hardly be appraised. The remaining contents of the Money-Museum, the library, the card-index and the records and files scattered the city ruins and were intact at the war's end. Unfortunately, however, it is unknown that at a later date all the coins were dumped in random fashion into bags and removed together with the records by the Red Army. The exact place of storage is unknown to us. As far as I was informed the library and the card-index no longer in the Reichsbank building. Only one book cataloguing book is said to be stored there at present.

I can not remember if or in what way the "Fuld" collection was acquired by the Money-museum. An exact statement would only be possible, if books, files, records and remnants of the museum are still available.

The Money-museum represents an asset of the Reichsbank, entirely separate and independent from the central and mint-museums. All acquisitions originated as direct purchases and the counterpart was paid and booked to the debit of the special account levied for the establishment of a money museum. Also those coins which were selected from bulk lot purchases to the Reichsbank were charged as purchases. The balance of the account after deducting the considerable proceeds from the sale of duplicate specimens amounted to approximately RM 1,500,000. The real value, however, was much more than invested sum and was estimated to be in the neighborhood of RM 52,000,000.---- This was due in large measure to the high value of the many precious and rare coins discovered in bulk coin deliveries to Reichsbank and paid for solely on basis of their metal content. From a cultural standpoint, however, it is impossible to fix definite value because there were numerous coins not to be found in any collection. Specimens of more recent era were collectively grouped and quite complete. The Money-museum due to its exemplary organization and its technical equipment was an inestimable source with regard to cultural, historical and exhibition studies not only for numismatically interested circles and schools but also for uninitiated visitors.

A great deal of my life work is connected with these collections now scattered. I would immediately be very happy to offer my services in the effort to restore and preserve these coins from destruction. We all hope that the "Museum" can be again

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rendered accessible to all people at home and abroad.

My former collaborators and associates, particularly "Compresionero"

My dear Mr. Schwartz:

Shortly before his departure, Mr. Rubin inquired by his letter of June 15, 1949, whether it would be appropriate for a representative of the Joint Distribution Committee to approach Minister Stucki regarding a possible advance in favor of the International Refugee Organization. Mr. Rubin stated that Mr. Moses Leavitt had raised this question with him, and Mr. Rubin suggested that the Department might communicate directly with Mr. Leavitt in the premises. Further reference is made to our telephone conversation on this subject several days ago.

No objection is perceived to an unofficial approach to Minister Stucki regarding the possible advance of funds to the IRO. It is suggested that the approach to Minister Stucki might more appropriately be made by the IRO, rather than by the JDC directly, inasmuch as Switzerland has now joined the IRO.

As you know, the negotiations between the Allies and Switzerland regarding the implementation of the Swiss-Allied Accord are in recess until September. In its preparations for these negotiations and in its tripartite discussions with the British and French, the Department of State gave very strong support to the position that the IRO should have a priority with respect to the disbursement of the proceeds of the liquidation of German assets in Switzerland. The Department of State was unable to obtain the agreement of either the British or the French representative to the proposal that the Swiss be asked to advance the Swiss franc equivalent of 7.5 million dollars to the IRO. The French Delegate was able, after some discussion of the subject had taken place, to indicate the agreement of his Government to

an advance of 3.5 million dollars to IRO. The French representative was not able to agree to the advance of an additional 4 million dollars, because that sum was already provided for specifically in the Allied-Portuguese Accord.

The British representative had not, as of the time the quadripartite meeting recessed, communicated to the Department any indication that the British Government was prepared to agree to any advance at all. The question was not raised with the Swiss Delegation, because the circumstances under which the negotiations were recessed would have made it premature to raise a question which really involves the manner in which payments under the Accord would be made, rather than any question regarding the implementation of the Accord.

Should either the IRO or the JDC decide to approach the Swiss, the Department would very much appreciate being informed of the result, because the Department continues to regard sympathetically the request of the IRO on behalf of the beneficiary organizations for a priority regarding the disbursement of German assets in Switzerland. The Department will continue to press the other governments concerned on this matter whenever it is of the opinion that an effective approach could be made.

It would also be appreciated if you were to tell Mr. Leavitt that the Department of State has no objection to an approach to Minister Stucki by the IRO or the JDC. It is believed that this course would be preferable to a communication from the Department to Mr. Leavitt directly, inasmuch as his question was raised by your office on his behalf.



## Memorandum of Conversation

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Mr. Rubin called at his request to discuss the above subject. He stated that he understood the US, UK and France were attempting to work out some agreement regarding the division as between IARA and Italy of German assets in Italy. He felt that consideration should be given to the possibility of a portion of these assets being set aside for the IRO as there were genuine and important refugee needs in Italy which could be met in lira. It developed from questioning that Mr. Rubin's proposal was for a share of the German assets in Italy of perhaps some 5% of the total over and above the \$25 million share provided for that organization by the Paris Reparations Agreement out of the German assets in the neutral countries. Mr. Rubin stated that if the additional payment could be obtained from the Swiss and the Portuguese should agree to the Safehaven Accord with that country, the \$25 million distribution would be fully met.

Mr. Rubin remarked that on one occasion when he was associated with the Department of State he had sounded out Signor Lombardo of the Italian Finance Delegation on the proposition that a part of the German assets in Italy should go to IRO. Although recognizing that Signor Lombardo was speaking quite informally and perhaps without full appreciation of the situation, it was Mr. Rubin's impression that Signor Lombardo saw no objection to a modest disposition in favor of IRO.

4. An exhortation to the Italians to make a voluntary contribution to the IRO out of their share.

Mr. Oliver explained that under present circumstances it would be very difficult to consider possibilities 1 and 2. He explained that the US had since 1945 strongly supported the view that all of the German assets in Italy should be turned over to the Italians. Any concession which the US might make against this principle would be made in the interest of a speedy settlement and be kept as small as possible percentage-wise. With respect to a reduction of the IARA share Mr. Oliver thought that the British would not agree and that it would be difficult for the US to insist upon any further reduction in view of the British position that a recovery for IARA from the German assets in Italy was required because of the general frustration of other reparations expectations. With respect to possibility 4 Mr. Oliver expressed the personal view that there would be no harm in approaching the Italians but was pessimistic as to their susceptibility to the suggestion, considering the frequent references of representatives of the Italian Embassy of disappointment regarding the manner in which the Italian treaty disposed of Italian reparations claims against Germany.

Mr. Oliver thought that possibility 3 was worthy of further study. However, he thought there might be some question as to the power of the US to waive its share of German external assets in Italy in favor of the IRO. It might be that the other IARA countries would claim that the US share, if not accepted by the US, should be divided among the other claimants. If the US accepted its share and then attempted to assign it to IRO, a question would arise as to the necessity for Congressional authorization. Indeed, it might be that such a question might arise even in a waiver situation according to what Mr. Oliver had heard regarding the attitude of the General Accounting Office. Mr. Rubin inquired how the IARA share would be allocated among the member nations. Would it be on the basis of the stated Category A percentage or would possible over drafts of the US be taken into account, with the result that the actual US recovery of German assets in Italy would be less than 28% (of the total share given to IARA)? Mr. Oliver stated that he did not know how this would be done but that this point would be considered further. Mr. Rubin suggested that the legal difficulties might be met, assuming that the Category A percentages would obtain at IARA, by announcing the US renunciation of its share in favor of the IRO at the time the division between the Italian Government and IARA was made. Mr. Oliver concluded the discussion of possibility 3 by remarking that there might be competing claims for the favor of a US renunciation.

Mr. Rubin stated that he would make his proposal officially to the Department by letter.

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COMMENT:

Provision for the IRO has been made in connection with all the Safehaven Accords except the Spanish. If all the Accords are concluded and performed the IRO will get the \$25 million set aside for it by the Paris Agreement on Reparations. Certainly the IRO's need for additional assistance will not be met by this sum, even assuming it is all collected, and the humanitarian appeal of the proposal justifies earnest consideration of the possibilities regarding assistance out of the German assets in Italy. However, possibility No. 3 seems to be the only line which could effectively be pursued. In addition to the legal difficulties, international and domestic, it will be recalled that Ambassador Dunn has recommended the renunciation of the US share in favor of Italy. It is barely possible that, should the British not accept our proposal for a 76-24% split but insist upon a 60-40% split, we could make a counter proposal that a part of the 18% difference go not to IARA but to IRO. In view of the difficulties regarding possibilities 1 and 2, it is my opinion that the note to the British agreeing in principle to a split between Italy and IARA be despatched. L/E (Mr. Surrey) has concurred.

EP would appreciate the views of the offices to which this memorandum will be circulated and may solicit them especially if not volunteered.

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
