1. Reference is made to conversations of 13 July 1950 between Lt. HOBBS, this headquarters, Special Agent DOBROWSKI, Region VI, and Lt. JENSEN and Captain MEISER, Region I, concerning clarification of certain allegations of war crimes. Reference is further made to a conversation of 14 July 1950 between Lt. HOBBS and Major ABRAHAM, this headquarters.

2. The following plan of action has been agreed upon, and it is desired that it be initiated with the least possible delay:

a. That Special Agent DOBROWSKI visit Region I and be introduced to Wlodziemiecz SANKO by Special Agent DUBOIS.

b. That Special Agent DOBROWSKI indicate to SANKO further interest in cases previously discussed with SANKO.

c. That DOBROWSKI request SANKO to provide the names of other trustworthy persons who may be familiar with the cases in question; and that, if SANKO fails to mention the name of X-9-VI, that DOBROWSKI indicate the following:

(1) DOBROWSKI has investigated the cases in an effort to determine other persons who may be familiar with the facts and has located one, X-9-VI. DOBROWSKI should then ask SANKO whether he knows X-9-VI and if he considers him reliable.

d. That, having obtained SANKO's consent to meet with X-9-VI, arrangements be made between Region VI and Region I for a meeting outside the Ellwangen DP Camp. (It is suggested that the LUDWIGSBURG Safe House be used for the conferences between Special Agent DOBROWSKI and DUBOIS, X-9-VI and SANKO.)

GIS ORGANISATIONS AND PERSONALITIES IN ARGENTINA AND SOUTH AMERICA GENERALLY

1. The NIEBUHR Organisation

There is complete unanimity among the Prisoners, where they are able to supply any infm at all on the point, in discounting the importance, scope and sinister reputation of the so-called "NIEBUHR Organisation". MÜLLER, MAMMEN and von FOCHHAMMER, who are best informed on the matter, are agreed that NIEBUHR was no great spy-master. Severe limitations were imposed on his activities by his very appointment: the fear of endangering diplomatic relations between GERMANY and ARGENTINA through any indiscretion on his part weighed heavily on him.

Martin MÜLLER has stated the position as follows:

"I must contradict the references to the NIEBUHR-WOLF organisation in ARGENTINA as an espionage organisation. Such an organisation postulates the employment of numerous agents with specific int tasks; and that would be the business of Abw. As Attachés, NIEBUHR and WOLF were naturally under the obligation to sift all int concerning the enemy and to transmit it: to that end, of course, they had to be organised. In their position, however, they had to take their int where they found it, without differentiating between sources or motives. The basis of their int reports was obtained from the USA daily and tech Press.

"The Attachés could not afford an organisation capable of competing with SD or Abw: it would have meant compromising the Embassy, and a rupture of diplomatic relations would have constituted a blow to German foreign policy out of all proportion to any value that int out of ARGENTINA could ever assume. Reports on shipping in the RIVER-PLATE, from such sources as THOMAS, were in themselves based almost exclusively on Press reports..."

The actual int work which NIEBUHR directed was not spectacular. Infm was obtained from the Press and such sources as Hans THOMAS and SCHUMANN and casual informants. Occasionally requests were made by BERLIN for checks on infm obtained in GERMANY from other sources in ARGENTINA and SOUTH AMERICA, none of them clearly defined, and it was clear to members of NIEBUHR's staff that outside groups were active in the local int field. During the phase of the repatriation of the GRAF SPEE men, NIEBUHR worked in close touch with Eugen LANGER @ "EUGEN" and Wilhelm von SEIDLITZ @ "DICKER". These, in their turn, employed their own collaborators, most of whom would be unknown to NIEBUHR, whose work was at the highest level.

When the GRAF SPEE undertaking came to an end, owing to the increasing vigilance of the Argentine authorities, and LANGER and SEIDLITZ turned to the organisation and operation of their courier

handing over all material to be sent by courier. When the Naval Attaché's office began to use this means of comm - its reports were sent usually in photographic form and in several copies - BURMEISTER continued to pay the full "postage"; no charge was passed on to the Naval Attaché.

Letters forwarded by the Military and Naval Attachés bore the inscription "PALERMO" on the envelope; those of the Botschaft were marked "EMBAJADA MADRID".

VOLBERG states that when he returned from the Province of CORDOBA in Nov 43, he wrote a report in BUENOS AIRES on the situation in the pharmaceutical market and the German firms engaged in the trade. The report was intended for Wirtschaftsgruppe Chemie, in BERLIN, but had to be shown first to the Commercial Attaché. Before preparing the report, VOLBERG spoke to BURMEISTER about the difficulties of forwarding the report, but was told to leave it with him, "for opportunities to send them on occurred from time to time." Von POCHHAMMER, too, speaks of facilities provided for all Embassy depts by couriers on Spanish ships, all arrangements being in the hands of BURMEISTER.

MAMMEN and MÜLLER confirm that at first the courier system was controlled by BURMEISTER, acting through LANGER and the latter's asst, who is known to them only as "GROSSO". After LANGER had returned to CHILE, the courier system appeared to have been taken over by von SEIDLITZ, to whom MAMMEN often handed envelopes containing the Naval Attaché's reports.

The intermediaries employed by both LANGER and SEIDLITZ are not known to Prisoners, but LANGER is quoted as having stated that he usually employed ordinary seamen and stokers, whose lowly status made them less apprehensive of dismissal than the ships' offrs. MÜLLER believes that among his collaborators was RIGAL OROZCO. SEIDLITZ was partial to members of the Falange when recruiting couriers; among his collaborators was Guillermo ROBERTSON GUANTES, of the CABO DE BUENA ESPERANZA.

Among other ships on which couriers were employed were: MONTE MONJUICH, MONTE ALBERTIA, MONTE AMBOTO, MONTE ICIAR, MULHACEN, INHAMBANE, LUSO, MELO.

6. BURMEISTER as Chief Paymaster: Payment of Agents in SOUTH AMERICA

That BURMEISTER was himself responsible for payments to such collaborators as LANGER has already been shown above. MÜLLER, who cannot amplify the statement, confirms that funds placed at the disposal of WOLF were obtained through BURMEISTER.

Von POCHHAMMER describes the Commercial Attaché as having played a decisive role in the payment of all "confidential contacts". His development of contraband in strategic materials yielded a considerable income at a time when the problem of financing the Embassy had become difficult. While responsibility for supervision of cash transactions in the official Embassy accounts had rested with von POCHHAMMER, BURMEISTER to an increasing degree began to control the sources of income and the payment of all unofficial expenses. In such matters he never consulted von POCHHAMMER, but dealt directly with Dr MEYNEN. Von POCHHAMMER was not encouraged to question him in the matter: "I soon noticed that he was particularly sensitive in these things."

This strict secrecy was maintained by the Commercial Attaché at all times, especially about the source of his funds. Von POCHHAMMER inclines to think that they came from GERMANY and were transmitted to BUENOS AIRES through some neutral intermediary: "it was all done very discreetly, no receipts were given." VOLBERG, who speaks with less authority, believes that BURMEISTER, as head of the Commercial Dept, must have controlled the greater part of Embassy funds. It was he who conducted negotiations on different occasions with the BANCO CENTRAL ARGENTINO and with the German banks in BUENOS AIRES. He was visited often by the directors of these banks and also by a certain Dr DOERGE, who was reputedly a German financial expert who had been in touch with the Argentine Ministry of Finance.

VOLBERG states that when BURMEISTER committed suicide, it was rumoured in local German circles that he had hanged himself because he had misappropriated large sums of money.

The manner of payment of agents in SOUTH AMERICA is apparently unknown to most of the Prisoners: MÜLLER and MAMMEN have been able to describe only the means of payment in the case of ADAMOWSKI, through RAMBE.

7. Penetration of Allied IS

According to MÜLLER, the only member of the group who has shown any worthwhile reaction to the question, there was never any penetration of the Allied IS. He adds that the Germans were under the impression that the Americans were working with a very large organisation and very considerable sums of money, while the British, if they lacked funds, had personnel that was better selected and trained; and this allowed them to make better use of their good relations with the Argentines.

The Service Attaché's Department did not even pursue occasional reports put in about the Allied IS: "From the practical point of view, the info was without value, especially as the Allies had the upper hand politically."

MÜLLER does not believe that the HARNISCH group met with any greater success. As far as he could see, this was "an organisation of amateurs and dilettantes created in wartime without a chance of competing with the mature and expanded Allied services."

8. Stay-behind Plans in SOUTH AMERICA: Plans made in PORTUGAL

Prisoners' knowledge of these matters agrees almost point by point with the account given by WOLF. SCHLÜTER @ "JACOBO" had been made responsible by the latter for continuing some form of int. service on behalf of the departing Embassy group.

SCHLÜTER, who was in touch with the "BOLIVAR" WT system, was to rely for his info on THOMAS @ "MIRLA", such material as he could gather from the daily newspapers and tech magazines, and possibly RAMBE, whom he also knew, and "ISA".

The courier route via neutral ships was to be kept open by LANGER, with whom SCHLÜTER would be in close liaison.

SCHLÜTER was not to attempt any reorganisation or expansion of the small group now placed under his control: the whole plan merely represented an attempt to maintain, on however small a scale, the int reports on shipping and aeronautical matters for which WOLF had hitherto been responsible.

The financial details are not known to any of the Prisoners, who felt that the scheme was doomed to failure, so half-heartedly had it been conceived.

The Prisoners agree that no more serious attempt was made from PORTUGAL to place the improvised stay-behind organisation on any proper foundation. According to von POCHHAMMER, the whole matter was by that time "out of the question". Occasionally MEYNER and WOLF received from BERLIN enquiries about some such arrangements, and held secret discussions in that connection. From the little that he heard later, von POCHHAMMER gathered that the subjects of discussion were not new plans, but details of the arrangements already made. WOLF was, in any case, no longer in any position to communicate with ARGENTINA: "He was very pleased to be rid of the business."

9. Argentine and South American Collaborators of GIS

All the Prisoners profess ignorance of any "criollo" collaborators of the GIS. MÜLLER and MARLEN deny that there were any who were known to them: von POCHHAMMER, who doubts whether there were many persons in ARGENTINA who would have collaborated actively, states categorically that he never heard any names mentioned in that connection.

He goes on to explain that any Argentine collaboration with the GIS as such was highly improbable. The friendly relations which WOLF maintained with many Argentine staff officers allowed him to ascertain the local military view on the war situation, a matter of considerable interest to the Embassy, for BERLIN had been strangely silent on the point since the loss of STALINGRAD. He doubts whether such appreciations or their int by-products were ever communicated to BERLIN, "even though the overall picture as painted by the Argentine officers was more roseate than our own."

After the installation of the new military régime in Jun 43, the Embassy expected no more of ARGENTINA than that she remain neutral and that her official circles should "show us small favours!" "We could have expected no more from them, if only because we had already discovered that anything beyond that would brand the persons concerned as pro-German; and that would either cost them their jobs or make them quite useless as the fount of further favours."

VOLBERG states that the Embassy appeared to have enjoyed, in the political field, the collaboration or at least the sympathy, of "elements notorious for their Germanophile tendencies". He cites:-

- General PERTINE, Intendente Municipal of BUENOS AIRES;
- Dr Manuel FRESCO, former Governor of BUENOS AIRES;
- OSSES;
- Antonio DELFINO;
- Professor AHUMADA;
- Gen MOLINA; and
- AGUIRRE, President of the Stock Exchange.

10. Collaboration with IS of Axis Sympathisers

Regular meetings took place in BUENOS AIRES of the Service Attachés of the Axis Powers. It seems, however, that they were based, at least on the German side, on courtesy rather than on the hope of any profit. Thus NIEBUHR at one time entertained friendly relations with the Italian Naval Attaché, TORRIANI; and WOLF with his successor, PRATI. So far as the Japanese were concerned, MÜLLER was detailed to meet the Japanese Asst Naval Attaché from time to time, to exchange Press evaluations on such matters as US shipbuilding, aircraft output etc; frequently the two also examined, at the German Embassy, published details of shipping movements in the port of BUENOS AIRES.

Von POCHHAMMER states that ties with the Japanese, which in NIEBUHR's day had been rather loose, were made closer by WOLF, in so far as he arranged for regular meetings with the Japanese. But collaboration was not easy, not least because of the language difficulties. WOLF often remarked that, in any case, he gave more infm away to his Axis colleagues than he ever got from them.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE:

SUBJECT: JANKOVIC Dr. Ladislav, War Criminal

RE : Investigation regarding whereabouts

Pursuant to instructions received from the Special Agent in Charge, CIG, Land Salzburg Detachment, this Agent initiated an investigation of Subject on the basis of SOI, Judge Advocate's Office, War Crimes Group, USFET, dated 13 August 1946, requesting arrest of Subject for extradition to Czechoslovakia. Subject is charged with being a member of the Slovak SS, of having taken part in the mass deportation of Jews to a concentration camp in Poland, torture and causing the death of many Slovakian patriots. Subject's address was given as Rauris, Land Salzburg, Austria. Investigation regarding whereabouts of Subject revealed the following:

According to the Gendarmerie in Rauris, Subject, born 25 June 1917 in Cifec, Slovakia, Czechoslovakian citizen, came to Rauris in April 1945 and after the occupation of Rauris by American forces received employment from Military Government officers as DP camp commandant in Rauris. Subject held his position till November 1945 when he was dismissed on grounds of thievery. He left for Alm, Bezirk Zell am See, Land Salzburg, Austria, in November 1945 and resided at Thorlenbauer.

Interrogation of KOHLMAYER Josef, born 19 April 1922 in Mellnitzhaette, Czechoslovakia, Czech citizen, employed by the "Papstliche Delegation fuer Deutschland und Oesterreich" as Referent for Papal DP registration, residing with Subject at Thorlenbauer, Alm, Bezirk Zell am See, revealed the following information:

Subject was employed by the "Papstliche Delegation fuer Deutschland und Oesterreich" (a Papal Delegation for Germany and Austria) in February 1946. The headquarters of the delegation are in Frankfurt a.M., Germany, and in Pfarrhof Ried, Oberoesterreich, Austria. Subject received his employment through one ZHANI August who is a representative of this delegation residing at the Pfarrhof in Ried.

Subject was in Paris, in August 1946, according to a letter received by KOHLMAYER. Subject stated in the letter that he expected to be in Rome, Italy, in September.

KOHLMAYER has been acquainted with Subject since March 1946. Subject is known by KOHLMAYER to be strongly anti-Russian. JANKOVIC, at present, makes speeches, writes articles and books against Russia, and also acts as a courier for the above mentioned papal delegation.

JANKOVIC was a "Katholischer Studentenfuhrer" and instructor in the Hochschuleinstitut "SVOBODOC" in Pressburg. KOHLMAYER could give no information on Subject's activities after leaving the Hochschuleinstitut nor did he know when Subject left the institute.

It is expected that Subject will return to Alm because he still has his belongings there. A search of Subject's belongings revealed nothing of interest. Orders for the arrest of Subject were given to the Gendarmerie in Bezirk Zell am See.
