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Dear RWG Member:

Thank you for having participated in the first meeting of the Regulatory Working Group (RWG). I appreciate the many other demands on your time, so I hope you share my view that the RWG is a useful forum for addressing regulatory issues of common interest and coordinating regulatory policy within the Administration. Your attendance was critical, and will continue to be critical, to the success of this Group in meeting the Administration's intention to improve the nation's regulatory system.

The next meeting of the RWG will be from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, January 26, 1994, in the Vice President's Office, Old Executive Office Building, Room 274. We will focus on Executive Order No. 12866 implementation issues, including your plans to review existing regulations. In addition, we will be assigning priorities to the various subjects that the RWG will be considering. I will send a more detailed agenda in mid-January.

During the last meeting, a number of you suggested issues as future subjects for the RWG. These included:

- cost benefit analysis (how and when to do it and the benefits of doing an ex-post cost benefit analysis);
- risk assessment guidelines;
- the disproportionate impact of Federal regulation on small businesses;
- improving regulatory science;

- the use of information technology to improve rulemaking;
- regulatory negotiation and other dispute resolution methods;
- adapting the relatively slow regulatory process to areas where technology changes rapidly;
- streamlining internal agency regulatory processes; and
- statutory changes that would improve agencies' abilities to regulate effectively.

Please let me know which of these you (or your staff) want to work on, as well as any other subjects you think the RWG should consider. We will be establishing sub-groups to address these topics; I will prepare a list of those interested in each for our next meeting. (Lest there be any doubt, you can sign up for more than one -- we expect several projects to proceed simultaneously.)

I have several additional requests. First, I am enclosing for your information a list of the Regulatory Working Group members. Please make sure the addresses and numbers we have listed for you are correct and let us know if they are not. Second, let me remind you that your plans for review of existing regulations were due on December 30, 1993. We have received some and hope to have all within the week; we will be discussing them at the January RWG meeting. Third, I am also enclosing a report from the Regulatory Information Service Center that summarizes the October Regulatory Agenda. Would this information, or something like it, be of use to you? Please look it over and let me know.

Finally, I would like to remind you of OIRA's Regulatory Exchange program. As I mentioned at our first meeting, the purpose of this program is to improve the skills of agency regulatory staff. Selected individuals would come to OIRA for approximately six months to learn how interagency coordination and regulatory review are carried out, and to help with the work of the RWG. If you are interested in participating, please let me know. We may have some suggestions regarding specific individuals whose participation might benefit your agency; I would be happy to discuss our thoughts with you.

If you have any thoughts, comments, or suggestions about the Working Group, please give me a call or contact Don Arbuckle (tel: 395-7340, Fax: 395-7285) or Kristina Emanuels (tel: 395-4897, Fax: 395-3047) of my staff. I look forward to seeing you on January 26th.

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PROJECTED REGULATORY ACTIVITY OF THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT

October 1993 - September 1994

Based on information appearing in the October 1993

Unified Agenda of Federal Regulations

INTRODUCTION

On September 30, 1993, President Clinton signed Executive Order 12866 "Regulatory Planning and Review" (58 FR 51735, October 4, 1993), which, among other things, requires agencies to publish agendas of all regulations under development or review. The April 1994 edition of the Unified Agenda of Federal Regulations will be prepared in accordance with the provisions of E.O. 12866. This edition was prepared in accordance with Executive Order 12291 and OMB memoranda implementing section 5 of that Executive order, which were in effect at the time agencies prepared their submissions.

AGENCIES AND ENTRIES

Fifty-nine Federal agencies submitted descriptions of 4,950 regulatory activities for the October 1993 Unified Agenda of Federal Regulations.

Of the 4,950 entries in the October Agenda, 855 or 17.3 percent were new to the Agenda, while 4,095 or 82.7 percent repeated from previous editions.

USDA had the largest number of new entries with 177. This is 38.5 percent of all USDA entries and 20.7 percent of all new entries in the Agenda. DOT had 88 new entries or 16.3 percent of its entries and 10.3 percent of all new entries.

RULEMAKING STAGE OF ENTRIES

Of all the Agenda entries, 237 or 4.8 percent were at the Prerule Stage; 2,065 or 41.7 percent were at the Proposed Rule Stage; 1,802 or 36.4 percent were at the Final Rule Stage; and 846 or 17.1 percent were Completed Actions.

ENTRIES BY AGENCY TYPE

Cabinet agencies submitted 3,580 or 72.3 percent of all entries; Other Executive agencies submitted 863 or 17.4 percent; and Independent agencies submitted 507 or 10.2 percent.

LARGEST CONTRIBUTORS

The Department of the Treasury submitted the largest number of entries with 637 or 12.9 percent of all entries, followed by DOT with 541 or 10.9 percent, USDA with 460 or 9.3 percent, HHS with 384 or 7.8 percent, EPA with 362 or 7.3 percent, DOI with 307 or 6.2 percent, and DOC with 283 or 5.7 percent. These seven agencies together submitted 2,974 entries or 60.1 percent of the total.

LEGAL DEADLINE

Agencies indicated that 645 or 13.0 percent of the Agenda entries were subject to a legal deadline. In some instances, an entry was subject to more than one legal deadline. Of the 645, 605 or 12.2 percent of the Agenda entries are subject to a statutory deadline: 141 for an NPRM, 490 for a final rule, and 78 for some other action. A judicial deadline applies to 69 entries or 1.4 percent of all Agenda entries: 38 for an NPRM, 65 for a final rule, and 2 for some other action. Agencies stated that 4,305 entries or 87.0 percent have no legal deadlines.

NEXT REGULATORY ACTION FOR ALL AGENDA ENTRIES

The largest number of Agenda entries had an NPRM or the end of the NPRM Comment Period listed as their next action. These actions account for 1,686 or 34.1 percent of all entries. After NPRMs, the largest number of next actions were Final Actions or Final Actions Effective (1,306 or 26.4 percent). In addition, 61 or 1.2 percent were at an early stage of rulemaking, listing an ANPRM or the end of the ANPRM Comment Period as the next action. Of all entries, 660 or 13.3 percent indicated that a next action was not yet determined.

REGULATORY PROGRAM

Status

Agencies indicated that they submitted or would have submitted 546 or 11.0 percent of the Agenda entries for the Regulatory Program of the United States Government had it been published. (In some instances, several Agenda entries were combined into a single Program entry.) The remaining 4,404 entries, which comprise 89.0 percent of the Agenda, would have been submitted only for the Agenda.

Rulemaking Stage of Entries

Of the Regulatory Program entries, the largest number (237 or 43.4 percent) were at the Final Rule Stage, while 234 or 42.9 percent were at the Proposed Rule Stage. Forty-six or 8.4 percent of the entries were Completed Actions, and 29 or 5.3 percent were at the Prerule Stage.

Agency

EPA submitted the largest number of Regulatory Program entries with 131 or 36.2 percent of the Agency's total number of Agenda entries. It was followed by DOL with 83 or 64.3 percent of its Agenda total, USDA with 55 or 12.0 percent, and DOT with 50 or 9.2 percent. These four agencies account for 319 or 58.4 percent of all entries in the Agenda that are also in the Regulatory Program.

Legal Deadline

Of the Regulatory Program entries, 185 or 33.9 percent are subject to a statutory deadline: 60 for an NPRM, 157 for a final rule, and 17 for some other action. A judicial deadline applies to 36 entries or 6.6 percent: 18 for an NPRM, 35 for a final rule, and one for some other action. (In some instances, an entry contains more than one legal deadline.)

Next Regulatory Action

An NPRM or the end of the NPRM Comment Period was the Next Action for the largest number of Agenda entries that would also have been published in the Regulatory Program (216 or 39.6 percent); 177 or 32.4 percent cited a Final Action or Final Action Effective as the next action; 10 or 1.8 percent were at an earlier stage of rulemaking, citing an ANPRM or the end of the ANPRM Comment Period as the next action; and 46 or 8.4 percent of the Regulatory Program entries were Completed Actions. The remaining next actions for Regulatory Program entries were distributed among four categories, including 67 or 12.3 percent for which the agency had not yet determined a next action.

AGENCY PRIORITY

Agencies designated 1,092 or 22.1 percent of the entries in the Agenda as agency priorities. Twenty-two of the 24 Regulatory Program agencies designated 885 or 20.1 percent of their non-Program entries as agency priorities.

SMALL ENTITIES

Agencies indicated that 790 or 16.0 percent of the entries in the Agenda might have an effect on small entities, and 3,207 or 64.8 percent would not. Agencies had not yet determined the small entity effects of 953 or 19.2 percent of the entries. Of the 790 that might affect small entities, 666 or 84.3 percent might affect businesses, 225 or 28.5 percent might affect organizations, and 211 or 26.7 percent might affect governmental organizations. Of the 790, 227 entries might affect some combination of the three types of small entities.

EPA reported the largest number of entries that could affect small entities with 98 or 27.1 percent of its total Agenda entries. It was followed by HHS with 86 or 22.4 percent, USDA with 83 or 18 percent, Treasury with 75 or 11.8 percent, SBA with 61 or 79.2 percent, and HUD with 57 or 25.8 percent of their respective Agenda entries.

GOVERNMENT LEVELS AFFECTED

Agencies indicated that 1,297 or 26.2 percent of the entries in the Agenda might have an effect on levels of government, and 2,909 or 58.8 percent would not. Agencies had not yet determined the effects on levels of government of 744 or 15.0 percent of the entries. Of the 1,297 entries that have an effect on levels of government, 849 or 65.5 percent might affect the Federal Government, 703 or 54.2 percent might affect State governments, and 490 or 37.8 percent might affect local governments. Of the 1,297, 547 might affect some combination of the three levels of government.

EPA reported the largest number of entries that could affect levels of government with 179 or 49.4 percent of its total Agenda entries. It was followed by USDA with 128 or 27.8 percent, HHS with 112 or 29.2 percent, DOD with 95 or 70.4 percent, HUD with 95 or 43.0 percent, and DOJ with 92 or 67.6 percent of their respective Agenda entries.

PROCUREMENT-RELATED ACTIONS

The Agenda includes specific information on procurement-related regulatory actions to help agencies and the Office of Federal Procurement Policy (OFPP) meet the requirements of the OFPP Act Amendments of 1988. Twenty-three agencies reported information on 323 procurement-related actions in this edition. Agencies indicated that of the 323, 60 or 18.6 percent have a paperwork burden associated with the action, 252 or 78.0 percent do not, and 11 or 3.4 percent are undetermined. Agencies also indicated that there is a statutory requirement for 97 or 30.0 percent of the actions, and for 226 or 70.0 percent there is not.

DOD reported the largest number of procurement-related actions with 101 or 74.8 percent of its total Agenda entries. It was followed by FAR with 65 or 100 percent, DOE with 34 or 40.0 percent, SBA with 22 or 28.6 percent, and GSA with 17 or 38.6 percent of their respective Agenda entries.


REGULATORY ANALYSES

Listing of analytic documents is optional. Twenty-three agencies indicated whether or not they would have prepared Regulatory Impact Analyses (RIAs) on 406 entries. Of these, 7 agencies reported they were preparing or had prepared RIAs for 95 entries. Agencies stated they were not preparing RIAs for 311 entries.

Twenty-two agencies indicated whether or not they were preparing Regulatory Flexibility Analyses (RFAs) on 487 entries. Of these, 9 agencies were preparing RFAs for 116 entries. Agencies were not preparing RFAs for 371 entries.


DOT reported 425 other analyses, all of which were regulatory evaluations except for one environmental assessment. Two other agencies (USDA and DOE) each reported preparing an environmental impact statement for one of their entries.

UNIFIED AGENDA OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS ENTRIES BY AGENCY TYPE OCTOBER 1993











UNIFIED AGENDA OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS NEW ENTRIES BY AGENCY OCTOBER 1993





UNIFIED AGENDA OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS RULEMAKING STAGE OF ENTRIES OCTOBER 1993







UNIFIED AGENDA OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS AGENCY PRIORITY BY AGENCY OCTOBER 1993





UNIFIED AGENDA OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS LEGAL DEADLINES OF ENTRIES OCTOBER 1993























UNIFIED AGENDA OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS PROCUREMENT ENTRIES BY AGENCY OCTOBER 1993
















