

MISS TEEN USA 1995 CONTESTANTS ASPIRE TO CAREERS IN EDUCATION Secretary of Education, Richard Riley Encouraged by Youth's Commitment to Teaching

LOS ANGELES, CA, August 1, 1995--The contestants of the 1995 MISS TEEN USA Pageant showed extraordinary diversity in naming their goals, preferences and media favorites--with one exception. A clear majority are hoping to find careers in the area of teaching. Elementary and special education topped the list, with English and physical fitness also mentioned.

"I am tremendously encouraged that so many bright and ambitious young people, such as the young women competing in this year's MISS TEEN USA Pageant, are choosing teaching as a future career. It underscores my belief that this country's youth value education and are personally committed to helping future generations. It is more important now, than at any time in our history that young people receive a good education," said Richard Riley, U.S. Secretary of Education. Careers in journalism, medicine and the performing arts were other oft-cited goals of these young women.

For the first year, the contestants chose members of the Clinton family as the people they would most like to meet. Bill, Hillary and Chelsey were often chosen by the young women as people they just wanted to sit and talk with. Tying for second place were Oprah Winfrey (last year's winner), Neil Armstrong, David Letterman and MISS UNIVERSE 1995, Chelsi Smith.

The Clintons were cited as role models and experts on the media. President Clinton is seen as an advocate for children and teens, with a vision for the future of the country. This year's contestants view Hillary Rodham Clinton as a dedicated wife and mother, as well as a strong and powerful professional woman with integrity and intelligence. In Chelsey, they seem to find a peer. While they empathize with her lack of privacy, they also share many of her values.

Other favorites of this year's contestants include:

- *Meg Ryan and Tom Hanks--Favorite Movie Stars
- **Forrest Gump--Favorite Movie
- *Jane Seymour and Tim Allen--Favorite TV Stars
- **ER--Favorite TV Show
- *Calvin Klein--Favorite Fashion Designer
- *Boyz II Men--Favorite Musical Performers

Seventeen was voted the favorite magazine of the contestants with YM a close second. Cosmopolitan and TEEN were also highly ranked in the magazine category.

The 1995 MISS TEEN USA Pageant will be broadcast live from Wichita, Kansas, on Tuesday, August 15th(9:00 PM-11:00 PM, live ET, delayed PT) on the CBS Television Network. The 13th annual presentation of the pageant, with 51 young women competing for the title, will be hosted by Bob Goen, the weekend host and correspondent for "Entertainment Tonight," and co-hosted by Maty Monfort, the host of ABC Daytime's "Mike & Maty." Vocal quartet All-4-One will perform their hit single, "I Can Love You Like That," from their newly released album.





Shauna Gambill Crowned MISS TEEN USA® 1994

Eighteen-year-old Shauna Gambill was crowned MISS TEEN USA® 1994 in Biloxi, Mississippi on August 16, 1994, winning more than \$160,000 in cash and prizes, including a 1994 Pontiac Grand Am GT Coupe and a two-year college scholarship from Bauder College in Georgia.

This year's telecast, hosted by Bob Goen and Daisy Fuentes, with Jamie Solinger (MISS TEEN USA 1992) as a special commentator, was broadcast live from the Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center on the CBS Television Network, and was seen by approximately 200 million people in 24 countries.

Shauna is California's first MISS TEEN USA. Born in Tarzana on September 22, 1976, Shauna is in many respects your average teen. She lives in the small town of Acton (pop. 7,000), an hour north of Los Angeles. Shauna recently graduated from Highland High School, where, on top of being valedictorian of her class, she also participated in cheerleading, Academic Decathlon, Interact, and the AP Club.

When she has free time Shauna enjoys going to the movies, hanging out with friends, cooking and shopping, all very typical things, but she is far from typical. Shauna aspires to meet Attorney General Janet Reno because "she could help me learn how to handle not being a people pleaser all of the time, but instead, stick to what I know to be the best for people everywhere."

Entering UCLA this winter, Shauna is planning to study Political Science. She has big plans post graduation. Shauna intends to enroll in an "excellent" law school. After graduation she will set out to practice environmental law.

With a strong environmental conscience, she plans to spend her year as MISS TEEN USA raising the public's awareness of the many problems that plague the earth. Too



ambitious to limit herself to just one issue, Shauna will get her hands dirty with as many challenging opportunities as possible.

Two projects that Shauna has already completed include a public service announcement for "National Red Ribbon Day", an anti-drug campaign, and participation in the "Aid for AIDS" fashion show. She is looking forward to becoming involved in children's hospital charities. "Children are our future, so whatever I can do to help children in need is something I feel strongly about," said Shauna.

When she's not touring around the country as MISS TEEN USA, Shauna believes in letting people know that she is still the "same old Shauna." She spends time with her close-knit family. "Staying near my family and friends was a priority to me when choosing a university. Knowing how grueling the pressures of being a freshman can

be, I just felt more comfortable staying close to home," said Shauna.

Along with her parents and younger brother, Shauna shares her home with a menagerie of family pets. They have two dogs, Kodie and Foster, and a cat named Ozzie. The Gambills also raise chickens. Shauna is looking forward to getting a Jack Russell Terrier of her own someday.

Shauna's strong belief in the importance of self-confidence and self-esteem are reflected in her actions. "Spending time with MISS USA® 1994, Lu Parker, has been one of the best things about being MISS TEEN USA, because Lu is the perfect role model. She is compassionate, intelligent, enthusiastic, and shares my love for life," said Shauna.

Shauna summarizes herself best when she explains her philosophy of life: "I try to take care of the things that I have in my control, and to place those things I cannot control, into the hands of God."

First and second runner up at the MISS TEEN USA Pageant were Whitney Fuller, MISS GEORGIA TEEN USA, and Melissa Hurtig, MISS KANSAS TEEN USA, respectively.

During the week leading up to the 1994 MISS TEEN USA Pageant telecast other awards were presented to Mary Elizabeth Stevenson, MISS SOUTH CAROLINA TEEN USA for Miss Congeniality. The Minolta Miss Photogenic Award went to Anjelie Eldredge, MISS WASHINGTON TEEN USA, and our winner Shauna Gambill, MISS CALIFORNIA TEEN USA, won the Jantzen Best in Swimsuit Award. The Minolta Delegate's Photo Contest was won by Denise Fisher, MISS MARYLAND TEEN USA; First runner-up was Jennifer Hunt, MISS MAINE TEEN USA and second runner-up was Nicole Bigham, MISS PENNSYLVANIA TEEN USA. 1





Chelsi Smith Crowned Miss Universe



MISS UNIVERSE to helping people overcome the emotional difficulties that are often the result of being disadvantaged. Smith is the sixth winner in the pageant's history to reign from the United States.

Among Smith's first public appearance as MISS UNIVERSE, was the naming and dedication of a bridge in Windhoek, the capital of Namibia. On May 14, 1995 Chelsi flew to the Ombengu Safari Ranch in northern Namibia to be presented her most precious prize, an elephant. At a beautiful ceremony the Namibian Minister of Housing, Dr. Libertine Amarthilla, presented Chelsi with a certificate of ownership.

Chelsi named her six-year-old male elephant, "Pepe". Pepe was one of five elephants rescued from poachers by this reserve. Pepe will be kept at the newly opened Ombengu Safari Ranch, an ecologically minded reserve. Ranch Director Roland Vincent and Marketing Director Pete Wilson hosted Chelsi and the Miss Universe staff at their wonderful accommodations, set among the untouched bush of Africa. The ranch featured authentic Namibian cuisine, paths for hiking and riding horses as well as a chance to feed elephants and go on safari at Etosha National Park, the largest game

park in Namibia. It was truly an African experience Chelsi will never forget.

First and second runner-up were MISS INDIA, Manpreet Brar and MISS CANADA, Lana Buchberger, respectively. The Jantzen Best in Swimsuit Award went to the winner, Chelsi Smith.

During the weeks leading up to the telecast other awards were presented. Toyin Enitan Raji, MISS NIGERIA, won the "Miss Congeniality" award, Petra Hultgren, MISS SWEDEN won the "Miss Photogenic" award and Paola Dellepiane, MISS PERU won the "Vibrance Most Beautiful Hair" award. "Best National Costume" went to Maria Reyes, MISS SPAIN. □



Where Are They Now?

Michelle McLean

MISS UNIVERSE 1992, Michelle McLean, served as the Pageant and Events Coordinator for the 1995 MISS UNIVERSE Pageant in her country, Namibia. One of the most important things in Michelle's life are the children of Namibia. In 1992 she established the Michelle McLean Children's Trust, a non-profit organization designed to provide assistance to children in need. The Trust has been involved in several efforts to help children in Namibia. Some of those include: providing financial assistance for a 12 year-old boy who had cancer and needed specialized treatment; the establishment of a mathematics program for children across the country in grades five through seven; an immunization project in conjunction with UNICEF that is expected to have all Namibian children immunized by the year 2000; establishing of the Katima Day Care and Kindergarten and raising funds for the Baby Sinvula Project, which provided a life saving heart operation to a child in need.

Her hard work and devotion to the pageant and to the children were quite evident when her Trust hosted the 1995 MISS UNIVERSE Annual National Gift Auction. Some of the exquisite items for auction were a handmade Turkish silk carpet from central Anatolia, a historic bronze knife from the Greek Independence Revolution of 1821 and a jewelry box containing seven types of precious stones donated by the President of Korea. The money raised from this event went to the Michelle McLean Children's Trust and totaled approximately \$100,000. Not surprisingly Michelle's motto is, "If you can imagine it, you can do it!"

In addition to her efforts on behalf of the children of Namibia, Michelle is also currently modeling in South Africa. ▢
